THE BEST STUFF ON EARTH?

Arizona Jewel (GB) (Dansili {GB}) states her Oaks claims in today's G3 Tattersalls Musidora S. at York, a trial won by her trainer Henry Cecil on nine occasions. The filly looked a work in progress when breaking her maiden in a competitive affair at Sandown over 10 furlongs last time Apr. 24. She encounters a proven performer in **Barefoot Lady (Ire)** (Footstepsinthesand {GB}), the winner of the Apr. 13 G3 Nell Gwyn S. over seven furlongs at Newmarket. She

looked as if this trip may not be beyond her when a staying-on fifth in the G1 1000 Guineas back there at the start of the month. "She's come out of that wonderfully well and, although I'm being extremely tough on her, she keeps coming back at me," trainer Richard Fahey commented. "She wasn't quick enough in the Guineas and got messed about because she wasn't going through the gaps. This is an ideal race, as she has no penalty."

INOUBLIABLE EUTHANIZED

The Wertheimers' **Inouliable (GB)** (Singspiel {Ire}) was euthanized after sustaining a fracture to his off-fore cannon bone at the close of Monday's G3 Prix de Guiche at Chantilly. In second when the injury occurred in the final furlong, he managed to cross the line in fourth. The Andre Fabre trainee was immediately taken to the nearby equine hospital, where an examination revealed inoperable damage. Undefeated in two starts going into Monday's race, the 3-year-old won a maiden test at Saint-Cloud last October, and took a conditions race at that course on his return in April. He was favored in the Prix de Guiche.

DERBY CANDIDATE IN THE "HOUSE"

The Queen's **Carlton House** (Street Cry {Ire}), getting ready for Thursday's G2 Totesport Dante S. at York, was the subject of a positive report from connections yesterday as he nears the test of his Derby credentials. Having

impressed when recording a nine-length success from the re-opposing **Yaseer (Ire)** (Dansili {GB}) when last seen in a mile maiden at Newbury in October, the homebred has apparently been shaping up in style on the Newmarket gallops. "The Queen is really looking forward to it and is pleased with his progress," Racing Manager John Warren said yesterday. "Physically, there is a lot to like about him and he is held in high regard by [trainer Sir Michael Stoute] on his spring work this year, but his horses have taken their time to come to hand and he will continue to keep improving whatever he does this week." **Dante field, p4**

BASSETT READY FOR POULAINS TEST

Last year's G1 Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere winner **Wootton Bassett (GB)** (Iffraaj {GB}) is set to defend his unbeaten record in Sunday's G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains at Longchamp, for which 19 colts stood their ground yesterday. "He's grown a lot and he's a lot stronger," trainer Richard Fahey said of Frank Brady and Cosmic Cases' colt yesterday. "When you see a horse winning as a 2-year-old as he was, you think that's all they'll be, but this fellow was always going to be a better 3-year-old. He was undefeated at two, and I couldn't be happier with him at three." In what is due to be a strong overseas challenge, David Simcock is preparing to unleash Khalifa Dasmal's G1 Prix Morny and G1 Middle Park S. winner **Dream Ahead** (Diktat {GB}), while David Wachman has committed Susan Magnier's May 2 Listed Tetrarch S. winner **Imperial Rome (Ire)** (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}). Of the domestic team, Khalid Abdullah's **Glaswegian (GB)** (Selkirk) will be re-opposed by the majority of those he beat in the course-and-distance G3 Prix de Fontainebleau Apr. 24, including His Highness The Aga Khan's **Rosanabad (Fr)** (Selkirk) and the Wertheimers' G1 Criterium International runner-up **Salto (Ire)** (Pivotal {GB}).

Pouliches Target for Memory

Highclere Racing's **Memory (Ire)** (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) was one of 22 names to feature in the list for Sunday's G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches at Longchamp. After getting left in the stalls in the G1 1000 Guineas, last year's G2 Cherry Hinton S. winner underwent a stalls test at Kempton Monday morning. "They put Memory into the stalls no fewer than seven times and, on each occasion, she came out fine the moment they opened the gates, so we have to hope and pray that everything will be fine at Longchamp," trainer Richard Hannon said. "Memory has never been straightforward at home. Ironically, she has never given us any problem at the stalls, but things are different when she gets to the track, and Newmarket was not the first time that she has been slow away. We sent her to Kempton with Mickey Hunt, her lad, wearing the full set of silks to get the adrenaline flowing and create a racecourse atmosphere." Hannon added, "The Guineas was such a disappointment for everyone involved. Memory had wintered so well and her preparation could not have gone any better, but she let us down and left us all somewhat embarrassed. We know that she is a very talented filly, and, hopefully, we will see the other side of her character in France on Sunday."

Of the home-trained fillies, George Strawbridge's **Moonlight Cloud (GB)** (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) may stage a quick return following a seventh in the Newmarket Classic, and will bid to confirm the form of the G3 Prix Imprudence with Khalid Abdullah's **Helleborine (GB)** (Observatory), who was second behind the Freddy Head trainee in that seven-furlong contest at Maisons-Laffitte when last seen Apr. 7. Others of note among the entries are Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum's Guineas third **Maqaasid (GB)** (Green Desert) and Gestut Ammerland's G3 Prix de la Grotte Heroine **Golden Lilac (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}), who is set to represent the Andre Fabre stable.

Markab, who finally hit the heights when winning the G1 Haydock Sprint Cup on his last outing in September, is burdened with a penalty as a result of that effort. **Genki**, winner of the Apr. 14 Listed Abernant S., was third that day. There will be some stern opposition led by the ex-Aga Khan runner **Dalghar**, whose two tries at this trip yielded a second in the G2 Diadem S. at Ascot in September and a third in Maisons-Laffitte's G3 Prix de Seine-Et-Oise when last seen in November. "He was purchased privately for some Australian clients, and we know he is a high-class performer with some very good form," new trainer Andrew Balding told *PA Sport*. "He has settled in well and his work has been good, but he may need this first run and will certainly come on for it. If all goes well, then the [June 18] G1 Golden Jubilee S. at Royal Ascot is the target." **Delegator**, who was second to Sea the Stars (Ire) (Cape Cross {Ire}) in the G1 2000 Guineas and to Mastercraftsman (Ire) (Daneshill Dancer {Ire}) in the G1 St James's Palace S. two years ago, has subsequently failed to live up to the expectations of Godolphin. Last seen finishing eighth behind Goldikova (Ire) (Anabaa) in the GI Breeders' Cup Mile at Churchill, he reverts to sprinting for the first time. "Delegator has shown a lot of speed in his races and I think that six furlongs is the right distance for him to try now," trainer Saeed bin Suroor commented. "He will improve for his first start of the season, but I am looking forward to seeing him run a nice race."

This serves as an Oaks trial for the Irish sophomores, and **Mesariya** is a fascinating member of that brigade, being a winner of her sole start in a 10-furlong maiden at Leopardstown Mar. 27. She beat the subsequent Listed Salsabil S. winner Siren's Song (Ire) (Azamour {Ire}) there, while the seventh Wonder of Wonders (Kingmambo) has since captured the Listed Cheshire Oaks. "She won her maiden nicely and it worked out well, so we'll have to see what she's made of," trainer John Oxx told *PA Sport*. "The thing is, she's not a brilliant homemaker, so we're relying on the racetrack to tell us how good she is and where we stand with her, what her distance is. It will be revealing."

Banimpire had Recital (Fr) (Montjeu {Ire}) back in third while winning Leopardstown's G3 Ballysax S. Apr. 10, and followed that with a win in Gowran Park's Listed Victor McCalmont Memorial S. last time May 1.

Prime Cut To Skip Preakness; Astrology In...

Trainer Neil Howard said yesterday that Courtlandt Farms' **Prime Cut** (Bernstein), runner-up in the GII Coolmore Lexington S. on the Keeneland Poly Apr. 23, will bypass the May 21 GI Preakness S. The colt worked five furlongs in 1:01.20 at Churchill Tuesday. "Change of plans," Howard said. "We are going to New York for the [GII] Peter Pan on Saturday. The Preakness has a big field with a lot of speed, and the top horses from the Derby look tough coming right back, and I don't know if he is ready for something like that." He added, "If he runs in one of the [Triple Crown] races, we feel the [June 11 GI] Belmont would be the best for him." Connections of **Astrology** (A.P. Indy), second in the GIII Sunland Park Derby and GII Jerome S. in his two 2011 outings, yesterday confirmed the colt is a go for the second leg of the Triple Crown.

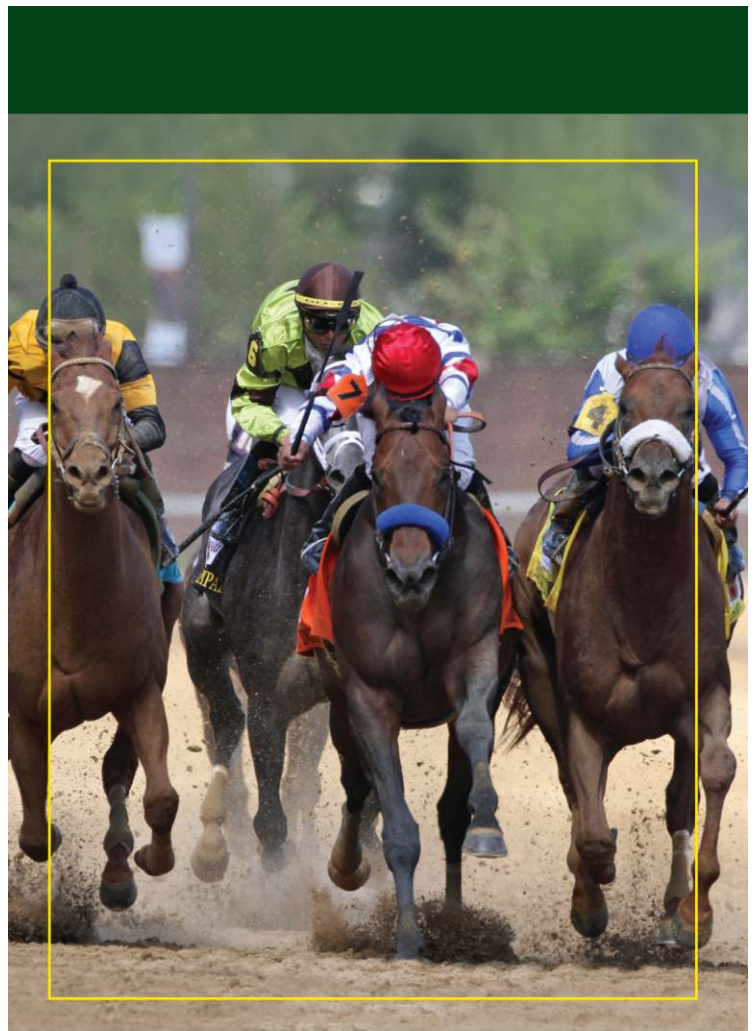
CANDY STRIPER

Even as an ambitious Argentine yearling sale was about to get underway, Animal Kingdom's GI Kentucky Derby win brought home the influence of Blushing Groom's son, Candy Stripes, who figures prominently in the pedigrees of what we can now call two of North America's leading young sires: F2006 (first foals five-year-olds of 2011) Candy Ride and F2007 (first foals four-year-olds) Leroidesanimaux, sire of the 2011 Derby winner in his second crop. You sort of automatically think, oh, Candy Ride, he must be by Candy Stripes, but in fact no: Candy Ride is by an otherwise undistinguished son of Cryptoclearance, Ride the Rails, and is out of a Candy Stripes mare. But Candy Stripes is the sire of Leroidesanimaux (a/k/a 'Leroi'), and has also sired none other than Invasor, winner of the GI Breeders' Cup Classic and G1 Dubai World Cup for Sheikh Hamdan, and a freshman sire of 2-year-olds in 2011.

In fact, Candy Stripes, who was a \$300,000 yearling bought by Mahmoud Fustok in 1983, never got big black type himself, but he was Classic-placed, having run third (promoted to second on the disqualification of winner River Mist [Irish River], with the race then going to No Pass No Sale [Northfields]) in the 1985 G1 Prix d'Essai des Poulaines--French 2000 Guineas. Candy Stripes was Kentucky-bred, but by the Gainesway French import Blushing Groom out of a mare by the Gainesway French import Lyphard. He found his way to stud in Argentina, though he did have a brief stint at Taylor Made in the late 1990s. He died in 2007, having sired 20 Grade/Group 1 winners, mostly, of course, in South America. But his legacy looks a lot more likely to survive 'up north,' through sons Leroidesanimaux and potentially Invasor, and grandson Candy Ride. It's a pretty significant contribution for a South American sire.

Leroidesanimaux was bred in Brazil, where he won one of his three starts as a 2-year-old in the 2002-03 season. He was brought up to California under the TNT Stud banner, who turned him over to Bobby Frankel. He was beaten in his first start in North America, an allowance 'down the hill' at Santa Anita, but then reeled off eight wins in a row over the next two seasons, his streak snapped only in his final career start, the 2005 GI Breeders' Cup Mile, in which he finished second to Artie Schiller. 'Leroi' was still named Champion Turf Male in North America that year, with which I completely agreed. His two-year streak included six graded wins, three of them Grade 1s. He only ran on the turf in North America.

His rise to prominence as a Grade I winner on the grass in the Frankel barn naturally piqued the interest of Europeans, especially as his dam is a half-sister to Juddmonte's blue hen, Hasili, the dam of five Group 1 winners, plus Dansili, another one of those Group 2 winners who's turned out to be a far more successful sire than an awful lot of Group 1 and Grade I winners. Leroi's best horses in his first crop were Arnold Zetcher's Always a Princess, a three-time Grade II winner from the Baffert barn; and Leroi's Dynameaux, a Grade III winner on the grass at Hollywood Park last year. Besides Animal Kingdom, his second crop also includes Glor Na Mara, trained by Jim Bolger in Ireland; he placed in two Group 1s last year, including the G1 Dewhurst S., behind Frankel; but he hasn't cut much ice in two starts this year.

Naturally, Animal Kingdom's \$1,411,000 payday has a big effect on third-crop sire statistics (sires with first foals 2007, 4-year-olds this year). After Saturday, with over \$2.4 million in 2011 progeny earnings, Leroidesanimaux tops even Dubawi by 2011 progeny earnings for third-crop sires ([click here](#) to see the TDN year-to-date third-crop sire list). However, Dubawi himself already has the earners of over \$2.2 million, including seven black-type winners and 11 black-type performers, this year. Ghostzapper is a meritorious, but nonetheless distant, third on this list, with 2011 progeny earnings around \$1.4 million. On the cumulative third-crop progeny earnings list ([click here](#)), Leroidesanimaux now moves up to ninth spot from the second 10; Darley compatriots Dubawi (\$8.5 million) and Shamardal (\$8.2 million) are over \$1-million clear of the top American sire on that list, Wildcat Heir (\$7.0 million).

Now, as for the race itself. It was an unusual Derby in that the pacemakers did not go out with a :46 half and 1:10 first three-quarters; quite the opposite, in fact you'd almost say it ran more like an all-weather race than a dirt race. After an opening quarter in 23:2/5, Shackleford (Forestry) led the field through the next half mile in 50:2/5, recording identical 25:1/5 splits. At this point--after an opening three-quarters in 1:13:2/5, and with a half-mile left to run--Dialed In was dead; there was no way he was going to swoop the field off those slow fractions. The final half went in 48:1/5, and it looks like the winner went his final half in :47:3/5--almost a European time for a final half. In fact, the G1 English 2000 Guineas looked more like an American race, and the G1 Kentucky Derby looked more like a European race. There's a role reversal for you.

Animal Kingdom ran a Beyer speed figure of 103 to win the race, meaning at least one American 3-year-old has broken 100 at nine furlongs-plus this year. But, given their limitations going into the Derby, I thought the first five or six emerged with credit.

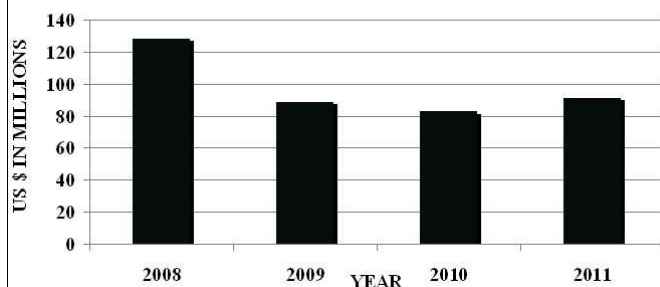
Weekly Sales Ticker

"Based on results so far this year, it appears the North American Two-Year-Old market has held up better than the European; from pre-crash 2008 figures, the North American gross has dropped by 28 percent, and the average by 23 percent, whereas in Europe the gross is off by 39 percent, and the average by 36 percent. Possibly it's because the smaller European market grew faster so fell further, whereas the surviving consignors in the more 'mature' North American two-year-old market adjusted more quickly. It's certainly good news that all the key indicators are up in North America from 2010, so far."

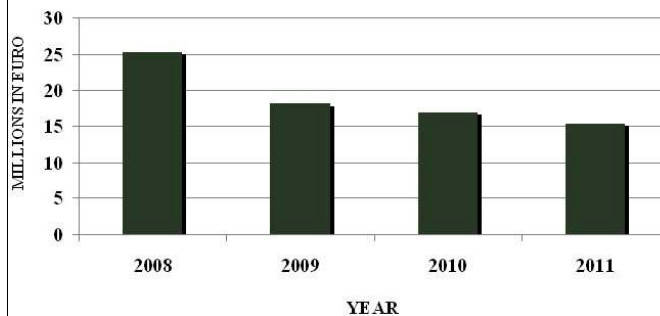

Nehro (Mineshaft) ran a massive race, and it looked like the wise-guy selection to win, off his fast-closing seconds in the GII Louisiana Derby and the GI Arkansas Derby, was poised to score until Animal Kingdom found another gear. Mucho Macho Man (Macho Uno) had won the GII Risen Star, then run third to Pants On Fire (Jump Start) and Nehro in the GII Louisiana Derby--so that race gets a credibility boost. He finished well to be third, with Shackelford hanging on gamely for fourth. Ballydoyle's entrant, Master of Hounds (Kingmambo) stayed on very well for fifth, looking as though he only figured it out when it was too late. GII Risen Star second Santiva (Giant's Causeway) also stayed on well for sixth, just behind Master of Hounds.

As interesting and satisfactory as the race ultimately turned out to be, it was still a little slow; not as bad as we might have feared going into the race, considering none of them had broken 100 in their last starts, but still well below average. As Andy Beyer pointed out in a recent *Washington Post* column, the average winning Beyer figure for the Derby for the last 25 years has been 109; in the last three years, the winning Beyers were 105 (Mine That Bird), 104 (Super Saver), and now 103. Fortunately, this statistical decline did not deter the record more than 164,000 racegoers who came to Churchill to watch the Derby. As an industry, we have no shortage of problems, and North America more than most, among the major racing countries. But it has to be good news that so many people are still keen to come to the big events.

Now there will be talk of the Triple Crown, which after all has been won only three times in the last 62 years--all in the 1970s, by Secretariat, Seattle Slew and Affirmed. As has been written extensively, Graham Motion is a conservative (with his horses), European-style, 'old-school' trainer--and, embarrassing as he finds it, immensely popular and respected along his colleagues and in the industry at large, not least because of his 8,000+ starts without a medication violation. You can bet he won't risk the horse in that grueling five-week schedule if he has any doubts about whether he's ready to go. But Derbies like these, without big-figure standouts, are often won by improving horses, and when a 3-year-old who gets good starts improving, often they keep improving. Considering Animal Kingdom had never run on dirt before, but had reportedly worked brilliantly at Churchill the week before the race, why should he have stopped improving? One of the attributes of those old-school trainers is that they can conceive a campaign. In the best scenario, Animal Kingdom keeps improving for two more races, then that conservative, old-school trainer can give him a proper break, and bring him back when he's ready. It's pretty unlikely that a horse who's just won the Derby in a Beyer 103 will end up the next Triple Crown winner--but, one thing's for sure: he's the only one who's eligible to do it this year.

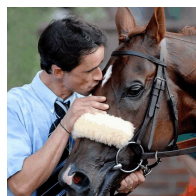

The win by Victoria's Wildcat in Friday's GIII Eight Belles S., for 3-year-old fillies on the Oaks undercard, marked the third graded black-type winner for second-crop sire Bellamy Road (Concerto), and propelled him, temporarily at least, a few thousand dollars ahead of War Front (Danzig), by 2011 year-to-date progeny earnings among North American second-crop sires ([click here](#)). In Europe, Cazals, a colt by Aussie Rules (Danehill), ran second to the unbeaten favorite Crackerjack King (Shamardal) in the G2 Derby Italiano, propelling him a few thousand clear of Coolmore barnmate Holy Roman Emperor (Danehill) among European second-crop sires. They are then followed by Iffraaj (Zafonic), Hurricane Run (Montjeu), and Shirocco (Monsun), again by 2011 progeny earnings.

Giant's Causeway continued his domination of the Venta Copa Bullrich during Monday night's second session of the auction, with two yearlings from the Coolmore stallion's first Argentinian-born crop leading the way. **Hi Amanda (Arg)** (Giant's Causeway) topped the session with a final bid of US\$68,627 from Carlos Carello. The filly, **lot 87**, was consigned by Haras Chenaut and is out of the unraced Inthecoolofthenite (Unbridled's Song). Her second

dam is MGSP Icy Warning (Caveat). Bloodstock agent George Hills went to \$62,500 to secure **One Dame (Arg)** (Giant's Causeway). The filly, **lot 88**, is out of La Piaff (Arg) (Southern Halo), a full-sister to MGSW Sa Torreta (Arg), and was consigned by Haras El Mallin. Eaton Sales' Reiley McDonald signed for the third-highest lot of the day, paying \$56,373 for a son of Honour and Glory. The yearling, **lot 111**, is out of Lucky Magic (Arg) (Ride the Rails) and from the family of Grade I winner and leading sire Candy Ride (Arg). Through two days of the three-day sale, 106 yearlings sold for \$3,876,333. The average of \$36,569 is down 9.8% from a year ago, The buy-back rate, 9.6% during Sunday's first session, increased to 19% Monday. "While RNAs rose, the market continued active and firm for a second session," reported Antonio Bullrich, general director of Antonio Bullrich SA. "The expectations were fulfilled." The three-day auction concluded last night, and complete results will appear in tomorrow's *TDN*.

14.5 MILLION WATCH KENTUCKY DERBY ON NBC (Edited press release) NBC Sports' coverage of Saturday's GI Kentucky Derby drew 14.54 million viewers, the fourth most-watched Kentucky Derby in 21 years, according to data provided by The Nielsen Company. Since implementing NBC's Big Event Strategy, the last three Kentucky Derby races have recorded at least 14.5 million viewers, including last year's Derby, which was the most-watched for the event in 22 years. NBC Sports coverage of the Kentucky Derby over the last 11 years averages more than 2 1/2 million more viewers than the previous 11 Kentucky Derby broadcasts on ABC (14.1 million vs. 11.5 million, up 23%). Saturday's race (6:06-6:54 p.m. ET) was off 12% from last year's 16.5 million, and 10% off from 2009's 16.3 million, the two most-watched Derbies since 1989, when Sunday Silence won the Derby (18.5 million). The only other Derby viewership to surpass Saturday's since 1990 was in 2004, when Smarty Jones won the Derby (14.6 million). The Kentucky Derby once again proved to be very popular with female viewers--51% of Derby viewers 18+ were women, making it the only annual sporting event that draws more female than male viewers.

IMPROVED FIRST-QUARTER RESULTS FOR CHURCHILL DOWNS INC Churchill Downs Incorporated has released its first-quarter results for 2011, with its net loss over the period dropping 63%, from \$8.1 million a year ago to \$3.2 million. The revenue growth was largely attributed to the two subsidiaries acquired in 2010, Youbet.com and Harlow's Casino Resort and Hotel. CDI historically operates at a loss during the opening quarter, as three of its four tracks do not offer live racing during that period. Several factors could have an effect on second-quarter results for CDI. On a positive note, Kentucky Oaks/Derby weekend produced an increase in on-track and all-sources handle. "We are extremely pleased with the results of this year's Kentucky Derby weekend, during which we set a new record for on-track Derby Day attendance--164,858--breaking the long-standing record of 163,628 that was set in 1974 for the centennial Derby celebration," CDI Chairman-Elect and CEO Robert Evans said. "We also saw increases over 2010 levels in on-track and all-sources wagering on both Derby and Oaks days, and grew revenues from sponsorships and admissions year over year. We believe these results demonstrate there is still demand for competitive, high-quality racing entertainment, and that is the very essence of Kentucky Derby weekend." But the company was forced to temporarily close its Harlow's property late on May 6 due to flooding in Washington County, Mississippi, where it is located. "At this time, we do not know when state officials will allow Harlow's to reopen or what the ultimate impact this temporary closure--or potential flooding--could have on the Harlow's operation or our business results," Evans said. "We are closely monitoring the situation."
