A TREASURE TROVE OF TALENT

France's Bastille Day highlight is the G1 Grand Prix de Paris at Longchamp and, despite a small field, the quality runs deep. The 1 1/2-mile test is this year

graced by the presence of the first and second from both the G1 Irish Derby and the G1 Prix du Jockey-Club, as The Curragh hero **Treasure Beach (GB)** (Galileo {Ire}) faces off against his hitherto unbeaten Chantilly counterpart **Reliable Man (GB)** (Dalakhani {Ire}). Aidan O'Brien's charge was

chinned on the line in the G1 Epsom Derby in June, but gained compensation in the June 26 Irish Derby.

Jockey Colm O'Donoghue continues his association with Treasure Beach here. "He's in great form, so I am really looking forward to the race and bring plenty of confidence with me," O'Donoghue told *Racing Post*. "Hopefully, he will take all the beating. Winning the Irish Derby [for the first time] was part of the job--bring on the next one." Reliable Man stepped up from two minor wins to claim Classic success in the June 5 Prix du Jockey Club on his pattern-race debut last time, and tackles his own generation here rather than take on all ages in next week's G1 King George VI & Queen Elizabeth S. at Ascot. Explaining the decision to forego an attempt at that contest, trainer Alain de Royer-Dupre said, "The important thing for us was to run against good horses in the Grand Prix de Paris and to improve the standing of our colt. I think, if we'd have been facing only French horses in the Grand Prix, I probably wouldn't have run." De Royer-Dupre, who bids for a fifth renewal, is pleased with predicted course conditions. "The weather has offered us a small present, so I'm happy the track won't be dangerous," he said. **Seville (Ger)** (Galileo {Ire}) was the meat in a Ballydoyle trifecta sandwich in the Irish Derby, rebounding off a disappointing effort when only 10th at Epsom, but rider Seamus Heffernan is hopeful of turning the tables on Treasure Beach. "I can't explain his run at Epsom, but if he improves a little bit--and he looks as if he might have the scope to--I'd be hoping to get a bit closer to Treasure Beach," he commented. "I felt he got a little bit tired with me at the Curragh. He came out of his race well, and it's great that Aidan's running [both of] them. We'll see which of the two is the best." **Cont. p2**

VOTING FOR BC BOARD OF DIRECTORS ENDS

The results of the Breeders' Cup Board of Directors election were announced Wednesday, with Bret Jones joining the 13-member Board for the first time, and Robert Manfuso and Richard Santulli getting re-elected. The Directors will each serve four-year terms. All 48 members of the Breeders' Cup 'big board' voted in the election. The complete Board of Directors is: Helen Alexander, Middlebrook Farm; Antony Beck, Gainesway Farm; Jerry Crawford, Donegal Racing/Derby Dreams Partnership; William S. Farish Jr., Lane's End Farm; Roy Jackson, Lael Stables; Bret Jones, Airdie Stud; Tom Ludt (chairman), Vinery; Robert Manfuso, Chanceland Farm; Clem Murphy, Coolmore Stud; Satish Sanan, Padua Stables; Richard Santulli, Jayeff "B" Stables; Oliver Tait, Darley; and David Willmot, Kinghaven Farms LLC. A blind draw was held after the election to determine, according to by-law changes made in April, when the terms of the members of the board of 48 will expire over the next two election cycles. Nineteen seats will be up for election in 2012, and 20 in 2014. The results of the blind draw determined that the terms expiring next year will be: Jack Brothers, Clem Murphy, Dan Pride, John Sikura, Duncan Taylor and Rob Whiteley. The terms expiring 2014 will be: John Amerman, Bill Casner, Tom Ludt, Reiley McDonald, Ogden M. Phipps, Richard Santulli and Oliver Tait.

Curragh maiden winner **Marksmanship** completes a Ballydoyle trio attempting to provide Aidan O'Brien with a second renewal. G1 Prix du Jockey Club runner-up **Bubble Chic** has finished second in his last six starts--including behind subsequent Epsom hero Pour Moi in May's G2 Prix Greffulhe--and tries this trip for the first time. "We decided to come for the Grand Prix de Paris in the hope of some consolation with it looking as though Reliable Man wouldn't run," said assistant trainer Alessandro Botti. "When they decided on this race, it was a blow. I have a lot of confidence in my horse, and he should be fine over 2400 meters." The field is completed by the Andre Fabre-trained pair **Kreem** and **Meandre**, who will seek to add to the maestro's record 10 wins in the contest. Kreem won last month's G3 Prix du Lys at Chantilly and Meandre, who has been supplemented for this at a cost of €36,000, lines up off a win in May's Listed Prix de l'Avre over course and distance. "They have exactly the same level of form," explained Fabre. "You could say their level is a little way below the best in the race, but I expect them both to run very well." With the addition of five millimeters of water before a similar level of overnight rain Tuesday, yesterday's official going was reported by clerk of the course Christian Delporte as good-to-soft. "The going for the Grand Prix should still be on the soft side of good--there should be no more rain and the forecast is for sunny periods."

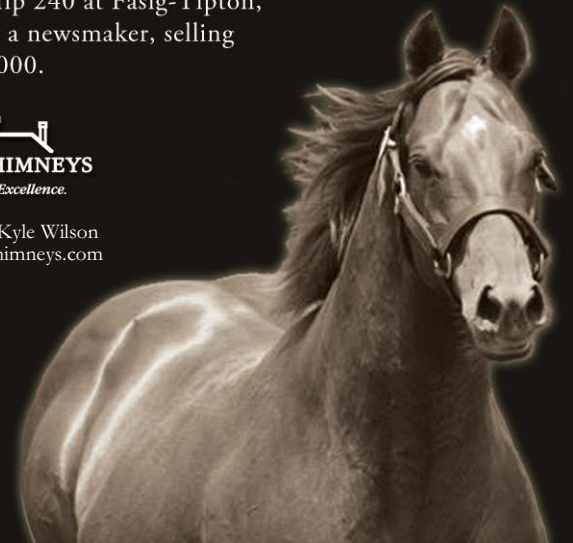

This marathon is an open affair with invaders from Britain, Germany and the Czech Republic. **Allied Powers**, winner of last term's G3 Prix d'Hedouville at this track and the G2 Grand Prix de Chantilly, leads that raiding party, but comes here off a below-par effort in last month's Listed Fred Archer S. at Newmarket. A lack of pace was cited as an excuse for that run and he is better judged on a second to St Nicholas Abbey (Ire), albeit nine lengths adrift, in May's G3 Ormonde S. at Chester and a third when defending June's G2 Grand Prix de Chantilly. "Allied Powers is very fresh, he is very well and he is bucking and squealing," said trainer Michael Bell.

I am writing today because I would like to give *TDN* readers an update on the recent charitable project 'Hats

Off for Japan' in which so many people from the Thoroughbred horse racing industry participated. We received 3,152 hats from horse farms and racing fans all over the world to sell to horse lovers and racing fans in Japan in order to raise money for the horses and farmers

affected by the sudden tsunami and subsequent nuclear disaster that struck the Fukushima province of Japan in March, 2011.

So far, 2,718 caps have been sold to racing fans and supporters in Japan (through the end of June). The total funds raised, which consisted of profit from selling hats and cash donations, was JPY 9,329,521 (US\$115,707.81). One hundred percent of the funds raised are going to be remitted to Minamisoma City Hall, Tsunami Orphan Fund, and the Retired Horse Association (RHA which is a non-profit organization to save suffering horses after the big earthquake and tsunami).

The project became a big 'Wake Up' call in Japan and encouraged the Japanese horse community to be positive and work to revive itself. It is also the first charitable action ever in Japan from people in the horse society. All the donated hats serve to remind the Japanese people that the global Thoroughbred industry is thinking of the suffering in the area and that they want to help. It was also a big surprise for the Japanese community to know that we horse lovers overseas carried out the project.

We would like to extend a special thank you to the two Japanese racing authorities, JRA and NAR, who gave the project tremendous time and support and also to Ms. Atsuko Meguro, the most famous horse-racing TV program newscaster in Japan. When Ms. Meguro heard about the "Hats Off To Japan" project, she immediately organized a volunteer team with 15 other members including reporters, racing journalists, and even a few famous Japanese actresses. They spent their personal time to handle online orders and sell hats at all the major race meets at the JRA and NAR racecourses across Japan and even autographed many of the hats for their fans.

There were 370 Soma ponies around Minamisoma in the past but now only 152 horses are alive. The project's funds are going to be used for the treatment of injured horses by volunteer veterinarians and to support breeding programs for the endangered Soma ponies.

The good news is that in spite of the huge reduction of horses, Minamisoma finally decided to go ahead and hold the 'Soma Nomaioi Festival' at the end of July, a tradition which has been held for over 11 centuries.

As for future plans, the volunteer team will hold a hat sales event at two major racecourses on July 18 and that will end "Phase 1" of the "Hats Off" project. Since the recovery of the Fukushima province--its people and its equine community--will take as many as 15 years or more, the Japanese equine community would like to hold another fund-raising project in the future to keep the morale of the people up. It is their sincere hope that the global equine community will again be able to help and support them to let the Japanese people know that they are not forgotten. They are considering a project perhaps later this year or sometime next year, but plans have not been finalized.

On behalf of the JRA and the NAR, and the people of the Japanese horse community and the Fukushima province, I would like to extend their deep gratitude to all of the people, farms and fans who donated their hats, their money and their time to the "Hats Off For Japan" project. FASIG JULY: CALL IT EVEN

The bare figures say Fasig-Tipton's season-opening July Yearling Sale was down 28% in gross, while the average dropped a little under \$6,000, or 7.8%. But the median was up 20%, from \$50,000 last year to \$60,000 this year, and that wasn't the only positive to take from the sale. The number sold dropped by 21%, but the catalogue was down by 26%, which means the clearance rate from the catalogue improved, from 60% to 63%. Even more significant is this statistic: the average dropped by \$5,890 from last year, but the average drop in stud fee (compiled by *TDN* staffer Gary King) was \$5,875--meaning 99.7% of the drop in average can be accounted for by the decline in stud fees from 2008 to 2009. Even given the decline in number catalogued, number sold, gross, etc., the decline in stud fees means the sale came out about as close to last year as it possibly could have.

Though the numbers for each stallion are quite limited in a 300-horse sale, nonetheless there may be some indications of how sires are regarded by the marketplace. Eight stallions with two or more sold registered six-figure averages ([click here](#) for the Instatistics table), headed by two each by the 2011 leading North American sire, Gainesway's Tapit (average \$250,000), and Lane's End's Lemon Drop Kid (average \$220,000; both bought by Ben Glass for Gary and Mary West). Six of the eight sires with six-figure averages are proven sires with first 5-year-olds and up this year. Five of the six had just two each sell; the exception was WinStar's (though Airdrie's when these were sired) Harlan's Holiday, with five sold, averaging \$131,000.

Other proven sires with two sold that averaged six figures were: Spendthrift's Malibu Moon (\$142,500), Darley's Medaglia d'Oro (\$125,000) and Three Chimneys' Sky Mesa (\$107,500). Also with six-figure averages were current top-three freshman sire Flashy Bull (Airdrie, three averaged \$116,666) and the top sire with first yearlings selling, 2008 Champion 3-Year-Old Big Brown (four, averaged \$130,000), another Three Chimneys resident.

Another seven stallions with two or more sold averaged between \$80,000-\$100,000. Two of these were proven sires at Three Chimneys (who I think we can therefore say had a good sale with their sires): Yes It's True had two average \$94,000, while Exchange Rate, whose first Kentucky 2-year-olds include Gill Bashford Manor S. winner Exactor, proved popular, with five yearlings averaging \$92,400.

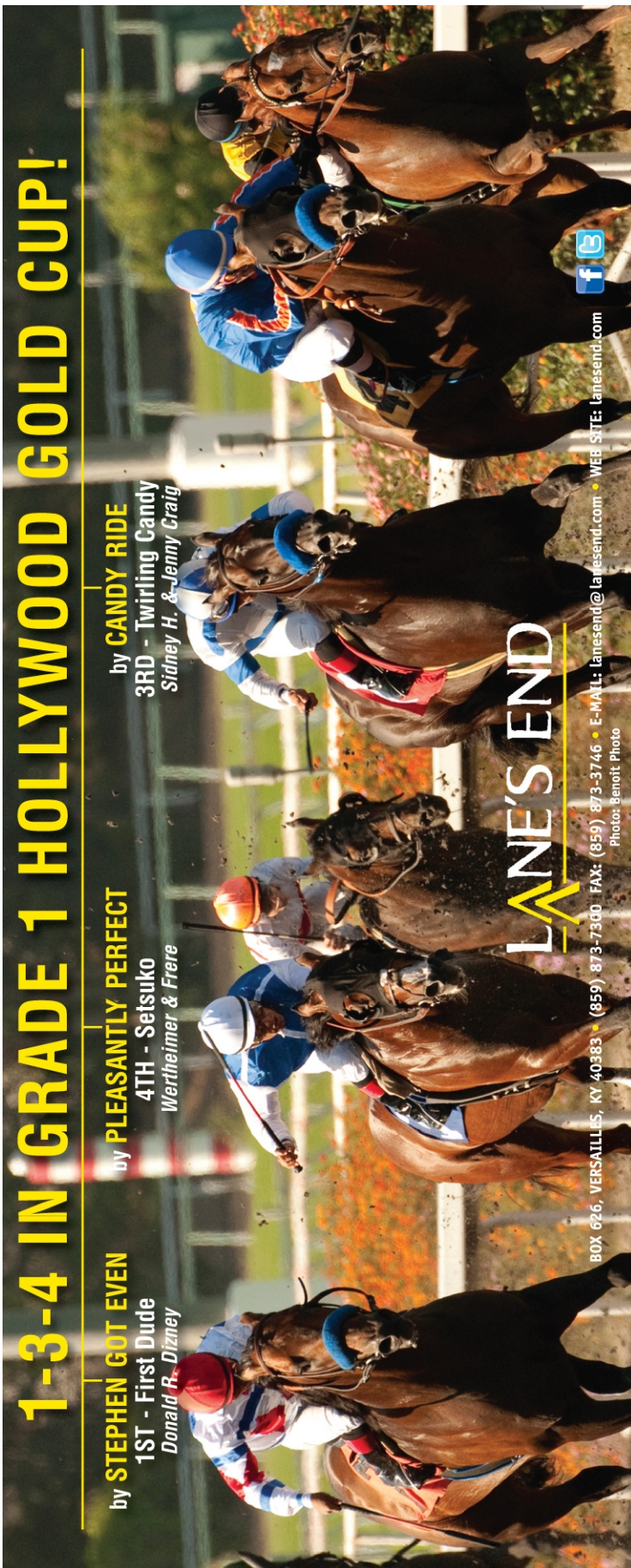

Claiborne's Flatter, with three graded stakes winners and 10 black-type horses already this year, had two average \$90,000; his full-brother, Vinery's Congrats, narrowly missed the top 15 with two or more sold, with three averaging \$79,000.

Three other freshman sires (besides Flashy Bull) averaged over \$80,000: dead-heaters Hard Spun, from Darley and another current top three North American freshman sire (the current leader on that list is the previously unknown New Mexico stallion, The Way Home, a son of Giant's Causeway) and Woods Edge's Latent Heat each had three yearlings sell at Fasig, for identical averages of \$88,333. Lawyer Ron, who stood at Stonewall in Kentucky, but died before he had runners, also hit the \$80,000 mark, averaging \$83,000, again with three sold. Ashford's Majestic Warrior finished second to Big Brown among sires with their first yearlings, five by him averaging \$86,400, though not far behind him were Spendthrift's Into Mischief (three, averaged \$78,333) and Hill 'n' Dale's Midnight Lute (eight, averaged \$77,875). He's a horse that has been strongly supported; it would be no surprise to see him finish up third among North American sires with their first yearlings 2011, behind only Big Brown and Curlin (yearling debut at Saratoga).

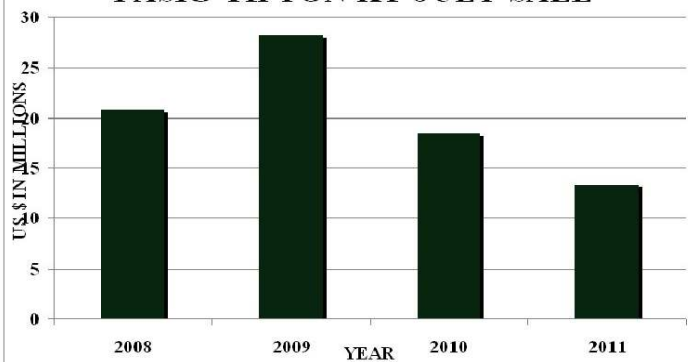

"Though all the metrics displayed here are down, what isn't shown is that the Fasig July Yearling Sale median was \$60,000, up 20 percent from \$50,000 in 2010. With the catalogue down 26 percent in numbers, the gross was always going to be down, and that was down 28 percent from last year. Interestingly, though, the average was down by eight percent, but the actual drop was \$5,890. TDN's Gary King calculated that the drop in average stud fee was \$5,875 – meaning the drop in stud fees alone accounted for 99.7 percent of the difference in average. It was a plenty strong sale for what was there." - Bill Oppenheim

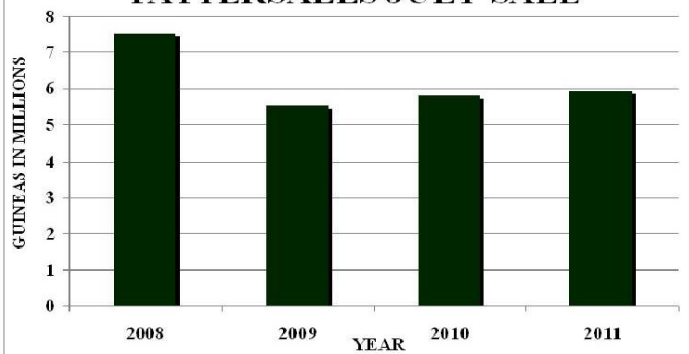

SPECIAL BOARD MEETING RMTC AUG. 4

(Edited press release) The Racing Medication and Testing Consortium, which consists of 25 racing industry stakeholders and organizations that represent Thoroughbred, Standardbred, American Quarter Horse and Arabian racing, will hold a special meeting of its Board Aug. 4 near Cincinnati, Ohio. The meeting follows the "International Summit on Race Day Medication, EIPH and the Racehorse," held in June and co-hosted by the RMTC, American Association of Equine Practitioners and the National Thoroughbred Racing Association. At the Aug. 4 meeting, the board will hear reports from committees that were formed in June to focus on the following topics:

- Penalty guidelines
- Proposals to phase out race day medication
- Enhanced stable area security and surveillance
- Guidelines for administration of race day medication

"In April, when we announced that we would be co-hosting an international medication summit with our colleagues at the AAEP and NTRA, we noted that we hoped to begin a process that had no pre-determined outcome," said RMTC Chairman Dr. Robert Lewis. "As a follow-up to the Summit, the RMTC has created several committees to develop the needed background information which will enable the full RMTC board to move expeditiously in developing specific recommendations relative to the various areas of focus identified at the Summit."

NTRA REPORT FROM CAPITOL HILL



CONGRESS TARGETS RACEHORSE DEPRECIATION

Talks on how to relieve the nation's debt crisis through various tax measures have led some members of Congress to target the standard three-year depreciation schedule for racehorses - a measure endorsed by the NTRA and secured in the 2008 Farm Bill with the support of Senator Mitch McConnell (R-KY).

Labeling the schedule the "Bluegrass Boondoggle," Democrats seized on Kentucky's presence in the Thoroughbred racing industry and the involvement of McConnell, the Senate Minority Leader and a key player in the debt negotiations.

Senator Jeff Merkley (D-OR) characterized the schedule as "royal tax treatment" for "those millionaires and billionaires owning those horses." Senator John D. Rockefeller IV (D-WV) added, "We should treat racehorses for the wealthy the same as horses for farmers, and eliminate this special deal, saving \$20 million over 3 years."

The three-year depreciation schedule took effect on January 1, 2009 and changed the way racehorses 24 months and younger are depreciated (a three-year versus seven-year schedule) to better reflect their prime earnings years on the racetrack. The depreciation schedule is slated to continue through 2013. NTRA continues to support the measure and to educate Congress on the economic realities of the horse industry.

Jamgotchian Challenges Ky Claiming Rule:

Jerry Jamgotchian filed a lawsuit Wednesday that looks to overturn the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission regulation that prevents a horse that has been claimed in the state from shipping to another track to run until that meet closes. It also challenges the ban on selling a horse privately within 30 days of making a claim. According to the suit, filed in Franklin Circuit Court, the KHRC rule is "invalid under federal law as it violates the Commerce and Equal Protection Clauses of the U. S. Constitution." Jamgotchian claimed Rochitta (Arch) at Churchill May 21, then attempted to run her outside the state on three occasions before the meet ended July 4, and was blocked each time. Jamgotchian filed a similar lawsuit against the California Horse Racing Board in March of 2009. The case was settled out of court, with the CHRB suspending that section of the California Code of regulations.

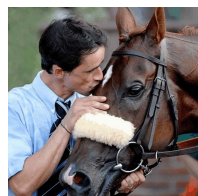

"He is getting more fit now," Yoshida said as Victoire Pisa stood patiently in a rain shower and nuzzled visitors. Champion 3-year-old colt in Japan for 2010 and winner of the G1 Satsuki Sho (Japanese 2000 Guineas) and G1 Arima Kinen, Victoire Pisa has won three consecutive races, including his most recent start in the World Cup. Among those he defeated in Dubai were multiple American champion Gio Ponti (Tale of the Cat) and recent Man O' War S. winner Cape Blanco (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}). -Michele MacDonald
