MICHAEL BAZE DIES

Jockey Michael Baze was found dead Tuesday on the backstretch at Churchill Downs. He had turned 24 last month. Born in Washington, he was part of the prolific riding family that included all-time winning rider Russell Baze, a second cousin; and Eclipse winner Tyler Baze, a first cousin. Michael Baze had his first winner at Hollywood Park in May of 2003. He moved east for three years before returning to California, where he was the leading rider at the Hollywood Park spring/summer and Del Mar meets in 2007. Baze was the leading rider at Arlington Park last year with 104 victories, but had planned to

make Churchill his home track this year. In 2011, he had 34 wins from 238 mounts for earnings of \$1,191,297; he had 918 wins and \$9.3 million in purse earnings over his career. He rode Nehro (Mineshaft) to a second-place finish in the GII Louisiana Derby in March before being replaced by Corey Nakatani. According to *Daily Racing Form*, Bobby Kelly, recently retained as Baze's agent, reported that backstretch workers called 911 Tuesday afternoon after noticing that the rider's car, a Cadillac Escalade, had been parked for a lengthy period with its engine running. Baze was pronounced dead at 4:47 p.m. Foul play was not suspected. An

autopsy did not reveal the cause of death, and a toxicology report will be performed, though the results will not be available for several weeks. A test for carbon-monoxide poisoning will also be performed. Baze was slated to appear in a Kentucky court Thursday for a cocaine possession charge stemming from an arrest in Louisville Nov. 18, when he was riding at Churchill. The reinsman is survived by his father, retired jockey Mike

Baze, and his mother Teri Gibson, as well as a brother and sister. Gibson told *DRF* that a memorial service has been tentatively scheduled for May 24 at Emerald Downs in Auburn, Washington.

NEW WORLD ORDER

Juddmonte homebred **World Domination** (Empire Maker), tabbed as a **TDN Rising Star** following a smooth debut score at Newbury Apr. 16, gets a class test today in the G2 Dante S. at York. Saddled with expectations for his career opener as a result of the Newmarket rumor mill, the dark bay lived up to the hype with a 3 3/4-length win over 11 furlongs at Newbury, and even a minor setback in the interim has done little to dim his luster. The sense of resurgence surrounding the career of Henry Cecil, one of the training icons in recent turf history, will ensure he is awarded maximum respect here despite his inexperience. "It is quite strange to have a maiden winner as favorite for the Derby, and he has a good deal to prove," Khalid Abdullah's Racing Manager Teddy Grimthorpe said in humble manner yesterday. "His make and shape, the way he's trained and run and his pedigree will help that conviction, and also his name probably lends itself to people thinking that he's going to be a great champion." Cecil has a longstanding love affair with this Classic trial, which he has won seven times, most recently with the 1993 hero Tenby (GB) (Caerleon). **Cont. p5**

Limited to races only up to a mile two seasons ago, Delegator was runner-up in the G1 2000 Guineas and G1 St James's Palace S. Trying six furlongs for the first time here, he suggested that this could be his sphere with an impressive success. Only seen three times last term, the dark bay won the Listed Dubai Duty Free Cup at Newbury in September over seven furlongs and was fourth in Newmarket's G2 Challenge S. over the same trip the following month before finishing eighth behind Goldikova (Ire) (Anabaa) in the G1 Breeders' Cup Mile at Churchill in November. Held up in rear early alongside Regal Parade, he was full of effort when switched to the stand's rail and duly collared that rival passing the eighth pole en route to a cozy score. "He's got a tremendous amount of speed and we tried to tackle the mile races, but he just doesn't quite get it, so we decided to try this," Frankie Dettori commented. "There was only one winner the whole way and, now that he's older and stronger, sprinting is going to be his game. To be honest, when I let him down I expected a better turn-of-foot and he was just workmanlike at the end, but I think we've got something there to work with." Godolphin Racing Manager Simon Crisford said that the 5-year-old had missed some time with quarter crack problems, but that his feet were in good shape at the moment, and would likely remain at sprint distances. "He travels very well in his races, so we'll certainly keep him to six furlongs for the moment," Crisford said. "He'll still have entries in all races from six furlongs to a mile, but he'll go for the G1 Golden Jubilee S. [at Royal Ascot June 18] next. He wants fast ground and a fast-run six-furlong race. Joviality, third on debut when slowly away and distinctly green in a seven-furlong maiden at Newmarket in October, returned to be worn down late on and finish second to the gelding Naqshabban (Street Cry {Ire}) in a mile conditions event at Sandown Apr. 24. Up in trip here, the dark bay moved easily in fourth initially before being moved up to challenge Barefoot Lady and the brief leader Arizona Jewel (GB) (Dansili {GB}) in early stretch. Seizing a short lead passing the quarter pole, she had to be driven out to hold the vigorous rally of the runner-up, and their momentum carried them clear of the remainder. "She's my favorite filly in the yard and is very nice," jockey William Buick said. "I've always liked her, and she showed why today--she has everything you want. She's not bred for this far and was tying up a bit at the finish." Trainer John Gosden, who confirmed that impression afterwards, has his eye on the 1 5/16 mile-trip of the G1 Prix de Diane at Chantilly June 12, rather than the 12 furlongs of the Epsom Oaks nine days earlier. "This is the top-end of the trip for her, and we'll have a look at the French Oaks if she's in great nick," Gosden said. "She was big, immature and weak last year, but we liked the way she developed in the spring, and she came on a bundle for Sandown, having ran a good race there. For a maiden to come here and pull nine lengths clear of the third is a testament to her."

Jim Bolger trains toughness into his string, and those that thrive can come back time and again to produce the goods at pattern level. Banimpire racked up black-type win number three in the space of a month here. Third over a mile in The Curragh's G3 Park Express S. Mar. 20, she accounted for some choice colts, including Recital (Fr) (Montjeu {Ire}) in the G3 Ballysax S. over a mile and a quarter at Leopardstown Apr. 10 before dropping slightly in trip to defy a penalty in the Listed Victor McCalmont Memorial S. at Gowran Park 10 days ago. Close up early under a tight rein in fourth, she traveled strongly into the straight before being shaken up to assume command with a quarter mile remaining. Kicking into a decisive advantage inside the final furlong, she was geared down late as Spin stayed on in her slipstream. "Banimpire will probably go for the G1 Irish 1000 Guineas [at The Curragh May 22] next, but will probably avoid the Epsom Oaks," Bolger told *Irish-Racing.com*. 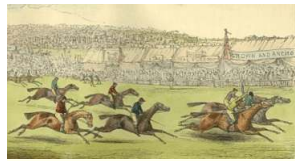

Derby Doubts for Sea Moon...

Khalid Abdullah's **Sea Moon (GB)** (Beat Hollow {GB}) looks set to miss the June 4 G1 Epsom Derby, according to Racing Manager Teddy Grimthorpe. Having gone into many notebooks in October when second on debut at Leicester and getting off the mark at Yarmouth a fortnight later, the Sir Michael Stoute-trained colt had been near the front end of the betting market for the "Blue Riband." "He just hasn't sparkled so far--he's fine physically and has developed well, but I would think the Derby would be out for him," Lord Grimthorpe explained yesterday.

Cloud out of Pouliches Picture...

George Strawbridge's **Moonlight Cloud (GB)** (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) has been withdrawn from Sunday's G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches at Longchamp. Seventh in the G1 1000 Guineas at Newmarket at the start of the month, the homebred will miss the fillies' Classic for which Denford Stud's G3 Fred Darling S. winner **Rimth (GB)** (Oasis Dream {GB}) is expected to be supplemented today.

Seville, who represents the Aidan O'Brien team responsible for three of the last five winners, he has proven form in the book. Runner-up to subsequent G3 Killavullan S. winner Dubai Prince (Ire) (Shamardal) in a Gowran Park maiden over a mile in September, he wired a 7 1/2- furlong race at Tipperary a few days later before finding only Casamento (Ire) (Shamardal) 3/4 of a length too strong in Doncaster's G1 Racing Post Trophy in late October. With the likes of Master of Hounds (Kingmambo) and Native Khan (Fr) (Azamour {Ire}) behind on that occasion, he has already set a lofty benchmark. **Yaseer** was nine lengths behind **Carlton House** on debut at Newbury in October, but a subsequent win on Kempton's Polytrack in December and third in Newmarket's G3 Craven S. over a mile last time Apr. 14 suggest he has moved up markedly. "Yaseer has been working well since the Craven and is likely to be well suited by the step up to a mile and a quarter," conditioner Marcus Tregoning said. "It could well be the pointer to the Derby itself. He ran a very good race in the Craven and, like I've said before, he's a May 26 foal, which is a bit of a disadvantage, but he is catching up fast. We have not overtaxed him to this stage and while the Dante will be tough for him, he is in good form--it will give us an idea of the level we are at with him. I think 10 furlongs to a mile and a half will be no problem for this horse."

The bay went on to add three more top-level successes to the two she secured as a sophomore, and was runner-up when attempting back-to-back renewals of the GI Breeders' Cup F/M Turf Nov. 5. She is joined by stable companion and ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ **Timepiece** to make a strong hand for Khalid Abdullah and Henry Cecil. The latter finally showed what her trainer always thought her capable of when besting the smart yardstick Prince Siegfried (Fr) (Royal Applause {GB}) in the Listed James Seymour S. at Newmarket in October, and is no back-number here.

Juddmonte's Racing Manager Teddy Grimthorpe commented, "Midday has wintered well and seems in good form, so we're hopeful of a big run from her. Timepiece's best races have been when she has run prominently. For a mile-and-a-quarter, [older] filly there are very few races, and she's certainly going to be running on her merits. She's likely to be up with the pace without blazing a trail, and Henry has always rated her above what she has won already, so we'll see, but we're hoping she's improved from three to four." Last year's G1 Falmouth S. heroine **Music Show** is up in trip after a return fourth behind Dick Turpin (Ire) (Arakan) in the Apr. 23 G2 Sandown Mile, and her stamina has to be taken on trust, which is not an issue for **TDN Rising Star** **Field Day**. She is certain to improve on her latest fourth behind the impressive I'm a Dreamer (Ire) (Noverre) in the G3 Dahlia S. at Newmarket May 1. Trainer Brian Meehan said, "She needed her comeback run when a staying-on fourth at Newmarket, and should go well."

The 3-year-old is eligible for a huge payday if he wins the GI Preakness S. by virtue of his victories in the GIII Holy Bull S. and GI Florida Derby S. In addition to the \$600,000 winner's share of the purse, he would collect a \$5-million bonus for LaPenta, as well as a \$500,000 bonus for trainer Nick Zito. "LaPenta's certainly thinking about it, he pays the bills," the conditioner quipped. "My staff and the feed guys are excited. There are a lot of people rooting for us next Saturday.

Peachtree Stable's **Flashpoint** (Pomeroy) will be making his first start for trainer Wesley Ward in the middle jewel of the Triple Crown. After a flashy win in the GII Hutcheson S., the grey colt finished fourth in the Florida Derby for conditioner Rick Dutrow Jr. "He looks fantastic and is doing great," Ward said. "He hasn't taken a bad step--hasn't missed an oat. He's done everything I've asked of him, if not more, in the mornings. I'm looking forward to the race and am excited about it." Regular rider Cornelio Velasquez will be in the irons.

The 4-year-old is coming off wins in the GII Commonwealth S. at Keeneland in April and last Saturday's GII Churchill Downs S. for trainer Todd Pletcher. "He was in a grueling drive to get up in the last jump in the seven-furlong stakes [at Churchill]," Dogwood President Cot Campbell said in a statement. "But, assuming Todd Pletcher is happy with his energy level, the Met Mile is a rather logical target. Seven-eighths to a mile is his 'hole card,' and [jockey] John Velazquez doesn't hurt! We hope to have him back."

PERFECT FINALE AT COPA BULLRICH

Though the appropriately named Final Perfecto (Arg) (Perfectperformance) who brought down the curtain following the third and final session of the Venta Copa Bullrich in Argentina Tuesday, it was actually **Porto Seguro (Arg)** who topped the third and final session. The son of Orpen was secured for US\$40,540 (ARS165,000) by trainer Jorge Mayansky Neer. Out of the Storm Bird mare Cascateira, [lot 157](#) is a half-brother to GSP Ocnus (Arg) (Latin American) and Cara de Buena (Arg) (Roy). Consigned by Haras El Mallin--the operation owned by Antonio Bullrich--the colt hails from the family of Good Manners (Nashua), one of the most influential stallions in Argentina over the last three decades.

"I am very happy because people responded," said Antonio Bullrich, general manager of Antonio Bullrich SA. "Most important of all were the featured horses, which were hard to match. Local farms offered a group of colts and fillies with ideal conformation and international pedigrees. The presentation was unbelievable for both the established farms, as well as the newer ones. I think that's why demand stood up

well up until the very last horse passed through the ring. For our part, we put everything into, not only in marketing, but also in

daily communication."

A strong local economy generated plenty of demand at the second installment of the Venta Copa Bullrich. In addition, the presence of the first Argentine crop of Giant's Causeway provided a huge boost to this year's trade and final figure. The stallion led the sale with nine lots, bringing a total of \$837,516 (ARS3,420,000), with an average \$93,057 (ARS380,000). Leading buyer at this year's sale was John Fulton Bloodstock, that secured eight lots for a total of \$635,484 (ARS2,595,000) and an average of \$79,435 (ARS324,375). Heading all consignors was La Passion, which set the pace with 28 yearlings which drew \$1,066,731 (ARS4,356,000) in gross revenues. Despite its strength in numbers, it was Chenaut that topped all consignors in average, with six lots averaging \$78,159 (ARS319,166), more than twice any other farm.

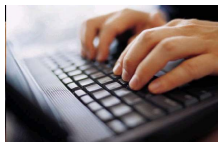

NOAH WHO? KEENELAND (AND TRACK) SHINE by Lucas Marquardt

If, by the generally accepted rule, an inch of rain equals a foot of snow, Lexington would have been buried under roughly 13 feet of the white stuff at the end of April. As it was, the state endured a record 13 inches of boring old rain during the month, which at times came down so hard that drivers on New Circle Road had to pull over in want of seeing more than water through their windshields. The near three-week deluge coincided almost exactly with Keeneland's 75th anniversary spring meet, a tough break for a track that conducts live racing just 30 days out of the year. But what could have been a financial disaster wasn't. In fact, numbers were even up a bit from 2010. Attendance stood at 241,684, third-highest for a spring meet ever, and up marginally from last year's figure of 238,282. On-track handle was up 3% to \$18,473,700, while all-sources handle was up 9%, to \$121,013,584.

Just as important, Keeneland once again enjoyed a sterling safety record. There wasn't a single equine fatality during afternoon racing this spring, and only one training fatality. That means that since Keeneland installed its Polytrack surface in advance of the fall 2006 meet, there has been only racing fatality during the spring meet in the past five years, and that was caused by a heart attack in April 2010.

Not surprisingly, Keeneland officials give much of the credit of the recent meet's success to the track itself. (Keeneland, it should be noted, co-owns Polytrack.) Polytrack has a vertical drainage system that allows water to flow right through the surface to the drainage apparatus--as does nearly every all-weather track. But in direct contrast to Santa Anita, which recently replaced its all-weather track, in part because of lingering drainage problems--Keeneland's surface came through with flying colors. Midway through the meet, in fact, at the draw breakfast for the GI Toyota Blue Grass, Keeneland president Nick Nicholson was already praising the track's performance, noting that just that morning, following a day where the airport across the street received three inches of rain, no fewer than 80 horses had worked over the main track. "In the past, on the old track, we would have had to cancel racing today," he said. By meet's end, Nicholson hadn't changed his tune.

"We had more rain in April than we've ever had before, and the track was just spectacular," Nicholson said. "The problems [Santa Anita] had with drainage are so different than the experience we had. In April, through all this record rain, this was virtually not a puddle anywhere on this racetrack at any moment. They can and should drain properly."

"Before, we would have been faced with a lot of scratches and extremely short fields," Nicholson continued. "Stakes races and graded races would have lost their competitive edge, and it would not have been near the race meet had this track not drained so well. Much to our surprise, our fields were actually bigger this year--up nearly half a horse per race--and last year's meet had great weather. Horses were able to work safely on the track in the morning, and race safely and formfully in the afternoon. And all this was against very adverse weather conditions."

In addition to the success of the Polytrack, Nicholson gave kudos to Keeneland's publicity and marketing departments. "You almost have to work at one of these racetracks to realize how many people it takes, doing totally different functions, to make a successful race meet," he said. "And this was a very good example of team working well together under adverse circumstances."

Keeneland's spring meet featured a number of theme days, including College Scholarship Day, Military Appreciation Day, and Keeneland's first-ever "Concert on the Lawn," which featured the Spazmatics and helped raised money for the Markey Cancer Center. "One of the benefits of a 15-day meet is that you can basically make each day special," said Nicholson. "Almost all of the days had their own theme. Some of them were crowd oriented, some were horse oriented in the form of top races."

Nicholson said Keeneland's unique position, as a company that also runs the most lucrative four-sale series in the world, also allows it to be a sort of laboratory for new ideas in racing, ideas that may eventually be applied to other aspects of the industry. "We can't be afraid to fail, and we can't do only sure things," he said when asked about trying out new things.

As an example, he pointed to Keeneland's installation of Trakus a few years ago. The horse-tracking system uses digital and radio technology to give, among other things, fans an accurate running order of horses in real time during a race. Trakus is co-owned by *TDN* publisher Barry Weisbord.

"Our fan base loves Trakus, and I think that Trakus is part of the explanation of our attendance growth, because it allows our fans to see the strategy of a race unfold in a way they never had before," said Nicholson. "They can watch their horse every step of the way in a much more substantive way."

Other new ideas put into motion include a smart-phone system that will allow handicappers to bet from their mobile devices. Keeneland hopes to launch the system this fall, at the same time an advance-deposit wagering site, designed with TwinSpires, is expected to go live.

WINNING DERBY BETTORS GIVE UP \$1 MILLION IN AUTOMATIC WITHHOLDING

Winning bettors paid some \$1 million in federal taxes on their winnings on Kentucky Derby day. Under current law, bettors experience automatic federal withholding on pari-mutuel winnings of \$5,000 or more at odds of 300-1.

According to industry estimates, close to \$1.16 million was withheld from bettors on the Kentucky Derby day card - winnings that may have otherwise been re-bet multiple times.

Churchill Downs handled \$165.2 million from all sources on this year's card. Of this total, the track reported that \$135.3 million, or 81.9%, was returned to winning bettors. But that number could have been higher if not for the automatic 25% federal withholding tax.

The NTRA's legislative team continues its work in Washington, D.C. to address the automatic withholding tax. Last year the NTRA secured introduction of legislation in the House to eliminate it. NTRA will seek re-introduction of a similar bill in the current Congress and is pursuing discussions with the Treasury Department to redefine the "cost of a wager," an indirect solution that could drastically reduce the number of affected winning wagers.

And, while Nicholson believes it is important for racing to embrace new technologies, he said that if Keeneland is indeed a laboratory for the sport, its most successful experiment has been its switch to an all-weather track, and Keeneland's subsequent safety record.

"Safety is one of the key components of building attendance, and you can't talk about the safety of our athletes without having a cerebral conversation about these new tracks vs. the old tracks," he said. "By the very definition of building attendance, you are appealing to people who are not there frequently. Bigger attendance means new people, new people mean fresh eyes, and fresh eyes will not accept the types of things that people that have been going to the track for the last 40 or 50 years have become accustomed to. The same goes for corporate sponsors--they don't want to be involved with a sport that isn't responsible. I think racing can have a very bright future, but I think one of the keys to that is that we build off a proper foundation. The foundation you have to build on is what the modern sports fan demands in all their sports. Number one is that it has to have integrity--on wagering systems, on rules, on drugs. The other thing is that you have to demonstrate care, concern and protection for the athlete. The safety of our human and equine athletes have to be our number-one priority, and it's going to be a critical piece of our overall strategy moving forward." -L Marquardt

Instant Racing Licenses Moving Forward:

Tim West, an attorney for the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission, indicated that applications to install Instant Racing machines in the next few months despite an ongoing court case challenging the game, *Courier-Journal* reported. Regulations to allow Instant Racing cleared the Administrative Regulation Review Subcommittee Tuesday, and may be considered by a second group of legislators. A court case is currently in the Kentucky Court of Appeals to determine whether Instant Racing is considered a form of pari-mutuel wagering or more similar to slot machine gambling. "If [racetracks] wanted to offer this wager and we approved it and the courts later ruled against it, then the tracks would be in a bad spot," West told *Courier-Journal*. "So that's an analysis that they have to make, whether they're willing to take that risk." West added, "We consider ourselves to be stewards of the racing industry. We have done what we think we can do to help that industry and to fulfill our statutory mandate." Instant Racing machines, which have proven to be popular at Oaklawn Park, are opposed by The Family Foundation of Kentucky.

Tampa Bay Downs Concludes Meet:

Edited press release

For the second year in a row, Tampa Bay Downs concluded its meet with a record set for commingled all-sources handle. Despite the loss of handle from New York City OTB parlors, the Oldsmar oval's total all-sources handle grew to \$411,484,853, up \$30,495,981 or 8%; this was accomplished even with one fewer racing day than the 2009-2010 season due to a mechanical failure. The average all-source daily handle is a new record for the Oldsmar oval, with \$4,572,054 wagered daily on Tampa Bay Downs, a 9.20% increase. This translates to \$436,820.49 wagered per race, also a new record, up 8.46% from last year's figures. Tampa Bay Downs Vice President and General Manager Peter Berube said of the record-setting increases, "I am very pleased with the outcome of our season. Fans and horsemen alike enjoyed a relatively dry and warm winter here, which certainly helped us increase attendance and on-track handle. Overall, we credit our lower takeout, large fields, 18% more turf racing and greater access to the California market as key to our success, as well as a larger simulcast following nationwide." Berube added, "This year, Tampa Bay Downs again introduced reduced takeout for Pick 3s, 4s, Super High Fives and Pick 6s; in addition, the late Pick 4 was supplemented by a \$35,000 guarantee sponsored by TVG. The entire Pick Four pool increased by 47% this season, which we attribute to our reduced takeout plus further awareness of the product through the TVG sponsorship." Racing Secretary Allison De Luca said, "This season, we were pleased to see our average number of horses per race increase to 9.11, and to have the average purses paid out jump by over 5%. Horsemen continue to run here for our safe surfaces and strong stakes program, and it's gratifying to get the kind of response we saw this season." De Luca continued, "I also was very pleased to see the dramatic increase in number of horses claimed this meet from last season. Over 50% more horses were claimed this season from last season, and the total cost of horses claimed was a 67% increase from last year. This speaks to the quality of horses going through the claiming ranks here, as well as to the general confidence trainers and owners have about these horses' potential for the future." Ronnie Allen Jr. led the jockey standings with 109 wins, while Gerald Bennett and Jamie Ness shared the top of the trainers' table with 61 wins each. Midwest Thoroughbreds was the leading owner at the meet once more, winning 59 of 163 starts and earning \$707,091.
