Michael Lauffer and W.D. Cubbedge's **Shackleford** (Forestry) has returned to Dale Romans's Churchill



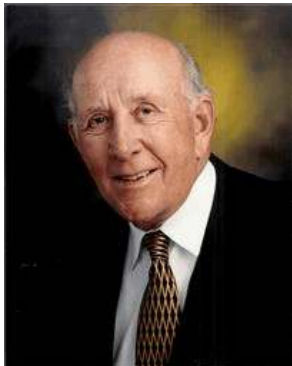

JOSEPH CORNACCHIA DIES

Joseph M. Cornacchia, co-owner of GI Kentucky Derby winners Strike the Gold and Go For Gin, died Sunday at the age of 78. The Queens, New York native, a pioneer in the board game industry, was the manufacturer of Trivial Pursuit and was also the president and founder of The Games Gang. The former member of the New York Racing Association's Board of Directors also campaigned GI Preakness S. hero Louis Quatorze in partnership. "Joe Cornacchia was a thoughtful and caring man who had a deep love for horse racing," NYRA Chairman C. Steven Duncker

commented. "He had incredible business acumen, which he displayed in both the board game industry and in winning three prestigious Triple Crown races. His presence at the racetrack will be sorely missed." Cornacchia is survived by his wife Eileen, sons Jim and Brian, stepson Ryan, daughter-in-law Amanda and grandchildren Colin and Caitlin. Cornacchia's wake will take place at Follett & Werner Funeral Home in Westhampton Beach, New York, Wednesday and Thursday. Funeral services will be held at Immaculate Conception Church in Westhampton Friday.

COOLMORE NOMINATES BIG 3 TO BC

Top international runners **Canford Cliffs (Ire)** (Tagula {Ire}), **So You Think (NZ)** (High Chaparral {Ire}) and **Treasure Beach (GB)** (Galileo {Ire}) have been nominated to the Breeders' Cup program through its special open enrollment program, it was revealed Tuesday. Coolmore nominated the trio for \$25,000 each. They were not nominated to the Breeders' Cup program as foals. The open enrollment period, available to any previously non-nominated horse sired by any stallion standing anywhere in the world that has been nominated to the Breeders' Cup in 2011, ends Thursday. "This open enrollment period has given us the chance to nominate our runners to the Breeders' Cup at a reduced price than the usual \$100,000 per horse," trainer Aidan O'Brien offered. "Making it easier for European-based horses to run in the Breeders' Cup also gives them future stallion prospects in the American market at the end of their racing careers." Canford Cliffs, co-owned by the Heffer Syndicate, Michael Tabor and Derrick Smith, and trained by Richard Hannon, defeated the mighty Goldikova (Ire) (Anabaa) in a thrilling renewal of the G1 Queen Anne S. at Royal Ascot June 14. Derrick Smith, Susan Magnier and Michael Tabor's Treasure Beach made headlines when taking the G1 Dubai Duty Free Irish Derby Sunday. G1 Tattersalls Gold Cup hero So You Think, co-owned by Smith, Susan Magnier, Tabor, Dato Tan and Tunku Yahaya, most recently placed second in the G1 Prince of Wales's S. June 15.

HALF TERM REPORT

We're just about halfway through the 2011 calendar year (already?), so it's a good time to take a look and see which sires are topping the charts thus far in 2011. We'll be using the sire lists on the *TDN* site, especially, this year, as including European sires and Dubai racing actually tells us a good deal about the state of play.

First up is the Year-to-Date *TDN* General Sire List ([click here](#)), and this tells us the avowed World Number 1, **Galileo**, is now almost \$2.5 million clear of his nearest rival, with 2011 earnings currently over \$6.7 million. After Treasure Beach and Seville ran one-two in Sunday's G1 Irish Derby, Galileo now has eight group/graded black-type winners this year, with five Group 1 winners--all 3-year-old Classic winners--and which have now won eight Group 1 races this year among them. A lot is made of the burgeoning Galileo/Danzig cross, which sure enough has produced Frankel, Golden Lilac and Roderic O'Connor this season. But, being a world number one, the point is Galileo works with just about anything: dual 2011 G1SW Misty For Me is out of a Storm Cat mare, and G1 Irish Derby winner Treasure Beach is out of a mare by Darshaan's son, Mark of Esteem. Over 10% (18) of Galileo's 168 runners this year have won or placed in group/graded stakes; that's pretty impressive, too.

The 4-year-old colt Rewilding (**Tiger Hill**) has won two major Group 1 races this year from two starts: the 12-furlong Sheema Classic in Dubai (\$3 million to the winner), and the 10-furlong Prince of Wales's S. at Royal Ascot, in the latter defeating Australian sensation So You Think (High Chaparral), in what actually might have been the race of the season so far. Rewilding accounts for almost 80% of Tiger Hill's 2011 progeny earnings of over \$4.2 million, which ranks him second on the *TDN* 2011 General Sire List, but fair enough: he might be the best 10-12 furlong horse in the world right now. If not, he's not far behind them. Leading North American sire **Tapit** is third on our list, with six group/graded stakes winners, 11 group/graded stakes horses, and the earners of over \$4.1 million. Presvis made an equally big contribution to the fourth position of his sire, **Sakhee**, with his \$3-million paycheck in the G1 Dubai Duty Free, but Sakhee also has Tin Horse, winner of the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains this year.

The next three slots--fifth, sixth, and seventh--are occupied by three of America's perennial leading sires: **Giant's Causeway**, **Distorted Humor** and **Smart Strike**. **Medaglia d'Oro**, in eighth, is the number two fourth-crop sire (first 5-year-olds 2011), behind Tapit, and in ninth and 10th are Euro sires **Montjeu** and **Dubawi**.

Mineshaft, **Forestry**, and **Malibu Moon** each also have 2011 progeny earnings over \$3.2 million, followed by four sires with over \$3 million: the new South African commercial star, **Trippi**; deceased but consistently good **Maria's Mon**; the top North American third-crop sire, **Leroidesanimaux**--and it's not just GI Kentucky Derby winner Animal Kingdom, not by a long way; and **Cape Cross**, a consistent top 10 sire in Europe who scored two Royal Ascot winners earlier this month. No fewer than 58 stallions have 2011 first-half progeny earnings over \$2 million. The message is there are plenty of good sires out there.

European Dubawi and now-Floridian 'Leroi' are the two third-crop sires (first 4-year-olds 2011) to have cracked the \$3-million earnings barrier this year, so obviously ran first and second on the year-to-date third-crop sire list ([click here](#)). Five other North American F2007 (first foals 2007) sires have over \$2 million in 2011 progeny earnings, headed by **Roman Ruler**, whose GI Belmont S. winner Ruler On Ice leads his 2011 earners of just under \$2.5 million. He is followed by **Kitten's Joy** (\$2.3 million), **Ghostzapper** (\$2.2 million), **Wildcat Heir** (\$2.1 million) and **Afleet Alex** (\$2.0 million). European number two **Shamardal** comes next with the earners of \$1.7 million this year. The horse who still looks poised to make a big leap forward is **Azamour**, who has five black-type winners and three group winners so far this year. He's a top 10 third-crop sire in black-type performers, but could use a 'big horse' now to confirm his promise.

Among second-crop sires (first foals 2008, first 3-year-olds 2011), the top three by 2011 progeny earnings ([click here](#)) remain **War Front** (\$1.69 million), **Bernardini** (\$1.63 million) and **Bellamy Road** (\$1.57 million). War Front has three graded stakes winners this year, and Bernardini has five graded stakes horses, though neither yet has a Grade I winner in 2011. However, Bellamy Road does in GI Wood Memorial winner Toby's Corner. The next three by 2011 earnings all have very similar profiles: **Rockport Harbor**, **Congrats** and **Silver Train** each have two black-type winners, of which one is a graded stakes winner; four or five black-type horses each so far this year; and the earners of over \$1.3 million. Two European second-crop sires now have 2011 progeny earnings over \$1 million: **Holy Roman Emperor** (\$1.24 million) and **Hurricane Run** (\$1.17 million), who has three 2011 group winners and jumped up the list when Memphis Tennessee, who had been fourth in the G1 Epsom Derby, completed the Aidan O'Brien trifecta in last weekend's G1 Irish Derby.

Three other second-crop sires had good weekends, or could be about to. The latter comment applies to **Shirocco**, Monsun's first important son at stud, who has two fancied runners (including footballer Michael Owen's impressive Ascot handicap winner Brown Panther) in Sunday's G1 German Derby.

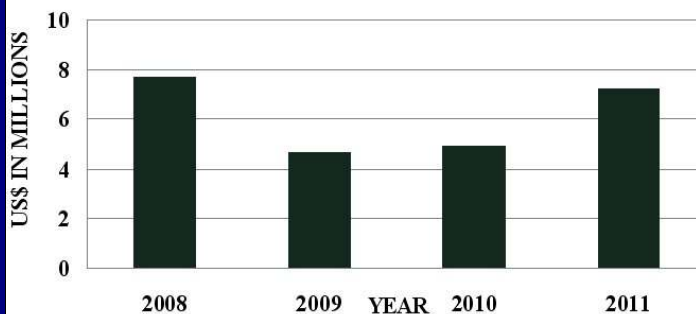
Weekly Sales Ticker

"Back to two days after a one-day sale last year, OBS June bounced back to near-2008 levels. NA 2-year-old sales gross up seven percent from 2010, and with recent good results there is guarded optimism for the yearling sales. Fasig July, though, is down to a one-day sale, with the number catalogued down 26 percent from 2010 and by 39 percent from 2009. As for the NA 2-year-old sales, when compared to 2008 there were 16 percent fewer catalogued, 11 percent fewer sold, the gross fell by 32 percent, and the average by 24 percent. But maybe a recovery begins this summer."

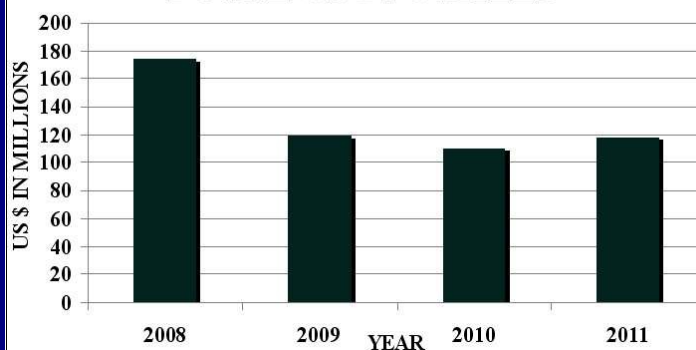

He's currently the number four European second-crop sire. But, if one of those colts comes up trumps, or even close to it in Hamburg, we'll be talking about a European second-crop 'big three,' Shirocco along with Holy Roman Emperor and Hurricane Run. Dansil's full-brother **Cacique**, unfortunately, retired from stud duty due to infertility, already had another big weekend. Fresh from having two top three placegetters, over 10 and 12 furlongs, at Royal Ascot, another colt by Cacique, Dominator, did just that to his field in a £150,000 sales race at Newmarket, winning by five lengths in group-class fashion. And the Ontario second-crop stallion **Philanthropist**, a son of Kris S. bred and raced by the Phipps family (he won the GIII Queens County H.), got a big upgrade to his profile when he had the second and third in Sunday's C\$1-million Queen's Plate, boosting his 2011 progeny earnings by over \$300,000.

The top five freshman sires ([click here](#)) are all European. **Dark Angel**, who has led the list from right out of the blocks, and his sire, Acclamation, had a productive weekend. First, in the Listed Empress S. at Newmarket on Saturday, the Dark Angel filly Lily's Angel defeated the Acclamation filly Pearl Diva. Then, in the G2 Railway S. at the Curragh Sunday, the Acclamation colt Lilbourne Lad just bested the aptly named Tough As Nails, by Dark Angel. It's enough to propel Acclamation into the Exceed and Excel category of leading 2011 European sires of 2-year-olds, and keeps Dark Angel in front of his closest pursuers--**Red Clubs** (Red Ransom) and **Dutch Art** (Medicean)--in the earnings race. All three have 10 or more winners, including a black-type winner, to date. Pivotal's son **Excellent Art** moved into fourth spot by virtue of an impressive win by the filly Experience in Saturday's G3 Grangecon Stud S. at the Curragh. Fifth-ranked **Teofilo** (Galileo) had previously scored with black-type winner Teolane. **Flashy Bull** moved to the head of the class among North American freshman sires when his daughter Flashy Lassie won Churchill's GIII Debutante S. Saturday, and **The Way Home**, a son of Giant's Causeway, had the first two in a New Mexico-bred race at Ruidoso. Also catching the eye, in Europe, has been **Lawman** (Invincible Spirit), and, of the American stallions, **Hard Spun**. Both are showing plenty of promise.

RACETRACK Round-Up

GODOLPHIN BUYS ALKIMOS Godolphin has purchased the G3 Tercentenary S. runner-up **Alkimos (Ire)** (High Chaparral {Ire}). Racing for Leonidas Marinopoulous and Luca Cumani, the 3-year-old colt was beaten 1 3/4 lengths by Pisco Sour (Lemon Drop Kid) in the 10-furlong contest at Royal Ascot. He will now be targeted at the 2012 Dubai Carnival, according to the operation's website.

BEHKABAD CAREER IN THE BALANCE His Highness The Aga Khan's **Behkabad (Fr)** (Cape Cross {Ire}) may have run his last race after sustaining a knee injury, racing manager Georges Rimaud announced. The Jean-Claude Rouget-trained 4-year-old, who was successful in the G1 Grand Prix de Paris, fourth in the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe and third in the G1 Breeders' Cup Turf last term, was second when last seen in the June 5 G2 Grand Prix de Chantilly. "Behkabad is unfortunately injured and needs rest," Rimaud told *PA Sport*. "How long he will be out for is difficult to say at the moment. It is a knee injury and we will just have to see how it repairs. It would not be right to say how long it will take at this stage. It is disappointing, as he ran a good race at Chantilly on his comeback, but that is racing."

VEITCH HEARING BEGINS Kentucky State Steward John Veitch's hearing regarding Life at Ten (Malibu Moon)'s lackluster performance in the 2010 Breeders' Cup at Churchill Downs kicked off Tuesday. The witnesses included *ESPN* television producer Amy Zimmerman, two Churchill Downs stewards and a starter, Life at Ten's jockey John Velazquez, and Veitch. Velazquez, who admitted no wrongdoing in the situation, recently accepted a deal and paid a \$10,000 fine. He testified via phone yesterday. "Trust me, I've ridden 25,000 horses, and I know when one is not all right," Velazquez said, according to *Daily Racing Form*. During the *ESPN* broadcast, Velazquez commented that Life at Ten wasn't "warming up like she normally does." Veitch shifted the attention to the state veterinarian during his testimony. "We are not trained that way because it is not our responsibility [to order veterinary exams]," Veitch said in a *DRF* report. "It is the responsibility of the state veterinarians." The hearing, conducted by Robert Layton to see if Veitch violated rules of racing prior to the Ladies' Classic, continues today.

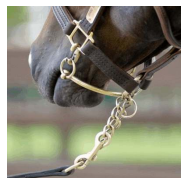

NO PANIC AFTER FOAL CROP STUDY The Thoroughbred Breeders' Association refused to show alarm after the results of a detailed study outlined the drastic reduction in the size of British and Irish foal crops. While the fall in foals shows up at almost 40% from 2007, Weatherbys' Executive Director and TBA Board Member Paul Greeves was taking a positive view. "The speed and quantity of the reduction in numbers is unprecedented in modern times," he said. "To get an idea of the whole picture, however, we need to look at the mare population. The mares are still there--more, perhaps, than the drop in the foal population might suggest. So, while foal numbers are down nearly 40% and the number of 2-year-olds going into training in 2012 might drop by more than 20%, the mare population has only declined by 21% and, within that, the quality factor has increased significantly. The reduced foal population may well be of greater quality and more robust. The racing industry depends on breeders and supporting the breeding industry at this time has to be a priority." TBA Chairman Kirsten Rausing also addressed the issue and was concentrating on the issue of the quality of the British race program. "Maintenance of the black-type programme at a competitive level is critical in these difficult times," she said. "It is the foundation of our race programme and, in spite of financial pressures, continues to ensure that British racing and breeding maintains its international reputation as amongst the best in the world and we should do all we can to maintain their crucial funding."

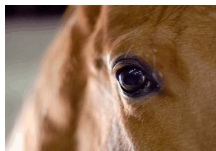
