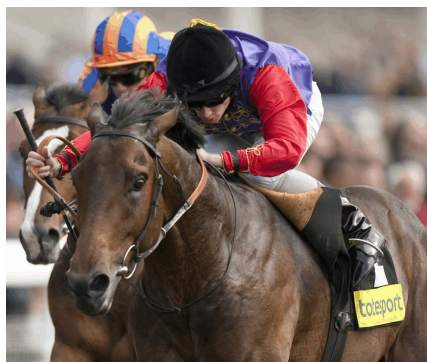

HOUSE TEAM WAIT ON DERBY DECISION

The Queen's **Carlton House** (Street Cry {Ire}) is not a certain starter for Sunday's G1 Dubai Duty Free Irish Derby at The Curragh, with connections set to wait until mid-week to firm up plans. Despite a strong

workout in Newmarket on Saturday, the Epsom Derby third and G2 Dante S. winner has not yet been given the go-ahead by trainer Sir Michael Stoute to line up in the Classic, which will feature Ballydoyle's Epsom contingent. Revealing that the Derby runner-up **Treasure Beach (GB)** (Galileo {Ire}), fourth **Memphis**

Tennessee (Ire) (Hurricane Run {Ire}), sixth **Recital (Fr)** (Montjeu {Ire}) and 10th **Seville (Ger)** (Galileo {Ire}) would all tackle the Irish equivalent, AnneMarie O'Brien tweeted yesterday, "At the moment, our four Epsom Derby runners are on target for the Dubai Duty Free Irish Derby at the Curragh Sunday." The Curragh's Manager Paul Hensey commented, "If the forecast is right, the ground will be perfect as it is officially 'good' at the moment with rain tomorrow and better weather later in the week. I have no news on Carlton House, but apparently he worked very well on Saturday morning and tomorrow's final forfeit will be crucial."

MR. NEDWANI TAKES BELGRANO

Brazilian invader **Mr. Nedawi (Brz)** (Nedawi {GB}) returned to his best form in yesterday's G2 Clasico General Belgrano at Palermo to earn an automatic berth into the Nov. 4 GII Breeders' Cup Marathon at Churchill Downs. The Belgrano was the first ever Breeders' Cup Challenge "Win & You're In" Series event to be run in South America. **Cont. p2**

'DELTA' & 'PRETTY' OUT OF MOTHER GOOSE

Royal Delta (Empire Maker), winner of the May 20 GII Black-Eyed Susan S. at Pimlico, will miss Saturday's nine-furlong G1 Mother Goose S. because of a bruised foot, trainer Bill Mott confirmed Monday. According to Mott, the dark bay missed several days of training, and is expected to resume training sometime this week. "It's really bad timing, but it could have been a blessing in disguise," Mott told *Daily Racing Form*. "They shortened the Mother Goose to a mile and a sixteenth, which I wasn't that crazy about. We got two good races up here, and they're both around two turns and that's the type of filly she is." Mott indicated the sophomore would be targeted at Saratoga's G1 Coaching Club American Oaks July 23 followed by the Aug. 20 G1 Alabama S. Also ruled out of Saturday's race is **Plum Pretty** (Medaglia d'Oro), winner of the May 6 G1 Kentucky Oaks. A 25-length winner of the Mar. 27 Sunland Park Oaks, the bay worked seven furlongs in 1:24 2/5 Sunday. "Plum Pretty not running in Mother Goose," trainer Bob Baffert Tweeted yesterday. "Slight temperature this morning...Bug going around barn. Shame. She worked awesome yesterday."



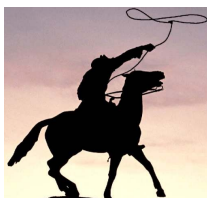

Cliffs Has Eclipse Option...

Canford Cliffs (Ire) (Tagula {Ire}) could attempt 10 furlongs for the first time in the G1 Coral-Eclipse at Sandown, connections revealed yesterday. While Goodwood's G1 Sussex S. is also on the agenda, Tuesday's G1 Queen Anne S. hero is not certain to defend his crown in that July 27 contest. Richard Hannon Jr, assistant trainer to his father, said yesterday, "Canford Cliffs came out of the Queen Anne fine and we are looking at either the Sussex Stakes or possibly the Coral-Eclipse for him next. We will discuss it with the owners, as it's a question of one race or the other." On Friday, Khalid Abdullah's Racing Manager Teddy Grimthorpe had stated that the Sussex was on the agenda for **Frankel (GB)** (Galileo {Ire}), but Hannon Jr is unfazed by the prospect of taking on the unbeaten G1 2000 Guineas and G1 St James's Palace S. winner there. "I would be confident taking on Frankel at Goodwood," he said. "It will be a good race and hopefully we will win."

So You Think Has Eclipse Aim...

So You Think (NZ) (High Chaparral {Ire}) was confirmed yesterday on course for the July 2 G1 Coral-Eclipse at Sandown. Runner-up in Wednesday's G1 Prince of Wales's S., Derrick Smith's colorbearer was the subject of another of Annemarie O'Brien's tweets yesterday. "We are looking at the Coral-Eclipse at Sandown as So You Think's next start," she declared.

Mr. Nedawi began his International campaign by winning the Oct. 19 G1 Gran Premio Dardo Rocha at La Plata in Argentina before adding the G1 Premio Jose Pedro Ramirez Jan. 6. Runner-up in the Mar. 5 G2 Otono, he was unplaced in his two latest starts, including a sixth in the May 1 G1 Republica Argentina. Bidding his time in mid-pack behind slow fractions early, the bay made his move at the top of the stretch and cruised home an easy winner. Champion Lingote de Oro (Arg) (Orpen) was ninth. "We were very confident in Mr. Nedawi because this is his distance," said trainer Joao da Costa. "He was running [recently] over 2,000 meters against some very fast milers and the rhythm was different. This is a very nice horse, easy to train--he always runs his race." Regarding a possible trip to the U.S., da Costa said, "We will talk with the owners. We're not at this time." Representing the Breeders' Cup, John Fulton added, "We are very happy with our first race in South America. This is just the beginning and we hope to do a lot more here. Mr. Nedawi is a very classy horse who knows how to travel--he will have a big chance if he goes to Churchill Downs."

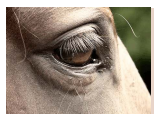

The Anglo-Irish breeding industry still has some way to go before it becomes monopolized by a single male line, unlike Japan, where the latest edition of the Derby was exclusively contested by grandsons of Sunday Silence (seven sons of the American Horse of the Year were responsible for 16 of the 18 runners, with the two exceptions having dams by Sunday Silence).

However, last week's 22 stakes races at Royal Ascot confirm that Britain and Ireland have become largely reliant on descendants of two sons of Northern Dancer--Sadler's Wells and Danzig. No fewer than 12 of the 18 group winners came from one or other of these lines.

Galileo, Montjeu and Beat Hollow were the three Sadler's Wells sons with a stakes winner to their credit. Galileo and Montjeu both enjoyed the distinction of having a Group 1 winner, while a fourth son, High Chaparral, fell just a neck short of that target when So You Think was unexpectedly beaten in the Prince of Wales's S.

The Danzig male line did even better, providing three of the meeting's five other Group 1 winners.

The Green Desert branch more than held its own in the white-hot competition, with Oasis Dream achieving a notable group-race double with Prohibit and Power, while Cape Cross scored with Namibian.

It was the Danehill branch, though, which dominated, as so often in the past. Five sons--Rock of Gibraltar, Tiger Hill, Exceed and Excel, Holy Roman Emperor and Oratorio--collectively supplied a total of six group winners, while another five--Aussie Rules, Cacique, Chevalier, Danehill Dancer and Dansili--had group-placed progeny.

This domination reflects the way that Danehill has come to permeate Coolmore's stallion roster in Ireland. Of the 23 stallions standing the 2011 season, eight (Aussie Rules, Danehill Dancer, Duke of Marmalade, Dylan Thomas, Fastnet Rock, Holy Roman Emperor, Oratorio and Rock of Gibraltar) are sons of Danehill and another four (Alfred Nobel, Choisir, Mastercraftsman and Strategic Prince) are grandsons. There's even a great-grandson in Starspangledbanner, which boosts the total to 13. As six of the other 10 are members of the Sadler's Wells line, it is easy to understand why Coolmore has been on the lookout for top-class performers whose pedigrees will bring in some different bloodlines.

Although the Aussie superstar So You Think is a grandson of Sadler's Wells and is inbred 3x4 to Northern Dancer, his first 13 dams were bred in Australasia, mainly in New Zealand. He therefore has plenty of scope as a mate for Danehill's many descendants.

The Coolmore partners also stepped in to secure the stallion services of Goldikova's conqueror Canford Cliffs. A Royal Ascot victory adds lustre to any future stallion's C.V., but Canford Cliffs now boasts three. These Royal Ascot wins came in the G1Coventry S., G1 St James's Palace S. and G1 Queen Anne S.--arguably the three races most likely to endear him to today's breeders.

Although his pedigree couldn't be described as fashionable, the same could have been said of Indian Ridge, a dual Royal Ascot group winner who made a major impact as a stallion.

Part of Canford Cliffs' appeal stems from the fact that he has comparatively little Northern Dancer blood by today's standards. His sire Tagula has no Northern Dancer blood and neither of the two lines in the bottom half of Canford Cliffs' pedigree will appear in the first four generations of Canford Cliffs' progeny.

Canford Cliffs had every right to be a talented, quick-maturing juvenile, as Tagula had also run well in the Coventry S., prior to recording victories in the G3 July S. and G1 Prix Morny. Tagula was later a fine third in the 1996 G1 French 2,000 Guineas and landed another group victory, this time over seven furlongs, before being recruited to Rathbarry Stud as a replacement for his sire Taufan.

Taufan had helped transform Rathbarry into one of Ireland's leading stallion stations, even though this son of Stop The Music had retired without a stakes win to his credit. He had been good enough to finish second in the 1979 G2 Mill Reef S. and the 1980 Tote Free H. before a back injury compromised his career. Taufan had the added attraction of coming from a family which was rapidly improving its status, as his dam, Stolen Date, was a half-sister to Best In Show, Kentucky's Broodmare of the Year for 1982.

Taufan became leading sire by number of winners in 1987 and leading sire by number of races won in 1989 and 1991. He twice sired more domestic 2-year-old winners than any other stallion, but one thing he hadn't done was sire the winner of a Group 1 race until Tagula took the 1995 Prix Morny.

Tagula wasted little time in proving a worthy substitute for his dependable father, with a pair of Group 2 winners among his four first-crop stakes winners. He has since been represented by such talented performers as Tax Free, King Orchisios, Beaver Patrol and Pentecost. However, like Taufan before him, Tagula had a long wait for his first Group 1 success as a sire, which finally came when Canford Cliffs took the G1 Irish 2,000 Guineas.

Now a five-time Group 1 winner, Canford Cliffs was a £50,000 yearling purchase at Doncaster. He was also the first Group 1 winner out of a mare by Marju, winner of the St. James's Palace S. after finishing second in the Derby. Other daughters of Marju have produced Marcellina, winner of the 2011 G1 Japanese 1,000 Guineas, and the up-and-coming stallion Big Bad Bob.

Canford Cliffs' dam Mrs Marsh, a half-sister to the very useful Pina Colada, was unraced, but his third dam, Triple Tipple, enjoyed substantial success in California after showing smart format up to a mile and a quarter in Europe.

No doubt Canford Cliffs will eventually shuttle to Australia, where his female line has been represented by the exceptional mare Makybe Diva, who shares the same fifth dam, the Santa Barbara H. winner Amerigo's Fancy.

It would have been tough for Ron Magers--who anchors the desk for Chicago's top-rated newscast ABC 7, and a longtime owner/breeder--to imagine that, 20 years after dropping in a \$16,000 claiming slip for

remained unbeaten in two juvenile starts with a smart 5 3/4-length victory in the \$150,000 Victoria S. at Woodbine. The bay colt, who runs under the banner R Plus Partners, is trained by Ralph Biamonte and has now earned \$126,495, following a rallying first-out victory at Woodbine May 15 with his Victoria S. win.

Lemhi Go (Lemhi Gold), he'd be racing her grandchildren. But he is. And last Saturday, Magers's homebred **Banner Bill** (Rockport Harbor), who's dam **Temporada** (Summer Squall) is a daughter of Lemhi Go,

Saturday's victory was more the continuation than the culmination of Magers's involvement with a family that, through two decades, has taken a circuitous route. And that's putting it mildly. Born in California, Magers grew up in eastern Washington State and nurtured a love of racing at the local bush tracks as a youngster.

Later, when the newsman moved to Chicago in the early 1980s, he bought into a few racing partnerships--more on this later. But in 1991, he and his wife Elise decided to strike out on their own and claim a filly at nearby Arlington Park. They landed on a 3-year-old filly named Lemhi Go, who was in for a modest \$16,000 tag. The filly had three previous wins--all in claiming company--and was a popular commodity that day. Ron and Elise won a five-way shake for her. What happened next didn't approach Lava Man-ish levels, but still was unexpected by everyone: Lemhi Go improved dramatically as she got older and more experienced, first winning a few allowance races, then, six months later, taking down her first stakes. During a busy 18-race campaign at 4, she added the Gill Arlington Matron H., and at five she secured a career best in the Gil La Prevoyante Invitational H. By the time she was retired, the former claimer had won 12 of 41 starts and earned \$330,805.

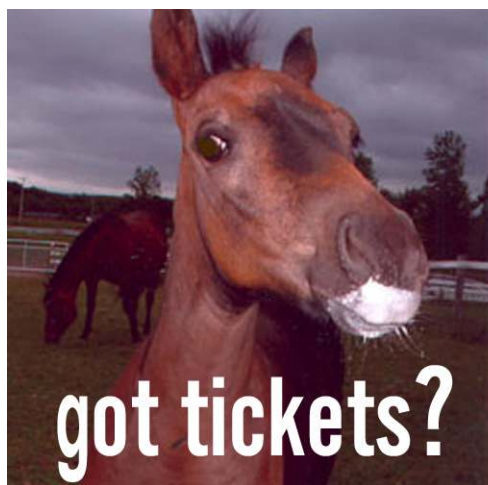
"The whole thing was lightning in a bottle," Magers laughed Sunday. "She just grew up before our eyes, and we made a lot of money with her on the track."

Lemhi Go wasn't done yet, though. Magers sent her to bloodstock agent Bill Betz in Kentucky to be sold as a broodmare prospect. One day, Betz called Magers up to see if he could change his mind about selling the mare--at least right away.

said Magers. "So Bill and I, and Bill's partner at the time, Phil Needham, bred her and sold her first foal to Prince Ahmed bin Salman for \$650,000 as a yearling. We kept her second foal, then sold her in foal to Unbridled for \$400,000 [to Cheveley Park Stud]."

Lemhi Go's first foal, Triple Treasure (Gone West), raced for bin Salman's The Thoroughbred Corp., and later went on to be the dam of the fast Bobby Frankel-trained sprinter Les Grands Trois (Officer). Her second foal, the one the partnership retained, was Temporada, Banner Bill's dam. Temporada showed promise early on, winning her debut in 1999, but a breathing problem prompted her early retirement to the breeding shed.

"This is when the story gets crazier," said Magers. "We thought Temporada's first few foals were going to be really good. She had a colt named Stormy Afternoon (Afternoon Deelites); he was stakes placed, but then died of a heart attack in the summer of his 3-year-old year on the racetrack one morning. Then her daughter Azevedo (Mr. Greeley), who won at Churchill at first asking in 2005, had a little knee chip taken out and was rehabbing in Kentucky, and there was a barn fire, and she was consumed in the fire."

It was a string of terrible luck. To make matters worse, Magers was so confident about Azevedo's ability that, figuring he had a promising female member of the family, he had sold Temporada. Sent through the 2003 Keeneland November Sale, Temporada realized a bid of \$26,000 while in foal to Chief Seattle.

But good news soon came. Roughly a year after the tragic barn fire, Magers's friend Robert Marcocchio, a longtime bloodstock agent, rang him up to let him know that Temporada was back on the market, and had been entered in the November sale once again. Magers jumped at the chance to buy back into the family, and in 2007 went to \$19,000 to re-acquire Temporada while in foal to Kafwain. Marcocchio went in for 20%.

The resulting Kafwain foal, the now 3-year-old filly (and aptly named) Third Chance, rewarded Magers's faith in the family by becoming Temporada's first stakes winner. Racing for Magers, Marcocchio and a third friend, Roe Conn, the Illinois-bred Third Chance finished third in last year's GIII Arlington-Washington Futurity S., then two starts later aired by nearly seven lengths in the restricted, \$100,000 Showtime Deb S. at Hawthorne. Fifth in the GII Forward Gal S. at Gulfstream earlier in the year, Third Chance will run in a state-bred stakes at Arlington Park this weekend.

Banner Bill is now Temporada's second straight black-type winner, and the sidebars continue with the Victoria S. hero. Marcocchio had won the Victoria before...way back in 1982. That stakes win came by way of the colt Flying Pocket (Full Pocket), who was partnered nearly 30 years ago with jockey David Clark. Banner Bill's rider last Saturday? David Clark.

Banner Bill, it should be noted, is named after the late Bill Walsh, a friend of Magers and Marcocchio's who passed away a year ago. Back in the early '80s, Marcocchio had purchased a horse for Walsh named Banner Bob (Herculean), a grandson of Bold Ruler who proved a very good runner, winning the GII Malibu S. and GIII Hutcheson S. as a 3-year-old. Banner Bob wasn't much of a sire, getting just a single stakes winner from 120 foals. That stakes winner, however, was Regal Pennant, second dam of Rockport Harbor. Thus when it came time to name Temporada's latest foal, it seemed appropriate to call him Banner Bill. Magers and Marcocchio also offered Walsh's widow Sharon a 5% interest in Banner Bill, and, having accepted, Sharon was one of the crew who made the trip to Woodbine last weekend. "I think it's been very rejuvenating for her," said Magers.

Temporada currently has a yearling colt by City Zip, a weanling full-sister to Banner Bill on the ground, and is back in foal to Bernstein.

Magers typically has two or three horses in training each year, and has campaigned, among others, the stakes winner Song of Africa (Alzao). In addition, Magers is also involved in a number of commercial breeding partnerships, many with Betz.

If so many storylines can derive from just one mare, it shouldn't be surprising that Magers's entry into the sport back in the 1980s carries its own interesting tale. Relates Magers, "My wife and I were at Gulfstream attending the races one day, and we were literally walking out of the place on our way to the airport to come home to Chicago when my wife walked across the horse path and noticed something glittering. It looked like a diamond bracelet, a tennis bracelet, so I said, 'It's probably one of those fake things. Throw it in your purse--we're about to miss our plane--and we'll call Gulfstream later and try to figure it out.' So the next day we called a jeweler friend of mine and had him look at it, and he said that it was real and actually quite valuable. I had another friend, a lawyer, call Gulfstream and tell them we had found 'something of value,' and if anyone reports something lost, have them get in touch with us. A few days passed, and we got a phone call from a guy from California who said his wife had lost a tennis bracelet, and was offering a \$2,000 reward for it. He sent us a picture of her wearing it, and sure enough, it was the same bracelet. We told him to just send the reward to one of our favorite charities--the Greater Chicago Food Depository--so he'd get a deduction and his bracelet, and everybody would feel good about it." **Cont. p4**



So how did this lead to Magers owning horses? "Well, not long after that, I got a call from a guy who said, 'You don't know me, but I know you,'" Magers said. "He said, 'I know your lawyer, and he told me about the diamond bracelet, and he told me you were interested in horses, and we have a racing partnership. And we want you to get involved. The way we figure it, anyone stupid enough to give that bracelet back needs to be in racing!'"

And when Magers bought his first horse--Lemhi Go--he duly dubbed his operation Diamond Stable, whose black silks featured a white diamond on the back.
