"We can't find words anymore," Freddy Head said after the latest performance by the Wertheimers' **Goldikova (Ire)** (Anabaa) in Sunday's G1 Prix d'Ispehan at Longchamp--a staggering 13th win at this level. As was the case last year, the French star appeared to find this trip at the limit of her stamina, and needed a slice of courage as well as her usual class to hold off **Cirrus des Aigles (Fr)** (Even Top {Ire}) by a neck. Given the customary smooth ride by Olivier Peslier, the 3-5

choice was committed with 1 1/2 furlongs remaining and gamely repelled the threat of the improving runner-up. "She is great--exceptional," her trainer gushed. "She is also a real fighter, and we are really lucky to have such a wonder. This distance is as far as she wants to go, and you could see that at the end."

PLAYED OUT PERFECTLY

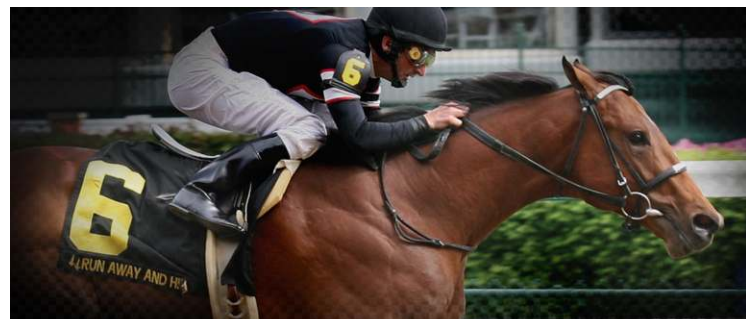
Like Saturday's Irish 2000 Guineas hero Roderic O'Connor (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}), **Misty For Me (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) put a no-show in the Newmarket equivalent firmly behind her to lift yesterday's G1 Etihad Airways Irish 1000 Guineas at The Curragh. In leading home

Together (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) for another one-two in a domestic Classic for Aidan O'Brien, Michael Tabor, Susan Magnier and Derrick Smith's colorbearer provided her sire with a remarkable fourth European Guineas in 2011 after Frankel (GB), Golden Lilac (Ire) and the

aforementioned Roderic O'Connor. Supported into 5-1, the blaze-faced bay--last year's European champion 2-year-old filly--raced prominently under Seamie Heffernan and gradually gained the upper hand from her stable companion and 4-1 favorite in the final 150 yards to win by 3/4 of a length. "She bounced right back after Newmarket, and Seamus knew her well from last year and gave her a great ride," O'Brien said. "After Roderic won yesterday, it gave us extra hope. Newmarket was her first run of the season, and she had been working lovely since. The second ran a stormer as well." **Cont. p2**

Most of Goldikova's fans and connections are not in a hurry to let go of the dream, but it is her remarkable consistency both in her training and racing which has prompted the highly unusual and brave decision to keep her on at six. With three GI BC Miles and almost countless European highlights under her belt already,

she has little left to prove but continues to thrive on her schedule. She had certainly given that impression when last seen adding Gio Ponti (Tale of the Cat) to the list of the conquered at Churchill Downs in November. Any fears that age has withered her were quickly dispelled on her seasonal return in this prize, which she became the first dual winner of since Crystal Glitters (Blushing Groom

{Fr}) in 1984. Her pacemaker Flash Dance (Ire) (Zamindar) proved an ideal aid en route to posting a career-best fourth in the process. Once Goldikova had relieved her of her duties passing the 300-meter marker, the race took on the usual sense of inevitability that accompanies her racecourse outings. Last year, it was Byword (GB) (Peintre Celebre) who chased her to the line, but with that rival proving disappointing this time it was left to the G1 Prix Ganay third Cirrus des Aigles to shake up the favorite to no avail. Rajsaman (Fr) (Linamix {Fr}) worked his way past Flash Dance to provide the stable with a first, third and fourth to add to Freddy Head's sense of well being. "Goldikova is tough, but she is six so we don't want to commit at this stage as to where she will run next," he said. "We will see how she comes out of this and discuss plans regarding Royal Ascot. Rajsaman is a very good horse who is improving with every run, and a potential Group 1 winner himself, so I'm very proud, especially as we had three in the first four." Guineas on her return May 1. Emulating the stable's 2003 Irish Guineas heroine Yesterday (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) in turning around her fortunes in the three-week interim period between the Newmarket and Curragh Classics, she overcame a wide stall to

re-establish her dominion over her domestically trained peers here. Towards the fore early with the Bolger pair of Claiomh Solais (Ire) (Galileo {Ire})--who was the lowest-rated of the field--and Banimpire (Ire) (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}), Misty For Me had gained the edge over that duo by the time Together appeared on the scene towards the far rail and duly outgamed her barnmate in the run to the line. "I wasn't confident going into this until I saw the winner yesterday, and that opened things up," jockey Seamie Heffernan, who had ridden her in the Moyglare last term, explained. "Aidan said she had improved a lot since the Guineas, and to ride her positively. So all the ability was in there and she had still been a bit asleep maybe. I hadn't really gone for everything until I really had to, and she put her head down when she needed to. There is very little between the front two at home, but Misty For Me just seems to be a little bit more straightforward. I was a winner at every step." O'Brien has alternative plans for the duo and added, "The plan after today was that the [Together] would stay at a mile and go for the G1 Coronation S. [at Royal Ascot June 17] and Misty For Me would step up and go for either the G1 Prix de Diane [at Chantilly June 12] or the [June 3] G1 Epsom Oaks."

So far, the Irish part of the So You Think story could hardly have gone smoother, and the long odds-on favorite was far from stressed when providing Ballydoyle with a fifth renewal of this contest. The event, which lacked strength in depth, gave no further clues as to his standing among the European elite, with only Godolphin's Campanologist to beat after Famous Name put in a disappointing effort. Royal Ascot's G1 Prince of Wales's S. will answer that question more effectively June 15, but the dark bay god of the Australian scene over the past two seasons can hardly be blamed for having scant opposition to deal with. Teed up for this with an emphatic 10-length success in the G3 Mooresbridge S. over this track and trip May 2, he was settled behind Ballydoyle's stalwart pacemaker Windsor Palace (Ire) (Daneshill Dancer {Ire}) until taking command at the top of the near three-furlong straight. It was plain sailing for the visiting Ryan Moore once he had set So You Think about his task, and his mount stayed on strongly under hand riding for a sixth top-level win, looking stronger the further he traveled. "He had only been ticking over since his last run, and we hadn't done anything serious with him," Aidan O'Brien explained. "The season is very long and we are happy with him, so hopefully the Prince of Wales's at Royal Ascot is next. It was important that Ryan got to sit on him, and he was delighted with him."

Having raced freely last time, the bay settled better anchored towards the rear throughout the early stages of this contest. Taken widest of all at the top of the stretch, she picked up impressively to cut down Epic Love and the rest of the blanket finishers inside the final 100 yards. "She is improving and quickened very nicely," trainer Andre Fabre commented. "I will have to discuss plans with Sheikh Mohammed before committing her." Epic Love's conditioner Pascal Bary said, "She has run very well and, although she was a little keen early, she settled well and was able to finish. She will run in the [Prix] Diane [June 12, Chantilly] next."

Globetrotter Gitano Hernando was looking for his first victory since winning the G3 Diamond S. in Ireland last fall and his first Group or Grade I since upsetting the Santa Anita's Goodwood BC S. in 2009. Purchased privately by Chechen President Ramzan Kadyrov from Team Valor International in March, the 5-year-old was a disappointing sixth for his new connections in the G1 Dubai World Cup Mar. 26 before another off-the-board effort in the G1 Audermars Piquet QEII Cup at Sha Tin in Hong Kong May 1. Back in form here, the double-digit longshot benefitted from a savvy Glyn Schofield ride. Up close just after the break, Gitano Hernando was sent to the lead heading into the first turn, but soon settled in second as California Memory raced up to lead. Schofield tipped his mount out with 600 meters to go, forged to the front soon after and the pair won the sprint to the wire. "We've had him for two months only and we've been getting to know him better and better," said Herman Brown, who took over training duties from Marco Botti. "We wanted a horse for the World Cup and there weren't a lot of horses about, but eventually these horses come and find you. Things have worked very well for him since he settled in here. I don't know what happened in Hong Kong, he just didn't settle there. He caught us a bit by surprise there. He was not composed at all before the race and we thought it was a race best to ignore. Maybe the right-handed way of going did not suit him either."

He continued, "On a track like Kranji, which is a bit sharp for him, we decided to go for a change of tactics, as we didn't have a chance if we came from behind. I also told Glyn to ride him more positive at the start. Just keep him going, try and get some pace and settle him as early as possible. Glyn couldn't have ridden him better. I thought the 2000m would be a bit short for him. Rocket Man, who confirmed his brilliance on the world stage two months ago in the G1 Dubai Golden Shaheen, put on a show in his return to international Group 1 company here, and set the stage for a possible showdown with Australia's wondermare, **Black Caviar (Aus)** (Bel Espirit {Aus}). The popular gelding, denied in this event by **Green Birdie (NZ)** (Catbird {Aus}) a year ago and by **Sacred Kingdom (Aus)** in 2009, returned from his Dubai sojourn to capture the local Lion City Cup at Kranji May 1 and was quickest away from the widest draw this time. Parked three wide, he was content to relinquish the lead to **Better Be The One (Aus)** (More Than Ready), but had moved to even terms 400 meters out. Shaken up by jockey **Felix Coetzee** soon after, Rocket Man drove clear to a four-length advantage and left the others to quibble over the place spots. "He's done us proud again, and this time he's won the one that has proved elusive for so long," said **Patrick Shaw**, who trains Rocket Man for **Fred Crabbia**.

"I was never really concerned when he was caught three wide early on. I know he can sit anywhere and just switch off. He was always traveling well, and I had no doubt he would be hard to beat once he straightened up. This is an amazing victory, for Fred, for us, for Singapore." With the crowd still cheering its sprint star, talk soon turned to a possible dream match-up with the unbeaten **Black Caviar**.

I've been waiting to go to Australia to take her on for a while. I've seen her and she is a great mare, but **Rocket Man** is better than she is."

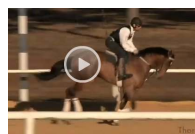

"I thought last night of going onto Belmont right away," explained the 44-year-old Louisville native. "But I wanted to send him back to Kentucky, so we'll get him with his regular team, go over him, watch him train a couple days and then make the decision. Ultimately, it will be

[owner] Mike's [Lauffer] call, but he'll let me have a lot of input, I'm sure. If he trains like he did going into the Derby, I don't know why we would pass. I think it's better than 50-50." Still basking in the afterglow of his biggest career score, Romans said he had received numerous phone calls and text messages of congratulations by late Saturday night. He said he only responded to one call from Frank Taylor of Taylor Made Farms, where Forestry stands at stud.

"That was a phone call that I answered, because Frank Taylor told me in Florida if I won a Grade I [stakes] with a Forestry, I had free meals for life at Malone's [in Lexington, Kentucky]," said Romans. "That was the one call I did answer to remind him of what he said."

Derby Hero Sitting on Belmont Fence...

Trainer Graham Motion said GI Kentucky Derby winner **Animal Kingdom** (Leroideosanimaux {Brz}) exited Saturday's GI Preakness S. in good condition, but that it was a little too early to commit to a run in the Belmont S. three weeks down the road. "He almost ate [everything] up last night," confirmed Motion. "He didn't completely eat up, but I think all things considered, he did very well. He looks great physically. He does seem a little drawn to me, like he had a hard race, which I think he did. Otherwise, he seems very well." As for what lies ahead for the chestnut, Motion added, "I think we've got to give him a week. [Team Valor International's] Barry [Irwin] and I would both love to do the Belmont, but we've got to give him a week to see how he bounces out of this. He's had two very tough races now and he's a lightly raced, relatively inexperienced horse. We just want to give him a chance to give us a chance to evaluate him to see how he's doing. But we would love to do it." Also uncertain about his Belmont status is **Dialed In** (Mineshaft), fourth as the 4-1 second choice. The Bob LaPenta-owned colt was vanned to the Oklahoma training track in Saratoga Springs, New York, Sunday morning. "You think about it, but it's too early to tell," said trainer Nick Zito.

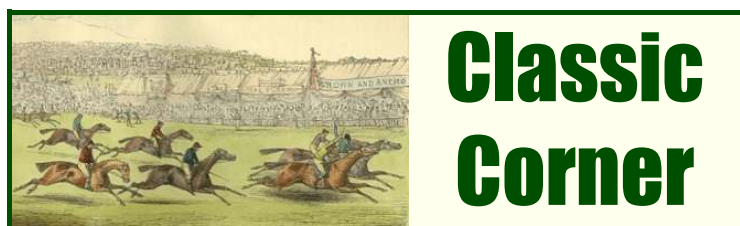
If the Shoe Fits...

Reeves Thoroughbred Racing and Dream Team Racing's **Mucho Macho Man** (Macho Uno) came out of his sixth-place finish in the GI Preakness S. short a shoe. "He caught his left front shoe," confirmed trainer Kathy Ritvo. "I'm going to watch the replay over and over and over again; I need to find out what happened with it." Previously, the colt lost his right front shoe in a third-place finish in the GII Louisiana Derby. "He's got to be doing something," she said. "I haven't had a horse pull a shoe for three or four years, and now I've got two in three races. I think he's snatching himself coming out of the gate. I think he's so excited to get out of the gate that he's springing before his front feet are gone. He's not a nervous horse. It's got to be something. I've got to figure out what happened and when he lost it." Mucho Macho Man, third in the Kentucky Derby, encountered some early traffic problems under jockey Rajiv Maragh. "Rajiv said he wasn't handling the track," said Ritvo. "When he got to the quarter-pole, he was just jumping up and down. He's got little cuts all over him, but no big deal." Mucho Macho Man was vanned to Belmont Park Sunday morning with the Belmont S. a goal. "We're on," confirmed Ritvo. "I think it's his kind of track and his kind of race. We just have to see how he comes out of this race."



No Belmont for Preakness Also-rans...

Stonestreet Stable and George Bolton's **Astrology** (A.P. Indy), third in Saturday's GI Preakness S., was sent back to his Churchill Downs base Sunday morning. "I thought that he competed really well," said trainer Steve Asmussen. "He was training well going into it and had a big chance." Despite the credible performance, Asmussen indicated it was very unlikely the colt would continue on to the GI Belmont S. Also off the Belmont train is **Dance City** (City Zip), fifth in the Preakness. "We'll regroup and freshen him up, and probably get him ready for Saratoga," said Todd Pletcher. "He ran a credible race."



Beatrice Aurore Given Oaks Green Light...

John Dunlop yesterday confirmed **Beatrice Aurore (Ire)** (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) an intended runner in the G1 Epsom Oaks. Owner and breeder Benny Andersson of ABBA fame has given the go-ahead for Wednesday's Listed Height of Fashion S. winner to contest the June 3 Classic. "I've spoken to the owner and he was very keen to have a runner, so we're looking forward to it," Dunlop told *PA Sport*.

Chantilly Aim for Dubawi Gold...

Saturday's G1 Irish 2000 Guineas runner-up **Dubawi Gold (GB)** (Dubawi {Ire}) is likely to be pointed at the G1 Prix Jean Prat at Chantilly, connections revealed yesterday. Considered unlucky when beaten 3/4 lengths by Roderic O'Connor (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) in the Curragh Classic, Andrew Tinkler's colt--who was also in that berth after the Newmarket Classic--will bid for compensation in the July 3 mile contest. "Maybe [Richard Hughes] did overdo the waiting tactics, but he has also done so much to help Dubawi Gold grow up, and, hopefully, they will get another chance to win their Group 1 together," the owner's Racing Manager Tim Jones commented. "Obviously, it is frustrating having finished second in two Guineas, but what's done is done, and we must now look to the future. We could easily go for the [June 15] G3 Jersey S. at Royal Ascot, and I am sure that he would start a short-priced favourite, but equally is it the right place to take a horse who needs to be winning his Group 1 to enhance his stallion potential? If we sidestep the Jersey, the obvious target would be a return clash with Frankel in the [June 14] G1 St James's Palace S. at the Royal meeting. However, our third and final option for another race against his own age group is the Prix Jean Prat at Chantilly, and taking in Ascot en route leaves things a bit tight for France."

The Fasig-Tipton Midlantic Two-Year-Olds in Training sale begins its two-day run today in Timonium, Maryland with the first of 600 catalogued juveniles scheduled to go under the hammer at 10 a.m. Fasig-



No Advantage *MJC*

Tipton Midlantic Sales Director Paget Bennett thinks the sale's location and timing have put it squarely on horsemen's calendars. "This sale has become quite popular for both consignors and buyers," Bennett said. "We have a pretty good location advantage, being so close to so many racetracks. We have people who come to this sale who don't travel to the other sales, whether because of their

schedule--that they can't get away for that time--or it just works out better for them to train in the morning and get to the sale and not to miss so many days." The juvenile sales season is winding down and Bennett admitted the auction's later date could be another advantage. "I think timing is also a part of it," she said. "A lot of people just wait for this sale. They don't want to push their horses early and they just wait for the May sale. It works out better for them and for the horses. And then the horses are ready to go on after the sale."

The auction enjoyed strong numbers during a slimmed down one-day sale last year, with 273 head selling for \$13,099,500. The 2010 sale average of \$47,984 was up 14% from the 2009 average and the median rose 8% to \$27,000. Bennett looks for another strong renewal this year. "I would say we're cautiously optimistic," she said. "I think there are a lot of nice horses here."

The sale boasts an impressive list of graduates, with Eclipse champions Afleet Alex (Northern Afleet) and Informed Decision (Monarchos) leading the way. Grade I winners Kip Deville (Kipling), Showing Up (Strategic Mission) and Thorn Song (Unbridled's Song) and multiple graded stakes winner Musket Man (Yonaguska) also went

through the Midlantic sales ring.

No Advantage (Posse), who sold for just \$14,000 at the 2007 sale, graces this year's catalogue cover. The 6-year-old captured this year's GI General George H. and has earned nearly \$500,000 to date. Multiple stakes winner and GI Haskell runner-up Trappe Shot (Tapit) topped the sale in 2009 with a final bid of \$850,000 from bloodstock agent Steve Young, acting on behalf of Mill House and those connections were back last year to take home the promising Rattlesnake Bridge (Tapit), who was the auction's second highest price when selling for \$450,000.

"People keep coming back because they have had a luck with getting runners out of this sale," Bennett concluded.

The Midlantic sale has typically been run over two days, but, following the trend of smaller catalogues at most of the juvenile sales, was shortened to a single session last year. It is back to its two-day format this year. "We had 600 horses catalogued, versus 400 last year," Bennett explained. "Going into it, we weren't sure what to expect, but the entries just kept coming in. I think a lot of people just

have had a lot of luck at this sale and they felt that this was where they wanted to bring their horses."

The Midlantic sale gets an extra boost of excitement from its proximity to the GI Preakness S. The second leg of the Triple Crown fits snugly between last week's breeze shows and the Monday/Tuesday sale sessions. "The Preakness absolutely helps," Bennett confirmed. "Getting everybody into town and having the buzz over on the backside of Pimlico, talking about what horses have worked well and who's got what in the sale. You always see a lot of those trainers that are running on the [Preakness] card over here on Sunday morning, so it definitely helps."

Bennett thinks the Midlantic catalogue offers something for buyers at every level. "We are hoping that we have a horse to fit everybody's taste and everybody's pocketbook," she said.

LAMOUREUX ENJOYING THE VIEW

Darin Lamoureux's Mountain View Sales, with a Midlantic consignment of just six horses, enjoyed a strong day on the racetrack last Wednesday when a pair of fillies shared the bullet one-furlong breeze of :10.1. "They are both very, very nice fillies," confirmed Lamoureux. "They both work together at the farm, so we knew they both had a lot of talent." The first Mountain View runner to record the bullet work was [hip 69](#), a filly by Eddington out of Gottah Penny (Stravinsky). Gottah Penny, out of graded stakes winner Marshua's Echelon (Marshua's Dancer), is a half-sister to Grade I winner Run Man Run (Theatrical {Ire}). "She kind of breaks the Eddington mold," Lamoureux said of the chestnut filly. "She is a freak of nature and she can run all day long. She is a very balanced filly and an all-around good horse." Harvey Clarke purchased the youngster for \$50,000 out of last year's Keeneland September sale. Sharing the bullet was [hip 242](#), a filly from the first crop of Grade I stakes winner Latent Heat (Maria's Mon). Out of Perfect Wave (Boston Harbor), the juvenile is a half to graded stakes placed La Rocca (Tocchet). The chestnut was a \$12,000 purchase at the Fasig-Tipton Kentucky October sale. "She's got a lot of talent," Lamoureux continued. "She is just now coming into her own and she showed up on the right day." A former jockey, Lamoureux is now a second generation trainer. "I was born and raised in California, but my dad moved us to Indiana when he bought a racing and breeding farm," he explained. "My dad trained horses for a lot of years--he was a farm manager for Fred Hooper." Lamoureux just started consigning sales horses four years ago. "I got involved with Hoby Kight when I retired from riding races," the 46-year-old recalled. "Hoby and I have been friends for 20-25 years. We rode together and I rode for him at the racetrack and then, when I quit riding, he got me into pinhooking." Lamoureux estimates he pinhooks about 10 horses a year; half of his Midlantic consignment he is selling for clients and half are his own horses. While he has only been training for four years, he already has an impressive list of graduates from his Ocala base. He broke last year's Kentucky Derby winner Super Saver (Distorted Humor) for WinStar and was represented in this year's Run for the Roses by Soldat (War Front), whom he broke for Clarke. Asked which side of the business, selling or training, he preferred, Lamoureux said, "I like them both. I don't make a whole lot of money breaking and sending horses off to other people, so I have to have horses to pinhook to get through the summer." He added, "I love training. It is a challenge--it's dodging a lot of bullets." Another thing Lamoureux loves is the Midlantic sale. "I'm starting to think about bringing every horse up here to Maryland," he confirmed. "This is just a super strong sale. There are racetracks in everybody's backyard and everybody is looking for horses to put into the starting gate."

"They're not here to find reasons not to buy racehorses, they are here to find reasons to buy racehorses. It's a very horse-user friendly sale. And that's where my money comes from--just the middle of the road horsemen." Lamoureux sees plenty of potential for the middle market. "I think a lot of the buyers who were buying the \$200,000 and \$300,000 horses have dropped down to the \$40,000 and \$50,000 horses to stay in the business. So I think the OBS April sale was a strong sale and this sale has always been a strong sale. I think the middle of the market is going to get strong." Once the last of his six Midlantic horses goes through the Timonium ring, Lamoureux has some serious family time planned. "Right now I don't have any horses left at the farm," he said. "I sent off everything to the racetrack and this is my last sale, so hopefully I can go home and be Mr. Dad for a few months, depending on how this sale goes." -J Martini

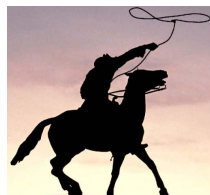

op/ed feedback

Arthur Hancock's recent analysis of why nothing serious seems to occur on eliminating drugs in horses on race days is right on the money.

In 2002, I addressed the Round Table in Saratoga and made the case for what additional medication had done to our sport. Increased medication has caused smaller fields, less starts, and shorter race careers!

I served five years on the drug consortium and watched the excuses for more required research and many other excuses to continue the use of race day medications.

The addition of lasix and the veterinary community's new definition for therapeutic use allows for the problems we face and the negative public perception of our sport. I can still remember getting vet bills for hundreds of dollars for pre-race medication and watch my horse finish down the track. I would ask myself, "How would he have run free of medication?"

The perception of our sport by the public needs to improve and will never be elevated until we race free of medication on race day. "Performance Enhancing" is a phrase a lot of horsemen do not like to discuss. The standard excuse is always "we need more research". Our industry has had many years to research therapeutic medication and deal with the problem of too many positives and poor publicity.

All the promised benefits of therapeutic medication on race day proved totally inaccurate. Field sizes didn't rise, they fell--horses didn't run more often, they ran less--nd careers of horses lessened in length rather than extended.

I have great respect for the many quality veterinarians who treat the sick and injured horse. I also have great respect for most of the trainers in America who do not get positives and manage clean operations. These good people are at a great disadvantage to the few trainers and veterinarians who win many races and consistently get positives and usually suffer no penalty other than small fines and short suspensions. The public says we have to do better. I'm as opposed to more government as anybody, but after many years of inability to come to grips with the drug issues, I urge all owners to support Arthur Hancock and the government initiative to assure the public that the great Thoroughbred race horse races clean on race day.

Use therapeutic drugs for what they were intended for "to heal an injury or illness" not to get a horse to the races that might not run his best without help or enhance his performance when he does run!
