'CAN' DO

Today's G1 Queen Anne S. represents a true face-off between the two leading older milers in **Goldikova (Ire)** (Anabaa) and **Canford Cliffs (Ire)** (Tagula {Ire}), both of whom are unbeaten at this meeting. While France's first lady took this prize 12 months ago on her only visit,

Canford Cliffs excelled as a juvenile when recording a six-length verdict in the G2 Coventry S. and returned last term to add the St James's Palace S. to his resume of top-level wins. That also includes an Irish 2000 Guineas, a Sussex S. and Lockinge S., and the latter was as smooth a re-introduction as

the Richard Hannon stable would have cared to see. In brushing aside the Italian heavyweight Worthadd (Ire) (Dubawi {Ire}) in that Newbury mile contest May 14, the colt owned by the Heffer Syndicate, Michael Tabor and Derrick Smith shot a warning across the bows of the Wertheimer-Head team. "Canford Cliffs is the big one, not just on the first day, but of the whole week, and his preparation for the Queen Anne could not have gone any better," Hannon said yesterday. "He has looked better than ever this season and has improved since the Lockinge. He was entitled to be a bit rusty at Newbury, as he had been off since Glorious Goodwood last year. While he can sometimes be a bit switched off in the mornings, [Richard Hughes] woke him up on the gallops last week and they then went to Kempton, where he looked really sharp. We are under no illusions how tough it will be to beat Goldikova, who is a 13-time Grade/Group 1 winner, but the French mare cannot possibly be getting any better at the age of six, and we will sit a bit closer to the pace and hope to do her for finishing speed, like we did Rip Van Winkle (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) at Goodwood last year." MEDICATION SUMMIT STARTS IN NEW YORK

The International Summit on Race Day Medication, EIPH and the Racehorse opened Monday at Belmont Park. The primary goal of the Summit, as National Thoroughbred Racing Association President and CEO Alex Waldrop explained, was "to inform and to foster interaction with our colleagues from across the globe. Our perspective will be a new one for many in the room, because of the international view of the issue." Waldrop added, "We want it to be a fair representation of the issue, representing all sides and all points of view." According to Waldrop, the two most recent NTRA board meetings, attended by members from all segments of the industry, were dominated by the Salix debate. "We could not find a consensus," he said. "And I believe we are a microcosm of the broader debate being undertaken by our industry." Cont. p9

Freddy Head brings Goldikova back to face what could be her biggest test to date, with Hannon having no qualms in placing Canford Cliffs above last year's Queen Anne runner-up Paco Boy (Ire) (Desert Style {Ire}) in terms of talent. Her third G1 BC Mile in November was as impressive as the previous two, and the form of her 13th top-level success in Longchamp's G1 Prix d'Ispahan May 22 has already been boosted by the subsequent group wins of the runner-up Cirrus des Aigles (Fr) (Even Top {Ire}) and fifth Byword (GB) (Peintre Celebre). "She is very well and I'm very happy with her," Head said yesterday. "I am sure she is as well as she's ever been and certainly as good as last year. She looks a freak and her work is very good. Competition is what racing is about, and I think I can take on any horse with her. We'll ride her like we did last year. Canford Cliffs is a great horse, there is no doubt about that, but we'll see on the course. Goldikova has been beaten a few times and no horse is invincible, but she will be hard to beat. I wouldn't like it to become soft, as that would be a problem for her."

Fitri Hay, Derrick Smith, Susan Magnier and Michael Tabor's **Cape Blanco (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) reverts to a mile, having finished fourth in the Mar. 26 G1 Dubai World Cup on Meydan's Tapeta surface and in the G1 Prix Ganay at Longchamp Apr. 30. He had the G1 Irish Champion S. won at every step when making all in dramatic fashion at Leopardstown in September and is a dangerous opponent when let loose on the front end. Jockey Jamie Spencer commented, "He's a high-class horse with top-class form. Hopefully, he will move forward off a messy race in Dubai and a good effort in the Ganay. As the season goes on, he will get better and better and he has plenty of pace." Cont. p3

This race's leading owner and trainer Godolphin and Saeed bin Suroor are represented by past **TDN Rising Star** ☆ Rio de la Plata (Rahy), who re-emerged from the shadows when capping his 2010 campaign with wins in the G1 Premio Vittorio di Capua over a mile of the San Siro circuit in October and G1 Premio Roma over 10 furlongs the following month. A respectable third under a seven-pound penalty on his six-year-old bow in Epsom's G3 Diomed S. over an extended mile on Derby day, his trainer is expecting improvement. "Rio de la Plata ran well on his first start of the year at Epsom Downs, and he came back from that run sound and healthy," bin Suroor explained. "He is ready to go, but he is coming up against some of the best milers in the world and it will be a tough race." In any other year, Barry Hills would be considered to have a live contender in the Apr. 14 G3 Earl of Sefton S. winner **Ransom Note (GB)** (Red Ransom), but in this company he may be out of his depth. "Realistically, he is running for third, but one of his finest hours came over course and distance when winning the Britannia H. last year, so he clearly loves Ascot," Hills said. "We still don't really know what happened in France [when eighth in the G1 Prix d'Ispahan May 22] last time out and have put a line through it."

As if the sheer talent of **Frankel (GB)** (Galileo {Ire}) wasn't enough for his opponents to deal with, the weekend news that Henry Cecil will receive a

knighthood just adds to the sense of destiny surrounding the appearance of Khalid Abdullah's colossus in today's G1 St James's Palace S. at Royal Ascot. At 4-11, it is hardly rocket science to predict his unbeaten record staying intact, and the manner of his performance in the Apr. 30 G1 2000 Guineas at Newmarket suggests any other scenario as virtually unthinkable. His trainer's four winners have spanned over 36 years, but none would give

greater pleasure to Warren Place and the assembled crowds if the favorite follows the script. "He's stronger and has done very well physically," Cecil stated on Friday in a message of foreboding to his rivals. "I'm very pleased with him and he's starting to grow up. He's got that very long stride, and when you are settling him in behind a horse, you have to take a little bit of a pull, but he's beginning to relax, so I've no intention of doing what I did at Newmarket. I've got a plan and it's not always easy to follow it, but hopefully it will work. He's very sensible in most ways, but he does want to get on with things, and I've had to bring him back carefully from the Guineas. He's hot-blooded, but that's him. In any Group 1, you've got to respect the opposition, and it's not going to be easy, but I'd love to see him win and carry on." Marco Botti is at the other end of the scale in training terms, but the fledgling conditioner has quickly emerged as a capable campaigner in the tradition of his esteemed family. In Giuliano Manfredini's **Excelebration (Ire)** (Exceed and Excel {Aus}), the Newmarket stable has a flourishing talent.

He came forward from a four-length beating by Frankel in the G3 Greenham S. at Newbury Apr. 16 to register a seven-length success in the G2 Mehl Mulhens-Rennen (German 2000 Guineas) at Cologne May 22. "I think he's in good shape and he's been working well," Botti told *PA Sport*. "Some of the horses have already won a Group 1 race--ours hasn't yet--but we will find out how good he is. We think he has improved a lot." **Dream Ahead** (Diktat {GB}) actually finished alongside Frankel at the top of the tree as a juvenile when the World Rankings were announced in January. That was mainly due to his highly impressive nine-length win in Newmarket's G1 Middle Park S. over six furlongs at the start of October, which followed a success in Deauville's G1 Prix Morny over the same trip in August. Only fifth behind Frankel in the G1 Dewhurst S. 15 days after his Middle Park romp, Khalifa Dasmal's colt is reappearing for the first time since that flop as the ground has been too fast up to now. "Dream Ahead has been working well, and I am very happy with him, but this will be his first run for a long time, and it might be that he could be a little ring rusty," trainer David Simcock said. **Wootton Bassett (GB)** (Iffraaj {GB}) was also a top-level winner at two, but his performance in Longchamp's seven-furlong G1 Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere on Arc day was marked by pillar-to-post speed, and he was undone by an extra furlong when subsequently fading into fifth in the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains back at track venue last time May 15. "It will be an interesting race, and if Frankel bowls away like he did at Newmarket, we might have to latch onto his tail," conditioner Richard Fahey commented. "He's in great order and was too fresh, and did everything wrong in France." Richard Hannon took this event 12 months ago with Canford Cliffs (Ire) (Tagula {Ire}) and relies on **Dubawi Gold (GB)** (Dubawi {Ire}), who was six-lengths runner-up in the 2000 Guineas and was considered unlucky to be in the same berth after the Irish equivalent at The Curragh three weeks later. "[Richard Hughes] has done a great job in getting Dubawi Gold to settle, and, while he should have won in Ireland, that is now history and it is the future that counts," Hannon commented. "He has improved since Frankel beat us at Newmarket, and, while I am not saying that we will reverse the form, I think we can finish closer this time and who knows, if he doesn't fire, we might even win." **Grand Prix Boss (Jpn)** (Sakura Bakushin O {Jpn}), who was champion 2-year-old in Japan, adds a fascinating dimension to this renewal after winning Tokyo's G1 NHK Mile Cup May 8 over subsequent G1 Yasuda Kinen up-ender Real Impact (Jpn) (Deep Impact {Jpn}).

Star Witness may not be in the Black Caviar league, but as the winner of the 2010 G1 Blue Diamond S. and G1 Coolmore Stud S. he fits into a category of Australian sprinters already successful four times in this since 2003. Trainer Danny O'Brien had begun to mastermind this plan before the 4-year-old's latest seventh placing in Flemington's G1 Newmarket H. Mar. 12, and he encounters a below-par crop of speedsters this season. "Coming to Ascot has been at the back of my mind ever since he won his second start, and we've been pretty conservative with him this season because of that," O'Brien commented. "He's only raced twice since Melbourne Cup week in November, and that has been by design, because I was thinking that the races that would really suit him were up here. When he ran in the Newmarket Handicap at Flemington last time, there was a Top Gear car rally next to the track, and like a lot of the horses, he got very worked up and he ran his race before he started. I've been over here before and got beaten, and didn't want to come back again unless I had one with a good chance. I think I've got one now."

If the form of August's G1 Nunthorpe S. is to be believed, **Star Witness** will have to be a better horse than **Starspangledbanner** (Aus) (Choisir {Aus}) to deal with the Irish hope **Sole Power**. The latter swept aside **Ballydoyle's** leading sprinter at 100-1 at York and showed that to be no fluke when beating some of this brigade in Haydock's G2 Temple S. last time May 21. Trainer **Eddie Lynam** is hoping the ground continues to dry after the latest downpour and will scratch the 4-year-old if "soft" features in the going description. "It's not looking too good at the moment," he told *PA Sport*. "He traveled over there last night, but they've had a good bit of rain and it's now good-to-soft. I'm hopeful it might dry out if they had a dry 24-30 hours. We'd love to run, but if the ground isn't genuinely good, we probably won't run." **Todd Pletcher's** first starter at this meeting is the smart **Bridgetown**, who warmed up with a second in the GIII Twin Spiers Turf Sprint at Churchill May 7. The trainer's assistant **Ginny de Pasquale** said last week, "Bridgetown is a trier. He'll give us his all, we just hope that's 110% and not just 99%, but we're looking forward to it. It's such a prestigious race and I think this, as well as **Wesley Ward's** recent successes at Royal Ascot, could open the door to this beautiful place for more Americans." Two smart British-trained fillies in the line-up are the **Ed McMahon** trainee **Astrophysical Jet** and **Swiss Diva** from the **David Elsworth** barn. The former took The Curragh's G3 Flying Five and Newbury's G3 World Trophy last summer, while **Lordship Stud's** **Swiss Diva** also registered a pair of Group 3 wins in Deauville's Prix de Meautry and Longchamp's Prix du Petit Couvert last term. **Astrophysical Jet** suffered a virus when unplaced in the G3 Palace House S. at Newmarket Apr. 30 and her conditioner is hoping she is back to her best. "I'm just hoping she's fully recovered from the virus she had at Newmarket," **McMahon** told *PA Sport*. "She never really disappoints at home, but it's only when you run them that it comes out. She seems to be pretty much as she was last year, but she might be a mid- to late-season filly rather than early on. She's coming back to herself, and we haven't got any other options at the moment."

☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ Power bids to provide Ballydoyle with a sixth renewal, having looked a class act in the making in two starts at The Curragh so far. Having won in professional manner in a decent six-furlong maiden on debut May 2, he gained the edge over the aptly-named Tough As Nails (Ire) (Dark Angel {Ire}) dropped back a panel in the May 21 Listed Marble Hill S and Aidan O'Brien sees this return to six furlongs as a positive. "We're happy with him and he's a big, strong, powerful horse," O'Brien said. "We think he's smart and we'll learn a lot more here. Class got him through the Marble Hill, as he looked on debut as if he might get seven, but we felt that going back to five would be a good sharpener for Ascot. He's probably going to progress as well." Barry Hills has sent out a trio of winners of this and is represented by the May 27 Haydock maiden scorer **Mezmaar**. Angus Gold, representing his owner Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum, commented, "From day one, Barry liked the horse a lot and, although he's not overly-big, he's from quite a small and fast family on the female side. I always imagined he'd prefer seven furlongs, but Barry thinks he's a good horse who has shown plenty of speed and he did win on debut over six. They've been pleased with him at home since and if we're lucky he'll be able to travel with them and have the class to get involved." Mick Channon won this 11 years ago and saddles **Gatepost**, who is unbeaten in two starts and impressed in a decent conditions race at York last time May 11. "An utter professional who has done nothing but thrive at home since his win at York," he commented. "He's done everything asked of him and there's no hiding place."

"Drawn 4, I have no idea if that's a positive, but the race is wide open and I expect the majority of trainers think their horse is a class act. I'm one of them. He's the marker and the one to beat." Godolphin rely on **Commissar**, who was purchased out of the Paul Cole yard following his impressive five-length success in a five-furlong maiden at Newmarket May 1. "Commissar won his maiden well when he made all of the running on a very windy day at Newmarket," his new trainer Mahmood Al Zarooni said. "His last piece of work went very well, and I think that he will run a really good race. He is very professional and is always relaxed in his work. We don't know how good he is at the moment, but we will have a better idea of his ability after Tuesday's race."

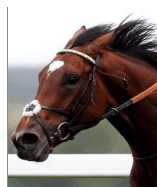

Frederick Engels ran into a hotpot in the filly Shumoos (Distorted Humor) when 4 1/2-lengths second to that **☆ "TDN Rising Star" ☆** in a five-furlong maiden at Haydock on debut May 28, but bounced out of that to record a quick time when beating **Es Que Love** by six lengths in a conditions event over that trip at Musselburgh 10 days ago. Provided this does not happen too soon, he sets the standard. Lowly Folkestone's much-publicised May 26 maiden which involved Wesley Ward's **Gentlemans Code** and subsequent winner **Bear Behind** could prove significant here and the latter's trainer Tom Dascombe said, "Bear Behind beat the American horse out of the gates there, but couldn't beat him at the line, so we'll see. He has improved since then and we hope he runs well."

Look for the **Ⓚ** throughout the TDN graded stakes entries, denoting Keeneland sales graduates. 

Delegator Heads Jubilee List...

Godolphin's **Delegator (GB)** (Dansili {GB}) yesterday featured among the 26 sprinters declared for Saturday's G1 Golden Jubilee S. at Royal Ascot and trainer Saeed bin Suroor is hoping that the 5-year-old can prove a force in this category. Dropped back to six furlongs for the first time when winning the May 11 G2 Duke of York S., the one-time **☆ "TDN Rising Star" ☆** and G1 2000 Guineas runner-up will be partnered by Mickael Barzalona, as Frankie Dettori is suspended. "I always believed he is a sprinter, as he showed plenty of speed in the morning," bin Suroor commented. "We gave him a chance at a mile, but he's not a miler really, and six furlongs is the best trip for him. He's in good form and came back from York well, where he was only 85%, so he's ready to go." Also in the field are a host of contenders in today's G1 King's Stand S. headed by **Star Witness (Aus)** (Starcraft {NZ}) and **Sole Power (GB)** (Kyllachy {GB}), while the 3-year-olds include Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum's 2010 G2 Coventry S. runner-up **Elzaam (Aus)** (Redoute's Choice {Aus}), Cheveley Park Stud's G1 Cheveley Park S. heroine **Hooray (GB)** (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) and Michael Tabor's G1 Phoenix S. winner **Zoffany (Ire)** (Dansili {GB}), who runs in today's G1 St James's Palace S.

Good Ground Possible For Day One...

Despite significant rain changing the going to good-to-soft, Clerk of the Course Chris Stickels was yesterday predicting that the straight course would revert to good on the straight track in time for today's opener. After 8.5 millimeters fell on the Berkshire venue on Sunday, he said, "Ideally we wouldn't have wanted that much, and the ground is on the slow side now, but it's better than watering and I would anticipate that by [Tuesday], it's good on the straight course. It will be a sunny day [Tuesday] and we might get a light shower on Wednesday, with more forecast on Thursday, Friday and Saturday, so it looks unsettled." Trainer Wesley Ward told *PA Sport*, "The rain certainly concerned me. I am staying at Ascot, and I had to have a couple of glasses of wine to settle me down. Fortunately, today it's been blue sky, there is a good bit of wind and it's a nice warm day. Maybe the rain will help. If we don't get any more rain it will add a touch to the ground."

Medication Summit cont.

Alex Waldrop noted that there is “amazing uniformity” in the regulations involving raceday administration of Lasix among the 38 jurisdictions that offer parimutuel Thoroughbred racing, and that some 97% of Thoroughbreds in the U.S. race on preventative doses of the bleeder medication. “No one knows for sure how many horses would bleed if not for the prophylactic administration of [Lasix],” he remarked. Offering a “snapshot of the American situation,” the NTRA executive outlined the most prevalent arguments surrounding the use of Lasix in treating Exercise Induced Pulmonary Hemorrhage. “While some say it is performance-enhancing, others term it performance-optimizing, and merely allows a horse to run true to its form,” Waldrop said. “While some say we need to get in step with the rest of the world [where race-day Lasix is banned], others believe we’ve got it right, and foreign jurisdictions should move toward adopting our policies.” The possibility of national legislation on raceday medication policies brought the issue to the forefront, but Greg Means--a D.C. lobbyist who has worked for the NTRA--said it is likely to be some time before the bill goes to the floor. “It’s hard to predict, but it is not expected to move any time in the near future,” Means said, but added that Thoroughbred racing would benefit by coming to a consensus on the issue. “A divided industry will have a much more difficult time achieving its goals,” he offered.

Pathology Report...

Monday morning’s session of the Summit included presentations by three equine veterinarians. Dr. Ed Robinson, a member of the College of Veterinary Medicine at Michigan State University and director of the Equine Pulmonary Laboratory who has studied noninfectious lung disease in horses for 30 years, led off with an overview of the cause and effects of EIPH. “When a horse runs, it pushes vast amounts of oxygen to the back of the lung,” he explained. “The blood vessels in the back of the lung are put under high stress and, as a result, the vessels are remodeled. They become thicker and, gradually, become obstructed.” Under this stress, the obstruction causes the capillaries to rupture, releasing blood into the airway. According to Dr. Robinson, horses consume 19 gallons of oxygen a minute when exercising at speed. Their heart rates increase to 220 beats per minute, and three pints of blood flows through the lungs per beat, equal to 75 gallons per minute.

“Close to 100%” of Thoroughbred racehorses will show evidence of EIPH during an endoscopic examination, Dr. Robinson stated, and the more starts a horse makes, the more likely it is to bleed. “It does affect performance,” he added. Lasix acts to reduce the pressure in the lungs, reducing the severity of the condition. “It has a direct dilating effect on pulmonary veins--it relaxes venous smooth muscle--and that relaxes the pressure on the capillaries,” Dr. Robinson remarked.

Dr. Robinson was followed by Dr. Steve Reed. A former professor at Ohio State University, he currently serves as an equine specialist at Rood and Riddle Equine Hospital in Lexington. Dr. Reed spoke on the topic of the management and treatment of EIPH. Referencing results of the South African study released in 2009, he said that Lasix reduced EIPH by up to 50%. In the study, 79% of the horses that received a placebo showed signs of bleeding, with several at the highest levels of Grade 3 and 4. Fifty-five percent of horses that were treated with Lasix still were found to have bled, but none higher than a Grade 2. “[Lasix] did not cure [EIPH], but it certainly did reduce it,” Dr. Reed remarked.

Dr. Reed also touched on other treatments in use, such as coagulant medications, including premarin and aminocaproic acid (Amicar), and the capillary stabilizer carbazochrome, which are not as tightly regulated and are not approved for raceday use in all states; as well as therapies using Vitamin K and platelet rich plasma.

There have been mixed reviews on the effectiveness of the various adjunct medications, but both Dr. Robinson and Dr. Reed agreed that nasal strips had been demonstrated to alleviate bleeding to a degree. “They have been shown to affect favorable changes on the pressure [that contributes to EIPH],” Dr. Robinson said. “That reduces the magnitude of the hemorrhaging.”

The final member of the trio to speak was Dr. Rick Sams, the director of the HFL Sport Science Inc. laboratory, the official lab of the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission. Dr. Sams addressed the issue of Lasix acting as a masking agent for banned medications.

Medication Summit cont.

Dr. Sams gave a brief history of Lasix, from its approval for use in humans in the early 1960s to its approval for equine medicine in 1967. First tabbed as a treatment for equine edema, it gained widespread popularity in treating EIPH in the 1970s, but with little oversight. In 1983, there was an outcry for a prohibition against Lasix use, but the American Association of Equine Practitioners came up with a standard that was accepted by the industry, recommending that Lasix be administered intravenously and at a time four hours prior to a race.

According to Dr. Sams, this practice alleviated the concern that Lasix affects the detectability of other medications. “[Lasix] does have the ability to dilute hundreds of water-soluble substances in the urine sample, but, four to five hours after administration, [the detectability] has returned to normal values,” he explained, adding, “That concern is largely eliminated when [Lasix] is administered in a tightly controlled environment, as it is in the United States.”

Dr. Sams also indicated that, while inside that four-hour window, Lasix could have a profound effect on detecting other medications in the urine sample, its impact on blood samples was “negligible.” He concluded, “I don’t refer to [Lasix] as a masking agent. Its impact on post-race testing is not very significant.”

The International Perspective...

Bill Nader traveled all the way from Hong Kong to take part in the Summit. The executive director of the Hong Kong Jockey Club since 2007, he arrived in New York Saturday afternoon, in time to watch the GI Belmont S. with his sons, albeit on TV. Nader brought a unique perspective to the issue of Lasix. He

was senior vice president and chief operating officer at the New York Racing Association during the period when New York became the last racing jurisdiction to allow its use on race day, but now oversees operations where Lasix is prohibited not only on raceday, but for training as well.

Speaking during the lunch break, Nader stressed the “fundamental importance of public perception and confidence.” He said, “In Hong

Kong, there is no compromise or breach in integrity. We believe in transparency--there is a wealth of material made available [to the public] on our website, all free--and we strive to build and maintain customer confidence.”

He added that, while he once may have shared the American view on Lasix, his attitude has changed since he joined the HKJC.

“We may not have cared about the rules and regulations in other jurisdictions in the past, but that view is now changing,” he said. “That’s why we are here.

“Going to Hong Kong changed my opinion,” he continued. “You see a jurisdiction where Lasix is not allowed on raceday, it’s not allowed in training--there’s no Lasix at all. It’s an eye-opening experience, to see the quality and competition at a very high standard. It’s a different world, a different approach, and it erased the preconceived opinion I had [about Lasix].”

To Be Continued...

The Summit continued into the afternoon, with a panel of regulators, a panel of trainers and a panel of veterinarians (details in tomorrow’s *TDN*). As expected there were no conclusions drawn. There will be a series of closed-door discussions today. “We’re going to roll up our sleeves and do the hard work now,” said Dr. Robert Lewis, the chairman of the Racing Medication and Testing Consortium who served as a moderator. “We are going to work through what we learned today, and what we already know, and try to find some answers.”

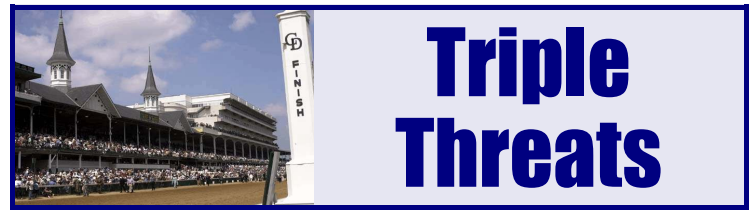

RACETRACK Round-Up

Bind Injured; Possibly Done for Year...

Claiborne Farm and Adele Dilschneider's **Bind** (Pulpit), tabbed a ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ after an eye-catching victory on debut at Fair Grounds earlier in the year and more recently second in a Churchill allowance on Kentucky Derby day, exited a work Monday with an injury and might be sidelined for the remainder of the year. "He worked like a champ," said trainer Al Stall, Jr. "He worked like his normal self. He looked like a gazelle running down the lane, but he didn't cool out properly, and there it was." Stall said Bind suffered a condylar fracture in his right front leg during a four-furlong drill over Keeneland's Polytrack yesterday, meant to be his final work before an anticipated start in Saturday's GIII Mat Winn S. at Churchill Downs. The 3-year-old colt covered the distance in :49.60 under exercise rider Jerry O'Dwyer. Bind was transported to Rood & Riddle Equine Hospital, where he was scheduled to undergo surgery. Stall said there was a good chance the injury is not career-threatening. "It's non-displaced, clean, there's no trash," Stall said. "It's a kick in the teeth right off the bat on a Monday morning, but that's just how it goes." Stall said the colt would require at least four months on the sidelines, but that he could return to action at Fair Grounds in early 2012.

In other Matt Winn news, George Bolton, Stonestreet Stables and Spendthrift Farm's **Dominus** (Smart Strike) has been listed as "possible" for the 1 1/16-mile race for 3-year-olds despite battling a foot problem. The dark bay, a 5 1/4-length winner in his second start at Santa Anita in March, was just tagged by ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ Machen (Distorted Humor) in the dying strides of the GIII Derby Trial S. at Churchill Apr. 30. Trainer Steve Asmussen said he hopes the foot issue will clear in time for Saturday's race.

Asmussen's other Matt Winn hopeful, GI Preakness S. third **Astrology** (A.P. Indy), breezed six furlongs in company with stablemate Brock (Distorted Humor) in 1:13.20. Iron Horse Racing LLC's **Alstom** (Silver Train), probable for the Matt Winn, worked a sharp five furlongs yesterday in :47.40, earning the D. Wayne Lukas-trained colt the bullet for 54 workers at the distance.

Apart Works for Foster...

Adele Dilschneider's **Apart** (Flatter) will try to assuage his connections' disappointment in Saturday's GI Stephen Foster at Churchill after the news stablemate Bind (Pulpit) is likely done for the season. To that end, the 4-year-old worked yesterday at Keeneland, sailing through four panels in :48.40 over the Poly, the second-fastest move of eight at the distance. Exercise rider Jerry O'Dwyer was in the irons. "Apart is on target," Stall said of the homebred, who is coming off a victory in the GIII William Donald Schaefer Jr. Memorial on the Preakness undercard. "I think he's an improving horse. That's what he's got going for him. He's a Grade II, Grade III type of winner, and we just feel like he's going to get better with time. It's nothing we're doing. It's just something Mother Nature will take care of, hopefully." Others slated for the Stephen Foster include **Crown of Thorns** (Repent), **Duke of Mischief** (Graeme Hall), **Equestrio** (Elusive Quality), **Flat Out** (Flatter), **Gladding** (Sarava), **Giant Oak** (Giant's Causeway), **Mission Impazible** (Unbridled's Song), **Pool Play** (Silver Deputy) and **Regal Ransom** (Distorted Humor).

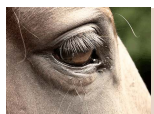

No-one could deny that American racing owes a significant debt to geldings such as Kelso, Forego and John Henry. Unlike the top-class entire colts which tend to be rushed off to stud, these three superstars stuck around long enough to achieve 10 Horse of the Year titles between them.

Kelso and John Henry, respectively veterans of 63 and 83 appearances, both made their last starts at the age of nine, while Forego was eight when he lined up for the last of his 57 appearances. In the process these magnificent performers took on the status of old friends to legions of admirers, at the same time acting as wonderful ambassadors for the sport of horse racing. They arguably played a similar role to the courageous and durable geldings which make jump racing so popular with the British and Irish horse-racing communities.

But is there a place for geldings in the Triple Crown races? Fans of such as Funny Cide, Mine That Bird, Prairie Bayou, Crème Fraiche and Ruler On Ice will no do doubt argue that there is--that these Triple Crown events should be won by the leaders of their generation, no matter whether they are colts or geldings. Pedigree Insights cont.

Forgive me if I sound like a dinosaur, but I much prefer the European system, whereby geldings are ineligible for the 3-year-old Group 1 classics. In fact, geldings weren't allowed to contest any Group 1 races in Britain until 1986. I am generally not a fan of human intervention, whether it be drugs to make a horse sounder or surgery to correct breathing defects. Neither, in the long term, is good for the breed. Nor, in my opinion, is it good to see colts denied their moment of glory by any horse whose temperament, presumably, was unsatisfactory enough to demand that he be castrated.

The question has to be asked: would these geldings have won at such a high level had they been left entire? British racing once had a long love affair with a gelding called Boldboy, who raced until he was nine. Although the gelded Boldboy was undoubtedly a thoroughly determined individual, with ability worthy of a Group 1 winner, some of his behaviour as an entire juvenile suggested that his temperament would probably have stopped him fulfilling his potential.

As a grandson of Fusaichi Pegasus, Ruler On Ice could be forgiven for having a less-than-perfect temperament. When I last wrote about the Belmont winner's sire Roman Ruler in this column, I reminded readers that when Nuno Santos was asked to name the most difficult horse he had dealt with, he opted for none other than Fusaichi Pegasus.

"He was a powerful horse," Santos explained. "He loved to rear up, he would refuse to go to the track. Just a headache..."

In those notes I also mentioned that Roman Ruler's figures for his first four seasons read 197 mares in 2006, followed by a second book of 112, a third book of 62 and a fourth book of only 37 mares.

That book of 37 came months before Roman Ruler's first juveniles caught the eye in 2009. Thanks largely to

In September 2009 Rob Whiteley contributed an invaluable op/ed column to *TDN* entitled "Older Can Be Better." Perhaps the Liberation Farm supremo was thinking partly of his Saratoga Six mare Champagne Glow. Having failed to produce a graded performer among her first ten named foals, Champagne Glow produced a Medaglia d'Oro filly at the age of 19 in 2007. That filly, Champagne d'Oro, became a Grade I winner in last year's TVG Acorn S. and now Champagne Glow's next foal, Ruler On Ice, has become her second Grade I winner .

The perseverance shown with Champagne Glow reflects the fact that she had been a talented performer--runner-up to Meadow Star in the GI Frizette S. in 1990--and comes from a successful family. Ruler On Ice's second dam, Champagne Ginny, won the GIII Biling Springs S. over 1 1/16 miles on turf and went on to produce stakes winners to four different stallions.

Two of her sons scored at Grade I level, with her Alleged colt Jurado taking the Premio Vittorio di Capua over a mile in Italy and her Fappiano colt Grand Canyon ranking second to Rhythm among the American juveniles of 1989. Grand Canyon was runner-up in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile, with this fine effort sandwiched between Grade I wins in the Norfolk S. and Hollywood Futurity. He was installed as winter favourite for the Kentucky Derby but injury kept him out of the Triple Crown events and he eventually succumbed to laminitis.

Ruler On Ice clearly stays well by American standards, thanks to the presence in his pedigree of such as Fusaichi Pegasus, Alydar, Priceless Fame (a sister to the Kentucky Derby and Belmont winner Bold Forbes) and L'Enjoleur (Queen's Plate and Prince of Wales S., the latter over 1 3/8 miles).

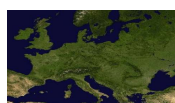
