## PADDY O'PRADO RETIRED

Donegal Racing's GISW **Paddy O'Prado** (El Prado {Ire} --Fun House, by Prized), who made a winning 2011 debut in Saturday's GII Dixie S. at Pimlico, exited the race with a fractured sesamoid in his right front leg and has been retired. The 4-year-old showed signs of the injury while cooling after Saturday's race, and the initial prognosis was a bruised foot. But X-rays taken after the colt returned to Churchill Downs Sunday afternoon revealed the fracture. "It was the top part of the sesamoid; the injury will heal, and maybe an average horse would come back and race again," trainer Dale Romans said. "But we don't want to take any chances with this horse." Donegal Racing's Jerry Crawford added, "We are

very disappointed today to see Paddy's career end so suddenly, but this is what is best for Paddy. He will make a full recovery and embark on the next stage of his career. The thrills that he has given us are priceless, and we were so proud and honored to share them with family, friends and fans in Iowa and around the country." Romans signed the ticket at \$105,000 on the colt at Keeneland September 2008. The grey, bred by Winchell Thoroughbreds, is the second foal out of GSW Fun House, herself a half-sister to MGSW and GISP Early Flyer (Gilded Time). Third in the 2009 GIII With Anticipation S. on the turf at Saratoga while still a maiden, Paddy O'Prado graduated in his second start at three, taking the GIII Palm Beach S. by 2 1/2 lengths. He switched to the Poly to run second in the GI Blue Grass S. at Keeneland, then handled the sloppy Churchill strip on the first Saturday in May, running third in the GI Kentucky Derby. Back on the grass for his summer campaign, he reeled off wins in the GII Colonial Turf Cup, GII Virginia Derby and GI Secretariat S. before running second against older horses in the GI Joe Hirsch Turf Classic at Belmont Park. **Cont. p2**

## MIDLANTIC SALE PROVES POPULAR AGAIN

The Fasig-Tipton Midlantic Two-Year-Olds in Training sale kicked off its two-day run in Timonium Monday, with figures off marginally from the strong 2010 one-day renewal. For the day, 161 juveniles sold for \$7,466,600. The average, \$46,376, was down 3.3% from a year ago, while the median fell 7.4% to \$25,000. The buy-back rate was 26.4%. "I thought the market, overall was very good today," confirmed Fasig-Tipton President Boyd Browning Jr. "For the most part, it seemed like there was pretty sturdy bidding on most horses, with a number of bidders. It didn't feel like there was just one bidder and the reserve very often. There was some depth of buyers. I thought it was a very, very good horse sale today." Last year's Midlantic single-day sale saw a 14% increase in average and an 8% increase in median over 2009 figures. "Today's sale followed up last year's, which was quite remarkable," Browning said. "We're halfway through this year and it looks like, statistically, we'll be pretty close to last year in terms of average and median, and I think that's a success, especially when you do that and you've increased your catalogue size 50%." The day's top-priced lot came early in the session when trainer Bob Baffert went to \$390,000 to acquire a daughter of Malibu Moon for an undisclosed client from the Bridlewood Farm consignment. Overall, there were six horses over \$200,000. There were nine over that mark a year ago. The sale continues today at 10 a.m. **Fasig-Tipton Midlantic Coverage Cont. p3**

"Today is bittersweet," said Dale Romans. "Paddy returned to training like a big gray monster, and we thought we were sitting on the Horse of the Year, but now he will be able to go on and be a champion sire." Paddy O'Prado retires with a record of 14-5-3-3 (*click [here](#) for brisnet.com lifetime PPs*) and earnings of \$1,721,297. "He was as versatile as any horse I've ever trained, and competed at the highest levels on turf, dirt and Polytrack," Romans continued. "It takes a special horse to win or place in Grade I races on all three surfaces. He never gave less than full effort, and every time we led him to the track, I was confident that he could compete against any other horse."

**On to the Breeding Shed...**

The phone lines jammed as soon as the news broke that Paddy O'Prado would be heading to stud. It was a carryover from the interest shown at the end of the colt's 3-year-old campaign. "We heard from 18 potential suitors last year, but we made the decision to race him again this year--the sport needs more horses to continue racing after their 3-year-old seasons," Jerry Crawford commented, adding, "The phones have been ringing regularly for the last few hours, and we hope to finalize his stud plans in the next couple of months." According to Crawford, the prospect of seeing Paddy O'Prado's offspring on the track in the coming years has assuaged some of the pain of the abrupt end to his racing career. "We can look forward to all the little Paddy O'Prados running around, and to the impact he will have on American racing," he said. "There are happy days head for us." Donegal Racing is also anticipating success with its new crop of 2-year-olds, including one named in honor of their Grade I winner.

"We have an El Prado colt named in honor of Paddy--O'Prado Again," Crawford remarked. "We're looking forward to him being a really good horse." But the \$350,000 KEESEP purchase, also trained by Romans, will have big hoofsteps to follow. "Paddy O'Prado was a barn favorite and a racetrack favorite," Romans said. "He has so much personality, and he did everything he was asked to do. I hate to see him leave the barn--he was a pleasure to be around. But we're expecting big things from him in his next career, especially since his father, El Prado, is turning out to be a sire of sires." Crawford concluded, "He meant so much more to us than dollars and cents. This is what draws us all to this incredibly beautiful sport. He changed our lives for the better--that's what horse racing can do. We had 200 people at the Secretariat and 300 people at the Kentucky Derby--friends and family getting to share that joy. You just can't put into words what that means."

**Malibu Moon Filly Gets Midlantic Off to Quick Start**

A filly by Malibu Moon got the Fasig-Tipton Midlantic Two-Year-Old sale off to a strong start, selling to trainer Bob Baffert, bidding over the phone via Fasig President Boyd Browning, for \$390,000. "She's a well-bred filly by Malibu Moon and she worked well," reported Donato Lanni, Hill 'n' Dale's bloodstock services director, who helps Baffert pick out sales horses. "She ticked all the boxes." Lanni declined to name which Baffert client had purchased the youngster. Bred and consigned to the sale by Bridlewood Farm, she was entered in last year's Keeneland September sale, but was scratched prior to going through the ring. "She was plain-looking as a yearling," explained Bridlewood General Manager George Isaacs. "People were more critical of how she looked as a yearling. So we just decided to regroup. We thought she'd finish up well as a 2-year-old. At a 2-year-old sale, pretty is as pretty does." The filly worked a furlong in :10.2 at the Fasig-Tipton Florida sale in March, but failed to sell at \$110,000. She shared the quarter-mile bullet breeze of :21.3 ([video](#)) last Wednesday. The bay is out of Eden's Causeway (Giant's Causeway), who is a daughter of Bridlewood's blue hen mare North of Eden (Ire) (Northfields), the dam of champion Paradise Creek (Irish River {Fr}) and Grade I winners Forbidden Apple (Pleasant Colony) and Wild Event (Wild Again). "Obviously, with her foundation-type pedigree, [waiting to sell] served us well," Isaacs added. North of Eden passed away in March, and Isaacs admitted watching the family sell was bittersweet. "Absolutely, it's hard to watch this family be passed on to someone else," he said. "It has been so near and dear to us, but we're a commercial operation, so we have to sell the ones that bring in the money." F-T cont. p4

**Street Sense Filly Joins Fledgling Mathis Stable...**

She may be retired, but reigning Horse of the Year Zenyatta (Street Cry {Ire}) is still pulling in the racing fans. Bill and Terry Mathis were out of racing for two decades, but admitted that the champion's exploits spurred them to get back into the game. The couple went to \$280,000 to add a filly from the first crop of Kentucky Derby winner Street Sense (Street Cry {Ire}) to their growing racing stable. "We were in it back in the 80s with some horses that were successful, but we've been out of it for 20 years," explained Bill Mathis. "Terry and I are getting back in as kind of a second business. We're having a lot of fun with it. We feel like the business is going through a renaissance right now. We got interested in racing again by watching Zenyatta--that sparked our interest. So we talked to John and Dottie Sherriffs. And we've been working with [bloodstock agent] David Ingordo." Mathis, of Oklahoma City, is the owner of Mathis Brothers Furniture. The Mathis Stable currently has just four horses, after adding three horses earlier this spring from the OBS March and April sales. "We're excited to be back in the business and hopefully we'll have some luck," he added.

The Street Sense filly is out of Polish Nana (Polish Numbers), a half-sister to graded stakes winner Love of Money (Not For Love) and multiple stakes winner Astrid (Concern). Consigned by Eisaman Equine, agent, she shared the bullet one-furlong work of :10.1 ([video](#)) last week. She came with Ingordo's seal of approval. "She is beautiful," Ingordo said of the juvenile. "There is no filly I've seen in a while that looked that good at a sale. She's got great condition, beautiful dapples on her. She handled everything well. It wasn't the best conditions to breeze in the other day, but everything went as smooth as silk. Mr. and Mrs. Mathis have hired John Shirreffs and John was in town. So I called him and told him he better get out to the sale and take a look at this filly. He and Dottie came over and it was pretty much a done deal after that."

**Harlan's Holiday Colt Jumps Through EQB's Hoops**

EQB's Patty Miller, bidding along with her dog Sally behind the sales pavilion, went to \$250,000 to secure a colt by Harlan's Holiday for an undisclosed client. After signing the ticket for the colt, Miller deferred questions on the purchase to EQB President Jeff Seder. The colt, who worked a furlong in :10.3 ([video](#)), came through EQB's strenuous examination process with flying colors, according to Seder. "For his age, he's big and fast," Seder commented. "His gait is clean. His exercise physiology, the different pieces that he has to have to make all that work from the inside, are in the top four or five percent of the breed. And when you can go through all those hoops, you know you've found a horse with a whole lot of talent. You can't look inside his brain and we don't know if he has courage or not. The main wildcards are attitude and injury, but we'll see. We're very, very happy to get him. He's a wonderful horse." Seder said the purchase was for an existing EQB client. The colt, a \$180,000 Keeneland November weanling, is out of Motivated Sreva (Lear Fan), a half-sister to graded stakes winner Adore the Gold (Formal Gold). He RNA'd for \$220,000 at Keeneland September and for \$185,000 at the Fasig-Tipton Florida sale. He was consigned by McKathan Brothers, Agent I.

**Hough Picks a Saturday...**

Stanley Hough had success at last year's juvenile sales, acquiring subsequent graded stakes winner Adios Charlie (Indian Charlie) for \$400,000 out of the OBS March auction. The trainer was back in action yesterday at the Midlantic sale, going to \$200,000 to secure a colt from the first crop of GI Haskell Invitational winner Any Given Saturday (Distorted Humor). "He's a big, nice horse," Hough said of the juvenile. "I think the sire is going to be a good one." Adios Charlie captured the GII Jerome S. in April and was most recently a narrowly beaten second in the May 14 GII Peter Pan S. That colt is co-owned by Hough and Robert Sahn. The Any Given Saturday colt was purchased for a partnership that includes "a couple of those that are in that partnership and a couple that aren't," according to Hough. The colt worked a bullet quarter-mile in :21.3 ([video](#)) at the breeze show last Wednesday. He was consigned to the Midlantic sale by Ciaran Dunne's Wavertree Stables on behalf of his breeder Fares Farm.

Fares Farm sent this colt to KEESEP last year, but brought him home after he RNA'd at \$47,000. That proved a wise move. The chestnut's half-sister, Around the Twig (Bluegrass Cat), hadn't started last fall, but ran second in a two-turn maiden special weight in her second start Jan. 27 and graduated at a mile in Arcadia Mar. 11. The chestnut then fired his co-bullet quarter, and rewarded his breeder for their patience second time through the ring. Fares acquired dam Fabulous Finish (Grand Slam) for \$300,000 with Around the Twig in utero at KEENOV 2007. **F-T cont. p6**

**Nekia Continues to Upgrade**

Trainer Steve Epley has been busy this spring, buying on behalf of Bruce and Rita Snipes' Nekia Farm. He continued his shopping spree Monday at the Midlantic sale, going to \$190,000 to take home a filly by Tapit. Consigned by De Meric Sales as agent, the chestnut worked a furlong in :10.2 at the sales preview. "Tapit is really hot right now," Epley said. "But what attracted me to the filly was her breeze. I didn't have her on my list, but she traveled so well, it was enough to make me go look at her. She had a nice walk and her conformation was perfect, so we just wanted her." Snipes is president of the South Carolina-based equine joint supplement company Corta-Flex. Epley, who has been training privately for the Snipes family for five years, purchased three OBS April juveniles on behalf of Nekia Farm, with his most expensive acquisition a colt by A.P. Indy for \$160,000. Nekia currently has 10 horses in training at Fair Hill, and has been taking advantage of market conditions to upgrade its stock. "Some of the horses we bought, we paid a lot for them, but they were good deals for what they are," Epley confirmed. Epley and the Nekia string had been based at Delaware Park before relocating to Fair Hill two years ago. "Hopefully next year we'll be training in South Florida," Epley chuckled. The chestnut filly, who sold as hip 129, is out of Kitty Foille (Black Minnaloushe), a half-sister to graded stakes winner Prospectress (Mining) and to the dam of group winner Trick or Treat (Lomitas {GB}). The sale was a good result for all involved, according to consignor Nick De Meric. "We were pretty confident she would bring \$150,000 or better," De Meric said. "She's done everything right, and she's by one of the hottest sires in the country and she just thrived in her training. This is a filly who just got better month by month. We came up here feeling pretty optimistic about her." Patty Miller signed the ticket at \$50,000 for the youngster at last year's Fasig-Tipton Kentucky July sale. She failed to sell at \$47,000 at OBS March. "We were selling on behalf of a partnership, and they don't usually divulge their names," De Meric said. "It was a great pinhook for them, more power to everybody. The gentleman who bought her got himself a super filly. You will hear from her again."

Raced exclusively at Group 1 level after her impressive debut win at Chantilly last May--which earned her **★ "TDN Rising Star" ★** status--the homebred had come up against some stellar opposition following her wins in the G1 Prix Saint-Alary at Longchamp and G1 Prix de Diane back at Chantilly last summer. Third behind Workforce (GB) (King's Best) in the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe on her final sophomore start, the bay returned to be runner-up to Planteur (Ire) (Danehill Dancer (Ire) in Longchamp's G1 Prix Ganay last time Apr. 30. Settled with only one behind early, she made her move as Announce took over with 1 1/2 furlongs remaining. That rival was on borrowed time in the lead, and as soon as Sarafina rolled by in the final 100 yards the contest was over. "She had come on a lot since her first run back, and we were very confident going into this," commented Alain de Royer-Dupre after greeting his fourth winner of this prize since 2006. "She won very well, but where she goes now is a bit of a question mark. She seemed to enjoy going left-handed, so could come back here for the [June 26] G1 Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud."

The owner-breeder's Racing Manager Georges Rimaud added, "We have to wait and see how Behkabad (Fr) (Cape Cross {Ire}) gets on when he returns in the [June 5] G2 Grand Prix de Chantilly, as he also has the Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud as a target. We've got time with Sarafina anyway, as the ultimate target is to have her at the top of her game for the Arc."

**Met Mile Contestants Drill Monday...**

Five expected runners for next Monday's GI Metropolitan H. prepped over the Belmont main track yesterday. Conditioner Todd Pletcher sent out GIII Westchester S. hero **Caixa Electronica** (Arromanches) in company with Christmas for Liam (St. Liam) and paired together GII Churchill Downs S. winner **Aikenite** (Yes It's True) and third-place finisher **Ibboyyee** (Medallist). Caixa Electronica, who Pletcher and Repole Stable claimed for \$62,500 out of a winning effort at Gulfstream Mar. 9, was credited with a five-furlong bullet in :59.23. He and his workmate went through speedy splits of :11.84, 23.76 and :34.99, but still came home in :24.28. "We ended up getting rained out last week and decided to go with one work, and we wanted to make sure we got a good solid work," Pletcher, who opted to send out his three-pronged Met Mile charge a day early to avoid expected rain, told *Daily Racing Form*. Of Caixa Electronica, Pletcher told the trade daily, "When he beat Mission Impazible in an optional claiming/allowance race at Gulfstream and he was back in for a tag, I just felt like if the horse was healthy he was worth the price. He was in good shape when we got him, and he trained really well and he showed in the Westchester he seems to relish a one-turn mile. It was a big effort. This is an ambitious placing." Dogwood Stable's Aikenite was credited with four furlongs in :48.76 and Anstu Stables' Ibboyyee went in :48.67. The works were 10th- and 9th-fastest of 33 spins at the distance, respectively. Turtle Bird Stable's GI Jockey Club Gold Cup winner and GI Cigar Mile H. runner-up **Haynesfield** (Speightstown) prepped in :48.89 (11/33) for four furlongs, and Barry Schwartz's **Rodman** (Malibu Moon) traveled five furlongs in 1:00.23 (4/8) for trainer Michael Hushion. Spendthrift Farm's **Crown Of Thorns** (Repent)--winner of the GII Mervyn LeRoy H. at Hollywood May 7--will not make the trip from California. "There wasn't any room for error and we had an error," trainer Richard Mandella told *DRF*, revealing that the 6-year-old had grabbed a quarter and was forced to miss five days of training. "It's a shame too, because it was a race I was really looking forward to," he added. Other probables for the Met Mile include GI Carter H. hero **Morning Line** (Tiznow), **Duke of Mischief** (Graeme Hall), **Kensei** (Mr. Greeley), **Sidney's Candy** (Candy Ride {Arg}), **Soaring Empire** (Empire Maker), **Tackleberry** (Montbrook) and **Tizway** (Tiznow).

**Thayer Supports Anti-Medication Legislation:**

Kentucky State Senator Damon Thayer issued a statement yesterday backing the proposal of the Racing Commissioners International that would, in five years time, ban all race-day medication. He also urged other states to follow Kentucky's lead in the effort to ratify the Interstate Horse Racing Compact. "As the legislative member of the Kentucky Equine Drug Research Council, I support the Racing Commissioners International position regarding changes in horse-racing medication policies. Kentucky should be a national leader when it pertains to reforms, and I plan to encourage the EDRC to make recommendations for the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission that we take action as soon as possible," Thayer said. He added, "In addition, with the passage of [SB 24](#) in the most recent Session of the General Assembly, I urge other racing states to move quickly to join the Interstate Horse Racing Compact so that racing commissions in member states can begin working collaboratively on the medication reforms that are best handled at the state level."
