**Canford Cliffs to Meet
 Dick Turpin in G1 Lockinge**

ARCHARCH RETIRED

Robert and Val Yagos's G1 Arkansas Derby winner **Archarch** (Arch--Woodman's Dancer, by Woodman) has been retired from racing. The dark bay suffered a condylar fracture of his front left ankle while finishing 15th in Saturday's G1 Kentucky Derby.

The surgery he underwent at Rood & Riddle Equine Hospital in Lexington Sunday was deemed successful, but it was decided that cartilage in the ankle was too damaged for

him to continue racing. Dr. Larry Bramlage performed the surgery and gave the Yagos the bad news.

"The cartilage damage was going to be irreparable--you can't regrow cartilage," Robert Yagos said yesterday. "He's going to have some stiffness in that ankle. Dr. Bramlage actually thought he probably could run again, but not at the level that he was running. That's not what we want for him. He's so competitive that he'd probably end up pushing himself and hurting himself again. So we're just going to retire him."

Yagos said Dr. Bramlage agreed with trainer Jinks Fires's initial assessment that the injury likely occurred

at the beginning of the Derby after the colt stumbled coming out of the starting gate. Yagos said that it was a testament to the colt's fortitude that he was able to finish the race. "It was a pretty good fracture, and for him to run a mile and a quarter on it without giving Jon [Court, jockey] any indication there was something wrong, that's a

horse with a big heart," he said.

UNCLE MO TO WINSTAR FOR TREATMENT

It was announced that **Uncle Mo** (Indian Charlie), last year's 2-year-old champion, left Churchill Downs for Winstar Farm Monday morning. Scratched a day before last weekend's G1 Kentucky Derby, the Mike Repole-owned colt is expected to undergo further treatment at the Versailles nursery. "It makes sense to keep him in the Lexington area, where he will have access to the best veterinary facilities," explained trainer Todd Pletcher. "WinStar Farm has a beautiful training facility, which includes a hyperbaric chamber and a first class staff. Our focus is to figure out what is going on internally with him and get him back to 100%. When we do figure this out, the horse is already fit, so we don't think it will take him long to get back to his 2-year old form." The colt, who scored in the Timely Writer S. in his seasonal debut, was diagnosed with a Gastro Intestinal infection following his third-place finish in the G1 Wood Memorial S. "The number one goal is to get Uncle Mo healthy, and I feel very confident with Elliott Walden [WinStar President/CEO] and his team," added Repole. "Todd trains many of Winstar's horses, and he and Elliott speak on a regular basis. Our second, distant goal when Uncle Mo gets back to the races is for him to be named 3-year-old champion and Horse of the Year."

Robert Yagos continued, "Jon did feel a little something, but thought it was the saddle problem. He stumbled leaving the gate and the saddle slipped forward a little bit, and Jon thought he was a little uncomfortable, but other than that he never gave any indication he was in distress or anything, and it didn't show up to the end of the race. Of course, we're not sure it happened out of the gate, but Dr. Bramlage said for as much damage as there was to his cartilage, that's probably where it happened. If he transfers that heart and desire he has to his offspring, there will be some nice babies out there." Yagos said the colt will remain at Rood &

Riddle for three or four more days, then rejoin Fires's string at Churchill. "That way, his groom can take care of him for about a month of stall rest," explained Yagos. "Then he'll probably walk for another month, then we'll ship him to a farm." Stud plans are undecided. "We visited a couple farms Sunday when we went to check on him, but we haven't made a choice yet," Yagos said. "We're new at this, so we want to go visit the rest of the farms down there. Then we'll see which one we like best and make a decision." Archarch was bred in Kentucky by Grapestock LLC and sold for \$60,000 at the 2009 Keeneland September Sale. He annexed the Sugar Bowl S. at Fair Grounds in December and the GIII Southwest S. at Oaklawn Feb. 21 in addition to his victory in the Apr. 16 Arkansas Derby. Archarch was produced by the MGSP Woodman's Dancer and is a half-brother to SW Run Sully Run (Cherokee Run). His second dam is Grade I winner Pattern Step (Nureyev). -BD/LM

Stonestreet Stables and George Bolton's **Astrology** (A.P. Indy) worked six furlongs in 1:12.40 Monday morning over a fast track at Churchill Downs. With Carlos Rosas aboard, the colt--working in company with 4-year-old Awesome Act (Awesome Again)--reeled off fractions of :13, :25, :37, :48.60, 1:00.40, galloping out seven furlongs in 1:25.40. He completed a mile in 1:39.60. "We liked the work," said Barbara Banke of Stonestreet Stables. "We'll see how he comes out of the work [before making a decision on the Preakness]. He looks good." Astrology, winner of last year's GIII Iroquois S., finished second most recently in the GII Jerome S. at Aqueduct Apr. 23.

Flashpoint Confirmed for Preakness..

Peachtree Stable's **Flashpoint** (Pomeroy) has been confirmed for the May 21 GI Preakness S. by owner John Fort yesterday.

"He's training up a storm, better than ever," Fort said. The lightly-raced colt, who won the Feb. 26 GII Hutcheson S., has been transferred to the care of Wesley Ward and has been in training at Keeneland. He turned in his second straight bullet workout of :59 seconds for five furlongs last Friday morning.

King Congie Readies for Preakness...

West Point Thoroughbreds' **King Congie** (Badge of Silver) breezed five furlongs in 1:01.14 over the main track at Belmont Park Monday morning. It was the sixth-fastest of 17 at the distance. "He worked very well [yesterday] morning," trainer Tom Albertrani said. "Hopefully, all goes well from now until the Preakness." Albertrani indicated the colt will work again at Belmont before the Preakness, and is likely to ship from New York to Baltimore the day before the

race. Winner of the Tropical Park Derby Jan. 1, he finished first in the Hallandale Beach S., but was disqualified and placed third for drifting out in the stretch. In his latest outing, the colt was third by a head in the GI Blue Grass S. at Keeneland.




RACETRACK Round-Up

PRETTY POLLY OPTION FOR FAIRY

Trainer Ed Dunlop yesterday suggested that Royal Ascot would come too soon for **Snow Fairy (Ire)** (Intikhab), who has the Curragh's G1 Pretty Polly S. as an alternative. Cristina Patino's dual Oaks and four-time Group One-winning 4-year-old has been held up with an injury sustained in the lead-up to the Dubai World Cup meeting, but is nearing a return. "She is back in ridden exercise and due to do her first canter this week, so is fully recovered from her injury and it's so far so good," Dunlop said. "We made the Royal Ascot entry, but to be honest, it's probably a little bit soon for her and the [June 25] Pretty Polly would be a race to try and be ready for if we don't make Ascot."

HANNON DUO SET FOR LOCKINGE CLASH

Richard Hannon yesterday admitted defeat in his attempt to keep his star milers **Canford Cliffs (Ire)** (Tagula {Ire}) and **Dick Turpin (Ire)** (Arakan) from taking each other on in the G1 Lockinge S. on Saturday. Last year's G1 Irish 2000 Guineas, G1 St James's Palace S. and G1 Sussex S. winner Canford Cliffs will be making his first appearance for his new part-owners Michael Tabor and Derrick Smith in the Newbury highlight, while John Manley's 2010 G1 Prix Jean Part hero Dick Turpin has the benefit of an outing after his win in the G2 Sandown Mile three weeks ago. "I walked the Newbury straight on Sunday morning and, following 31 millimetres of rain, the ground is absolutely beautiful, so in all, probability both Canford Cliffs and Dick Turpin will run," Hannon commented. "Obviously, I would rather keep them apart, and if I had my way, we would save Dick Turpin for the G1 Prix d'Ispahan in France on Sunday week, but John Manley, the colt's owner, justifiably makes the point that Dick has met Canford Cliffs three times and come out on top twice, and I know that he is keen to run at Newbury.

We are very lucky to have two of the best milers in Europe and, though Dick Turpin has the benefit of a run, Canford Cliffs is straight enough, having enjoyed a couple of recent racecourse gallops."

Also among the 11 remaining entries at yesterday's forfeit stage are Khalid Abdullah's **Twice Over (GB)** (Observatory), Tabor's **Jan Vermeer (Ire)** (Montjeu {Ire}) and Scuderia Incolinx's dual Classic hero **Worthadd (Ire)** (Dubawi {Ire}).

FOREST AIM FOR SETA

★ **"TDN Rising Star"** ★ **Seta (GB)** (Pivotal {GB}) will run in Royal Ascot's G2 Windsor Forest S., trainer Luca Cumani announced yesterday. Successful on her 4-year-old bow in the Listed Conqueror S. at Goodwood at the end of last month, Sarah and Robin Leigh's homebred will stay at a mile for the June 15 contest. "Seta's win at Goodwood was most pleasing, not least in view of the anticipation that preceded her reappearance last year only for the outcome to be rather deflating," her trainer said. "Her work this spring had suggested she had strengthened up over the winter and it was good to see her finish off her race much more strongly than last year. The Windsor Forest Stakes at Ascot is the next logical step and she'll go there without a race in between."

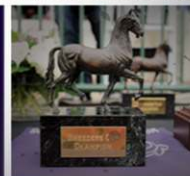

This contest was marred by the serious injury sustained by favorite Inoubliable (GB) (Singspiel {Ire}) in the final furlong, but it was Absolutly Yes who prevailed to stake his claim for the G1 Prix du Jockey-Club here June 5. Beaten on three occasions at Saint-Cloud and Longchamp last term, the bay returned with a new spring in his step and was off the mark in a mile conditions event at Longchamp Apr. 14. Settled behind Inoubliable and his pacesetting stable companion O'Kelly Hammer (Ire) (Intikhab) early, he was already getting the better of the favorite as that rival broke down inside the final eighth and Nobel Winner stayed on without threatening. "I have always liked him and he has improved a lot from his first run, but he's not the most correct horse in the world and I was slightly worried about the ground," trainer Yann Porzier said. "He will definitely run in the Jockey-Club and we will hope for lots of rain." Nobel Winner's conditioner Jean-Marie Beguigne is also pointing his charge at the Chantilly Classic, while Inoubliable was vanned off the track for probable surgery. **Click for the [Racing Post chart.](#)**

ALL 'GIANT,' ALL THE TIME IN ARGENTINA

The first Argentine-born crop of leading stallion Giant's Causeway (Storm Cat) stole the show during the opening session of the Venta Copa Bullrich 2011 sale late Sunday night. The six top lots were all sired by the 14-year-old, who has stood for two South-hemisphere seasons at Estacion de Montas La Mission. The first of three sessions yielded positive results, with a gross of \$2,568,000 and an average of \$43,526 from 68 lots offered. Nine yearlings RNA'd, while the remaining six of 74 catalogued were withdrawn. [Lot 2](#), a colt named **Giant's Secret (Arg)** out of MG1SP La Promenade (Arg) (Southern Halo), set the bar early and remained the highest-priced offering throughout at \$132,678. The chestnut was offered by Haras Chenaut, a newcomer to Argentine auctions, and was secured by John Fulton Bloodstock, which once again remained active and prominent at the sale. "I have loved the colt since I saw him at the farm," reported Fulton. "Giant's Causeways can cost \$500,000 at Keeneland or Fasig-Tipton, but here we get the same quality in pesos." He added in regards to the topper, "He is from a female family that has given me great results for my clients. We bought La Promenade for Cobra Farm, as well as her full-sister La Galerie (Arg), who won the G1 Gran Premio Saturnino J Unzue at Palermo. She also finished third in the [GII Distaff Breeders' Cup H. at Aqueduct]." La Galerie sold for \$800,000 as a broodmare prospect at KEEJAN in 2004. Fulton continued, "Giant's Secret offers one of the best, traditional and most successful pedigrees from Ceriani Cernada's Haras La Quebrada farm. La Promenade is also a full-sister to Gouache (Arg), the dam of champion Guernika (Arg) (Luhuk) and Japanese Group 2 winner Eishin Osman (Jpn) (Rock of Gibraltar {Ire})." The second-highest price was shared by the colts **Giant's Runner (Arg)** ([Lot 52](#)) and **Be My Lion (Arg)** ([Lot 54](#)), who each went for \$127,764. Fulton, who puts together racing partnerships purchased Giant's Runner. The colt, offered by Haras Chenaut, is the first Argentine-born foal out of MG1SW Randy Cat (Arg) (Roy). "This year's package is for a group of owners that includes Roy and Gretchen Jackson, Gary and Betty Biszantz, Ian Jameison, Chuck Merrick, Lori and Chris Wagner and Maria Correa," Fulton explained.

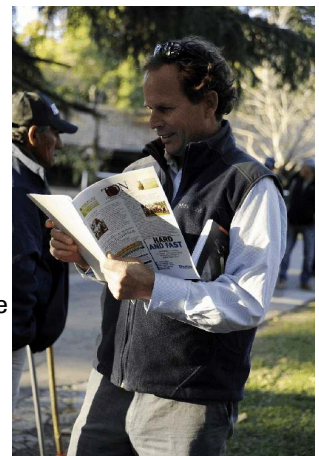

This is not Fulton, or the Jackson's, first exposure to Randy Cat. "We bought Randy Cat for the Jacksons to continue her racing career in the United States, so to have one of her offspring is to close the circle as far as they are concerned. He is a stunning colt with a lot of quality with a real runner for a mother."

Be My Lion, out of the Gone West mare B Gone Blues, was consigned by Haras La Pasion. The striking, powerfully built chestnut was scooped up by Stud Dos Estrellas and will most likely be trained by Omar Tournoud.

La Pasion led all consigners by gross, selling 11 yearlings for a total of \$613,045 and an average of \$55,432.

"It was a difficult afternoon, but we did well," said Nicolas Benedicto, owner of La Pasion. "It is true that we let some of the horses go below the value that we had planned, but Be My Lion raised the average, which I have no doubt would be considered very good. All in all, it was great for us to sell all our horses."

Antonio Bullrich, General Manager of Antonio Bullrich SA., the auctioneer and auction organizer, finished exhausted and with little voice, but offered, "I saw a very steady market, with John Fulton as a star among the foreign capital attracted for the Copa Bullrich." He continued, "Besides, the domestic market still rules, clearly. We were very happy with how everything was and the prices obtained, and we had only eight RNA's, which was below average. The quality of the horses helped a lot. Now we hope to maintain the rhythm for the next two sessions."

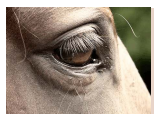

At a time when many are questioning the soundness of the American Thoroughbred, it can't have gone unnoticed that the latest winner of the Kentucky Derby is by Leroidesanimaux, a stallion bred in Brazil, and has a dam bred in Germany, where stallions are subject to strict soundness requirements.

The only American-breds in Animal Kingdom's first three generations are Candy Stripes, his paternal grandsire who raced in France, and Dancing Brave, the British-based superstar who sired his second dam Dynamis. American-breds are also rather scarce among the 16 horses in Animal Kingdom's fourth generation, the exceptions being Red God, Lyphard (who appears twice), Sookera and Navajo Princess. Of these, Red God started his racing career in England, while Lyphard and Sookera raced exclusively in Europe.

In the circumstances, anyone could be forgiven for wondering how Animal Kingdom would cope in his first start on traditional dirt, but we now know that he is as versatile as he is talented.

Perhaps those who underestimated him forgot that there are plenty of previous examples of Candy Stripes's descendants performing with distinction on dirt. His champion son Invasor triumphed in the Breeders' Cup Classic over the Kentucky Derby course and distance, and there were also graded successes by Different (GI Spinster S.), Lundy's Liability (GII Goodwood Breeders' Cup H. and GII San Antonio H.), Criollito (GII Churchill Downs H.) and Victory Stripes (GII Hawthorne H.). Candy Stripes also sired the dam of Candy Ride, whose first couple of crops have done so well in the U.S.

It is also significant that Animal Kingdom's great-grandsire, the brilliant French colt Blushing Groom, enjoyed some major victories with his dirt runners, even though his stallion success centered largely on Europe. Blush With Pride won the Kentucky Oaks for him and Sky Beauty did even better, taking the Triple Tiara. *Cont. 10*

Among Blushing Groom's sons, the French 2000 Guineas winner Blushing John adapted well enough to dirt to win the GI Hollywood Gold Cup and Pimlico Special, while Rahy was another former turf horse who adjusted extremely well to dirt. The most spectacular convert to dirt, though, had to be Arazi, who turned the 1991 Breeders' Cup Juvenile at Churchill Downs into a procession. Others Blushing Grooms with high-class dirt form included Runaway Groom (Travers S.), Mt. Livermore (Carter H.) and You'd Be Surprised (Top Flight H.).

My lasting memory of Blushing Groom is of his flamboyant, free-flowing action. *Great Thoroughbred Sires of the World* relates that Blushing Groom "could change gears in spectacular style, and the scope and power of his high, bounding action was awesome on any going, but perhaps made him an exceptional mud horse."

The analysis continues with the assessment that the Blushing Groom line has nicked best with Northern Dancer (especially Lyphard and Nijinsky).. Blushing Groom himself sired the Group 1 winners Groom Dancer and Gold Splash from daughters of Lyphard, plus their fellow Group 1 winner Sillery from a grand-daughter.

His son Rainbow Quest also sired the G1 St Leger winner Millenary from a grand-daughter of Lyphard, by Dancing Brave, who supplies one of the two lines to Lyphard in Animal Kingdom's pedigree. It was also a mating between Blushing Groom and a daughter of Lyphard which produced the dam of that brilliant mare Goldikova (and of Goldikova's very promising half-sister Galikova).

When I saw Leroidesanimaux at Stonewall Farm a few years ago, it was impossible not to liken him to Blushing Groom. Like his grandsire, Leroidesanimaux is a medium-sized, muscular, well-balanced chestnut with a good shoulder and a fair splash of white on his legs. Leroidesanimaux probably has more length, though.

Leroidesanimaux also displayed the same sort of verve that Blushing Groom brought to the racecourse, and he also showed a good measure of his grandsire's brilliance. When the World Thoroughbred Rankings for 2005 were published, Leroidesanimaux found himself in illustrious company. With a rating of 124, he ranked third among the world's older milers and his rating meant that he was the year's best American-trained turf performer. Timeform rated him 127.

The handsome son of Candy Stripes had first drawn attention to himself during a brief career at Gavea in his native Brazil, where he romped home more than 11 lengths clear over six furlongs at the end of May 2003 as a 2-year-old. A month later, he was pitched into G1 company and justified the move by finishing second to the champion 2-year-old Ay Caramba.

T N T Stud then transferred him to the care of Bobby Frankel in California. As Leroidesanimaux was born to Southern Hemisphere time, on September 27, 2000, he was effectively in the early stages of his 3-year-old season when he made his American debut in early January 2004, when officially a 4-year-old.

Although he could finish only fourth on that occasion, Leroidesanimaux easily shrugged off whatever disadvantage his birth date placed on him against older Northern Hemisphere horses. By the time he made his American stakes debut, in the GIII Inglewood H. May 1, when still well short of his actual fourth birthday, he had already recorded a pair of victories over a mile at Santa Anita.

Leroidesanimaux underlined his tremendous potential with his display in the Inglewood, over 1 1/16 miles. He flashed home a length clear of the seven-year-old Designed For Luck--winner of the GI Shoemaker Mile later in the month--and his time sliced 0.32 seconds off the course record.

Although it was nearly six months before Leroidesanimaux raced again, he showed no rustiness in the GIII Morvich H. over Santa Anita's downhill six and a half furlongs. He extended his winning sequence to four and quickly increased that to five in the GI Citation H. at Hollywood four weeks later.

As a fully mature 6-year-old, Leroidesanimaux had a great shot at taking championship honours among the turf milers in 2005. He began his quest with a gate-to-wire win against six other Grade I winners in the GI Frank E. Kilroe Mile at Santa Anita in March, when he recorded his sixth straight victory, in a time of 1:33.89.

Up to this point Leroidesanimaux had raced exclusively in California. It was the same old story, though, when he shipped to Saratoga for the GII Fourstardave H. Carrying top weight of 122 pounds, he led virtually from the start to set another track record for 1 1/16 miles, this time covering the distance in 1:39.92.

“When he gets competition, he tries even harder,” Frankel pointed out. “When horses come to him, he’ll go on by himself.”

Even better was to follow when the five-year-old shipped to Woodbine for the Atto Mile. Despite running on a yielding course for the first time, Leroidesanimaux cruised away to score by nearly eight lengths. When asked whether Leroidesanimaux was the best turf horse he had ever trained, Frankel agreed, saying “he must be. He keeps winning and getting better with every run.”

Unfortunately, the striking chesnut drew the outside post position of 11 in the GI Breeders’ Cup Mile. He also had the handicap of having sore feet, but still managed to take the lead in the stretch before being run down by Artie Schiller. Nevertheless, the voters for the Eclipse Award for turf male preferred him to his Breeders’ Cup conqueror.

So, Leroidesanimaux retired a winner of eight of his 10 American starts, including six graded stakes and three Grade Is. He also achieved two track records and Beyer speed figures higher than 110 in five of his victories, including a figure of 114 in the Atto Mile.

Despite being a champion racehorse with an excellent pedigree, Leroidesanimaux faced two considerable prejudices when he retired to stud in Kentucky. The first was his birthplace and the second was that he was a turf horse with a predominantly European turf pedigree. These prejudices were soon compounded by the sharp downturn in the American breeding industry and he could almost have been described as the right horse in the wrong place at the wrong time.

However, he is out of a half-sister to the dam of a champion European stallion, Dansili, and Leroidesanimaux’s first two crops confirm that he too is capable of siring very smart performers. From a first crop of 67 named foals, he has been represented by two graded winners and two graded-placed horses. That admirable filly Always A Princess was a Grade II winner on dirt in 2010 and 2011, with a victory to her name over the champion filly Blind Luck. The other graded winner, Leroy’s Dynameaux, won the Grade III Will Rogers S. on turf.

His second crop numbers only around 59 named foals. Animal Kingdom isn’t the only member of this crop to have shown Grade I ability, as Glor Na Mara was beaten only half a length when second in last year’s G1 Phoenix S. Crimson Knight was runner-up in the GII Tampa Bay Derby. This adds up to a healthy percentage of graded performers and it is a pity that his third crop numbers only 27 named foals so far.

Animal Kingdom clearly possesses more stamina than his sire, and for this we need look no further than his dam, Dalicia. This daughter of Acatenango claimed a notable victim in Soldier Hollow when she became a Grade 3 winner over a mile and a quarter as a 4-year-old in Germany. This family scored a fine graded double on Derby Day, as Dalicia’s sister Darwinia is the dam of Daveron, winner of the GIII Beaugay S. on turf.

Acatenango, an outstanding racehorse and sire in Germany, was pensioned at the age of 22 in 2004, and then died in April 2005. However, the Gestut Fahrhof stalwart made sure that he wasn’t easily forgotten. His retirement was quickly followed by the French Derby success of his son Blue Canari. Then, in 2005, he was represented by his third winner of the German Derby when Nicaron followed in the footsteps of Lando and Borgia. In doing so, Acatenango matched his sire, the German Derby winner Surumu, who owed his three Derby successes to Acatenango, Mondrian and Temporal.

Acatenango also won the Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud during a 24-race career that yielded 16 victories. Some of his best offspring have also shone outside Germany, with Fraulein and Sabiango both scoring at the top level in North America, where Borgia was second in the Breeders’ Cup Turf.

In assessing Acatenango’s record, it should be remembered that he was used much more sparingly than many of today’s stallions and his long career yielded fewer than 600 foals, of which 71--12%--became stakes winners.
