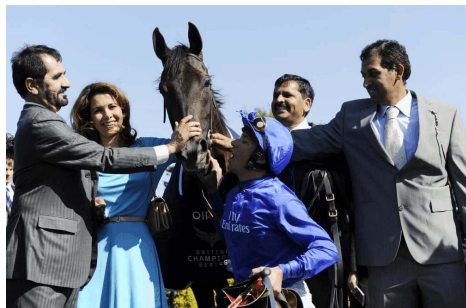

The pair, joined by assistant trainer Mike McCarthy, went out shortly after 8:30 a.m. Uncle Mo, who completed the task in 1:01.60, was accompanied by Johnny Velazquez, while Stay Thirsty, who drilled in 1:01.80, had exercise rider Fernando

Blue Bunting arrived without a major flourish on debut when five-lengths second to the eventual G3 Prestige S. winner and G1 Fillies' Mile third Theyskens' Theory (Bernardini) in a seven-furlong maiden on the other course at Newmarket at the end of July. She proved a professional and game performer when going one better at the expense of the well-regarded Midnight Caller (GB) (Dansili {GB}) over a mile at Doncaster a fortnight later, and was again tough when winning a war of attrition with the smart Elas Diamond (GB) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) in the Listed Montrose Fillies' S. over this track and trip at the end of October. Overshadowed by the operation's premier candidate White Moonstone in the early build-up to this, the roan filly was placed in central focus for the team after that unbeaten Saeed bin Suroor trainee was forced onto the sidelines. Blue Bunting was toward the rear and sheltered from the high winds early as Hooray (GB) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) set off in Frankel-fashion, and her rider was began to get active by halfway. Responding to the first flashes of the whip with a quarter mile remaining, she upped her workrate as Together got the better of Maqaasid (GB) down the middle. With stamina kicking in on the run to the line, the royal blue train derailed what had looked to be more Classic glory for Coolmore. "We knew she would finish well, as we thought she would be a filly who will appreciate some distance of ground," Godolphin's Racing Manager Simon Crisford said. "We were also concerned about the quick ground, as we felt a little bit of cut would suit her better, but she was very willing. Frankie gave her a great ride and crept into the race with three to run, and she was doing her best work at the finish. We haven't had much of a chance to discuss it, but I'm sure Sheikh Mohammed will want to go straight to the [June 3] G1 Epsom Oaks."

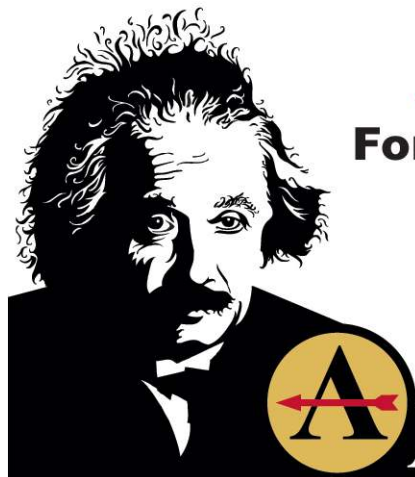

Crisford added, "We weren't sure whether to run here or in an Oaks trial, but Sheikh Mohammed decided even before White Moonstone went wrong that he wanted her to come here, as this has always been a lucky race for us looking ahead to the Oaks. She had a little chip in her ankle after the listed race, so was here in Newmarket for the winter, but I don't think it made a difference. Mahmood has fitted very well into the team, and is a tremendous character and great enthusiast, so we couldn't be more pleased with the way it's turning out." Al Zarooni added, "This is very special, but admitted, "We always thought she was a mile-and-a-half filly who wanted soft ground, so everything we thought was wrong." Sheikh Mohammed confirmed the impression of the winner as a hybrid middle-distance performer when saying, "I think she is bred to stay. She was beautifully ridden, and we will aim for the Oaks." **Moonlight Cloud (GB)** (Invincible Spirit {Ire}), who was sent off the 9-2 favorite, made smooth progress from rear to arrive on the front end approaching the final quarter, but could not go with the main protagonists and faded into seventh. The 6-1 second favorite **Memory (Ire)** (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) almost refused to leave the stalls and tailed throughout.

***At the Mercy of the Elements...***

Maqaasid's jockey Richard Hills was left wondering what might have been had the strong wind not intervened at a crucial time. "She's run a huge race, a gust of wind came and took her stride as we were making our run and she's only little, so it made a big difference to her," he told the *Racing Post*. Together's jockey Colm O'Donoghue told the trade daily, "Richard Hills came at me and we beat him off, but then Frankie rushed us and did us on the line. We couldn't believe how bad her last run was, so we're delighted she's shown her true form."

"Ideally, you'd want those kind of fractions for a five-furlong work-- :13, :25 and so on. And that's just what they did," trainer Todd Pletcher told a large group of assembled media yesterday morning. "They both handled the 'off' going well. It was a textbook 1:01 work, which is just what we were after. I said he needed to have a perfect three weeks [at Churchill Downs] if he were to run in the Derby, and so far, we have. His work today was better than the last one, and his appetite and appearance are much better than they've

been. We've still got a week to go, but we are where we want to be right now." Of the work, Repole added, "I'm not the expert here, but the horse [Uncle Mo] I saw today was a whole lot different than the one who left Belmont Park two weeks ago. A whole lot different. I talked to Johnny [Velazquez] after the work, and he said he watched it and he loved it. He said 'I wouldn't trade places with anyone.'" Of Uncle Mo's entymate, Pletcher offered, "I think [Sunday's] work was the best I've ever seen him have. The way he hung in there and the way he galloped out was very encouraging. His last race [a seventh-place finish in the GI Florida Derby Apr. 3] wasn't for real. It was hot--92 degrees--and he didn't like it at all. He was wet; not what you'd call washed out, but it appeared he was overheated. He seemed to cool down some going over to the gate and I thought he might run his race, but he didn't. I'm throwing the race out."

**Pants On Fire Works...**

George and Lori Hall's **Pants On Fire** (Jump Starts) breezed a half-mile in :47.80 with jockey Rosie Napravnik up. Among the first to visit the sloppy track following the renovation break Sunday morning, the handsome bay worked from the half-mile pole to the finish line through splits of :11.80 and :24, galloping out five furlongs in 1:01.80. "We had said :48 would be perfect, so we got what we wanted," trainer Kelly Breen said. "He pulled up good, didn't turn a hair. Now it's all up to the racing gods. He's fit and ready to go." In his latest start, the colt scored in the nine-furlong GI Louisiana Derby Mar. 26. "He showed a lot of improvement going into there and he showed a little bit of a spark and still he's maintained it," Breen said. **No Derby for Anthony's Cross...**

A D K Racing's **Anthony's Cross** (Indian Charlie) will not make it to Kentucky for Saturday's Classic, according to trainer Eoin Harty. The GII Robert B. Lewis S. winner, who is currently No. 21 on the 20-horse Derby-eligible list, will "look to other options" confirmed his Irish-born conditioner. "We got to thinking about it, and we decided it was just going to be too much hassle," Harty said. "You ship all the way down there and then, if you don't get to run, you've got to ship all the way back. And right now, it doesn't look good for us running, so rather than hanging on hope, we just decided it would be best for all if we said 'no go.' We've got lots of other options with this colt, and I'm zeroing in on one of them, but we'll definitely live to fight another day. We would have loved to have come, but often these things work out for the best."

**Toby's Corner Readies at Fair Hill..**

Dianne Cotter's homebred **Toby's Corner** (Bellamy Road), winner of the GI Wood Memorial, breezed six furlongs in 1:15 Sunday morning over the Tapeta surface at the Fair Hill Training Center in Elkton, Maryland. "It was very non-eventful," confirmed trainer Graham Motion. "It went exactly how I hoped it would. Basically, it is exactly what we did with him before the Wood Memorial." While split times were not available, Motion indicated that the move went exactly as planned. The colt was accompanied by exercise rider James Slater. "The most important thing to me was that he didn't go off too fast and that he finished up nicely," Motion said. "That's exactly what he did." Toby's Corner is scheduled to walk today and will be shipped by van to Churchill Downs tomorrow. Eddie Castro will ride the colt in the Kentucky Derby.

**Joyful Victory Relishes the Churchill Slop...**

Fox Hill Farms' **Joyful Victory** (Tapit) skipped over Churchills' wet track Sunday morning, turning in a bullet five-work in :59.20. Ridden by jockey Gabriel Saez, the grey recorded the fastest work at the distance by a full second yesterday. Working in company with 5-year-old stablemate Payton d'Oro (Medaglia d'Oro), the filly posted internal fractions of :11, :22, :34.20, :46.40 and :59.20 before galloping out six furlongs in 1:13.80. Joyful Victory finished up about seven lengths in front of her stablemate. "She really did well," trainer Larry Jones said. "We just wanted a good work in her because the work last week was on the same kind of a track. We put the other horse out there to kind of make sure that she knew someone was around, because she'll get to loafing a little bit coming down the lane. She just kind of

galloped away from [Payton d'Oro, who won the GII Black-Eyed Susan two years ago]." Third in the GI Frizette S. last term, Joyful Victory won the GIII Honeybee S. and the GII Fantasy S. at Oaklawn Park in her two most recent starts. "Gabriel never asked her for anything," added Jones. "It was a good work. It's what we wanted. We set out to go in :59, knowing that the track could play a little different. When he got her in :59 1/5, that's as good as we could hope out of Gabriel and it was all well." While having recorded all of her prior wins on a fast track, Jones pointed out her penchant for the off going. "She's done very well [on a wet surface]," he said. "Everybody knows that saying that you can't bet against a gray in the mud. If it was to rain Friday-- we're not going out of our way and praying for rain-- but if it rains, we're not going to be afraid to go out there."

**Arienza Out of Oaks...**

Robert and Lawana Low's **Arienza** (Giant's Causeway) is no longer under consideration for Friday's GI Kentucky Oaks and will most likely run in the GIII Eight Belles S. on the Oaks undercard, trainer Danny Peitz confirmed yesterday. "I just think that right now I'm doing the best thing for the horse," Peitz said. Peitz indicated the daughter of Horse of the Year Azeri (Jade Hunter) will stick to shorter distances this season.

**All is Well With Zazu...**

Trainer John Sadler confirmed Sunday that "all is well" with Jerry and Ann Moss' Kentucky Oaks candidate **Zazu** (Tapit), one day after her seven-furlong drill in 1:24.40. "We're all good here," said Sadler from his Hollywood base Sunday. "She came out of it fine and we're getting ready to ship. We'll do a little something with her on the track [today], then she's on a flight early [tomorrow] morning." Zazu, first or second in six of her seven starts, including a tally in the GI Las Virgenes S. at Santa Anita in February, will be sent to Kentucky aboard a Tex Sutton flight scheduled to leave Los Angeles at 4 a.m. Tuesday morning. The flight is expected to transport several California-based horses with designs on several Churchill Downs stakes this week, including the Oaks and the Kentucky Derby.

***Stamina Tests Unlikely for Frankel...***

Henry Cecil cast major doubt on the possibility of stretching out **Frankel (GB)** (Galileo {Ire}) for a tilt at the 10-furlong G2 Dante S. at York May 12 and G1 Epsom Derby over a mile and a half June 4. Following the dramatic six-length success of Khalid Abdullah's unbeaten colt in Saturday's G1 2000 Guineas at Newmarket, a possible run in the Dante was touted, but that was all but ruled out by his trainer yesterday.

"Obviously, the Prince will make a decision, and we can tell him what we feel, but the Dante comes up very quick, and to run in a Derby would slightly be guessing," Cecil explained. "It is far more probable, but not definite, that he could go to Royal Ascot for the [June 14] G1 St James's Palace S., and take on the older horses over a mile later in the year. There is the G1 Sussex S. [Goodwood July 27] and G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. [Ascot Oct. 15], and we'll put him in the mile-and-a-quarter races like the G1 Juddmonte International [York Aug. 17], as I think he will get that trip now he's settling. It's all up in the air, but if I don't feel the Derby is right for him, he mustn't go for it. You are going into completely unknown territory, and with the speed he has got, he'd have to be an extraordinary horse to do it. I feel we'd be much better to feel our way and not abuse him. I think at the back of his mind, the Prince is not for Epsom either, and I'm sure [Racing Manager] Teddy [Grimthorpe] will announce it in the next day or two on his behalf. I think eventually, when he grows up and gets a bit stronger, there's every chance he'll get a mile and a quarter. Whether he'll get further than that, time will tell, but I'm not going to test him in the Dante to see if he gets the Derby trip."

On speculation of a drop to sprinting, Cecil was quick to discount that prospect.

"I've no intention of thinking of the G1 July Cup [at Newmarket July 9], and I don't think the Prince is either. I think it will be a mile campaign before moving up to a mile and a quarter, but he'll tell us and we could change our mind."

Reflecting on the brilliant performance, the trainer added, "It might sound very facetious, but I expected him to do exactly what he did, because we planned it. He wasn't pulling, he was relaxed, and at the end, was getting a bit lazy and had no competition."

Frankel emerged from the race with no problems, according to Cecil, who concluded, "He ate up last night and was hollering for his breakfast this morning, so he's fine. He had 10 minutes stretching his legs and 15 minutes picking grass, and it looks as if he's taken it well--he had a race, but was not distressed. He looks exhausting to watch, but he's well within himself, and so probably didn't have as hard a race as people think. We are in no rush, so we'll bring him back quietly."

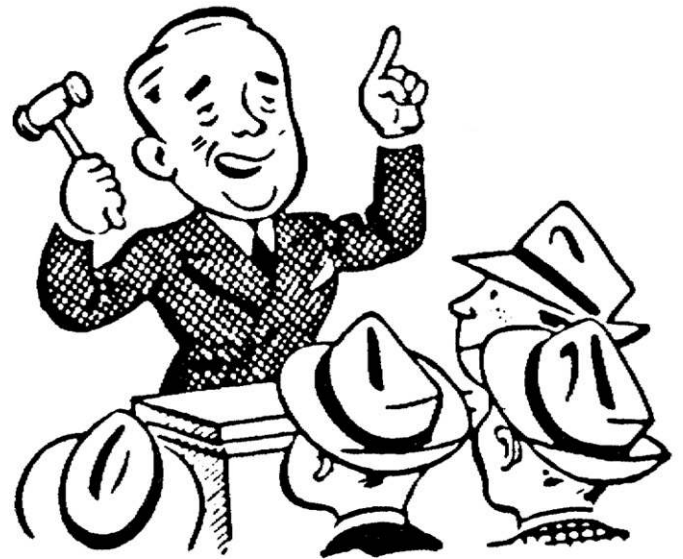

**You never know where the next Kentucky Derby winning owner might come from. In the last five years, we've had...**

*...A baseball executive and his wife from Pennsylvania who had been in the business 30 years when their homebred stormed to victory in 2006.*

*...A publisher from Chicago, by way of Pittsburgh, who got his start in racing with Dogwood Stable when he retired in 1983, but celebrated a homebred Derby victory in 2007.*

*...A brash New York investment banker who'd formed a racing partnership just five years earlier, then teamed up with the president of a New York trucking company on a horse that had broken his maiden on the Saratoga turf.*

*...The Stetson-wearing horse trainer and veterinarian from New Mexico who bought a champion Canadian juvenile privately and, the following year, saw him trucked cross-country in a two-horse trailer to take the roses at 50-1.*

*...A pair of Texans who met on the backstretch at Ak-Sar-Ben, went on to success in the communications and heavy equipment industries, then teamed up on a Kentucky farm..and 10 years later were holding aloft the Derby trophy for a colt they'd bought in utero.*

This year's line-up is no exception. The *TDN* will talk to the owners of the five Derby candidates who emerged victorious from the five Grade I preps, to find out what it means to them to be living the dream.

### ***Close Last Year, LaPenta Aims for Redemption...***

It wouldn't be a surprise if Robert LaPenta arrived at Saturday's GI Kentucky Derby clutching every amulet, horse shoe and rabbit's foot he could find. Luck, after all, was hard to come by for the Connecticut-based owner a year ago, when his Ice Box (Pulpit) endured a brutal trip in the Rose for the Roses--the official comment line reads "steadied, blocked, steadied"--that left the GI Florida Derby winner a tough-beat second. Now, LaPenta is back in Louisville with another Florida Derby hero, the lightly raced Dialed In (Mineshaft). And he feels a clean trip--which in the Derby, could be a synonym for lucky--might be all that's needed for his colt to wear the roses.

"I think Ice Box was the best horse last year, but racing's racing," LaPenta said Friday. "We're back again, and Dialed In couldn't be doing any better. I could be wrong, but I think his best race is ahead of him, and I think it's going to come very soon."

LaPenta has achieved much since getting his start in racing in 1998. Born and raised in Yonkers, New York, LaPenta entered the sport with sterling business

credentials. As vice president of the defense contractor Loral Corporation from 1972 to 1996, he helped grow revenue from \$20 million to \$7 billion, according to *Business Week*. When Loral was acquired by Lockheed Martin, LaPenta left to start L-3 Communications, a technologies firm that achieved \$8 billion in annual revenue under his direction. In 2005, LaPenta formed L-1 Investment Partners, a private equity investment firm dedicated to investing in companies in security and identity management.

Headly stuff, and LaPenta was determined to bring that acumen to his racing endeavors. Initially a member of Rick Pitino's OI Memorial Stable, LaPenta left the relative safety of racing partnerships to launch his own venture in 2001. The goal? To win Triple Crown races. The business plan, conceived with the help of future Hall of Famer Nick Zito, was simple enough: buy yearlings that had pedigrees and physicals for the Classics, run them through 2-year-old in training sales, then keep and race the ones that don't sell. A simple business plan isn't the same as an easy business plan, but the pair enjoyed immediate success.

LaPenta's first big horse, The Cliff's Edge, was part of that initial crop of yearlings he purchased under the banner Whitehorse Stable. Bought for \$200,000 at KESEF, and later bought back for \$195,000 at

FTFFEB, The Cliff's Edge won the GII Kentucky Jockey Club S. at two in 2003. At three, he was a close-up third in the GI Florida Derby, then rallied from well back to pin down Lion Heart (Tale of the Cat) in the GI Blue Grass S., giving LaPenta his first win at the highest level. It

looked like added ground would only help The Cliff's Edge, and he was made the morning-line favorite for the Kentucky Derby. Smarty Jones would ultimately leave the gate as the crowd's choice, and the crowd got it right. LaPenta, meanwhile, suffered his first bit of bad luck in the Triple Crown. The Cliff's Edge threw not one but *two* front shoes, and finished a well-beaten fifth. It was one of LaPenta's first lessons on managing not only his expectations, but those of friends and family, too.

"This is a great family sport--people are tracking the horses and calling me at night to talk about this horse or that horse, and after a big loss or a disappointing effort, you don't want them to become disillusioned," he said. "Half of the problem after losing is trying to get people up off the ground when you're kind of down on the ground yourself. The dynamics are very unique."

A year after The Cliff's Edge, Andromeda's Hero (Fusaichi Pegasus) got LaPenta back to the Derby, running eighth to Giacomo (Holy Bull). He skipped the Preakness, then completed the exacta behind Afleet Alex (Northern Afleet) in the GI Belmont S. He probably wouldn't rank as one of LaPenta's best horses, but that doesn't mean he doesn't have a spot in his owner's heart.

"'Andromeda' was such a great horse for us," said LaPenta. "In a very lean year, he brought us to all the big races, and he performed well."

Moreover, the colt would come back to figure in a later business dealing.

In early 2008, LaPenta and Zito had the winter-book favorite for the Derby in their barn in the form of War Pass (Cherokee Run). Unbeaten at two, War Pass won the GI Champagne S. and GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile en route to divisional honors in 2007, and the 113 Beyer War Pass earned in the Juvenile understandably left his connections dreaming of roses. But he exited his final Derby prep--a runner-up effort in the GI Wood Memorial S.--with a fractured sesamoid, which kept him from the Derby, and ultimately ended his racing career.

Bad luck again, but the sting of losing a horse who would have been one of the favorites for the Derby was assuaged by the unheralded Da' Tara (Tiznow). A rank 38-1 outsider entering the '08 Belmont with just a maiden win to his credit, Da' Tara led every step and shocked a New York crowd expecting a Big Brown (Boundary) Triple Crown coronation.

After a modest 2009 season--Miner's Escape (Mineshaft) was last in the Belmont in their only Triple Crown appearance--LaPenta and Zito were back at it last season. In addition to Ice Box's strong showing in last year's Derby, Jackson Bend (Hear No Evil), in whom LaPenta has purchased an interest from Jacks of Better Farm, ran third in the Preakness, beaten just 3/4 lengths by Lookin At Lucky (Smart Strike). That's a lot of success for a stable that rarely spends more than \$200,000 for a yearling--Dialed In being a rare exception as a \$475,000 yearling--and is a source of pride for LaPenta.

"When I first got involved in a meaningful way, all my friends said, 'Are you crazy? This is a sport where you do nothing but pour money down the drain,'" said LaPenta. "I told them that my plan was to race at the highest level of the game, but apply business principles to it and do it in a fiscally responsible way. I'm happy to say we've stuck to that, and we're very pleased with our results. But we haven't gotten the big jewel yet. Last year, we knocked on the door real hard. I'm hoping this year we can knock it down."

allowance race at Gulfstream in March, then chased down fellow Derby hopeful Shackelford (Forestry) in the GI Florida Derby. The last victory, in concert with a loss by Uncle Mo (Indian Charlie), put Dialed In as the early favorite for the Derby, and LaPenta admits to feeling some

of the strain that carries with it.

"With our belief in this horse, I think it's been a little more stressful," he said of the run-up to the Derby. "We've been counting down now what seems like a lot longer than 30 or 60 days or whatever. It's been a stressful road to the Triple Crown, but I'm glad we're getting close. It's been such a crazy road this year with all of the upsets. Plus we're going in thinking we have a horse that is very, very special. We just want to get into that gate on the first Saturday in May and have him prove how great it is."

It's also seems that LaPenta feels Dialed In isn't getting the respect he deserves.

"The only horse who has won as the favorite on the Derby trail this year, I think, is Dialed In," he said. "The only one not to have lost to a 3-year-old is Dialed In. The race in Florida [defeat in allowance race], it wasn't ideal for him to run against older horses, but in hindsight, I think it ended up being great. The pace was slow, he got caught inside--Julien [jockey Leparoux] said he was trying to give him a little experience--and I was impressed with the way he closed once he got loose. And if you're going to lose a race, that's the one you want to lose. It took a lot of buzz off the horse and a lot of people jumped off the bandwagon."

One horse that concerns LaPenta in the Derby is a horse he himself used to own: Mike Repole's Stay Thirsty (Bernardini), a half-brother to none other than Andromeda's hero. LaPenta bought Stay Thirsty as a yearling for \$160,000 at KEESEP, then sold him to Repole for \$500,000 as a FTFFEB 2-year-old. LaPenta said it was a matter of hours before seller's remorse set in.

"If I could redo that, I would not have sold Stay Thirsty--and not only because he wound up being a really quality horse," said LaPenta. "Putting myself back at the exact moment of the sale, I loved Bernardini, and I loved [dam] Marozia, and I wouldn't have sold the horse for that price. That night I said, 'Wait a minute, how did I just sell a Bernardini out of Marozia for \$500,000?' I mean, \$1 million, \$1.2 million--sure. And frankly, he's a horse I'm worried about in the Derby."

"I think he's going to get the distance, Ramon [Dominguez] is going to ride him well, and I think he didn't like the heat and you have to throw out the Florida Derby. And if you like Toby's Corner, you have to like him."

Stay Thirsty beat subsequent GI Wood Memorial S. winner Toby's Corner (Bellamy Road) in the GIII Gotham S. before running seventh to Dialed In in the Florida Derby.

For LaPenta, part of the thrill of a Derby win would be that he did it with Zito, a fellow New Yorker who's become a close friend over the years.

"We're alike in many ways, and we're different in many ways--we're complementary," said LaPenta. "We formed a friendship, a bond, that's unique in this sport. We've been very loyal to each other. I use the words 'team' and 'partnership,' and I think we have something very special in racing. We've been through some very tough periods--we've gone through periods where we lost 40 races in a row, and horses were up the track. We've had difficult conversations, like everybody does. But it's always been--let's just keep hitting the ball, hitting line drives, and eventually they'll start to drop in again."

This weekend, of course, they're hoping not for a line drive, but for the walk-off home run.

"Dialed In loves what he does," said LaPenta. "He's a remarkable horse--he's got a great nose for the wire--and let's hope he can do it." -L Marquardt
