DIVISIONAL HEAVIES CLASH IN DELAWARE

Havre de Grace (Saint Liam), perfect in three starts this term and the clear leader of the distaff division, walks out of the Larry Jones barn to take on arch-rival **Blind Luck** (Pollard's Vision), who makes the fourth trans-continental trip of her career and her 10th overall journey outside of California in today's \$750,000 GII Delaware H. While Blind Luck enters today's battle with a 3-2 advantage when squaring off head-to-head

with Rick Porter's runner, the momentum is squarely in Havre de Grace's corner, as she has beaten her foe twice in their last three meetings while finishing behind Blind Luck in the GI Breeders' Cup Ladies' Classic last November. Despite having won the GI Apple Blossom H. this past April, Porter has had his eye on this track's big prize for some time. "Obviously being from Delaware and being the biggest race in Delaware, it is high--very high--on my list," he commented. "We thought a few times we had some nice horses that might win it for us, but for some reason or another they just did not work out the way we had hoped. When I first gave Larry [Jones] the horse, I told him she might be the horse that could win the big one at Delaware. As far as talent and accomplishments, I would put her right up there with [GI King's Bishop S. winner] Hard Spun (Danzig). I hope she turns out to be the best horse I have ever had, and I have been fortunate enough to have some nice ones." Blind Luck snapped a five-race skid when landing the GII La Trioenne S. May 6 and overcame a glacial pace to take the GI Vanity H. June 18. Jerry Hollendorfer shoots for his second training win in the Del 'Cap, having saddled Hystericalady (Distorted Humor) to score in 2008.

'WONDER' ODDS-ON FOR IRISH OAKS

Nine distaffers have been declared for Sunday's G1 Darley Irish Oaks and bookmakers have installed **Wonder of Wonders** (Kingmambo) as a general 5-6 favorite to reverse Epsom Classic form with 4-1 second choice **Dancing Rain (Ire)** (Daneshill Dancer {Ire}). Conditioner Aidan O'Brien halved his squad to three at yesterday's declaration stage, and Ryan Moore jets in to renew a Cheshire Oaks-winning partnership, exiting from a middling six gate. Michael and Lee Taylor's G1 Epsom Oaks victress **Dancing Rain** has been allocated box seven. O'Brien's team is completed by G3 Noblesse S. also-ran **Amazing Beauty (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) and **Gemstone (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}), who have drawn the eight and two stalls, respectively. As expected, Godolphin will be double handed and is represented by the G1 1000 Guineas heroine **Blue Bunting** (Dynaformer), the 9-2 third choice who gets the three hole, and **Rumh (Ger)** (Monsun {Ger}), who will depart from nine. Drawn five, Jackie Bolger's hardy G2 Ribblesdale S. winner **Banimpire (Ire)** (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}), a 9-1 chance, will sit alongside the G1 Irish 1000 Guineas third and bookmakers' 12-1 fifth choice **Laughing Lashes** (Mr. Greeley) in four. Forecast rain is unlikely to significantly alter the current good-to-firm going.

JABER ABDULLAH - Zain Al Boldan (GB) Abdullah is a Dubai-based businessman. He is associated with the Rabbah Bloodstock banner. Rabbah was established by Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum for a group of friends and business associates in 2006. Abdullah expanded his operation in 2008 with his first string in Ireland. He campaigned champion Youmzain (Ire) (Sinndar {Ire}), a two-time Group 1 winner who ran second in the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe in 2007, 2008 and again in 2009.

GODOLPHIN - Blue Bunting, Rumh (Ger)
 Godolphin is the Thoroughbred racing operation of Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum, who became the ruler of Dubai in 2006. He is also prime minister and vice president of the UAE. Sheikh Mohammed rode as a child, and visited his first racecourse while studying in England in 1967. Ten years later, he celebrated his first win as an owner. Godolphin, headquartered in Dubai, was established in 1992. Four years later, at the Sheikh's Nad Al Sheba Racecourse, the first running of the world's richest race, the G1 Dubai World Cup, was held. The event was moved to the state-of-the-art Meydan racecourse in 2010. Godolphin has won 174 Group/Grade I races in 12 countries.

 daughter of the legendary trainer Vincent O'Brien, Susan Magnier is married to John Magnier, who heads up the global Coolmore empire. Magnier also owns a portfolio of property interests, including the Sandy Lane Hotel in Barbados. Tabor, born in London and currently based in Monaco, founded the bookmaker Arthur Prince before selling it for £28 million in 1995. Involved in racing as an owner since the early 1990s, Tabor tasted early success when his Thunder Gulch (Gulch) captured the GI Kentucky Derby and GI Belmont S. in 1995. He has been a partner in Coolmore horses since that time. Smith, a former director of Ladbrokes and successful currency trader, is presently based in Barbados. He came into the Coolmore fold in 2004.

MRS J MAXWELL MORAN - Laughing Lashes
 Mrs J Maxwell Moran is better known in the U.S. as Betty Moran of Brushwood Stables. Moran grew up on the family farm in Pennsylvania, which she has expanded from 105 to 240 acres. An accomplished rider who was originally involved in steeplechasing, she served as chairman of the Radnor Hunt Races and was a board member of the prestigious Devon Horse Show. Creme Fraiche carried her colors to victory in the 1985 GI Belmont S., and she also owned the 2000 Grand National winner Papillon (Ire). She and her son Michael bred GISW and freshman sire Hard Spun (Danzig). Moran is also well known for her philanthropy, which earned her the Allaire duPont Humanitarian Award by the Thoroughbred Charities of America and the Pennsylvania School of Veterinary Medicine's Silver Bellwether Medal. She celebrated her 80th birthday last August.

DANCING RAIN - Martin and Lee Taylor
 The Taylors are brothers and are both employed as corporate lawyers in London. They are in the process of acquiring a handful of mares for a small broodmare band. "Martin and Lee are looking for nicely bred fillies to race and eventually breed from, so we studied the Orby catalogue pretty hard and found about a dozen we wanted to look at," agent Liam Norris explained following the filly's 20-1 upset in the G1 Epsom Oaks June 3. "Dancing Rain was one of those I inspected and she was gorgeous. Martin flew out to look at the lots and he agreed with my judgement. She was lot 4 in the catalogue and I think a lot of potential bidders were being cautious, waiting to dip into the market until they knew the strength of the Euro, so we got her for a fair price. The Taylors have really got into breeding and want to have around five commercial broodmares. Their first one at stud, the winning Sinnidar mare Alaia, was bought a few years ago and she visited Montjeu this spring."

If the Oaks were held in the commonwealth of Kentucky, **Bizzy Caroline** would have to be a slam dunk. The Runnymede homebred was unplaced in a pair of starts at two, but was third in her sophomore debut at Gulfstream Park in February and has run the table in three appearances since. A seven-length Churchill allowance victory over a next-out winner in Dos Lunas (Hennessy) was followed by an impressive 2 1/4-length success in the GIII Regret S. June 18 beneath the Twin Spires. "She had to win the Regret to justify coming out there," McPeek told *Daily Racing Form*. "She's always acted like a good filly. She had a shortened 2-year-old campaign when she got injured. We're really excited about her." **Cambina** took advantage of a strong pace to score the GII Providencia S. on the Santa Anita lawn Apr. 9, but found the mile distance of this track's May 7 GIII Senorita S. too sharp and settled for third behind **Star Billing** and **Entrustment**. The chestnut may have been best in a pacesetter renewal of the June 11 GII Honeymoon H., but a stinging late rally could earn her only a third-place effort, a head behind Star Billing.

Banned will look to follow in the footsteps of his successful young sire, who took this event in the first year it was graded back in 2004. Bred by the Ramseys, Banned has made six of his seven career starts on the grass, his lone off-the-board finish coming when a close fifth at 5-1 in the GII Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf last November. The bay has used dramatically different running styles in landing a pair of graded events in his last two appearances. He was well back off a strong pace before rallying in the GII American Turf S. on Oaks Friday, but was much more prominent and struck from just off the speed to best Benergy in the GIII Jefferson Cup last time out June 18. That versatility could serve him well this afternoon. **Crimson China** is blessed of a tremendous turn of speed which saw the Team Valor runner earn ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ honors for a February allowance win at Gulfstream. He was up against it from a pace standpoint when runner-up on Polytrack in the Rushaway S. in March and when fifth in the GI Toyota Blue Grass the next month, but came from last to take the May 28 Lamplighter S. in his most recent effort. **King Congie** was one of the leaders of this generation over the winter with a win in the Tropical Park Derby and was taken down from a score in the Hallandale Beach S. After missing by a head in third in the Blue Grass, he was an even seventh in the GI Preakness S. May 21 and heads back to what is likely his preferred surface here.

Tanda turns back to her preferred trip off a third in the grassy Redondo Beach S. at a mile here June 5. The bay stamped herself as a top filly sprinter last semester, annexing the GIII Santa Paula S. at Santa Anita in March by 4 1/4 lengths before besting MGSW Switch (Quiet American) by a half length over this track and trip in the GIII Railbird S. last May. Tanda finished off her sophomore campaign with a fast-closing third in the GI Acorn S. at Belmont last June 5, and while she is winless in three tries this year, she has yet to return to a main-track sprint. Warren Williamson's **Mildly Offensive** couldn't have been much more impressive in her first two outings. She romped by 4 1/4 lengths on debut at Santa Anita Feb. 19, and scored by the same margin while earning a 98 Beyer Speed Figure in the Santa Paula S. back in Arcadia Mar. 20. The daughter of MGSW It's Personal (Personal Flag) and 3/4-sister to MGSW It's No Joke (Distorted Humor) made a surprising switch to the lawn to contest the six-furlong June 18 Manhattan Beach S. here, dueling before finishing a narrowly beaten fourth. She's the only 3-year-old in this field, but figures to control the pace if ridden aggressively. Five-year-old Cal-bred **Ultra Blend** was promoted from second to first in the GII Milady H. May 21 when St. Trinians (GB) (Piccolo {GB}) was disqualified. **American Story, Washington Bridge, Tanda** and **Church Camp** all finished behind Ultra Blend that day. "I think she'll run big" trainer Art Sherman told *Daily Racing Form*. "She's never off the board, a hard-trying filly." He's right--from 21 career starts, Ultra Blend has been in the trifecta in impressive 19 times.

Michael Tabor's **Excited** gets the nod on the morning line. The bay took the Hilltop S. over yielding ground at Pimlico May 20 by an emphatic 3 3/4 lengths over **Pink Pallet** and is coming off a runner-up effort to GI American Oaks contender Bizzy Caroline (Afleet Alex) in the GIII Regret S. at Churchill Downs. **Dynamic Holiday** was last seen emphatically completing a four-race win streak in the GIII Hercomesthebride S. at Gulfstream in March. She was two lengths clear of **Mystical Star** in second and another 1 1/2 lengths in front of Excited in third. Trainer Graham Motion has won at a gaudy 41% (seven-for-17) clip first off the bench in graded turf stakes over the past year, according to *DRF Formulator*. Millenium Farms' **Summer Savory** is undefeated since she was switched to the sod. Cape Blanco Looking Like a Million...

Cape Blanco (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}), who took down the colors of multiple Eclipse Award winner Gio Ponti (Tale of the Cat) in the GI Man O'War S. July 9, faces a potential rematch with that rival in the GI Arlington Million Aug. 13, *Daily Racing Form* reports. Gio Ponti, the race's 2009 champion, was runner-up to Debussy (Ire) (Diesis {GB}) last summer. Owned by Michael Tabor, Sue Magnier, Derrick Smith and Mrs. Fitri Hay, Cape Blanco finished one spot ahead of Gio Ponti in fourth on their only other meeting in the G1 Dubai World Cup in March, but was fourth in the G1 Prix Ganay prior to a failed attempt at a mile in the G1 Queen Anne S. at Royal Ascot June 14. The 4-year-old's trainer Aidan O'Brien saddled Powerscourt (GB) (Sadler's Wells) to a win in 2005, one year after he was disqualified from a Million victory.

Jockey Club Commends Breeders' Cup Initiative... Edited Press Release

The Jockey Club released a statement yesterday commending Breeders' Cup Limited for its decision to eliminate race-day medication in its championship events, and further encouraged the Thoroughbred industry to take steps to reform medication policies and impose stronger penalties on those who violate them. "The Jockey Club applauds the exemplary leadership that Breeders' Cup Limited has displayed with its plan to eliminate race-day medications in its championship events over the next two years," said James L. Gagliano, President and Chief Operating Officer of The Jockey Club. "As we said back in April, the integrity of horse racing and the health and safety of our human and equine athletes requires horses to compete free from the influence of medication. "We hope that other industry stakeholders, and particularly state racing commissions, will see the wisdom of the Breeders' Cup decision and will reconsider many of the medication policies, drug classifications and penalty structures we currently have in place. Our policies should mirror those in the rest of the racing world and prevent chronic offenders from having a continued place in our sport. "We urge the members of the Racing Medication and Testing Consortium and the Racing Commissioners International at their upcoming meetings to continue the momentum to reform these rules and policies."

DARLEY FLYING START CONFERENCE July 14, 2011

SOLUTIONS AND STAKEHOLDERS

The Darley Flying Start class of 2012 met with a group of industry leaders Thursday night at the annual Darley Flying Start conference in Lexington, Kentucky. During an enjoyable, largely informal evening, the class's 12 trainees discussed and debated some of the



biggest challenges facing racing today, and offered solutions in a forum that encouraged the crowd to weight in...and take sides. Held at the Fasig-Tipton pavilion, the conference treated attendees to cocktails and dinner at the second-floor lounge, after which action moved downstairs to the pavilion itself. In attendance were a wide array of industry players, including Fasig's own Dan Pride and Terence Collier; Keeneland's Geoffrey Russell and Tom Thornbury;

Taylor Made Sales' Duncan and Frank Taylor; Pedigree Consultants' Byron Rogers; Gainesway's Michael Herson; Hall of Fame jockey Chris McCarron; racing historian Edward Bowen; the *TDN's* Barry Weisbord; and a number of Flying Start alums and Darley executives, including Darley Start America President Jimmy Bell and Head of Sales Charlie Boden.

The Flying Start trainees were assembled into a panel and, during a session moderated by NBC's Kenny Rice and Flying Start director Clodagh Kavanagh, asked to represent the perspective of the industry's myriad stakeholders. They were:

Kate Benner (sales companies/bloodstock agents/consignors), **Adrian Bott** (racing commissions/state and federal government), **Leah Clark** (trainers), **Nicholas Hay** (owners), **Michael Hardy** (breeders), **Barry Lynch** (TV and radio coverage), **Michael Morrison** (international perspective), **Matthew Prior** (public perception and opinion), **Kelsey Riley** (racing media), **Lindsay Schultz** (racetrack operators), **Brianne Sharp** (casino/racino operators/ADW/betting exchanges), and **James Trotter** (Breeders' Cup/NTRA).

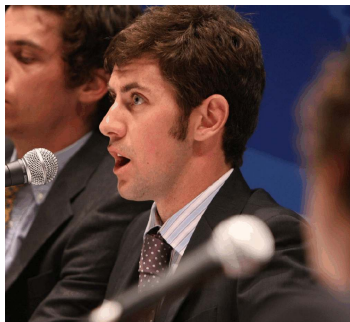
The panel was then asked to comment on 12 issues, and possible solutions, facing the industry. "A lot of these issues are the same around the world, whether it's Ireland or England or Australia, and it's good to have a forum like this, with 12 people of a certain age, from all around the world," said Kavanagh. "They don't have the years and decades of experience you have, but they've studied hard, they've listened, they've ask the questions, and they have a view, and maybe that view, in some way, will help formulate some solutions for the industry here tonight."

The trainees had indeed done their homework, and offered a lively, well-informed and sometimes contentious dialogue on issues ranging from optimizing owner experience to whip use to overhauling pari-mutuel regulation.

One of the first topics out of the box was raceday medication, timely given the announcement by the Breeders' Cup just hours before that it was phasing out Lasix and other drugs for its World Championships. "Lasix has always been an issue for [overseas competitors coming to the U.S.]," said Michael Morrison, a 25-year-old from Brisbane, Australia. "One thing that has perhaps prevented them from making that step is that they have felt in the past that they weren't on a fair playing field unless they used this raceday medication. With the stance the Breeders' Cup has taken, I think it will open the doors much more widely to international participation."



The Tasmanian-born Nicholas Hay from Australia, 22, didn't pull any punches when assessing the state of some American tracks. He thought the establishment of a national board to evaluate their condition could be a useful tool in encouraging capital improvements to make the racing experience better for owners and fans alike. "Take Turfway Park--and I know one of the shareholders is sitting here in the crowd," he said. "My experience at Turfway Park in January had to be the most awful race meeting I've ever been to. You'd have a better atmosphere going to a meeting at Hobart, Tasmania, in the middle of July, with snow on the mountain and sleeting rain, and standing there in your gumboots. Why would I want to take a group of owners, clients or friends to go and look at my horse run at a place where you have to pay for overpriced beer, overpriced hot dogs, while the place is falling apart and rusting away? We went up to Pimlico for Preakness, and it was like stepping back into the 1950s."

The second half of the session put the panel's solutions to the gathered crowd, which was armed with a small paddle--green on one side, red on the other--and asked to vote on whether it agreed with the solutions.

The implementation of Trakus technology at all tracks garnered broad support from the crowd and panel alike, though issues were raised. "You need to keep racetrack patrons engaged in the sport," said Brianne Sharp, a 23-year-old from Arkansas. "From my experience attending racetracks with Trakus, you often find people following the little chicklets going around, rather than

the horses, because it makes it possible to track the horse you're wagering on. And in today's society of instant gratification, if people can't follow the horse they're wagering on, they're going to lose interest. So from a wagering perspective, I agree that it would be fantastic to have Trakus at every track. The problem is that it's expensive, and who is going to pay to put it in at every track? From the ADW's perspective, would an ADW be willing to put in some money, because it increases our handle and revenue? It's a great idea, but it's expensive."

Sharp also weighed in on source-market fees during a discussion on overhauling current pari-mutuel legislation. "Larger tracks tend to subsidize the smaller tracks through source-market fees, and it's not really a free market," said Sharp. "But finding a way to get rid of them is the difficult part. The reason they exist is because the legislatures in the states with small tracks force the ADWs to pay the tracks source-market fees as a condition of being able to take wagers in that state." A reduction in take-out and incentivizing large gamblers through rebates or reduced take-out rates was also suggested as a means of boosting pari-mutuel handle and thus increasing revenue.

One solution put to the panel was a national registration for bloodstock agents. Though many on the panel and in the crowd agreed it was a good idea, Kate Benner, a

24-year-old from Louisville, worried about the burden it would place on international agents, in particular. "You want to encourage international buyers to come in, but when you think about licensing right now, you have to go to the racing commission, get fingerprinted, fill out paperwork and get a picture," she said. "That would close off the market to some international buyers, or any buyers traveling in for a quick sale." Benner instead embraced the code of ethics that's already been adopted by the major sale companies, in part or in whole. "It's published in the Keeneland and Fasig-Tipton [catalogs], and those who don't comply with the code of conduct are listed online, which further increases a bloodstock agent's incentive to comply," she said.

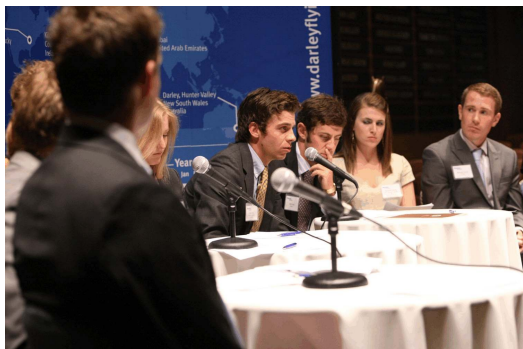
Michael Hardy, a 23-year-old from Co. Down, Northern Ireland, sees a national registration as a way of instilling confidence in new investors. "What's important is that we show owners that agents acting on their behalf are behaving completely ethically," he said. "I think it would aid in bringing in new owners and to lose the stigma that is perhaps perceived around the industry sales. National licensing is quite achievable, and it doesn't have to be to the same extent as a jockey or owner has to go through. If a bloodstock agent violates the code of ethics laid down by TOBA [Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association], the [authority to punish] shouldn't be held by sales companies, but instead by a national body like the racing commission, so that there's more transparency and integrity."

Wheaton, Illinois native Leah Clark, 23, acknowledged whip usage can be a public relations nightmare, but said she believed riding crops are a necessary tool. "Jockeys, when they're on a horse, can really only use their hands [to control the horse], and when you have a horse who's getting out or having issues staying straight in the stretch, the only tools they have are their hands and their whip," said Clark. "For that reason, it's a safety issue for the horse and rider. From the public perception, it doesn't look good whipping the horse, but it's a tool and they need training to do things correctly. A whip isn't going to kill a horse, but if a rider didn't have one, there could be serious issues controlling a horse."

Irishman Barry Lynch, 23, saw it a different way. "If you want to sell this sport to the public, you can't be seen to be beating animals," he offered. "I've grown up with horses and understand the horse isn't hugely damaged by correct use of the whip, but Joe Public doesn't

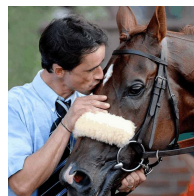
recognize this. Even if it's correctly used, you're still raising a stick to an animal."

Matthew Prior, 26 and hailing from Kent, England, helped lead a discussion that found broad agreement in the panel and crowd that a solution for after-race care of Thoroughbreds would need to include mandatory participation from the industry's various components. "The crucial aspect is that funding comes from every person involved in the industry," he said. "Everyone in the industry has a responsibility to these horses, to give them the aftercare they deserve. During their racing career, they gave their all to every player who was involved with the horse, and morally, we are stewards for these horses."

A solution that found near unanimity in the pavilion was the establishment of a national racing commission, led by an appointed racing commissioner. Said James Trotter, a 28-year-old from South Africa: "The NTRA effectively represents *all* the racetracks in the country, where in other sports--baseball or football--the commissioner isn't in charge of all of football, for instance. He's just in charge of the select, elite talent of his industry. And I think if we were to install a commissioner in the USA, we'd want to put him in charge of the elite talent in the country--the owners and their horses--and they would control the biggest races in the country, and the structure of the races, and hopefully install some form of uniformity." He continued, "In the old days before the PGA Tour, it was the golf courses who had control of the schedule for the year, and they held golf tournaments when it suited them, rather than when it suited the players. Eventually, the PGA Tour came in and said, 'Listen, we're representing the players, and we're going to decide when the best tournaments will happen, and which will be the biggest events.' If we were to set up a commissioner in racing, I think he would need to represent the talent--the horses and owners in the country--rather than the racetracks."



The conference concluded the class's seven-month stay in Lexington, and ushered in a four-week summer vacation. On Aug. 15, the group travels to Darley's base in Hunter Valley, New South Wales, Australia, which will be followed by stays in Dubai beginning in January and in Ireland in April. NYRA AND THE CUP

Considerable debate has gone on in recent years about whether the Breeders' Cup would best serve its purposes by establishing a permanent base for its annual two days of racing. Having followed and written about racing history for many years, I have been keenly interested in this debate. In my opinion, a number of individuals who have not been in the game for more than 25 years or so might be overlooking at least one aspect of the history of the Breeders' Cup which I believe should take the permanent-site option off the table.

I speak of the role played by the New York Racing Association during the germination days of the Breeders' Cup as it went through the stages from concept, to shaping, to reality.

When the Breeders' Cup was being developed, NYRA had as close to a climactic annual series of races as North American racing offered at the time. In 18 of the previous 36 years, the Jockey Club Gold Cup winner had been Horse of the Year. Similarly, NYRA's Champagne Stakes had been won by a juvenile champion in 19 of the last 27 years, the Frizette had been won by the eventual juvenile filly champion in 17 of the last 29 years, and the Beldame had been won by either the three-year-old filly champion or older distaff champion 26 times in the last 38 seasons. Clearly, New York in the fall was the prestige locale--the Big Apple for sure.

From the standpoint of a racing journalist at the time, I recall musing on whether the powers that be at NYRA would (1) welcome the Breeders' Cup, or (2) see it as a rival and try to protect their own territory--a stance not unknown in Thoroughbred racing. It occurred at the time that bumping up the purses for specific races and fiddling about with their dates would allow NYRA to get in some blows difficult for the fledgling entity of the Breeders' Cup to overcome.

Instead, NYRA apparently accepted that the Breeders' Cup was a positive for the industry overall and allowed its own climactic races to be subjugated to the role of preps. In fact, a number of the bellwether races of the NYRA autumn have been grouped in some years and promoted as Preview Weekend--a strong admission that, "We are not the top dog anymore, but a stepping stone to the championship day."

Of course, it was inherent in that stance that the quality of NYRA racing meant it deserved being in the rotation of Breeders' Cup presentations from time to time. Two of the first seven runnings of the Breeders' Cup were held at NYRA tracks, as have three subsequent runnings.

We have every confidence that the personal codes of integrity of the Breeders' Cup's present leaders would steer them away from such a scenario as, "You were with me from the start. You helped me get established and have been a willing supporter all along. However, I just don't need you anymore. Goodbye."

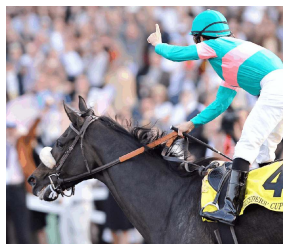
Yet, in an institutional sense, that is exactly what the Breeders' Cup would be doing inadvertently were it to crowd NYRA out of the picture insofar as never having further opportunities to host the event.

There is also another pragmatic reason for the Breeders' Cup board to keep NYRA in the mix. It is a matter of playing sound defense. A scorned NYRA, with the increased muscle of anticipated casino revenues, might reverse the course of its predecessors and adopt a competitive stance, upping purses here and there and switching dates in an attempt to bring to its own fans the best horses in climactic meetings.

For some sporting spectacles, permanency of location is part of the magic. These would include the Kentucky Derby, the Masters Tournament, and the Indianapolis 500. For others, energy is augmented by changes in locale, i. e., the Super Bowl, the NCAA Basketball Tournament, the U. S. Open golf tournament. Those were pretty wise fellows who organized the Breeders' Cup as a moveable feast, and I hope that it will always remain so.

TERRY LANNI DIES J. Terrence Lanni, retired chairman of the board and chief executive of MGM Mirage and a longtime Thoroughbred owner and breeder, passed away Thursday evening at his home in Pasadena, California, surrounded by his family. The 68-year-old had been battling cancer for years and was under hospice care at the time of his death.

Lanni joined MGM Grand in June 1995 as its CEO and in 2000 oversaw the acquisition of Mirage Resorts, creating a hotel and gaming giant in Las Vegas. Prior to his time with MGM, he served for 18 years in senior executive positions with Caesars World, Inc. and was inducted

into the Gaming Hall of Fame in 2000. He retired from MGM Mirage in 2008. Lanni got into the Thoroughbred business during his college days at the University of Southern California, when he was partners with a brother and a sister in Greenhill Stable. Lanni was co-owner of Silic (Fr), the 1999 GI Breeders' Cup Mile hero, and GISW Ladies Din. In 2006, Sinister Minister, owned in partnership with Bernie Schiappa and Mercedes Stable, took the GI Toyota Blue Grass S. More recently, that same ownership group won this year's GI Santa Anita H. with Game On Dude (Awesome Again) following a lengthy stewards' inquiry. That colt narrowly missed following up in last weekend's GI Hollywood Gold Cup. "We've lost a fine man and I've lost a dear friend," commented Joe Harper, the CEO, president and general manager of the Del Mar Thoroughbred Club. Lanni was a member of the directors of Del Mar since 2001. "Terry had great insight into both the gaming business and the racing world, and we were [lucky] to have him on board with us the past decade. He will be dearly missed." Funeral and memorial service plans are pending.

CHURCHILL DOWNS RELEASES FALL STAKES SCHEDULE Churchill Downs has released the stakes schedule for their 21-day fall meet, which will take place from Oct. 30 to Nov. 27 and will include the two Breeders' Cup cards Nov. 4 and 5. Other highlights to be run under the Twin Spires are the \$500,000 GI Clark H. Nov. 25 and a pair of "Stars of Tomorrow" cards that will feature all 2-year-old races on Oct. 30 and Nov. 26. Almost mirroring last year's fall meet in terms of purse money and races, Churchill Downs will run 14 stakes (not including the Breeders' Cup) with total purses in excess of \$2.1 million.

Canterbury on Brink of Reopening:

Hollywood to Pay Retroactive Purse Increase:

Citing better-than-expected business for the spring/summer meeting, Hollywood President Jack Liebau told *Daily Racing Form* that the track will pay a 7% retroactive purse increase to horses that earned purse money from Apr. 23 to June 26. Officials at the track predicted a dip in business going into the meet, owing to a drop in handle at Santa Anita, the struggling economy and a threatened boycott from bettors who were disappointed by a decision to increase takeout on certain wagers in order to fund purses. "I have to admit that personally I had low expectations," Liebau told *DRF*. "Looking at the economy in general, with 12% unemployment [in California], and we were threatened with this boycott, all of these things resulted in me having low expectations. As things have turned out, it has been much better than I hoped. It's not good when you say you're down. Based on my expectations, it's pretty much a success." Horses that earn money in the final three weeks of the meet will not be entitled to a retroactive payment. Liebau also told the publication that he intends to run Hollywood Park on the basis that racing will continue in Inglewood. The track's parent company has been granted zoning approvals to develop the property, but have yet to do so given a bleak real estate outlook. Liebau said the track has applied for two meetings in 2012 and is considering making improvements to the grandstand, hinting that racing could continue at the venue for the foreseeable future.

The results of a major economic study of the Thoroughbred industry commissioned by The Jockey Club, as well as segments devoted to medication, safety and equine injuries, will highlight The Jockey Club's Round Table Conference on Matters Pertaining to Racing at the Gideon Putnam Resort in Saratoga Springs, N.Y., on Sunday, Aug. 14, 2011. The Jockey Club will once again provide a live video stream of the entire Round Table Conference. The two-hour conference begins at 10 a.m. EDT and can be viewed at www.jockeyclub.com. A replay of the live video stream will be available within one hour of the conclusion of the conference and an official transcript of the proceedings will be published at a later date. A major portion of the program will focus on the findings and recommendations from a recently completed industry study entitled, "Driving sustainable growth for Thoroughbred racing and breeding." The study was conducted by the management consulting firm McKinsey & Company in conjunction with The Jockey Club. James L. Gagliano, the president and chief operating officer of The Jockey Club, Dan Singer, a director in McKinsey & Company's Media & Entertainment Practice, and Michael Lamb, a principal in McKinsey & Company's Media & Entertainment Practice, will each provide insights into the study. Ian D. Hight, the secretary-treasurer of The Jockey Club, will provide a summary of the activities of The Jockey Club, and Matt Iuliano, the executive vice president and executive director of The Jockey Club, will present an update on medication reform. Stuart S. Janney III, vice chairman of The Jockey Club and chairman of the Thoroughbred Safety Committee, will deliver a report on behalf of the committee, and Dr. Tim Parkin, an epidemiologist at the University of Glasgow and a consultant to the Equine Injury Database, will unveil new statistics and trends from the database. The Jockey Club Round Table Conference was first held on July 1, 1953, in The Jockey Club office in New York City. The following year, it was moved to Saratoga Springs, N.Y., where it has been held every August since.
