Royal Ascot witnessed one of the great gambles yesterday when **Fame and Glory (GB)** (Montjeu {Ire}) gave a passable impression of Yeats (Ire) to annex a fifth G1 Gold Cup in six years for Ballydoyle at a rain-soaked Royal Ascot. Pummeled into 11-8

favoritism as the confidence proved infectious, the bay was carried by the wave of the crowd's will as he swooped to the lead approaching the final furlong under Jamie Spencer. Godolphin had overturned So You Think (NZ) on Wednesday and it looked momentarily as if a case of deja vu

was about to strike with **Opinion Poll (Ire)** (Halling) coming out wide. But the Derrick Smith silks stayed ahead this time and, at the line, it was three lengths back to the royal blue. "Very few mile-and-a-quarter Group 1 winners get to run in a Gold Cup, but class makes them stay," Aidan O'Brien said of the 5-year-old, who capped a successful venture for Dr Jim and Fitri Hay into joint-ownership with Smith, Magnier and Tabor. "He's been a Group 1 winner every year since he was a 2-year-old, and we never knew until we tried, but we believed he would definitely get two miles. We are privileged to have him and Jamie was very confident and gave him an unbelievable ride."

KEEPING IT REAL

So far this week, Royal Ascot has been missing an overseas victory, but that could be put right by Bobby Flay's **More Than Real** (More Than Ready) in today's G1 Coronation S. Todd Pletcher may be venturing on maiden turf here, but he can take much comfort from his representative's success in the GII BC Juvenile Fillies Turf. On that occasion, the chestnut was a decisive winner and one of her chief opponents here, **Together (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}), was back in fifth. Ginny dePasquale, Pletcher's assistant, said last week, "She is definitely bigger, stronger and more mature than last year. She's very focused on her training and doing quite well here. The aim would be for More Than Real to make one good run at the end." *Cont. p7*

ANIMAL KINGDOM SUSTAINS BONE FISSURE

Team Valor International's **Animal Kingdom** (Leroi-desanimaux {Brz}), sixth in last weekend's GI Belmont S., exited the race with an injury to his left hind leg. The GI Kentucky Derby winner and GI Preakness S. runner-up was observed by his trainer Graham Motion

to be stiff the day following the 1 1/2-mile race, and appeared to be off in his left, hind leg, prompting the decision to send him to the New Bolton Research Center in Kennett Square, Pennsylvania. Dr. Dean Richardson performed a nuclear scan Wednesday morning and, with the assistance of Dr. Larry Bramlage of Rood & Riddle Veterinary Clinic, detected a small fissure at the tip of the cannon bone. "It's not a major thing," said Dr. Bramlage. "Right now, it is a tiny crack and, technically, you could call it a fracture. But I would characterize it as more of a fissure, because of how small it is." *Cont. p3*

Like Yeats before him, Fame and Glory was able to harness ample stamina over a mile and a half and win Epsom's G1 Coronation Cup last term, which followed an authoritative success in the 1 5/16-mile G1 Tattersalls Gold Cup at The Curragh. Alongside his G1 Criterium de Saint-Cloud and G1 Irish Derby victories, his record also boasts the honor of two runner-up finishes behind Sea the Stars (Ire) in the 2009 G1 Epsom Derby and G1 Irish Champion S. If there was any concern about his staying this extreme trip in the lead-up, it was based on that prior high-class form over middle distances rather than the impression of his easy scores in the Apr. 17 Listed Vintage Crop S. at Navan and May 29 Listed Saval Beg S. at Leopardstown. Settled against the rail early in the spot his illustrious predecessor used to enjoy in his four forays here, the bay was lolling off the moderate pace which was upped a notch after a mile by the veteran Geordieland (Fr) (Johann Quatz {Fr}). Still cruising with a half mile remaining, Jamie Spencer waited for racing room to appear on his outside, and asked him to go through the gears at the top of the stretch. Rolling by Duncan (GB) (Dalakhani {Ire}) with 1 1/2 furlongs remaining, he received a smack with the whip there and a few after as Opinion Poll arrived and kept grinding way in the final yards.

"We didn't go very fast early and I was delighted when I saw Geordieland go round the field and inject some pace," Spencer said. "He wasn't keen, but because he has so much class and is used to going a different pace he wanted that to make it more comfortable for him. It was a very easy, push-button ride and I'm just privileged to be allowed to ride him. Everyone was doubting him for the last few weeks, but we never had any doubts as those first two races were just to bring him along. It's a great training performance." Another tilt at the Oct. 2 G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe is on the cards for Fame and Glory after his luckless runs in that Longchamp showpiece in 2009 and 2010. "The plan after today was to give him a break and train him for the Arc again, with a run beforehand," O'Brien added. Mahmood Al Zarooni said of Opinion Poll, "I am pleased that he has come back to form and the jockey said he loved the ground. He was just beaten by a better horse." Racing Manager Simon Crisford added, "That was a super effort and the [July 28] G2 Goodwood Cup would be a suitable next step. The ground helped him today--he goes on quicker ground, but he really does prefer to get his toe in. Mickael [Barzalona] put him to sleep at the back of the field and Opinion Poll picked up really well, so we are pleased."

PEDIGREE NOTES - FAME AND GLORY

It was never going to be Fame and Glory's pedigree that prevented him from winning the Gold Cup on his first start beyond a mile and three-quarters. His sire Montjeu (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) is Europe's best source of

middle-distance and staying talent; already in 2011, he has been represented by the Derby winner Pour Moi (Ire) and Coronation Cup hero St Nicholas Abbey (Ire), and Montjeu's sire Sadler's Wells supplied two multiple Gold Cup winners in Kayf Tara (GB) and Yeats (Ire).

Fame and Glory's dam, Gryada, won over seven furlongs and a mile at two,

and is a sister to Golan Heights (GB), who won over 10-12 furlongs. Her 3/4-sister Gonfalon (GB) (Slip Anchor {GB}) produced Group 3-winning miler Gonfilia (Ger) (by speed influence Big Shuffle) and Gonbarda (Ger) (by middle-distance sire Lando {Ger}). Gryada's other foals include middle-distance winners Graham Island (GB) (Acatenango {Ger}), Grampian (GB) (Selkirk), Guaranda (GB) (Acatenango {Ger}), Rain Forest (GB) Sadler's Wells) and Yummy Mummy (GB) (Montjeu {Ire}). Guaranda is the dam of Gravitation (GB) (Galileo {Ire}), winner of the G3 Lillie Langtry S. over 14 furlongs and third in the two-mile Queen's Vase at Royal Ascot.

Expanding on the injury, Bramlage explained, "He lit up pretty good on the nuclear scan. Normally, no matter how hard a horse hits his leg on the ground in an accident, there is not enough force to show this type of uptake on the scan for a period of at least 10 days. This tells me that, like a lot of racehorses, he probably had a little something going on in there that he was dealing with. But, when he hit the ground with such force in the accident, he overloaded the bone and this is the result." As for the course of treatment, Bramlage added, "I agree with Dr. Richardson that the best course of action is to keep the colt inactive for two weeks and radiograph the leg again. In two weeks, it should settle down and he should be sound again. I don't think it is going to separate, but that would be the worry. The good news is that this should not cost him the entire season. I would hope that he would be able to return to training in a matter of weeks."

Jim Bolger's policy of not leaving prizemoney behind bore fruit once more as the ultra-resilient Banimpire registered a career-high here and, in so doing, claimed a fifth black-type score in just 67 days. Successful once in four juvenile starts, she opened her sophomore campaign with a third to subsequent G2 Windsor Forest S. victress Lolly for Dolly (Ire) (Oratorio {Ire}) in the G3 Park Express S. at The Curragh Mar. 20. Her winning sequence began in the G3 Ballysax S. at Leopardstown next time Apr. 10 and it continued with scores in the Listed Victor McCalmont S. at Gowran Park May 1 and the G3 Blue Wind S. at Naas 10 days later. Banimpire suffered a reversal of fortune when fifth in the May 22 G1 Irish 1000 Guineas back at The Curragh, but bounced back with a decisive win in the G3 Noblesse S. at Cork over 12 furlongs last Sunday. Settled midfield in a tactic to conserve stamina here, she cut through the field on the home turn and, with only Field of Miracles ahead of her at the two pole, knuckled down under a drive in the closing stages to deny that tenacious front runner in a thrilling bobber. "We hoped she'd be okay after the race at Cork, as we were using that instead of giving her a blow-out at home and it was always the plan to come here," Bolger explained.

"All she does is eat and sleep, and the only time she exerts herself is on the racecourse," the conditioner said. "We'd have preferred good going, as she didn't seem to handle the ground too well, but she got there anyway. She's very courageous, very gutsy and stuck at it. I'll probably find a race for her in between now and the G1 Irish Oaks [at The Curragh July 17]. After that, we'll do what the French do and give her a break before the [Oct. 2 G1] Prix de l'Opera at Longchamp." Winning rider Kevin Manning added, "She's very tough and is improving all the time. She traveled very well, but when I asked her to quicken for home off the turn I had to dig deep on her. She usually shows a better turn of foot, but the ground wasn't ideal for her and she wasn't as effective on it. I thought the track was riding loose and slow."



PEDIGREE NOTES - BANIMPIRE

Banimpire is a first-crop daughter of dual Group 1-winning juvenile Holy Roman Emperor (Ire) (Danehill), who was whisked off to stud at the end of his juvenile season. We will never know what the sire's optimum trip at three and beyond might have been, but it's worth noting his Australian-bred sister Milanova stayed 10 furlongs. Banimpire's dam My Renee is by Derby winner Kris Kin's sire Kris S. She is out of an unraced daughter of Arc winner Detroit (Fr) (Riverman), who also produced an Arc winner in Carnegie (Ire) (Sadler's Wells). My Renee, a listed winner over a mile and a half, has produced Dream On Buddy (Ire) (Oasis Dream {GB}), twice a winner at a mile.

Bapak Chinta carried a considerable home reputation into his debut at Hamilton May 13, and came out of that five-furlong dash with it enhanced after beating Frederick Engels (GB) (Iceman {GB}) by three lengths. That form was boosted when the runner-up went on to finish in the same spot behind the subsequent G2 Queen Mary S. runner-up Shumoos (Distorted Humor) before winning Tuesday's Listed Windsor Castle S. in his next two starts. Connections had their enthusiasm dampened by the persistent morning rain at Ascot, but the grey proved as versatile as he is talented with a game and professional display here. Racing up with the early pacesetter Pyman's Theory (Ire) (Exceed and Excel {Aus}), he took over traveling strongly at halfway, and kept finding to ward off the attentions of Boomerang Bob in the run to the line. "He's a very good horse, who does everything right at home, so when we went to Hamilton, we were very confident," trainer Kevin Ryan commented. "We were very confident coming here too, but when the rain came this morning, we just got a bit worried as his breeding suggests he wants top-of-the-ground. That's the sign of a good horse, when they can overcome the ground, as he'd have found that tough. He relaxes and before he went to Hamilton he hadn't come off the bridle, and hasn't come off it since at home. That's the type of horse he is, and when he came off it today he found gears.

I have a lot of nice horses, but this horse has something different about him, and he has a great attitude. He's a May foal and a young horse, but is lovely to train." Jockey Phillip Makin, who was registering a first Royal Ascot winner, added, "I've always had a lot of faith in this horse and I've not sat on a 2-year-old as sharp as him. It wasn't a bad race at Hamilton and he still did it very easily. Today he took me down to the two and, when I let him off, he tried his guts out as he didn't like that ground."

Chin Up...

Bapak Chinta's dam, the unraced Suena Cay (Maria's Mon), is a half-sister to Celtic Melody (Mr. Greeley), who was put up to first after finishing second by a head in the 2002 GI Humana Distaff. She also hit the board in the GII Cotillion H. and GIII Tempted S., and earned \$329,000 during three seasons on the racetrack. In foal to El Corredor--a Grade I-winning son of Mr. Greeley and half-brother to GISW Roman Ruler--Suena Cay was picked up for \$23,000 by E.T. Buckley at KEENOV in 2006. The resulting colt Spanish Island won twice in Britain. After producing the winning gelding Waronthefront (War Chant) in 2008, Suena Cay went back to the Gone West sire Speightstown, and foaled Bapak Chinta May 16, 2009. A \$20,000 KEESEP yearling purchase by Brown Island Stable, the grey colt was resold for £46,000 to Stephen Hillen at the Goffs breeze-up in March. Suena Cay was bred back to Quiet American last spring.

Runner-up in the £500,000 Tattersalls Millions 2yo Trophy at Newmarket at the start of October, Pisco Sour closed his freshman campaign with an eighth-place effort in the G1 Criterium International at Saint-Cloud at the end of that month. He returned this term to run a commendable third in the May 12 G2 Dante S. at York, but finished off the radar, albeit eased when beaten, behind Pour Moi (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}) in the G1 Epsom Derby last time June 4. Positioned within range of the leaders in seventh here, Pisco Sour required a tight grip through the early stages until making smooth headway rounding the home turn. He loomed large at the quarter-mile marker, quickened to the fore soon after and kept on resolutely under a drive in the closing stages to safely withstand the vain bid of Alkimos for a career-best score. The win provided trainer Hugh Morrison with back-to-back Royal winners after Sagamor (GB) (Patoral Pursuits {GB}) annexed the Britannia H. 35 minutes earlier. "We thought Sagamor would run well, but the way Pisco Sour put him to bed on the gallops last Saturday gave us hope for this," Morrison revealed. "However, I looked at the quality of this field and thought we were just here for a run around. You can forget his run in the Derby, as that was trainer error."

'EVERY DAY' AT ROYAL ASCOT

David Reid is the co-owner of Ice Wine Stable, who has three Royal Ascot runners this week with trainer Wesley Ward: Italo (With Distinction), 23rd in the Coventry S; Gentlemans Code (Proud Accolade), 4th in the Windsor Castle; and Everyday Dave (Weather Warning), who runs Thursday in the Norfolk. He and fellow Ice Wine owner Geoff Stein operate Preferred Equine Marketing, a standardbred sales agency.

I think we liked England better than our horses. As predicted by the local weatherman, we woke up this morning to heavy rain. It continued until around noon when the sky cleared for a while. Once again, we were treated to the royal procession and the arrival of the Queen and other distinguished royal family guest including Kate Middleton's parents.



The expected crowd today was around 60,000.

Everyday Dave raced in the first race today at Ascot, the G2 Norfolk S. going five furlongs. He was sent off at 9-1 by the public. He broke well in a smaller pack

towards the left hand fence, while the eventual winner was away in the middle of the track with a bigger group. Everyday Dave was tired and finished back (12th, I believe, but who's counting?). The favorite Bapak Chinta was just better than us and the field today. As expected, the going was soft.

Obviously, we are disappointed with the race results this week but not the overall experience. That is horse racing. We had a terrific time in London and at Royal Ascot.

Royal Ascot was great. From the great quality of racing, great horses, great trainers and jockeys, and hospitality, it was top shelf. Racing officials went out of their way to be sure we had everything we needed to make this an enjoyable trip.

Things we witnessed here are different, such as huge fields, horses racing clockwise, bookmakers, tote companies, punters and a ton of enthusiastic champagne drinkers. The track itself is unconventional in shape, with sharp turns, several inclines and declines, and a wide course to accommodate 30-horse fields.

After Everyday Dave's effort, we enjoyed the remainder of the day's races from high above the track with fellow owners of our trainer, Wesley Ward.

We also had the chance to meet other industry personnel from all over Europe. Once again, we stayed for the traditional singing around the bandstand. As I said on Tuesday, it was a great display of togetherness. We said goodbye to our newfound friends and headed to the exit gate. As if not losing pounds (local currency) with the local bookmakers during the week and our three starters not finishing in the top three wasn't bad enough, a sharp, astute woman saw me coming and I must have had sign on my head reading "American sucker." After getting a wildflower, a good luck rock and getting my fortune read to me, the gypsy got me for £20 (\$32.30). She says it will help feed a young son of a gypsy. I hope it does.

Aidan O'Brien relies solely on Derrick Smith's **Together**, who is looking to turn her fortunes around after a trio of top-level second-placings. Having split White Moonstone (Dynaformer) and **Theyskens' Theory** in the G1 Fillies' Mile here in September, she was undone by another Godolphin runner in Blue Bunting (Dynaformer) in Newmarket's G1 1000 Guineas May 1. Her stable companion Misty For Me (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) came between her and glory in the Curragh equivalent three weeks later. O'Brien said, "We're very happy with her. When she gets to the front, she doesn't do much. Ryan had a lovely run through at The Curragh and got nabbed on the line. For a Galileo, she has loads of speed but just doesn't want to be in front too soon so it might be a bit easier to judge when to get there at this track." Together holds Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum's **Maqaasid** on the form of the 1000 Guineas, with the John Gosden trainee 1 1/4 lengths behind the Ballydoyle raider in third.

That was last year's G2 Queen Mary S. winner's first try at a mile, and her subsequent effort when eighth in the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains at Longchamp May 15 is forgivable from a highly disadvantageous outside draw. "I thought she ran a fabulous race at Newmarket in the Guineas, but possibly didn't quite get home in the last 100 yards," commented the owner-breeder's Racing Manager Angus Gold. "She seemed to come out of that race very well, so we took her to France, but we pretty much knew our fate going there with that draw. It just didn't work out, and she never had a race at all. She was the one filly who did make up some ground of those drawn badly, and finished off the race pretty well, and [trainer] John [Gosden] has been happy with her since. With any filly that has the speed to win a Queen Mary, you doubt whether she can truly stay a mile. We don't know that, but she is a high-class filly. If she gets the trip I think she will go close. She's been very consistent and has hardly run a bad race. What impresses me is the way she has settled down mentally. Last year she was a bit buzzy, but now she takes things much more in her stride, and she certainly gives herself a chance of staying." Gosden also saddles Princess Haya of Jordan's **Joviality**, who bested the Apr. 13 G3 Nell Gwyn S. winner **Barefoot Lady** by a head in the G3 Musidora S. over an extended 10 furlongs at York when last seen May 11. "Joviality is bred to be a miler and the extra two furlongs of the Musidora was as far as she wants to go," Gosden explained. "She's very tough and I'm glad we sat out the French Oaks as it was a hot renewal. This looks a much more open race." Richard Strauss and Robert Collet will be hoping that this trip to Britain with **Immortal Verse** has a happier ending than the previous one when she refused to load for the 1000 Guineas. Strikingly impressive in the G2 Prix de Sandringham at Chantilly last Sunday, the homebred makes for a strong French challenge alongside the English and French Guineas fourth **Nova Hawk**.

With seven wins to his name, Sir Henry Cecil is inching closer to the record of nine held by John Porter and may be helped on his way here by **TDN Rising Star** **World Domination**. Impressive on debut in an 11-furlong maiden at Newbury Apr. 16, the son of his Oaks heroine Reams of Verse (Nureyev) was only fourth in the G2 Dante S. at York May 12. He is joined by stable companion **Glencadam Gold**, who steps up in class after a bloodless win in a 12-furlong Newmarket handicap May 14. "World Domination is quite immature and had a setback before the Dante and, although there were no excuses, he wasn't ready to win it," Cecil said. "I think he's a horse who will progress and progress as the year goes on and next year, as he is quite a baby. Glencadam Gold is an improving horse who I haven't got to the bottom of at all." World Domination's jockey Tom Queally added, "I've ridden him in a lot of his work and he's going really well. We're hoping he can leave his York run behind him. A decent gallop will suit him and I think missing the Derby was the wise choice, as he's needed a bit of time." **Genius Beast** and **Nathaniel** sidestepped the Derby despite taking in notable preps, with the former winning the Apr. 24 G3 Sandown Classic Trial and Nathaniel going down by a head to the subsequent Epsom runner-up Treasure Beach (GB) (Galileo {Ire}) in the May 5 G3 Chester Vase. Genius Beast was taken out of the Derby after his third in Longchamp's G2 Prix Hocquart May 15, while Nathaniel's trainer John Gosden also opted to avoid the "Blue Riband." "I walked the track at Epsom on the Wednesday and it was perfect, but the combined effect of wind and sun meant it had dried out a bit too much by the end of the week," Gosden said. "It would have been too quick for him going downhill. Ascot is a very different layout and once you get out of Swinley Bottom, you're meeting the ground all the way home. He's improved since Chester and that was obviously very good form, with the winner going so close in the Derby." There has been a buzz around Newmarket for the Ballymacoll representative **Fiorente**, who stepped up from a debut fifth behind World Domination to win with authority at Newbury last time May 14. His trainer Sir Michael Stoute has collected five editions, including the likes of Shareef Dancer, Saddler's Hall (Ire) and Papal Bull (GB).

Jim Bolger has made no secret of his regard for **Teolane**, and thus far she has justified his faith with an impressive seven-furlong maiden success at Leopardstown May 29 and opening black-type win in Naas' Listed Coolmore Stud Sprint S. over this trip last Monday. The master of Coolcullen captured this prize in 2008 with a similar type in Cuis Ghaire (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) and said, "She's a good type of filly," Bolger said. "I hate to say this, but Teolane is probably as good as Cuis Ghaire, who won the Albany a few years back." She meets some serious speed merchants here, headed by the Jeremy Nosedata-trained **Illaunglass**. She was backed as if defeat was out of the question on debut in a six-furlong maiden on Lingfield's Polytrack June 2 and duly delivered, despite a few swishes of her tail. "Illaunglass would want the ground to dry out--she wants it on the quick side," commented her trainer, who sent out La Chunga (More Than Ready) to win this in 2005 and Sander Camillo (Dixie Union) to follow up 12 months later. "She has shown plenty of talent at home and worked well last Saturday." **Judy the Beauty** was ruled out of this event by Wesley Ward yesterday.

HEILIGBRODTS TO DISPERSE STOCK BEGINNING AT FTKJUL

Texas natives Bill and Corinne Heiligbrodt, among the top 10 owners in the country the last four years, announced Thursday that they will be dispersing their racing and breeding stock. The Heiligbrodt dispersal will begin with Phase I, an 80-horse consignment to be offered following Fasig-Tipton's 2011 Kentucky Selected Yearling Sale at Newtown Paddocks in Lexington July 12. Included in the consignment, which is being handled by Bluewater Sales, will be horses of racing age, 2-year-olds in training, in-foal mares with their foals of 2011, and yearlings. The Heiligbrodts, who have been in the Thoroughbred business for 25 years, indicated they were taking a hiatus from racing to devote more time to family and to other business interests. The couple has, alone and in partnership, campaigned some 118 stakes winners, 45 of them graded, and their horses have bankrolled more than \$21.5 million since 2005. Their top horses include Grade I winners Appealing Zophie (Successful Appeal), Golden Ballet (Moscow Ballet) and Cashier's Dream (Service Stripe) and millionairess Lady Tak (Mutakddim). The horses in Phase I of the dispersal will be available for inspection at Newtown Paddocks beginning Saturday, July 9. Highlighting the offering are the 4-year-old filly **Local** (Offlee Wild), winner of the Honeymoon S. at Louisiana Downs June 4; and the 3-year-old colt **Cornpiper** (Indian Charlie), a debut maiden winner at Santa Anita in April and second in an allowance at Churchill May 29 in his two starts. The catalogue will be available online starting June 22 and in print beginning June 25. Updated racing performance information will be available on the Fasig-Tipton website www.fasigtipton.com up to the day of sale.

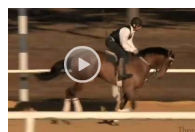

STRONACH GROUP ACQUIRES ALL MJC ASSETS

A group headed by Frank Stronach has entered a binding agreement to acquire Penn National Gaming Inc.'s stake in the assets and operations of the Maryland Jockey Club. The transaction will be effective July 1, 2011, following the completion of the reorganization of MI Developments and will give the Stronach Group full control of Laurel, Pimlico and the Bowie Training Center. Penn National purchased a 50% stake in Maryland's two Thoroughbred racetracks in 2010, with the goal of helping to steer casino gaming to the facilities. Those hopes perished earlier this year when voters in Anne Arundel County failed to pass a referendum which would have overturned zoning approval for a casino to be built near Laurel. Penn National paid \$50 million for its stake in the tracks, *Daily Racing Form* reports. "Today's announcement is part of our ongoing commitment to the horse racing industry and to the State of Maryland," commented Belinda Stronach on behalf of The Stronach Group. "We are determined to work with industry and government officials across the state to further develop Maryland's reputation as a premiere location for racing."

SECOND PURSE HIKE IN TWO WEEKS AT CHURCHILL

Citing unexpected growth in all-sources wagering, officials at Churchill Downs have announced a 15% increase in overnight purses for the remaining three weeks of the spring/summer meeting. A 10% increase was previously announced June 3. "Horse racing fans have responded positively to our racing product this season, and wagering levels over the last two weeks in particular greatly exceeded our projections," said Kevin Flanery, president of Churchill Downs. "We're pleased to announce another 15% increase for our horsemen as we hit the stretch run of the Spring Meet." Purses for all overnight races will increase by an average of \$5,126. Total overnight purses for the meet are projected to be \$13.3 million, up by \$1.2 million over the \$12.1 million originally projected. While officials are clearly pleased to be able to offer greater purse money, they have acknowledged that it is a band-aid on a bigger issue. "We've been fortunate this season, but as we've said before, these positive purse adjustments aren't long-term solutions to the problems we face in Kentucky," Flanery said. "The Commonwealth's signature horse racing industry still isn't on a level playing field with states whose racetracks have an immense competitive advantage by having their purses fueled by slot machine and casino revenues, and our purses remain well shy of their highest levels of recent years."
