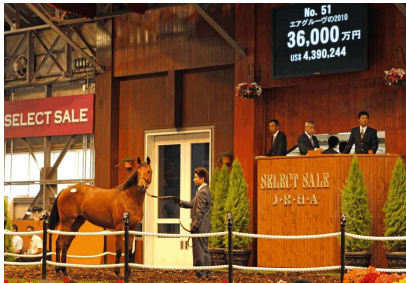

## ROYALLY BRED FILLY TOPS JRHA OPENER

In the few minutes it took for a statuesque filly to take several graceful pirouettes around the Northern Horse Park sale ring Monday, the Japanese bloodstock industry burst back into life. The daughter of Horses of the

Year Deep Impact (Jpn) (Sunday Silence) and Air Groove (Jpn) (Tony Bin {Ire}) had been groomed for this moment virtually since she had been born at Katsumi Yoshida's Northern Farm. She did not disappoint, bringing a Japanese yearling record bid of ¥360 million (\$4,390,243) from prominent agent Nobutaka Tada's Globe Equine Management Co. Ltd. at the opening session of the Japan Racing Horse Association's select sale of yearlings and foals

Perhaps the best news for the JRHA is that the filly was not alone in the spotlight. A half-brother to 2007 Horse of the Year Admire Moon (Jpn) (End Sweep) by current leading sire King Kamehameha (Jpn) (Kingmambo) also smashed the previous record yearling price of ¥250 million set in 2007 when he went to Takaya Shimakawa for ¥260 million (US\$3,170,731).

With the two top-priced yearlings adding turbo power, the overall sale results zoomed upward to a Japanese yearling session record gross of ¥4,726,000,000, a remarkable increase of 49.6% from 2010's languid session total of ¥3,157,100,000. The clearance rate improved from 80.8% in 2010 to 84.5%, with 197 yearlings sold from 233 offered.

The average price of ¥23,990,000 leaped up by 31.5% from last year's average of ¥18,249,133, all the more significant since the overall JRHA sale results had declined for four consecutive years. The vibrant trade was expected to make national news as a sign that Japanese confidence is returning after the earthquake and tsunami disaster in March.

"I was expecting the sale figures to be down, so it was a very happy mistake," said Yoshida, who bred and consigned the two toppers. "This market is very healthy and that is good for the horse industry." **Cont. p2**

## FIRST UP: FASIG-TIPTON JULY

The American Thoroughbred industry will get a gauge on the yearling market as Fasig-Tipton hosts the first major auction of the season, the July Sale of Selected Yearlings, this afternoon in Lexington, Kentucky. The July Sale has undergone a number of major changes in recent years, and now looks significantly different than previous renewals. As recently as two years ago, the first book of the sale was comprised of yearlings only by sophomore and freshman sires. After lackluster results for those yearlings by sophomore sires in 2009, Fasig-Tipton refocused the young-sire showcase on just freshmen last year, and while results were mixed, opted to do away with the showcase altogether this term and instead have a completely integrated catalogue.



"Primarily, we listened to what our customers have had to say," explained Fasig-Tipton Vice President of Sales Bayne Welker. "With the way the market was going, some buyers were shying away from the first-year sires. They were still buying them, but the strength wasn't there. And this year, there were fewer first-year sires across the board. So we felt, in order to keep the momentum through the sale, that it would be better to have the proven mixed in with the new. That way there isn't a stop/start effect, and hopefully it will give the sale a feeling of continuity." **Cont. p8**

As Japanese sales continue to shift toward yearling and 2-year-olds and away from the traditional concentration on foals, the quality of the yearlings on offer, both in pedigree and conformation, “was much better than before,” Yoshida observed.

Sticking with his decision to sell the filly out of Air Groove, the 1996 Yushun Himba (Japanese Oaks) winner who missed catching European champion male Pilsudski (Ire) (Polish Precedent) by a neck in the 1997 Japan Cup, proved difficult.

“I didn’t want to sell her; I wanted to keep her,” confided Yoshida.

Even though he well knew the quality of the filly, who is a three-quarter sister to 2004 champion older mare Admire Groove (Jpn) (Sunday Silence) and a half-sister to a pair of Group 2 winners, the price she demanded in a market that strongly prefers colts was a surprise.

“I never expected so much in this economy,” said Yoshida’s son

Shunsuke, general manager of the huge Northern Farm operation. He added, “When she was born, we decided we wanted her to be a star at the sale. Physically, she is very nice. She is the 10th foal out of Air Groove, but she is bigger than the others. Her brothers and sisters had strong temperaments, but she is very relaxed and has a good mind.”

“I liked everything about her: her eyes, elegance, beauty, movement--she had everything,” declared Tada, who also praised the filly’s composure. “She can pose; she can see the cameras and she knows how to behave. She’s like a supermodel.”

Tada said he acquired the filly for two clients that he could not name. However, word spread that she was to be owned by Tada’s longtime client, Hidetoshi Yamamoto, the owner of recently retired American Grade II winner Casino Drive (Mineshaft), and Japanese show business executive Yasushi Kubota, who helped create Japan’s popular AKB48 ‘idol group’ of young female singers and dancers.

Kubota also was reported to be the buyer of four other yearlings, including a Deep Impact colt for ¥66 million, for a total of ¥134 million (more than \$1.6 million). One of his agents said Kubota planned to return for today’s foal session.

**Stars Come Out at JRHA Sale...**

The fact that the JRHA sale lured Japanese entertainment celebrities--including movie and television star Hideaki Ito, who sat among the crowd in the sales pavilion--was another positive sign for the Thoroughbred business.

The ongoing commitment from industry stalwarts such as Takaya Shimakawa--a previous leading buyer who lost substantial facilities for his natural foods operation in Sendai in the tsunami--were additional barometers of optimism. After being outbid by Tada on the Deep Impact filly, Shimakawa was resolute in turning back that rival for the King Kamehameha colt.

“I missed the first one, so I really wanted to buy [the colt], but the price was a bit more than I expected,” said the good-natured Shimakawa, who entertained a

crowd of Japanese media while chuckling about his bloodstock investments. In 2009, he bought the top three colts in the JRHA foal session, paying ¥125 million or more for each of them, including a Symboli Kris S. colt out of Admire Moon’s dam My Katies (Jpn) (Sunday Silence), who has been named Tosen Summit (Jpn), and a three-quarter brother to Deep Impact called Tosen Laurence (Jpn) (Daiwa Major {Jpn}). Neither of the colts has started yet.

“All the expensive horses I have bought in the past have not run well, so I am afraid about this one,” Shimakawa joked while discussing his latest big purchase. “And I am very worried about going home tonight and telling my wife that I spent this much money on a horse.”

But by the time the session had ended, Shimakawa had added two other colts to his account--a half-brother to multiple Group 2 winner Meiner Rainier (Jpn) (Grass Wonder) by Deep Impact, and a half-brother to the owner's Group 3 winner Tosen Captain (Jpn) (Jungle Pocket {Jpn}) by Chichicastenango (Fr) (Smadoun {Fr}). The two cost ¥54 million and ¥52 million, respectively.

Although there were not any other yearlings that crossed the magic ¥82 million (\$1 million) threshold, another Northern Farm consignee came close at ¥80

million (\$975,609). The big bay son of Neo Universe (Jpn) (Sunday Silence), sire of this year's Dubai World Cup winner Victoire Pisa (Jpn), out of G1 Cheveley Park S. winner Donna Blini (GB) (Bertolini) was sold to Eclipse Management Co. Riki Takahashi, who developed Sheikh

Mohammed's Darley Japan operation and ran it until the end of 2007, acted as agent in purchasing the colt, but said he could not disclose his client.

"I liked the dam--she was a top, top filly in Europe," Takahashi said. "When I went to Northern Farm to inspect all the yearlings, this one has been my pick "I expected him to cost a little bit more, so I think this is good value."

**Aussie Invasion A Success...**

The two Australian buying groups on hand were successful, with Paul Fudge's Waratah Thoroughbreds acquiring two

yearlings, fillies by King Kamehameha and Storming Home (GB) (Machiavellian), and Phil Sly's group buying a Fuji Kiseki (Jpn) (Sunday Silence) filly.

Fudge, who was accompanied by his Australian veterinarian consultant Treve Williams, declined to comment to international media. However, he indicated to Japanese officials that he will seek a Japan Racing Association foreign-based owner's license in order to race in Japan. He plans to keep the ¥21-million King Kamehameha filly out of April Bird (Jpn) (Sunday Silence), consigned by Shadai Farm, in her native land.

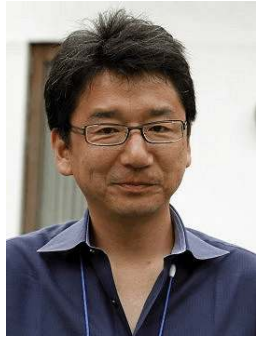
Ranked by Forbes Australia as one of the 40 wealthiest Australians, Fudge plans to send the ¥6.5-million Storming Home filly, who is a granddaughter of French Group 2 winner Whitehaven (GB) (Top Ville {Ire}), to France for racing. The filly's third dam is GI Kentucky Oaks and GI Alabama S. winner White Star Line (Northern Dancer).

Sly and his consultants, Malua Racing partnership manager Troy Corstens and Hong Kong-based bloodstock agent Justin Bahen, indicated they tried to buy more horses, but found the bidding stiffer than they had anticipated.

"We've been a bit punched up on the other ones," said Sly, who also is seeking a JRA license, "But we're happy with the filly. It's a small step and I'm looking forward to coming back next year and stirring these blokes up a little bit harder."

Sly halted the Fuji Kiseki filly, who is a half-sister to Group 3 winner Zenno Parthenon (Jpn) (Afleet) and from the immediate female family of Group 2 winner and G1 Oka Sho (Japanese 1000 Guineas) runner-up Admire Kiss (Jpn) (Sunday Silence), for ¥31 million (\$378,048).

Among the most ebullient of Japanese buyers was the Hiroo Thoroughbred Club and its chief executive officer Kohsuke Nakao, who successfully bid ¥50 million (\$609,756) for a full-brother to 2008 champion and G1 Tokyo Yushun (Japanese Derby) winner Deep Sky (Jpn) (Agnes Tachyon).

The handsome chestnut colt out of Abi (GB) (Chief's Crown) and from the family of GI Kentucky Derby winner Winning Colors (Caro {Ire}) will be one of an expected 10 yearlings to be offered to club members in partnership this December. It is a rare occasion when a well-bred, full sibling to a

Classic winner can be obtained by a racing club not associated with the Yoshida family's Shadai Group.

"We had a look at him [Sunday] and [Monday] and everybody thought his price would be much higher. But the bidding started slowly, so I decided to get involved. I made two bids and got him," Nakao said.

"He looks like his brother. He has a good walk, correct conformation. He is a of medium size and has room to improve and grow up and make it like his brother did," he added.

Also appearing on the list of buyers was the Japan Racing Association, which acquired yearlings in order to resell them as juveniles in a breeze-up sale at Nakayama Racecourse next April. Teams of JRA inspectors viewed every yearling on the grounds and the group wound up buying three: fillies by Neo Universe and Manhattan Café (Jpn) (Sunday Silence) and a colt by Aldebaran (Mr. Prospector).

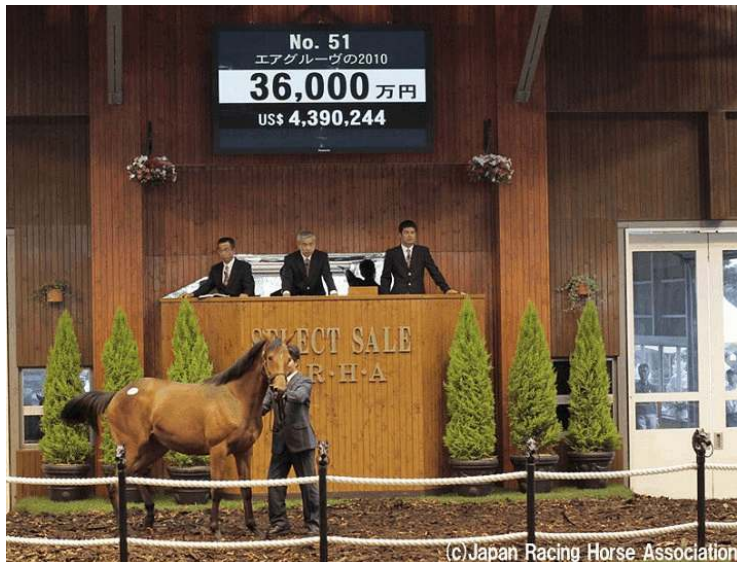

**New Career for Delta Blues...**

Some of Japan's most prominent owners have transformed elite Thoroughbred runners into horses that not only have new careers when their racing days are over, but also serve as continuing ambassadors with the public.

The most famous of these horses is Delta Blues (Jpn) (Dance in the Dark {Jpn}), who made history in 2006 as Japan's first winner of one of the world's richest and most demanding international races, the two-mile G1 Melbourne Cup in Australia.

Owner and breeder Katsumi Yoshida made the decision to geld Delta Blues, who also won Japan's classic Kikuka Sho (Japanese St. Leger) and continued racing through May 2009, because there did not seem to be enough interest in him as a stallion prospect.

A massively built horse who was known for his aggressive nature, Delta Blues now lives at the Northern Horse Park, which Yoshida built and owns, and is being trained in show jumping. Conceived to be comparable to the Kentucky Horse Park, the Northern Horse Park is home to the Japan Racing Horse Association's annual select sale of yearlings and foals as well as a public riding center and

tourism destination. The park's tranquil rolling land is dotted with birch trees and gardens and features restaurants and a souvenir shop that carries shirts, hats and even dolls with the likenesses of famous racehorses.

Park visitors can stroll through Barn 2, where Delta Blues lives alongside other former racing stars, and visit with the 10-year-old out of Kentucky-bred Grade III-placed winner Dixie Splash (Dixieland Band). Northern Horse Park staff members are happy to open his stall door and allow fans, who quickly gather for a glimpse of the handsome superstar, to pet his face and take photos. Delta Blues earned \$6,212,378 while trained by this year's Dubai World Cup-winning conditioner Katsuhiko Sumii.

Joining Delta Blues in the same barn is another Kikuka Sho winner, That's the Plenty (Jpn) (Dance in the Dark {Jpn}), who finished second in the 2003 G1 Japan Cup and third in the Tokyo Yushun (Japanese Derby). That's the Plenty was bred by Teruya Yoshida's Shadai Farm and earned more than \$3.6-million for Shadai Race Horse.

Other former racing stars in the same barn include 1986 Japanese Horse of the Year and Tokyo Yushun winner Dyna Gulliver (Jpn) (Northern Taste), whose coat still gleams at age 28 and who moved to the Horse Park upon conclusion of a stud career; Mile Championship winner Tokai Point (Jpn) (Tokai Teio {Jpn}) who was third by a neck and a nose in the 2002 G1 Hong Kong Mile; and Group 1 winner Admire Jupiter (Jpn) (French Deputy), an earner of more than \$3 million through 2008 for top owner Riichi Kondo.

**Hip 336, c, Neo Universe (Jpn)--Wind in Her Hair (Ire), by Alzao**  
*Consigned by Northern Farm*

One of the most exciting of the potential showstoppers in the catalog, this colt needs no introduction as the three-quarter brother to two-time Japanese Horse of the Year, Triple Crown winner and 2010 leading freshman sire Deep Impact (Jpn) (Sunday Silence).

"This colt is kind of a copy of Deep Impact when he was a foal," said Atsushi Nagahama, a broodmare supervisor at Northern Farm. Flashy with a white blaze and two hind socks, the colt foaled on March 7 already is a professional when being shown to potential buyers. His dam won the German G1 Anal-Pokal and was second in the Oaks at Epsom before producing Deep Impact, his full-brother and Group 2 winner Black Tide (Jpn), Grade III winner and producer Veil of Avalon (Thunder Gulch) and Glint in Her Eye (Arazi), dam of English Group 2 winner and promising freshman sire Jeremy (Danehill Dancer {Ire}).

**Hip 354, c, Malibu Moon—Jewel of the Night, by Giant's Causeway**  
*Consigned by Northern Farm*

A handsome individual that would be very appealing in the American market, this colt foaled Mar. 31 is a half-brother to multiple Grade I winner and millionaire Evening Jewel (Northern Afleet). His immediate female family features the likes of Grade I winners General Challenge (General Meeting) and Notable Career (Avenue of Flags). "He's a powerful, strong type," said Northern Farm supervisor Tomokazu Okazaki.

**Hip 388, c, King Kamehameha (Jpn)—Jadeite (Jpn), by Sunday Silence**  
*Consigned by Northern Farm*

"This is one of the best looking foals consigned by Northern Farm," said Okazaki. "His shoulder gives him a great range of motion, and he could pass as a son of Sunday Silence." The third foal produced by his 9-year-old, stakes-winning dam, the colt offers great racing and breeding potential as his female family boasts European juvenile champion and sire Alhaarth (Ire) (Unfuwain) and European Classic winners Makfi (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}), Green Dancer (Nijinsky II) and Authorized (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}).

By a young champion son of Sunday Silence who romped in the 2006 G1 Dubai Sheema Classic and is off to a strong start at stud in Japan, this colt is a half-brother to Richard Santulli's Straight Story (Giant's Causeway), winner of the GIII Fort Marcy S. at Belmont in May and a Grade I-placed earner of \$643,778 to date. His dam is a half-sister to the outstanding filly Take Charge Lady (Dehere), who won the GI Spinster S. twice and the GI Ashland S. This colt has a development edge on many in the catalog as he was foaled Jan. 28.

**FIRST UP: FASIG-TIPTON JULY**

Numbers are down substantially at Fasig-Tipton's July Sale of Selected Yearlings. In 2007 and 2008, Fasig had catalogued well over 500 horses over two days of selling in July, with 494 catalogued in 2009 and 407 last year. In 2011, the magic number is 303, or a 25.5% decline from a year ago, and for the first time in over a decade, the sale will be held over a single session. The decline in numbers can be attributed to two things: a smaller foal crop, brought about by the economic woes facing the industry, as well as a reluctance by sellers and Fasig-Tipton to put horses into the sale who didn't necessarily belong. Taylor Made Sales' Mark Taylor, for one, is more comfortable with a smaller July Sale.

"We've been selling at this sale for 30 years, and what I've always said was that for every horse who went over 500 [in the catalogue, the sale weakened]," Taylor said. "You just couldn't get the sheer number of buyers here to support that number. Plus to fit this sale, you have to be an early maturing horse. You can't be a late foal, you can't be immature. So there's only one sliver of the yearling population who fits that, and you're down to a fairly small number you're picking from. And then you have to find clients who want to sell early rather than wait for September. So when you increased the numbers past 500, you'd invariably take some horses who just didn't fit."

The Heiligbrodt's 79-strong catalogue of yearlings, juveniles and horses of racing age, as well as mares with unweaned foals at their sides, follows the previously scheduled programming. The dispersal features mares in foal to the likes of Bluegrass Cat, Macho Uno, Sharp Humor, Successful Appeal and Super Saver, and race horses by Indian Charlie, Candy Ride (Arg), Tapit and War Front. "Daylight to dark, we've be very busy," Meg Levy of Bluewater Sales, which is handling the dispersal, said during a break in the action yesterday. "Buyers have a great opportunity to purchase stock from a highly respected, and highly successful, operation like the Heiligbrodts', and there's a little something for everyone."

Shoppers at Fasig-Tipton have had three bright and sunny, if at times uncomfortably hot, days to peruse the wares, and have been out in force. "All the usual suspects are here," said Fasig-Tipton Vice President of Sales Bayne Welker. "The sale's been very well-shopped. "I think we've assembled a good group of horses, and there are some quality individuals here. There's certainly been a lot of foot traffic, and now it's just in the hands of the market. There are a lot of new sires to kick off the year, and no one knows where that buoy's going to land and what their value will be. Again, it's just up to the market. But I think we'll get to that benchmark that's going to establish things for the rest of the year. There's a lot of anxious interest, I would say, and we're cautiously optimistic going in and kicking this thing off. Anytime you're the first one out of the box, there's going to be a lot of unknown."

Last year's sale was topped by Gold Rally (Medaglia d'Oro--Beright, by Gray Slewpy), a half-brother to MGSW Principal Secret (Sea of Secrets) who went to John Ferguson for \$450,000. Bluewater Sales consigned the grey on behalf of his breeder, Mike Moreno's Southern Equine Stable. Average was down 2.5%, to \$75,780, while median was down 9%, to \$50,000. The RNA rate was 28.7%. "I think we're starting to see the marketplace inch forward, but if we can hold to where we were last year, I think we could claim that as a victory," said Welker.



## WHAT THEY'RE SAYING ...AT THE SALES

### Tom VanMeter, VanMeter Sales:

"With the numbers we have here, I think average is certainly going to be up. I think the whole market is contracting, and that's just the way it is. Hopefully, when we get some credit rolling we can get this thing back on track. But as the foal crop gets smaller, if our business is selling horses, things have got to get better. I think it's going to be all right; I really do.



"What kind of horse do you pick for F-T July? We choose American pedigrees, and we'll never bring a short-legged, small horse here. We always try to bring a leggy, mature type. That's what we shoot for. We're not too worried about pedigree, but we need a big, mature horse."

### John 'Sandy' Stuart Jr., Bluegrass T'bred Services:

"I don't really have any particular feel on how it will turn out. I don't see any particular reason why it will be stronger than last year--the economy hasn't gotten stronger. Thank goodness we leveled off and maybe rebounded a little bit last year, but we struggled a little bit; it was kind of hit or miss. I do think things have stabilized a bit, and people can figure out what these things are worth. People are more confident now. They can gauge prices versus last year, and they know how they did after last year's purchases, and I think fewer horses will fall through the cracks than last year."

*Have you seen a major contraction in numbers personally?* "Half our clients have left the breeding industry, and the other half have downsized. You need to have really well-bred, producing mares to make it these days. They definitely trimmed the fat. If you look at the numbers we're consigning to the sale, they're down about 40%. That hurts."

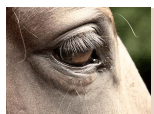

In addition to being free of the most widespread influences in modern breeding, Include has an appealing pedigree in that he is inbred 4x4x4 to Turn-to, as well as 4x5 to the influential broodmare Hidden Talent and 5x5 to the brilliant Ribot.

The career of the Irish-bred Turn-to was all too short, starting in August 1953 and ending the following March, when Turn-to bowed a tendon. However, he still had time to win six of his eight starts and to earn co-top weight on the Experimental Free H. Turn-to enjoyed many more innings as a stallion, siring such good sons as Hail To Reason, Sir Gaylord, First Landing, Best Turn, Captain's Gig and Cyane during an uneven career.

His stock had a reputation for being none too sound, but this didn't deter Robert E. Meyerhoff (breeder of Include) from arranging a mating which created 3x3 inbreeding to Turn-to, through two of his daughters. The gamble paid off in the form of Include's sire Broad Brush, a multiple Grade I winner at around a mile and a quarter. Broad Brush was immune to the unsoundness often associated with Turn-to, to the extent that he raced as many as 14 times as a 3-year-old and another nine times the following year.

**Pedigree Insights cont.**

I have mentioned before in this column that Broad Brush's trainer Dick Small once said, "I realized right then [after an early defeat] that this horse needed very stern, hard training; he needed fast works close to his races to run to his best. We worked him whenever we could because we knew we couldn't miss a single day."

Broad Brush went on to become a leading stallion, with further inbreeding to Turn-to sometimes playing a part in his success. Among Broad Brush's horses inbred 4x4x4 to Turn-to were Include and his fellow graded winners Mongoose, Quest Star, Brushed Halory, Noisette, Silver Charades, Hesanoldsalt, Merengue, Magic Broad, Tookin Down and Gail's Brush. The third line often came through one or other of Hail To Reason's sons, with mares by Stop The Music doing particularly well. Include was one of six stakes winners among the 18 foals representing this combination. He wasn't just a stakes winner. His career included a purple patch of nine wins from ten starts, including the GI Pimlico Special, and he posted 13 triple-digit Beyer figures.

The Aga Khan, a man who makes every effort to ensure that the gene pool in his studs doesn't become too limited, is one breeder who has used Include. His Highness has a 2-year-old filly by him in training with John Oxx in Ireland.

Include's stud career provides a near-perfect example of what could be called the roller coaster phenomenon. This starts with the young stallion's popularity being at a high in his first season, before dipping over the next two or three years. Then a bright start by his first runners catapults him back up the slope. He is unable to maintain that peak of popularity, though, because his smaller crops aren't able to sustain his success on the track, and so the whole sequence starts again.

Include covered his first mares in 2003. On the track, his 5-year-old campaign had been a bit of an anti-climax following an excellent 4-year-old year, but he attracted 153 mares in his first season. That total fell by 60 mares in his second season and to 61 in his third. This type of slide can sometimes be halted by encouraging results by a stallion's first sales weanlings or yearlings.

For Include, it was his first yearlings that came to the rescue. They averaged nearly \$70,000, off a fee of \$12,500, with a top price of \$500,000. Consequently, his fourth book was a healthier 117 mares, but it was the success of his first runners that saw 163 mares stampede to his door in 2007 at an increased fee of \$25,000. Since then, though, his books have fallen; his next three totals being 82, 37, and 28 in 2010. There's no doubt his 2008 foals will revive interest in Include.

Although Include didn't win at two and didn't become a graded winner until four, his progeny are often more precocious. Indeed, he was represented by 20 2-year-old winners from 48 first-crop runners in 2006. Among the 20 were Grade I winner Cash Included, Grade I-placed She's Included and stakes winner Runway Rosie.

The 2007 season saw Runway Rosie finish third at the Grade I level and another daughter, Panty Raid, become her sire's second Grade I winner, thanks to her victories in the American Oaks and Spinster S. Now Her Smile has become Include's third Grade I winner.

Panty Raid's sister St. John's River became graded winner number four, having earlier failed by only a neck to take the GI Kentucky Oaks. In addition to these, Include has five other offspring that have finished second or third at the Grade I level.

One striking aspect of Include's success is that many of his best runners are fillies, something which may not help him in today's economic climate. However, it should endear him to owner-breeders.

Another is that three of his best winners have a second line of Too Bald on their dam's side, creating three lines to Hidden Talent. The best example is Her Smile, whose dam Hepburn is by Too Bald's son Capote. A high-class racemare, Too Bald also numbers Exceller, American Standard, Baldski and Bob And John among her descendants. Include's stakes-winning son Sul Lago is out of an American Standard mare, while stakes winner Pink Pallet has a third dam by Exceller.

Inbreeding to Hidden Talent makes sense. This winner of the Kentucky Oaks and Ashland S. had a talented sister in Heavenly Body, whose descendants include Sakhee and Mastercraftsman. Hidden Talent had only four foals, but among them were the good racemares Turn To Talent (second dam of Broad Brush) and Too Bald. It cost Charles Engelhard a sale-topping \$225,000 to buy Too Bald at the '69 Cain Hoy dispersal of Harry Guggenheim's excellent breeding stock.

# The Roar Returns To The Shore

Lion Hearted's sprinting star Roaring Lion returned to one of his favorite places, beautiful Monmouth Park, to defend his title in the \$75,000 Mr. Prospector Stakes on the Fourth of July. And like fireworks, he exploded!

The now 7-year-old big bodied dark bay, making his first start of the year, held off 1-2 favorite Sean Avery to capture the Independence Day sprint by two and a quarter lengths. Grade 1 winner and \$1.4-million earner Fabulous Strike finished third. Roaring Lion ran the six furlongs in a sharp 1:08.98 to record his fifth win in his last five starts at New Jersey's shore track, dating back to July 2009.

"I was still loaded," said rider Mike Luzzi of the stretch drive. "I still had a lot of horse underneath me. When he switched leads, he accelerated a little bit."

Owned by Repole Stable, Roaring Lion made a winning debut for Todd Pletcher, who took over the training of the gelding from Bruce Levine. It was the 12th career victory in 31 starts for Roaring Lion, who ranks as Lion Hearted's leading earner with a career bankroll of \$538,536. Out of the stakes-winning mare Smartly, a daughter of Horatius, Roaring Lion was bred in Maryland by Binnie Houghton and her late husband Eddie's Buckingham Farm and is a full brother to stakes-placed Brave as a Lion.
