E Paul Robsham Stables LLC's **R Heat Lightning** (Trippi), the expected favorite for Friday's GI Kentucky Oaks, has been ruled out of the prestigious \$1-million event for sophomore fillies after heat was discovered in her right knee. "We detected heat in her right knee this morning and she was slightly off at the jog," reported conditioner Todd Pletcher.

"It's unfortunate. She's a very talented filly and has been

training great. We've scheduled an appointment for an evaluation later this week at Rood and Riddle clinic in Lexington." R Heat Lightning had worked a half in :48 1/5 over a fast Churchill strip Saturday. Winner of the GI Spinaway S. last September, R Heat Lightning established herself as a leader of her generation with a 7 1/4-length romp in the GII Davona Dale S. at Gulfstream Feb. 26 and an 8 1/4-length tour-de-force back at the Hallandale Beach oval in the GII Gulfstream Park Oaks Apr. 2.

A number of GI Kentucky Derby and Oaks contenders had their final preparations over a sloppy track at Churchill Downs Monday. GI Santa Anita Derby hero **Midnight Interlude** (War Chant), GI Blue Grass S. upsetter **Brilliant Speed** (Dynaformer) and **Nehro** (Mineshaft), who figures to take significant action coming off second-place runs in the GI Arkansas Derby and GII Louisiana Derby, headlined the worktab for the colts. SO YOU THINK LEAVES NO DOUBT

Australian-campaigned superstar **So You Think** (NZ) (High Chaparral {Ire}) enjoyed the easiest of introductions to European racing yesterday with a 10-length romp in the G3 Mooresbridge S. at The Curragh. The two-time G1 Cox Plate winner had been allowed time to acclimatize to his new surroundings, but the former Bart Cummings trainee had set tongues wagging with his prep work for this first race in 181 days. Under a tight grip from Seamie Heffernan in the early stages behind the Ballydoyle rabbit and eventual runner-up **Bob le Beau (Ire)** (Big Bad Bad {Ire}), the five-time Group 1 winner eventually settled into a more languid rhythm. Given some rein approaching the final quarter, the dark bay responded by cruising to the front there and was pushed out to impose his total superiority. "He is an incredible horse and we feel privileged to have him," Aidan O'Brien said.

Midnight Interlude Fires Bullet...

Arnold Zetcher's homebred **Midnight Interlude** (War Chant) splashed through five panels in 1:00.80 under the Twin Spires Monday morning. It was the fastest of seven drills at the distance and a fifth of a second quicker than his workmate, MGSW Mythical Power (Congaree). The work's internal fractions were :12.40, :24.40, :36.40 and :48:20. "Midnight Interlude has been improving every day since I've been here," said conditioner Bob Baffert of the Santa Anita Derby winner. "He's still green. He's learning how to run. I worked him with his workmate, and once he gets in front of the workmate, he wants to shut it down a little bit. He's figuring it out,

though. He's doing a little catch-up." Baffert acknowledged that, while Midnight Interlude outworked his partner from a time standpoint, it was by design. "[The riders] had radios on them, and I didn't want [Mythical Power] to do too much, because he's running Friday [in the GIII Alysheba S.]," Baffert explained. "He just went five-eighths and the other horse kept going. That's why it might have looked like that. But when [Midnight Interlude] got in front of him, he wanted to shut it down. The workmate could have kept him going a little bit farther. He's a horse that needs a target. He's going to be running in the last part of it, but he does need a target, but he sort of gets lost out there."

Midnight Interlude cont.

Baffert continued, "In the Santa Anita Derby, when Comma to the Top just took off from him, he was completely lost for a few jumps and [jockey Victor Espinoza] had to really get into him. Then all of a sudden he realized, 'I've got to catch that horse.' He's learning, but he only has four or five days to learn. But, believe me, he will have plenty of targets."

Brilliant Speed Handles Surface...

Live Oak Plantation's **Brilliant Speed** (Dynaformer) got acclimated to the Churchill Downs main track with a five-furlong breeze in 1:01.20 under Tom Albertrani's assistant trainer Dan Blacker Monday. The GI Blue Grass S. winner carved out splits of :12.60, :36.40 and :48.40, and he galloped out six furlongs in 1:15 flat. "I thought he went well," said Albertani. "The work was good and he galloped out nicely. I thought it was a nice work--what we were looking for. He continued, "I just wanted to see how he handled the track. Today wasn't the best day with the rain that we've been having. Ideally, I would have preferred a fast track, but there is no guarantee what the track might be like on Saturday, either. Today was just kind of a maintenance move and I thought he worked well."

Nehro Has Easy Work...

Zayat Stables LLC's **Nehro** (Mineshaft) had an easy four-furlong breeze in :51.20 in the Churchill slop yesterday. Under regular exercise rider Carlos Rosas, the bay recorded splits of :13 flat, :25.60 and :38 flat, finishing up in :13.20 for the 34th fastest of 28 drills at the distance. He galloped out five furlongs in an unpressured 1:05.40. "It went nice and smooth," said trainer Steve Asmussen. "We didn't do a lot with him at all; Saturday will be three races in six weeks and we just hope he continues to progress. Obviously, it's a big assignment, but the mile-and-a-quarter suits him." He said of his handling of the Arkansas Derby runner-up, "I think we're just letting him be happy. The horse hasn't always been a big work horse. I think the progression's been slow. He took a big step from his maiden race to the Louisiana Derby. I think Mr. Zayat showed a lot of confidence in him with that move. From the way he trained, I was definitely wanting validation of the maiden race and, if anything, he's definitely backed that up." Asmussen added, "The horse has got a great mind. He's stayed very consistent with his appetite and his attitude, but he's not one to impress you with his works." Of Nehro's "wise guy" status, Asmussen quipped, "I don't want any 'mooshers' on board. I think he can carry us, but I don't think he can carry their bad luck."

Santiva Tries to Beat the Crowd...

Tom Walters' **Santiva** (Giant's Causeway) was sent out to work at 5:45 a.m. Monday morning by Eddie Kenneally in an effort to beat the crowd and get a pristine surface, and he recorded a half-mile drill in :50.20 in company with stablemate Commonwealth Rush (Afleet Alex). "He came home in :24 flat from the quarter pole to the wire, so I'm very happy with that," said Kenneally. "I tried to get out there early today when the track was as even as it could be. We worked over the best possible surface given the weather." Derby rider Shaun Bridgmohan, who was aboard for the work, added, "We're less than a week out from the race so it's more maintenance and you're not looking for anything special. I thought he went well."

Watch Me Go Handles Slop...

Gilbert Campbell's GII Tampa Bay Derby-winning homebred **Watch Me Go** (West Acre) had his final Derby work yesterday--a day after originally planned due to wet weather. Despite admitting that her charge isn't as comfortable on an off track, trainer Kathleen O'Connell was pleased with the five-furlong drill in 1:02 flat. "I like a long warm-up," she explained. "I wasn't looking for speed. [Rider Freddie Lenclud] was perfect. He had worked this horse before, so I had faith in him." Watch Me Go, who will be ridden Saturday by Rafael Bejarano, galloped out six furlongs in 1:15 flat and seven panels in 1:29.20.

Plum Pretty Relishes Going in Final Oaks Work...

Peachtree Stable's Plum Pretty (Medaglia d'Oro), who was last seen annexing the Mar. 27 Sunland Park Oaks by an eye-catching 25 lengths, relished the slop in her final preparation for Friday's GI Kentucky Oaks Monday under regular pilot Martin Garcia. The Grade I-placed bay posted fractions of :12.40, :24.80, and :36.80 en route to a published four-furlong spin in :48.80. Plum Pretty galloped out in 1:01.60. "I was really happy with the way she went today," said Bob Baffert. "She likes the slop. She loves that stuff."

Daisy Devine Has Quick Blowout...

GI Fair Grounds Oaks heroine Daisy Devine (Kafwain) blew out three furlongs in :35.80 Monday in advance of Churchill Downs' Friday feature. Her work was more than a second faster than the next quickest at the distance, and the James Miller colorbearer galloped out in :49.20. "Perfect," conditioner Andrew McKeever beamed. "I told [rider Larry Melancon] to let her do what she wants to do. I wanted a little decent work because she's going to have to run hard and she looked good. She really quickened up at the eighth pole when he asked her to, so it was perfect. And she came back happy." Of his runner's inexperience racing over a wet track, McKeever said, "It doesn't seem to matter to her. As long as it's a dirt track she seems to like it. [Churchill is] similar to the Fair Grounds, and we know she liked that."

The app was available for download on Apple Thursday, April 28 and will provide instant, real-time access to the latest GI Preakness S. updates, including news releases, historical data, blogs and wagering information. The app will be available on Android and BlackBerry later this week. In addition, the app will provide facts and figures on the daily races during Pimlico Race Course's spring meeting, including handicapper Frank Carulli's morning line and pre-race program notes as well as scratches, results (with payouts) and video replays. "Social media has changed the landscape of how we communicate," said Maryland Jockey Club president Tom Chuckas. "We thought it was logical to launch this new platform around our biggest event but plan on utilizing it year-round." The 136th running of the \$1-million Preakness, the middle jewel of the Triple Crown, is Saturday, May 21.

The Long and Winding Road...

It's a trip that can take four hours--or more than 40 years. Alorton, Illinois, is just 258 miles from Louisville, Kentucky, a straight shot on I-64. The little town, once

home to now-shuttered Cahokia Downs, is where Arnold Zetcher discovered the sport of racing. This week, after decades spent zigzagging across the country as a high-powered executive in the world of retailing, Zetcher will land in Louisville as the owner of Kentucky Derby hopeful **Midnight Interlude** (War Chant).

Sounding like a kid on Christmas morning, Zetcher said, "It's pretty amazing."

Born and raised in St. Louis, Missouri, Zetcher didn't stray far when it

came time to go to college, attending Washington University in his hometown. And, after a long day spent studying, where did he go to kick back and have fun? The racetrack.

"They had night racing across the river in East St. Louis at Cahokia Downs and Fairmont Park, and that's where we'd go," Zetcher recalled. "We enjoyed going out, we liked the thrill of watching the horses run. We weren't gambling large amounts, just small bets, but it was still a thrill. And I always loved the beauty of the horses competing against each other. It was just something that attracted me from the start."

Following graduation, the Missouri native put his shoulder to the wheel, focusing his passion and energy on his work. His dedication paid off--Zetcher quickly climbed the ranks in retailing. He was just 37 when he was named the CEO of New York City-based Bonwit Teller, a high-end women's clothing store. After a stint as CEO of Kohls Food Stores, he joined Talbots, a chain of women's specialty stores headquartered in Massachusetts, in 1987. Eight years later he was honored as the CEO of the Year by *Finance World*.

But, no matter where his work happened to take him, he always tried to find time for his one real hobby.

"I've been in retailing my whole life and, when you're in retail, you end up living in a number of different cities," Zetcher said. "But wherever I lived, I'd go to the races, whether it was Arlington Park in Chicago, or New York or San Francisco or wherever."

He and his wife Ellen tossed around the idea of venturing into ownership a number of times before finally deciding to take the plunge.

"About 10 years ago, we decided it was time maybe to get into it," Zetcher remarked. "I'd been a fan of racing for all my life, and it was time to try a different phase of it."

But, as is the case with so many trying to make the transition, Zetcher was unsure how to proceed.

"I wasn't sure how to get into it," he said. "And, even though I was living in Boston at the time, I always felt that California racing had the best year-round horse racing, and that was what I wanted to do."

"I had a friend who had some horses and I told him I was interested in getting started, but wasn't sure how to do it, and he said, 'Well, I have a horse that we bred that's with Ron McAnally, would you like to talk to him?'"

Zetcher was a captain of his industry, but he was awestruck at the idea of rubbing elbows with a Hall of Fame trainer.

"I said, 'My goodness, would he talk to me? It's Ron McAnally!'" he said with a chuckle. "But my friend set up the date and I went out to California and Ron and I talked. We bought our first horse through Ron, and I was pretty much totally with Ron for six or seven years."

They were good years, too. McAnally found Gabriellina Giof (GB) (Ashkalani {Ire}) for the Zetchers and, just five months after ordering their first set of pink and green silks, the couple had their first stakes winner. The British-bred mare captured the Manhattan Beach S. at Hollywood, and also ran second in the GII San Clemente H. Other stakes winners followed--GII Del Mar Derby hero and GI Hollywood Derby runner-up Fairly Ransom (Red Ransom), and GII Fantasy S. and GII Hollywood BC Oaks winner House of Fortune (Free House), who bankrolled \$989,185 at the track.

Eventually, however, the Zetchers determined that a different philosophy was in order.

"We started out with more older horses and foreign horses, but the last three or four years, we've concentrated on the younger horses," Zetcher explained. "It just seemed like it was a part of racing, a part of the industry, that we wanted to participate in."

With the change in focus came a change of trainer. Zetcher said that Bob Baffert was the obvious choice.

"I think Bob's the world's best trainer for young horses," he explained. "I'd watched him for the six or seven years that I'd had horses in California, and I had gotten to know him. He and I got along well, we'd become friends. Ellen and I went out to dinner with Bob and [wife] Jill. When I decided to move in a new direction, it was a pretty easy decision to make to move over to Bob."

The Zetchers celebrated their first Grade I win with Baffert, who saddled Gabby's Golden Gal (Medaglia d'Oro) to an upset

victory at 13-1 in the 2009 GI Acorn S. They took the GI Pacific Classic in '09 and '10 with private purchase Richard's Kid (Lemon Drop Kid). Zardana (Brz) (Crimson Tide {Ire}) beat Horse of the Year Rachel Alexandra (Medaglia d'Oro) in the New Orleans Ladies S.

And they found themselves with a legitimate Kentucky Derby contender when Midnight Interlude captured the GI Santa Anita Derby--also at 13-1.

But, Zetcher said, "It was not a total surprise. When we first brought him to California, when Bob and his assistant trainer [Jim Barnes] first saw him, they said, 'Hey, this looks like a real possibility.'

"We ran him the first time going short, and it was clear he wanted more distance. He took third, then he came back in another maiden race and took second, and the third maiden race he ran, he won by about eight lengths, and could've won by 14 or 15. Joel Rosario was riding and it was clear he was winning, so he didn't push him, which was the right thing to do, but it was a really strong race. We thought he had a real chance to perform really well."

Still, Zetcher admitted, "When it happened, I was a little bit in shock that he had actually won it."

It has been a great run for the Baffert/Zetcher combination, but you have to give McAnally a nod for some of that success. Gabby's Golden Gal is a daughter of McAnally trainee Gabriellina Giof, part of the Zetchers' eight-strong broodmare band, and Midnight Interlude is out of another of the Zetchers' overseas finds, Midnight Kiss (NZ) (Groom Dancer).

"We bought the mare in New Zealand in 2004," Zetcher offered. "She had run three or four times down there, and came in third in the [G1] New Zealand Oaks. We brought her over to run in the American Oaks at Hollywood Park. Unfortunately, she got hurt before we were able to run her, but we held on to her and bred her."

The first foal out of the mare, Woods Road (Empire Maker), a \$3,000 KEENOV weanling sale, was winless in four starts; the second, Prime Kiss (Point Given), sold for \$15,000 as a KEEJAN yearling, and broke her maiden at Beulah Park. The owners were willing to let the mare go.

"At the time, the stable had gotten larger than we really wanted it to be, so we talked about trying to cut down a little bit," Zetcher said.

Midnight Kiss, who had RNA'd for \$200,000 with Woods Road in utero, went to the ring at Keeneland January 2008 carrying Midnight Interlude. She was bought back for \$70,000.

Looking back, Zetcher can breathe a sigh of relief. But, he added, "We didn't want to give her away. We put a healthy reserve on her and ended up keeping her."

And now they are headed to Louisville for the Kentucky Derby.

"We are just unbelievably honored to be in the Kentucky Derby," Zetcher said. "When you think that there are 30,000 foals every year, and only 20 go into the Derby, and we have one that's going in, and a homebred at that, well, we're just proud to be there."

The Zetchers will touch down in the Blue Grass State today, and the plan is to drink in the Derby experience.

"We're excited about it, we want to be a part of it all," Zetcher said. "We'll be with Bob much of the time, and he'll kind of lead us as to what we should be attending and all that kind of stuff. We're really looking forward to participating in the whole event."

They are realistic about their chances on the first Saturday in May.

"It's a large field and the trip is really important," Zetcher said.

But, after getting this close, it's hard to keep from dreaming.

"Everything tells us that distance is not going to be an issue for him," Zetcher said. "His mother, she ran a mile and three-eighths, a mile and a half. And we think Bob has really got him ready for this and we're ready to go."

Are there butterflies?

"Oh *yeah*," said Zetcher. "When any of our horses run, I get a little anxious, and this is the peak. We are nervous and kind of anxious and kind of wish it would hurry up and get here. But we're still going to try and enjoy every moment of it."

The subject of significant support when getting off the mark in a seven-furlong maiden on Dundalk's Polytrack last time Apr. 8, Emiyna took the leap into Pattern company in stride with an ultimately cosy defeat of the year-older dual group scorer Lolly For Dolly here. There was plenty of confidence in her chances in the betting ring beforehand, and Johnny Murtagh also showed his faith in the homebred as he settled her out the back door early. Traveling smoothly onto the heels of the leaders in a matter of strides passing halfway, the bay was eventually given the go-ahead and quickened to the front with a furlong remaining before holding the battle-hardened runner-up under mainly hand riding. "She is a good filly and will return here for the [May 22] G1 Irish 1000 Guineas," trainer John Oxx commented. Dunlop Points to Native Epsom Bid...

Ed Dunlop yesterday suggested that the G1 Epsom Derby could be the target for Saturday's G1 2000 Guineas third **Native Khan (Fr)** (Azamour {Ire}). While not ruling out a tilt at Chantilly's G1 Prix du Jockey-Club, the Newmarket-based conditioner is looking at the June 4 blue riband for Vefa Araci's colt, who was 6 1/2 lengths behind Frankel (GB) (Galileo {Ire}) last Saturday. "We were 11 lengths clear of the rest over a distance which is too short for us," Dunlop said. "You can take it as read that Native Khan won't be running over a mile again and either our Derby or the Prix du Jockey-Club will be his next race. He came out of the race in great shape and did not lose too much weight, and, while he would be eligible for the breeders premium if we went to Chantilly, I favour Epsom for obvious reasons, especially now that it looks as if Frankel will be sticking to a mile. Winning the Oaks at Epsom with Ouija Board was one of the biggest thrills that I have had in racing, and then we went back there and did it again with Snow Fairy last year, so it would be really special if we could win the Derby with Native Khan. However, I have always said that Native Khan's programme will be determined by the ground. He is too good a mover to operate on the soft, and as he will definitely not be having a prep race, we don't have to make an early decision. We will sit down with the owners nearer the time and decide which route to take."

Gold Has Curragh Aim...

Andrew Tinkler's G1 2000 Guineas runner-up **Dubawi Gold (GB)** (Dubawi {Ire}) is being pointed at the Irish equivalent at The Curragh May 21, trainer Richard Hannon announced yesterday. With Frankel (GB) (Galileo {Ire}) looking almost certain to head straight to Royal Ascot, connections of the colt, who was stepping up from wins on Lingfield's Polytrack in the Mar. 26 Listed Spring Cup and Apr. 9 Listed International Trial S., are keen to exploit the opportunity of garnering a first Classic at The Curragh. "To produce that sort of run after two wins on the all-weather at Lingfield shows what a decent horse Dubawi Gold is and, while he had a hard race, he has come back and eaten up, so we can start planning for Ireland," Hannon commented. "He'll go to the Curragh with a big chance, and I'm glad we won't be meeting Frankel there. But if he wins in Ireland, the logical target would then be the G1 St James's Palace S. at Royal Ascot, where we will probably cross swords again with Frankel. Racing is all about competition, and there is no use in ducking and diving every challenge that looks difficult."

Memory Gets Second Chance at Longchamp...

Highclere Thoroughbred Racing's **Memory (Ire)** (Daneshill Dancer {Ire}) will get the opportunity to atone for her no-show when second favorite in Sunday's G1 1000 Guineas at Newmarket in the French equivalent, connections revealed yesterday. Staying in the stalls for precious seconds in the mile Classic Sunday, last year's G2 Cherry Hinton S. and G3 Albany S. winner was allowed to coast to the line while detached from the field. She is likely to head to Longchamp for next Sunday's G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains. "It was a non-event and, though Longchamp is only two weeks away, she has not had a race as she just cantered up behind them, so there won't be any question of France coming too quick if that is the route we decide on," trainer Richard Hannon explained. "[Richard Hughes] said that Memory just refused to jump. She had been slow out in the Albany S. at Royal Ascot last year but, though she gave them 10 lengths start, she got away with it then and still won, whereas at Newmarket she was not having any of it. However, we will give her plenty of schooling through the gates at home and hope that she will be more co-operative next time. She has never been a straightforward filly, but she has a lot of talent and kidology rather than bullying is the way to win her over."

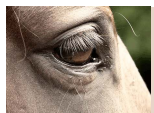

In the days following the passing of Sadler's Wells, there couldn't possibly have been a finer tribute to this magnificent stallion than the one paid by his exceptional grandson Frankel, with his jaw-droppingly brilliant display in the Qipco 2,000 Guineas.

The accompanying lists of the recent champion sires and broodmare sires in Britain and Ireland are another way of paying tribute to the Coolmore stalwart. These show him with 14 sires' championships, 13 of them consecutive, plus six successive titles on the broodmare sire listings.

These lists also provide some strong clues as to why Frankel is as immensely talented as he is. His sire is the remarkable Galileo, champion sire in two of the last three years and already a clear leader on the 2011 table.

Frankel's grandsires are Sadler's Well's and Danehill, the latter being the stallion who finally knocked Sadler's Wells off his throne in 2005 after finishing runner-up to him five times. One of those defeats was by less than £10,000 in 1997. Danehill went on to take the title of champion sire three times and--like Sadler's Wells--has already sired a champion sire, in Danehill Dancer.

In other words, these two stallions headed the table 17 times in the last 21 years, with their sons topping the list in three of the other four years. The solitary exception was Caerleon, who, together with all the other champion sires in the last 21 years was a Coolmore stallion.

It is a similar story with the four stallions in the third generation of Frankel's pedigree. They are Northern Dancer, Britain's champion sire in 1970, 1977, 1983 and 1984; Miswaki, champion broodmare sire in 1999 and 2001; Danzig, champion sire in North America two or three times (depending on where you look); and Rainbow Quest, champion broodmare sire in 2003 and 2004.

Success in the Epsom Derby also flows through these generations. Northern Dancer sired three winners of the Epsom Derby and Sadler's Wells sired two, as well as seven colts who finished second. One of Sadler's Wells's winners, Galileo, already has a Derby winner to his credit in New Approach. Sadler's Wells' brother Fairy King also sired a Derby winner and Galileo is himself a half-brother to another outstanding Derby winner in Sea The Stars, both being out of Miswaki's Arc winner Urban Sea.

Daughters of Rainbow Quest produced two Derby winners, including North Light to Danehill. With Danehill as her sire and a dam by Rainbow Quest, Frankel's dam Kind represents the same cross as North Light.

With all this encouragement, the Derby could be considered an automatic choice for Frankel, but--and this is a very big but--Kind was a totally different type of animal to North Light. North Light inherited comparatively little of Danehill's speed, his strong suit being some of the stamina which brought his dam Sought Out an easy victory in the Prix du Cadran over two and a half miles. Sought Out never won over less than 1 3/4 miles, so it wasn't too surprising to see North Light come up with a winner of Britain's longest classic, the St Leger, in his first crop.

Kind, on the other hand, inherited little of the stamina which had brought her dam Rainbow Lake an impressive success in the G3 Lancashire Oaks over a mile and a half. Instead she showed a good measure of the speed that had brought Danehill victory in two leading six-furlong events. After a maiden success over seven furlongs, Kind raced exclusively over five and six furlongs, winning listed races over each distance. *Timeform* described her as a strong, good-topped filly, and Frankel's imposing physique owes more to her than to Galileo, who was a more refined individual in training, when *Timeform* described him as neat and attractive.

Danehill's Northern Hemisphere daughters have a growing number of group winners to their credit. Predictably they are a varied bunch in terms of stamina, but they include Art Connoisseur, who, like Frankel, is by a stallion with a dam by Miswaki. Art Connoisseur emulated Danehill by winning the six-furlong Golden Jubilee S. (formerly Cork and Orrery S.). Frankel, with more stamina in his pedigree, has already shown he stays better than Art Connoisseur, but his keen temperament makes me question his ability to last the Derby distance. To do so, he would need to be ridden with more restraint than at Newmarket, which would effectively blunt his most effective weapon--his ground-devouring stride.

Frankel ranks alongside Teofilo, Cima de Triomphe and Roderic O'Connor as one of four Group 1 winners that Galileo has sired from Danehill mares.

I commented in length on the Galileo-Danehill cross last year, after Roderic O'Connor's victory in the Criterium International.

"It was...inevitable that breeders would send daughters of Danehill to Galileo from the moment he covered his first mares in 2002," I explained. "Although the first two foals from this cross both won, it was Teofilo, one of the two second-crop foals out of Danehill mares, who became its first stakes winner. Undeclared in five juvenile starts in 2006, including in the G1 National S. and the G1 Dewhurst, he ended the year as champion European two-year-old.

"The number of Danehill mares visiting Galileo had been steadily increasing, producing four named foals in 2005, five in 2006 and seven in 2007, but Teofilo's 2006 exploits opened the floodgates. There are 17 youngsters bred this way among Galileo's current [2010] 2-year-olds and, in addition to Frankel and Roderic O'Connor, they include Golden Lilac, an unbeaten daughter of the Group 1 winner Grey Lilas. (Golden Lilac recently maintained her unbeaten record in the G3 Prix de la Grotte, shaping like a future Group 1 winner).

"The incentive for sending Danehill mares to Galileo has been further increased by such distinguished representatives as Cima de Triomphe (2007 Derby Italiano), Cuis Ghaire (second in the 2009 1000 Guineas) and Gile Na Greine (a close third in the 2010 1000 Guineas). As a consequence, there are 19 [2010] yearlings from this cross, including brothers to Frankel and Roderic O'Connor and fillies out of the Group 1 winners Aquarelliste, Banks Hill, Echelon, Luas Line and Simply Perfect.

"At least another 24 were born in 2010, including a sister to Roderic O'Connor and there's even a filly out of Peeping Fawn, which is inbred 2x3 to Sadler's Wells."

I mentioned at the time that the number of foals of racing age representing this cross was given as 79 to the end of 2010 and now stands at 98. It was important to point out that these figures include a substantial number of foals sired by Galileo during the five seasons he spent in Australia. Those seasons yielded 565 foals, the youngest of which are three-year-olds of the 2010-11 Australian season.

Extraordinarily, a stallion responsible for 17 Group 1 winners in his Irish crops, has only one to his credit among his numerous Southern Hemisphere progeny, which include only five Australian group winners. However, Galileo's shortcomings in the Southern Hemisphere needn't concern us Europeans, as we have ample evidence that he is a worthy heir to his legendary sire.

One of the reasons for selecting a son of Sadler's Wells as a mate for Kind is the fact that Powerscourt, her half-brother by Sadler's Wells, had shown frequent flashes of top-class ability. Although he had his quirks, Powerscourt twice crossed the line in front in the GI Arlington Million and also took the 2004 G1 Tattersalls' Gold Cup by six lengths.

Frankel's third dam Rockfest was a successful staying two-year-old who went on to be second in the Lingfield Oaks Trial, and his fourth dam Rock Garden was a half-sister to Glen Strae, a very smart winner of six of his seven juvenile starts.

With a rating five pounds above Dream Ahead, Frankel was *Timeform's* undisputed two-year-old champion last year. He is by no means the first high-class juvenile produced by his female line. His fifth dam Nasira was by Persian Gulf out of Circassia, a daughter of the Queen Mary S. winner Samovar. Samovar's visits to Persian Gulf yielded Zabara, winner of the Cheveley Park S., 1,000 Guineas and Coronation S., and Rustam, one of the leading two-year-old of 1955.

People are already speculating about Frankel's stallion career. As the British and Irish industries are already steeped in the blood of his grandsires Sadler's Wells and Danehill, we will have to accept that a lot of mares will produce inbreeding to one or other of these great stallions. As both stallions have a well-earned reputation for transmitting soundness to their progeny, breeders are likely to be more than happy to inbreed to either of them. The first runner by the similarly-bred Teofilo is Parish Hall, who made an encouraging winning debut from the subsequent winners Raphael Santi and Requito at Leopardstown last month. Parish Hall is inbred 3x3 to Sadler's Wells, his dam being a daughter of Montjeu.

Beshear Signs Racing & Wagering Compact Bill:
 Kentucky Gov. Steve Beshear yesterday ceremonially signed The Racing and Wagering Compact, a law that, according to a release from the governor's office, "allows Kentucky to join other states that conduct pari-mutuel wagering and racing to adopt and implement uniform rules and regulations governing the sport." Officially known as SB 24, the law was sponsored by Sen. Damon Thayer and addresses the inconsistencies in rules and penalties that can occur between the 38 states that offer pari-mutuel wagering. "The Racing and Wagering Compact will give those in the industry a much more consistent avenue in which to operate," said Gov. Beshear. "I encourage other states that are considering this important legislation to act now in order to streamline what has become a burdensome process for owners, trainers, veterinarians and others who must look at many variations of the laws that govern their industry in order to come to work each day."

"I am very pleased that Kentucky is among the first to acknowledge the importance of this compact. I would especially like to acknowledge Rep. Susan Westrom and Rep. Larry Clark for their hard work and contributions to this effort." The governor's office said that states will retain autonomy under the bill, and that the compact isn't under federal control. The release stated: "The state racing commissions will still enforce the rules of racing in their respective jurisdiction. The compact requires a state's consent to a rule before it becomes applicable within that state's borders thus protecting the participating state's interests. The compact will become effective after the model bill has been adopted by six states. Kentucky is the first major racing jurisdiction to adopt the bill. Kentucky Horse Racing Commission Executive Director Lisa Underwood, who was on the committee that helped draft the legislation. "The compact will provide an efficient method for states to act together to adopt uniform rules. Industry stakeholders will have ample opportunities for input and deliberation. This will be beneficial to all of the participants in the industry."

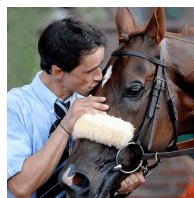

After a strong day of selling Monday, Gordon Cunningham's Curraghmore Stud was the leading vendor by both average and aggregate. "We've always considered this sale as a very viable commercial option for our clients, and again today that's proven to be the case," Cunningham said. "We had a smaller draft than normal this year, but the interest before the sale has been consistent with previous years, and again we achieved really good prices for the obvious horses. Both our top lots were bought by Australian interests, so it's again very encouraging to see that demand for our horses coming from Australia."
