## STRONACH EXPRESSES DESIRE TO ELIMINATE RACEDAY MEDS

Gulfstream Park owner Frank Stronach has submitted a request to the Florida Division of Pari-Mutuel Wagering in which he asks state regulators to help him implement a plan to eliminate all raceday medications at Gulfstream Park beginning with the 2011-2012 meeting. In a letter to Milton Champion at the Florida Horse Racing Commission dated July 13, Stronach formally enlisted the organization's assistance in putting a plan in place to eliminate all raceday medications, including the diuretic Lasix, the impact of which on

Thoroughbred performance remains the subject of great debate. Stronach's letter was sent one day ahead of an announcement by Breeders' Cup Limited that they planned to institute a protocol to eliminate all medications in horses competing at the meeting by 2013. Breeders' Cup is attempting to remove medications from the five juvenile races by 2012. Stronach's plan would go a bit further and impose the policy on 2-year-olds later this year. Kent Stirling, executive director of the Florida Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association, does not stand behind the decision. "Obviously, we'd be entirely against it," he commented. "It creates so many problems. Everyone is jumping the gun, and Frank wants to get out there, too. It seems to be a rush to judgment. The main thing that people want to do is keep the vet out of the stall, and the simple way to do that is to have regulatory vets give the Lasix, like they do in New York and all of Canada--it makes sense that way. For people to jump in and want to take away the one medication that is proven to help horses--if you can stop a horse from bleeding and drop them one grade, you're allowing horses to compete." Stirling expressed frustration at the hastiness of the request. "We sit down, we have a summit, we talk intelligently and map out a strategy and then come up with a solution," he reflected. "But right away, people get out front and try to get their way." Stirling is a supporter of Lasix. "It's a great medication," he offered, referencing a study that was performed in South Africa. "The research shows that Lasix is more effective at low elevations, and the South African study was done at altitude, at almost 5,000 feet. Stronach's two biggest tracks are at sea level, and it just seems to me he's asking for trouble. We don't need to rush to any judgment."

"We are pleased to have a partner in the private aviation category that continues to recognize the importance of the Breeders' Cup as a marketing vehicle to reach our affluent audience." Marty Guinoo, Sentient's chief executive officer, added, "It is our privilege to be sponsoring the Breeders' Cup for the fourth year in a row, and to have the opportunity, through our partnership, to recognize excellence in Thoroughbred racing. We are especially pleased to be sponsoring the new and exciting Breeders' Cup Juvenile Sprint, in addition to the two other Sprint races we have entitled the past three years."

### TATTS REINSTATING GUINEAS BREEZE-UP

Tattersalls announced it will reinstate the Guineas Breeze-Up Sale in 2012, as well as introduce a session for older horses in training. The sale is scheduled for May 4, with the breeze show taking place on the previous morning on Newmarket's Rowley Mile. "This year, we reorganized our Breeze-Up schedule by staging the Craven Breeze-Up as usual [Apr. 17 & 19], followed by a new sale at Tattersalls Ireland in Guineas week," said Tattersalls Chairman Edmond Mahony, explaining the decision to reinstate the event. "While the Craven Breeze-Up produced increased turnover on the 2010 sale, the Tattersalls Ireland Breeze-Up did not manage to replicate the appeal of the sale it was replacing, and feedback from our vendors indicates that they would like to see the Guineas week fixture at headquarters, rather than at Tattersalls Ireland." As for adding the horses-in-training segment, Mahony offered, "At the same time, we felt that there was a demand for a new sale for horses in training to fill the existing gap between our February Sale and the July Sale. The recent Tattersalls July Sale showed yet again the enduring international appeal of horses-in-training sales at Park Paddocks and, by combining the Guineas Breeze-Up with a horses-in-training session, we will have a sale which will appeal to an even wider cross section of buyers. The aim will be to catalogue around 100 2-year-olds in training, which will be preceded by approximately 150 horses in training." Consignor Emma O'Gorman commented, "We have always been supporters of the Tattersalls Guineas Breeze-Up since its inception in 2007, and the addition of a horses-in-training session will add further appeal to the sale. There have been some smart performers come out the sale in recent years."

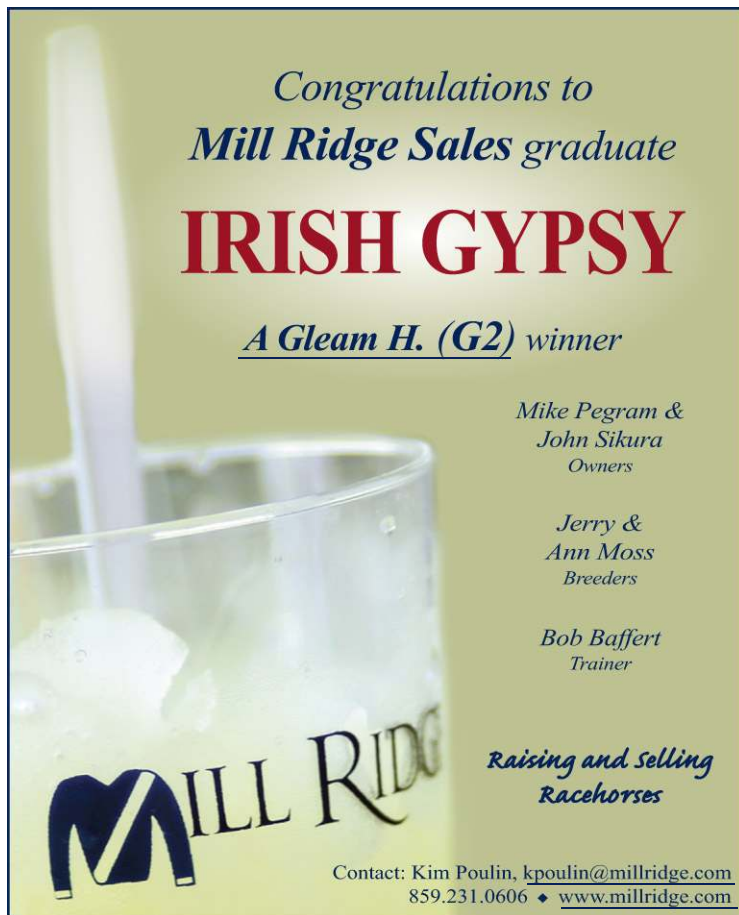

**ISSUES AND ANSWERS**

There have been some interesting points raised about the **Black-Type** and Pattern (Graded/Group) race designations and systems recently. In Saturday's *Daily Racing Form*, Matt Hegarty pointed out the number of races in North America is shrinking faster than the number of approved Graded races, meaning the percentage of Graded races of all races run is increasing, potentially devaluing Graded black-type.

Last year, when Britain's Racing For Change project was attempting to create a domestic season-ending Championship Day, there was a good deal of muttering by the British about the difficulty of finding a suitable day. This was blamed on the 'Pattern'--the Graded/Group Race framework, in this case in Europe. The French have the first weekend in October--Arc weekend. The Irish have the first weekend in September--Irish Champion S. day and weekend. The Breeders' Cup has the first weekend in November. The British answer was to 'shoehorn' their day into mid-October, two weeks after Arc weekend and three weeks before Breeders' Cup weekend. In this case it wasn't the black-type itself, but the positioning of each country's big weekend that was the issue.

In a recent Sunday edition of Britain's *Racing Post*, Bloodstock Editor Richard Griffiths even went so far as

to question whether **black type** itself is still serving the purpose for which it was originally intended: to identify high-class horses, and really identify them by putting their names in bold print in catalogue pages. And it's certainly true that one of the reasons why European buying at American sales has been shrinking is because, even though the relevant horse's black-type entry includes designations for the racetrack and purse money earned by the relevant horse in the race, it's not easy enough to read. If the professionals (in this case from Europe,

It would be impossible to overstate the importance of black-type in the development of the Thoroughbred business into the big business it is today. First used in catalogues by Fasig-Tipton in the early 1950's, **black type** literally created the framework by which value could logically be assigned to pedigrees. I would go so far as to say black-type is the foundation of value in the Thoroughbred business. Some version of 'getting rid of it' is unthinkable.

But the Pattern Race system, and the parameters for assigning black-type internationally, do go back 40 years now. Probably any system with 40 years of history could do with a thorough cleaning. And unlike so many problems besetting the industry, there is an international mechanism for examining the issue: the International Race Planning Advisory Committee (IRPAC; formerly the International Cataloguing Standards Committee [ICSC]).

So, the natives are restless--at least, some of the natives--and maybe with good reason. There is now an awful lot of black-type, and even professionals often don't know what it means, or how to interpret it. Do the Graded/Group Race designations even tell us what we need to know? Are 'Listed' races really Graded/Group 4 races by a more confusing name? What about the fact that there are no black-type races in Europe below Listed class, yet, in 2008, 61% of all North American black-type races were--and, by the way, that was 1,148 black-type races in one year, below Listed standard.

Last year, with my consultant's hat on, I was hired by a very knowledgeable and prominent British bloodstock agent whose client wanted to buy at Keeneland's September sale. My job was basically to 'translate' the black-type in the Keeneland catalogue for them. It was good for me, but he shouldn't have had to do it. It's maybe not a wall anybody put up on purpose, but it's a wall nonetheless, and we need to take down walls, not put them up, or let them stay there just because they're there now. It probably is time for a comprehensive review of the black-type system. Maybe all non-Graded/Group black-type races should be put in **bold blue print** or something.

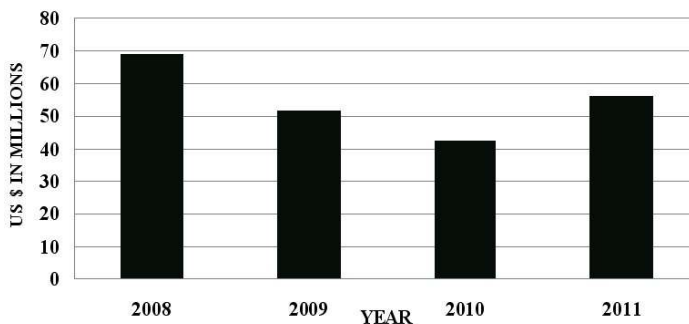
This brings me to another subject that I call 'the competition trap.' Hey, there's nothing wrong with regional and national pride and rivalries--they're probably part of our social 'collective unconscious' going back to tribal days. But there are levels of competition, and I'm pretty sure this industry is suffering a competition hangover dating back 50 years, when horse racing was the only legal form of gambling in the U.S. outside of Las Vegas, and racetracks really did have to compete with each other for top horses. That was back when an assigned handicap weight could make a difference in the U.S. In Europe, competition among and within countries, each with its own domestic agenda, is virtually mandated by European competition laws. **Cont. p5**

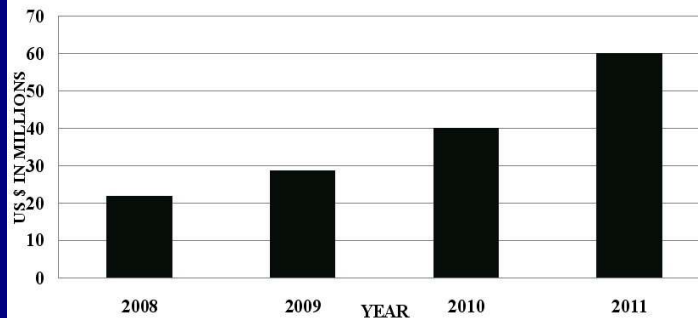

In today's world, this situation is analogous to the industry taking a big old shotgun and taking dead aim at both feet. Most importantly, it is unsustainable.

We need to get out of competition with each other and into collaboration. In Europe, the industry needs to find a way to address European competition issues and create a racing calendar for top-tier horses across five countries, in coordination. For the 92% or so of horses who are below the top tier in each country, international coordination is not an issue, and each jurisdiction's domestic agenda is fine. But not at the top. It's already international, and to attempt to shoehorn the top horses into a domestic agenda, in each of the five countries (Britain, Ireland, France, Germany, Italy) creates problems, not solutions. Otherwise admirable domestic initiatives only dilute the distribution of top-tier horses. But unless we find a way to start collaborating to produce world-class sport to compete not with ourselves, but with other, far better organized world-class sport, this industry is dying a slow, protracted death.

In America the specific problems are different, there are more of them, and they are more immediately life-threatening, but they still have the same theme: internal industry competition, not collaboration. Safe track surfaces and race-day drugs (both welfare issues) are just two, even aside from the necessity of creating a coherent national racing calendar--which at least we know culminates with the Breeders' Cup.

In that context, let me address Ed Bowen's plea in Saturday's *TDN* ([click here](#)) to bring the Breeders' Cup back to New York. As far as I recall, Ed is absolutely correct when he writes that, in the formative era of the Breeders' Cup (first run in 1984), "NYRA apparently accepted that the Breeders' Cup was a positive for the industry overall and allowed its own climactic races to be subjugated to the role of preps." But, when he talks about conditions that he thinks means the Breeders' Cup should take "the permanent-site option off the table," he is ignoring the findings of the 2009 Breeders' Cup Strategic Planning process to which I've alluded before.

A Breeders' Cup press release after a meeting of the Board of Directors on Dec. 11, 2009, noted, "The Breeders' Cup Board of Directors approved core components of the organization's long-term strategic plan today..." The first of four 'pillars' that the Board approved was to, "Explore the feasibility of a single permanent host site location for the Breeders' Cup World Championships." The second pillar was to "Establish a new Breeders' Cup Racing Series in partnership with North American and European racetracks to better define and market the road to the Breeders' Cup World Championships."

Let me emphasize I don't speak for the Breeders' Cup; I'm writing now as a commentator. A permanent warm-weather host site would have two major advantages over all other options: first, warm weather (and a higher incidence of dry tracks), and, second, a single site would save a lot of money in not having to reinvent the wheel every year. Maybe it's not possible to negotiate or create a permanent warm-weather site, but, at the time and from the point of view of the Breeders' Cup, that was clearly the favored option. Cont. p6

Instead of caucusing to hold the Championship weekend in New York, where there is a much higher chance of inclement weather in a facility that hasn't been updated since 1984 (through no fault of the team now running NYRA--there's no doubt they would have if they could have), I would have thought a more productive

idea for everybody would be to try to implement the second pillar of the Strategic Plan, cited above: work with the racetracks to create a narrative "to better define and market" the road to the Championships, the buildup. New York alone could hold two big 'preview' days, one at Saratoga towards the end of the meet, one a month out. As Ed points out, this has been done before. Look, it's understandable that everyone wants to fight in their own corner, but there's a case for saying what the industry really needs is a collaborative effort among the major racetracks and racetrack groups to really create three identifiable major regions--West, Midwest, and East; to have much healthier major racing in each (New York might be about the streak ahead in that department); and instead of talking about two days in November, for us all to be able to talk about a comprehensive, comprehensible narrative beginning after the Triple Crown, and eventually leading to a Breeders' Cup or Championship Racing Season.

And as for the not-very-veiled threat that "A scorned NYRA...might reverse the course of its predecessors and adopt a competitive stance..."--well, there it is again, that very buzzword: "competitive."

You know what? This shouldn't be that hard. So everybody's got some vested interest they're arguing for; so a lot of people with good ideas and strong feelings have egos. But if everyone would just step outside those identities for a minute, just try and see what the racing industry looks like from outside, and what it could look like--well, haven't we still got a long way to go? It's entirely possible to work toward a goal that is palpably for the common good while addressing the concerns of established interests, without raised voices and saber-rattling. But the stakeholders have to have the will to accomplish it. This is the biggest challenge: to really and truly collaborate. There is not a lot of reason to have a lot of confidence in the future of the industry, in the U.S. anyway, if a lot more serious collaboration doesn't start happening a lot faster.

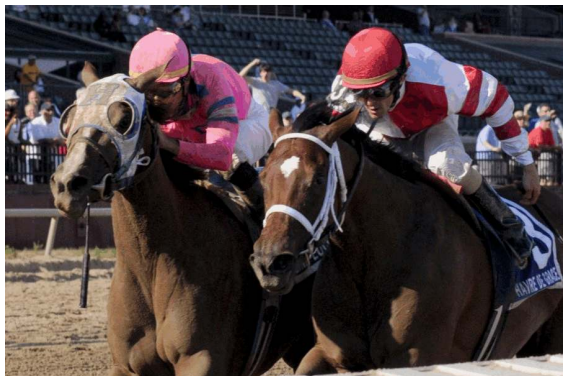

## SHOW ME THE MONEY

Top fillies **Blind Luck** (Pollard's Vision) and **Havre de Grace** (Saint Liam), who put up another thriller in their sixth meeting last Saturday in the GII Delaware H., may yet face off once more in the GI Personal Ensign S. at Saratoga Aug. 28. That 10-furlong contest is currently valued at \$300,000 in the stakes schedule, but Havre de Grace's owner Rick Porter indicated his 4-year-old would take part if the purse were increased to \$600,000. "Double the pot and it's game on," Porter told *Daily Racing Form* yesterday.




**Blind Luck (blinkers) bests Havre de Grace in GII Delaware H.**

On Monday, Porter told the publication that he and trainer Larry Jones were debating whether to test Havre de Grace versus the boys in the \$750,000 GI Woodward S. at the Spa Sept. 3. The Woodward is contested at nine furlongs. In 2009, New York Racing Association officials boosted the Woodward's purse from \$500,000 to \$750,000 to lure Rachel Alexandra (Medaglia d'Oro), who wound up sealing her historic Horse of the Year campaign with that victory. NYRA President and Chief Executive Officer Charles Hayward told *DRF* that "it would be much more compelling for the two fillies to run against each other," but said no decision had been made yet.

## KRONE COMING BACK FOR CHARITY

Retired Hall of Fame rider Julie Krone is preparing to get back in the saddle again for a "legends" event at England's Doncaster Race Course in September. The event benefits an injured jockeys' fund. Currently a resident of Carlsbad, California, the 47-year-old has been getting up on horses at Del Mar in the mornings for trainer Richard Mandella, and has been also taking karate classes. Krone has also been contacted by the producers of the popular reality television show "Survivor." "They say I've got appeal for a [desirable] demographic," Krone said. "But if I'd taken them up on it, I wouldn't be here now. I'd be out wherever they're filming it."
