TATTS JULY SALE BEGINS TODAY

Tattersalls' July Sale, which gets underway this morning in Newmarket, does not look to feature a star such as last year's record-priced 460,000gns Business As Usual (GB) (Invincible Spirit {GB}), but there is enough in the 753-lot catalogue to appeal to a variety of buyers.

"We've got a quality catalogue with all the ingredients to attract our usual cast of domestic and international buyers. It's a sale that appeals to all sorts of people with different requirements," said Tattersalls marketing director Jimmy George. "We've got some well-covered mares, fillies with good pedigrees and some good quality horses in training."

There was a good spread of domestic and international visitors looking for racing and breeding

prospects at Tattersalls' Park Paddocks yesterday afternoon, and one mare with a current pedigree is [lot 49](#), **Anasy** (Gone West--Blue Moon {Fr}, by Lomitas {GB}). The 5-year-old, covered by Equiano (Fr), is a half-sister to recent Gill Beverly Hills H. winner Malibu Pier (Malibu Moon), and

should make considerably more than the 3,200gns she realised on her last visit to Tattersalls in February 2009.

[Lot 43](#), **Eclaircie (Ire)** (Thunder Gulch--Blushing Gleam {GB}, by Caerleon), is for sale with her March-born Dubawi (Ire) colt foal, while Cliveden Stud's unraced homebred **Trishuli (GB)** (Indian Ridge {Ire}--Place de l'Opera {GB}, by Sadler's Wells) will have appeal when appearing as [lot 74](#). She is a full-sister to the group winners Imperial Stride (GB) and High Pitched (GB), and appears from New England Stud with a Mount Nelson (GB) covering.

Darley is well-represented in the catalogue. Its offerings include [lot 78](#), the 4-year-old **La Chicana (Ire)** (Invincible Spirit {Ire}--Always Friendly {GB}, by High Line {GB}), a sibling to both Group 2 winner Allied Powers (Ire) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) and recent impressive 2-year-old debutant Eastern Sun (Ire) (Kodiac {GB}).

INGLORIOUS TO TRAIN UP TO ALABAMA

Inglorious (Hennessy), who upset a full field of males to win the Queen's Plate at Woodbine June 26, was not nominated to the Prince of Wales S. and will

instead try to give Donna and Verne Dubinsky's Donver Stable a second victory in the GI Alabama S. in the span of three years Aug. 20. The couple's colors were carried to victory by Careless Jewel (Tapit) back in 2009. "She's going straight to the Alabama," trainer Josie Carroll told *Daily Racing Form*. "She came out of her last race good. On the track, she's been bucking and squealing. But she's run several races close together. I talked to the Dubinskys, and we thought it was the right thing to give her extra time off." Though she is perfect in five starts over the Woodbine all-weather, the Ontario-bred was runner-up in the Gill Rachel Alexandra S. in February and fourth as the favorite in the Gill Fair Grounds Oaks in her only two appearances on conventional dirt. She has a current record of 7-5-1-0 and earnings of \$1,264,943.

Of the horses in training, [lot 390](#), **Humidor (Ire)** (Camacho {GB}--Miss Indigo {GB}, by Indian Ridge {Ire}), was still in the sale last night, and is likely to be popular on the back of his third in the G3 Coral Charge at Sandown on Saturday ([video](#)). The George Baker-trained 4-year-old is also a leading contender for the Stewards' Cup Handicap at Goodwood.

Those appealing to the jumping market are likely to include [lot 356](#), Sheikh Mohammed's 3-year-old **His Excellency (Ire)** (King's Best--Road Harbour, by Rodrigo de Triano), a 10-furlong handicap winner at Leopardstown for trainer John Oxx. The 3-year-old is a half-brother to useful hurdler Leg Spinner (Ire) (Intikhab). Northern Ireland handler Andy Oliver offers [lot 287](#), **Terminal Velocity (Ire)** (Iffraaj {GB}--Bint Al Balad {Ire}, by Ahonoora {Ire}), winner of a competitive 10-furlong maiden at the Curragh on June 3, while [lot 337](#), 3-year-old **Sportmaster (Ire)** (Ad Valorem--Boston Ivy, by Mark of Esteem {Ire}), has won his last two starts, including a Curragh handicap on June 24.

Jim Bolger often fares well as a vendor at this sale. His offerings this year include [lot 708](#), Curragh maiden winner **Irish Review (Ire)** (Rock Of Gibraltar {Ire}--Aretha {Ire}, by Indian Ridge {Ire}), and [lot 714](#), the 2-year-old **Snowflake Dancer (Ire)** (Dylan Thomas {Ire}--Snowy Day in La {Ire}, by Sadler's Wells), who boasts two listed places.

Trainer Mark Johnston is well-represented, and [lot 329](#), **Ithoughtitwasover (Ire)** (Hurricane Run {Ire}--Green Castle {Ire}, by Indian Ridge {Ire}), will have admirers on the back of a recent 12-furlong Bath maiden victory.

Two boasting winning form at a high level are [lot 620](#), last season's G3 Select S. winner **Red Badge (Ire)** (Captain Rio {GB}--Red Fuschia {GB}, by Polish Precedent); and [lot 670](#), the 2009 Breeders' Cup Marathon winner **Man Of Iron** (Giant's Causeway--Better Than Honour, by Deputy Minister).

Selling, beginning at 9:30 a.m., runs all day today with pre- and post-racing sessions tomorrow, starting at 9:30 a.m. and again at 5 p.m., and Friday, kicking off at 9:30 a.m. and 5:30 p.m. Catalogues are available on www.tattersalls.com.

WITNESS ON TRACK FOR CUP BID

Australian raider **Star Witness (Aus)** (Starcraft {NZ}) was sent to work on the July Course yesterday by trainer Danny O'Brien in preparation for a tilt at Saturday's G1 Darley July Cup. Partnered by jockey Steven Arnold in the spin, the G1 King's Stand S. second and G1 Golden Jubilee S. third gave all the right signals, according to his conditioner. "That was very pleasing," O'Brien said after the work. "Steven was really happy with the way Star Witness felt on the course. Obviously, it is a different course from what we would have at home. Most of our racecourses are fairly flat. The horse did not appear to have any problem taking the dips and rises. He was very strong through the line on his gallop. It is obviously different when you get under raceday pressure, but it was all positive out there this morning." He added, "An Australian-trained horse has never won the July Cup--a bridge too far for the Australians in the past--but naturally it is a challenge and we would like to be the first to win it."

Of how his charge has been doing since Royal Ascot, O'Brien offered, "He went into the King's Stand S. needing the run--it was part of his preparation for the Jubilee--but we were still hoping to win that race. He came out of the King's Stand S. in great order and obviously ran very well on the Saturday without conditions being in his favour."

O'Brien continued, "He has had three weeks since and really enjoyed the environment here at Newmarket. He certainly has not gone backwards."

The 4-year-old, a two-time Group 1 winner in Australia, will be retired after Saturday's race, and his trainer thinks an English Group 1 win on the stallion's resume would look pretty good. "He is going to Widden Stud," O'Brien confirmed. "He goes into quarantine straight from the races here on Saturday. He gets on the flight with all the shuttle horses and will start at Widden in September. There is never a Group 1 race in a country like England that is going to be easy to win. If we could walk away with a July Cup win on this horse's resume, that would be a fantastic thing for him to take into his stud career. There were two deserving winners at Ascot, and we just hope we get our turn on Saturday."

As for tactics in Saturday's race, O'Brien said he hoped to see Star Witness wait longer to make his move. "We probably would like to hold him up for a bit longer on Saturday," he explained. "We got a bit exposed in the Jubilee--we probably went a fraction early as the horses down the stand's side rail looked to be well in front. We were out on our feet in the last 100 metres. We need to be running to the post, rather than staggering to it. I will leave it to Steven, but I am sure he will be a little bit more patient on Saturday and hold it together for as long as he can."

Arnold, who rode in this race two years ago when 10th on 11-8 favorite Scenic Blast (Aus) (Scenic {Ire}), added, "Star Witness seems to be holding his form well, which is obviously important and, if he runs like he did at Ascot, he will be competitive on Saturday. I wouldn't be surprised if it is not quite as testing as Ascot over six furlongs. The speed in the race will dictate where we are--we will probably be just behind the pace. If he performs up to his best, he will be in there at the finish. Scenic Blast came off winning the King's Stand S., so he was in good form as well, but he did not put up his run that day for whatever reason, but he was gone well before the rise, so it was not the track."

BATTER UP: FASIG FIRST

We're less than a week away from Fasig-Tipton July, the inaugural yearling sale of the season, and though there are nearly four weeks between it and Saratoga--also a Fasig sale--the catalogues are now out or online for both. The first thing that hits you when you look at the books is that the number catalogued is down, in both sales. Fasig July shrinks to one day from two, with a 26% drop in the number catalogued (407 to 303), while Saratoga drops 21%, from 202 to 160 over two nights. Combined, there are 463 catalogued between the two sales, down 24% from 609 catalogued last year, and down 40% from the 763 catalogued between the two sales in 2008.

What is worrying about this drop is that the two sales represent first, the middle tier of the market, and

second, the upper tier. When the foal crop started to shrink from the years of overproduction, the idea was that the biggest drop in numbers would come at the bottom; but what these numbers suggest is that there has been significant

attrition in all tiers of the market. The freezing of credit that resulted from the global recession of 2008-09 evidently affected more than just the bottom, no doubt a function of record stud fees and other high production costs. Keeneland doesn't have a final count yet for their September supermarket sale, but how far the number catalogued is below last year's 4,857 is a statistic that will be watched more closely than usual.

Traditionally a fall in the numbers catalogued correlates with being able to sustain an average, which was \$75,780 at Fasig last year, and \$277,051 at Saratoga. Fasig's July sale tends to average in the \$75,000 to \$100,000 range, so with a smaller catalogue and a market maybe on the rise, there must be some optimism for an uptick in average. On the other hand, we are still in the thick of a downsizing in many other aspects of the business, including on the major non-slots circuits--California, Kentucky and, at one point, New York--which traditionally supply the biggest players who spend the biggest money. But maybe they'll be encouraged by the downsizing to think they can be more competitive in the most prestigious races as the competition seemingly thins out.

With the move to one day, Fasig has scrapped its New Sire Showcase (at least temporarily), but the three stallions with the highest representation are nonetheless first-crop sires. With 10 each catalogued at Fasig are Hill 'n' Dale's dual GI Breeders' Cup Sprint winner **Midnight Lute** (Real Quiet) and Spendthrift's **Tiz Wonderful** (Tiznow), winner of the GII Kentucky Jockey Club S. as a 2-year-old. Midnight Lute had 20 weanlings/short yearlings average \$46,000 during the 2010-11 mixed sales; Tiz Wonderful had 24 average \$36,062. His individuals impressed a lot of judges, with the foals and short yearlings sold averaging almost three times his entering 2009 stud fee. Being essentially a conformation sale, having so many accepted to Fasig July suggests the stock of both horses are continuing to impress at least the sales company judges.

Majestic Warrior (A.P. Indy) was reportedly a very expensive purchase by Coolmore after winning the GI Hopeful S. in 2007, but, as fate would have it, he never even hit the board in five subsequent starts at two and three. Ashford accepted right away he would have to be a mid-range sire and work his way up; he went to stud for \$20,000, itself a far cry from what they were no doubt hoping to stand him for when they bought him, and in 2011 he stood for just half that, \$10,000. He had 21 weanlings/short yearlings average \$33,652, but, in the context of what he now stands for, having nine yearlings accepted for Fasig July is a good sign.

Four other sires with their first yearlings have five or six yearlings catalogued. Two are sons of Street Cry: Darley's **Street Boss**, a dual Grade I winner sprinting in California as a 4-year-old; and Vinery's **Street Hero**, winner of the GI Norfolk S. at two. Three Chimneys' **Big Brown** was the champion 3-year-old of 2008; he and **Curlin** (Smart Strike; three at Saratoga) figure to be the two 'Book 1' North American sires among the sire group with first foals 2010, first yearlings 2011. Big Brown is by Danzig's son Boundary, who has a pretty successful second-crop sire son already this year in Pomeroy. Big Brown has five catalogued at Fasig, as does **Notional** (In Excess). He's one of three Spendthrift stallions with first-crop representation at Fasig, along with Tiz Wonderful (see above) and **Into Mischief** (Harlan's Holiday; three catalogued).

Another nine stallions have between five and seven catalogued at Fasig July, of which four have 5-year-olds and up in 2011, and five have their first 2-year-olds, 3-year-olds, or 4-year-olds. Among the older brigade, two have seven catalogued each: WinStar's (formerly Airdrie's) **Harlan's Holiday** (Harlan), who has eight black-type winners this year; and Walmac's **Songandaprayer** (Unbridled's Song), a prolific sire of 2-year-old winners, with five already this year including last Sunday's GII Matron S. second, Say a Novena.

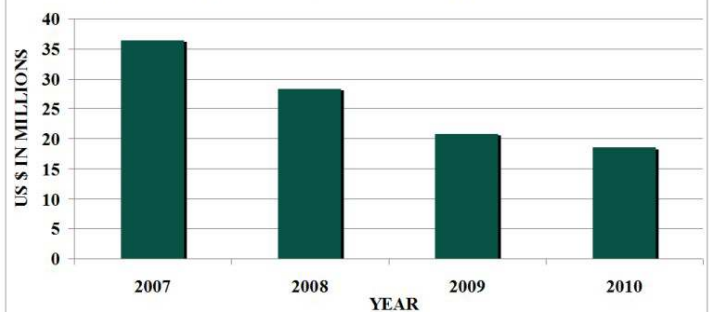
Weekly Sales Ticker

"Downsizing the catalogues is the main theme of next week's season-opening Fasig July Yearling Sale and their top-tier Saratoga Sale next month. Fasig July's catalogue is down 26 percent to a one-day sale, with 303 catalogued; Saratoga drops 21 percent, from 202 to 160. Fasig July's clearance rate from the catalogue was around 60 percent last year, so they'll be hoping to sustain that rate at least. The gross, as you can see, has dropped by half since 2007, and will surely drop more, but the \$75,780 - \$77,716 averages the last two years are the real target. The 2-year-old market results are a positive."

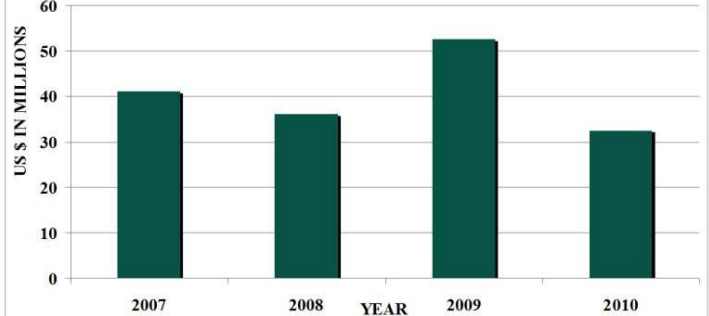

Three Chimneys' **Exchange Rate** (Danzig) had a 2.41 APEX A Runner Index at the end of last year from his Florida crops. His first Kentucky crop includes last weekend's GIII Bashford Manor S. winner Exfactor. He has six catalogued at Fasig, as does the now-Turkish stallion, **Lion Heart** (Tale of the Cat).

Adena Springs' **Ghostzapper** (Awesome Again), among the top five third-crop sires this year ([click here to see the year-to-date third-crop sire list](#)), has five catalogued at Fasig. Among second-crop sires, Darley's **Rockport Harbor** (Unbridled's Song), fifth on the 2011 second-crop sire list ([click here](#)), has six in the book, while WinStar's **Bluegrass Cat** (Storm Cat), who is 10th, has five catalogued. Among freshman sires, with their first 2-year-olds, Gainesway's **Corinthian** (Pulpit) and deceased (was Stonewall) **Lawyer Ron** (Langfuhr) each has six catalogued.

Saratoga is a different ball game; as you'd expect, a different group of sires has the biggest representation there. Darley's top-three second-crop sire **Bernardini** (A.P. Indy) tops all sires with 16 catalogued at Saratoga--fully 10% of the catalogue, in fact. Last year, Bernardini ranked third among freshman sires by progeny earnings and had four graded/group stakes winners, two of them Grade I/Group 1 winners, and it just seemed a question of when, not if. He's running second to War Front in 2011 progeny earnings, with Bellamy Road right behind him in third, and you just want to say, would you get on with it, please? Bernardini has just two black-type winners this year, though he's had five different 3-year-olds place in a Grade I. Surely, with the number of his runners that are plenty more than useful, a 'big horse' is imminent.

Seven other sires have six to eight yearlings each catalogued to Saratoga, only one of which, Darley's promising freshman sire **Hard Spun** (Danzig, 6 catalogued) is not a proven sire. Leader among these is another Darley stallion, **Medaglia d'Oro**, with 11 catalogued. He is one of three F2006 sires (first foals 2006, first 5-year-olds 2011) among the seven; the other two are Gainesway's 2011 Leading North American sire (by progeny earnings), **Tapit**, and Lane's End's equally exciting **Candy Ride**, with seven and six catalogued, respectively. With eight each at Saratoga are Taylor Made's perennial top 15 sire (and very promising broodmare sire) **Unbridled's Song** and Spendthrift's **Malibu Moon**, North America's newest top 10 sire. Airdrie's **Indian Charlie**, sire of 2010 2-year-old champion Uncle Mo (remember him?) has seven catalogued.

CASINO DRIVE TO SHADAI Casino Drive

(Mineshaft--Better Than Honour, by Deputy Minister), winner of the 2008 GII Peter Pan S., has been retired from racing and will take up stud duties at the Shadai Stallion Station, according to *Racing Post*. Out of Broodmare of the Year Better Than Honour, Casino Drive is a half-brother to back-to-back GI Belmont S. winners Jazil (Seeking the Gold) and Rags to Riches (A.P. Indy). The handsome chestnut was purchased by Nobutaka Tada on behalf of Hidetoshi Yamamoto for \$950,000 out of the 2006 Keeneland September sale. He was in line for a try at giving his dam a third straight Belmont victory after his Peter Pan win, but was knocked out of the Classic by a bruised foot. The 6-year-old was also second in the 2009 G1 February S. On the board in six starts in Japan, Dubai and the U.S., Casino Drive retires with four wins and earnings of \$904,575.

DAKOTA PHONE RETIRED GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile winner **Dakota Phone** (Zavata--World of Gold, by Spinning World) has been retired, according to *Daily Racing Form*. Unplaced in three starts following his 37-1 upset at Churchill last November, the 6-year-old gelding sustained an unspecified injury in the spring. "He has an injury we probably won't bring him back from," trainer Jerry Hollendorfer told *DRF*. Hollendorfer added that Dakota Phone is currently "enjoying himself" at the Rancho Paseana training center near Del Mar. Campaigned by a partnership that included Hollendorfer, along with John Carver, Halo Farms and George Todaro, the Kentucky-bred compiled a record of 35-6-7-9 and earnings of \$1,282,810. He also won the 2010 GII San Diego H. at Del Mar.

JACK'S IN THE DECK Comes Up Aces In Futurity S. G2

Two-year-old **JACK'S IN THE DECK**, from the second crop of graded stakes winner **LOVE OF MONEY**, broke his maiden in his second start by posting a dominating 4-length score in the historic \$150,000 Futurity S.-G2 at six furlongs on Sunday, July 3 at Belmont Park.

The Skeedattle Stable-owned runner has "been getting better as he's trained, and we all felt like going longer would be better for him," said winning conditioner Robin Graham. Out of the Partner's Hero mare Thracian, and closely related to multiple stakes winner Spirited Game, Jack's in the Deck was entered in the Futurity off a second-place finish in his debut at Delaware Park on May 25.

Jack's in the Deck is the second stakes horse for Love of Money from 17 starters. A quality miler, Love of Money was able to extend his speed in his stakes debut by blasting to the front of the 1 1/8 mi. Pennsylvania Derby-G2 and drawing off to win by nearly 9 lengths. The son of Not For Love won four times in 10 starts, from 6 fur. to 1 1/8 mi., by an average margin of nearly 7 lengths, earning \$602,705.
