On a day that features nine graded stakes across North America, the lone Grade I will be held at Belmont in the form of the \$250,000 Mother Goose S. Fox Hill

Farm's **Joyful Victory** (Tapit) will be looking for a bit of redemption after finishing a troubled fourth as the 2-1 choice in the GI Kentucky Oaks at Churchill May 6. "There was some traffic and I don't think she was able to do her running when she wanted," said trainer Larry Jones.

"She's a big, long-striding filly, and she needed to be cruising faster than she was able to [in the Oaks]." The grey filly began

her career with trainer Tony Dutrow, and concluded her time with him by finishing fifth in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies. Owner Rick Porter moved a number of his horses back to Larry Jones when the affable conditioner returned from a brief hiatus, and Joyful Victory romped in her first two starts at Oaklawn this season before coming up short once more under the Twin Spires. "If you look at her race in the Breeders' Cup last year when Tony had her, it was the same kind of race, and the outcomes were similar," Jones pointed out. He added, "Rick Porter picked out this spot for her after the Oaks. We gave her a little time after that race and she's been steadily picking it up in her works, so I believe we've got her where we want her." **Cont. p5-6**

Goose, but wound up not making the flight. Though trainer Bob Baffert put her name in the entry box for today's GII Hollywood Oaks, he'll make a game-day decision on her participation. "I worked her the other day, and the next day she was kind of quiet," Baffert told *Daily*

Racing Form. "I took the blood and it was normal. I just didn't feel comfortable putting her on the plane. [Tuesday], she was full of herself. I'll watch her until Saturday. We'll make the call that day." **Cont. p6-7**

KNEE SURGERY FOR DIALED IN

Robert LaPenta's GI Florida Derby hero **Dialed In** (Mineshaft) has ben sidelined due to a chip in his right knee. In a statement, trainer Nick Zito said Friday, "Dialed In will be out of training for awhile. We noticed there was something different with the knee. Dr. [Joe] Migliacci took some X-rays, on May 25, which was after the Preakness, and there was no problem, but there is now. Dr. [Larry]

Bramlage will do the surgery next week, and he will be back in training soon. Bob LaPenta and I, and all my staff, were looking forward to the Travers. Unfortunately, that will not happen. I am grateful that he was the favorite in the Kentucky Derby and ran in the Preakness for the \$5-million bonus. But I am disappointed, along with Bob, that he did not get a fair chance in those races. Hopefully, as a 4-year-old, he will get back to where he belongs." Dialed In was purchased by LaPenta for \$475,000 at FTSAUG 2009. An impressive maiden winner in his debut at Churchill in November, he won the GIII Holy Bull S. and \$1 million Florida Derby at Gulfstream, and was sent off the 5-1 favorite in the May 7 GI Kentucky Derby. Eighth on the first Saturday in May, he followed up with a fourth in the May 21 GI Preakness S. The 3-year-old has compiled a record of 6-3-1-0 and earnings of \$939,206.

The Queen's **Carlton House** will face just seven rivals after the likely outsider Best Hello (GB) (Beat Hollow {GB}) was scratched yesterday, meaning that this year's renewal sees the smallest field assembled since Generous (Ire) beat only five rivals in 1991. While Epsom Derby second and third **Treasure Beach** and Carlton House have drawn outside posts in seven and eight, with so few runners and a likely strong pace, that is unlikely to play a major factor in the outcome. One who has escaped under the radar is Ibrahim Araci's **Native Khan**, whose name became embroiled in the High Court battle between his owner and Kieren Fallon, but whose form stands up to the closest inspection. Successful in the G3 Craven S. at Newmarket Apr. 14, the grey was third to Frankel (GB) (Galileo {Ire}) in the G1 2000 Guineas back there 16 days later before running creditably to be fifth despite getting tight for room late on at Epsom. Just 1 1/2 lengths separated him from Carlton House and Treasure Beach in that June 4 Classic, and the likely odds difference between the trio is unjustified. He exits from the five hole which, historically, could be a lucky omen for the superstitious as that was the stall from which a quartet of Derby winners emerged including Galileo (Ire). "He's come out of the Derby well, and we're confident enough that he just about stayed at Epsom, but we're under no illusions that it's going to be very tough again and maybe more of a stamina test," trainer Ed Dunlop said. "It's his last chance of running in a Classic against his own generation and in time we may well drop him in

trip, but we've every right to be there, and he's in very good form. At Epsom, he got a little bit trapped down on the rail and Johnny [Murtagh] felt he could have finished a length and a half closer." Dunlop is keen that the ground stays good. "He is such a good mover and he floats over

fast ground, so the more it dries out the better," he added. "Johnny is adamant that, while The Curragh is more of a stamina track than Epsom, it will suit Native Khan better, so we go there with a good shout." The first of Dermot Weld's two Irish Derby heroes Zagreb (Theatrical {Ire}) was second on his previous start in a Leopardstown conditions race. Hoping that history can repeat is Moyglare Stud, whose **Notable Graduate** was also an odds-on failure in the Listed Alleged S. Over 11 furlongs at that venue last time June 9. Racing Manager Stan Cosgrove told *PA Sport*, "He's in good order, and I think he'll run a good race. It's a step up for him, but if you're not in you can't win, and I think he's improved since Leopardstown. It was also only a mile and three that day, and he'll be a better horse over a mile and a half. He'd like a bit of give in the ground, and I think it's going to rain tonight, which is good news. I think he's around 25-1, and I think he's worth backing each-way at that price."

VEFA IBRAHIM ARACI - NativeKhan (Fr) The 52-year-old Turkish businessman is president of the Koruma Group, which was a chemical company when Araci bought it in 1994, but now includes subsidiaries involved in, among other things, construction, transportation and tourism. The family was introduced to racing by daughter Pinar, who rode as a child and got involved in the sport while at university in England. Araci bought his first bloodstock--three mares--at TATDEC in 2007, and the following year purchased Vefa Stud in Turkey. Managed by Pinar, the farm is home to 60 horses. Native Khan was named for Araci's father.

JOHN CONNAUGHTON - Dunboyne Express (Ire) Connaughton, a retired businessman and a keen rider and huntsman, had raced and bred in the past. After a hiatus, he returned to the sport in earnest 10 years ago. Born and raised in Ireland, he is based at Barrettstown Stud in Mullingar, Co. Westmeath. Dunboyne Express's dam Love

Excelling (Fr) (Polish Precedent) is part of Connaughton's current 10-strong broodmare roster. The half-sister to Love Divine (GB) (Diesis {GB}), dam of Sixties Icon (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}), was purchased for 220,000gns at the 2003 Tattersalls December Sale. Connaughton is selling a Raven's Pass half-brother to Dunboyne Express at this fall's Tattersalls October Yearling Sale. Connaughton also bred the 2008 G3 Athasi S. winner Prima Luce (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}).

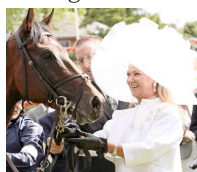

SUSAN MAGNIER, MICHAEL TABOR, DERRICK SMITH - Memphis Tennessee (Ire), Seville (Ger), Treasure Beach (GB)

A daughter of the legendary trainer Vincent O'Brien, Susan Magnier is married to John Magnier, who heads up the global Coolmore empire. Magnier also owns a portfolio of property interests, including the Sandy Lane

Hotel in Barbados. Tabor, born in London and currently based in Monaco, founded the bookmaker Arthur Prince before selling it for £28 million in 1995. Involved in racing as an

owner since the early 1990s, Tabor tasted early success when his Thunder Gulch (Gulch) captured the GI Kentucky Derby and GI Belmont S. in 1995. He has been a partner in Coolmore horses since that time. Smith, a former director of Ladbrokes and successful currency trader, is presently based

in Barbados. He came into the Coolmore fold in 2004. The Coolmore colors have been carried to victory in the Irish Derby no less than 10 times since 1997, and come into this year's edition bidding for an incredible seventh straight success.

MAGNIER, TABOR, SMITH & THE SANGSTER FAMILY - Roderic O'Connor (Ire)

The late Robert Sangster, who died of pancreatic cancer in 2004 at the age of 67, was the patriarch of the Sangster family's racing empire. His three sons--Adam, Guy and Ben--have carried on the prestigious operation, though on a smaller, restructured scale. Ben manages Swettenham's Northern Hemisphere operation from the family's Manton estate in

Wiltshire, England, while Adam owns and manages the farm's Australian division. Robert was the son of Vernon Sangster, founder of the Vernon Soccer Pools. He inherited the business and sold it in 1987 for a reported \$151.2 million. In the 1970s, Sangster joined forces with trainer Vincent O'Brien and Coolmore's John Magnier to develop commercially profitable sires from the horses they raced. The men revolutionized the breeding industry, pioneering the shuttling of stallions to the Southern Hemisphere and building Coolmore Stud into an international powerhouse. Horses carrying Sangster's famed green, blue and white silks included Sadler's Wells, Storm Bird, Alleged, The Minstrel and El Grand Senor.

MOYGLARE STUD - Notable Graduate (Ire)

Moyglare Stud was founded by the Swiss-born billionaire Walter Haefner. Born Sept. 13, 1910, Haefner will celebrate his 101st birthday this year. Haefner began his far-flung business empire owning car dealerships in England and Switzerland. In the 1950s, he recognized the importance that computers would have in the industry and was one of the first in the country to import an IBM computer

system. A few years later, he launched Automation Center A.G., a computer services company. Haefner still owns AMAG Automobil-und Moteren, a highly successful Swiss automobile dealership chain. Haefner purchased Moyglare Stud Farm, sitting on 440 acres in Maynooth, Co. Kildare, Ireland, in 1962. Horses owned or bred by Moyglare include the Classic winners Assert (Ire), Bikala (Ire), Refuse to Bend (Ire), Trusted Partner, and GI Belmont S. winner Go and Go (Ire), as well as the likes of Group/Grade I winners Brief Truce, Dress to Thrill (Ire), Media Puzzle and Relaxed Gesture (Ire). Last year, Haefner was recognized by Forbes as the world's oldest living billionaire. In 2008, Haefner's daughter Eva-Marie Bucher Haefner took over the running of Moyglare.

The Queen

THE QUEEN - Carlton House (GB)
 Queen Elizabeth II is the second-longest reigning monarch in British history. She was crowned Queen on the death of her father, King George VI, in 1952. She celebrates her 60th year on the throne with the Diamond Jubilee in 2012. A horse enthusiast from an early age, the Queen has won four of the five British Classics, most recently in 1977, when her homebred Dunfermline (GB) (Royal Palace {GB}) took both the G1 Epsom Oaks and G1 St. Leger S. The 85-year-old monarch has yet to win the Epsom Derby, coming closest in 1953, when Aureole (GB) (Hyperion {GB}) ran second shortly after her coronation, and when third with Carlton House this year. The colt becomes her first runner in the Irish Derby.

Prior to that, the Virginia-bred bay secured a NW1X at Aqueduct Apr. 13. "She's very fit," said trainer Todd Pletcher. "It was a good performance last time in the Black-Eyed Susan, and I hope she continues that trend of improvement."

Shadwell's **Alseera**, who returned from an eight-month hiatus to secure a first-level test at Belmont May 26, goes right into stakes company. "It's a step up, but we've seen it happen before," said trainer Kiaran McLaughlin, who saddled the lightly raced It's Tricky (Mineshaft) to a 10-1 upset in the GI Acorn S. June 11. "If you go back to It's Tricky, we were looking for Grade I black type, and we'd have been happy with second or third. It looks like we made the right decision with the other one; maybe we can get a little lucky here."

Fifty Proof has been first or second in five of six tries on the Woodbine sod, and is perfect in two starts this season. Runner-up in the GI Northern Dancer S. going 12 furlongs at Woodbine last September, the free-running gelding set the pace in the GI Canadian International S. the following month before weakening to fifth, beaten just 1 1/2 lengths. The chestnut trailed the field home after pressing the pace in the Nov. 28 G1 Japan Cup, and was given a break. Switched to synthetic for his first two outings this term, the 5-year-old captured a seven-furlong allowance at Woodbine Apr. 22 and the 1 1/16-mile GIII Eclipse S. May 28. The

consistent and well-traveled **Workin for Hops** visits his fourth racetrack this year. Midday has done well since Epsom, she's in good form, and she seems to have thrived this year. She ran well in the Coronation Cup, and she's coming back to take on her own sex again this weekend, which is nice. We'll get this race out of the way before we finalise any plans, but, hopefully, she'll go back to Goodwood for the [July 30] G1 Nassau S." Aidan O'Brien, who saddled Peeping Fawn to win in 2007, looks to repeat that feat with the G1 Moyglare Stud S., G1 Prix Marcel Boussac and G1 Irish 1000 Guineas heroine **Misty For Me**. She is joined by **Empowering**. Fifth in the G1 Epsom Oaks when trying a mile and a half for the first time, she is more likely to be at home over this intermediate trip. Snow Fairy, who registered the G1 English and Irish Oaks double last season, was set to make her first start since taking the G1 Hong Kong Cup in December, but connections ultimately found the rain-softened ground unsuitable. "It's rained solidly all morning and evening at the Curragh, so we've decided tonight so she can travel back early tomorrow," trainer Ed Dunlop told *Racing Post*. "It was meant to be her first run of the season if the ground had been okay, but it's going to be very poor, so we've made the decision. There is a possibility she could run in England next week in the Eclipse or the Lancashire Oaks, but that's a Group 2." A run in the G1 Coral Eclipse S. a week from today would mean a dream clash with Workforce (GB) (King's Best) and So You Think (NZ) (High Chaparral {Ire}).

STARS COME OUT AT SAN ISIDRO

The XXI edition of the “Carreras de las Estrellas” festival will be held today at Hipodromo San Isidro in Buenos Aires, Argentina. Organized by Fundacion Equina Argentina and based on the concept of the Breeders’ Cup, the races will distribute purses for a total of ARP3,181,818 (about US\$770,000). There are a total of 89 runners in the eight races, six of them Group 1s. All of the races will be run over San Isidro’s turf course, which is expected to be soft.

As always, the most important race on the card will be the G1 Gran Premio Estrellas Classic over 2000 meters. **Star Runner (Arg)** (Souther Halo), recent winner of the May 1 G1 Gran Premio Republica Argentina, is the likely favorite. Owned by Stud El Zonda, the 3-year-old will have G1 Gran Premio 25 de Mayo hero **Vitaminado (Arg)** (Not for Sale {Arg}) as his main opponent. Also in the 11-horse field are Group 1 winners **Cocho (Arg)** (Sunray Spirit) and **Rupit (Arg)** (Lucky Roberto), both milers who are now stretching out to 1 1/4 miles.

The G1 Gran Premio Estrellas Juvenile provides a championship showdown between **Mighty Hunter (Arg)** (Mutakddim), **Escape of Glory (Arg)** (Lode) and **Suggestive Boy (Arg)** (Easing Along), all of whom winners at the highest level. The G1 Gran Premio Estrellas Juvenile Fillies promises a duel between unbeaten G1 Jorge de Atucha winner **Gamuza Fina (Arg)** (Equal Stripes {Arg}) and **Una Cabeza (Arg)** (Leroidesanimaux {Brz}), heroine of the G1 Gran Premio de Potrancas at this track and distance. **Lindalindalinda (Arg)** (Val Royal {Fr}) and **La Laguna Azul (Arg)** (Orpen) appear as longshots.

The G1 Gran Premio Estrellas Distaff over 2000 meters offers a clash between the best filly and the best older female of 2010, **Catch the Mad (Arg)** (Catcher In the Rye {Ire}) and **Malpensa (Arg)** (Orpen). **Malpensa**, who beat **Catch the Mad** in December’s G1 Gran Premio Copa de Plata, comes in off two sharp victories in the G1 Gran Premio Gilberto Lerena and the G1 Gran Premio Criadores. **Catch the Mad** returned from a five-month layoff to win going a mile in the G3 Clasico Circulo de Propietarios de Caballerizas.

The G1 Gran Premio Estrellas Mile appears to be the most evenly matched contest of the festival. Group 1 winners **Cafrune (Arg)** (Colonial Affair) and **San Livinus (Arg)** (Mutakddim) will meet **Hunky (Arg)** (Orpen), a progressive 3-year-old. **Pick Out (Arg)** (Brancusi) and recently returned **Saba Emperor (Arg)** (Emperor Jones) could also make their presence felt.

Favored in the G1 Gran Premio Estrellas Sprint is the filly **Hidebound (Arg)** (Grand Slam). **Filoso Emperor (Arg)** (Emperor Jones) and 2009 Sprint winner **El Noi (Arg)** (Anjiz) are rivals that might present problems to the Haras Futuro homebred.

The festival will also include a pair of ungraded races: the 1000-meter Clasico Estrellas Sprint Junior will return to the card after a few seasons of absence; and the 1200-meter Clasico Provincias Argentinas, which is reserved for horses who have only competed in the countryside.

"She did what she had to do to win [the Oaks]," recalled Vern Dubinsky. "It was a slow [early] pace, but she got up late to win it. [Jockey] Luis [Contreras] said she did it very easily."

During the post position draw at Woodbine Thursday morning, the imposing 3-year-old drew the nine hole for her first test against the boys.

"I think the post position is okay," conceded the Edmonton-based businessman. "Because of the way they load [starting from post 1 and 17 and working inward] she will go in late, so I think that's a positive. You don't want her standing in there so long anyway. We're pretty happy."

At two, she was an easy winner of both of her state-bred starts over Woodbine's Polytrack--the Fanfreluche S. and Ontario Lassie S. A well-regarded runner up behind Kathmanblu (Bluegrass Cat) in her career debut on the dirt in the GII Rachel Alexandra S. at Fair Grounds Feb. 19, the daughter of Noble Strike (Smart Strike) came home a credible fourth behind Daisy Devine (Kafwain) and subsequent GI Kentucky Oaks runner-up St. Johns River (Include) in the GII Fair Grounds Oaks Mar. 26.

"I think she stacks up well with this group," affirmed Dubinsky. "When she found herself in behind in her previous races, she showed she had no fear of going between horses and pushing her way through. I think she is going to run well, and we would be obviously thrilled if she could win."

Purchased for \$90,000 at the 2009 Canadian-bred Yearling Sale upon the advice of Ocala horseman Ciaran Dunne, the Dubinskys hope their filly can follow in the hoofprints of her more exalted predecessor, millionairess Careless Jewel, who sold for a whopping \$1.95 million at last fall's Keeneland November sale.

"[Inglorious] was a big, strapping filly," recalled Dubinsky. "We were also having all the luck with Careless Jewel, who is out of a Hennessy mare, so we decided to buy this filly, who is by Hennessy herself. [The breeding to Hennessy] kind of triggered something. Since then, she's obviously gotten bigger and stronger. She just does everything so easily. She trains so well and has a good head on her shoulders."

Despite the large crowd expected for the first jewel in the Canadian Triple Crown, Dubinsky has little doubt his filly will be able to handle the commotion.

"She's just awesome," said the owner of V.D.M Trucking, which transports oil rigs. "She's like a pony. She just walks around and is very even tempered. I don't think the raceday crowd is going to bother her at all."

Donver currently owns approximately a dozen mares, and all of the mares bred in Kentucky are boarded at Marty Takacs's Belvedere Farm before shipping to Gayle Woods' farm in Sherwood Park, Ontario, to foal. Dunne, who purchases most of the young horses acquired by Donver at auction, is charged with breaking all of the youngsters at his farm in Ocala. In addition to their broodmare band, the Dubinskys own a total of about 65 horses, including foals and race horses. The racing team is split between Bob Baffert in California, John Terranova in New York and Josie Carroll in Toronto.

"We started out trying to get good fillies, but now we are trying to get some colts, too," said Dubinsky.

Among the colts which have risen to the top is **Seawatch** (Woodman), who gives the Donver racing team a second bullet in the Queen's Plate. The colt, who will be partnered by Slade Callaghan, drew the 12 post for Sunday's 1 1/4-mile Classic. He is listed at a healthy 20-1 on the morning line.

"Seawatch is a homebred and we think we have a good shot in the Queen's Plate with him," offered Dubinsky. "I think he's in the top half dozen horses in the race. He got a huge Rag[ozin] number last time [when fifth in the Victoria Park S. June 12], better actually than Inglorious' number. I think [Callaghan] might have moved a little too early last time, so I think he will be back early this time and then will make a run late. It's quick coming back, but we think he has a chance. He's been bouncing around the last few days and everything seems to be perfect."

Win, lose or draw, Dubinsky has enjoyed an overwhelmingly positive launch to his maiden voyage in Canada's most recognized Classic.

"The excitement and the build up is like the Breeders' Cup," he enthused. "It's almost like a let down when the race is over. It should be a great weekend. We have a horse running everyday, so it should be a lot of fun."

Ladies in Waiting No Longer...

Fillies have performed exceptionally well in the Canadian sophomore Classic, having collected 33 editions on behalf of the fairer sex. The first to accomplish the feat was Brunette, who won two of three heats and was fourth in the other in the 1864 edition of the contest. In the 20th century, 16 fillies won the Plate, including Belle Mahone (1917), Queensway (1932), Canadiana (1953), Flaming Page (1962), Jammed Lovely (1967), La Lorgnette (1985) and Dance Smartly (1991), who holds the distinction of being the lone filly to produce a Queen's Plate winner when Dancethruthedawn (Mr. Prospector) became the only filly this century to take the 1 1/4-mile Classic in 2001. Of the human persuasion, Josie Carroll became the first female trainer to saddle a Plate winner when Edenwold (Southern Halo) scored in 2006, while Emma-Jayne Wilson earned Plate honors in 2007 aboard Mike Fox (Giant's Causeway).

"Hopefully, these bonuses will help create bigger fields, which will lead to better wagering opportunities for our customers and higher handle on our races."

Bob Molaro and Jim Stumpf will be honored as co-recipients of the first annual Karen Paulsen Award at Arlington Park Saturday, June 25. The Paulsen Award is presented by Galloping Out, the equine welfare branch of the Illinois Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association, and honors individuals who have shown "extraordinary diligence and effort" in improving the lot of retired Chicago-based Thoroughbreds. Both Molaro, a longtime Illinois State legislator, and Stumpf, Arlington's vice president of legislative affairs and OTB development, were responsible for securing the passage of a 2007 state law that banned horse slaughter in Illinois. Stumpf and Molaro also insisted on provisions for equine welfare and retirement in pending casino legislation. Molaro, who is now affiliated with assorted advocacy entities in Springfield and Chicago, served in the Illinois State Senate from 1993-2003, and the State House from 2003-2009. Stumpf has been a member of Arlington's management team since 1992, when he joined the staff of Chairman Duchossois as vice president of off-track operations. The inaugural Paulsen Awards will be presented on Saturday after the third race on Prairie State Festival Day at Arlington. A reception will be held in the paddock following the conclusion of racing that will include cocktails, appetizers, and the opportunity for fans and supporters to mingle with owners, trainers and jockeys. Tickets are \$25, and include two drinks and hors d'oeuvres. They are available at the ITHA's Arlington Park office (847) 577-6464 and will also be available Saturday in the track's grandstand. Santa Anita Park will close its main track for training beginning July 11 for a surface modification. The project, which will involve mixing natural sand into the existing dirt surface, is expected to take 10 days. While that takes place, the inner training track will be available every morning. Santa Anita, which had a troubled experiment with Cushion Track before switching to another synthetic surface, Pro-Ride, overhauled its main oval last fall. Near-record rainfall in December and January affected the composition of the newly installed conventional dirt surface, resulting in a high percentage of silt and clay in the dirt.

BRIGANTIN HAS PRIX KERGOLAY TARGET; MELBOURNE CUP POSSIBLE Team Valor International's **Brigantin** (Cozzene), third to Fame and Glory (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}) in the G1 Gold Cup as Royal Ascot June 16, is being pointed toward the G2 Prix Kergolay at Deauville Aug. 22 as connections ponder a possible tilt at Australia's G1 Melbourne Cup in November. The Kergolay is contested over 15 furlongs, a furlong shy of the two-mile distance of the Melbourne Cup. "This race should give us a good barometer as to our readiness to tackle the Melbourne Cup," said Team Valor President Barry Irwin. "As long as the ground is in our favor, which would be good to firm, our boy should get the test we require to properly evaluate him." The operation, which won this year's GI Kentucky Derby with Animal Kingdom (Leroidesanimaux {Brz}), indicated it may also wait a year to send the now 4-year-old to Australia. Brigantin is trained by Andre Fabre. Last season, Americain (Dynaformer) won the Kergolay en route to upset victory in the Melbourne Cup.

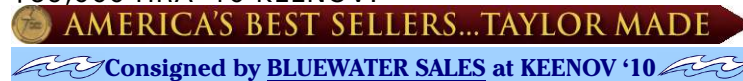
