ANIMAL KINGDOM DONE FOR THE YEAR

Kentucky Derby winner **Animal Kingdom** (Leroidesanimaux {Brz}) will miss the remainder of his 3-year-old season with a slab fracture, it was announced Wednesday. The Team Valor International colorbearer was originally diagnosed with a small fissure at the tip of his left hind cannon bone two weeks ago. "A second set of films has revealed a slab fracture just above the small fissure noted in the previous images," Team Valor CEO Barry Irwin commented. Dr. Dean

Richardson of New Bolton Research Center in Pennsylvania will insert a screw to compress the fracture Thursday. **Animal Kingdom**, a game second in the G1 Preakness S. and an eventful sixth in the G1 Belmont S., will rehab for three months before returning to training at Graham Motion's Fair Hill base. The chestnut will be pointed toward the 2012 G1 Dubai World Cup, according to Irwin. "I think that Henry Cecil proved it was possible to train a colt in a cold climate like England and win well with him off the plane in Dubai, as he did with **Twice Over** (GB) (Observatory) last year," Irwin explained. "Graham and I have talked about this. No decision will be made for a while. But running **Animal Kingdom** in the World Cup without a prep is definitely something to consider."

ECLIPSE AIM FOR FAIRY

Ed Dunlop has confirmed that Saturday's G1 Coral-Eclipse is the likely target for **Snow Fairy (Ire)** (Intikhab), who was withdrawn from the G1 Pretty Polly S. last weekend. Despite holding an alternative option in Haydock's G2 Lancashire Oaks, the 4-year-old is set to take on the big guns in the 10-furlong contest. "She went to Ireland and back in a very short period of time, but I'm favouring Sandown, as the ground should suit," Dunlop said yesterday. "She'll have a small blow-out tomorrow, and if that goes well and we are happy, we will run." The globetrotting miss captured four Group 1 events in 2010, the G1 Epsom Oaks, G1 Irish Oaks, G1 Queen Elizabeth II Cup at Kyoto and G1 Hong Kong Cup at Sha Tin. Sandown's Clerk of the Course Andrew Cooper described the ground as officially "good" yesterday following some light rain on Tuesday. "It looks a very settled week with sunny spells and no indication of rain," Cooper said. "Our view at the moment is to provide ground on the faster side of good on Saturday. The race lacks a strong 3-year-old this year, but we have an outstanding clash of the older horses."

F-T CATALOGUES 160 FOR SARATOGA

Fasig-Tipton has catalogued 160 head for its Saratoga Yearling Sale, which will take place Aug. 8-9 at the Humphrey S. Finney Pavilion in Saratoga Springs, New York. The catalogue is available at fasigtipton.com. Among the young sires represented by their first crop are Grade I winners **Big Brown** (Boundary), **Curlin** (Smart Strike), **Midnight Lute** (Real Quiet), **Raven's Pass** (Elusive Quality) and **Street Boss** (Street Cry {Ire}). "We have eight of the top 10 current leading sires represented and yearlings by most of the top established and young sires you'd expect to find in this very selective market," said Boyd Browning, president of the auction house. "We will also welcome several new faces to the Spa this year, to join the consignors who, over many years, have helped make Saratoga the great source it is for top-quality racehorses."

HEILIGBRODT DISPERSAL SHOULD OFFER OPPORTUNITIES

The Heiligbrodt name has been synonymous with precocity and speed in American racing over the past 20 years, and buyers will have a chance to tap into the pipeline when Bill and Corinne Heiligbrodt begin Phase I of a major dispersal at the Fasig-Tipton July Sale, to be held July 12th in Lexington, Ky. The Texas couple, who have alone or in partnership, campaigned the likes of Grade I winners Appealing Zophie, Cashier's Dream, Golden Ballet and Lady Tak, recently announced they were taking a hiatus from owning racehorses in order to devote more time to family and other interests. Roughly 80 horses will be offered during the dispersal, including yearlings and horses of racing age, as well as mares and foals that will be sold as a package, as the foals haven't yet been weaned. Meg Levy's Bluewater Sales is handling consigning duties.

The star of the draft figures to be [hip 448](#), the homebred 3-year-old colt **Cornpiper** (Indian Charlie--Tamboorensnshampan, by Deerhound), who broke his maiden impressively in his debut at Santa Anita Apr. 17. He came back with a runner-up finish in a Churchill NW1X May 29. The colt, trained by Steve Asmussen, was produced by a half-sister to the Grade II-winning Indian Charlie colts My Pal Charlie and Bwana Charlie, and to GSW Bwana Bull (Holy Bull).

Boyd Browning Jr., president and CEO of Fasig-Tipton, said the dispersal has a much broader appeal than a single horse of racing age.

"We are able to showcase the racehorses and a handful of yearlings, but also the higher-quality bloodstock they have, in terms of broodmares and their foals," said Browning. "We have an exciting horse like Cornpiper, but buyers also have a chance to buy several members of his family, including his dam [\[hip 470\]](#), at the sale at the same point and time. I think it creates a unique opportunity. It's a little unorthodox, but it's a unique group of horses that, frankly, is going to warrant the effort and attention it will receive."

The mare/foal packages include [hip 465](#), the 15-year-old mare Richbabe (Richman), dam of GSW Richwoman (Successful Appeal), who is in foal to Bluegrass Cat and sells with her 2011 Street Sense colt; while the broodmares include [hip 466](#), the \$300k-earner Sax Appeal (Successful Appeal), a MSW who is offered carrying a member of Kentucky Derby winner Super Saver's first crop. **Cont. p3**

"The Heiligbrodt brand is very strong--Bill and Corrine have bred fast, high-quality horses for many years, and they've been one of the country's leading owners for the past decade," Browning continued. "They have those very distinctive silks that you're used to seeing in the 2-year-old races, but those horses also tend to carry on and go forward for many years. There's a lot of durability and heartiness demonstrated in that catalogue. If you look, it's amazing to see the average number of starts for a lot of those horses, and to see the number of races and stakes they won. They obviously had a very good eye for a horse, and utilized some of the best trainers in the United States, particularly Steve Asmussen."

Selling breeding stock in July--when many buyers are focused on yearlings--presents its own challenges, but Browning said the dispersal has generated a nice buzz.

"It's increased interest across the board for the sale," he said. "There are some high-quality horses being offered. There are some unproven horses being offered, which gives people the opportunity to buy a horse today who they think might develop for them. Or, if you're looking for a proven horse who you can buy and go right to the races with, you can do that, too. There are really a lot of options, depending on what the buyers and bidders want to do. I think the cumulative effect of the regular yearling sale combined with the dispersal has sparked a lot of interest through the United States."

Former U.S.-based trainer Paulo Lobo, who returned last fall to his native Brazil to direct a large stable for prominent Sao Paulo owner-breeder Haras Old Friends, saddled his first Group 1 winner in Brazil Sunday with the 2-year-old filly Old Tune. Ridden by Ivaldo Santana--also contracted by the successful Brazilian stable--Old Tune covered the one-mile turf race in 1:35.40 to annex her second victory from five career starts. In victory, the promising Wild Event filly provided runner-up favorite and Group 1 winner Alta Vista with her first defeat in five starts. The bay, who has won or placed in all five of her starts, will point to the G1 Grande Premio Barao de Piracicaba, the first leg of Sao Paulo's Jockey Club Triple Crown in August. Lobo, 41, trained Farda Amiga to victory in the 2002 GI Kentucky Oaks at Churchill Downs and GI Alabama S. at Saratoga en route to an Eclipse Award as champion 3-year-old filly. Lobo also trained MGISW Pico Central (Brz), who was an Eclipse Award finalist as champion sprinter of 2004.

NTRA REPORT FROM CAPITOL HILL



INTERNET POKER BILL INCLUDES LANGUAGE FOR HORSE RACING

Rep. Joe Barton (R-TX) recently introduced the Internet Poker Act (H.R. 2366) to legalize Internet poker and establish a structure to license, regulate and tax potential operators.

Language related to the horse racing industry is included in the new legislation. Similar to legislation that was introduced in the last Congress by Senator Harry Reid (D-NV) but did not pass, H.R. 2366 clarifies that criminal penalties under the Wire Act do not apply to wagers made legally in accordance with the Interstate Horseracing Act.

Additionally, H.R. 2366 establishes the requirements for horse racing entities to apply for a license to offer Internet poker. To qualify, these entities must be regulated by a state or Indian tribe to accept pari-mutuel wagers on horse racing. They also must meet one of two additional requirements related to their operations: the entity must house at least 500 gaming devices at one physical location or must have handled at least \$200 million in gross wagering on horse racing for any three of the previous five years.

The legislation has bipartisan support, as seven of its 11 cosponsors are Democrats, and has been referred to the following House committees: Energy and Commerce, Financial Services and Judiciary.

LIFE AT TEN HEARING CONTINUES Kentucky Chief State Steward John Veitch faced three hours of questioning yesterday during the second day of the hearing held by the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission. *Daily Racing Form* reported that Veitch's attorney, Tom Miller, stressed that a horse's fitness to race should be determined by trackside veterinarians, as well as the people closest to the horse, including jockeys. "I cannot and should not ever influence a veterinarian to make a medical decision," Veitch said in a *DRF* report. The commission's attorneys questioned Veitch about the reported inconsistencies in the steward's statements about the matter. The hearing continues today.
