INDIAN CHARLIE COLT TOPS MIDLANTIC SALE

A colt by Indian Charlie topped the Fasig-Tipton Midlantic 2-Year-Olds in Training sale yesterday when selling for \$600,000 to the bid of EQB's Patty Miller.

Miller declined to say who she had purchased the youngster for, but said it was not the same client who paid \$250,000 for a son of Harlan's Holiday during Monday's opening session of the sale. "They have to jump through a lot of hoops," an exuberant Miller said

after signing the ticket on the Indian Charlie colt behind the sales pavilion. "And this one jumped through all the hoops very well. I watched him all week, and I had people watching him all winter. This horse had presence. We thought he was special. He looks like the genuine article." Of the sale-topping price, Miller laughed, "I would have loved to get him for \$350,000." She added, "That was our high end. But when they walk up here and they look like that, people are going to be lining up, so you have to be prepared. I kept all my sheckels in my pocket all day. So it was good I had a few left over." The strapping Indian Charlie colt ([hip 492](#)) is out of Bally Storm (Sumer Squall) and is a half-brother to multiple stakes placed Silver Bayer (Smoke Glacken). He worked a furlong last Thursday in :10.1 ([video](#)).

The colt was consigned by Becky Thomas's Sequel Bloodstock. Thomas purchased the youngster for \$95,000 out of last year's Keeneland September sale. After offering Miller a few congratulatory hugs, Thomas said, "He was an awesome horse. I loved him. He ended up at this sale because of a bunch of circumstances, but he was the first horse that I've done a video on since we used to send videos to the Japanese in the 1990s. I loved, loved, loved this horse. He is just so awesome, so professional." Thomas was selling the horse along with partners Dennis and Michael Narlinger. "He looked like this, but not developed," Thomas said of the colt as a yearling. "He was immature. He has grown a lot, but he had the framework of what he's turned into. Besides what he looks like, he's just performed everyday of his life. And he's got the most laid-back attitude. He's just a really cool horse." **Cont. p2**

Pope Takes Home More Than Ready Filly

A filly by More Than Ready, named Corkage, sold for \$300,000 to the bid of Whisper Hill Farm's Mandy Pope. Pope, bidding alongside bloodstock advisor Chris Brothers from a back row inside the sales pavilion, only got into the action in the last couple of bids. She saw off a challenge from Donver Stable's Verne Dubinsky, bidding with bloodstock agent Ciaran Dunne at the outside rail of the pavilion, to secure the bay filly. Asked what she liked about the filly, who worked a furlong in :10.1 ([video](#)) last Thursday, Pope said, "Everything. She's gorgeous and she's correct. She moves very well over the track. She went very fast and has a great attitude. There was nothing not to like. Everything was there. She couldn't have done anything more." Pope admitted the final price tag was more than she expected to pay. "We were hoping to pay around \$150,000 to \$200,000, to be honest with you," she said. "But it's the usual thing. The really nice ones, there are plenty of people who want them. You just have to, if you can, pay for them and cross your fingers, because everything has to go right to get that money back again." Pope is in a good position to judge the strength of the Midlantic market. Her Whisper Hill Farm ventured into the pinhooking business with a group of yearlings purchased at auction last year. Through De Meric Sales, Pope sold a colt by Grand Slam for \$90,000 yesterday. She had acquired the gray for \$30,000 at last year's Saratoga New York-bred sale. "If you have a nice horse, you're going to be heads above everything else that is in the sale," Pope said. "We probably only had four horses on our short list. It's a good place to bring something that can really stand out. And I like [the sale] at this time of year, because they are ready to go on. It's not like buying them in February or March, because you'll need to give them a couple of months off since there is nothing else they can do right then." Corkage ([hip 409](#)) is out of Uncork (Unbridled), a half-sister to stakes winner Chetten County (Giant's Causeway) and to the dam of multiple graded stakes winner Apart (Flatter). Bob Hess, Jr. will train the filly.

Far from a Swan Song...

Corkage was one of three horses consigned to the Midlantic sale by Ocala-based Lynne Boutte. The filly was purchased for \$50,000 by Black Swan Stable. Black Swan is a racing partnership, and the More Than Ready filly was the group's first foray into pinhooking. "Black Swan is a group that I've been buying racehorses for the last couple of years, and they decided they wanted to try the pinhooking side of it," Boutte explained yesterday. "This filly, when we bought her, we bought her early, early in the day. Just with what we gave for her, it was the perfect opportunity to take a shot."

Boutte picked out the youngster along with Black Swan manager John DeStefano. “She has been a pleasure since the day we got her,” Boutte said of the juvenile. “I love More Than Ready. Even before he had two horses win at the Breeders’ Cup, I just thought he was awesome. When I bought her, [Taylor Made’s] Frank Taylor came up to me and said, ‘I can’t believe you got her for that.’ And I said, ‘I can’t believe it

either.”

Boutte knew the filly would be sought after well before she went through the ring yesterday. “Over the last couple of days, she got hotter and hotter and we knew by this morning that she’d be very popular,” Boutte said. “She’s just lovely, and every time she came out she was lovely. You don’t have to do anything to her, she just sold herself.”

Boutte, who was enjoying her biggest sales success yesterday, is a New York native whose involvement in racing was an accident of geography.

“My parents couldn’t spell horse,” she laughed. “I grew up in New York, but my elementary school was right outside Belmont Park. I got hooked looking at the horses outside my school window. My parents allowed me to start with show horses. We lived up the road from [Hall of Fame trainer] Allen Jerkens and he actually helped me get my first job on the racetrack, walking hots. I earned my way up from there.”

Boutte has been consigning horses for over two decades, but admitted changes in the economy have led to changes in how she does business.

“We used to sell a lot, but now, with the industry changing so much, it makes me sad to tell people I couldn’t sell their horse, so we’ve dropped back a lot,” she explained. “Mostly now we just sell our own horses that we’ve pinhooked. It’s just what we find that we feel we want to own. You don’t just want to own a horse anymore. We’ve also got a few broodmares. You have to be versatile, so we breed some and we race some and we sell a few. Primarily, we train yearlings to 2-year-olds for clients. And, when we get the opportunity, we get to buy some for them as well.”

More Than Ready Stays Hot at Midlantic...

More Than Ready was the stallion of the moment midway through Tuesday’s second session of the Midlantic sale. Just a few hips before Mandy Pope bought a filly by More Than Ready for \$300,000, Glen Hill Farm’s Craig Bernick went to \$240,000 to secure a colt by the Vinery stallion. Bernick, standing at the back of the pavilion with bloodstock advisor Donato Lanni, purchased the juvenile on behalf of himself and a friend from Chicago. He signed the ticket as Kingsbury Stables. “We like to buy fillies and, if we do buy colts, we kind of like to buy turf horses, because we think there might be a little bit more of a discount on them.” Bernick said it was likely the colt will find a home on the grass. “More Than Readys are better on turf. We seem to run everything on the grass anyway, so we may as well buy grass horses.”

Tom Proctor will train the juvenile, who worked a furlong in :10.3 ([video](#)) last week.

Craig Bernick declined to name his partner on the horse, but said this colt is his first horse. "He's been to the races, he's been to the Derby and to Saratoga, and he decided he wanted to buy a horse," Bernick explained. The colt ([hip 403](#)) is out of graded stakes placed Trippi Street (Trippi). He was purchased for \$225,000 out of last year's Keeneland September sale and was consigned to yesterday's sale by M & H Training and Sales. Bernick was making his first trip to the Midlantic sale and he sees advantages to the auction's late date. "I just came this year because I was involved with a pinhooking deal of weanlings to yearlings and we had some left over," he said. "So I came to watch a horse sell, and then, obviously, I went shopping. I think it's a good sale. Sometimes you know a little bit more about the horses then you might know in March. And if you buy them in March, they generally have to go to the farm for a couple of months. But this horse we think can go right to the track, which is a bonus."

Quick Return to the Ring for Indian Charlie Colt...

Sonia and James Chapman found opportunity knocking at the OBS March sale and took advantage of the situation. Sonia Chapman signed the ticket at just \$13,000 for a son of Indian Charlie out of that auction. The colt returned to the sales ring at yesterday's Midlantic sale under the Chapman's Breaking Point Farm banner, and sold for \$300,000 to the bid of Carolyn Vogel. "Sonia and I saw him together at the [March] sale," James Chapman said after turning the nifty profit yesterday. "He was a really pretty-profiled horse. I think they were just getting him ready for a later sale and he didn't work very fast." Bred by Gulf Coast Farms and consigned to the March sale by Jerry Bailey Sales Agency, the bay colt worked a furlong at OBS in :11. "I bought him in the ring," Chapman admitted. "I just thought he was a deal." At last week's under-tack preview, the colt worked the same distance in :10.2 ([video](#)). "I just took him home and breezed him a few times and every time we breezed him, he got better," Chapman said. The juvenile RNA'd at \$70,000 at last year's Keeneland September sale. Sold yesterday as [hip 538](#), the colt is out of the unraced Cariada (Seeking the Gold), a full to stakes winner Treasureinmyhand.

Vogel, who races under the name Crossed Sabres Farm, said the colt will join the barn of trainer Dale Romans. "He was sort of a second choice after the [\$600,000 Indian Charlie], but all of my people thought he'd be every bit as good as that other one. He's just not quite as developed yet. But he will be." Vogel has high hopes for the youngster. "We were hanging out with Dale Romans all day at the Preakness," Vogel admitted. "We were sort of the groupies of Shakelford. We made the walk over. And I thought, 'We're going to do this for ourselves next time.'"

Forest Grove Colt for Cella

Veteran trainer Lynn Whiting, bidding on behalf of Charles Cella, went to \$200,000 to secure a colt by Forest Grove out of Asheville (Clever Trick). The juvenile ([hip 483](#)) worked a bullet three furlongs in :33.4 ([video](#)) last Thursday. "I was here to see his work and I thought it was the best work of the day," Whiting said yesterday. "He is a big, strapping young horse, and he vetted completely sound. It looked like the place to buy if you wanted a good horse." The chestnut is a half-brother to multiple stakes placed Agastache (Mutakddim). As for what is next for the youngster, Whiting said, "I'll take him to Louisville and I'll start to learn a little bit about the horse. Obviously, we'll give him a little time if he needs it. He's going to have to tell me."

Whiting, who has a dozen horses in training at Churchill Downs, also bought a pair of Midlantic juveniles on behalf of Choctaw Racing. Asked if he found plenty of competition in bidding, Whiting said, "There always is for a nice horse."

Fasig Midlantic Concludes Strong Run

The Fasig-Tipton Midlantic 2-Year-Olds in Training sale concluded its two-day run in Timonium Tuesday with figures largely comparable to last year's strong one-day auction. During two days of selling, 343 juveniles grossed \$16,211,100. The average of \$47,263 was off just 1.5% from last year's figure, while the median fell 7.4% to \$25,000. "It was the kind of result we had hoped for," said Fasig-Tipton Midlantic Sales Director Paget Bennett. "Last year we had such a good sale that it attracted more horses and new consignments. I think people have a lot of confidence in this market." A total of 76 horses were reported not sold, for a buy-back rate of 18.1%. Last year's buy-back rate was a remarkable 12.5%. A total of 12 horses sold for \$200,000 or more this year, compared to nine in 2009. The two-day sale attracted a strong buying bench, according to Bennett. "We had good representation at the top and from all areas--East Coast, West Coast, Louisiana buyers--we had everybody from all the different racing jurisdictions," she said. "We're fortunate that people bring horses for all markets and all state racing programs, and that people come here looking to buy them."

Trainer Brian Meehan is prepared to hold on until the autumn with last year's GI Breeders' Cup Turf hero **Dangerous Midge** (Lion Heart), following his disappointing effort in Dubai. Last when tailed off in the Mar. 26 G1 Dubai Sheema Classic on his seasonal bow, Iraj Parvizi's 5-year-old is being rested at present. "He's having a holiday until midsummer, then we'll aim him towards the autumn and back-end for the Breeders' Cup again," Meehan told *PA Sport*. "He may go for something like the [Aug. 17] G1 Juddmonte International at York as a starter, then America, then, hopefully, on to Japan. He's a tough horse to give a break to as he's full of beans, but we've managed to let him down a bit and he's just enjoying that."

MTOTO

Mtoto (GB) (Busted {GB}--Amazer {Fr}, by Mincio {Fr}) died at his home Aston Uphorpe Stud at the age of 28. Retired to Darley's establishment at the end of his stellar racing career in 1989, the triple Group 1 scorer went on to sire the likes of Presenting (GB),

Shaamit (Ire), Celeric (GB) and, most recently, Serious Attitude (Ire). Bought for 110,000 guineas by bloodstock agent David Minton, the dark bay was campaigned by the late Alec Stewart for Sheikh Ahmed bin Rashid Al Maktoum, and sprang to prominence when upsetting Reference Point (GB) in the 1987 G1 Eclipse S. He went on to record his second straight success in that Sandown feature the

following year, when he also captured Ascot's G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth S. and a second renewal of the Prince of Wales's S. in its former guise as a Group 2. Beaten into second after a luckless trip in the 1988 G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe at Longchamp, he had been a stalwart of the Oxfordshire wing of the operation ever since. "Mtoto was an exceptional racehorse, and he won some of Britain's most famous races," Dalham Hall's Stud Director Liam O'Rourke commented. "Perhaps his most memorable performance was in the 1988 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe, where he overcame a wall of horses with his incredible acceleration to be beaten only a neck. Mtoto was an inspiration to many--from racing professionals and the public to the staff at Aston Uphorpe, where he will be sadly missed." Among his most celebrated progeny are the 1996 G1 Epsom Derby hero Shaamit--who died as an 8-year-old, but sired the 2002 G1 St Leger winner Bollin Eric (GB)--and the 1997 G1 Ascot Gold Cup winner and Champion Stayer Celeric, as well as Presenting (GB). Third in the 1995 Epsom Derby, the subsequent group winner is now one of Europe's dominant national hunt sires. Mtoto's daughter Sumoto (GB) was responsible for the Group 1 winners Compton Admiral (GB) (Suave Dancer) and Summoner (GB) (Inchiner {GB}), while Serious Attitude managed to crown his sire's stud career with wins in the 2008 G1 Cheveley Park S and 2010 GI Nearctic S.



RETIRED

BRASS HAT CALLS IT A DAY The *Daily Racing Form* reports that veteran gelding **Brass Hat** (Prized--Brassy, by Dixie Brass), who won \$2,173,561 for owner/breeder Fred Bradley in his seven seasons on the racetrack, has been

retired. The winner of the GI Donn H. in 2006, the bay annexed five additional graded events, including the GIII Sycamore S. at Keeneland last October. He was last seen finishing seventh in the GI Clark H. at Churchill

Nov. 26. "He has been galloping strongly, but recently does not appear to be as free-moving as he was once," trainer Buff Bradley, son of the owner/breeder, told *DRF*. Over his 40-race career, Brass Hat won 10 times, setting the track record of 1:47 3/5 for nine furlongs at Gulfstream Park in 2006 and hitting the wire in a record-setting 1:41 1/5 for 1 1/16 miles at Churchill Downs in 2007. He also had eight seconds and five thirds. After his Donn victory, he travelled to the UAE for the G1 Dubai World Cup and ran second, but was subsequently disqualified after testing positive for methylprednisolone, losing out on the \$1.2 million share of the purse. The Bradleys staunchly maintained that they had followed the guidelines for withdrawal time provided by the Dubai Rules of Racing, which stipulated that the medication in question be administered no closer than 23 days before the race and, in fact, treated Brass Hat 28 days prior to the World Cup, giving the medication an extra five days to clear his system. But an appeal of the DQ was denied. Brass Hat will be retired to the farm on which he was foaled, the Bradley's Indian Ridge in Frankfort, Kentucky.

ran only as a 3-year-old, but won seven times in 11 starts in 1999. In his last four races, he won the GII Dwyer S., run that year over 8 1/2 furlongs; finished a length third to Menifee in the GI Haskell Invitational H. over nine furlongs; ran a Beyer 116 when defeating Five Star Day and Successful Appeal in the seven-furlong

GI King's Bishop S.; and ran a Beyer 114 when running fourth to Artax in the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint over six furlongs.

Forestry was retired to long-time Jones associates' Taylor Made Farm for the 2000 season. His first foals arrived in 2001, and raced in 2003. He was such an immediate hit that at least twice before the end of 2006, I had written about him as "possibly rivaling" Unbridled's Song as Taylor Made's top stallion. At the end of 2005, the year his first 4-year-olds ran, his APEX A Runner Index was an astronomical 4.79. He kicked off 2006 with the colt later to be known as The Green Monkey breaking Seattle Dancer's all-time record for a Thoroughbred at auction (\$16 million) at Fasig-Tipton's Calder 2-Year-Old Sale. He ended the year with Discreet Cat running Beyers of 115-116 in the GII Jerome H. (at 1-20) and GI Cigar Mile H. (at 1-4), to take his record to an unbeaten six-for-six.

Forestry ranked 20th on the 2006 General Sire List (per bloodhorse.com), and finished the year with a 3.80 A Runner Index, ranking him among the top 10 sires by that measurement. His stud fee, already \$100,000 for the 2006 season, was bumped again, to \$125,000, for 2007.

We know it's a fickle business, but Forestry's four years in the commercial wilderness until Shackelford jumped up to halt the Triple Crown bid of Animal Kingdom (Leroidesanimaux {Brz}) in last Saturday's GI Preakness S. (Beyer 104) is just about the most textbook case you can find. Neither The Green Monkey nor Discreet Cat won a single race in 2007, and Forestry dropped to 55th on the final 2007 General Sire List. His 2008 stud fee was still \$100,000, but, in subsequent years, he ranked 73rd (2008), 62nd (2009), and 64th (2010), while his stud fee plummeted to \$40,000 for 2009; \$17,500 for 2010; and just \$12,500 for 2011--a 10th of what he stood for in 2007. **Cont. p8**

But sometimes it takes five years for seeds to sprout in this business. I did call Forestry ‘the best value sire in the business’ at least once on his way down, and before the 2010 breeding season I wrote, “The gamble is that his three crops out of mares bred to a six-figure stallion [foals of 2007-2009] will ignite a comeback.” It didn’t really happen with his 2007 crop, the first sired at a six-figure fee. But it has happened with his second crop from a six-figure fee, with no less than the G1 Preakness winner Shackleford. It doesn’t mean Forestry is suddenly right back to where he was in 2006, but it does mean those breeders who rolled the dice on him on the way down could yet have made the right call.

EURO CLASSICS: GALILEO UPDATE

Weren’t we just speaking about him last week, and what a weekend he had in Ireland: Aidan O’Brien’s son Joseph gave Roderic O’Connor a gutsy front-running ride to win the G1 Irish 2000 Guineas, and the next day Galileo fillies Misty for Me and Together ran one-two in the G1 Irish 1000 Guineas. Both were previous Group 1 winners, by the way, so it doesn’t change the statistics we ran last week, except that two more Guineas wins lowers the average winning distance for his now-27 Group 1/Grade I wins for 3-year-olds and up to 10.89 furlongs from 11.12 furlongs. There cannot be anybody who knows what a pedigree is who doesn’t know by now that ‘Roderic’ is the third Guineas winner this year by Galileo out of a Danehill mare. But please do not breed every Danehill mare on the planet to Galileo, even if you could afford to: like all number one sires, there’s not very much he doesn’t work with. But I would wager that sending him crooked unplaced mares just because they’re by Danehill will not prove a formula for success.

Frankel (Galileo), who ran an RPR of 133 when bolting up in the G1 English 2000 Guineas, is, of course, the number one 3-year-old miler in Europe, and is heading for the G1 St. James’s Palace S. at Royal Ascot. That looks like it will be a small field. With the four next best 3-year-old colt milers possibly aiming elsewhere, it could leave possibly G1 Prix d’Essai des Poulains favorite Wootton Bassett (Iffraaj) as his best-known challenger. G1 Irish 2000 winner Roderic O’Connor (Galileo, RPR 120) is likely going to go for a Derby; Dubawi Gold (Dubawi, RPR 119), second in both the English and Irish 2000, may go for the G1 Prix Jean Prat in France. He could meet Excelebration (Exceed and Excel), who ran second to Frankel in the G3 Greenham S. before blitzing the opposition by seven lengths on Sunday (RPR 118) in the G2 Mehl-Mulhens-Rennen, in that contest.

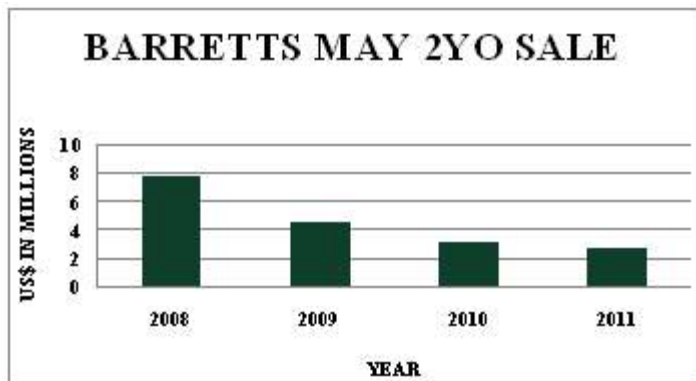
Poulains winner Tin Horse (Sakhee, RPR 119) could conceivably try Ascot; Frankel hasn’t trounced him yet.

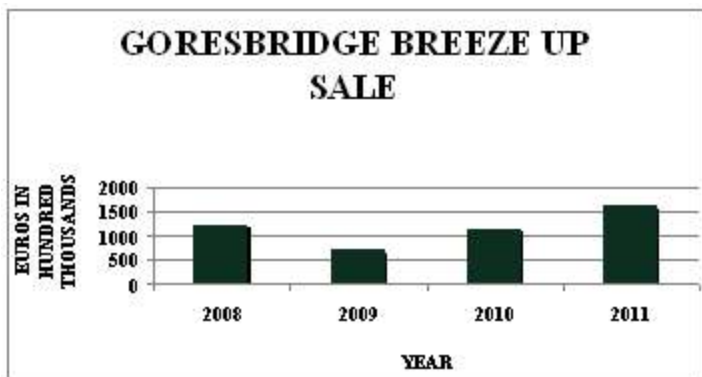
Weekly Sales Ticker

“The depressed state of California racing may be gauged by the results of the Barretts’ Two-Year-Old sales in March and May. In 2007, between the two 604 juveniles were catalogued, 269 sold (45 percent of cat.) for \$30.6-million, average \$113,900. This year 229 were catalogued, 127 sold (55 percent) for \$8,001,000, average of \$63,000. The clearance rate is up ten percent but the number catalogued declined by 62 percent, the number sold by 53 percent, the gross by 74 percent – almost three-quarters – and the average by 45 percent. Purse money in California needs to improve dramatically, and fast.”

SECOND- AND THIRD-CROP SIRES

Among North American second-crop sires, War Front (Danzig) had two black-type winners over the weekend, taking his total to six black-type winners this year. He leads all second-crop sires in that category, as well as in black-type horses in 2011 (nine) and graded stakes winners (three). With 2011 progeny earnings over \$1.43 million ([click here to see the second-crop year-to-date table](#)), he is now about \$90,000 in front of second-placed Bellamy Road (Concerto, \$1.34 million). Bernardini (A.P. Indy) is in third, with the earners of \$1.21 million, including seven 2011 black-type horses. Congrats (A.P. Indy, \$1.07 million), Silver Train (Old Trieste, \$1.04 million), and Rockport Harbor (Unbridled's Song, \$1.00 million) are also over the \$1-million mark in 2011 progeny earnings. Congrats, who now has 15 black-type horses in all, still leads second-crop sires by cumulative progeny earnings (\$2.7 million), ahead of War Front (\$2.6 million) and Bernardini (\$2.5 million) ([click here](#)).

Among third-crop sires--whose first foals are 4-year-olds this year--Animal Kingdom's sire, Leroidesanimaux (Candy Stripes, \$2.69 million) has a lead of a little over \$40,000 over Dubawi (Dubai Millennium, \$2.65 million) in 2011 progeny earnings ([click here](#)), although Dubawi leads all third-crop sires by 2011 black-type winners (seven), black-type horses (16 in 2011 alone!), graded/group stakes winners (three) and graded/group stakes horses (10). That's just in 2011.

In the cumulative categories ([click here](#)), Dubawi is the number one third-crop sire by progeny earnings (just under \$9 million), black-type winners (22), black-type horses (30), graded/group stakes winners (13) and graded/group stakes horses (22). In the cumulative figures, Shamardal (Giant's Causeway) is second in all the same categories, including \$8.3 million in progeny earnings.

In terms of 2011 progeny earnings, Ghostzapper (Awesome Again, \$1.7 million) is the third-leading third-crop sire in 2011, ahead of Kitten's Joy (El Prado, \$1.6 million), Wildcat Heir (Forest Wildcat, \$1.5 million), Afleet Alex (Northern Afleet, \$1.45 million), Roman Ruler (Fusaichi Pegasus, \$1.45 million) and Shamardal (\$1.27 million).

On the cumulative third-crop list--after Dubawi and Shamardal--the leading North American sires are: Wildcat Heir (\$7.2 million), Afleet Alex (\$6.9 million), Roman Ruler (\$6.2 million), Blind Luck's sire Pollard's Vision (Carson City, \$5.4 million), Kitten's Joy (\$5.3 million), Ghostzapper (\$5.1 million) and Leroidesanimaux (\$4.7 million). Tenth by cumulative earnings, and ninth by 2011 earnings, is Saint Liam (Saint Ballado), who died after siring one crop, now 4-year-olds. He would have been in the mix at the top of this group, at least in North America, had he lived.

At four, he captured the GII Commonwealth Breeder's Cup H., and finished second in both the GI Metropolitan H. and GI Strub S. Afternoon Deelites retired with a lifetime record of 12-7-3-0 and earnings of \$1,061,193. Standing at Airdrie Stud in Midway, Ky. before moving to Clear Creek Farms, LLC. in Folsom, La. in 1994, Afternoon Deelites is credited with 23 stakes winners, including Grade II winners Zappa, Deeliteful Irving and Miss Pickums, as well as multiple Grade III winner Three Hour Nap. Afternoon Deelites arrived at Old Friends on May 22 with founder and president Michael Blowen on hand. "It's an honor and privilege to have him here," said Blowen. "We hope all of his fans will come out and visit him." Editor's note: Last month, the TDN published two stories about the efforts of Winchester Farm's Naoya Yoshida to raise funds for the equine industry's victims of the March 11 earthquake and tsunami in Japan through the collection of racing logo caps. On April 29, I left for Hong Kong to attend the G1 Queen Elizabeth II Cup at Sha Tin Racecourse with 1,300 caps (four boxes with a total weight of 220 pounds). Then, in Hong Kong there were another two big boxes from the Hong Kong Jockey Club waiting for me.

I stayed in Hong Kong only one day and a half before leaving for for Japan. All the boxes were safely given to



the volunteer team in Tokyo May 2. The team consists of the six famous female horse racing newscasters and racing journalists who have been donating

time after world to advertise the 'Hats Off' Program in Japan in magazines, on the Internet and in newspapers.

During my two-day stay in Tokyo, I was interviewed by the *Asahi* newspaper, one of the biggest nationwide newspapers in Japan and was able to clearly state the message from our Thoroughbred industry to the Japanese people. I also had a meeting with The Japan Racing Association (JRA) and The National Association for Racing (NAR). NAR is the umbrella organization of provincial racing.
