Victory in the Epsom Derby has so far eluded The Queen, but 2011 could mark a watershed year if **Carlton House** (Street Cry {Ire}) can build on yesterday's smooth success in York's G2 Dante S. Sent off at 11-4 for the Blue Riband's premier trial, the

impressive Newbury maiden winner translated his impressive homework into racecourse action with a 1 1/2-length defeat of **Seville (Ger)** (Galileo {Ire}) to provide Sir Michael Stoute with a sixth renewal. Keen early off the slow gallop, the bay wore down Ballydoyle's 5-4 favorite approaching the final furlong and was pushed

out to assert. "His work had been very good and he has a very good turn-of-foot, so I probably would have been disappointed if he had got beaten today," winning jockey Ryan Moore commented. **Cont. p2**

A Gift Horse...


Carlton House (Street Cry {Ire}) is named after the former Royal residence, which stood next to St James' Park in London and was demolished in 1825. The colt was bred by Darley, and presented to The Queen as a token of Sheikh Mohammed's gratitude. John Warren explained, "Her Majesty had a horse called Highland Glen (GB) (Montjeu {Ire}), who had been a bit troublesome in the stalls. The Sheikh wanted to buy him and take him to race in Dubai. As The Queen doesn't race in Dubai, she let him have the horse. The Sheikh was very grateful for the gift and, as a consequence, he sent her four yearlings. Sheikh Mohammed and John Ferguson handpicked the yearlings for her, and they are excellent judges." Bred by The Queen, Highland Glen broke his maiden on the turf at Lingfield in May of 2009, and won a pair of handicap races at the end of the season despite his reluctance to load into the starting stalls. He joined Sheikh Mohammed's team that fall and, in his first run in the Godolphin blue, captured a lucrative Meydan handicap.

An eye-catcher when a strong-finishing runner-up in a mile maiden at Salisbury on debut in late September, Carlton House sent out some positive signals when successful by nine lengths from Yaseer (GB) (Dansili {GB}) in a similar event over the same trip at Newbury the following month. Following some smart homework on Newmarket's slopes, the Darley-bred colt had emerged as a leading light in the ante-post picture for the June 4 Epsom Classic and duly upstaged his contemporaries in this crucial test. Keen early in fourth off the slow pace set by Pisco Sour (Lemon Drop Kid), he was short of room in early stretch following that rival and Seville, who was committed by Christophe Soumillon with a quarter mile remaining. Squeezing between that duo soon after, he needed only vigorous hand riding from Ryan Moore to subdue Ballydoyle's raider. **World Domination** (Empire Maker), the well-touted 5-2 second favorite, briefly threatened in the straight before fading into fourth. "It was a horrible race and he did well to win as they didn't go any pace," jockey Ryan Moore said. "It was a shame, because no-one's really learnt a great deal. It was messy and everyone was trying to get in and get cover, but being a trial, we decided to ride him that way. If it had been another race, we would have gone on and let him bowl, but we wanted to teach him and it was important it happened that way." Trainer Sir Michael Stoute, who had won this five times, including with subsequent Derby winners Shahrastani in 1986 and North Light (Ire) in 2004, revealed that the winner had suffered from a foot infection a few weeks ago that put him off schedule slightly. He added, "We thought it could be a messy race and certainly turned out to be that, but he would have learned a bit. He went through a nice, tight opening and let's hope he progresses more from that--he is relaxed enough and has a good mind."

The Queen's Racing Manager John Warren said, "After he won at Newbury, I asked Michael 'are we on for a Derby trial?' and he replied 'definitely' and that's unlike him, as he usually sits on the fence. This will mean a lot to The Queen. She's very aware, but doesn't try to influence. The excitement surrounding her having a Derby favorite will be great. After she had the Royal Ascot winner a few years ago, people mentioned it at every public engagement for about two months." The Queen, who inherited the string of her father, King George VI, when he died in 1952, almost enjoyed Derby glory with her first Classic runner Aureole (GB) in 1953. Running four days after her coronation, the colt was second to Gordon Richards' mount Pinza (GB). Her silks have been carried to success in five Classics, with the last coming in 1977 courtesy of Dunfermline (GB) in both the Epsom Oaks and St Leger. **Cont. p3**

Aidan O'Brien was offering no excuses for Seville afterwards. He told *PA Sport*, "It was a very good race and a very good trial. We are delighted with our fellow, but the winner picked up better than we did. We can't complain and the likelihood is he'll go to Epsom."
 ⚡ **"TDN Rising Star"** ⚡ World Domination is one that will probably be giving Epsom a miss, according to Khalid Abdullah's Racing Manager Teddy Grimthorpe. "We are happy enough, but he's still a big baby," Grimthorpe explained. "At this stage, I'd say Epsom is unlikely--he might go to Ascot [for the June 16 G2 King Edward VII S.]. Pisco Sour's trainer Hughie Morrison is keen to try his colt in the June 4 Classic. He told *PA Sport*, "He's run a very good race--better than anyone would have thought. We came here thinking the ground would be good-to-soft, but it ended up being quite quick. I thought we might end up running in the G3 Queen's Vase at Ascot, but we obviously have to look at the Derby now."

NEW INTRO PLANNED FOR WORKFORCE

Khalid Abdullah's 2010 Epsom Derby and Arc hero **Workforce (GB)** (King's Best) looks set to swerve an encounter with So You Think (NZ) (High Chaparral {Ire}) in next Sunday's G1 Tattersalls Gold Cup and stay at home for the May 26 G3 Brigadier Gerard S. at Sandown. Teddy Grimthorpe, racing manager to the owner-breeder, told the *Daily Mail* that connections have shifted their options for the Sir Michael Stoute-trained four-year-old. "We were patient with Workforce last year and we will be again," he told the daily. "Ireland is looking less likely and the Brigadier Gerard S. at Sandown is a possibility."

INTERNATIONAL MEDICATION SUMMIT IN JUNE

The American Association of Equine Practitioners, National Thoroughbred Racing Association and the Racing Medication and Testing Consortium have joined forces to host the first "International Summit on Race Day Medication, EIPH and the Racehorse." The event will be held June 13-14 in New York city at a location still to be announced. Representatives from Europe, the Middle East, Asia, Australia, the U.S. and Canada will participate in the summit. Summit panels will offer discussions on regulatory issues surrounding race day medication; veterinary viewpoints on the management of Exercise Induced Pulmonary Hemorrhage; the management of EIPH from the perspective of trainers. "Our goal is to shine a light on how other countries manage a variety of issues relating to race day medication," said NTRA President and CEO Alex Waldrop. "We look forward to providing a forum for sharing valuable perspectives from some of the world's foremost trainers, regulatory authorities and veterinarians." RMTC Chairman Dr. Robert Lewis added, "This summit represents an effort to bring together racing representatives from around the world to exchange information on the various approaches to managing medication use, especially regarding the management of EIPH, and for all to hear the overall perspectives of each on horse racing in general. Every country that conducts racing encounters problems at one time or another, but EIPH is a universal problem. RMTC believes it cannot be anything but beneficial to open the lines of communication between international stakeholders so that we can learn from one another to improve racing and protect the horses."

AUSTRALIAN TRAINERS TO REPORT EQUINE SURGERIES

According to accounts in the Australian press, the Australian stewards have approved a policy that will require Thoroughbred trainers to report any surgery undergone by horses in their care. The decision was reached during the stewards' annual National Policy Conference, held in Melbourne this week. "There was a rumour So You Think (NZ) (High Chaparral {Ire}) had had a throat operation, and in the finish, we made it our business to find out," Racing Victoria Limited Chief Steward Terry Bailey told the *Herald-Sun*. "But we don't want a repeat of that occurrence. Trainers need to be more conscious of the punter. Now they will be required to report any sort of surgery, whether it be upper respiratory or even any sign of lameness or gait dysfunction. Any horse, any time, if something's happened, we believe the customer has the right to know." Stewards questioned So You Think's trainer Bart Cummings after it came to their attention that the 2009 G1 Cox Plate winner had a surgical procedure to correct a throat problem during the off season at the beginning of 2010. Cummings insisted his charge was fit for his return in the '10 G2 Memsie S., and So You Think proved him right with a handy victory. The new policy must now be approved and implemented by Australia's major racing clubs.



Classic Corner

DREAM AHEAD OUT OF POULAINS

Khalifa Dasmal's **Dream Ahead** (Diktat {GB}) was ruled out of Sunday's G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains (French 2000 Guineas) by trainer David Simcock yesterday. After reviewing the ground conditions at Longchamp, he opted to scratch last year's G1 Prix Morny and G1 Middle Park S. hero and joint-champion juvenile from the mile Classic, which was swelled to 15 yesterday after the decision by Godolphin to supplement the Apr. 14 Newmarket maiden winner **Midsummer Fair** (Medaglia d'Oro). "The ground is vital and I'd have been worried if he ran on fast ground," Simcock said. "If he did and hated it, we still wouldn't know if he stayed a mile. Although they are calling it good, good-to-soft in places, they haven't had any rain for a long time, so it would be on the faster side of good. We are just going to sit tight and wait for the rain." As expected, Denford Stud's Apr. 16 G3 Fred Darling S. winner **Rimth** (GB) (Oasis Dream {GB}) was added to the G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches, making a field of 18 for the fillies' Classic.

Godolphin Weigh Up Options

Godolphin are in the process of firming up Classic plans for their leading middle-distance sophomore colts, with a trio under consideration for the June 4 G1 Epsom Derby. **Genius Beast** (Kingmambo), who took the Apr. 24 G3 Sandown Classic Trial, is set to be declared for Sunday's G2 Prix Hocquart at Longchamp, while last year's G1 Racing Post Trophy scorer **Casamento** (Ire) (Shamardal) and Apr. 30 Listed Newmarket S. winner **Ocean War** (GB) (Dalakhani {Ire}) will head straight to their respective Derbies. "Casamento will either go straight for the [June 5] G1 Prix du Jockey Club or Epsom, while Ocean War will head straight to Epsom because he has had two races already this year and doesn't need another one," racing manager Simon Crisford explained. "We have three horses in the mix for the Derby--one of them will end up in France, but we don't know which one yet."

ALL WELL IN THE KINGDOM

Trainer Graham Motion continued to be pleased with how **Animal Kingdom** (Leroidesanimaux {Brz}) has come out of his victory in Saturday's GI Kentucky Derby. "The horse is great," Motion, back home at his Fair Hill training center base, said yesterday. "He's not worried about anything. He seems to be traveling well, which is always a concern coming out of a race like that. He seems to be taking everything in stride and that's a big deal." Motion expects Animal Kingdom to remain at Fair Hill until May 20, the day before the GI Preakness S. "I want to enjoy the Derby this week, then next week we'll start worrying about winning the Preakness," Motion said. "There's no doubt there's going to be pressure, because you're going to feel like everybody's on your shoulders. Everybody wants this to happen, so how do you not feel pressure?" Motion did admit that he is concerned about the quick turnaround between the Derby and the Preakness. "It's unlikely to me that he's going to progress in the Preakness coming back in two weeks," the Englishman said. "I think it's a race where you just hope that he's that good that he can handle the two weeks. That's the tough part of it. To expect him to improve, I think that's asking a lot. But he showed he's a brilliant horse. If he's as brilliant a horse as I think he might be, then he can handle it."

Duncan has his first try at an extended trip here, having proven his ability over a mile and a half when besting Nakayama Festa (Jpn) (Stay Gold {Jpn}) in Longchamp's G2 Prix Foy in September. While the runner-up went on to excel when filling the same spot in the Arc the following month, Duncan only beat four home in that highlight and will be more at home at this level. **Native Ruler** was coming back from a two-year absence when losing out to Dandino (GB) (Dansili {GB}) in a bobber at the end of the Apr. 30 G2 Jockey Club S. at Newmarket, where the G3 John Porter S. winner Indian Days (GB) (Daylami {Ire}) was four lengths back in third. Trainer Henry Cecil will be hoping that the "bounce theory" does not apply to the 5-year-old. "Native Ruler made an encouraging return after a long absence when second in the Jockey Club S. and looks to have a leading chance," the Warren Place trainer commented. **Askar Tau**, who took the G2 Lonsdale Cup here and G2 Doncaster Cup in 2009, turned back the clock after a spell in the wilderness last time when annexing the G3 Sagaro S. at Ascot Apr. 27 and warrants respect in an open-looking renewal. "Askar Tau showed he retains plenty of ability in the Sagaro S. at Ascot last time and we hope he will run extremely well again," trainer Marcus Tregoning said. "He drops back in trip and, hopefully, the ground will be fast enough for him."
