SETBACK FOR CARLTON HOUSE

The Queen's **Carlton House** (Street Cry {Ire}) suffered a minor setback ahead of Saturday's G1 Investec Derby at Epsom, connections announced yesterday. While it is expected that the May 12 G2 Dante S. winner will still make the line-up for the Blue Riband, Racing Manager John Warren warned that it would be a "day-by-day" brief after filling was found in one of the colt's joints at evening stables Monday. "His joints weren't quite a pair, and it became evident there might be an issue, but this morning the horse was X-rayed and we found there to be no abnormalities," Warren explained. "It is a soft-tissue swelling and it's a day-by-day thing now, as

no medication can be administered. It could be the equivalent of a footballer straining his ankle, and it wasn't evident in his cantering yesterday that he took a false step. The horse is sound this morning and, luckily, his important work is out of the way, so it would only be routine cantering that would be undertaken for the remainder of the week anyway. It was a little bit sore and filled, but they will be hosing, icing and wrapping the joint to speed up the healing process. I felt this morning that we are still extremely hopeful." Warren revealed that Carlton House had trotted yesterday and added, "I think the fact that Sir Michael sent him out this morning really says it all--it's not as if he has to stand in his box and it's a big issue. I suspect that it will be well cared for during the day and this evening and in the morning a little bit more information will come to the surface. Her Majesty just wanted to know the detail and was typically philosophical, but is used to horses and knows them inside out."

Dunlop Pleased with Murtagh Booking...

Ed Dunlop yesterday expressed his pleasure at snapping up Johnny Murtagh for the ride on **Native Khan (Fr)** (Azamour {Ire}) in Saturday's Classic. After the G1 2000 Guineas third completed his preparation yesterday morning, the Newmarket-based conditioner said, "We are delighted to have Johnny on our side. He has already won the race on Sinndar (Ire), High Chaparral (Ire) and Motivator (GB), and he is a world-class jockey with a fantastic record around Epsom. He finished third on Ouija Board (GB) in the 2004 Arc, so we know him well, and I am sure that he will do a great job for us. Obviously, it was disappointing hearing that Kieren [Fallon] had changed his mind, and I felt particularly sorry for the owners, who wanted him to ride and thought that they had their man. But it's no big deal--Native Khan has run five times, and Kieren was only aboard twice. We then went for Olivier Peslier, who rode Native Khan in the 2000 Guineas, but he has to ride for the Wertheimer brothers at Longchamp on Saturday, so had to decline. However, getting Johnny is a real coup, and we are very happy about it."

PRIME CUT WORKS AT CHURCHILL Donald Adam's **Prime Cut** (Bernstein), third in the GII Peter Pan S. May 14, worked five furlongs in 1:03.60 at Churchill Downs Tuesday in preparation for a possible start in the GI Belmont S. June 11. With exercise rider Dane Noel aboard, the \$475,000 KEESEP yearling graduate galloped out six furlongs in 1:16.40. "Everything went good," trainer Neil Howard reported. "I was just looking to go just a nice five-eighths--not too fast, not too slow. I thought he went well, finished good and galloped out strong. He's been running--he's just come off the Peter Pan--so he's a pretty fit horse." A decision regarding the third leg of the Triple Crown is coming soon.

Theory Has Coronation in Her Sights...

Andrew Rosen's **Theyskens' Theory** (Bernardini) was yesterday confirmed on course for the June 15 G1 Coronation S. at Royal Ascot. Last year's G3 Prestige S. winner and G1 Fillies' Mile third returned with a smooth win in the Listed Michael Seely Memorial S. at York May 13. Trainer Brian Meehan said, "She'd had a Guineas preparation, had done extremely well over the winter, but had a chest infection and had to miss her trial and the Classic. So she was quite fit for York, and we expected her to win well. She is very talented, and we're looking forward to the Coronation."

Lady Set for Jubilee Return...

☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ **Lady of the Desert** (Rahy) is due to make her 4-year-old debut in Royal Ascot's G1 Golden Jubilee S., trainer Brian Meehan announced yesterday. Not seen since rounding off her sophomore campaign with a second in the G1 Prix de l'Abbaye de Longchamp in October, Jaber Abdullah's G2 Diadem S. winner also has an engagement in the June 14 G1 King's Stand S., but is more likely to wait until the Saturday of the Royal meeting. "She's been great, but we opted for a late start with her, as the autumn is going to be busy," her conditioner explained yesterday. "She's more likely to go for the Golden Jubilee, but we've kept her in the King's Stand just as an option. She's a sprinter now, and that's what she'll stay."

EUROPE'S CHAMPION 2-YEAR-OLD OF 2011 COULD BE DECIDED AT CHURCHILL DOWNS

One of the principles we learned during the Breeders' Cup 2009 Strategic Planning process was the importance and advisability of expanding the Breeders' Cup's reach internationally. The new international stallion nomination program eliminates the necessity for non-North American breeders to nominate foals of 2011 and later, as long as their sires are nominated to the program, and will hopefully expand the number of internationally sired foals nominated from around 1,000 to more like 10,000. International Northern Hemisphere stallions may be nominated for 50% of the stud fee, Southern Hemisphere stallions for 25%. By the end of May, I think Breeders' Cup staffers have been pleasantly surprised that already over 300 stallions from 14 countries have been nominated.

Two of the principal benefits of this expansion are (1) potential growth of field sizes due to more non-North American foals being automatically eligible; and (2) the potential growth of betting revenue internationally. There is absolutely no intention to pay less attention to domestic growth, but we saw pretty incontrovertible evidence that there is significant potential for expansion internationally, too. It's worth remembering that the Breeders' Cup, like many important entities in the racing game, is a non-profit organization dedicated to the improvement of the racing and breeding industries. Part of what's happened is that the organization's Board of Members--39 of whom are elected by the nominators and which itself elects the 13-member Board of Directors--agree that expanding the organization internationally in these areas will benefit the North American breeders who still pay to nominate their foals, and who, along with the stallion nominators, form the cornerstone of the organization.

As you know, the format and conditions of the "Win and You're In" Challenge Races have also undergone significant changes. Most notably, the Breeders' Cup has discontinued paying purse supplements for these races, but instead, the race winners (as long as they are nominated to the program) will have their entry fees paid for the relevant races on the two-day Breeders' Cup Championship card, as well as be paid a travel allowance of \$10,000 for domestic winners and \$20,000 for international winners. Significantly, too, the nominator of any winner for which a nomination fee was paid will receive a \$10,000 Nominator's Award.

There are 69 Challenge Races this year, so that could mean new payments of \$690,000 to the nominators of Challenge Race winners this year (if all Challenge Race winners are nominated this year) alone. By the way, one of the reasons for paying entry fees instead of purse supplements is an attempt to raise the percentage of Challenge Race winners that actually do run in the Breeders' Cup Championship races; only about half the winners have run up until now, whereas the hope is it will be closer to two-thirds or three-quarters under the new program.

There were international races included in Version 1.0 of the "Win and You're In" program, which operated through 2010. In 2011, 18 of the 69 Challenge Races will be run outside North America, 14 in Europe (five each in France and Great Britain, four in Ireland) plus two in Australia and one each in Japan and Argentina. Besides promoting the Breeders' Cup program in each of these countries, another important objective of the Challenge program, internationally and domestically, is to try and create more of what is called a 'narrative' leading up to the two-day Championship. For example, the \$3-million GI Breeders' Cup Turf has suffered from smaller fields than ideal the last few years. So that division has the highest number of "Win and You're In" Challenge Races, 10, including one each from Japan, Great Britain and Ireland, and two from France. The idea is that the Breeders' Cup crack marketing team will have more to promote, domestically (five more are in North America) as well as internationally.

Last December, the North American Graded Stakes Committee agreed to a significant change, which was to upgrade the \$1-million Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf from a Grade II to a Grade I. Coupled with the agreed designation of three seven-furlong Group 1 races in Europe as "Win and You're In" races, there exists the real and exciting possibility of an example of how the new, truly international world could look. I mean, simply and directly, this: the winners of the G1 National S. in Ireland, the G1 Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere on Arc weekend in France and the G1 Dewhurst S. in England could meet in the new Grade I, \$1-million Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf to determine the champion 2-year-old in Europe. It is, really, a revolutionary Transatlantic concept, but it really could work, and the basic reason is ground conditions.

Let me explain. Prior to 2001, France's top year-end 2-year-old race, the G1 Grand Criterium, was run over one mile on Arc weekend. In 2001, the distance was shortened to seven furlongs, and it became possible for horses to run both in it, and in the G1 Dewhurst S. 13 days later (in 2003, the Grand Criterium was renamed the Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere, in honor of the French industrialist and important French breeder and owner who died earlier that year). But, over the last decade, there have also been a growing number of top European 2-year-olds that needed to run one mile, not seven furlongs, by the end of the season.

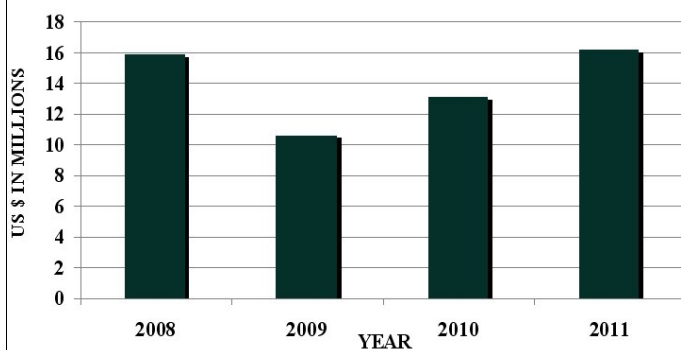
Weekly Sales Ticker

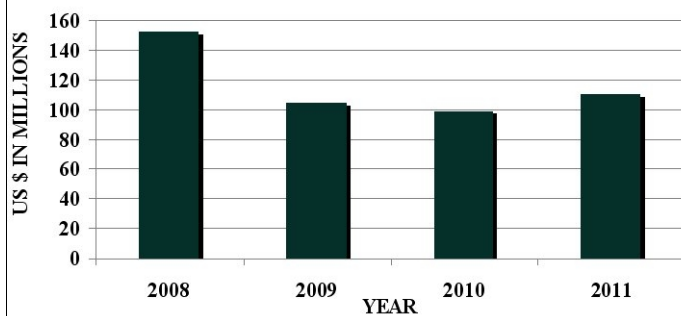
FASIG-TIPTON MIDATLANTIC 2YO SALE

The British have the G1 Racing Post Trophy at the end of October, and the French created a new race in 2001, the now-G1 Criterium International, run at Saint-Cloud, also at the end of October. The problem with both races: prevailing soft ground. Not always, but often, the ground is soft or heavy for both of these races. Now that the G1 Dewhurst S. has been moved to the week after the Lagardere, there is (a) little chance the same horse would run in both, and (b) horses who run in one of the seven-furlong Group 1s face the possibility, if not probability, of bottomless ground if their owners want to run in one of the one-mile Group 1s later in the month.

Moreover, the Dewhurst, once the definitive race to determine Europe's 2-year-old champion, really isn't any longer. Yes, Frankel won it last year, but the two previous years the Dewhurst had been won by Intense Focus and Beethoven--good colts, sure, but not Europe's champion 2-year-olds of their years. If you look at the winners of the Dewhurst since 2001, six were the best 2-year-olds in Europe in that year, but four weren't. It's been the best race to win the 2-year-old championship in, but--especially with the date change--it just doesn't look like the dominant race in the European calendar it once was.

I know a lot of Europeans are going to bridle at the suggestion, but this is where the Breeders' Cup can step in, and begin to really be the international program to which it aspires. In 2011, the winners of the G1 National S., the G1 Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere and the G1 Dewhurst S. can receive free entry and a \$20,000 travel supplement to run in a \$1-million Grade I race the first weekend of November--with at least a better chance of good ground--which actually has the potential to tell us all which is the best European-trained 2-year-old colt of 2011: the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf. But there is a condition, which is that the winners of those races must be nominated to the Breeders' Cup program. They can still run if they're not nominated, by supplementing, but that costs \$100,000 if the sire was nominated to the Breeders' Cup or E.B.F. for the 2009 foal crop, or \$200,000 if not. We'd all prefer to avoid that, I'm sure. The Breeders' Cup would much rather have the relevant horse already eligible than have to try and persuade the owners to come up with a six-figure late nomination fee.

The key point to keep in mind is that we are talking--for right now--about the 2009 foal crop, when the Breeders' Cup/EBF 'stallion reciprocity' agreement was still in force.

The big problem with that, for European breeders, was that even if the stallion was nominated, it was still necessary for European breeders to nominate the foal to the Breeders' Cup program in order for it to be eligible for the Breeders' Cup. Beginning with the foal crop of 2011, that will not be the case: if the stallion is nominated under the new Breeders' Cup program outside North America, all its foals will be automatically eligible, just as in the E.B.F. program itself. But in 2009, the foals still had to be nominated separately, and, under the old program, it tended to be the big Transatlantic operations--Darley, Coolmore, Juddmonte, Shadwell, and the like--which understood the program and nominated their European-sired foals to the Breeders' Cup.

But this is why I am writing this piece now: in order to alert owners, breeders, and trainers to the opportunity for previously non-nominated foals of 2010 and earlier (including 2009 foals) to become eligible to the Breeders' Cup, there was created what is called the 'Open Enrollment' program. Until June 30, as long as the sire is nominated to the Breeders' Cup for 2011, owners of foals of 2010 and earlier--from anywhere, by the way, North America as well as internationally--can pay a one-time fee, and they are nominated forever. Those fees are: \$3,000 for yearlings (foals of 2010); \$6,000 for 2-year-olds (foals of 2009); and \$25,000 for 3-year-olds and up (foals of 2008 and earlier). This is a one-time opportunity, designed to 'catch up' foals born before 2011 and make them eligible. Not incidentally, it's likely that, from now on, Americans looking to buy horses from Europe and elsewhere are going to be more inclined to buy a horse already nominated to the Breeders' Cup than one for which they would have to pay a \$100,000 or more late nomination fee. That is likely to apply next year to this year's yearlings (foals of 2010, for which the Open Enrollment fee is \$3,000), as well as to horses already of racing age in 2011. If you have questions about the eligibility, or possibility of eligibility, of any horses, the best thing to do is to contact Dora Delgado at the Breeders' Cup office in Lexington (ddelgado@breederscup.com), and she will help you figure it out.

For owners of 2-year-olds that you think might be good enough to compete in the three Group 1 “Win and You’re In” Challenge Races for European 2-year-olds (the National S. in Ireland, the Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere in France and the Dewhurst S. in Great Britain), if they have not been nominated previously, the cost will be \$6,000 to nominate, again provided the colt’s sire is itself nominated for 2011 (dead or retired stallions in 2011 are automatically assumed to be nominated). I know you’ll say, ‘well, why can’t we wait until later and then nominate if they’re good enough?’ The answer is that this whole thing is complicated enough as it is. The June 30 deadline wasn’t designed with these specific races in mind, and if they start moving the goalposts, it’s going to be even harder to understand. But I maintain, the way things have evolved, the newly Grade I, \$1-million Breeders’ Cup Juvenile Turf really does have the potential to determine the best European-trained 2-year-old of 2011. If that could be your 2-year-old and it is not yet nominated to the Breeders’ Cup, the cost of nominating is far from prohibitive.

I should also add one other point: Breeders’ Cup officials have tried to make the point all along that the objective is not just to collect money and swell the coffers. It is their stated intention to try and use money collected from non-North American sources to support races outside North America, as much as possible. We are only in the very beginning stages of how new directions might emerge. But the Breeders’ Cup aspires to be a democratic organization representing all its stakeholders and nominators, whether domestic or international. All nominators who pay a nomination fee have votes in elections for ‘Big Board’ Members (which then elects a Board of Directors), so non-North American stallion nominators will have voting rights in upcoming Breeders’ Cup elections. We think that’s an important point to keep in mind: no taxation without representation. That’s the American way.

IGLESIA MARE TOPS FINAL MM BROODMARE SESSION

(Edited press release) The well-bred mare Last Love (Aus) (f, 4, Iglesia {Aus}--Tranquil Love {Aus}, by Imperial Baron {Aus}) topped Tuesday's third and final session of the Magic Millions National Broodmare Sale at the Gold Coast. Catalogued as [lot 1231](#) and consigned by Peachester Lodge, Last Love was knocked down for A\$37,000 (US\$39,422.29) to Boomer Bloodstock after attracting strong interest. The 4-year-old, who is yet to go to stud, is a half-sister to four winners, including juvenile Brief Embrace (Aus) (Irgun), who won four races, including three stakes, and earned over A\$650,000. She was also second in the G1 Blue Diamond S. Over A\$470,000 changed hands on 150 lots during the session, for an average price of A\$3,165 and clearance rate of 79%. "There was great value throughout today's session, with buyers no doubt delighted with their purchases," Magic Millions Managing Director Vin Cox said. "It was nice to see strong interest from international buyers from the Philippines, Thailand, Korea, Hong Kong and New Zealand." Cox added, "The session seemed to go pretty well with the quality lots well sought out and plenty of bargains to be had. To boast an increased average on last year's corresponding session is encouraging--as was the clearance rate of over 79%."
