**EIGHT LEFT IN ECLIPSE**

Saturday's G1 Coral-Eclipse is likely to feature a small field after only eight remained at yesterday's six-day stage. Aidan O'Brien accounts for half of that number with **So You Think (NZ)** (High Chaparral {Ire}) joined by **Cape Blanco (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}), **Jan Vermeer (Ire)** (Montjeu {Ire}) and **Alexander Pope (Ire)** (Daneshill Dancer {Ire}) in the list for the Sandown feature.

Speaking on Sunday, the Ballydoyle conditioner was in no rush to firm up jockey plans for So You Think, who suffered a surprise defeat on his British debut in the G1 Prince of Wales's S. at Royal Ascot June 15.

“Joseph [O'Brien] rides him out every day, Seamie [Heffernan] rides him in all his work and rode him the day he won the first time at the Curragh, so I don't think there is any scarcity of riders,” O'Brien said. “We'll decide if he's going to run or not first and then we can talk about who is going to ride him. We're delighted with him and everything has been good since Ascot.” Sir Michael Stoute is set to run Khalid Abdullah's 2010 G1 Epsom Derby and G1 Arc de Triomphe hero **Workforce (GB)** (King's Best) and pacemaker **Confront (GB)** (Nayef), while Roger Varian will saddle last year's runner-up **Sri Putra (GB)** (Oasis Dream {GB}). Ed Dunlop is pondering the race for the re-introduction of the four-time Group 1 winner **Snow Fairy (Ire)** (Intikhab). Withdrawn from Saturday's G1 Pretty Polly S. at The Curragh due to the rain-softened ground, she is also entered in the G2 Lancashire Oaks on the same day at Haydock. “Snow Fairy would have to carry a five-pound penalty in the Lancashire Oaks, as it is a Group 2 race and who knows what the ground will be like up there. While Sandown looks like being a very competitive race, with Workforce and So You Think in the line-up, we are anxious to get rolling again when we get our proper ground,” Dunlop commented. “We have always stressed that Snow Fairy's main programme centres on the second half of the season, but the [July 23] G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth S. at Ascot and the [July 30] G1 Nassau S. at Goodwood are also in the mix and, if we miss next weekend, we would be going there cold, which would not be ideal.”

**JUVIE TURF HERO PLUCK BACK IN TRAINING**

Team Valor International and The Vinery's **Pluck** (More Than Ready), a flashy winner of last year's GII Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf at Churchill Downs, is back in training after being sidelined earlier in the year with bruising of his canon bones. The 3-year-old will begin jogging today at Fair Hill Training Center in Maryland for trainer H. Graham Motion. Pluck was conditioned by Todd Pletcher when he launched a near last-to-first move in the Breeders' Cup. Moved to Motion's barn over the winter--along with the rest of Team Valor's horses--he returned to action in a Tampa Bay allowance Mar. 12, but was a listless fourth as the 1-5 choice. Again off the board when favored in the GIII Transylvania S. at Keeneland Apr. 8, he was subsequently diagnosed with bone bruising. Rood & Riddle Equine Hospital's Dr. Larry Bramlage looked over radiographs yesterday morning, however, and gave the colt the green light to return to training. “We are very happy to be able to put the horse back into training,” said Barry Irwin, CEO of Team Valor International. “It'll probably take Graham the better part of four months to get him back to the races, but at least we are back in action. We've had a few horses with this same ailment before, and they were able to make it all the way back to their previous form, the most notable of which was Unbridled Belle (Broken Vow), who went on to win the G1 Beldame S. and earn nearly \$2 million for our stable.”

## BETFAIR'S YU RESIGNS

Betfair chief executive David Yu confirmed yesterday he is leaving the company after 10 years. News of Yu's departure, speculated about for days, saw shares in the gambling firm drop to 715p, off a high of £13 hit last October. The FTSE-250 company's market value yesterday was £777-million, compared to £1.4-billion when the company was floated eight months ago, according to *The Guardian*. Yu joined Betfair in 2001 and had been chief executive for almost six years. His contract is set to expire in October of next year. "I will remain committed to delivering the best for our people and our shareholders and will give the board all possible support during the succession process so we can find a great, new CEO to steer Betfair through its next phase of growth," Yu said in a statement. Betfair chairman added "We understand why after 10 years David would like to start thinking about the next stage of his career and, in time, hand the reins over to a new CEO. With the Board's full support, David will continue to focus on delivering against the business' plans as we search for his successor."

### ALABAMA NEXT FOR ZAZU

Zazu (Tapit), victorious in Saturday's GI Hollywood Oaks, will now target a summer date in Saratoga. "The Alabama is probably the next race," trainer John Sadler told *Daily Racing Form*. The GI TVG Alabama S. will be run Aug. 20 over 1 1/4 miles. Zazu, third behind Plum Pretty (Medaglia d'Oro) in the May 6 GI Kentucky Oaks, turned the tables on that rival at Hollywood Park Saturday with a gritty rail-skimming 1 1/2-length victory.

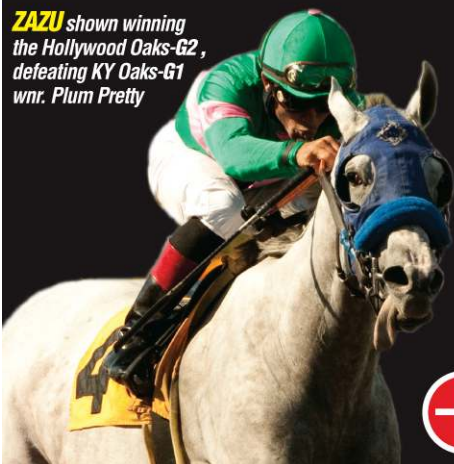

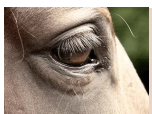

There's a saying which runs roughly along the lines that men perspire, women glow and horses sweat. However, some of Britain's racing commentators seem to have forgotten the last part of this attempt to promote euphemisms for this natural bodily function.

Horses do indeed sweat, to varying degrees, but how much should it worry us before a race? The answer seems to be "not at all" if the perspiring horse is by the remarkable Galileo.

If I remember correctly, the many-times champion jockey John Francome issued dire warnings that Galileo's son Frankel was sweating between his hind legs before he made his reappearance in the G3 Greenham S. Frankel, apparently unaware of the danger, scooted home four lengths clear of a colt who took the G2 German 2,000 Guineas by seven lengths.

Nathaniel, another son of Galileo, became very warm prior to the G2 King Edward VII S., but then won so well that his connections are now considering a tilt at the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe. **Cont. p4**

Then, two days ago, the irrepressible Matt Chapman on Attheraces warned that Treasure Beach--yet another son of Galileo--was sweating up badly prior to the Sunday's G1 Irish Derby. Yet again this tendency to sweat made no difference, with Treasure Beach finishing strongly to gain well-deserved compensation for his narrow defeat in the G1 Epsom Derby.

Turn to the essay on Galileo in Timeform's *Racehorses of 2001* and you will find the following:

"The game and genuine Galileo acted on any going. He was equipped with a crossed noseband in his races and tended to sweat, though he did not get anything like so warm as usual before the Irish Champion..."

Incidentally, the Irish Champion was the race in which Galileo suffered the first defeat of his career.

Timeform also recorded that Galileo's second dam, Allegretta, sweated up when blinkered on her final appearance and there are good grounds for thinking that a tendency to

sweat can be hereditary. In its analysis of Nathaniel's Royal Ascot victory, the *Racing Post* commented that, "While he got edgy and warm in the preliminaries, his trainer was unconcerned (apparently it's a trait of the family) and it clearly didn't have any effect on the way he ran."

Nathaniel certainly has every right to get warm before his races, as he is out of a mare by Silver Hawk. *Racehorses of 1982* alluded to Silver Hawk's temperament, pointing out that he had a reputation for being nervous as a 3-year-old and that he sweated up freely when he finished fourth as favorite for the 2,000 Guineas and when second in the Irish Derby.

Nathaniel's trainer John Gosden won the Derby with Silver Hawk's son Benny The Dip, a horse who was described by Gosden as very excitable--a hyper-neurotic creature.

Combining Galileo and Silver Hawk could, theoretically, have been a recipe for producing horses whose potential might be compromised by their excitability. The reality is that Galileo has had five runners out of Silver Hawk mares and all five have won. No fewer than four of them are black-type performers and, in addition to Nathaniel, they include Seville, the colt who finished a fine second to Treasure Beach in the Irish Derby.

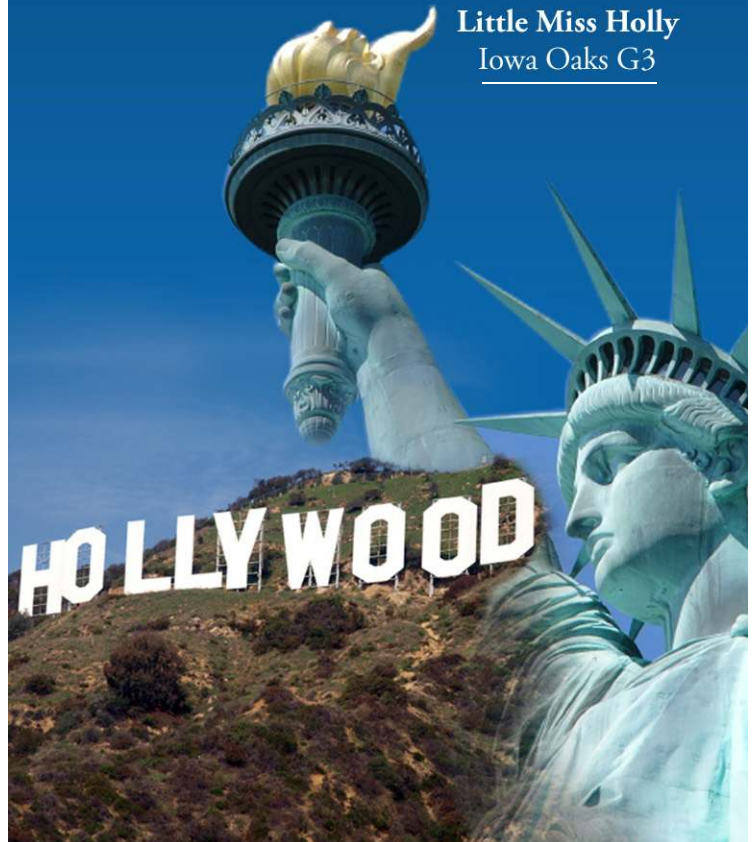

Impressive as this is, it is possible that Galileo's record with Treasure Beach's broodmare sire, Mark of Esteem, is even more striking. This combination has nine foals of racing age, of which seven have run. Treasure Beach is no less than the third group winner from the seven, his predecessors being Kite Wood, a multiple group winner who finished a close second as favourite for the

G1 St Leger in 2009, and Mikhail Glinka, winner of the G3 Queen's Vase over two miles.

It is worth pointing out that Kite Wood's dam Kite Mark was a once-raced maiden; that Mikhail Glinka's dam Lady Karr gained her only win from 10 starts in a maiden race at lowly Catterick; and that Treasure Beach's dam, Honorine, was just a fairly useful handicapper at up to a mile and a quarter. On the two occasions that Honorine tried to earn black-type, she finished seventh and eighth.

If this poses the question of why these unexceptional racemares were mated to Galileo, the answer is that Mark of Esteem was the highest-rated son of Darshaan, a stallion whose daughters have played such an important role in the success of the Sadler's Wells male line.

Although Galileo has four group winners out of Darshaan mares, including the high-class long-distance horse Alandi, they come from a sample of 91 foals of racing age.

As Mark of Esteem was a 3-year-old as long ago as 1996, it is easy to forget how good he was at his best. After winning the 2,000 Guineas, he was an impressive winner of the G2 Celebration Mile and then won the G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. as part of Frankie Dettori's seven-timer at Ascot. Significantly, *Timeform* recorded that "Mark of Esteem sometimes carried his head awkwardly and was decidedly on his toes and sweating before the Queen Elizabeth II S." **Cont. p6**

Maybe it is Mark of Esteem's outstanding ability over a mile which is helping his daughters establish a superior record to that of Darshaan mares when mated with Galileo, a stallion who appreciates some speed in his mares.

Mark of Esteem was forced into retirement after the 2006 season. I considered him a little disappointing as a sire, given the opportunities he received, but he hit the Group 1 target with the Derby winner Sir Percy, the 1,000 Guineas winner Ameerat, the top sprinter Reverence and the Metropolitan H. winner Bribon. Treasure Beach is the second Group 1 winner out of one of his daughters, the other being the Middle Park S. winner Amadeus Wolf.

Although Treasure Beach's dam Honorine failed at stakes level, she is a half-sister to Indian Creek, who stayed well enough to win the G2 Hardwicke S. over a mile and a half, despite being by the sprinter Indian Ridge. Their dam Blue Water, by the top mile-and-a-half horse Bering, was a very useful middle-distance performer in France and so was Treasure Beach's fourth dam, Radiance. Radiance, by the way, was a daughter of the Derby winner Blakeney, who also cropped up as the broodmare sire of Mark of Esteem's Derby winner Sir Percy and of Sir Percy's sister Lady Karr, dam of Mikhail Glinka.

TWO PUNCH DEAD AT 28 Northview Stallion Station's Two Punch (Mr. Prospector--Heavenly Cause, by Grey Dawn II) was euthanized last Saturday at the age of 28 due to the infirmities of old age. Named Maryland's Stallion of the Year three times (1994, '95 and '97), Two Punch has sired the earners of more than \$49 million and no fewer than 54 black-type winners, including Eclipse Award-winning sprinter and successful sire Smoke Glacken. He was also represented by

Grade I winner Taking Risks, and the graded winners Punch Line, Calipha, Willa On the Move, K. O. Punch, and Fistfite. He boasted 83% starters/foals and 77% winners/starters. Two Punch was one of the original stallions at Northview, which opened its doors in 1989. A foal of 1983, the gray was bred in Kentucky by

Eleanor R. Ryan and raced for Ross Valley Farm and trainer Woody Stephens. He won his debut at Aqueduct in November of 1985 and finished third in the Swale S. a few months later at Gulfstream. He registered a career best in his career finale, a win in the six-furlong Bachelor S. at Oaklawn Park in 1986. Winning half of his eight starts, he earned \$89,795. If his race record was inauspicious enough, Two Punch warranted a chance in the breeding shed if only because of his pedigree, being a son of Mr. Prospector out of Heavenly Cause, champion 2-year-old filly in 1980 and a five-time Grade I winner. He got off to a solid start at stud--his first three crops, numbering 109 named foals, yielded nine stakes winners (8.25%). He remained a reliable source of black-type runners in the mid-Atlantic region for the remainder of his career. Two Punch got his most recent stakes winner on June 11 when his 3-year-old daughter Bold Affair captured the \$200,000 Jostle S. at Parx Racing--her third win in four starts. At the sales, 16 Two Punch juveniles brought prices of \$250,000 or more, led by his son Heavyweight Champ, who made \$675,000 at auction and later placed in the GI Champagne S. behind Officer. He has had 182 2-year-olds sell for an average of \$102,204, while his 436 yearlings have averaged \$51,530. Two Punch is the broodmare sire of a diverse bunch, including two-time Eclipse Award-winning steeplechaser and millionaire Good Night Shirt (Concern), multiple Grade I-winning sprinter millionaire Shine Again (Wild Again), and this year's GII Hutcheson S. winner Flashpoint (Pomeroy).

HAYWARD DISCLOSES NYRA SALARIES Chief Executive Charles Hayward revealed yesterday that the New York Racing Association has ceded to demands from a state regulatory body to provide the salaries of its senior officials. Hayward made the announcement during a press conference in Albany to promote the upcoming Saratoga racing season. Hayward announced that NYRA's executive compensation increased 3% in 2011, an increase that was justified because the executives had not received raises in three years, the Associated Press reported. Hayward also stated that NYRA is projecting losses of \$11.6 million this year. Robert Megna, who heads the Franchise Oversight Board for the state of New York, last week called for transparency in NYRA's payment structure in a letter addressed to Hayward and New York Inspector General Ellen Biben.

Corinthian Colt Earns Top Honors at MHBA Show:

Bob Manfuso and Katy Voss's homebred Corinthian colt earned the grand championship title at Sunday's 77th annual Maryland Horse Breeders Association's Maryland-bred Yearlings Show in Timonium. Pennsylvania horseman Russell B. Jones Jr. judged 62 yearlings in four classes. The Corinthian colt was winner of Class II for colts and geldings sired by out-of-state sires. He is out of Moonshine Run (Go For Gin) and is a half-brother to stakes-winner Izzy Speaking (Partner's Hero). "He's just a wonderful, strong colt," Jones said of his top pick. "Everybody would love to raise a horse like him." The reserve champion was the Class IV winner (for out-of-state sired fillies), a daughter of freshman sire Latent Heat shown by her breeder Brice Ridgely's Spring Meadow Farm. Out of GSP Vee Vee Star (Norquestor), the yearling is a half-sister to champion juvenile Declan's Moon (Malibu Moon).

Charles Town Adds Two Dates:

Charles Town has rescheduled two live racing programs. The West Virginia track will now host racing on Aug. 24 and 31. Post time for both days will be 7:15 p.m. Charles Town was forced to cancel four racing days in January due to inclement weather. The two added dates received approval from the West Virginia Racing Commission last Friday.

Darley scooped the TBA Silver Rose Bowl for Flat Breeder of the Year. Colin and Melba Bryce's Laundry Cottage Stud was awarded the TBA Silver Salver Special Merit Award for the breeding of last year's G1 Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere hero Wootton Bassett (GB) (Ifraaj {GB}). Melba Bryce said, "It's nice to be recognised and to have been able to breed a Group 1 winner was just amazing. This is our first award and it has given all the staff a really big lift. We've gotten to know the syndicate that owns Wootton Bassett, too, so it's been wonderful to share in their joy." As a result of the emphatic success of Harbinger (GB) (Dansili {GB}) in the G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth S., his breeder Anita Ooi was awarded the Langham Cup for Small Breeder of the Year, while Sophie Woolf of Rushbrooke Stud received the TBA Annual Stud Staff Award sponsored by New England Stud. 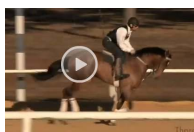
