MORNING LINE SOLD TO LANE'S END, DIXIANA

Lane's End Farm and Dixiana Farms LLC have purchased a majority interest in GISW **Morning Line** (Tiznow--Indian Snow, by A.P. Indy) from Legends

Racing. The \$700,000 KEESEP yearling, who captured last term's GII Pennsylvania Derby and this year's GI Carter H., is set to go in today's GIII Salvator Mile at Monmouth (*preview, p5*). He will remain in training with Nick Zito. "We have been extremely impressed with Morning Line's race record over the past year and feel he has the potential to make an outstanding sire, with his

striking good looks and exceptional pedigree," Lane's End's Will Farish said. "He will stand at Lane's End Farm upon his retirement." The 4-year-old, a grandson of MGISW November Snow (Storm Cat), has compiled a record of 10-4-4-1 and earnings of \$1,114,800.

TWICE OVER TO YORK

Sir Henry Cecil is aiming **Twice Over (GB)** (Observatory) at the July 23 G2 York S., he announced Friday. Only fifth in Royal Ascot's June 15 G1 Prince of Wales's S., Khalid Abdullah's dual G1 Champion S. and 2010 G1 Eclipse S. winner will have a class drop in the 10-furlong contest. "Twice Over is in good form and we have found no reason why he ran so poorly at Ascot," Cecil said. "He had been working very well at home, but he seemed to get upset in the box before the race and was reluctant to go into the paddock or the stalls. He is in a Group 2 at York in mid-July and hopefully we shall see his best form there."

SOLDAT GETTING A BREAK

GII Fountain of Youth S. winner **Soldat** (War Front) has been sent to a farm in Lexington, Kentucky, with tentative plans to bring him back for a fall campaign, at which point he will return to the grass. "His feet were just a little tender and we wanted to stop on him and hopefully have a top horse in the fall or next year," said conditioner Kiaran McLaughlin. "There wasn't anything specifically wrong with him. We just had a gut feeling that he wasn't doing as well as he was before the [May 7 GI Kentucky] Derby." Soldat, who broke his maiden when switched to the sod in the GIII With Anticipation S. last September, finished 11th in the Derby last time.

OVER TO YOU

If Aidan O'Brien is right and the Royal Ascot defeat of **So You Think (NZ)** (High Chaparral {Ire}) was down to him, then the Australasian legend has to put matters right in today's G1 Coral-Eclipse at Sandown. In **Workforce (GB)** (King's Best), Derrick Smith's colorbearer has a rival who will stretch every bit of his talent to the limit, but the sheer weight of cash for the Ballydoyle horse this week suggests confidence is high. His neck defeat at the hands of Rewilding (GB) (Tiger Hill {Ire}) in the June 15 G1 Prince of Wales's S. unraveled some of his purported invincibility and this is a pressure situation for the team. No one is due to feel that as much as his rider Seamus Heffernan, but he was playing it cool on Thursday. "It's great to be back on him and it looked to me as if things didn't go his way at Ascot, so hopefully they will here," he said. "He's a very good horse with a big reputation, so I just hope he puts things right. He's very straightforward and has a lot of speed and if he hits the gates well I'll go along and if not, I'll ride him wherever he's comfortable. It's a very good race and whoever wins will have to run right up to their mark." **Cont. p2**

Workforce, who emulated Lammtarra (Nijinsky) and Sea the Stars (Ire) (Cape Cross {Ire}) in annexing the G1 Epsom Derby/G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe double last term, registered an impressive return when defying a seven-pound penalty in the G3 Brigadier Gerard S. over this track and trip May 26. That was the first win for Khalid Abdullah's homebred over this distance, and he dispelled notions that he needs a mile and a half to be at his best. Much has been made of Sir Michael Stoute's lack of winners this month, but the Freemason Lodge conditioner has an enviable record in this race, with five winners since 1993. "Michael is one of the great trainers and he's not going to send his horses out for Group 1s unless he's really happy with them," racing manager Teddy Grimthorpe told the *Guardian*. "We have every confidence in him. This horse has won his only start and that's quite good form. We're very positive. He has trained very nicely, he looks great. All the signs are very decent at this stage. I think he'd like a little bit more rain if we could get it but, other than that, everyone's very happy with him." **Cont. p3**

Ouija Board (Ire) (Cape Cross {Ire}). However, connections are not expecting too many fireworks on her first run since registering a fourth Group 1 win in the Hong Kong Mile Dec. 12. After an injury and fruitless trip to Ireland last weekend, anything other than third

place here would be a significant training feat from Ed Dunlop. "There has been much speculation as to which of the colts will come out on top, but Snow Fairy had a blowout on Thursday morning and, having scoped well afterwards, we saw no reason why we should not take them on," Dunlop explained. "Obviously, Snow Fairy has not had an ideal preparation. Having suffered that minor bone damage to one of her knees in Dubai in March, it was always the intention to start her off instead in the G1 Pretty Polly S. in Ireland. Two inches of rain at the Curragh last Saturday scuppered that idea, so we have had to think again. Ideally, we could have done with another week, but if we are going to go for the King George or the Nassau, it would be good to head there with a run under our belt. So, though there are a few ifs and buts, this looks the next best place to start back after Ireland." **Sri Putra** was finishing to real effect up this track's famous uphill climb to the line when runner-up to Twice Over (GB) (Observatory) in last year's renewal. He comes here on the back of a third in the Prince of Wales's. Trainer Roger Varian is under no illusions as to the task in hand. "I said before the Prince of Wales's that I thought the race would be run to suit and he went on to run his best race since he was second in this last year," Varian told *PA Sport*. "What he needs is 10 furlongs, a stiff track and a really good pace and he should get it again in the Eclipse. Realistically, he has it all to do to win but the race should be run to suit again."

Three-time Group 1 winner **Stacelita** takes on the boys in her stateside debut. The ebony mare captured the G1 Prix de Diane and G1 Prix Vermeille (via DQ) at three, and added the G1 Prix Jean Romanet at four. Second in the G1 Prix de l'Opera last October, she shipped to the Far East for the Dec. 12 G1 Hong Kong Cup, but could do no better than eighth. The 5-year-old has been out once this year, finishing third in the G3 La Coupe going 1 1/4 miles at Longchamp June 13. "On form, Stacelita looks one of the best in the field, but she will be racing left-handed for the first time in over two years so it will be all new for her," Michel Zerolo, racing manager for owner Martin Schwartz, told *Racing Post*. Zerolo added, "[Trainer Jean-Claude Rouget] is pleased with her; she has travelled well and is in good shape." **Bourbon Bay** was four-for-five in 2010, taking the GII San Luis Obispo S., GII San Luis Rey S. and GII San Juan Capistrano H. The 5-year-old opened the new year with a win in the GII San Marcos S. Jan. 17, but missed by a nose in his Obispo title defense Feb. 19. A tired 11th in the G1 Dubai Sheema Classic at Meydan Mar. 26, he was sporting front wraps when he made his return in the June 11 GI Charlie Whittingham H. and finished an even third. **Chinchon**, winner of this race at 7-2 a year ago, is the morning-line chalk. The 6-year-old has failed to hit the board in four subsequent starts, finishing fifth in the Sheema Classic and most recently filling the same spot in the G1 Singapore Airlines International Cup at Sha Tin May 22.

Courageous Cat ships west off a win in the June 10 GIII Poker S. at Belmont. Second to Goldikova (Ire) (Anabaa) in the 2009 GI Breeders' Cup Mile, the 6-year-old made only three starts last year, winning the GIII Canadian Turf S. at Gulfstream in February, then running ninth in the G1 Dubai Duty Free S. at Meydan in March. He has been out twice since, finishing third in the GI Shadwell Turf Mile S. at Keeneland in October and taking the Poker in his 2011 opener. "He needed time off after Keeneland," explained Rudy Brisset, assistant to trainer Bill Mott. "He had an entrapped epiglottis, had surgery, and needed time to recover." The Wygod homebred arrived in California Wednesday. "Everything went smoothly," Brisset said. "He ate well and was on the track [Thursday] morning." **Victor's Cry**, the winner of this race a year ago, ended 2010 with a late-running success in the Nov. 27 GII Citation H. at Hollywood. Third in the GIII Thunder Road H. at Santa Anita Feb. 5, he was last seen running fifth in the G1 Dubai Duty Free Mar. 26. **Caracortado**, winner of the Sunshine Millions Turf S. Jan. 29, followed up with a head second in the GI Frank E. Kilroe Mile H. Mar. 5. A rallying fifth in the Apr. 9 GII Arcadia H., he was freshened after finishing sixth--but beaten just 3/4 of a length--in the May 6 GIII Alysheba S. on the dirt at Churchill Downs.

Former claimer **Rodman** came charging late in the GI Met Mile H. May 30, but ran out of real estate, finishing 2 3/4 lengths behind Tizway (Tiznow) in second. The 6-year-old has won five of his nine starts since being dropped in for a \$35,000 tag in an off-the-turf event at Saratoga in July of 2009. Four-for-eight that season, he captured the GIII Queens County H. to cap the year, then missed the entire 2010 campaign with a foot injury and a bout with colic. The Barry K. Schwartz runner ran

second in an optional claimer at the Big A Feb. 18 after a 14-month absence, and wired the field in the Irish Tower S. Apr. 14 two back. He fired a bullet five-eighths in :59 1/5 June 26. **Colizeo**, a consistent 4-year-old with plenty of early gas, opened this term with a win in the Challenger S. at Tampa Mar. 5 and came back to be third in the GIII Skip Away S. at Gulfstream Apr. 3. The dark bay was gifted soft fractions on the front end in the May 21 GIII W.D. Schaefer Memorial S. at Pimlico, but was caught late by Apart (Flatter) and finished second by a neck. He could get away with easy splits again today.

Adios Charlie is the morning-line chalk off a determined victory in the Apr. 23 GII Jerome S. at Aqueduct and a neck second to Alternation (Distorted Humor) in the May 14 GII Peter Pan S. The bay got a later start to his 3-year-old campaign and was kept out of the Triple Crown, but trainer and co-owner Stan Hough sees that as a blessing thinly disguised. "As the Triple Crown races unfolded, it might have been nice to be involved, but everything has worked out for this horse," said Hough. "I think the way it unfolded, I couldn't be any happier. There are a lot of races for 3-year-olds, and a lot of choices, and I really like the way he is coming into this race." Adios Charlie has been working bullets on the Oklahoma training track at Saratoga since the Peter Pan. **Malibu Glow** broke his maiden at this trip on a sloppy Belmont strip May 5, but was compromised when stumbling at the start of the Spend a Buck S. at Monmouth 17 days later and finished a distant third. The Jim and Susan Hill colorbearer adds blinkers for his graded bow. **Dominus** makes his first appearance since finishing second by a neck in the Apr. 30 GIII Derby Trial S.

Sir Henry Cecil holds the record of seven winners of this prize and saddles the progressive **Vita Nova**, who found only the smart Ferdoos (GB) (Dansili {GB}) a neck too strong in the Listed Pinnacle S. over this track and trip last time May 28. "Vita Nova is an improving filly," Cecil commented. "She is going nicely and should have a good chance." Jockey Tom Queally added, "She was second over course and distance in a listed race last time, but I certainly think she's capable of bridging the gap in class to Group 2 level. While she lost her unbeaten record, I was delighted with the run. She was only just beaten by Ferdoos--and I know they think an awful lot of her--the pair pulled an awful long way clear of the third." Last year's G2 Blandford S. winner and G1 Yorkshire Oaks third **Eleanora Duse** needs to rebound from a latest sixth in the G3 Dahlia S. at Newmarket May 1, while **Gertrude Bell** is on an upward curve after beating the re-opposing Polly's Mark by a head in receipt of four pounds in the Listed Warwick Fillies' S. at Goodwood last time Apr. 30. Polly's Mark has a visor for the first time here. Trainer Clive Cox told *PA Sport*, "We're putting the visor on, just to hopefully get a bit more concentration out of her. As she's got a little bit older it just wanders a bit. She's gone well in it at home. In the past, she has run in snatches in her races, so we feel it's worth a try."

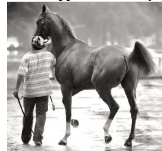

CREME DE LA CREME

Irving Cowan has certainly paid his dues in the horse racing game, and his early exertions were once again rewarded with an impressive three-length victory by homebred **Bold Warrior** (Bernardini) in a seven-furlong allowance at Belmont Wednesday afternoon. Out of his prized mare Hollywood Wildcat (Kris S.), the 3-year-old is a half-brother to GI Breeders' Cup Mile hero War Chant (Danzig), MSW and GSP Ministers Wild Cat (Deputy Minister) and Group 2 winner Ivan Denisovich (Ire) (Danehill), who also was runner up in the G1 Prix Morny and GI Secretariat S.

"This was a very nice colt from the beginning," Cowan said of Bold Warrior. "He does everything so well and with little effort. I've got high hopes for him and, after watching Wednesday's race, I'm convinced he's stakes quality."

Cowan indicated that plans have not been finalized as to where the colt might appear next, but he said a trip upstate to Saratoga appears to be in the cards.

"Exactly where we're going to go next, we haven't had a chance to discuss with [trainer Allen Jerkens], but stakes company is the direction we're thinking about," Cowan confirmed.

Bold Warrior marked his career debut with a narrow second in a seven-panel test at the Elmont oval Apr. 30 before breaking through with an eye-catching three-length score in a six-furlong maiden test May 21. While both his wins came at less than a mile, Cowan has little concern that his up-and-coming star can handle a route of ground.

"He was bred to go as far as you want to send him," Cowan offered. "We think he should get a mile and a quarter. He's been sprinting, so we are not 100% sure what his running style will be. We know he can sprint, but he has also shown he can rate with no problem.

"The only real question he will have to answer along the line is what kind of turn of foot he will show when he's asked to come from behind."

Cowan, who enjoyed most of his earlier success breeding his GI Breeders' Cup Distaff heroine Hollywood Wildcat to sons or grandsons of the legendary Northern Dancer, departed from that tried and true path when breeding to Darley's sophomore champion and Classic winner Bernardini (A.P. Indy).

"We decided on Bernardini, because it was a good [Werk] nick," he explained. "Bernardini was a hot stallion prospect with a very impressive racing career and had a beautiful pedigree. They are also very compatible in their looks and build. Hollywood Wildcat's a medium-sized mare, who doesn't look her age and never did. She's a nice, racy-looking mare, and beautifully conformed, so we thought he would fit her beautifully."

Cowan indicated that Bold Warrior showed plenty of precocity at two, but was forced to remain on the sidelines until this spring.

"He was pretty close to being ready to start last season, but, as happens with some of these babies, he bucked his shins," recalled Cowan. "He needed a little time to pull himself back together again. That obviously set us back. Other than that, he's had no physical problems and never gave us cause for concern. Since then, he has shown us that he is fast and sound, now

he is just putting it all together."

A former Broadway producer, Cowan--president of Cowan Enterprises Inc.--campaigned Thoroughbreds over the last four decades with his wife, Marjorie, who passed away 2 1/2 years ago. Cowan not only lost his wife of over five decades, he also lost a central member of the Cowan racing partnership. Last fall, he decided to reduce his Thoroughbred holdings, beginning with Keeneland's November sale. Among those sold during that initial phase

of the reduction was Society Selection (Coronado's Quest), winner of the GI Frizette S., GI Test S. and GI Alabama S., and earner of \$1.9 million. The bay, who brought a healthy \$1.85 million at the Lexington venue, will be represented by another Cowan homebred--first-time starter American Angel (Ghostzapper)--in Belmont's second race this Sunday.

“There wasn’t anything pressing financially or any other big issue forcing me to disperse,” Cowan explained. “I never lost interest in racing, but Marjorie and I used to enjoy going to the races together. That was a big reason for the reduction.”

He added, “I just felt it was time to bring the numbers down to a reasonable number.”

According to Cowan, the decision to retain Bold Warrior was more a function of circumstances than foresight.

“He was in training and doing quite well, but we never really participated at the 2-year-old in training sales, so that wasn’t an option,” Cowan offered. “Also, we hadn’t really decided to reduce my horses until after the [Keeneland] September sale, so consequently, we ended up hanging on to most of the young racing stock. The initial phase of the reduction really only involved the mares.”

Last fall, Cowan reduced his Thoroughbred holdings to 35, down from 70. He is expected to offer five yearlings at Keeneland’s September sale, and an additional five mares in November.

Among those on offer in September will be a Street Cry (Ire) colt out of Hollywood Wildcat. But the businessman insisted he will never part with Bold Warrior’s 21-year-old dam.

“Hollywood Wildcat was a special horse to us,” Cowan said. “She’s coming to the end of her career as a broodmare, and that’s always been an emotional thing for myself and my wife. We decided long ago that we would always keep her and provide for her, even after her service as a broodmare was over. We wanted to make sure that she was retired to a good farm and that she

received everything we felt she deserved. She was such a unique individual, being a Breeders’ Cup winner and producing a Breeders’ Cup winner. It would feel like I was turning out a child if I sold her.”

Also from the golden pipeline, Cowan owns Hollywood Wildcat’s 4-year-old son Shintoh (Giant’s Causeway). Cowan said that Shintoh, runner-up in the G3 Ballymacoll Stud S., has been transferred to the U.S. and is expected to return to competition later this season. Hollywood Wildcat has a 2-year-old Hard Spun filly that sold to Lakland Farm for \$310,000 at FTKOCT.

Cowan indicated that his plan to downsize is by no means an exercise in culling, and that he has offered, and he will continue to do so in the coming months, much of the very best his operation has to offer. Despite the sizable reduction, however, Cowan hopes to retain a small interest in the sport.

“Everything is subject to various circumstances, but my intention is to keep four-to-six top-bred mares and to participate with a relatively small, but select, stable,” he remarked. “I would keep some of the fillies that are racing, so they could join my broodmare band. Basically, I would just re-circulate them. I’m not looking to get up to the types of numbers we had previously.”

While Cowan lost his motivation to keep his racing operation at its former level, he certainly hasn’t lost the biggest force that has driven the enterprise over the past 40 years.

“The overriding factor that keeps me in the game is that I love my horses,” he said. “I really do.”

What’s Next for Bold Warrior?

Trainer Allen Jerkens said yesterday that Bold Warrior will be nominated to the July 30 GII Jim Dandy S. and Aug. 27 GI Travers S., but it may be the fall before he takes the step into graded company. “We don’t know [where he’ll run next] because it’s so tough right now, unless you wanted to wait for the races in the fall,” said Jerkens. “The two races in Saratoga figure to be very tough, both the Jim Dandy and Travers. We’ll have to see.” But plans are to try the 3-year-old at a route of ground. “There is reason to believe he can go a distance,” said Jerkens. “He’s not one of those horses you can’t rate.”

Gov. Christie Vetoes Purse Subsidy:

As expected, Gov. Chris Christie yesterday vetoed the \$15 million purse subsidy requested by the New Jersey Racing Commission. The money would have come from casino taxes. "The actions of the Commissioners of the NJRC appear to constitute an abdication of their responsibilities as Commissioners to protect the best interests of the State of New Jersey and its citizens," said Gov. Christie in his veto letter. "The NJRC's decision to allocate \$15 million in state subsidies for the support of the New Jersey horse racing industry contradicts and jeopardizes my stated goal of creating a self-sustaining course for the horse racing industry, which culminated in the recent agreements with private individuals to shift track operations at both the Meadowlands Racetrack and Monmouth Park from the State to the private sector." Christie added, "We have an obligation to the New Jersey horse racing industry and our citizens to restructure the industry so it can be competitive and financially self-sustaining in the long run. The sooner that initiative is underway, which requires the elimination of state subsidies for horse racing, the better chance it has to succeed."

Canterbury Temporarily Shut Down Due to State Woes:

(Edited press release) Canterbury Park temporarily suspended all of its gaming operations effective Friday at 12:00 am. This action was taken because of the inability of Minnesota's Governor and Legislature to reach an agreement on the State's budget. The lack of a budget agreement forced the shutdown of many state government agencies and functions, including the Minnesota Racing Commission (MRC), the agency which regulates Canterbury Park's pari-mutuel and Card Casino gaming operations. "I am extremely disappointed and frustrated that we are forced to suspend operations due to the state government shutdown," Canterbury President Randy Sampson said. "The MRC is entirely funded by the racing industry, receives no money from the general fund, and has already received reimbursement for expected July expenses. However, it is still subject to a shutdown. The money is already there, paid by the industry, for the MRC to regulate this business. Because of this, 1,000 employees' lives will be needlessly impacted in a negative way." Canterbury Park began distributing notices Thursday to employees indicating they would be placed on a temporary unpaid leave of absence until operations were allowed to resume. "We are hopeful that this government shutdown is short-lived and that a budget solution will soon be found. However, should the stalemate continue, there is the real possibility that owners and trainers will start moving their horses from Canterbury to other racetracks. If the budget impasse continues beyond early July, the impact could be devastating for Canterbury and the horse industry. It is possible that Canterbury and its horsemen could lose the remainder of their racing season," Sampson said.

2011 Pincay Award to Jerry & Ann Moss:

(Edited press release) Jerry and Ann Moss will be presented the eighth annual Laffit Pincay Jr. Award during the Hollywood Gold Cup program Saturday, July 9 at Hollywood Park. Pincay, a member of racing's Hall of Fame since 1975, will make the presentation between the fifth and sixth races. The Pincay Award is presented annually to someone who has served the sport with integrity, extraordinary dedication, determination and distinction. "Racing owes the Mosses a debt of gratitude for keeping Zenyatta in training for an extra year," said Pincay. "They have been huge supporters of the sport for a long period of time and have continued to promote racing in numerous ways. I was fortunate enough to ride some winners for them during my career. They are very nice people, great to be around and well respected by everyone in every way." The Mosses and (trainer John) Shirreffs were widely lauded for making Zenyatta accessible to the racing public, as she was often visited by fans at her Hollywood Park stable. The entire Zenyatta team was given a Special Eclipse Award earlier this year. In addition to his involvement as an owner, Jerry Moss has served as a member of the California Horse Racing Board since being appointed by former Governor Arnold Schwarzenegger in 2003. Ann Moss is an active environmentalist and founder of the Dolphin Connection. The Pincay Jr. Award was introduced by Hollywood Park in 2004, with esteemed executive and racing publicist Bob Benoit the initial winner.

SUNCOAST YEARLING SALE ENDS ON A DECLINE

The annual KZN Yearling Sale, held for the first time at Suncoast Casino and hosted by South Africa's Thoroughbred Breeders Association, ended with mixed results. The aggregate of R7.727 million (US\$1,147,979) was down slightly on last year's total of R7.973 million, and the RNA rate rose from 59% to 65% in 2011. The average rose slightly from 2010, from R43,568 (\$6,043) last year to R46,269 (\$6,418). The highest-priced yearling in 2011, a colt by Right Approach (GB) (Machiavellian) sold as lot 128, made R310,000 (\$43,000), a 40.9% increase on last year's top price of R220,000 (\$30,517). Day two of the sale was topped by lot 222, a handsome grey named Luxardo (SAf). Consigned by Backworth Stud, the colt is by Machiavellian's half-brother Mogok (Storm Cat), and is himself a half-brother to the five-time winner Aquavit (SAf) (Fard {Ire}). He hails from the family of Broodmare of the Year Loyal Linda (SAf) (Averof {GB}). The grey was knocked down to VIP Thoroughbreds for R200,000 (\$27,743). Jan Naude, CEO of the TBA, commented, "There have been many positive comments made about the Casino. Unfortunately, the current tough economic climate is reflected in some of the results."
