BERNSTEIN COLT SETS RECORD AT OBSJUN

A colt by Bernstein out of Within (Rahy) brought a final bid of \$300,000 to top the opening session of the OBS June Sale Tuesday. It was a record for the auction. Consigned by Texas-based Robert Brewer as

hip 16, the dark bay was purchased by EQB's Patrice Miller, agent. Brewer picked up the juvenile for \$31,000 at the 2010 FTKOCT sale. From the family of champion Chief's Crown, he worked a furlong in a bullet :10 flat (video) at the preview. "What a nice horse he was!" Miller exclaimed. "He was a stand-out, and he would be a stand-out at any sale. We were sent here to look for a stand-out, and darned if we didn't find one." The horsewoman, who declined to name the client involved, would have been at a loss to find anything negative to say about her purchase. "He had a fabulous

breeze, he galloped out well, he had a tremendous cardio," she said, adding, "He had a pristine vetting, and he had a lot of attitude--he was very calm. It's hard to find one that jumps through all our hoops, but he did." Despite the glowing review, however, Miller was hoping she could get the colt for a bit less money. Unfortunately, bloodstock agent David Ingordo was also in the mix. "The bidding went flying up there," Miller said. "I just made two bids, and I wasn't going a whole lot further, either. We hoped we wouldn't have to pay that much, but we think he is a very special horse. We really loved him, and we were delighted to get him." Miller was quick to praise the care taken with the colt prior to the sale. "They did the right thing by not pushing him into an earlier sale; they took their time with him," she said. Cont. p2

Susan Magnier's Recital (Fr) (Montjeu {Ire}) has been taken out of consideration for Sunday's G1 Dubai Duty Free Irish Derby at The Curragh. The G2 Derrinstown Stud Derby Trial winner was sixth in the G1 Epsom Derby June 4. Annemarie O'Brien Tweeted, "We weren't 100% happy with Recital this morning, so he will not run in the Derby. Roderic O'Connor (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) will be left in the race, and is a possible to run instead." The G1 Irish 2000 Guineas hero heads a strong quartet for Aidan O'Brien, along with Treasure Beach (GB) (Galileo {Ire}), Memphis Tennessee (Ire) (Hurricane Run {Ire}) and Seville (Ger) (Galileo {Ire}). They will face The Queen's Carlton House (Street Cry {Ire}), Ibrahim Araci's Native Khan (Fr) (Azamour {Ire}), John Connaughton's Dunboyne Express (Ire) (Shamardal), Jaber Abdullah's Best Hello (GB) (Beat Hollow {GB}) and Moyglare Stud's Notable Graduate (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}).

Something's Brewing...

Robert Brewer hadn't intended to make his first trip to the OBS June Sale with his Bernstein colt. The Kentucky-bred was entered at the Fasig-Tipton Midlantic Sale in May, but suffered a setback.

"He had a little injury," Brewer explained. "He cut his hind leg in the stall, and I had to let it heal up before I could continue on with him. Timing-wise, it backed me up." But, after such a successful debut at the sale, he said, "I like it here--I just might come back."

A fifth-generation horseman and competitive team roper, Brewer was at the Fasig-Tipton sale last October when he came across a yearling that caught his eye.

"He was very correct, he had all the parts, and he looked really fast," the Texas native remarked. "He was my kind of horse."

But the April foal looked to be out of his price range. "I figured I'd probably get outrun for him," Brewer said. He was counting his blessings when the bidding stalled at \$31,000. "I was willing to give a lot more for him," he admitted. "I was scratching my head a little bit about how I got him for that kind of money. But it was late in the evening on the third day. I'm sure that helped, but I was a little shocked."

Already big and handsome, the yearling kept going in the right direction, prompting the consignor to state, "He's the best horse I've ever bought at a sale."

Brewer knew from an early age that he would make his living in horse racing. "I've been in [the Thoroughbred business] my whole life," he explained. "My great great granddaddy brought the first Thoroughbreds to Texas. It's what we all did, and it's all I know how to do. My granddaddy trained, and I worked for him. I started training in 1992, and I've been pinhooking full-time since 2003."

Brewer handles 20 to 30 horses each year, and the majority go through the ring at the Fasig-Tipton Texas Two-Year-Olds in Training Sale. He sent 28 to that venue this year, a consignment headed by a Fusaichi Pegasus filly he'd bought for \$16,000 at KEESEP and pinhooked for \$48,000, a typical result for the Texan.

The Bernstein colt was in a class by himself, and he proved it when he posted the bullet work at the under-tack show. But the move came as no surprise.

"I expected him to breeze exactly like that," Brewer said. "He went real smooth, and he wasn't having to go real hard to go that fast. He does it easily--mechanically, it's not hard for that horse."

Still, he had his expectations--and his reserve--set considerably lower than the hammer price.

"I didn't know what to expect--I thought I might be in the wrong sale to get the big money," Brewer said.

And when the bidding stopped at \$300,000?

"I was impressed," he offered. "I'm just trying to make a living, and if he'd brought half that, it would have made me smile. I don't get stupid; I don't shoot for the stars. I sell to make money, and he did that plus some."

Shumoos Heads for Newmarket...

Trainer Brian Meehan yesterday announced that **TDN Rising Star** **Shumoos** (Distorted Humor) will run in the G2 Cherry Hinton S. at Newmarket July 8. Beaten a short head by Best Terms (GB) (Exceed and Excel {Aus}) in Wednesday's G2 Queen Mary S. at Royal Ascot, the Fawzi Abdulla Nass-owned filly will step up in trip for the July Festival contest. "She's in great form and is a powerful filly, so she has cantered a few times since," Meehan said. "The great thing to take out of the race is that she is going to improve for six furlongs, and the Cherry Hinton is the plan."

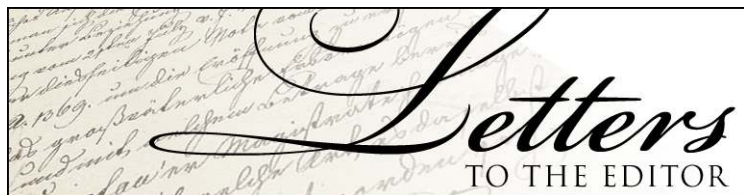

'Suit' to France?

Trainer Richard Hannon suggested that the G1 Prix Jean Prat July 3 at Chantilly is the target for **Strong Suit** (Rahy) following his success in last Wednesday's G3 Jersey S. at Royal Ascot. Julie Wood's sophomore, who returned to the form that saw him capture the G2 Coventry S. at the 2010 meeting, could bid for a first top-level win in the mile contest across the Channel. "We always knew that Strong Suit was very good, but now that he has won his Group 3 and Group 2, the logical route is Group 1, and the Jean Prat looks the right race for him," Hannon said. "Ascot was a career-best for him, as the official handicapper has put him up three pounds to 116, so we are entitled to aim for the stars." Hannon also revealed that the same day's G2 Queen Mary S. winner **Best Terms (GB)** (Exceed and Excel {Aus}) would take in York's G2 Lowther S. Aug. 18. "[Past Queen Mary winners] Fly Baby, Lyric Fantasy, Risky and Gilded were all very good fillies, but Best Terms would be right up there with them," Hannon added. "She is only small, but she is very quick, and York would suit her."

ASCOT DOUBLES

The 2011 edition of Royal Ascot, the world's greatest week of racing, is in the books. The last three of the week's five days were run in steadily deteriorating conditions, yet over 294,000 people came through the turnstiles--an increase of four percent over 2010, when weather conditions were much better. It's a mighty impressive 'gate,' demonstrating that there are conditions when horse racing can still draw big crowds and generate great enthusiasm. It seems to be a combination of top-class racing (with reasonable-to-big fields) and a big dash of glamour; clearly a winning formula, and one which Royal Ascot succeeds in presenting, in spades. Some of us still aren't in love with the new stand, but, citing 'hospitality' increases of 12 percent, the much-improved viewing from boxes and ground-floor loges is a big plus.

Aidan O'Brien won leading trainer plaudits, both in races won (four) and money won (over £477,000), with Richard Hannon runner-up on both counts, with three winners and earners of over £364,000. Five different conditioners scored doubles, including three trainers whose doubles came on each of the last three days. Trainer Hughie Morrison had a double on Thursday with two 3-year-olds, Sagamor (Pastoral Pursuits) in the one-mile Britannia H. and Pisco Sour (Lemon Drop Kid) in the 10-furlong G3 Tercentenary S. On Friday, trainer John Gosden saddled 3-year-old Nathaniel (Galileo) to win the 12-furlong G2 King Edward VII S. and the 4-year-old Beachfire (Indian Haven) to score in the 10-furlong Listed Wolferton H. Then, on Saturday, trainer James Fanshawe had a staggering six-furlong double in back-to-back races, when the 4-year-old Society Rock (Rock of Gibraltar), second in the race as a 3-year-old last year, went one better to win the G1 Golden Jubilee S., and followed up a half-hour later when the 4-year-old Deacon Place (Compton Place) won the meet's big sprint handicap, the Wokingham. Other trainer doubles were accomplished by Mark Johnston, who won the two-mile G3 Queen's Vase on Friday with Namibian (Cape Cross) and the 12-furlong Duke of Edinburgh H. on Saturday with Fox Hunt (Dubawi), both for Sheikh Mohammed's son, Sheikh Hamdan bin Mohammed. Young Tom Dascombe, in his second season at star footballer (soccer variety) Michael Owen's Manor House Stables, doubled up with two 3-year-olds, the filly Rhythm of Light (Beat Hollow) in the one-mile Sandringham H. on Wednesday, and the ultra-impressive Shirocco colt Brown Panther (also bred by Owen), who slaughtered the field in the 12-furlong King George V. H. to close out Thursday's card.

With 30 races over the five days, there are obviously 90 top-three placings up for grabs. Twelve stallions hit the board at least twice, including four which had two or more winners each.



Maybe *Racing Post*

Coolmore's world number one Galileo and Darley's Cape Cross had three winners each, but Galileo is awarded top spot because he had three additional placings, and also won the money title, with the earners of over £310,000. Galileo's three winners

were: 3-year-old Frankel in the one-mile G1 St. James's Palace S. on Tuesday; another 3-year-old, Nathaniel, who won the 12-furlong G2 King Edward VII S. on Friday; and the 2-year-old Maybe, winner of the seven-furlong Chesham S. (L) on Saturday. Cape Cross's three winners were: the 4-year-old Julienas, winner of the one-mile Royal Hunt Cup H. on Wednesday; and a double on Friday, the 3-year-old Namibian in the two-mile G3 Queen's Vase, and the 6-year-old Manassas, winner of the seven-furlong Buckingham Palace H.

Juddmonte's Oasis Dream and Coolmore's Rock of Gibraltar had two winners each, though Oasis Dream had two placings also, meaning with four wins or placings he was second to Galileo among top-three finishers. Oasis Dream's two winners both came last Tuesday: 6-year-old Prohibit in the five-furlong G1 King's Stand; and 2-year-old Power in the six-furlong G2 Coventry. Rock of Gibraltar had the 2-year-old Samitar, winner of the six-furlong G3 Albany S. (fillies) on Friday; and the aforementioned 4-year-old Society Rock.

Interestingly, of the 12 stallions with two or more top-three placings during the week, no fewer than 10 stand or stood at either Coolmore or one of the Darley farms. The two exceptions were Oasis Dream (Juddmonte) and Selkirk (Lanwades, two placings). Besides Galileo (three wins, six top-three placings) and Rock of Gibraltar (two wins), four other current (two) or former (two) Coolmore sires doubled up, each with two placings: current Coolmore sires Danehill Dancer and High Chaparral, and former Coolmore sires Chevalier and Hawk Wing. Besides Cape Cross, Darley's other three were: Exceed and Excel (one win, two placings); deceased Singspiel (three placings, all in either the 2 1/2 mile Ascot H. or the 2 3/4-mile Queen Alexandra [conditions] S., in which he ran one-three); and Kheylef (two placings).

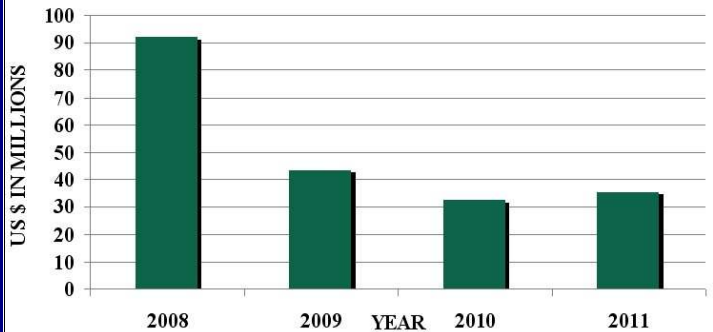
Weekly Sales Ticker

"The nine percent rise in gross in first-half sales to date from 2010 brings the drop in first-half gross since 2008 back to \$107-million, or 37 percent of the 2008 total of \$288-million. But the 2-year-old market, which we reviewed last week (OBS this week last major sale), is down 26 percent (just over \$50-million), whereas the first-half mixed sales (NA & EU combined) were down \$57-million from \$92-million in 2008, or a whopping 61 percent. Combining all first-half sales so far, the number sold is down by just under 1,000, while the combined average is down by 24 percent from 2008."

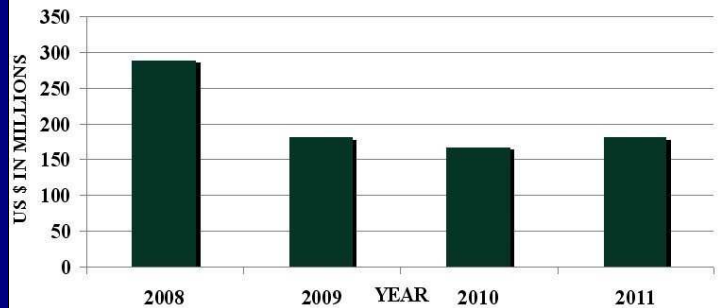

Four third-crop sires (meaning their oldest crop is now four) hit the board. Coolmore's Oratorio sired Lolly for Dolly, a 4-year-old filly from his first crop who won the one-mile G2 Windsor Forest S. for fillies and mares. Darley's Dubawi, the leading third-crop sire by progeny earnings and in practically all other categories, had Fox Hunt, from his first crop, win the 12-furlong Duke of Edinburgh H. The English



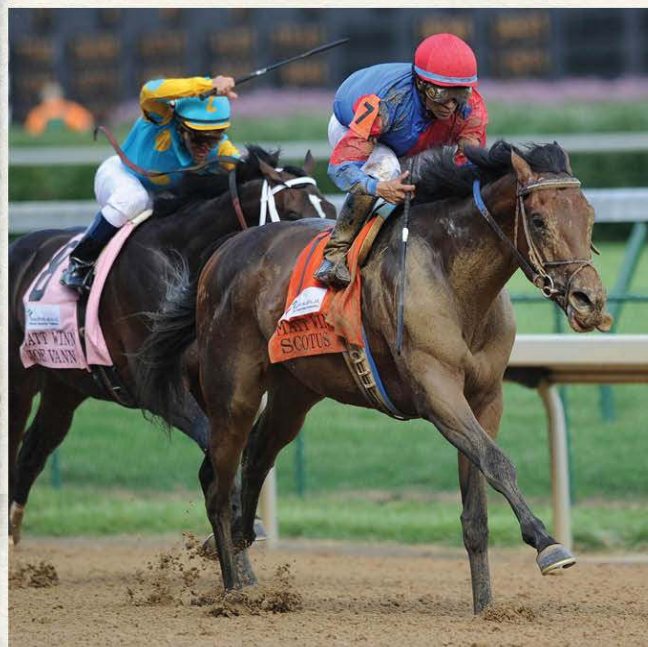

National Stud's Pastoral Pursuit, who won the six-furlong G1 July Cup as a 4-year-old in 2005, sired 3-year-old Sagamor, winner of the one-mile Britannia H. for 3-year-olds, and the 4-year-old Pastoral Player, third in the six-furlong Wokingham H. Pastoral Pursuits is by Bahamian Bounty (Cadeaux Genereux), who also stands at The National Stud. Pastoral Pursuits now puts himself a little bit more on the radar. If he keeps getting his name in the paper his commercial profile could be enhanced later in the year. Coolmore's Footstepsinthesand also had two placegetters, G2 Windsor Forest S. runner-up Chachamaidee, a 4-year-old filly; and Barefoot Lady, a 3-year-old filly who ran third in Friday's G1 Coronation S. Both races were at one mile.

Eight second-crop sires (meaning their oldest crop is now three) had one or two top-three finishers each. Leading European second-crop sire Holy Roman Emperor, from Coolmore, had the winner of the 12-furlong G2 Ribblesdale S., the 3-year-old filly Banimpire, as well as the second in the six-furlong G2 Coventry, 2-year-old colt Roman Soldier. Cheveley Park's deceased Iceman, as I mentioned last week, had the opening-day 2-year-old Windsor Palace S. (L) winner, Frederick Engels; and Darley's Shirocco had the impressive 12-furlong King George V. H. winner Brown Panther mentioned earlier (footballer Owen, trainer Dascombe), one of a raft of good 12-furlong 3-year-olds by Shirocco to have appeared in the last month or so. Cacique, the Juddmonte full brother to Dansili who we also mentioned last week as unfortunately having had to be retired because of infertility, racked up two more group placings, both 3-year-olds: Slumber, who ran third in the 10-furlong G3 Tercentenary S., and Census, second to Brown Panther in the 12-furlong King George V. H.

Four other second-crop sires had placegetters-- Darley's Iffraaj, whose 3-year-old Cai Shen ran second in the one-mile Britannia H.; Coolmore's Aussie Rules, the 2-year-old Boomerang Boy, second in the five-furlong G2 Norfolk S.; and 'neutral' Firebreak, sire of the 100-1 shot Caledonia Lady, third in the five-furlong Queen Mary, for 2-year-old fillies; and Norse Dancer, sire of the 3-year-old filly Dorcas Lane, third in the Ribblesdale.

Three first-crop sires registered placings with their 2-year-olds. Red Clubs, a son of Red Ransom who stood at Ireland's Tally-Ho Stud, unfortunately became infertile and then died, but sired the filly Illauglass, third in the six-furlong G3 Albany. He also sired a Group 3 winner in Italy on Sunday, and thus edged ahead of Dark Angel among 2011 freshman sires by progeny earnings. The ultra-promising Lawman sired

the seven-furlong Chesham S. (L) second Fort Bastion; while Dutch Art, third on the current freshman sire list ([click here](#)), sired the five-furlong Windsor Castle (L) third Captain Netscher. I do

recommend having a good browse through the TDN Sire lists ([click here](#)) on a regular (daily) basis, to see who's where and doing what. For example, on our year-to-date leading sire list ([click here](#)), Galileo has now attained the top spot. He is ahead of Tiger Hill, sire of the 4-year-old Rewilding, who upset So You Think in the G1 Prince of Wales's S. In his previous start, Rewilding was impressive taking the G1 Sheema Classic on Dubai World Cup night (Dubai earnings are included in the TDN figures).

Finally, a note about the broodmare sires of the 90 top-three finishers. Galileo was the top sire, with three winners and three placegetters; his sire Sadler's Wells was the top broodmare sire, also with three winners and three placegetters. Danehill, another Coolmore sire, had four top-three finishers, three winners and a second; the three winners included two by Galileo (Frankel and Maybe), and one by Beat Hollow (Rhythm of Light), also a son of Sadler's Wells. Three damsires had three top-three finishers: Machiavellian (one winner, two seconds); Woodman (one winner, two other placegetters); and, perhaps surprisingly, Desert Prince, who had three seconds in handicaps as a broodmare sire.

Click [here](#) to see a sortable Excel file with the 90 placegetters in the 30 Royal Ascot races, compiled from the Racing Post website (www.racingpost.com). RPR ratings are a version of speed figures using the '126' scale (also used by Timeform and in the U.S. for Experimental Free Handicaps and the like). Everybody's calculations are a little bit different, but you get an idea. You'll see that in some races the second or third might have a higher RPR than the winners; those are usually in handicaps, and the lower/higher ratings are ascribable to differences in the weight carried.

NJ Bill Moves Out of Committee:

The legislation that would finalize an abbreviated Thoroughbred racing calendar in New Jersey in 2011 passed out of committee Monday, and now is up for a vote by the state Senate. Current law mandates 141 racing days in the Garden State annually; a temporary measure was passed last year to allow for the experimental "Elite Meet" at Monmouth Park. Thoroughbred horsemen are still in negotiations with Monmouth regarding a racing schedule and purses, but the bill is expected to pass in both the Senate and the House without opposition.

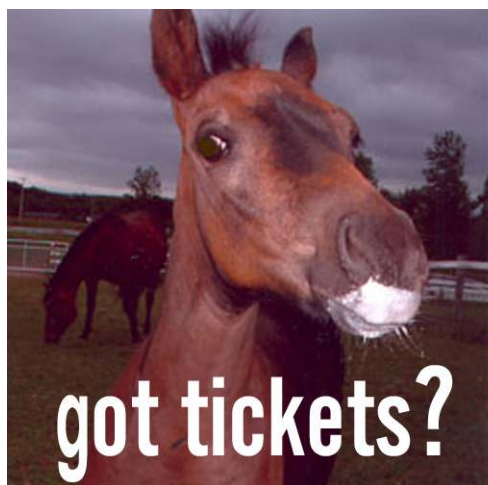

He published a landmark Breeders Racehorse Ownership survey, represented the industry on numerous government and racing consultative bodies and spoke for breeders on such public issues as animal welfare, artificial insemination and coal mining encroaching on farming land." Aushorse Marketing Chairman Antony Thompson said that McGauran also played a pivotal role in establishing the new promotions and marketing arm of the Thoroughbred industry. "Peter has proved to be a respected and effective ambassador for the Australian industry throughout our key markets and the introduction of sustained 2-year-old racing in Singapore is largely due to his organisational skills. Aushorse Marketing has a lot of territory to cover, including the all important domestic market, and Peter did it with energy and purpose." Lobb and Thompson wished McGauran well for the future and expressed the hope he would retain an involvement in the Thoroughbred industry. McGauran will continue in the role for several weeks while a search for his successor is undertaken.

The Special Olympics will be held from June 25-July 4. Approximately 7,500 Special Olympics athletes from 185 nations are set to compete in 22 Olympic-type sports. Equestrian competition will be held June 27-July 3.

PERUVIAN BREEDERS ENJOY STRONG SALE

Szen Sza Szional (Per), a colt from the second crop of Peruvian leading freshman sire Flanders Fields (A.P. Indy), set a record to highlight Monday night's first session of the Peruvian Breeders Association select sale, Peru's premier yearling sale. Stakes-placed Flanders Field, out of champion and GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies heroine Flanders (Seeking the Gold), is a half-brother to 2000 champion 3-year-old filly Surfside (Seattle Slew) and GSW Battle Plan (Empire Maker). Leading buyer Jet Set Racing Stable, whose Peruvian dual Classic winner Tomcito (Street Cry {Ire}) finished third in the 2008 GI Florida Derby, paid \$62,000 for the colt. He was offered by Haras San Pablo, the evening's leading consignor at an average of \$44,666. Szen Sza Szional is the first foal out of 2007 Peruvian champion grass mare Sza Sza Gabor (Per) (Shuailaan). The 40 colts offered in the catalog sold for an aggregate of \$906,000, with an average price of \$22,650. Professional soccer players Claudio Pizarro and Paolo Guerrero, members of Peru's national team and colleagues in the German Bundesliga, also participated in the sale. Pizarro's Stud El Catorce went to \$31,000 for an unnamed colt from the first crop of Philosophy (Gone West), from the consignment of Haras Gina Santa Rosa. Guerrero's Stud Diego Enrique went to \$32,000 for a son of Pegasus Wind (Fusaichi Pegasus) from the family of champions Dushanbe (Per) (Riyadian {GB}) and Chispeao (Per) (Sharaf {Per}), and to \$23,000 for a colt by Privately Held (Private Account). Guerrero runners Dilange (Per) (Unbridle's King), a colt, and filly Cubage (Per) (Quintillon), a filly, are the early favorites to win their division of Sunday's Clasico Selectos, Peru's richest races for 2-year-olds. Wednesday's session of selected fillies will conclude the two-day sale.
