NEHRO TO BYPASS PREAKNESS

Zayat Stables' **Nehro** (Mineshaft), runner-up to Animal Kingdom (Leroidesanimaux {Brz}) in the GI Kentucky Derby May 7, will skip Saturday's GI Preakness S. and instead await the GI Belmont S. June 11. "It is very hard to pass any Grade I when your horse is doing so well, but Mr. [Ahmed] Zayat felt that four races in eight weeks could be too much to ask, and wanted to take the super-cautious approach," explained Brad Weisbord, Zayat's finance and racing manager. "Nehro worked brilliantly [Monday], and

GREEN LIGHT FOR OVERDOSE

Connections of the renowned Hungarian sprinter **Overdose** (GB) (Starborough {GB}) have confirmed him on course for Saturday's G2 Temple S. at Haydock. The "Budapest Bullet" is stabled with Amanda Perrett in Sussex. "I have never been to Haydock before, and we will be travelling up with the horse on Friday night," said co-owner Zoltan Mikoczy. "The opposition was not great on his comeback run in Germany, and the Temple S. will be a much better test and will tell us more. [It] will be on Hungarian TV, and he has a huge following at home. If he was trained in Britain or France, he would not be such a big story, but in Hungary he is. He needs around four-to-six weeks between his races, so the plan this year is Haydock, Royal Ascot, the Abbaye and possibly the Breeders' Cup. The plan is currently to race on into next year with him, then he will be retired to stud. He would probably stand outside of Hungary, but we would make sure Hungarian mares were sent to him."

Dialed In It to Win It...

Dialed In (Mineshaft), eighth as the crowd's choice in the Kentucky Derby, is in line to win the Preakness 5.5 --the \$5.5 million bonus announced by Frank Stronach last year--if he can complete the GIII Holy Bull S.-GI Florida Derby-GI Preakness triple. But trainer Nick Zito said yesterday that the bonus isn't owner Bob LaPenta's main goal. "Bob and I talked about it, and we just want to focus on winning the Preakness," said Zito, who would get \$500,000 of the Preakness 5.5 pot. "He wants to win the bonus, but that's not what he's in the game for...he'd rather have the trophy." But, he added, "For me, it's a different story. If the horse crosses the finish line [first], the feed guys will be standing in line--it'll all go to the feed man."

CANADIAN HALL OF FAME INDUCTEES

ANNOUNCED The Canadian Horse Racing Hall Fame announced the induction of five new members during a press conference at Woodbine Race Track in Toronto Tuesday. The organization's annual induction ceremonies will be conducted at the Mississauga Convention Centre Aug. 18. The five members of the Thoroughbred class include **Dancethruthedawn** (Mr. Prospector--Dance Smartly, by Danzig) along with her Sam-Son Farm connections--the late Tammy Samuel-Balaz in the Builders category and Mark Frostad, who trained three of the Milton nursery's Queen's Plate winners. Collecting the title in the Male category was 1997 GI Belmont S. winner **Touch Gold** (Deputy Minister--Passing Mood, by Buckpasser), who was campaigned in the colors of Stronach and Stonerside Stables, while 1973 champion 3-year-old filly **Square Angel** (Quadrangle--Nangela, by Nearctic), owned by the late Gen. Preston Gilbride, was elected in the Veterans category. **Cont. p3**

Sam-Son Farm once again proved its dominance on the Canadian scene with a trio of inductees. The 2011 session was led by Dancethruthedawn, who collected a victory in the first jewel of the Canadian Triple Crown--

Queen's Plate S.--in addition to the Labatt Woodbine Oaks en route to a sophomore championship in 2001. The following season, the granddaughter of the blue hen mare Classy 'n Smart (Smarten) added a score in Saratoga's GI Go For Wand S. and was

third in the GI Personal Ensign H. Bred for success, the bay is a daughter of Canadian Triple Crown winner and Horse of the Year Dance Smartly. A foal of 1998, she is a full-sister to Scatter the Gold, who collected Classic glory in the 2000 edition of the Plate. During her career, she won seven races from 17 starts before retiring with earnings of \$1,609,643.

Fellow inductee Frostad, who collected his first win as a trainer in 1991, trained for a number of owners in the early '90s, including Bob Anderson, Rod Ferguson, Michael Van Every, Kinghaven Farms, Earle Mack, as well as Jim Begg and his son Jeff, owners of Windways Farm and Frostad's first Plate winner, Victor Cooley (Cool Vicotr). He assumed the helm at Sam-Son in 1994 and, for that operation, conditioned Horses of the Year Chief Bearhart (2x), Quiet Resolve and Soaring Free.

Also included among horses trained by Frostad were Silken Cat, Smart Strike, Always A Rainbow, Catch the Ring, Desert Waves, Eye of the Sphynx and Dance With Ravens. Samuel-Balaz, daughter of Sam-Son Farm's founder Ernie Samuel, was inducted in the Builders category. She was named president and general manager of Sam-Son Farm following the death of her father, Ernie Samuel, in 2000.

Touch Gold, Grade I placed in Canada at two, came into his own at three, taking the GI Belmont S., GI Haskell Invitational H. and GI Lexington S. for trainer David Hofmans. Now 16, he retired to Adena Springs in 1999.

PENN NATIONAL TO SELL STAKE IN MJC? The *Baltimore Sun* reported Tuesday that Penn National Gaming, which acquired a 49% share in the Maryland Jockey Club last year in anticipation of getting a slots license for MJC-operated Laurel Park, is in negotiations with majority owner MI Developments to sell its stake in the company. The MJC was unable to secure a slots license for Laurel, and Penn National Gaming has turned its focus to Rosecroft Raceway, buying the bankrupt facility this past winter with plans to lobby for slots and bring back live harness racing and, in the future, introduce Thoroughbred racing at the track. Before those plans can be finalized, Penn National Gaming must come to terms with MID over its shares in MJC. The company must also sign an agreement with the state's horsemen, and get the approval of the Maryland Racing Commission. Eric Schippers, a spokesman for Penn National, told the *Baltimore Sun* that talks with MID were "nearing the finish line," adding, "Hopefully, we will have more to say on that soon."

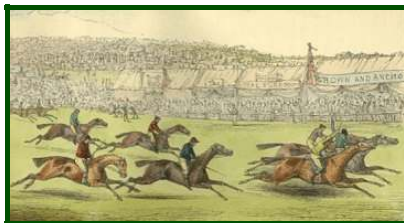

Express on Track...

Trainer Kevin Prendergast yesterday issued an upbeat bulletin on his G1 Abu Dhabi Irish 2000 Guineas contender **Dunboyme Express (Ire)** (Shamardal). Jonn Connaughton's G3 Anglesey S. and G3 Leopardstown 2000 Guineas Trial winner is likely to face a depleted field Saturday in The Curragh Classic, but his trainer still fears the Newmarket Guineas runner-up **Dubawi Gold (GB)** (Dubawi {Ire}). "Dubawi Gold is definitely the one to beat and I thought he ran a fine race in the 2000 Guineas," Prendergast said. "It looks a competitive race, and Epsom is definitely on the cards if he gives a good account of himself on Saturday."

Wachman on Weather Watch...

Trainer David Wachman is hoping for rain ahead of Sunday's G1 Etihad Airways 1000 Guineas at The Curragh, for which his unbeaten stable star **Chrysanthemum (Ire)** (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) was one of 16 fillies remaining at yesterday's forfeit stage. Owners

Michael Tabor, Derrick Smith and Susan Magnier had six left in the list yesterday, and last year's G3 C.L. Weld Park S. winner is the only one not to hail from Ballydoyle. "I'm very happy with her, she's in good form," Wachman told *PA Sport*. "She wouldn't want the ground too quick, so we'll have to see what the track is like nearer the time." Wachman added, "This has always been her aim all winter, absolutely. Good ground would

be fine for her, and I'd imagine Wayne Lordan will ride her." Of the five Aidan O'Brien trainees, the May 1 G1 1000 Guineas runner-up **Together (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) and last year's G1 Prix Marcel Boussac winner **Misty For Me (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire})--who was unplaced in that Newmarket Classic--appear to have the strongest credentials. Betty Maxwell-Moran's G2 Debutante S. winner **Laughing Lashes** (Mr. Greeley), Jim Bolger's dual group scorer **Banimpire (Ire)** (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}) and His Highness The Aga Khan's G3 Athasi S. winner **Emiyna** (Maria's Mon) are other notables for the Classic. As expected, Highclere Thoroughbred Racing's **Memory (Ire)** (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) will be on the sidelines once more on Sunday after being forced to miss the French equivalent due to being in season.

time in the G1 Dubai Golden Shaheen over the Meydan Tapeta Mar. 26, turned in a brilliant workout Tuesday morning over the Kranji all-weather surface. The gelding broke off at the 1000-meter pole before settling into his 600-meter drill. He covered

the distance in a sparkling :34.5, with the final furlong in :11.5, and was under a tight hold from jockey Felix Coetzee.

The South African rider thought the move had gone much slower. "You just can't believe it," said Coetzee. "He just flies underneath you and you don't know you're running those sorts of times. It is the first time I have seen him since Dubai. He looks terrific and his coat is much better than what it was in Dubai. He is feeling terrific in himself also and I can't ask for any more than that. As long as the horse is doing very well then I'm happy." Trainer Patrick Shaw was also more than satisfied with the work. "I was very happy with that gallop," said Shaw. "I can't ask for anything more than that. He is spot on." Rocket Man's stiffest competition should come in the form of a pair of former KrisFlyer winners from Hong Kong. **Sacred Kingdom (Aus)** (Encosta de Lago {Aus}), who defeated Rocket Man by a neck in 2009, will be looking to snap a three-race streak of runner-up efforts this weekend. Glen Boss takes the ride on the former world champion sprinter. **Green Birdie (NZ)** (Catbird {Aus}) caused a 13-1 upset a year ago, also besting Rocket Man by a neck. He was most recently fourth, beaten under three lengths, in the Golden Shaheen.

WORLD NUMBER ONE: GALILEO
Golden Lilac's impressive win in Sunday's G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches marked Galileo's 18th Northern Hemisphere-bred individual Group 1/Grade I winner from six crops of 3-year-olds and up--an average of three G1/GI winners per crop. They consist of 12 G1/GI-winning colts, an average of two per crop, and six G1/GI-winning fillies, an average of one per crop. They have won a total of 33 top-level races among them. They include seven winners of English, Irish, or French 3-year-old Classics (not including the G1 Irish St. Leger and G1 Prix Royal-Oak, of which he has had one 4-year-old winner each), including 2011 one-mile Guineas winners Frankel and Golden Lilac--both, as has been noted extensively, out of Danehill mares.

It's hard to remember now, but at the beginning of 2004--just seven short years ago--Sadler's Wells' stature as a sire of sires looked problematic. In the Wings, Barathea, the surprising North American success El Prado, and maybe Fort Wood in South Africa represented his best form to that time as a sire of sires. It wasn't certain that Sadler's Wells was even going to survive as a significant sire line. Montjeu was about to have his first 2-year-olds race (as were, in what turned out to be a critical positive turning point in Coolmore's fortunes, Giant's Causeway and Fusaichi Pegasus [two out of three ain't bad]) and, though the Montjeus had created a positive impression from the time they first sold as foals in late 2002, pretty is as pretty does, as we know. Nobody was climbing out on much of a limb.

By the end of 2005, things were looking up considerably for Sadler's Wells as a sire of sires, thanks to Montjeu's first crop which included three Classic winners: Motivator, Hurricane Run, and Scorpion. However, Galileo hadn't yet made much noise; he didn't have a black-type winner with his first two-year-olds in 2005, and entered 2006 well down in the second five among 2005 freshman sires by progeny earnings.

That was the last time there were any doubts about him, or the Sadler's Wells sire line. Nighttime won the G1 Irish 1000 Guineas in May 2006 and, by the end of the year, he had added two more 3-year-old G1/GI winners--Sixties Icon in the G1 English St. Leger and Red Rocks in the GI Breeders' Cup Turf--and had the unbeaten champion 2-year-old in Europe, Teofilo, from his second crop.

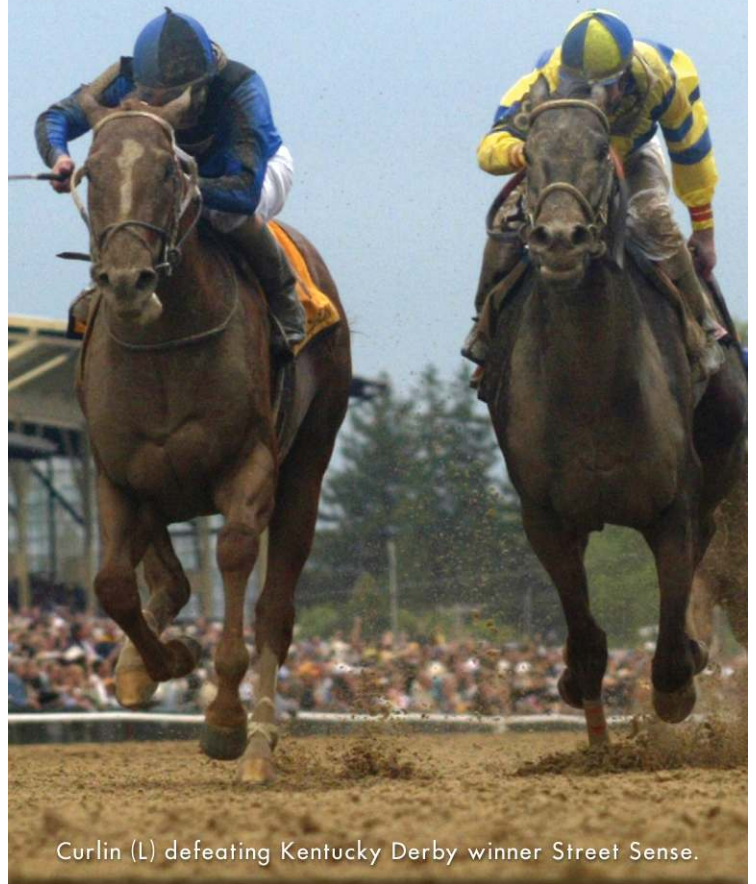

Galileo's stud fee quadrupled, from its low point of €37,500 in 2005 and 2006 to €150,000 for 2007. It's been 'private' ever since, though estimates consistently put the price of buying a season to breed to him as safely over \$200,000 every year since 2008. He's been leading sire in GB/Ire twice (2008 and 2010), and leading sire of 2-year-olds twice (2007 and 2010).

Galileo's six crops include three European champion juveniles: Teofilo (2006), New Approach (2007), and Frankel (2010). New Approach went on to win the 2008 G1 Epsom Derby, and Galileo has sired two winners of the G1 Irish Derby: Soldier of Fortune (2007) and Cape Blanco (2010). Those three Derby winners, along with Nighttime and Sixties Icon from his first crop, and Frankel and Golden Lilac from his current (sixth) crop of sophomores, constitute his seven 3-year-old Classic winners. Besides BC Turf winner Red Rocks, his other top horses include two triple Group 1 winners, the colt Rip Van Winkle and the filly Lush Lashes. He already has four Group 1 winners so far among his current crop of 3-year-olds: besides Frankel and Golden Lilac, this crop also includes 2010 2-year-old Group 1 winners Roderic O'Connor and Misty for Me.

When all is said and done--in spite of all the sire analysis and statistics the likes of myself and many others come up with--it's the horses we can identify as 'household names' that set stud fees and sell seasons. Galileo has sired a string of them: unbeaten champion 2-year-olds Teofilo, New Approach (Derby winner), and Frankel (Guineas winner); Rip Van Winkle, Red Rocks, Cape Blanco, Soldier of Fortune, now Golden Lilac, maybe Roderic O'Connor, plus other 2011 Classic contenders, including Seville (2nd G2 Dante, to G1 Derby favorite Carlton House), Together (2nd G1 English 1000 Guineas), and Galikova (half-sister to Goldikova, won G3 Prix Cleopatre, will meet Golden Lilac next month in the G1 Prix de Diane). Voila: that's why Galileo is the world's number one sire.

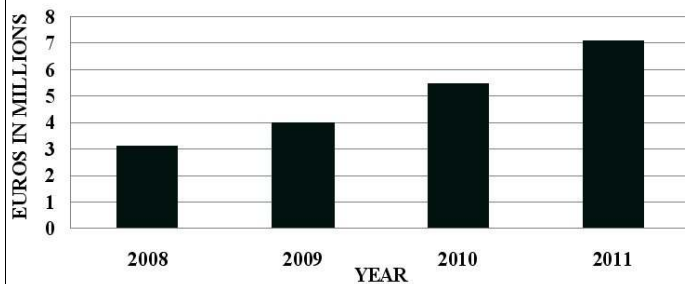
Weekly Sales Ticker

"Are we in a time warp? Is it 2007 or 2008? We haven't seen a graph like this since then: the Arqana Two-Year-Old Sale at Saint-Cloud was up 28 percent in gross and 21 percent in average from last year. The gross has more than doubled since 2008, and the average is up by 80 percent. It also explains why the European Two-Year-Old stats were running worse than North America's; with this sale added in, the European Two-Year-Old market is down 21 percent, and the average 22 percent, from 2008 – very plausible to live with, and in fact slightly better now – as you'd expect – than the North American market."

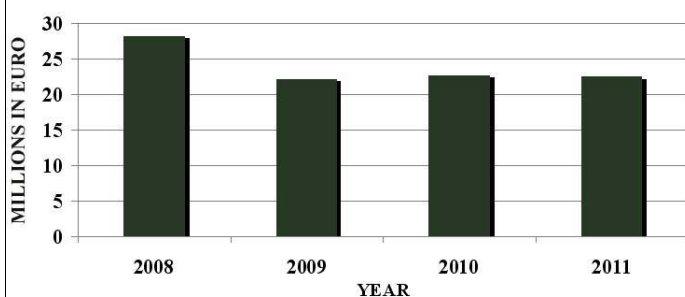

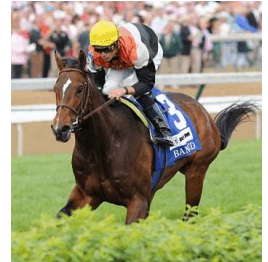

The American Cousins...

El Prado, racing in the Sangster colors and trained by the legendary Vincent O'Brien, won the G1 National S. as a juvenile in 1991, and was considered very useful, but not a top 2-year-old by Timeform, which assigned him a year-end rating of 119. He was injured early as a 3-year-old, ran three times with no success later in the year, and was retired to stud in Kentucky in 1993 without any great expectations. He came from the same sire crop as A.P. Indy, so to end up as the second-best North American sire whose first foals were born in 1994 is no mean achievement. His very best horse was Medaglia d'Oro, a dirt horse who won three Grade I's and four Grade II's, and was second in six other Grade I's, in 17 career starts, bankrolling over \$5.7 million. He's now one of the top young sires in North America, one of the "Fearsome Foursome" of North America F2006 sires, along with Tapit, Speightstown and Candy Ride. Medaglia d'Oro had a 3.65 A Runner Index through the end of 2010, and I ranked him 12th among the New World Order Top 30 in my Apr. 20 column ([click here](#) to see the New Top 30 table).

Two years after Medaglia d'Oro was foaled, El Prado's 2001 crop included two top-class grass horses who are also trying to contribute to this American branch of the Sadler's Wells sire line. Kitten's Joy was champion turf male of 2004 as a 3-year-old, when he went six-for-eight, including wins in the GI Secretariat and GI Turf Classic, and a second to Better Talk Now in the GI Breeders' Cup Turf. Kitten's Joy stands at the Ramsey Farm in Kentucky. He is a third-crop sire now, with first 4-year-olds.



Banned Horsephotos

According to the TDN Sire Lists ([click here](#)), he ranks fourth among third-crop sires by 2011 progeny earnings, and seventh by cumulative progeny earnings (fifth in NA) in a group headed by European sires Dubawi and Shamardal. On Apr. 23 at Keeneland, Kitten's Joy had three black-type horses, two winners (including Gill Coolmore Lexington S. winner Derby Kitten) and a second. He also had Banned, the winner of the GII American Turf S., for 3-year-olds on the grass, at Churchill on Derby Day.

Artie Schiller, also a foal of 2001, then picked up the baton. He ran six times on the turf as a 4-year-old in 2005, all in Grade I or Grade II races. He won two Grade IIs and the GI Breeders' Cup Mile, in which he defeated none other than Leroidesanimaux, sire of this year's GI Kentucky Derby winner and Triple Crown contender Animal Kingdom. He also placed in his other three starts, another two Grade IIs and one Grade I. His first foals are now 3-year-olds. He stands at Pauls Mill, alongside Bellamy Road, who is in a ding-dong battle with War Front for the lead among 2011 second-crop sires by progeny earnings. But Artie Schiller is definitely trying to poke his head above the crowd, with five horses that have won or placed in black-type races since the beginning of April. He's currently 11th on the 2011 second-crop sire list by progeny earnings ([click here](#)), but one gets the feeling he's heading in the right direction, too. So, unexpectedly, a branch of Sadler's Wells has sprung up in America, and the most promising of them so far--even Medaglia d'Oro's oldest are just 5-year-olds--was a dirt horse.

El Prado may not be quite finished yet, either. Paddy O'Prado, now four, was third in last year's GI Kentucky Derby and went on to win three graded races on the grass, including the GI Secretariat S. Hopefully, he'll be a good grass horse for connections later this year. He can enhance his credentials, but he's already done enough to earn a chance to enhance El Prado's American branch of the Sadler's Wells sire line.

BUFFALOED

The other night, I was watching TV and a few wild dogs were trying to bring down a buffalo. They were having trouble until they were joined by more dogs and, lo and behold, they brought the buffalo down.

I was reminded of the pervasive issue of performance-enhancing drugs in our industry. For a long time, the buffaloes and their minions have been parading around, snorting, and spouting off platitudes and promises about how they are going to clean up the industry and stop the use of performance-enhancing drugs on race day.

The truth of the matter is that the only interest many of these people have is in maintaining their status as moguls of the industry. Even though some of them are truly well-intentioned, they have no way or means to accomplish the banning of performance-enhancing drugs in the Thoroughbred industry.

The IHIA (Interstate Horseracing Improvement Act) can actually accomplish this. A few dogs can't bring down the buffalo, but many of us banding together can. It must be done and done soon or we will have no industry. Whether medication is good or bad doesn't matter and is not the question. The public doesn't want it. It turns them away. If you want to survive as an industry, you must do away with it and do it soon. In the same vein, no gambler wants to play a game that he perceives as tainted or crooked, be it blackjack, poker, or horseracing. Drugs are causing this industry to lose its fans, its gamblers, its reputation and its integrity.

As owners, we are paying a minimum of \$100 million a year just for the use of Lasix alone, not counting the money we spend for "jugs" to revive the horses after they have had this powerful diuretic. If you add butazolidin and all of the other veterinary charges to the list, I calculate that we are shelling out at least \$150 million a year. What a nice bonus it would be if we could do away with race-day medication altogether and have only trace levels in the blood--levels which are not performance-enhancing, that is. This would vastly improve our image, our breed, our pocketbooks and most important of all, the health and welfare of that noble creature, the horse.

The only way to bring about the change we seek is through the Interstate Horseracing Improvement Act. There is no other way. Some say they don't want the government involved in our business. Well, they already are involved. They gave us, at our request, the IHA in the first place. They can give us the Interstate Horseracing Improvement Act as well.

We are not trying to do anything that the Brits and others don't do. We want our industry to be trustworthy and above-board; that is all. The crooks won't let us operate on a level playing field without the Federal Government. That is why we have the FBI and other government agencies. You have a choice--don't trust the Federal Government and trust the thugs, druggers and cheaters; or join us in asking the government to implement the IHIA and once and for all put a stop to all of the nefarious practices that accompany the use of performance-enhancing drugs. In the end, if we stand together and support this legislation, we can regain the respect and support of our fans, as well as our reputation for producing the best Thoroughbreds in the world. All these years we have kow-towed to the buffaloes and look where we are today. You can join us or continue to let the buffaloes run over you and your children's future.

GLOBAL GAMING COMPLETES LONE STAR PURCHASE

After a series of delays, Global Gaming LSP LLC has finalized the purchase of Lone Star Park in Grand Prairie, Texas. The group represents and manages the entertainment interests of the Chickasaw Nation, which also owns Remington Park in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma. "Many people will ask, 'What will be different after the ownership change,' and the short answer will be very little for the first few days and weeks," Drew Shubeck, Lone Star president and general manager, said in a release. "All employees and managers have been retained and all contracts will be honored. Over the months ahead, everyone will start to notice projects that will benefit workers and customers of the Grandstand and Post Time Pavilion, plus horsemen will notice building projects on the backside."

HARD SPUN COLT TOPS BARRETTS MAY

A colt from the first crop by Hard Spun (Danzig) brought a final bid of \$220,000 to top the single-session Barretts May Sale in Pomona, California, Monday evening. Consigned by Ciaran Dunne's Wavertree Stables Inc., the juvenile was purchased by George Bolton. The dark bay, bred by Marvin Little Jr., was acquired by Trail Ridge Farm as a \$375,000 KEENOV weanling. He had RNA'd for \$425,000 as a KEESEP yearling. A half to GISW Sinister Minister (Old Trieste), he worked a quarter in a co-bullet :21 2/5 ([video](#)) at the preview. Wavertree was the leading consignor by gross and average, selling four 2-year-olds for an aggregate \$359,000, and an average of \$89,750. The catalogue for this year's May Sale was 26% smaller than a year ago, but figures mirrored those of 2010. The average of \$36,466 was up 1.3%, while the median of \$20,000 was down 2.4%. Sandra Rasmussen's decision to add quality her River Ridge Ranch broodmare band brought her to the 2008 Fasig-Tipton Kentucky November sale, where she landed the 5-year-old mare Oprah Winney, in foal to Ghostzapper, for \$400,000. That Ghostzapper filly, Lady Ban Shee, was a first-out winner yesterday at Prairie Meadows.

Oprah Winney, a six-time stakes winner, captured the 2007 GII Barbara Fritchie H. and earned \$593,988 on the racetrack.

The mare had the stamp of approval of Rasmussen's reproductive vet, Dr. Roy Kipper, but, asked yesterday why she purchased the gray, Rasmussen chuckled, "I loved her name."

She then added, "I look back on it, and while I had really decided to upgrade my broodmare band, when I was there, as in all auctions, I got a bit carried away. I don't think I realized how high I was going. I had planned on going up to \$300,000, but I guess I was just into the swing of it. Dr. Kipper had really liked her, and that was a big selling point. He is excellent. He has owned horses himself and is very good at picking horses. So it started out with a stellar idea, and then probably my stupidity overran the rest of it."

River Ridge Ranch in Runnells, Iowa, is perennially one of the top breeders in the state. But Rasmussen said an uncertain local racing climate led to a change in business philosophy.

"I was basically hoping to win races in more places than Iowa," Rasmussen said. "A few years ago, it appeared there were bigger powers that were trying to get rid of horse racing in Iowa. So I thought, 'My horses have got to be able to run somewhere else.' Fortunately, the law changed this year, the legislature saw our side of it, and we have a bright, bright future in horse racing in Iowa right now."

Just yesterday, the Iowa legislature approved a gambling bill that legalizes advance deposit wagering in the state and allows Prairie Meadows to create its own ADW company. The bill also eliminates the 2021 expiration date of a law that requires at least 11% of casino revenues to go towards purses and stipulates that at least 20% of net purses be used for state breeders' awards and purse supplements for Iowa-breds.

Lady Ban Shee almost didn't make it into Rasmussen's flaming orange colors. The filly was entered in last year's Keeneland September sale, but RNA'd for \$65,000.

"I was hoping to recoup some cash," Rasmussen said of the decision to enter Lady Ban Shee at the Keeneland sale. "But I wanted it to be enough to make a difference, rather than running her."

With Iowa's breeders' incentives, not selling certainly made sense.

"Today, because she was an Iowa-bred winning an open race, we get an additional 40% of the purse," Rasmussen explained. "She almost made what I was being offered for her at the sale, so I am very happy that it worked out."

Rasmussen's primary focus is not commercial breeding.

"I always have bred to race," she confirmed. "I kind of got talked into trying to sell last year, but I get too attached to them, to be honest with you. I just love them."

The Iowan did admit to having some nerves while watching Lady Ban Shee race for the first time yesterday.

"I was so frightened that she wouldn't be able to run," Rasmussen said. "You can train all you want, but you never know. I thought, 'What if I spent all this money and she can't run?' She had been training well."

"She got out of the gate beautifully--she had the outside hole, which is a good thing if you're a 2-year-old and scared, but it's a long way to come. They were catching her at the end, but I was thrilled."

Rasmussen didn't have to wait long for a return trip to the Prairie Meadows winner's circle. After Lady Ban Shee captured the day's third race, River Ridge homebred El Borrego (Borrego) won the sixth race.

Lady Ban Shee, who is one of 15 River Ridge horses in training at Prairie Meadows, will spend the rest of the summer in Iowa. Where she goes after that is up to her.

"I hope to race her here in Iowa until August when the meet is done," Rasmussen said. "At that point, I'll have to make a call on whether she is still in good health and if she's shown more promise. I have my fingers crossed, but I'm sure not counting any chickens."

Oprah Winney's foal by Giant's Causeway died of a ruptured ulcer last year, but the mare produced a colt by Hard Spun Apr. 24. Rasmussen reported the youngster is "a beautiful colt." Oprah Winney was bred back to Stormy Atlantic.
