Delegator (GB) (Dansili {GB}) would have a G1 2000 Guineas under his belt had he not run into Sea the Stars (Ire) (Cape Cross {Ire}) two years ago, but the wheel of fortune could turn for him today as he lines up as favorite for the six-furlong G1 Darley July Cup.

Campaigned exclusively over a mile or seven furlongs until his latest successful outing in the May 11 G2 Duke of York S. over this trip, his transformation into a sprinter has been a long time coming,

according to Godolphin Racing Manager Simon Crisford. "Sprinting has been in the back of our mind for a long time, but we just haven't had the opportunity to do it," Crisford said yesterday. "I think six furlongs is the trip for him. We're hoping he can make up for a bit of lost time, as he missed most of last season with a very small problem with his pastern. That held him up and he missed some key events, and that's why we couldn't campaign him in the sprint races last year. The ground was against him for some of the other sprinting races, so we had to stick to a mile. His preparation has been very good, and he's in excellent shape. He needs to prove to everyone that he's better than his current rating, and we believe he can. I know there is rain about, but I don't think it's a significant amount and, hopefully, not enough to jeopardize our chances."

PADDY O'PRADO TO SPENDTHRIFT

Paddy O'Prado (El Prado {Ire}--Fun House, by Prized), who was retired after suffering an injury while winning the GII Dixie S. in May, will begin his stud career in 2012 at at B. Wayne Hughes' Spendthrift Farm in Lexington, Kentucky. "We are thrilled with the addition of Paddy O'Prado to the Spendthrift Farm stallion roster and to our very popular Share The Upside program," said Ned Toffey, Spendthrift Farm general manager. "He is a grand-looking animal with a world of talent on the racetrack. That, coupled with the success of sons of El Prado at stud such as Medaglia d'Oro and Kitten's Joy, will make Paddy O'Prado a very attractive stallion prospect." Bred in Kentucky by Winchell Thoroughbreds LLC, Paddy O'Prado was purchased by Jerry Crawford's Donegal Racing for \$105,000 and turned over to trainer Dale Romans. The grey colt won his maiden in the grassy GIII Palm Beach S., then was runner-up in the GI Toyota Blue Grass S. on the Keeneland Polytrack ahead of a third-place effort in the GI Kentucky Derby on conventional dirt. He made four of his final five starts of his sophomore season back on the turf, accounting for the GII Colonial Turf Cup, the GII Virginia Derby and the GI Secretariat S. ([video](#)), following in the footsteps of former Dale Romans trainee Kitten's Joy. Shannon Potter of Taylor Made Sales helped broker the deal. The 4-year-old heads to stud with a record of 14-5-3-3 and earnings of \$1,721,297. A stud fee will be determined and announced at a later date.

His trainer believes he can still shake up the main contenders. "Delegator is favourite for Saturday, and we were only half a length behind him at York," Nicholls told *PA Sport*. "If my lad can run up to his best, I would definitely give him a shout. He's had a couple of below-par efforts this year, which is unlike him, but we know he's a good horse. Maybe he's just a better horse with a bigger field, as his best two wins have come when there were loads of runners. He seems very well in himself and, hopefully, we'll see the Regal Parade of old." Richard Hannon has two strong contenders in **Monsieur Chevalier**, who was second in the G1 Golden Jubilee S. at Royal Ascot last time June 18, and **Libranno**, who took the G3 Criterion S. over seven furlongs in his latest here June 25. The latter also captured the G2 July S. over this track and trip 12 months ago and that proven track form will help him here. "It might have been a blessing in disguise--him missing his second season through injury--as it is always tough for 3-year-old sprinters, but he has bounced right back to his best this year and ran a stormer to be beaten only half a length in the Golden Jubilee at Royal Ascot," Hannon said of Monsieur Chyevalier. "A reproduction of that form would put him bang there, though he likes to come through horses, so he will need the breaks. Libranno made all when winning the Criterion S. and, if anything, is even better over six and, though it is never easy beating your elders at this time of the year, he has done it once." Both Libranno and Monsieur Chevalier had previously trailed Khalid Abdullah's **Bated Breath** when third and fourth, respectively, in the Listed Leisure S. over this trip at Windsor May 23. Bated Breath was fifth in the Golden Jubilee last time, and may find this drier ground more in his favor. "Bated Breath is in good order, and I think he will be a better horse on quicker ground," trainer Roger Charlton, who also saddles the June 25 G3 Chipchase S. winner **Genki**, told *PA Sport*. "Looking at the forecast, I think the ground will probably be OK, but you never know. I'm very happy with the horse. It's a competitive race, obviously, and I would say there is probably only a length between seven or eight of the runners. Genki is in great form and looks wonderful at the moment. He's taking his racing really well and he's improving all the time. I was impressed with his last race at Newcastle, and I think he's in with a shout." Aidan O'Brien has been responsible for two of this race's great winners in Stravinsky and Mozart (Ire), and while **Oracle** has plenty to find to figure here, he has a similar profile to the latter having finished third in the G1 Irish 2000 Guineas at The Curragh May 21 and fourth in the G3 Jersey S. at Royal Ascot June 15. Despite having the lowest rating of all these, **Winker Watson** was a high-class juvenile in 2007 when winning the G2 Norfolk S. and G2 July S. here.

Beset with training troubles after that and now back in training with Mick Channon after a spell at stud, the 6-year-old was sixth in the Chipchase last time, and his trainer is keeping faith. "I was thrilled with Winker Watson at Newcastle. He ran a cracker and the jockey, [Hugh] Bowman, said he only took a blow in the last half-furlong; otherwise he would have been thereabouts. He seems to have come out of that race nicely. Peter Chapple-Hyam had him before and they all seemed to love him there. He's such a smashing horse to deal with; great temperament and just a great horse to have around."

The Castleton Lyons Farm colorbearer, a good second to the brilliant Goldikova (Ire) (Anabaa) in last year's GI Breeders' Cup Mile at Churchill Downs Nov. 6, finished a close fifth in the G1 Dubai World Cup over the all-weather Mar. 26, and enters off a third-place finish behind **Mission Approved** as the 7-5 favorite in the GI Manhattan H. June 11. "A record-breaking third win in the Man o' War would be a great achievement at a track where Gio Ponti has enjoyed some remarkable days in his illustrious career to date," Castleton Lyons President Shane Ryan commented. "However, as always, these Grade I's are never easily

won. We respect the opposition and hope that Gio Ponti runs his best race. With three Eclipse Awards and Grade I victories at Santa Anita, Keeneland, Arlington and Belmont we are delighted with his career over the last few years and hope that he can add to these achievements Saturday." According to a report in *Daily Racing Form*, Gio Ponti will be scratched if the course comes up soft or yielding. **Cape Blanco** invades from overseas. Last term's G1 Irish Derby and G1 Irish Champion S. hero has failed to hit the board in three tries this season, including a fourth in the Dubai World Cup and a well-beaten sixth in the G1 Queen Anne S. at Royal Ascot last time June 14.

Her lone blemish in that streak came when second in the valuable Jostle S. at Philly Park last June and, following a pacesetting third to Blind Luck (Pollard's Vision) and Havre de Grace (Saint Liam) in the GII Delaware Oaks going a route of ground, closed the season with an impressive win in the Charles Town Oaks at seven panels. Her return to action in a Parx allowance June 11 was no less scintillating, as she

was forced to await room before exploding away in racehorse time. Today's trip may be just short of her best, but she is in with an upset chance. **Sassy Image** brings career-best form into this test, including back-to-back wins in the GI Humana Distaff S. May 7 and the GIII Winning Colors S. May 30. Of her six career wins, five have come at Churchill, so she must prove that she can take her show on the road. **Champagne d'Oro** posted a big win in the GI Test S. last summer at Saratoga, but is winless in four tries since. She makes her first appearance in six months, having finished fourth of five in the 1 1/16-mile GII El Encino S. Jan. 16.

Impressive in winning the Jimmy V. S. on Breeders' Cup Saturday last November, the bay was the 3-1 favorite to Twirling Candy (Candy Ride {Arg}) and crew in the GI Malibu S., but could do no better than fourth. He made his 4-year-old debut on the Derby undercard, finishing an even fifth in the GII Churchill Downs S., but put it all together in his latest, a one-length score in the GIII Aristides S. June 4.

Manoel Cruz takes the ride for the first time this afternoon. **Apriority**, a nose second in the Churchill Downs, brings a perfect local record and five consecutive triple-digit Beyers into this. He defeated Aikenite (Yes It's True) with a 113 Beyer in a third-level Gulfstream allowance and was subsequently runner-up in the GI Carter H. prior to his last-out effort in Louisville. **Giant Ryan** defeated **Royal Tricon** in the June 11 Ponche H., the local prep for the Smile, and has enough speed to keep California shipper **Irrefutable** honest on the front end.

Dede McGehee's **St. John's River**, a heart-breaking second in the GI Kentucky Oaks May 6, makes her much anticipated return. The GII Fair Grounds Oaks runner-up worked four furlongs in :48 1/5 at Delaware Park July 2. "The track is a little bit looser and cuppier than I like, but I think she will adjust to it fine," trainer Andrew Leggio told *Daily Racing Form*. "We really like this filly, and she is training real well, so I think she we will run a big race." Jose Lezcano replaces the injured Rosie Napravnik in the saddle, according to *DRF*. **All for Thee** puts a three race winning streak on the line, most recently annexing Delaware's Go For Wand S. June 4. **Soundwave**, perfect in two prior attempts over this strip, stretches out in distance off a pair of in-the-money finishes in six-furlong Belmont overnight stakes May 18 and June 16.

Stalking the steady pace set by Masaya (GB) (Dansili {GB}) for the most part, the eventual winner challenged hard on the steel passing the two pole and quickened smartly to seize control at the bottom of the climb. Jockey Tom Queally left nothing to chance by applying a degree of force in the closing stages and, despite a late drift to the left, Timepiece was comfortably on top at the line to initiate another hoisting of Sir Henry Cecil's Warren Place standard. "They only hacked along, it rode like a piece of work, and the beauty of it was that I was able to keep her on the bridle for so long," explained Queally. "She skipped along up the hill and did it very well. The slow pace could have caught us out, but it didn't and she took care of them. I'm pleased for her, and I'm pleased for everyone in the yard." Regarding future plans, Khalid Abdullah's racing manager Teddy Grimthorpe told *PA Sport*, "There are lots of options now such as the [G1] Matron S. [at Leopardstown Sept. 3] and the [G1] Sun Chariot [S. at Newmarket Sept. 24]. Further on there are races like the [GI] Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf."

The next step could be the [Aug. 18 G2] Lowther [S.] at York, but all the big races could be her target because of the way she won."

Winning owner Reg Bond is the owner and managing director of Bond International, a company whose business affiliations include Infinity Tyres, a fast-growing tire manufacturer in Europe. Bond got into the racing game roughly 12 years ago. He began with trainer Bryan Smart, who purchased Ladies Are Forever's dam, Forever Bond, as a yearling for £15,500 at 2001 DONSEP. Forever Bond never made the races, but has now produced six foals for Bond Thoroughbred Corporation. Four of the six are by Monsieur Bond, a £36,000 DONSEP yearling purchase by McKeever St. Lawrence whom Smart trained for Bond. Monsieur Bond won six of 23 starts, including the G2 Duke of York S. and the G3 Gladness S. as a 4-year-old in 2004. Monsieur Bond stood the 2011 season at Norton Grove Stud in Great Britain at a fee of £3,000. Smart and Bond parted ways in 2007, when Bond decided to hire former flat jockey Geoff Oldroyd as his private trainer.

STRONG RESPONSE TO BC OPEN


ENROLLMENT *(Edited press release)* The Breeders' Cup announced Friday that a total of 107 horses were nominated to the program through the recently conducted Open Enrollment period. Among the top nominated horses are Grade/Group 1 winners Canford Cliffs (Ire) (Tagula {Ire}), Cape Blanco (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}), Dubawi Heights (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}), Gitano Hernando (GB) (Hernando {Fr}), Miss Match (Arg) (Indygo Shiner), Overdose (GB) (Starborough {GB}), So You Think (NZ) (High Chaparral {Ire}), Stacelita (Fr) (Monsun Ger) and Treasure Beach (GB) (Galileo {Ire}). Last year, the Breeders' Cup Board passed sweeping changes to its worldwide nomination program to increase the number of eligible runners for the 2011 Breeders' Cup World Championships. Among those changes was the offer of a special one-time, fee-based program this year for previously non-nominated horses. Of the 107 total open enrollment nominees, 24 are ages 3-years-old or older, 63 are 2-year-olds and 20 are yearlings. The complete list of open enrollment nominees will be posted July 15 at www.members.breederscup.com. With the expiration of this one-time open enrollment, the late nomination fees will revert to standard rates for horses that were not previously nominated (e.g., \$100,000/\$200,000 Horses of Racing Age fee). "We are tremendously pleased with the global response to this one-time open enrollment program from owners and breeders from around the world. They were able to take advantage of this special program to nominate their racehorses at prices that were extremely favorable," said Dora Delgado, Breeders' Cup senior vice president, racing and nominations. "It is also very encouraging to see the high volume of 2-year-old stock coming into the program from horsemen who can now take advantage of our expanded Championship Juvenile program, as five races will be offered at the 2011 event at Churchill Downs." In addition to the nomination of yearlings and horses of racing age, a total of 390 international stallions from 17 countries outside of North America have thus far been nominated to the Breeders' Cup through the International Nominations program, which makes all of their offspring automatically eligible. Those stallion owners in the Northern Hemisphere paid an annual nomination fee of 50% of the advertised stallion's stud fee, while stallion owners in the Southern Hemisphere paid 25% of the advertised stud fee to nominate their stallions.

"Buyers from all over the world made their usual huge contribution, and equally

encouraging has been the domestic demand, both Flat and National Hunt. The increase in turnover, despite a significantly smaller catalogue, is a very pleasing result, and a clearance rate nudging 90% is a remarkable statistic demonstrating the intensity of the demand at all levels of the market which is the feature of so many sales at Tattersalls."

Qatari owner Mohammed Alattiyah bid 83,000gns for yesterday's session topper, the 3-year-old **Casual Glimpse (GB)** (Compton Place {GB}--Glimpse {GB}, by Night Shift) ([Lot 721](#)). The colt, trained by Richard Hannon for owner Sir Robert Ogden, had finished second in a conditions event at Newmarket on Thursday afternoon. "The aim with him is the Qatar Derby at Doha at the end of December," said Alattiyah, whose purchase is set to be trained by Jassim Al Ghazali. "We liked his performances and saw him finish yesterday."

The 2-year-old **Snowflake Dancer (Ire)** (Dylan Thomas {Ire}--Snowy Day In LA {Ire}, by Sadler's Wells) ([Lot 714](#)), who racked up two listed places after giving Dylan Thomas a first winner with his first starter, changed hands for 70,000gns when consigned from trainer Jim Bolger's stables. Newmarket trainer Willie Musson got the better of agent Paolo Benedetti for the colt. "In the short term, he is coming to me, but he is likely to race abroad in the future," said Musson. "Not many people improve one from Mr. Bolger, but we thought that he might do better as he steps up in trip with his pedigree."

The smartly bred **Man Of Iron** (Giant's Causeway--Better Than Honor, by Deputy Minister) ([Lot 670](#)), winner of the 2009 Breeders' Cup Marathon at Santa Anita, changed hands as a stallion prospect for 55,000gns. The sibling to G1 Belmont Stakes heroes Rags to Riches (A.P. Indy) and Jazil (Seeking the Gold) was purchased by National Stud supremo Brian O'Rourke. "His pedigree is exceptional, and he's a very good-looking individual," said O'Rourke. "I cannot say where he is going, but I have bought him for a client as a stallion prospect to go overseas."

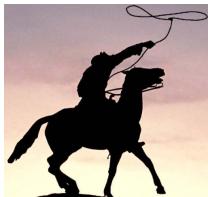

"She has been bought for Sheikh Mohammed bin Khalifa Al Maktoum," said Stakemire. "[She] will be covered in Europe to Southern Hemisphere time, and then will foal in Australia."

The three-day July Sale was led by the sale of the 4-year-old colt Top Spin (Ire) (Cape Cross {Ire}), who sold to Frank Berry Wednesday for 175,000gns.

"Top Spin (Ire) was typical of the competition between buyers, with National Hunt connections fighting off determined overseas interest," said Mahony, who added, "The 2011 July Sale may have lacked obvious stars, but it has graphically illustrated why Tattersalls is the European market leader. The vendors have confidence that they will always find a market of depth and diversity at Tattersalls, and the buyers, both domestic and overseas, know that they will find quality and value for money. There remain plenty of challenges for all of us in the racing and breeding industries, not least in Britain, but the past three days show that our bloodstock continues to be held in the highest regard, and we can begin to look forward to the October Yearling Sales with a degree of cautious optimism." Frankel Set to Go it Alone...

Sir Henry Cecil yesterday stated that **Frankel (GB)** (Galileo {Ire}) would be without any pace help in the July 27 G1 Sussex S. at Goodwood. Khalid Abdullah's G1 2000 Guineas and G1 St James's Palace S. winner has been joined by Rerouted (Stormy Atlantic) on his last two starts, but he will not be required next time. "I don't think I'll use a pacemaker, because he's settling very well at the moment," Cecil told *PA Sport*. "He's in very good form at the moment."

Reliable Man Target Hinges on Weather...

The Pride Racing Club's **Reliable Man (GB)** (Dalakhani {Ire}) could run in Thursday's G1 Juddmonte Grand Prix de Paris, trainer Alain de Royer-Dupre announced yesterday. Also under consideration for the G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth S. at Ascot July 23, the G1 Prix du Jockey Club hero will head to Longchamp on Bastille Day if the ground is not too quick. "He's working well and a decision will be made on Monday, but if the ground is too fast here, he won't run in France," Royer-Dupre told the *Racing Post* yesterday. "Both options remain open, and it will depend on the state of the ground." A total of 13 stood their ground for the 12-furlong feature yesterday, with Aidan O'Brien leaving in a quintet including the G1 Irish Derby one-two **Treasure Beach (GB)** (Galileo {Ire}) and **Seville (Ger)** (Galileo {Ire}). Others of note are His Highness The Aga Khan's Prix du Jockey Club third **Baraan (Fr)** (Dalakhani {Ire}) and the runner-up in that **Classic, Bubble Chic (Fr)** (Chichicastenango {Fr}), while John Gosden is set to supplement Lady Rothschild's June 17 G2 King Edward VII S. winner **Nathaniel (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) if the forecast is for a wet lead-up.

Winter Memories Gearing Up for Lake George...

Darby Dan's Phillips Racing Partnership's **Winter Memories** (El Prado {Ire}), two-for-two this term with wins in Keeneland's GIII Appalachian S. Apr. 21 and Belmont's GII Sands Point S. May 30, remains on target for Saratoga's GII Lake George S. July 21. The gray daughter of MGISW Memories of Silver (Silver Hawk) is scheduled to breeze Sunday. Winter Memories fired a five-furlong bullet in :59 3/5 over the Belmont grass June 26. "She's matured even since her last race," said trainer Jimmy Toner, who also trained the brilliant Memories of Silver. "I see her getting bigger and stronger and continuing to develop." Toner added that Winter Memories would also target the GII Lake Placid S. at the Spa Aug. 21, the GI Garden City at Belmont Park Sept. 18, and Keeneland's GI Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup in the fall. Winter Memories, second to Bobby Flay's **More Than Real** (More Than Ready) in last November's GII Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf, may face off against that rival again in the Lake George. A lackluster 11th in Royal Ascot's G1 Coronation S. June 17, More Than Real returned to the worktab with a four-furlong move in :51 over the Belmont main track July 7. "With the way [Winter Memories] has been running, it could be a nice rivalry," Todd Pletcher's assistant trainer Jonathan Thomas said.

Q AND A WITH THE BREEDERS' CUP BOARD OF DIRECTORS CANDIDATES



The last two years, the *TDN* has given candidates for the Breeders' Cup board the opportunity to let us know what they would like to accomplish, should they be elected. On July 7, Breeders' Cup announced the six individuals who are in the running for the three open seats on the Breeders' Cup Board of

Directors. Voting began Wednesday, and will continue through next Wednesday, when Breeders' Cup hosts its annual members' meeting in Lexington. The top three vote getters each will serve a 4-year term. We posed the following question to each of the candidates:

Q: What do you think is the biggest issue facing the Breeders' Cup today and, if voted to the Breeders' Cup board, how would you propose this issue be solved?

Barry Weisbord:

The biggest issue facing us is: how do we give our competition more impact, both from the point of view of our weekend event, and through the expansion of our competition in a more meaningful way throughout the year. Last year, I was named co-chairman of the newly created Enhanced Experience Committee, which was formed to directly address what I think is one of the biggest issues: making the weekend more impactful for fans, bettors and race participants.



I am proud that our committee, in a short period of time, has been able to

accomplish a number of improvements for this year's competition, including:

- *A vastly improved dining experience for premium ticket holders.
- *Free programs for all attendees.
- *A backstretch luxury breakfast hospitality area for the participants, with the best view of the on-going training on the track.
- *The introduction of a new Thursday night kickoff event, celebrating the international cuisine of the participating countries.
- *A "Sweet Taste of Success" post-race area, where the Breeders' Cup Ltd. will entertain the winning owners and their guests in a celebratory setting.

Additionally, we have worked hard to deliver our on-track and simulcast fans a better media experience, and will introduce this year:

- *An in-house feed that will deliver more of the sights, sounds and excitement of the day to on-track fans
- *A simulcast feed that will include the latest Trakus elements for our remote bettors and fans.

Weisbord cont.

For years, the industry has clamored for more structure for the sport. I am sure the McKinsey report will echo those cries, and cite a widely held belief that structure and television are critical elements of racing's future. I believe the Breeders' Cup should be at the forefront of initiatives designed to carry out those goals.

I would be grateful for the chance to apply my 30-year experience of creating and producing racing events, as well as my experience in media, communications and PR, to supporting the Breeders' Cup in those objectives by serving on the Board of Directors.

Bill Oppenheim:

The way this question is worded, it implies there is a single 'big issue' for which we should propose a solution. I don't necessarily agree that is the case. To me, the biggest issue facing the Breeders' Cup is how to successfully implement the findings of the 2009 Strategic Planning process, the results of which have been adopted by our Board of Directors. One key finding was that the Breeders' Cup is a recognized and respected 'brand,' both domestically and internationally. The biggest task the organization faces, in my view, is how to grow that brand, to the benefit of the industry at large. Domestically, making the experience at the Championship weekend a world-class event is a big priority, but so is expanding the Breeders' Cup 'narrative' from the end of the Triple Crown races through Championship weekend, so that the Breeders' Cup brand is in people's minds from this stage of the season on. The new Win-and-You're-In format is a plank in that platform. Internationally, the Breeders' Cup is much more recognized and respected than people appreciate, as is testified to by the 390 stallions outside North America that have been signed up to the new International Stallion Nomination Program. We know from the Strategic Planning process that there is significant growth potential in attracting international runners, and in continuing to expand international viewing and betting. So the Breeders' Cup needs to pursue these goals, both domestically and internationally; that is my 'solution.' If you want a specific problem we have to deal with, race-day medication is a huge issue to European and other non-North American participants and nominators, so I'm sure that will be coming before us for a vote sooner or later (the question is with a Committee at this stage). I would personally vote for a ban, only because until we join the rest of the international community on this issue, it makes it much more difficult to talk about World Championships when they all say, oh yeah, like the 'World Series' of baseball. **Cont. p16**



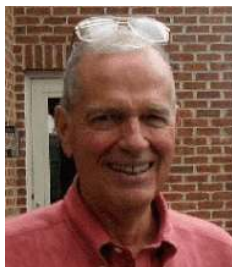

But that's my personal opinion, and the strength of the Breeders' Cup has to be that we argue it out, decide on the policy and, as far as possible, speak with one voice to the rest of the industry. We must aspire to that, otherwise we're just another set of initials sending a lot of conflicting signals and making a lot of noise, but no progress.

Robert Manfuso:

Distraction from our core mission is the biggest problem facing Breeders' Cup today. We must stay focused on our mission statement and continue to execute our strategic plan that has led to significant progress over the last few years.

In 1989, Lizza and Joseph Bartone purchased Highcliff Farm in New York, a nursery which stands Congaree, Cosmonaut and Key Contender. "He will be missed," said Suzie O'Cain, who with her husband, C. Lynwood O'Cain, managed Highcliff Farm for Lizza. "He was a delightful man to work for, and with. He had made all his plans for Saratoga and was looking forward to the meet." He is survived by his wife, Vianne. Funeral arrangements are pending.
