EVEN DOZEN FOR 'TEST OF THE CHAMPION'

A field of 12 sophomores was drawn yesterday for Saturday's final leg of the Triple Crown, the GI Belmont S. on Long Island, New York. For the first time in the history of the event, the top seven finishers from the GI Kentucky Derby have been entered to run, including 20-1 upsetter **Animal Kingdom** (Leroidesanimaux {Brz}) and **Shackleford** (Forestry), who dashed his rivals Triple

Crown dreams with a narrow victory in the GI Preakness S. May 21. Owned by Team Valor International, Animal Kingdom has been in the Big Apple since last Sunday, and showed absolutely no signs of fatigue, breezing a strong half-mile at Big Sandy. While the post position draw in a 12-furlong race--especially one with a near quarter-mile run into the first turn--is perhaps less critical than in a shorter race, Animal Kingdom did slightly better of the two Classic winners, and will depart the nine hole. The usually prominent Shackleford will have to use at least a bit of his natural speed to clear his 11 other rivals, as he was handed the widest alley in 12. In the eyes of trainer Graham Motion, it wasn't a perfect result, but neither was it disastrous. "I would have preferred 6 or 7," he admitted. "I would not have wanted to be in the 1 or the 12. The 12 is right near the grandstand. I'm happy [Shackleford] is in the 12. It will make him work a little bit. It's going to be a tactical race, no doubt about it." Shackleford's trainer Dale Romans was drawing comfort from a generally accepted accounting principle. "With post position 12, he'll be the last one in and the first one out," he offered. "Hopefully, he'll be able to clear the field. He's fast enough that he'll be able to break and clear everyone anyway."

Doing the Dirty Work...


While he had an mostly uneventful and clean trip in his Kentucky Derby victory, things didn't go quite so smoothly in the Preakness for Animal Kingdom. He was a bit slow to find his stride early on, and that left him near the back of the pack, having to deal with significant kickback for the first time. "I've never had a horse come back from a race like that; the dirt was literally caked in his blinkers," Motion said. "It was extraordinary. I don't think that's going to happen in the Belmont."

Nehro Freshened for Belmont Run...

Zayat Stables' **Nehro** (Mineshaft) has been a revelation and one of the most improved of his generation this spring. The GII Louisiana Derby and GI Arkansas Derby runner-up was a bit closer to the pace in the Kentucky Derby and looked a winner for a few strides inside the final furlong, but was unable to resist the late rally of Animal Kingdom. Connections could easily have pressed on to Baltimore, but decided the five weeks between races was tantamount, and the colt has a decided freshness advantage over his rivals on Saturday. "We've got three seconds in the last three Derbies, being Louisiana, Arkansas and Kentucky," commented Brad Weisbord, racing manager to Ahmed Zayat. "Mr. Zayat and his family are very pleased to be running in the Belmont S. New York is like their hometown, and to be here is just a dream. Nehro is very versatile, so he really can be anywhere. In Louisiana he was very close; in the Arkansas Derby he was far back. In the Kentucky Derby he was a little closer, but I believe that was because of the slower pace. He's very versatile. We're going to leave that up to the jock. Corey Nakatani rode him very well, so we'll leave it up to those guys." Nehro drew the middle of the starting gate in six.

A Change Will Do You Good?...

He'll have a new, hopefully more foolproof set of shoes and a new jockey on his back Saturday, and **Mucho Macho Man** (Macho Uno), third in the Derby, will try to improve upon an even, but non-threatening sixth-place effort in the Preakness. In addition to new glue-on shoes, the Florida-bred will have the services of NYRA's leading rider, Ramon Dominguez, and the duo will depart for their 1 1/2-mile journey from the 10-hole. The colt's ownership certainly aren't lacking for confidence. "We think we have the best horse in the country," Dean Reeves said. We just need to prove it, and hopefully Saturday we'll do that."

The Heat is On...

Lacking the fireworks that their connections provided at Tuesday's media luncheon in Manhattan, Classic winners **Animal Kingdom** (Leroidesanimaux {Brz}) and **Shackleford** (Forestry) quietly shared the spotlight over Big Sandy for some light exercise shortly after 9 a.m. on a steamy Wednesday morning in New York.

The action shifted indoors to Belmont Park's Garden Terrace shortly thereafter for the traditional breakfast and GI Belmont S. post position draw. Patrice Wolfson, who, along with her late husband Louis Wolfson campaigned Triple Crown winner Affirmed under the Harbor View Farm banner, received a nice hand as she started off the festivities by recalling the colt's dream run in 1978 and the importance of continuing on with tradition.

Team Valor International principal Barry Irwin wouldn't take the bait from NYRA's Andy Serling when asked if he had a sidebet with trainer Dale Romans on the Belmont after the two exchanged jabs at the previous day's press conference. **Mucho Macho Man** (Macho Uno)'s majority owner Dean Reeves, however, gave the crowd something to laugh about while Romans and Irwin chose their words a bit more carefully this time.

"That's the most intelligent and insightful thing that I've heard in weeks," Reeves said playfully, referring to Irwin's well-publicized comments that Mucho Macho Man was the horse that he feared most.

Romans and conditioner Graham Motion, the two biggest advocates of this oft-criticized sophomore crop, are embracing the budding rivalry between the GI Kentucky Derby and GI Preakness S. winners.

"Without a Triple Crown on the line, this is going to be one of the most exciting Belmonts I can remember," Romans said.

Motion added, "I think these two horses coming down the stretch would be the ultimate. It's great for this race. It's a test of champions."

Zayat Stables's racing manager Bradley Weisbord attributed the quick turnaround for the Preakness as the main reason for awaiting the third leg of the Triple Crown with **Nehro** (Mineshaft). As for the trio of consecutive runner-up efforts by the bay, he added, "We hope to shed the bridesmaid tag and get the win."

T.J. Comerford, assistant trainer to Aidan O'Brien, discussed the frequent flyer miles that **Master of Hounds** (Kingmambo) has racked up this spring. Will the the 1 1/2-miles distance of the Belmont suit the Mrs. John Magnier colorbearer? "[It] will hit him on the head," he said. The Derby fifth-place finisher will remain in quarantine at Aqueduct until Thursday. He arrived from Ireland Tuesday.

Trainer Tom Albertrani seemed confident in Derby seventh-place finisher **Brilliant Speed** (Dynaformer)'s chances, and also talked about a recent visit to see a former charge of his, 2006 champion three-year-old colt Bernardini. "I thought I could get him on a van to Belmont and get him back in training," he said of the leading young Darley stallion.

The always entertaining Mike Repole offered that he had no problem coming in under the radar with **Stay Thirsty** (Bernardini). "In this race, you don't want to be the favorite," the owner said. "I'll take my 20-1 [morning-line] odds and feel like I'm the favorite."

As the draw was approaching the finish line, Repole also provided an update on champion Uncle Mo (Indian Charlie), who has put on 83 pounds since receiving some downtime at WinStar Farm. The GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile winner, recently diagnosed with cholangiohepatitis, is expected to resume light training in about two weeks. "Uncle Mo will decide at the end of the day," Repole said regarding his charge's chances of returning to the races.

INTERNATIONAL RACE DAY MEDICATION SUMMIT NEXT WEEK

Prominent horsemen, veterinarians and regulators from around the world will participate in an "International Summit on Race Day Medication, EIPH and the Racehorse" Monday and Tuesday in New York. The event is jointly sponsored by the American Association of Equine Practitioners (AAEP), National Thoroughbred Racing Association (NTRA) and the Racing Medication and Testing Consortium (RMTC).

Day 1 will include presentations on the current status of medication issues in racing; an overview of exercise induced pulmonary hemorrhage (EIPH) and its impact upon horse health; management and treatment alternatives for EIPH; and testing issues surrounding treatment for EIPH. These topics will be followed by international panel discussions on regulatory issues surrounding race day medication; veterinary viewpoints on the management of EIPH; and the management of EIPH from a trainer's perspective.

Day 2 of the Summit will feature a facilitated discussion.

DON ADAM - Prime Cut Adam, a resident of Bryan, TX, owns Courtlandt Farms, a 370-acre facility based in Ocala, FL. Adam started The Adam Corporation/Group in 1977 and helped build it into a wide-ranging company dealing in banking and financial services, cable TV, contracting and real estate.

First American Bank, a subsidiary of the corporation, was acquired by Citigroup for a reported \$750 million in 2005. Later the same year, Adam launched what is now American Momentum Bank in Florida, and is still majority owner, chairman and CEO. He got into racehorse ownership after meeting Lane's End's Will Farish in 1995. He has owned GISW Film Maker (Dynaformer) and GSW Adriano (A.P. Indy).

Ice George Hall is the president, founder and majority shareholder of Clinton Group Inc., an investment company. The Halls, who live in Rumson, NJ, got involved in racing in 2004 with the purchase of four yearlings. With their private trainer Kelly Breen, they have campaigned GI Kentucky Derby starters West Side Bernie (Bernstein), Atomic Rain (Smart Strike) and Pants On Fire (Jump Start), ninth in this year's Derby. The Halls own the 385-acre Annetes Farm in Versailles, KY, where they keep seven broodmares. Their racing string consists of 24 horses.

KHARAG STABLES - Isn't He

Perfect Kharag is the stable name of trainer Doodnauth Shivmangal, who hails from Guyana, a small country situated between Venezuela, Brazil and Suriname. Shivmangal's father also trained racehorses, and his brother was a jockey. A former jockey himself, Shivmangal trained 52-time winner Guyana Star before he moved to the U.S. in the late 1980s. He trained on the New York circuit in the early 1990s, then left in 1995 to focus on his freight trucking company at JFK Airport. He returned to training in 2010. His co-owners include wife Zalimoon, sons Harry and Kevin, daughters Lolita and Sherie and cousin Dejainauth Ramnarayn, who is managing partner. Also involved in the partnership are Ramnarayn's brothers Dirgindra, Yoindra and Parindra, nephews Prem and Narinda Arjun, and Trilokie Khemai, his niece's husband. Ramnarayn's father, Kharag, was president of the Kennard Memorial Turf Club for 12 years. Dejainauth, who owns three pawnshops, has lived in Queens since he moved to the United States in 1978.

LIVE OAK PLANTATION - Brilliant Speed Charlotte Weber, born in Philadelphia, has homes in NYC, Saratoga Springs, NY, and Hobe Sound, FL. The granddaughter of Campbell Soup Co founder John Dorrance, she is on the board of trustees of the company. Weber established her breeding operation, 4,500-acre Live Oak Stud, in Ocala in 1968. Live Oak's seven Grade I winner include millionairess My Typhoon (Giant's Causeway) and 2006 GI Breeders' Cup Mile hero Miesque's Approval (Miesque's Son).

MRS. JOHN MAGNIER - Master of Hounds Susan Magnier of Co. Tipperary, Ireland, is the daughter of legendary trainer Vincent O'Brien, and the wife of John Magnier, the head of the Coolmore racing empire.

TEAM VALOR INT'L - Animal Kingdom Team Valor is a syndicate group led by CEO Barry Irwin, a former racing journalist from Los Angeles who now lives in Versailles, KY. Irwin started his first partnership group, Cloverleaf Racing Stables, with partner Jeff Siegel in 1987. The two formed Team Valor in 1992 and, in 2007, Irwin bought out Siegel and renamed the operation Team Valor

International. Team Valor's Grade/Group 1 winners include Irridescence (SAf) (Caesour), Ipi Tombe (Zim) (Manshood {GB}) and Captain Bodgit (Saint Ballado).

REEVES THOROUGHbred RACING & DREAM TEAM ONE - Mucho Macho Man Dean Reeves, CEO of Reeves Contracting, and his wife Patti, who owns Reeves Media, were introduced to racing by Bob and Esther Ades while vacationing in Turks and Caicos in 2007, and formed their racing

partnership in 2009; they are from Atlanta, GA. The Ades are also members of the syndicate. Dream Team One is a partnership group headed by Dr. Jim Culver, who has a Ph. A regular at Aqueduct and Belmont when he was growing up in Queens, Repole bought his first horse in 2002, and became heavily invested six years later. His runners include last year's juvenile champion Uncle Mo (Indian Charlie).

SAGAMORE FARM - Monzon Sagamore Farm in Glyndon, MD, established by the Vanderbilt family in 1925, was the breeding operation of Alfred G. Vanderbilt until he sold the property to developer James Ward in 1986. It is now owned by Kevin Plank, the founder and CEO of Under Armour Inc., a leading manufacturer of sports performance apparel. The youngest of five boys, Plank grew up in Kensington, MD. He played football at the University of Maryland and began a company that sold roses for Valentine's Day. He parlayed the profits into Under Armour. Plank was bitten by the racing bug when rumors began five years ago that the GI Preakness S. might be relocated from his home state. He bought the 530-acre Sagamore in 2007, and is restoring the farm. His colors were carried to victory by Shared Account (Pleasantly Perfect) in last fall's GI Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf. Monzon is his first homebred. Sagamore bred and raced Hall of Famers Native Dancer, Bed o'Roses and Discovery, who are all buried on the grounds.

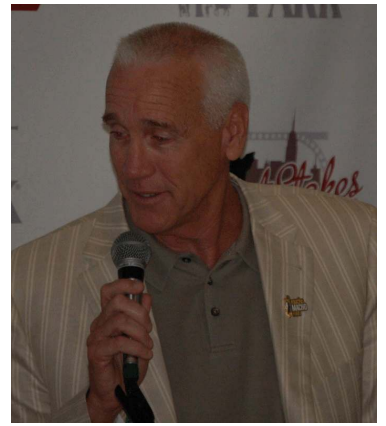

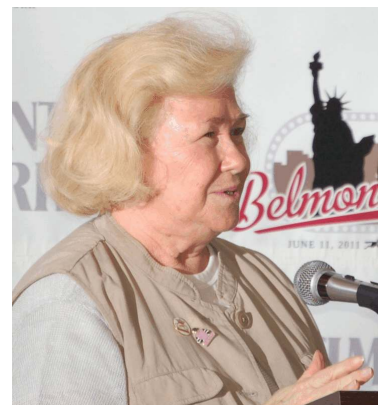

They include two fellow top-class 2-year-olds of 2010 in Khalifa Dasmal's **Dream Ahead** (Diktat {GB}) and Frank Brady's **Wootton Bassett (GB)** (Iffraaj {GB}), as well as Andrew Tinkler's dual 2000 Guineas runner-up **Dubawi Gold (GB)** (Dubawi {Ire}) and Giuliano Manfredini's May 22 G2 Mehl Mulhens-Rennen winner **Excelebration (Ire)** (Exceed and Excel {Aus}). "Frankel looks a bit unbeatable at the moment, but we won't be going to Ascot for place money, we will try and beat him if we can," Excelebration's trainer Marco Botti told the *Daily Mail*. Also remaining is the Aidan O'Brien-trained pair of **Alexander Pope (Ire)** (Daneshill Dancer {Ire}) and **Zoffany (Ire)** (Dansili {GB}), while the G1 Futurity S. and G1 NHK Mile Cup winner **Grand Prix Boss (Jpn)** (Sakura Bakushin O {Jpn}) is set to represent Japan.

Cliffs to Gallop Today...

Canford Cliffs (Ire) (Tagula {Ire}) will warm up for Tuesday's G1 Queen Anne S. with a racecourse workout on Kempton's Polytrack this morning, trainer Richard Hannon announced yesterday. One of eight left in the Royal Ascot mile contest at yesterday's six-day declaration stage, the four-time Group 1-winning 4-year-old enjoyed a solo breeze on his trainer's all-weather gallop yesterday morning under Richard Hughes. "That gallop will put Canford Cliffs spot-on for Tuesday, and we will then just keep him ticking over at home, but we will also take five others to Kempton, including a few other Ascot possibles, so it should be an informative session," Hannon said. "Canford Cliffs is in terrific form, and we are all looking forward to meeting Goldikova (Ire) (Anabaa). The French mare is a legend, but racing is all about competition, and let's hope we have a great race." There were no surprises among the Queen Anne entries yesterday, with the Wertheimers' Goldikova also set to meet Fitri Hay and Coolmore's dual Group 1 hero **Cape Blanco (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) from Ballydoyle and Canford Cliffs' stable companion **Dick Turpin (Ire)** (Anabaa).

Power Set for Stand Test...

Trainer Edward Lynam was yesterday in positive mood ahead of his star sprinter **Sole Power (GB)** (Kyllachy {GB})'s start in Tuesday's G1 King's Stand S. Successful in York's G1 Nunthorpe S. in August and in Haydock's G2 Temple S. when last seen May 21, the 4-year-old will meet a maximum of 20 rivals in the Royal meeting's five-furlong sprint. "He's in good order, and we're looking forward to next week," Lynam commented. "At the moment he's like a boiling pot, and it's a case of keeping him calm. Providing we get good or faster ground at Ascot and the draw isn't an issue, I think he'll give punters a run for their money." One who will definitely be missing is Jaber Abdullah's G1 Prix de l'Abbaye runner-up **Lady of the Desert (Rahy)**, who has met with a setback and was scratched from the King's Stand yesterday. The owner's Racing Manager Bruce Raymond told *sportinglife.com*, "She's under a cloud and won't be going to Ascot. She's having some minor treatment, and will definitely miss the meeting. It's only a minor hiccup and we're hoping that she should be back for July." Widden Stud's G1 Coolmore Stud S. winner **Star Witness (Aus)** (Starcraft {NZ}) also featured among the contenders, alongside Miko Racing's **Overdose (GB)** (Starborough {GB}) and U.S. raider **Bridgetown** (Speightstown), who is set to represent Melnyk Racing Stables and Todd Pletcher.

Ward Lines Up Team...

Trainer Wesley Ward has given the lowdown on his eight intended runners at Royal Ascot. The group is made up mainly of juveniles expected to be scattered among the meeting's six juvenile races. Having had his horses based with Xavier Nakkachdji in Chantilly since April under the supervision of his assistant Blake Heap, Ward will ship to Ascot on Saturday. "We've entered **Italo** (With Distinction) in the [June 14 G2] Coventry. He won at Longchamp first time out," Ward's representative Steve Leving told *PA Sport*. "**Holdin Bullets** (Ghostzapper) will run in either the [June 14] Listed Windsor Castle S. or the [June 18] Listed Chesham S., or both. He's not run in Europe yet. He was in a race, but was scratched. He had a lot of public support in his first race [a one-length victory over 4 1/2 furlongs at Keeneland Apr. 21]. **Gentlemans Code** (Proud Accolade), the one British racing fans are familiar with, is in the Windsor Castle. **Holiday For Kitten** (Kitten's Joy), the only older horse Wesley will be running at Royal Ascot, is in the [June 14] G1 King's Stand S. **Gypsy Robin** (Daaher) has been entered in both the [June 15] G2 Queen Mary S. and the [June 17] G3 Albany S. It has not been completely determined yet which race she is going to run in. She could run in either of the two. She's run just the once at Keeneland over four and a half furlongs in :50.2, a fast time, and she won by 7 1/2 lengths in an 11-horse field. She can really run. Similarly the horse that won in Paris, **Judy the Beauty** (Ghostzapper), is also nominated for both those races. She won at Keeneland in a fast time and then won again over five furlongs at Chantilly last month. Judy the Beauty has trained well and is a good one. **Everyday Dave** (Weather Warning) has run twice. He won his maiden easily at Keeneland and then he won at Chantilly by eight lengths in a time of :57.3. After that race, Timeform gave him a rating of 104p. He's slated to go for the [June 16] G2 Norfolk S. **Tiz Terrific** (Tiznow) is a filly who has been nominated for the Chesham and she won by 2 1/2 lengths at Longchamp. So far, so good. You have to be lucky and it has been firm ground, which was beneficial. The horses were well-trained and they have talent. It is different now to what it was when Wesley won at Ascot the year before last. He won with Strike the Tiger, he won with Jealous Again, but the fashion he did it was a little different because the horses went directly to England for the races. Now this is new territory and when you're running at Royal Ascot you're running against the best horses in the world. It's a difficult assignment."

Isaac Murphy has gone the way of Joe DiMaggio, as a nation turns its lonely eyes away. Good job, Rob.

I applaud Rob Whiteley on his thoughts about use of the whip. I have never ridden in a race but I, too, believe that the whip is used to extremes. I am ashamed to admit that in my early years of training racehorses, I did not give much thought to how hard or how many times a rider hit my horses. However, one day one of my favorite horses came back to my barn with severe welts and that opened my eyes.

There have been many thoughts on how to control the use of the whip--how many times a jockey can hit his horse, the jockey can not raise his arm above his shoulder, etc. I believe that best solution is to not let the jockey turn the stick over (hit underhanded). The jockey needs the whip for two reasons: 1) to control the horse; 2) to signal the horse it is time to give his best. Both of these can be accomplished with the stick turned down. There may be a rare exception when the jockey needs to use the whip differently for his and his mount's safety. This will also be very easy to police; the jockey either turned his stick over or he didn't. I do not think any aspect of the race will change except showing some compassion for our beloved horses.

All credit to Rob Whiteley for, again, exposing all the negatives of the public flogging of horses. Of course, the crowd in favor of sadism in the interest of saving their Exacta, will howl. Once upon a time there was an outcry when hanging children for petty theft was stopped. Same again when public flogging of criminals was abolished. That crowd should stay away from horse racing. There is only a slim chance the sport can be saved. Public cruelty to animals does not improve the chance of survival.

KHRC DENIES DUTROW REQUEST The Kentucky Horse Racing Commission Wednesday denied trainer Rick Dutrow's request that his license application, rejected by the KHRC in April, be retroactively withdrawn, according to the Louisville *Courier-Journal*. The license rejection in Kentucky could lead to Dutrow's license being reciprocally rejected in other racing jurisdictions, while, if he was allowed to withdraw his application, other states would have the option of denying or granting an application. Dutrow is appealing the initial license rejection, but no hearing date has been set. The trainer, who won the Kentucky Derby in 2008 with Big Brown, is also under fire in New York, where a hearing was held last week before the state's racing and wagering board on possible medication infractions.

LILACS AND LACE SOLD TO JAPAN The 3-year-old filly **Lilacs and Lace** (Flower Alley--Refinement, by Seattle Slew), who upset Keeneland's GI Ashland S. in April, has been sold privately to

Keeneland September buyback, Lilacs and Lace began her racing career for breeders Judy Hicks and Kathryn Nikkel. She registered her first stakes victory in the California Oaks on New Year's Day, after which James Covello purchased a majority interest in Lilacs and Lace. Moved from trainer Duane Offield to John Terranova, Lilacs and Lace finished fourth in the GIII Bourbonette Oaks at Turfway Mar. 26, then posted a 48-1 shocker in the Ashland. Lilacs and Lace's dam Refinement produced a full-sister to her the day after the Ashland, and *DRF* reports the mare is back in foal to the Three Chimneys stallion. Refinement is still owned by Hicks and Nikkel, who operate Brookstown Farm in Versailles, Kentucky.

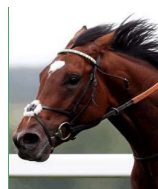

RESETABLE TOPS MM RACEHORSE SALE

Resetable (NZ) (Zabeel {NZ}--Assertiveness {Aus}, by Danehill) topped yesterday's Magic Millions National Racehorse Sale on the Gold Coast with a final bid of A\$160,000 (US\$170,289). The 4-year-old ([lot 2318](#)) was presented by the William's family's Hudson Conway Racing as part of its annual dispersal. Leading Victorian trainer Eric Musgrove came out on top for the gelding, who has won two of his four lifetime starts. "He's a lightly raced and highly promising young galloper who has already won in Melbourne from just four starts," Musgrove said. Musgrove also purchased the second highest price of the session, going to A\$125,000 to secure **Weighted (Aus)** (Encosta de Lago {Aus}--Cannsea {Aus}, by Canny Lad {Aus}), also from Hudson Conway Racing. The 3-year-old ([lot 2352](#)) is stakes-placed. "He's in a similar mold to Resetable," Musgrove said. "He is lightly raced and is already a black-type galloper. He's a promising stayer of the future." During the one-session sale, 85 horses sold for A\$1,164,750. The average, A\$13,703, rose 44.2% from a year ago, while the median jumped 50% to A\$4,500. The clearance rate was 90%. "It was really a solid day's selling," said Magic Millions managing director Vin Cox. "There was a good crowd of buyers on hand from around Australia, and it was good to see great competition on some quality racing prospects. The National Racehorse Sale is one of the fastest growing in the Southern Hemisphere and we are sure graduates from this sale will help see this growth continue into the future."
