PROMISING GROUP ASSEMBLED FOR MATRON

A field of seven fillies will line up for Sunday's GII Matron S. at Belmont which, along with the GII Futurity S. earlier on the card, is the beginning of New York's graded stakes series for juveniles. Rick Shanley's **Say a Novena** (Songandaprayer) is one of the Matron headliners off a three-length track record-breaking graduation score at Monmouth in her second start June 12. The daughter of GSW Rabiadella (Dynaformer) and half to GSW Diadella (Diesis {GB}) was a non-threatening fourth on debut in Oceanport May 22, but showed drastically improved speed second time out, zipping her way to a 4 1/2-furlong clocking in :50.93--nearly a full second quicker than the previous top clocking for the trip. Long Lake Stables's **Born Bullish** (Flashy Bull) will make a quick turnaround for conditioner John Terranova. The grey was extremely well-backed in a nine-length debut romp at Big Sandy June 24. "Her debut was perfect, and she's obviously doing very well for us to enter her," said Terranova. "She's dictating this--not us. Everything has been perfect since that race, and we think she is a nice filly." **Defy Gravity** (Bandini) returns off an eight-length maiden-breaker at Pimlico in her second start May 8. She earned an 82 Beyer Speed Figure for that effort--the field's best--and finished ahead of a pair of next-out winners.

Included in the Futurity's field of six is **Threeanddonedan** (Dance With Ravens), who is owned and trained by John Salzman, Jr. The bay bested impressive next-out winner **Getupwiththesun** (Dance With Ravens) in the slop at Pimlico Apr. 16, but was a wide-trip fourth in the Victoria S. at Woodbine June 18. Mark Shuman sends out Joseph Strazzanti's **Team Six** (Lion Heart), who scored by five lengths at first asking at Monmouth June 18. Wesley Ward is represented by **Large Kaufy** (Omega Code), while **Tarpy's Goal** (High Cotton), who was entered in Saturday's GIII Bashford Manor S. at Churchill Downs, will instead ship up to New York.

Seamus Heffernan has been announced as the rider of **So You Think (NZ)** (High Chaparral {Ire}) in tomorrow's G1 Coral-Eclipse S., which has attracted a small field of five after all the remainder of the Ballydoyle contingent were scratched yesterday. Having partnered the 5-year-old in the G3 Mooresbridge S. at The Curragh May 2, Heffernan will be back on board as Ryan Moore is retained for **Workforce (GB)** (King's Best). As is now customary, the jockey declaration was tweeted by Anne Marie O'Brien yesterday morning, ending days of speculation as to who would partner the dual G1 Cox Plate hero.

Don Cavallo gets the narrow morning line nod in this contentious event, coming off a second in the 8 1/2-furlong GIII Eclipse S. here May 28. The Adenabred boasts a 3-2-1-0 career record over the Woodbine Polytrack, but this will be his first trip beyond 1 1/16 miles. Mr. and Mrs. John Amerman's **Center Divider** took a 1 5/8-mile allowance at Keeneland Apr. 27 after being transferred from Christophe Clement to Chad Brown. He enters this with a pair of bullet drills over Saratoga's tiring Oklahoma training track. **Laureate Conductor** was also making his first start away from Christophe Clement over the turf here June 12. He was claimed from Castleton Lyons and Rachel Halden by Bear Stables and Michael DePaulo out of that winning effort. Clement conditioned the bay to a third in the 1 1/4-mile G1 Secretariat S. in 2009.

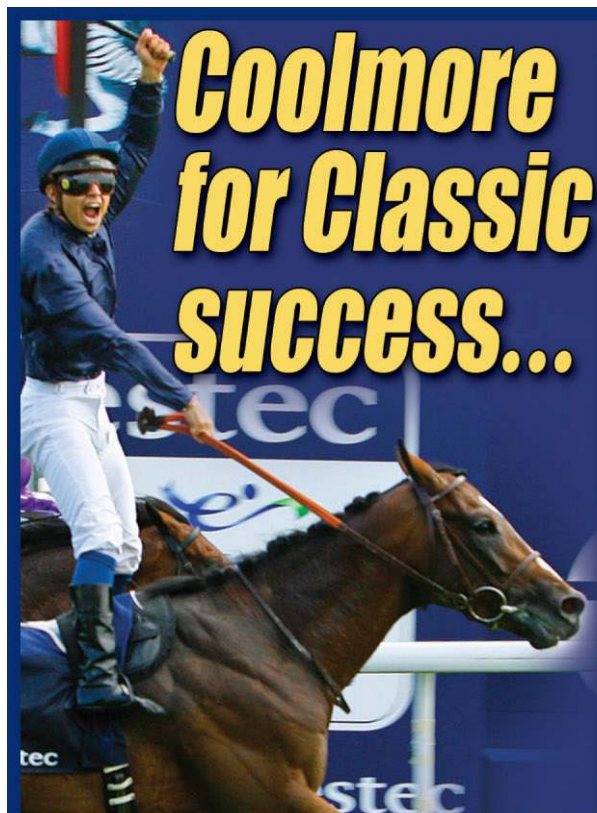

WinStar Sells Piece of Sidney's Candy...

WinStar Farm has sold a percentage of GISW **Sidney's Candy** (Candy Ride {Arg}--Fair Exchange, by Storm Cat) to Argentina's Rubio B Stable. The 4-year-old was recently purchased by WinStar from the Craig Family Trust and turned over to trainer Todd Pletcher. He will retire from racing at the end of this season to stand in 2012 at WinStar in Kentucky, and will then shuttle to Ricardo Benedicto's Haras La Pasion in Argentina for the Southern Hemisphere season. "Rubio B has acquired a significant interest in Sidney's Candy, and he will shuttle to Haras La Pasion in Argentina after his initial season at WinStar," confirmed Elliott Walden, WinStar President/CEO & Racing Manager. "We've been impressed with Haras La Pasion for a long time and like what they bring to the table. They're a leader in Argentina and have a great program. So we're thrilled to be working with one of the best that South America has to offer, and it's especially important that we happen to share the same passion for Sidney's Candy and his great potential." Benedicto added, "Candy Ride is special to Argentina because he was the best horse to ever leave the country. Sidney's Candy is his best son, and we're excited about our relationship with WinStar." Antonio Bullrich and John Fulton brokered the deal.

Jean Prat Takes Shape...

Sunday's G1 Prix Jean Prat at Chantilly attracted eight entries yesterday after trainer Richard Hannon supplemented **Strong Suit** (Rahy) and David Simcock withdrew **Dream Ahead** (Diktat {GB}). Julie Wood's June 15 G3 Jersey S. winner was added at a fee of €24,000, while last year's G1 Prix Morny and G1 Middle Park S. winner Dream Ahead will wait for Saturday's G1 Darley July Cup. "A combination of the ground and trip means he won't run in the Prix Jean Prat," the trainer's wife Jennie Simcock told the *Racing Post*. "France was the last 3-year-old race for him and we wanted to keep all our options open, but with no rain forecast the owner and trainer have decided to wait and drop him back in trip. If the ground is at least good, he will run in the July Cup a week on Saturday, but any mention of the word firm and he wouldn't run. His nearest target is the G1 Prix Maurice de Gheest [at Deauville Aug. 7]. That's when he's most likely to get his ideal conditions and he needs a run before then. The Sussex S. would be too close, so the July Cup looks like being the race that fits in best with his programme." William Haggas is set to run Cheveley Park Stud's **Fury (GB)** (Invincible Spirit {Ire}). Other notable entries include Khalid Abdullah's G3 Prix Paul de Moussac winner **Mutual Trust (GB)** (Cacique {Ire}) and the G1 St James's Palace S. second and fourth **Zoffany (Ire)** (Dansili {GB}) and **Neebras (Ire)** (Oasis Dream {GB}).

LIFE AT TEN HEARING CONCLUDES John Veitch, Kentucky's Chief Steward, maintained his position on the incident involving Life At Ten (Malibu Moon) during last year's GI Breeders' Cup Ladies' Classic during Thursday's final session of the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission's three-day hearing on. The retired Hall of Fame trainer has argued that he behaved properly and according to protocol by not contacting on-track veterinarians after it was brought to his attention that jockey John Velazquez had said during a post parade interview on *ESPN* that his mount was not warming up as she had in the past. Luke Morgan, the attorney for the commission, opened Thursday's testimony by questioning Scott Chaney, a California steward. Chaney testified, according to *Daily Racing Form*, that, if given "credible information" regarding the possibility of a horse being unfit to race, he would contact track veterinarians. He acknowledged concerns regarding a steward influencing the actions of track vets, but noted that "the alternative is far worse." Among witnesses called by Veitch's attorney, Tom Miller, was Dr. Foster Northrup, a member of the Kentucky Racing Commission and the state veterinarian who accompanied Life At Ten back to trainer Todd Pletcher's barn following her last-place finish. Northrup deemed on-air speculation that Life At Ten could be "tying up" before the race "absolutely absurd," and said that, based on video of the mare before and after the race, she appeared completely normal. Hearing officer Bob Layton is not expected to reveal his recommendation until the fall, and the racing commission's subsequent ruling will come some time next year.

HR/TVG Repole Stable's **OVERDRIVEN (Tale of the Cat)**, a \$350K KEESEP yearling graduate, makes his debut for Todd Pletcher. The 9-5 morning-line favorite, a half-brother to millionaire Smooth Air (Smooth Jazz), fired a four-furlong bullet in :48 1/5 over Saratoga's training track June 22. Pletcher also sends out fellow firster **Big Creek (Indian Charlie)**, a \$300K FTFEB juvenile. The dark bay is owned by Green Hills Farm. **J C's Pride (Henny Hughes)** was the most expensive juvenile by his sire to go through the ring this season when bringing \$200K at EASMAY. NJ Bill Approved by State Senate:

The New Jersey State Senate voted unanimously Wednesday in favor of a bill that would enable the New Jersey Sports and Exposition Authority (NJSEA) to jointly operate Monmouth Park and the Meadowlands for up to a year with the tracks' lessees, Morris Bailey and Jeffrey Gural, respectively, as lease details are finalized. "This bill provides the NJSEA with the flexibility necessary to craft and effectuate a viable lease agreement for the Meadowlands and Monmouth Park racetrack facilities without disrupting previously scheduled events," Assemblyman Ronald Dancer (D-Ocean) explained to *MyCentralJersey.com*. The bill, which was approved by the State Assembly in February, must now be signed by Gov. Chris Christie.

NJ Racing Commission Seeks Purse Subsidy:

The New Jersey Racing Commission has approved a request for \$15 million in purse subsidies. The group, which met at Monmouth Park June 29, had until yesterday to make the request. The funds, which would come from the Casino Reinvestment Development Authority, would be split up as follows: \$2.5 million to Atlantic City Race Course, \$2.5 million to Monmouth Park, \$2.5 million to the Thoroughbred license at the Meadowlands (which has been taken over by Monmouth), \$2.5 million to Freehold Raceway, and \$5 million to the harness racing license at the Meadowlands. Gov. Chris Christie, who has expressed opposition to purse subsidies for the state's tracks in the past, can veto the request.

The Best-Laid Plans...

Things don't always work out the way you expected.

Dave Pope never planned to make his living in the Thoroughbred business. Fifteen years ago, he was a transplanted accountant looking for a job in Lexington. Yesterday, he was celebrating the second victory in two days for Siena Farm, the fledgling operation of chairman and founder Anthony Manganaro, co-owner and general manager Ignacio "Nacho" Patino, and Pope, a co-owner who serves as the farm's president.

Siena's very first winner was, coincidentally, the first baby foaled on the farm, **Alaura Michele** (Arch). Making her second start, the

2-year-old filly cruised to a 4 1/4-length score in a maiden special weight test on

the Belmont Park turf Wednesday. Less than 24 hours later, Siena homebred **Anna Sophia** (Oasis Dream {GB}) belied 9-1 odds to post a 2 1/2-length debut win on Belmont's main track.

The fact that Anna Sophia was making her first start on the dirt--and in the Siena

colors--was also something of a surprise. The dark bay was entered in Fasig-Tipton's Saratoga Sale last year, and there was a lot of buzz around the yearling. ([Click here](#) for the TDN's pre-sale story on the filly and her dam, *Devout {Aus} {Dehere}*). But bidding stalled at \$290,000, and the Siena partners brought her home.

"We were planning on selling her at Saratoga--we thought she'd be the horse that all the Europeans wanted," Pope said. "She ended up RNA'ing, but we believed in her. She was foaled on our farm, we'd watched her, and we knew she had talent. We were happy to keep her and race her. It was very sweet to see her win."

But, he admitted, "We didn't expect her to perform as well on the dirt as we thought she would on the turf. [Trainer] Bill Mott has done a terrific job."

Both Alaura Michele and Anna Sophia clearly demonstrate the philosophy behind Siena Farm. In 2008, Manganaro, a highly successful real estate developer and businessman, was looking for new worlds to conquer. He purchased a 225-acre property in Paris, Kentucky, and went about creating a boutique commercial breeding operation. Manganaro wanted to develop a broodmare band with international appeal and, as Pope is quoted on the Siena website, "Breed and raise superior, world-class racehorses by melding hundreds of years of traditional horsemanship with leading-edge technology."

Anna Sophia's dam, purchased privately, was stakes-placed in Australia and boasts European champions Park Express (Ire) (Ahonoora {GB}) and New Approach (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) in her pedigree. Alaura Michele is the first foal from Isobel Baillie (GB) (Lomitas {GB}), who was listed-placed in France before being acquired by Siena, and traces back to Canadian champion Glorious Song (Halo).

Why is there focus on bloodlines from outside the U.S.?

"The equine industry might be suffering in North America at the moment--the market is a little tough out there," Pope said. "But a lot of European buyers come over for our sales, people from Japan, from South America, from Australia. And we recognized that, to have a Book 1 horse, you have to have what the buyers want. We recognize the reality of the marketplace, and the international buyers are an important part of it."

But the global band of mares will be going to top U.S. stallions. Devout has a yearling filly by Distorted Humor that will sell in September, and was bred to Speightstown in 2011. She had no foal this year. Isobel Baillie has a yearling filly by First Samurai and foaled a colt by Arch in March.

Team Siena intends to keep the numbers to boutique levels. The broodmare band now numbers 17, and there is no plan for major expansion.

"Like every farm, we are looking to develop good foundation families," Pope said. "But we will never get above 23 mares; that's our maximum."

Keeping the numbers down will be a matter of survival of the fittest. "If a mare is falling short of expectations, then we need to move on," Pope said.

It is also key to the survival of the operation.

"The mega-farm is a difficult model in the current economic environment," Pope explained. "When you take 100 yearlings to the sale, they aren't selling. There

is an oversupply. The business model that works is to have a select group of top-quality horses. We are consciously focused on producing the Book 1 horse."

Pope gives the credit for developing the Siena model to Manganaro. A civil engineering graduate from the class of '67 at Northeastern University in

Boston, Manganaro was the entrepreneur behind Siena Corporation, a commercial real estate development company in the Baltimore-Washington, D.C., corridor; ezStorage Corp., the largest self storage company in Maryland, Virginia and Washington; and Boston Medical Corp., a Maryland-based company that sells wholesale physicians' and surgeons' equipment and supplies.

"Anthony is the businessman; he has years of experience running companies and achieving success at a very high level," Pope remarked. "He is our mentor, and he is determined to make a success of Siena."

Explaining what led Manganaro to branch out into the Thoroughbred industry, Pope continued, "What he always tells people is that he has been very successful in real estate development, and his son [Todd] worked with him. It got to the point where his son was ready to take over the business, and Anthony is smart enough to know that, for his son to be viewed as the boss, he couldn't be in the room. If he was still on board, people would always look to him.

"He felt like he needed a new project. His brothers had raced horses, he had owned horses with them, and he felt this was a worthy venture. It was a challenge he wanted to take on."

As he had with his other businesses, Manganaro went about finding the best people available to run Siena Farm. Patino was working as assistant manager at Stonerside Farm with Bobby Spalding when he was introduced to Manganaro. The meeting convinced Siena's founder that this was someone he wanted to bring on board.

"You know as soon as you meet him that Nacho is a horseman," Pope said. He has a natural approach, he is good with the animals, he's great to work around and he's a hard worker. He gets the respect of the people he is working with immediately. Anthony made him a job offer."

The path to Siena was a little more complicated for Pope. It was only by chance that he was in the Bluegrass State at all.

"Kentucky is the halfway point between my family and my wife's family," he revealed. "We were both working in Washington, D.C. when we met and got married. Neither one of us wanted to stay in a big city. My family is in Akron, Ohio, but my wife [Kym] didn't want to move there. She is a Southern girl; her family is from Tennessee. We got a map out and Lexington was right in the middle; it was neutral ground. So that's where we moved."

He added, "When I relocated back in 1996, it was evident that horses are a key industry in the area."

Pope ended up at Airdrie Farm, working for Gov. Brereton Jones. "I was looking for an accounting position, he was looking for a controller," he said.

And, while he thoroughly enjoyed his 12 years with Airdrie, he decided on a career change.

"I met Nacho and Anthony, and they convinced me to go to Siena Farm," Pope said.

"It's ironic," he added. "I didn't come to Kentucky for a job in the horse industry. It was fate--it wasn't the plan at all."

Pope is more than happy that fate has led him to Siena.

"Anthony is an amazing person," he said. "And one thing he is very strong about is that he wants his top management team to be owners as well. As part of our benefit package, we have equity in the farm. It's not a job for us--we have the same identity of interest, and we work very hard to accomplish our goals."

As for future plans for Alaura Michele and Anna Sophia--both named for Manganaro's granddaughters--those are up in the air. They could be retained by Siena, and eventually join the select broodmare band.

"We know that sometimes it is necessary to replenish our broodmare band from within," Pope said. "We will race and develop fillies as broodmare prospects."

But, as Pope well knows, some opportunities are too good to ignore.

"The reality is, sometimes you get an offer that you can't turn down; you have to be open to it," Pope said.

SUNCOAST YEARLING SALE KICKS OFF IN STYLE

The 2011 KZN Yearling Sale, held for the first time at the Suncoast Casino in Durban, made a promising start on Thursday. The two-day sale's opening session saw an increase in both aggregate, R4,700,000 (US\$695,192), and average, R50,000 (US\$7,397) from last year. Seven yearlings sold for more money than last year's top price of R220,000. However, of the 150 yearlings catalogued to sell on day one, 48 failed to find new homes. Day one was topped by [lot 128](#), a colt by G1 Dubai Duty Free winner Right Approach (GB).
