'CLIFFS' ON TOP

Yesterday's G1 Queen Anne S. was billed as a two-horse race and that's how it turned out, with the Heffer Syndicate, Michael Tabor and Derrick Smith's **Canford Cliffs (Ire)** (Tagula {Ire}) prevailing ahead of **Goldikova (Ire)** (Anabaa) in a thrilling renewal. Having lost favoritism to the Wertheimers' champion in the final seconds

prior to this match, the 11-8 shot was always traveling strongly in her slipstream as the pair followed the strong early tempo. Ousting last year's heroine and the 5-4 market leader with 100 yards remaining, the bay asserted to win by a length under Richard Hughes. "I have told everyone he's the best horse I've ever ridden and I'm sure he can beat whatever is put in front of him," Hughes enthused. **Cont. p2-3**

BOW TO HIM

Peerless in the 2000 Guineas, **Frankel (GB)** (Galileo {Ire}) offered slightly more hope to his rivals in yesterday's G1 St James's Palace S., but was still in command where it mattered to complete the notable double under Tom Queally. At 3-10, Khalid Abdullah's unbeaten colt was sent off the shortest-priced favorite since Tudor Minstrel (GB) in 1947 and, after being settled in initially, was asked to lengthen passing halfway. Taking over from his pacemaker **Rerouted** (Stormy

Atlantic) on the turn, he was once again left to chart his own passage up the straight as **Zoffany (Ire)** (Dansili {GB}) closed the margin down to 3/4 of a length. Frankel's win was a first in this race for his owner-breeder and a fourth for his trainer Sir Henry Cecil, who now has 73 Royal Ascot triumphs to his name. "Tom said he was very idle in the end, which is good as we can ride a race on him now," the recently knighted patron of Warren Place said. "Now he's getting wiser, he thought he'd done enough like he did in the Guineas. Tom said he wasn't at all tired." **Cont. p3-4**

NO NEED TO 'THINK'

By now, the whole world knows all about **So You Think (NZ)** (High Chaparral {Ire}), and the Australian champion dominates the second day of Royal Ascot as he takes in the G1 Prince of Wales's S. Formerly a Group 2, this race has quickly been re-invented as one of the international stage's premier events, and the new Ballydoyle incumbent would sit easy alongside the names of Dubai Millennium (GB), Nayef, Rakti (GB), Azamour (Ire), Oujja Board (GB), Duke of Marmalade (Ire) and Manduro (Ger) on the honor roll. Like the fellow Aidan O'Brien trainee Duke of Marmalade, **So You Think** collected the G1 Tattersalls Gold Cup in facile fashion en route. While he faces stiffer competition than in that May 22 Curragh contest, his trainer's confidence shines through. "He has had two easy runs and we had just been playing with him at home for them," O'Brien said. "This is another jump up, with more serious contenders to run against, so his work has stepped up a little more seriously since, and it will be interesting to see how he goes. He's a big cruiser, so it's hard to say what his exact trip is, but you wouldn't be afraid to run him over a mile on what we've seen at home." **Cont. p12-13**

Canford Cliffs registered a six-length success in the G2 Coventry S. over six furlongs here in 2009 and had stamina to prove as he entered the fray for the following year's Classics. In the event, the son of the speedy Tagula saw out the mile of the G1 2000 Guineas adequately when third at Newmarket before taking the Irish equivalent in impressive style at The Curragh three weeks later. His success in the G1 St James's Palace S. at the last Royal meeting was followed by a mid-summer break, and he returned to put Rip Van Winkle (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) in his place in Glorious Goodwood's feature G1 Sussex S. in August.

He missed this track's G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. after scoping badly in September, and an interest was sold to Michael Tabor and Derrick Smith. He justified that decision when returning to best Worthadd (Ire) (Dubawi {Ire}) in the G1 Lockinge S. at Newbury last time May 14. Moving with his customary gusto in rear early as Goldikova followed the pace cut out by her pacemaker Flash Dance (Ire) (Zamindar) and the aggressively ridden Cape Blanco (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}), he was hot on her heels as she moved to take over inside the final quarter. With Olivier Peslier--who rode two pounds overweight--hard at work to shake off his attentions passing the furlong pole, the writing was on the wall for the supermare, and Canford Cliffs was firmly on top at the line as Goldikova kept putting up her typical game effort. "Olivier rode a terrific cat-and-mouse race, as I wasn't going to kick until he did, and the quickest part of the race was the final two furlongs," Richard Hughes commented. "Ideally, I wanted to be right behind her and, luckily, I ended up in her slipstream. I have been confident about this horse since the first day I sat on him. He is amazing." Richard Hannon added, "Goldikova is obviously a brilliant mare, but he's a very good horse, so we had to take her on. It was the perfect race with two good pacemakers, and he has a real cruising speed and can quicken. He's a very special horse to us--these ones don't come along every day." That trainer's son and assistant Richard Hannon Jr. added, "He is probably the horse of a lifetime, and while Goldikova is becoming a legend already, maybe he is going the same way. He seems near unbeatable at a mile. My view is if it isn't broken, don't fix it, but we'll discuss plans with the owners. The G1 Sussex S. [at Goodwood July 27] is there and later on there is the Breeders' Cup, Japan and Hong Kong, so we'll pick our way." Goldikova's trainer Freddy Head was magnanimous in defeat after witnessing the crowd's applause on her return to the runner's-up spot. "I am very happy with her, as she has run a great race, but there is nothing I can say other than she was beaten by a better horse on the day," Head said. "He had a lovely run and followed us through and, as I've said before, this mile is tough, and is maybe a bit too far for her. These people know their horses and are very fond of champions, so it was a thrill to see their reaction to her afterwards. I think she's run a top race and is as good as ever, so we will follow the same path, and head to Deauville in August, and then try and win a fourth Breeders' Cup Mile." **Cont. p3**

Bred in Ireland, Canford Cliffs is a great-grandson of the U.S.-based stallion Stop the Music, and hails from an American female family as well. His third dam Triple Tipple (Raise a Cup) began her racing career in Europe before returning home to secure the GII Wilshire H. and GIII Palomar H., and also was runner-up Sabin in the GI Gamely H. for trainer Richard Cross. Canford Cliffs, in whom an interest was sold last season to Michael Tabor and Derrick Smith, has a 2-year-old half-brother by Holy Roman Emperor (Ire) named Mayo Lad (Ire). That bay colt, sold for 100,000gns to Peter Doyle Bloodstock as a yearling at Tattersalls October, has joined his accomplished brother with trainer Richard Hannon. Their dam Mrs Marsh produced an Excellent Art (GB) colt last February.

Already exciting before he came here for the G2 Royal Lodge S. in September, Frankel ignited the blue touchpaper in that track-and-trip contest when delivering a stellar performance to win by 10 lengths. His mid-race move on the turn set him apart and, after come-from-behind wins in Newmarket's G1 Dewhurst S. in October and Newbury's G3 Greenham S. on his return Apr. 16, waiting tactics were dispensed with a fortnight later.

It's in our blood



His monstrous effort in the Newmarket Classic led to an exchange of opinions as to the long-term effect of such forcing tactics, and Cecil was keen to take a step back with the hot-blooded star of the Juddmonte operation. Whereas Rerouted was not quick enough to lead him in the Guineas, this time Michael Hills was away and gone on the pacemaker as Tom Queally restrained Frankel in fourth tracking the peloton's leader **Grand Prix Boss (Jpn)** (Sakura Bakushin O {Jpn}). Pushed past that runner with five furlongs still remaining, Frankel immediately began opening up as his rivals punched the panic button in behind. Within a furlong and a half he was in front and, although the final eighth seemed agonisingly long as Zoffany closed in under Ryan Moore, he had already inflicted the damage. "He jumped a little bit slow and settled better than ever, so I was in a tricky position as no one was inclined to follow Michael [Hills]," Queally said. "I thought I'd draw sooner rather than later, and he was running for a long way and was getting fed up in front, as he does it so easy. He's growing up all the time and he's more versatile than people think--he doesn't have to jump and run, and we've got options regarding tactics. He's still the one to beat at the moment."

For Cecil, the relaxed nature his star colt exuded yesterday means that he can ponder alternative targets now. "He settled very well today and the pacemaker went off quite fast, so Tom had to ask him to take it up," Cecil commented. "The plan was to do what he did in the Royal Lodge again and go just before the bend. He sprinted away, and the further he went, the better. Now I don't have to make as much use of him, and as he settles, he could go a mile and a quarter for the G1 Juddmonte International [at York Aug. 17], or stay at a mile for the G1 Sussex S. [at Goodwood July 27], but we'll

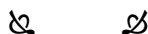

see. It's too soon after the race." Zoffany's trainer Aidan O'Brien said, "Our horse has got a lot of speed, but he'd never raced beyond seven furlongs, and we'll have to stick to a mile now. We'll look at the Sussex." Marco Botti, whose Excelebration was closer to Frankel than in the Greenham, commented, "We closed the gap on him from Newbury, and [jockey] Adam Kirby said he stumbled coming out of the stalls and lost a length. Dubawi Gold (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}) hampered us, but there are no excuses. He has proven he's a Group 1 horse, and we're in no hurry to take on the older horses. He'll probably have a summer break and come back for a campaign in the second half."

Not Just Any Kind...

Juddmonte homebred Frankel represents the highly successful cross of Galileo (Ire) over Danehill mares; this year alone, other runners bred on that pattern include Classic winners Golden Lilac (Ire) and Roderic O'Connor (Ire). The unbeaten colt is out of the successful sprinter Kind, whose half-brother Powerscourt (GB) (Sadler's Wells) was at his best over 10 furlongs and beyond. Kind's first foal was last year's G3 Lingfield Derby Trial winner Bullet Train (GB) (Sadler's Wells). Her 2-year-old Galileo colt, named Noble Mission (GB), is in training with Henry Cecil. The mare has a yearling colt by Oasis Dream (GB) and, after producing a filly by that Banstead Manor stallion in April, was bred back to Galileo May 15 and is believed to be in foal.

Prohibit, a product of the Juddmonte operation and acquired by current connections for a now-bargain 85,000gns at Tattersalls' 2009 edition of the Autumn Horses-in-Training Sale, made a belated first

pattern-race start when hitting the board in the Sept. 18 G3 World Trophy at Newbury, and ran with credit when a close sixth in the G1 Prix de l'Abbaye at Longchamp in last season's finale next time Oct. 3. Sent to Dubai in the spring, the hardened campaigner bettered an eighth in Meydan's Feb. 3 G3 Al Shindagha Sprint by garnering a turf

handicap back there one week later. He finished off the board, but within three lengths, in both a Mar. 3 conditions event and the Mar. 26 G3 Al Quoz Sprint. His European return was not spectacular, but the bay finished close up when ninth in the Apr. 30 G3 Palace House S. at Newmarket and fourth in the May 15 G3 Prix de Saint-Georges back at Longchamp. Prohibit's form continued on an upward curve when he hit the board in the G2 Temple S. in his penultimate start May 21, and finished a head second to Wizz Kid (Ire) (Whipper) in the G2 Prix du Gros-Chene last time June 5. He raced in the open behind furious early fractions after a sharp break here, but came under pressure at halfway in this stiff dash. However, he was unrelenting under a final-quarter drive and pounced late to break the 60-second barrier, denying Australia's Star Witness, Hong Kong's Sweet Sanette, Hungary's Overdose (GB) (Starborough {GB}) and Germany's War Artist (Aus) (Orpen), who led home the remainder of an eight-nation cast. Prohibit's victory provided Robert Cowell with a first Group 1 success. The Newmarket conditioner was overcome with emotion in the immediate aftermath, saying, "I can't believe this has just happened to me, and I am overwhelmed. I am so proud because I get a lot of flak from some quarters for running him so often, but he thrives on his racing. It takes nothing out of him, and he's a game, game horse. It is the best day of my racing life, without a shadow of doubt, and I am so pleased for everybody associated with the horse."

Philosophical in defeat, Danny O'Brien, trainer of Star Witness, nonetheless looked to the future. He told *PA Sport*, "He didn't have anything to tow him into the race, but he kept on going strongly, and [jockey] Steven Arnold said that things didn't exactly go to plan. We had hoped to run him twice over here, and he's now blown away a few cobwebs. He'll either run on Saturday [in the G1 Golden Jubilee S.] or in the [G1] July Cup [at Newmarket July 9]. He's run well without winning, so we'll certainly look at Saturday." Tony Millard, trainer of the third Sweet Sanette, added, "She's not an easy filly to ride and she's got many tricks up her sleeve. [Jockey] Jamie [Spencer] said he was going so well that it was difficult to hold her back. When he went clear, he thought he had the race sown up, but Prohibit got up. I think she's a real [G1] Nunthorpe [S. at York Aug. 19] type, but I've got to speak to the owners, as the race is six weeks away, and I'm not sure they want her to stay that long." **Click for the [Racing Post chart](#), the [brisnet.com PPs](#) or the [free brisnet.com catalogue-style pedigree](#). BREEDING ANALYSIS - PROHIBIT

Oasis Dream finished third in this race in 2003 before establishing himself as leading sprinter following clear cut victories in the G1 July Cup and G1 Nunthorpe S. Today, the Banstead Manor Stud incumbent is regarded as one of Britain's leading sires and rightly so, since Prohibit is the stallion's eighth Group 1 winner from five crops of racing age. The son of Green Desert is also a remarkably versatile stallion; at the other end of the distance spectrum to Prohibit is the brilliant middle-distance filly Midday (GB). Prohibit was bred by Juddmonte Farms and sold by the operation to Robert Cowell for 85,000gns (*US\$146,602*) at the 2009 Tattersalls Autumn Horses in Training Sale. He is one of three stakes winners out of the Group 2-placed Well Warned (GB) (Warning {GB})--a sister to Grade III winner Out Of Reach (GB)--following the listed-winning pair Emergency (GB) (Dr Fong) and Prior Warning (GB) (Barathea {Ire}).

In mid-division early in this cavalry charge, the bay was starting to work from some way out, but kept finding for Ryan Moore's urgings and had ground his way into contention by the final furlong. Gaining the edge over Roman Soldier in the final 100 yards, he rolled across near the end of the war of attrition and, ultimately, had to survive a stewards' enquiry to provide Ballydoyle with a sixth renewal." Ryan gave him a great ride, and he's a tough horse who fought hard," Aidan O'Brien said. "He's a progressive, hardy horse who looked as if he would definitely get more than six today. Slowly away when beaten three lengths by tomorrow's G2 Norfolk S. contender Bapak Chinta (Speightstown) in a Hamilton maiden on debut May 13, Frederick Engels' bad luck continued when catching a tartar and finishing a 4 1/2-length runner-up to ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ and today's G2 Queen Mary S. hotpot Shumoos (Distorted Humor) in a similar event at Haydock May 28. However, the bay made no mistake next time, registering a quick time and strolling home by six lengths in a hot conditions race at Musselburgh last time June 4, after which he was acquired by his new owner. The eventual winner raced in midfield on the stands' side rail--as American raider Gentleman's Code (Proud Accolade) united the field with his blinding early pace--but was shoved along at halfway. Picking up well between horses to take over with 150 yards to race, he ran on strongly to claim a personal best and register a first Royal-meet winner for trainer David Brown. "I've had a lot of good horses as an owner, and then I started training when I retired three or four years ago," Brown told *PA Sport*. "We have a great training facility and, if you couldn't train horses there, you couldn't train them anywhere. We haven't got a lot of horses and there are just four staff and me. All the lads were up at 4 a.m. this morning to do all the rest of the work. We'll probably have a party tonight or, if not tonight, tomorrow. I thought he might win, but I just dare not say it. He has been working like that at home, and we didn't think he'd get beaten in his first two runs, but he was very green. He still is a bit. [Jockey] Johnny [Murtagh] says he's a proper horse and he'll go further, so we'll probably look at the [G2] July S. [at Newmarket July 7] over six furlongs next."



FREDERICK ENGELS - BREEDING ANALYSIS

The colt is the second stakes winner within the past seven days for Cheveley Park Stud's late Iceman (GB) (Polar Falcon), who enjoyed his finest moment at this meeting in 2004 when successful in the Coventry S. He left behind just two crops, and was represented by his first winner at stakes level only last Thursday when Djarvo (GB) won the Listed Prix La Fleche at Maisons-Laffitte. Bred in Britain by Peter Baldwin, Frederick Engels is the first Northern Hemisphere stakes winner out of a mare by 1994 Derby third Colonel Collins. He is one of three winners out of Colonel's Daughter (GB), a placed half-sister to the tough Grade III winner Shuffling Kid (GB) (Rock City {Ire}). In third was Caspar Netscher, who becomes a third stakes performer for Iceman's former stud-mate and first-season sire Dutch Art (GB) (Medicean {GB}).

Fallon was due to partner **Veiled (GB)** (Sadler's Wells) in the marathon Ascot H. at yesterday's Royal Ascot meet, and she compounded his misery by taking the £50,000 contest in the hands of substitute rider Eddie Ahern. "Kieren Fallon missed today at Royal Ascot--no dramas," Fallon's agent, Terry Norman, wrote on *Twitter*. "He jarred his neck this morning and has been advised to have physiotherapy to avoid making it worse. It's just a precaution, and he will be back Wednesday."

What a Day at Royal Ascot!

Royal Ascot is located 60 minutes west of London and the ride throughout the countryside is beautiful. Upon the arrival to small town of Ascot, you see the

massive structure of the grandstand of Royal Ascot. Thanks to Queen Anne's vision in 1711, this year's meet is the 300th anniversary of Royal Ascot.

From the time you pass through the turnstiles, you see class, beauty and royalty. Everyone was dressed extremely well, with the ladies wearing dresses and hats (all shapes, colors and styles) while the men sport the traditional morning suit with tails. Everyone was drinking champagne (50,000 bottles served last year) along with eating loads of smoked salmon, fresh prawns and crab meet.

At approximately 1:00 p.m., Mike Smith, the jockey for one of our horses, Gentlemans Code, arrives and walks the racecourse. For this jockey with 4,995 career victories, this is his first day at Royal Ascot.

Unfortunately, it rained very hard on Sunday and, while Monday was a dry and sunny day, the ground is going to be soft. Wesley Ward's horses prefer a firm course, while the European horses prefer the softer going.

At 1:45, we began to see the royal precession with teams of horses trotting up the racecourse and passing in front of the very long grandstand. As you would expect, the crowd was very happy to see the Queen, cheering and clapping accordingly.

As the Queen passes the finish wire, the precession continues through the tunnel under the grandstand into the parade ring (a viewing walking ring where jockeys take their mounts) where the royal family exits their horse drawn carriages. Not to slight any of the Royal family, Prince Charles and Camilla exited the second carriage and accompanied the Queen as she unveiled a new horse statue in the parade ring area to commemorate the achievement of Ascot's greatest equine legend, the four time Gold Cup winner Yeats. The Queen views the horses in the first race and proceeds to her royal viewing box.

The quality of horses, trainers and owners are among the finest in Europe, if not the world. Horses on the card include Goldikova, Canford Cliffs, Frankel, as well as up-and-coming two-year-olds.

The pre-race communication with racetrack management has been first class from my first email two-weeks-ago to our arrival. We were placed in a private box on the sixth floor of the grandstand, filled with food, champagne and excellent service.

No fewer than 10 nations will be represented at this year's five-day meet.

Six races were contested today, with four of the six raced on a straight turf track. First post was at 2:30 p.m. The day begins with a slight upset as Goldikova was beaten by Canford Cliffs. The race was a one mile straight, with slight inclines on the course. Truly impressive and unique. The camera work was terrific (needed to be) as horses start a far distance from the viewing grandstand.

As we get closer to our first starter (Italo) of the day, the 4th race, the Coventry S., a Group 2 race for two-year-olds going six furlongs, I continue to realize how special and unique Royal Ascot is. By all accounts, just to have a horse to start here, let alone win is an accomplishment to most. That said, we didn't come all this way just to drink champagne.

Italo has post 14 in a 23-horse field (yes 23 horses) and went off at approximate odds of 16-1. With U.S. Jockey Jeffrey Sanchez up, Italo broke decent from the gate in the middle of the pack, leading through 2 1/2 furlongs only to come to a walk in the final stages and finish last. Yes, last in a field of 23. Welcome to England!!! I don't think it was a good first impression for her Majesty or the Royal family.

After such a defeat, we needed to return to our box for some hydration and time to collect our composure. We still have another runner today, Gentlemans Code in the last race of the day--the Windsor Castle S.--going five furlongs with a field of 27 starters (yes - 27). With Mike Smith aboard, he is third choice on track at 8-1. Breaking from the middle of the pack, he takes the lead quickly and continues in the middle of the track, while other horses are on the rail. It is very unique to see 27 horses break from the starting gate and racing straight for five furlongs. Gentlemans Code starts to edge towards other runners on the rail, is holding well thru 3 1/2 furlongs, but is pressed and gives way to eventual winner and race favorite Frederick Engels. Gentlemans Code fought gamely to finish fourth, beaten just a bit for second. Mike Smith told me that maybe he should have used a different strategy when he got the lead, trying to move closer to the rail with the favorite, but that is European style racing. The final time was just a tick off the track record, and considering the softer going, he ran a nice race.

In a most impressive displays of pageantry and tradition, at the conclusion of the final race winners circle presentation, all race fans are invited to join the traditional singing around the bandstand adjacent to the Parade Ring. Thousands of people joined together and sang 20 songs, such as "When The Saints Go Marching In," "My Bonnie Lies Over The Ocean," "New York, New York," "Hey Jude" and "The National Anthem," just to list a few. It was amazing.

Undoubtedly, today was one day that we will never forget as a family and as race fans. It had it all--great weather, great horses, great trainers, great jockeys great fans, great food and drink--and the icing on the cake, the presence of members of the Royal family and the QUEEN herself.

Despite not having the race results we wanted and our trainer Wesley Ward going home disappointed with his results, we can't wait to make the journey to Royal Ascot on Thursday to do it all over again. We will have Everyday Dave racing in the Norfolk Stakes.

The forecast predicts rain, but we are hoping that the weatherman has the same results that we had today. As is the case with such elite events like the Kentucky Derby in Louisville, the Prix D'Amérique in Paris or the Elitlopp in Sweden, anyone who is a lover of horse racing or is a racetrack operator or administrator, must add Royal Ascot as a place to visit.

JUVENILE SPRINT ADDED TO BC PROGRAM

(Edited press release) The Breeders' Cup announced Tuesday that a new race, the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Sprint, has been added to the Breeders' Cup World Championships beginning this year at Churchill Downs. The Breeders' Cup Juvenile Sprint will be run as a six-

furlong race, open to 2-year-old colts, geldings and fillies, and will be contested on the main track for a purse of \$500,000. The new race will have a maximum of 14 starters. The Breeders' Cup Juvenile Sprint becomes the 15th race of the two-day, \$26-million Breeders' Cup World

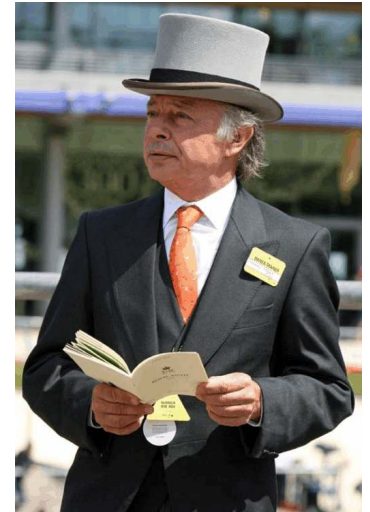
Championships, which will be held Nov. 4-5. The new race will be run on Friday, Nov. 4. The creation of Juvenile Sprint was developed through the combined efforts of Breeders' Cup Wagering Committee--chaired by David Willmot--and the Breeders' Cup Racing and Nominations Committee, chaired by Clem Murphy. "Our goal in the Wagering Committee focused on creating a Breeders' Cup race that would generate not only betting interest for the public, but also provide an additional opportunity for the two year old crop from which our owners and breeders could benefit," said Willmot. "A six-furlong sprint race for Juveniles has the potential to provide highly competitive fields in this new division." Murphy commented: "In discussions with horsemen on selecting a new race, an overwhelming majority requested that we add a Juvenile Sprint to the Championships program. There are a number of talented 2-year-old sprinters around the world who are not suited or may not be ready to run the two turns at 1 1/16 miles of the Juvenile or Juvenile Fillies in early November. The Juvenile Sprint provides horsemen with an alternative." This is the first expansion of the World Championships program since 2008, when the number of races was increased from 11 to 14 for the 25th running at Santa Anita Park. Total purses for the two-day Championships this year will remain at \$26 million, which includes purses for the undercard races on both days. The purse of this year's Sentient Jet Breeders' Cup Sprint will be \$1.5 million. It was contested at a \$2 million purse in 2010.

COOLMORE: A GOOD DAY AT THE OFFICE

The Coolmore legions had good reason to be satisfied with the results from Ascot's opening day yesterday: they had bought into **Canford Cliffs** (Tagula) at the end of last year, which looked a pretty smart move after he stopped the 6-year-old wonder mare **Goldikova** (Anabaa) from notching her 14th Group 1/Grade I win in the meet's opening race--the G1 Queen Anne S.--run over Ascot's straight mile. Then Frankel, by Coolmore's world number one, Galileo, scraped home in the one-mile G1 St James's Palace S., run on the round course, while Coolmore's **Zoffany**, by the Juddmonte stallion Dansili, upgraded his stallion prospects by running a bang-up second. Then, to finish off the day, their investment in a second Juddmonte stallion paid off when **Power** (Oasis Dream) finished strongly to give Aidan O'Brien his sixth win in the G2 Coventry S. All in all, a pretty satisfactory opening day; though the weight of expectation which Frankel carried yesterday is transferred today to Coolmore's So You Think (High Chaparral), as short as 2-5 last night to win today's G1 Prince of Wales's S.

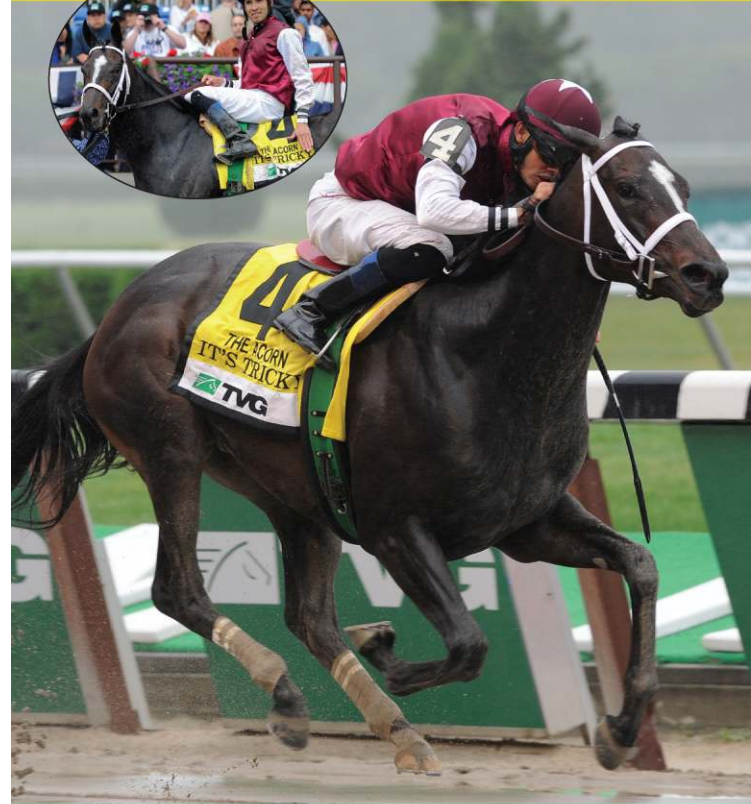
It was also a good day for Prince Khalid Abdullah's Juddmonte operation. Frankel may only have scraped home in the St James's Palace S., but his record now reads seven wins from seven starts, and his master trainer--the newly knighted (and slightly embarrassed, as usual) Sir Henry Cecil--will now go off and think about what he wants to ask his colt to do next. Henry mentioned the G1 Juddmonte International (sponsored by the owner) over an extended 10 furlongs at York, even as the wise guys were again trying to talk him into shortening him up to six furlongs. There's a reason he's been champion trainer nine times, and it's not because he listens to the riders in the stands. Besides the fact a runner by their own stallion, Dansili, gave Frankel an almighty scare, Juddmonte could also be pleased that their stallion Oasis Dream--arguably the number two sire in Europe now behind only Galileo--had two winners on opening day: Prohibit in the G1 King's Stand S. over five furlongs; and Power in the G2 Coventry, always the first really important 2-year-old race of the year.

The racing, as always, was fiercely competitive, and there were a few noteworthy performances in defeat--none more so than Goldikova's loss to Canford Cliffs in the Queen Anne. Like Zenyatta, she went down fighting, and has now won 16 races, with four seconds and two thirds in her 23 career starts--only once unplaced, in a bog in the G1 Prix d'Ispahan, in her first start of 2009. Prince Khalid's **Cityscape**, now a 5-year-old and by Selkirk, ran a lifetime best, finishing third, less than two lengths behind Goldikova; and Godolphin's 6-year-old **Rio de la Plata** (Rahy) also ran a good race, in fourth.

At five furlongs, the G1 King's Stand isn't always my favorite race, but it was a grand race yesterday--mainly because I spotted a massive gamble going on **Prohibit** in the last couple of minutes before the race and managed to use him in a trifecta which paid awfully well considering the odds the bookies were paying on the first three. The Australian contender, **Star Witness**--from Starcraft's first Australian crop--ran on gamely for second, just ahead of the Hong Kong-trained, South African-bred mare **Sweet Sanette** (Jallad), with the 'Budapest Bullet', Hungarian-trained **Overdose** (Starborough) in fourth. The British did keep the race at home for once, but the second, third, and fourth are trained in Australia, Hong Kong, and Hungary, respectively. An international cast for sure.

There has been a lot of action by European second-crop sires in the last few days. Over the weekend, Coolmore's Hurricane Run (Montjeu) got his third group winner when his colt Kreem nosed out the German-trained Shirocco (Monsun) colt Ibicenco in the G3 Prix du Lys in France, but the next day Shirocco got his second group winner of the season when another colt by him, Arrigo--like Ibicenco owned and bred by Germany's storied Gestut Schlenderhan--won the G2 Oppenheim-Rennen, a trial for the G1 Deutsches Derby. This moved Hurricane Run and Shirocco to second and fourth, respectively, among the top five European second-crop sires by 2011 progeny earnings ([click here for the second-crop year-to-date earnings list](#)). Coolmore's Holy Roman Emperor (Danahill) has gone nearly \$200,000 in front, due in part to the exploits of his filly Banimpire, trained by Jim Bolger, who stepped up to a mile and a half for the first time and defeated older fillies and mares in the G3 Noblesse S. at Cork over the weekend for her third Group 3 win of the season. She is due to run back in tomorrow's G2 Ribblesdale S., for which she'll be one of the favorites. Holy Roman Emperor also had the second in yesterday's Coventry, Roman Soldier. **Cont. p12**



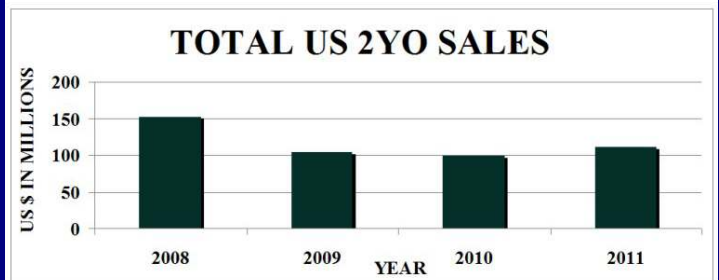

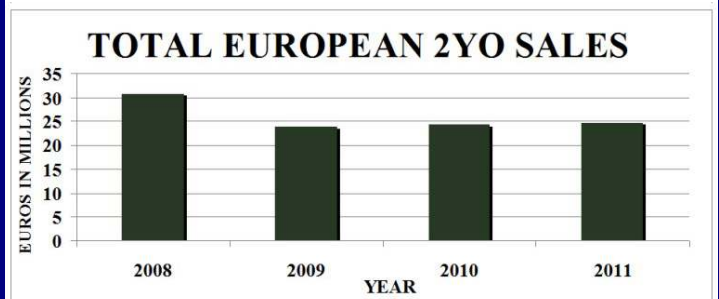

"After the North American 2-year-old market saw a 26 percent drop in number catalogued, and a 35 percent drop in gross from 2008 to 2010, this year's double-digit increases from 2010 in number catalogued, sold, and gross were welcome news. The gross has now dropped 27 percent, the average by 21 percent, since 2008. In Europe, the gross is down by 20 percent since 2008, the average by 23 percent. Given that the market top dropped by 50 percent and the bottom by two-thirds, the 2-year-old sales have at least outperformed the overall market."

Further down the second-crop sire list is a horse called Iceman, himself a winner of the G2 Coventry in 2004. He was by Polar Falcon, also sire of Pivotal, and was bred and raced by Cheveley Park Stud. Though he never won again after the Coventry, Cheveley Park gave him a shot at stud, but he unfortunately died after, I think, just two crops. A week or so ago, a filly from his second crop, Djarvo, shipped over to Paris and won the five-furlong Prix La Fleche; and yesterday another 2-year-old by Iceman, Frederick Engels, hosed up in the final race on Ascot's first-day card, the Windsor Castle, another listed event going five furlongs. Unfortunately, it's Chester House all over again: the Iceman cometh not.

Speaking of sire lists, Ruler On Ice may be Roman Ruler's only black-type winner so far this year, but when that colt wins a \$1-million Classic such as the GI Belmont S., it does move his sire up on the lists. Narrowly second to Offlee Wild on the 2009 freshman sire list, Roman Ruler goes back up to third among third-crop sires (first 4-year-olds) by 2011 progeny earnings, moving back ahead of Kitten's Joy, and trailing only Dubawi and Leroidesanimaux (*click [Dehere](#) to see the 2011 year-to-date third-crop sire list*).

GENERAL BELGRANO ATTRACTS 11 Monday's G2 Clasico General Belgrano, the first ever Breeders' Cup Challenge 'Win & You're In' Series race to be held in South America, has attracted a field of 11 horses. Contested over 2500 meters at Hipodromo de Palermo's dirt track, the race has drawn a solid field, including **Lingote de Oro (Arg)** (Orpen), who returns to action after a seven-month layoff. Crowned the 2010 Argentine Horse of the Year, the bay was retired several months ago, but, owner Carlos Felice of Stud Keyser Soze opted to return the 6-year-old to training after failing to reach an agreement to stand the MG1SW at stud. The race will also feature 2010 G1 Gran Premio Nacional, G1 Argentine Derby winner **Expressive Halo (Arg)** (Halo Sunshine); Group 1-winning mare **Foggy Stripes (Arg)** (Equal Stripes {Arg}); Brazilian champion **Mr. Nedawi (Brz)** (Nedawi {GB}); record-setting **Aristocity (Arg)** (City West {Arg}); MGSW **Mustang Force (Arg)** (Sunray Spirit); and 2009 G1 Republica Argentina winner **Calidoscopio (Arg)** (Luhuk). The winner of the Clasico General Belgrano will receive an automatic berth in the Breeders' Cup Marathon at Churchill Downs.

106 PRE-ENTERED FOR ESTRELLAS A total of 106 horses were pre-entered last Monday to participate in the XXI edition of the Carreras de las Estrellas--the local version of the Breeders' Cup--which will be contested at Hipodromo de San Isidro June 25. The series organized by the Fundacion Equina Argentina will consist of eight races, including the 1000-meter Estrellas Sprint Junior, now a Group 1. **Malpensa (Arg)** (Orpen), **Mighty Hunter (Arg)** (Mutakddim), **Escape of Glory (Arg)** (Lode), **Suggestive Boy (Arg)** (Easing Along), **Gamuza Fina (Arg)** (Equal Stripes {Arg}), **Catch the Mad (Arg)** (Catcher In the Rye {Ire}) and **Cafrune (Arg)** (Colonial Affair) are listed among probables for the day's races. As usual, the focal point of the card will be the G1 Estrellas Classic, headed by **Star Runner (Arg)** (Southern Halo). The Ernesto Romero trainee recorded the biggest win of his career in the May 1 G1 Gran Premio Republica Argentina. **Vitaminado (Arg)** (Not for Sale {Arg}), recent winner of the G1 Gran Premio 25 de Mayo, will be his chief rival. Also expected to compete are Group 1 winners **Rupit (Arg)** (Lucky Roberto) and **Cocho (Arg)** (Sunray Spirit). The post position draw will be held the Tuesday, June 21.

RACE DAY MEDICATION SUMMIT

CONCLUDES There were no decisions made and few areas of agreement, but the participants from the International Summit on Race Day Medication, EIPH and the Racehorse, held Monday and Tuesday at Belmont Park, exited the experience with an optimistic outlook. Seventy-two members of the international racing community were on hand for the closed discussions held Tuesday. They broke into nine groups, and hashed out the question of 'How do we address the issue of raceday medication in a way that is good for the horse and good for racing?' "No specific recommendations were announced, but areas of broad interest were identified," said Eric Wing, the senior director of media relations for the National Thoroughbred Racing Association, during a wrap-up press conference Tuesday evening. The topics that will be the focus of future discussion include Lasix administration, penalties, security issues, research and education. NTRA President and CEO Alex Waldrop said, "We certainly came away with our eyes open. The Summit was informative and, perhaps, long overdue. We've agreed to come together in July and continue the conversation. We'll sit down and talk specifically about where we want to go in the future, and that's the best outcome we could have hoped for today." The July meeting will bring together members of the Racing Medication and Testing Consortium, 25 industry stakeholders and organizations that represent Thoroughbred, Standardbred, American Quarter Horse and Arabian racing. The date for the meeting has not yet been set. But, ultimately, the participants in the Summit recognized that they cannot mandate change. "None of us have regulatory authority," said Dr. Scott Palmer, chairman of the American Association of Equine Practitioners' Racing Committee. "We are in a position to make suggestions, but our power in coming together will be consensus." Added Dr. Robert Lewis, president of the AAEP, "To be effective, [our recommendations] would have to be adopted by all 38 racing jurisdictions [in the U.S.]." **Cont. p17-18**

POV: The Regulators...

The Monday afternoon session of the Summit was comprised of three separate panels. The regulators led off the post-prandial proceedings, with representatives from Europe, Hong Kong and the U.S. taking the mic. One fact immediately made clear was that the definition of the term bleeder was vastly different in the U.S. and abroad. While horsemen in America consider any horse that demonstrates signs of EIPH during endoscopic exam to be a bleeder, Dr. Brian Stewart, head of veterinary regulation and international liaison at the Hong Kong Jockey Club, summed up the international perspective by stating that an official bleeder was a horse that evidenced “blood out of the nostrils that must be of pulmonary origin.”

Denis Egan, an accountant by profession who has been chief executive of the Irish Turf Club since 2001, stated that just one in 1,100 Irish horses was labeled a bleeder under those terms. Egan was soft-spoken, but firm in the position that his compatriots were united against the use of raceday Lasix. While revealing that the average horse in Ireland makes just 3.8 starts per year, about 40% less than their American counterparts, he nevertheless blamed a lack of opportunity on the abbreviated campaigns.

Egan explained that Irish trainers pointed to a number of factors that could contribute to EIPH, including dust in the environment, a lack of fresh air and allergies. “Stress is a major cause--they try to avoid overstressing the horse,” he added.

He admitted that his horsemen do use Lasix in training, but insisted, “There has been no pressure for raceday Lasix. The general feeling is that it is performance enhancing. I don’t know if that’s correct or not, but it is the perception in Ireland.”

He also remarked that there was concern that the use of raceday Lasix had damaged the genetics of American-bred horses. “They believe that the American racing product is tainted, because of the use of raceday medication,” Egan said.

Dr. Anthony Stirk, senior veterinary advisor to the British Horseracing Authority, was also aware that British trainers treated their horses with Lasix in training. What trainers do at home, Dr. Stirk said, “is their own business. We only require that horses run drug free.”

While Lasix is not permitted for training or racing in Hong Kong, Dr. Brian Stewart, head of veterinary regulation and international liaison at the Hong Kong Jockey Club, said, “[EIPH] is an issue for us, and it does affect racing performance, there’s no doubt about that.”

Horses that perform poorly in Hong Kong are scoped after the race. If the horse is found to have bled, the information is made public immediately. In addition, Dr. Stewart said, “[Trainers] are required to report anything that might have affected performance. Non-reporting is not a significant issue.”

While trainers in the U.S. are not under such intense scrutiny, when it comes to the administration of Lasix, procedures are tightly controlled. Dr. Ted Hill, New York Racing Association steward, explained that New York racing has established a practice of having NYRA vets, rather than private practitioners, administer Lasix before a race. NYRA did away with the detention barn at the beginning of the 2010 Saratoga meet, and, for the rest of the year, the private vets were charged with making sure that horses were given their pre-race Lasix shots at the proper time, four hours before the race. But it became a scheduling headache, and there were 18 scratches after the detention barn was eliminated, because of problems with Lasix administration. NYRA vets have been administering Lasix since start of 2011, and there have been no such scratches.

The Trainers Speak...

The four trainer chosen to speak at the Summit presented a truly international front. While Christophe Clement and Graham Motion may ply their trade in the



U.S. now, they started off in Europe, and John Size--an Australian--packed his stopwatch for Hong Kong in 2001. Size has trained two Hong Kong Horses of the Year and has been champion trainer in the country six of nine seasons. U.S. Hall of Famer Richard Mandella rounded out the quartet.

Not surprisingly, Clement, Mandella and Motion all include Lasix in the regimen for a majority of their horses.

Motion, just weeks removed from his GI Kentucky Derby victory with Animal Kingdom (Leroidesanimaux {Brz}), has not had a horse test positive in the 18 years since he took out his license. But he sees the benefit of medication, in racing and in training.

“I certainly breeze some of the 2-year-olds on Lasix, even if they haven’t been bleeding previously,” Motion said. “Prevention is important--I don’t want them to start bleeding that early.”

Added Clement, “If a horse bleeds, right away, you’ve got a situation. You’ve got to do everything you can. You can’t avoid bleeding--it’s a fact of life. What you can avoid is it becoming chronic.”

But U.S. horsemen do not rely solely on Lasix to help horses suffering from EIPH. They change up the horse’s racing and training program, giving them more time between hard work or even giving them vacations when necessary. Motion has access to open paddocks, and makes generous use of them. “We turn horses out--we have that luxury, training at Fair Hill.” **Cont. p18**



Mandella also looks beyond the EIPH for other potential problems. "Over the years, the worst bleeding episodes, there was some reason to tie to it," he said. In addition to respiratory illnesses, he found stress and hypertension to be contributing factors. "Any great stress you put on them will contribute to bleeding," Mandella said, then pointed out, "In Europe, the stables are off the [racetrack] grounds. They ride out to the gallops, they ride back--they are up on 'em for over an hour. [In the U.S.], it's not like at the farms, where they can drop their heads and go to sleep. They know when they are at the racetrack--that constant tension is part of the problem in America. The European system is unique."

Without Lasix, Size has to deal with his bleeders the best he can. "I space a horse's races, I'm careful as to how much work I ask him to do," he explained. "I try to slow it down a little bit and manage his working program. I try to get them to relax, maybe introduce a different routine, make life more enjoyable. If they don't respond, the best thing is to retire them."

Or, as the U.S.-based conditioners pointed out, the bleeders can be sent overseas.

"I have had a lot of benefit of that from successful operations in Europe," Motion said. "They send me horses they feel are being impacted by bleeding."

Added Clement, "That's obviously a way out, to come to the States."

Mandella, addressing the possibility that the use of raceday Lasix might have a weakening effect on American bloodlines, said, "There are families that tend to bleed more than others," but out the blame more on the mental than the physical characteristics of the horse. "Nervous, washy horses are more likely to bleed," he said.

Mandella, a trainer for 35 years, could see both sides of the argument on the raceday use of Lasix.

"They do have racing [without Lasix], and they start as many times a year [as we do in the U.S.]," he remarked. "I don't know if we've developed a dependence on Lasix. Racing would go on without it."

But, Mandella added, "Horses bleed--they've proven that. I know that Lasix helps. Is it inhumane not to treat a horse that you know bleeds? That's an important question."

The Medical Report..

Two American veterinarians and two from the international racing community made up the final panel at the Summit Monday. Representing the A.S. were Dr. Foster Northrop and Dr. Scott Hay; Dr. Treve Williams of Australia and Dr. John McVeigh, who is based in South Africa, but has also practiced in the U.K. and France.

All agreed that conditions were different for horses racing in the U.S. and around the world.

"You're comparing apples and oranges," Dr. Northrop said. "[U.S. horses] are not in yards, the majority of racetracks are in the worst part of the city, there is very little fresh air. You're asking horses to be professional athletes coming out of that environment."

And there was a consensus on the efficacy of Lasix. While adamantly against its raceday use, Dr. Williams admitted, "I feel it's the only drug of any value, and [Australian trainers] will use it on breeze-up day."

Dr. McVeigh offered, "We all have to agree that Lasix works." Citing the distress he has seen in horses that have bled, he added, "We have a welfare issue, and I would give Lasix, from a welfare point of view."

Said Dr. Hay, "Lasix is as good as it gets right now as far as being able to control bleeding."

But they were divided when it came to the perception of its use on raceday. Dr. Williams implied that unscrupulous horsemen would treat to win one day, then change the dosage, or even use saline instead, and aim to lose the next. Moderator Dr. Scott Palmer made it clear that such practices are guarded against in the U.S., with post-race testing ensuring that a horse is treated as regulated.

Asked if he would use Lasix if it were permitted, Dr. Williams said, "No I wouldn't. The reason why I wouldn't is that those who use it can yo-yo the drug. You don't have Betfair here, but with exchange wagering, you can bet to lose. Once you introduce a performance-enhancing [medication] into a trainer's arsenal, you are really asking for trouble, certainly from a betting point of view."

Dr. McVeigh, comparing Lasix treatment to the prevalent use of Ritalin for children today, said, "When you get to a point where 90% are being treated for a condition, you get concerned."

But both Drs. Northrop and Hay voiced concerns about the integrity of racing should Lasix be banned.

"You'd have to seriously look at your security, if you want everyone to truly run on the same playing field," Dr. Northrop said. "We could be worse off than we are now. It could be a nightmare for vets and trainers--there would be a lot of pressure to do things you're not supposed to do. It would be back to the way it was when New York didn't have Lasix--you had what was called the New York bleeder treatment."

Dr. Hay staunchly defended his own practices. "I think you know me well enough to know I'm not going to be in the stall on raceday," he said. But he continued, "I can't say that about everybody. Unfortunately, we're not all on the same page here as to the best way to treat a horse. It would be very tough competitively on raceday if there's not enough security around to enforce the rules. It's a darn shame to say you need security to keep it honest. I don't, but there are people out there who do."
