A CERTAINTY? THINK AGAIN

For most of yesterday's G1 Prince of Wales's S., it appeared all was going perfectly to plan for **So You Think (NZ)** (High Chaparral {Ire}), but, in the closing stages, it was **Rewilding (GB)** (Tiger Hill {Ire}) who prevailed under a power-packed Frankie Dettori drive. While all the pre-race emphasis centred around the ex-Australian superstar, Godolphin's G1 Dubai Sheema Classic hero was under the radar and started at 17-2, opposed to the 4-11 on offer for Ballydoyle's favorite. As So You Think set out for a solo under Ryan Moore on the home turn, Rewilding was beginning to wind up out wide, and gradually ground him down in the final 50 yards to score by a neck. "They were two great horses and it was a sheer joy to be in the race," Dettori said. "It was a tremendous battle and the second never gave up, but I'm delighted for Rewilding, as he is a good horse and doesn't get the recognition he deserves."

When this race was upgraded to its current status in 2000, Godolphin were quick to dominate, but after the riches reaped by the three consecutive scorers Dubai Millennium (GB), Fantastic Light and Grandera (Ire) came the drought. Step forward Rewilding. A half-brother to international star Dar Re Mi (GB) (Singspiel {Ire}), the bay colt ran third in the G1 Epsom Derby last June, and kicked off his 4-year-old campaign with a win in the G1 Dubai Sheema Classic at Meydan Mar. 26. "If you win these races, it is a great thing, and the preparation and training was perfect," Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum commented. Conditioner Mahmood Al Zarooni gave the credit to his boss. "I have to be honest, it's not me, it's His Highness--he always gives us direction with the horses," Al Zarooni noted. "He has been around a long time and has a lot of experience, while we are still learning. The G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth S. [at Ascot July 23] is next." **Cont. p2**

GLORY SEEKING

Two days after the statue of Yeats (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) was unveiled here, **Fame and Glory (GB)** (Montjeu {Ire}) would prove a fitting winner of today's G1 Gold Cup for Ballydoyle. Only Rite of Passage (GB) (Giant's Causeway) has stopped the Rosegreen outfit from annexing the last five renewals, and that potential threat is now absent after he suffered a late setback. That leaves Fitri Hay's colorbearer with a clearer route to the winning post if he manages to see out this marathon trip, which is six furlongs farther than he has attempted so far. The four-time Group 1 winner holds a distinct class edge if his stamina lasts out. Aidan O'Brien admits this is a venture into the unknown. "You can't be sure about the 2 1/2 miles, as he is a Group 1 winner over a mile and a quarter and a mile and a half," O'Brien said. "His work has been a bit longer and slower, as we've been trying to teach him to relax. On form and quality and looking at his run at Leopardstown, you'd think he'll definitely get two miles, so we'll just have to see about the other half a mile." **Cont. p8-9**

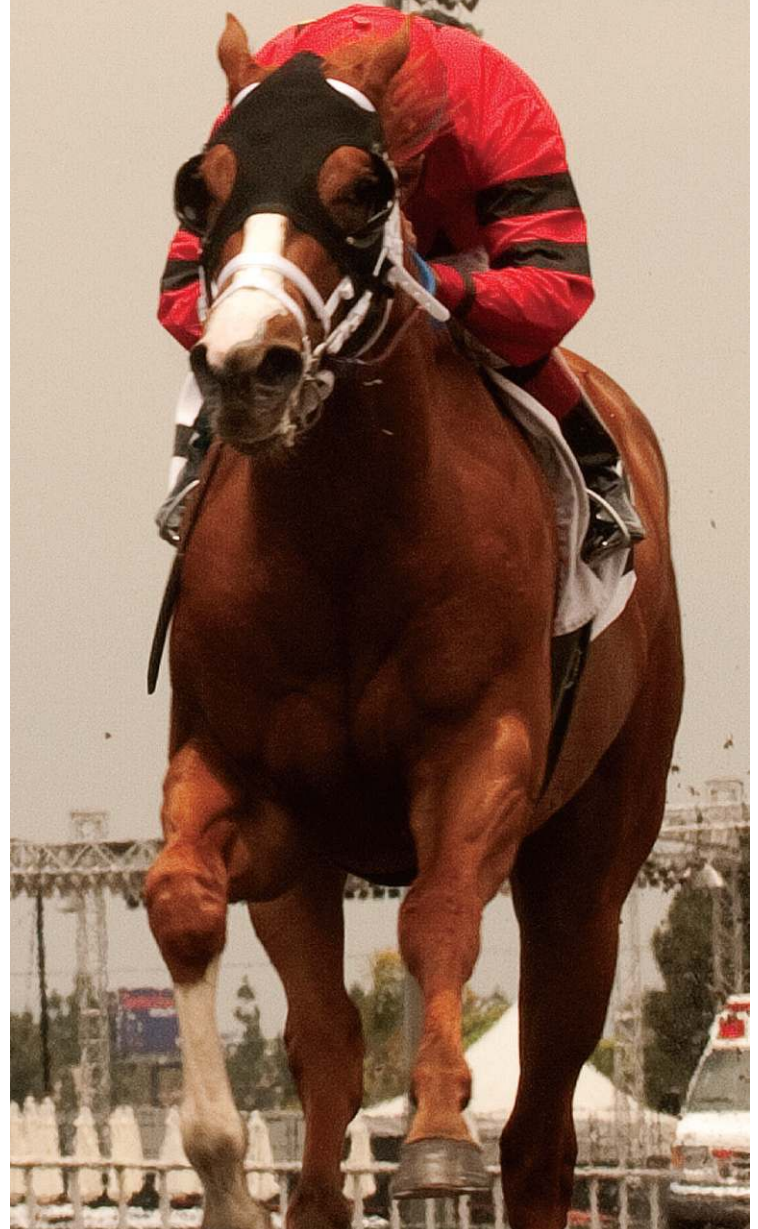

Rewilding was held in the highest regard by his then-trainer Andre Fabre following his second to **Planteur (Ire)** (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) in the G2 Prix Noailles at Longchamp last April. Transferred to Mahmood Al Zarooni, the bay booked a Derby ticket when taking Goodwood's Listed Cockeyed Hat S. in mid-May, and was third in the "Blue Riband" itself just over a fortnight later. Despite taking those three quick runs in his stride, he subsequently backtracked from an impressive success in the G2 Great Voltigeur S. over 12 furlongs at York in August when only sixth as the even-money favorite for the G1 St Leger at Doncaster the following month. With vital time under his belt, he reappeared on World Cup night to show the benefit of patience and duly won the G1 Dubai Sheema Classic with a degree of authority, but a question mark remained over this drop back in trip. Held on to early as Frankie watched the race unfold in front, he raced enthusiastically while the initially languid **Jan Vermeer (Ire)** (Montjeu {Ire}) took up the pacesetting duties after the first quarter. **So You Think** raced past his stable companion on the final bend and, although he had first run on **Rewilding**, his early move cost him as the royal blue train steadily usurped the purple where it mattered.

Ir470,000gns, the bay mare proved a bargain at the price. Her first two foals for Watership Down, Kilimanjaro (Shirley Heights) and Rhagaas (Sadler's Wells), each brought 500,000gns--from Demi O'Byrne and Godolphin, respectively--as yearlings

at Tattersalls. Her 1999 Sadler's Wells colt established a British record when selling for 3.4-million guineas in 2000; originally named Diaghilev, he developed into a Group 1 winner in Hong Kong under the moniker River

Dancer. Dar Re Mi was retained to race under pink-and-grey silks, and bankrolled £2,698,880 for the Lloyd-Webbers. John Ferguson secured Rewilding for 500,000gns at Tattersalls in 2008, and the bay colt has repaid that several times over. Darara was pensioned after producing Rewilding.

It's Not What You Think...

So You Think's trainer Aidan O'Brien blamed himself his charge's defeat. "I would take total responsibility for this, as he won his first two starts very easily, and I was letting him come along very gently and not training him very hard," O'Brien explained. "I didn't like to get stuck into him and, while this was a big step up from his other races, he was a little fresh and tanked for the first two furlongs, and then went to win and got tired. Frankie gave his horse a beautiful ride and his horse stays a mile and a half well, so he just got him in the final yards. It was trainer's error for not getting him fit enough for this kind of race, as I didn't want to chase him too much. We must remember that he would never have had this strong and competitive a race in this atmosphere before, and it was my fault, as he had a big heavy blow after. All I can say is sorry, and we will go on from here and see what happens next time. I would expect plenty of improvement, and the G1 Eclipse [at Sandown July 2] is a definite possible, but he has a lot of options, so we'll go home and discuss it."

this trip at this meeting before running fifth in the G1 Pretty Polly S. at The Curragh last season. Campaigned exclusively at The Curragh so far this term, she annexed the Mar. 20 G3 Park Express S. over a mile

and the seven-furlong G3 Gladness S. Apr. 7 before finishing runner-up in the May 2 G3 Athasi S. and the G3 Ridgewood Pearl S. three weeks later. Held up early by Wayne Lordan towards the rear of the group racing up the centre, the blinkered bay was pulled towards the stand's rail to deliver her thrust. As the early leaders started to tread water, she swooped by the likely winner Chachamaidee passing the furlong marker before asserting in the drive to the line.

Jacqueline Quest (Ire) (Rock of Gibraltar {Ire}), last year's disqualified G1 1000 Guineas winner, planted herself in the stalls and took no part.

"The blinkers are the key, as last year she didn't really kill herself in the Sandringham, and they have worked the oracle," trainer Tommy Stack's son and assistant Fozzy said. "It was always in the back of my mind to come here, as she's very tough and takes a lot of work--she has the constitution of an ox. I might give her a holiday now and bring her back for a prep before the G1 Matron S. [at Leopardstown Sept. 3]. She stays well and likes passing horses, and last time she got in front too far from home." Sir Henry Cecil said of the runner-up, "Chachamaidee ran a lovely race, and the mile is probably just a bit of a stretch for her. Over seven furlongs, it might have been closer. Something like the [July 29] G3 Oak Tree S. at Goodwood is ideal for her."

Hello, Dolly...

A member of the first crop of MG1SW Oratorio (Ire) (Danehill), Lolly for Dolly is the first foal from Heart Stopping (Chester House). That mare failed to win in five starts for Juddmonte and trainer Barry Hills, and sold for 22,000gns at Tattersalls December in 2005 to the account of Gordian Troeller Bloodstock. Heart Stopping has a 3-year-old Shamardal filly named Eclipseoftheheart (GB) that is unraced to date, and her 2009 Motivator (GB) colt died as a yearling. The mare produced a colt by Canadian champion Champs Elysees (GB) (Danehill) this past March.

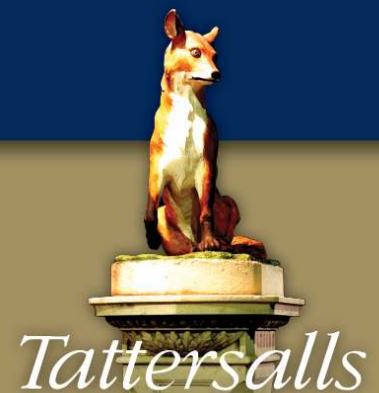

great-granddaughter Best Terms who stole the show with a narrow verdict here. In doing so, the diminutive filly continued a stellar Royal Ascot for the Richard Hannon/Richard Hughes combination. Introduced

to the main game at Windsor, like so many Hannon juveniles, Best Terms justified favoritism in her Apr. 18 debut with a half-length success and built upon that with an easy conditions score at Newbury last time May 13. Breaking a little awkwardly, she raced in the wake of Gypsy Robin (Daaher) and On the Dark Side (Ire) (Kheleyf), who combined to set furious early fractions.

Keeping those pacesetters within range throughout, the bay was gathered together just before the quarter-mile marker and launched her bid soon after. Finding extra under a power drive inside the final furlong, Best Terms inched out 🐾 **"TDN Rising Star"** 🐾 Shumoos and the fast-closing Caledonia Lady in a three-way finish.

"She's a decent filly and wasn't born until May 19, but boy is she quick, very quick," enthused winning conditioner Richard Hannon. "She stuck her head out, she's still unbeaten and it's unbelievable really." Adding further gloss to the appraisal, rider Richard Hughes continued, "She's a little superstar and was so laid back beforehand that she went around the [parade] ring like an old steeplechaser. I jumped a bit awkwardly--and it took me 100 yards to get her balanced--but I got in the slipstream of the American filly [Gypsy Robin] and things were grand once we were there. We were toying with the idea of going for the [G3] Albany [S. here on Friday], because you need to stay six furlongs to win over five [furlongs] here. It's turned out well that we didn't go for that race and she really stuck her head out well to the line."

Passage of Time...

Best Terms, a May 19 foal, boasts the top-notch Time Charter as her third dam. Campaigned by Robert Barnett, the bay captured the G1 Epsom Oaks and G1 Champion S. at three in 1982. The following year, she was victorious in the G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth Diamond S., and added the G1 Coronation Cup to her trophy case at five. Time Charter produced Group 2 winners Time Allowed (GB) (Sadler's Wells) and Zinaad (GB) (Shirley Heights {GB}), and By Charter--the Queen Mary winner's second dam--produced a trio of black-type winners in First Charter (GB) (Polish Precedent), Anton Chekhov (GB) (Montjeu {Ire}) and Private Charter (GB) (Singspiel {Ire}). Best Terms, who was bought back for 10,000gns at Tattersalls in October, is the most recent reported foal from Sharp Terms.

Strong Suit came to this meeting with a weight of expectation 12 months ago and duly emulated stable companion Canford Cliffs (Ire) (Tagula {Ire}) by winning the G2 Coventry S. in dramatic come-from-behind style. Subsequently third to Zoffany (Ire) (Dansili {GB}) when the 4-9 favorite for the G1 Phoenix S. at The Curragh in August, the chestnut was given a break and returned with a respectable second, albeit nine lengths adrift of Dream Ahead (Diktat {GB}), on testing ground in the G1 Middle Park S. at Newmarket in October. Examined following his poor showing in the Apr. 16 G3 Greenham S. at Newbury, he underwent a breathing operation and, with his talent unlocked once more, was back with a vengeance to defy a penalty here. Settled in a clear second early as Utley (Smart Strike) set off in isolation, he was unhurried beneath a confident Richard Hughes and strode past that faltering rival approaching the furlong marker. With the race wrapped up there, he was comfortably on top as favored Codemaster and eye-catching closer Western Aristocrat ate into his margin.

"I knew how good he was, and in Ireland last year he stopped as if shot, but then scoped perfect, so we were scratching our heads," Hughes said. "His work in the spring was okay, but he got the wobbles in the Greenham and we saw how badly he was suffering when we got the cameras on him afterwards. He couldn't do what he did today when his breathing was affecting him." Trainer Richard Hannon added, "We took him to Kempton the other day with Canford Cliffs, and he worked brilliantly. He had lost his confidence before, and has done a very good job of that today. Stepping up to a mile wouldn't worry him."

Codemaster's trainer Henry Candy commented, "He has done absolutely nothing wrong and Richard's horse is very good. I think mine will get another furlong, but we haven't decided anything yet."

As It Suits...

Helwa, whose granddam Private Colors (Private Account) is a full to the peerless Personal Ensign, didn't make it to the races for Shadwell, and was sold as a 4-year-old for \$350,000 while in foal to Spinning World to John Mabee at KEENOV in 1999. No reports were filed for 2001 and 2002, and she went back on the block in 2003 at Barretts January. Agent Gayle Van Leer signed the \$17,000 ticket for her at that venue. The chestnut's resulting Event of the Year filly R Berry Brandy was unplaced, and her Bold Anthony filly Independent Kate was unraced. Helwa eventually made it back to Kentucky to produce the Rahy colt Naseeha in 2006 for a partnership that included Gainsborough and Robert Clay. Strong Suit is her last reported foal, though she was subsequently bred to Harperstown and Exchange Rate. Helwa is a half-sister to Japanese Group 2 winner God of Chance (Jpn) (Cozzene), and is a full to listed winner Silver Colours.

NTRA REPORT FROM CAPITOL HILL



INTERNATIONAL RACE DAY MEDICATION SUMMIT LEADS TO SPECIAL RMTC MEETING

The "International Summit on Race Day Medication, EIPH and the Racehorse" concluded Tuesday, June 14 in New York and the next step is a special Racing Medication and Testing Consortium (RMTC) Board meeting in July.

The RMTC, the American Association of Equine Practitioners (AAEP) and the National Thoroughbred Racing Association (NTRA) jointly sponsored the Summit and identified several areas of interest to explore at the July meeting, including options for administration of Salix, security issues, penalties, education and research. The groups reached these conclusions after two days of extensive discussions that included perspectives from around the world.

Additional background information on the areas of interest will be collected in advance of the special RMTC board meeting next month.

The two-day Summit attracted representatives from 16 global racing jurisdictions and more than 180 attendees. Day 1 included a combination of presentations and panel discussions. Day 2 featured a private day-long facilitated discussion among members of the sponsoring organizations and other international participants and a teleconference for media questions.

Dettori Ban Rules Out Eclipse...

Frankie Dettori was yesterday handed a nine-day ban for excessive use of the whip on Rewilding (GB) (Tiger Hill {Ire}) in the G1 Prince of Wales's S. His suspension will run from June 29-July 7, which means he will be forced onto the sidelines for the G1 Eclipse at Sandown and the opening day of Newmarket's July Festival. Dettori will miss the final two days of this week's fixture after receiving a 10-day sentence for failing to ride out to the line on Blue Bunting (Dynaformer) in the Epsom Oaks.

Churchill Date for Cliffs?

Connections of Tuesday's G1 Queen Anne S. winner **Canford Cliffs (Ire)** (Tagula {Ire}) are set to aim the 4-year-old at the GI Breeders' Cup Mile and a possible rematch with **Goldikova (Ire)** (Anabaa), it was announced yesterday. "The one American track that would really suit Canford Cliffs is Churchill Downs--I thought that we could have beaten Goldikova there last year, so it was nice to finally get the job done," jockey Richard Hughes said. Trainer Richard Hannon added, "I would love to train him as a 5-year-old, but I doubt that I will get my wish. We will talk to John Magnier and the boys before making plans, but the [July 27] G1 Sussex S. at Goodwood is the obvious route, though I paid £1,600 this morning to keep him in the G1 Coral-Eclipse [at Sandown July 2], and one day I would like to try him over a mile and a quarter. Obviously, Canford Cliffs will have an important second half of the season, and we will probably have to consider the Breeders Cup and also Japan and Hong Kong, but this horse could go anywhere. He is that good--the best I have trained in 40 years." Goldikova is tentatively being aimed at a fourth consecutive win in the Mile.

Queally Reflects...

Jockey Tom Queally yesterday moved to defend his tactics on Frankel (GB) (Galileo {Ire}) in Tuesday's G1 St James's Palace S. Having been sent clear after the final turn, Khalid Abdullah's star colt was 3/4 of a length in front at the line as Zoffany (Ire) (Dansili {GB}) closed in, but his rider believes the early move was the right one. "The bottom line from yesterday's St James's Palace S. was that Frankel won," Queally said. "He's still unbeaten and now won three Group 1 races. Sir Henry and I decided we should try and kill them off at halfway, and that's ultimately what we did. He was idling, as he was in front for a long way, and I think he could have found more if he needed to. You have to remember he's never been eyeballed, but I think he'd pull out more if he did get into a battle. All he wants to do is try for you."

Regarding a possible step up in trip, he added, "He settled well and I think we can ride him differently now. I am not sure what his target is, but the owner Prince Khalid is keen to win the G1 Juddmonte International [at York Aug. 17], and I think he'll stay 10 furlongs no problem."

Fame and Glory has been gradually crafted into a stayer in two successful outings this term in the traditional Irish warm-ups, the Listed Vintage Crop S. over 1 5/8 miles at Navan Apr. 17 and Listed Saval Beg S. over 14 furlongs at Leopardstown May 29. The 5-year-old does hold a class edge if he handles the step up in trip. "It goes without saying that Aidan's horses always improve for a prep, and he travels well and settles well and has a strong stamina pedigree," said jockey Jamie Spencer. "You'd be very hopeful he would stay, as he can be quite lazy."

Like Fame and Glory, **Duncan** is a talented middle-distance performer attempting to stretch out, and it is difficult to say how long he will last on the latest evidence of his success in the May 13 G2 Yorkshire Cup. Ridden prominently to beat **Blue Bajan** and **Manighar** in that 14-furlong contest, last year's G2 Prix Foy hero and G2 Hardwicke S. runner-up will be dangerous to all if allowed to do his own thing in front. Manighar was having his first start since finishing strongly to be third behind Zipping (Aus) (Danehill) in the G2 Sandown Classic over 12 furlongs in November. "It's very difficult to tell how Manighar will fare trying 2 1/2 miles for the first time, as the acid test only comes in the race itself and, as we found out with Purple Moon, the last couple of furlongs are always liable to catch out the dubious stayers after the long pull uphill from Swinley Bottom," trainer Luca Cumani said. "That said, Yorkshire Cup winner Duncan is in the same boat and the opposition, him aside, looks to be a little bit light." Sir Mark Prescott saddles a live outsider in Kirsten Rausing's homebred filly **Motrice**, who needs to improve on her third in the G2 Doncaster Cup over 2 1/4 miles and second to Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum's **Tastahil** (Ire) (Singspiel {Ire}) in the G3 Jockey Club Cup on Champions' Day at Newmarket last October. Second behind Yeats in 2007 and 2008 and third in 2009, old stager **Geordieland** is back for the first time since finishing third in that year's G2 Doncaster Cup. Success here would represent a masterful training performance by Jamie Osborne, and the conditioner is far from pessimistic about the 10-year-old's prospects. "It's been a fair journey through the last few months trying to get him ready, as he got a leg in the Doncaster Cup, and we were probably a month away from running in last year's Gold Cup and he got injured again," he said. "He came back into training in December, and it was always the plan to go straight to Ascot if he was going to stand training. If you watched him work now, you wouldn't believe he's 10 and hasn't run for two years. If Yeats hadn't been around, he'd have won two Ascot Gold Cups."

If **Banimpire** shows no ill effects from her convincing win in Cork's G3 Noblesse S. four days ago, she sets a standard which her rivals have to prove they can meet. That 12-furlong contest was her fourth black-type success in a period of little over two months, but trainer Jim Bolger seems relatively unconcerned about her volume of activity. "She seems to be improving all the time and takes her racing well," he commented. "She's traveled over in good form, and gets this trip well. She's a big, burly filly, so it's extremely difficult to keep the weight off her, as she doesn't do much at home. As long as we can get a sequence of races with her, we'll chase it." **Rumh** followed a third behind subsequent Epsom Oaks third and first Izzi Top (GB) (Pivotal {GB}) and Dancing Rain (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) in Newbury's Listed Swettenham Stud Fillies' Trial S. May 13 with a six-length defeat of the smart Imperial Pippin (Empire Maker) in the Listed Lord Weinstock Memorial S. back there last time June 9. She represents Godolphin, which equaled Sir Henry Cecil's tally of five winners 12 months ago. Cecil has been winless since Juddmonte's Yashmak (Danzig) scored 14 years ago and puts forward that operation's **Arizona Jewel**. She was a disappointing favorite when only fourth in the G3 Musidora S. at York May 11, but her trainer thinks she had an excuse for that effort. "She was in season last time and it seemed to bother her, as she's slightly immature," he explained. **Zain Al Boldan**, who beat **Field of Miracles** by six lengths in the May 7 Lingfield Oaks Trial, was only ninth in the June 3 G1 Epsom Oaks, but her trainer Mick Channon managed to get Miletrian (Ire) (Marju {Ire}) to bounce back from a last placing in that Classic to win this in 2000. "The lack of pace did for her in the Oaks and we were never a factor," he commented. "We still don't know how much better than her Lingfield listed win she is, as we learnt nothing at Epsom. She didn't have a hard time, and has come out of the race well, and we have to go there feeling positive about our chances."

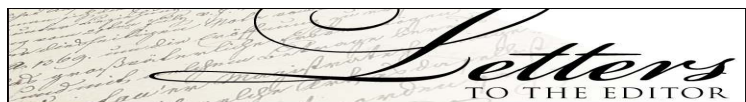

Maragh Gets 7 Days for Belmont Ride...

Jockey Rajiv Maragh, maligned in some quarters for his riding tactics in last Saturday's GI Belmont S., has been given a seven-day suspension by New York

stewards. Maragh was aboard longshot **Isn't He Perfect**

(Pleasantly Perfect) when he left the 11-hole in the Belmont and subsequently came in a path or two, cause a chain reaction that caused GI Kentucky Derby winner **Animal Kingdom** (Leroidesanimaux {Brz}) to stumble and nearly unseat jockey John Velazquez.

Velazquez and others said he thought the move was a

deliberate attempt by Maragh to interfere not with Animal

Kingdom, but with **Mucho Macho Man** (Macho Uno), in the stall directly to Maragh's inside. Maragh had ridden Mucho Macho Man in the first two legs of the Triple Crown, including a third-place finish in the Derby, but was taken off the colt for the Belmont. Head-on video of the race shows that Maragh and Isn't He Perfect indeed come in, though it's inconclusive whether the young jockey is actively steering his charge to the inside. Regardless, stewards felt the incident warranted disciplinary action. Maragh's penalty was originally 10 days, but that was reduced to seven when he waived his right to appeal.

Bind OK After Surgery...

Claiborne Farm and Adele Dilschneider's ☆ **"TDN Rising Star" ☆ Bind** (Pulpit), who suffered a condylar fracture to his right fore after working Monday at Keeneland, has undergone successful surgery and is currently recuperating at Claiborne in Paris, Ky. Bind was working toward this weekend's GIII Matt Winn S. at Churchill Downs. "The prognosis after the surgery is very good," trainer Al Stall, Jr. said. "Everything went well and they didn't find anything in there that they weren't supposed to find." Bind earned a big 105 Beyer airing by nearly 10 lengths in a Fair Grounds maiden in February, then was second to Prime Cut (Bernstein) in a two-turn allowance in New Orleans Mar. 26. He was most recently a close-up second to the older horse Wordly (A.P. Indy) in an allowance on the Kentucky Derby undercard at Churchill. The homebred has earned \$43,400 to date.

COMMITTEE RELEASES PAPER ON TRACK SURFACES

The Racing Surfaces Committee, formed in 2006 at the inaugural Welfare and Safety of the Racehorse Summit, yesterday published a 34-page "Racing Surfaces White Paper," which offers an assessment of the "current state of knowledge pertaining to training and racing surfaces," according to a release. The document touches on hoof-track interaction, types of racing surfaces, testing of racing surfaces, and track composition and maintenance, among other things. The white paper was drafted as a collection of

published scientific papers and data, was co-authored by Dr. Mick Peterson (University of Maine), Dr. C. Wayne McIlwraith (Colorado State University), Dr. Lars Roepstorff (Swedish University of Agricultural Sciences), Dr. Jeffrey J. Thomason (University of Guelph) and Christie Mahaffey (University of Maine). "The fundamental issue behind doing this white paper was the fact that there has been limited academic study of racetracks," Peterson said. "Veterinarians, engineers and soil scientists have all studied racing surfaces, but it has been a modest body of study. This paper will tell researchers and scientists what we don't know and confirm once again that actions taken to improve safety should be based on sound science and published research." Peterson and McIlwraith coordinate the Racing Surfaces Testing Laboratory, formed in 2009 with financial support from a broad industry coalition. **To read the paper, click [here](#).**

DEAL TO ALLOW OHIO SLOTS REACHED

A deal was reached yesterday by Ohio Gov. John Kasich and casino developer Rock Ohio Caesars that would pave the way for video lottery terminals (VLTs) at the state's seven racetracks. In a "Comprehensive Gaming Review Agreement," Kasich said he intends to allow the Ohio Lottery Commission to grant 10-year licences to the tracks, based on a license fee of \$50 million per track. The fee would be paid over time: \$10 million upon application, \$15 million once the machines are up and running, and \$25 million one year later. The tracks would be required to invest \$150 million in capital expenditures, including the cost of installing VLTs. Tracks would be permitted to keep 66.5% of revenue and would be required to complete capital spending and open the VLT facilities within three years of license approval. Important for racing, the deal also stipulates that VLT operators must reach an agreement with the horse racing industry--regarding the distribution of funds to benefit the industry--before operation begins. A separate, but similar deal with Penn National Gaming Inc., which is currently building casinos near Columbus and Toledo, is in the works.

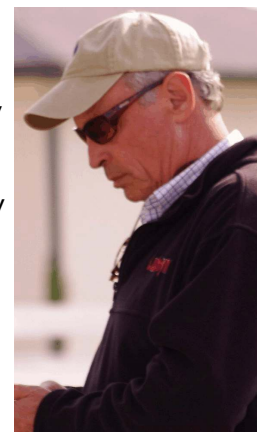

The South Carolina House of Representatives has adopted a resolution to "recognize and commend South Carolina's Thoroughbred owners and trainers, and their South Carolina-trained horses, all of whose performance bring honor to the Palmetto State." The legislature noted that South Carolina-prepared horses figured prominently in America's recent Classic races, including Plum Pretty (Medaglia d'Oro), owned by John Fort's Peachtree Stable, based in Camden, and broken and trained by the Camden-based Kip Elser. The resolution also noted the success of GII Churchill Downs S. hero Aikenite (Yes It's True), owned by Cot Campbell's South Carolina-based Dogwood Stable partnership and prepared in Aiken by Ron Stevens; GI Woodford Reserve S. winner Get Stormy (Stormy Atlantic), prepared in Camden by Donna Freyer; and GI Humana Distaff winner Sassy Image (Broken Vow), prepared in Ellore by Franklin Smith. Two weeks later, on Preakness Stakes day at Pimlico, Smith could also boast having broken Paddy O'Prado (El Prado {Ire}), winner of the GII Dixie S., while on the same card Apart (Flatter) won the GIII William Donald Schaeffer Memorial S. The 4-year-old was prepared by Holly Hill's Jane Dunn. "To crown it all," said the resolution, Shackleford (Forestry), broken by Webb Carroll of St. Mathews, won the GI Preakness S. The resolution also noted that the overall economic impact on South Carolina exceeds \$100 million annually.
