**CLASSY QUINTET LINES UP FOR CCA OAKS**

Five graded stakes winners, including the horses who emerged victorious from the GI Kentucky Oaks, GI Acorn S. and GI Mother Goose S., were entered for the Saturday feature at Saratoga, the 95th running of the GI TVG Coaching Club American Oaks. Peachtree Stable's **Plum Pretty** (Medaglia d'Oro) looks to become

the first winner of the Kentucky Oaks to follow up in this event since Ashado (Saint Ballado) completed the double back in 2004 when the race was still contested at Belmont Park and at the distance of a mile and a quarter. She had the tables turned on her by Kentucky Oaks third Zazu (Tapit) when she finished a last-out runner-up in the GII Hollywood Oaks June 25, and trainer Bob Baffert looks east for this one. "I

think she likes dirt better," commented assistant trainer Jim Barnes. "In the Hollywood Oaks, we kind of sat and waited, and waited and waited. She came out of that race alright and here we are." **It's Tricky** (Mineshaft) wore Darley maroon and white when posting an upset over Turbulent Descent (Congrats) in the GI Acorn S. at an astonishing 10-1. She'll carry Godolphin blue Saturday afternoon, the same silks borne on 2008 CCA Oaks heroine Music Note (A.P. Indy) and 2002 hero Jilbab (A.P. Indy). **Buster's Ready** (More Than Ready) looks to give trainer Todd Pletcher his fifth renewal since 2001 and his second in a row (Devil May Care, 2010). Raced by the Estate of Ned Evans, she was runner-up to **Royal Delta** (Empire Maker) in the GII Black-Eyed Susan S. in May prior to her defeat of GII Fantasy S. victress and beaten Kentucky Oaks favorite **Joyful Victory** (Tapit) in the Mother Goose June 25.

No worse than third in any of his five previous trips to the post, **Cirrus des Aigles** (Fr) (Even Top {Ire}) grabbed the lead a quarter mile from home and charged away to a popular and comfortable victory in the G3 Grand Prix de Vichy Wednesday evening. Third in Longchamp's G1 Prix Ganay Apr. 30, the gelding hustled

Goldikova (Ire) (Anabaa) when runner-up back there in the May 22 G1 Prix d'Ispahan before regaining the winning thread in the G3 La Coupe at that track once more June 13. He was a commendable second to Sarafina (Fr) (Refuse to Bend {Ire}) in the June 26 G1 Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud last time and justified odds-on favoritism back at this level for a fifth pattern race triumph. Settled in a close third behind a steady pace for most of the contest, he challenged on the bridle passing the 400-meters sign and was ridden out once taking over approaching the final eighth to win in cozy fashion. Cirrus des Aigles may now point to the Aug. 17 G1 Juddmonte International at York. **Chart p2**

## Racetrack Round-Up

### Flashy Lassie to Be Scratched from Schuylerville...

Citing his opposition to vanning GIII Debutante S. winner **Flashy Lassie** (Holy Bull) from Kentucky to upstate New York in increasingly oppressive conditions, trainer Gary Simms has decided to scratch the filly from Friday's GIII Schuylerville S. at Saratoga. "To ship her that far in this heat is not the right thing to do," Simms told the publication. "Plus you got to train over that track up there; it's not an easy track to ship in and run over. They don't call it the 'graveyard' for nothing. Our goal is to try to get to the Breeders' Cup with a fresh horse, that's our thinking." Owned by Barry King, Flashy Lassie was a popular nine-length winner versus \$20,000 maiden claimers at Churchill May 13 before surprising the Debutante field at 17-1 June 25. Simms will now turn his attention to the Mountaineer Juvenile Fillies in West Virginia Aug. 6.

be retired from racing. "I looked at him yesterday morning before he went out to train and didn't like what I saw," trainer Mark Casse told *Daily Racing Form* yesterday. "We treated him and this morning you wouldn't even know it was there. He looked normal. But an ultrasound revealed a tear." The 6-year-old, owned by Bill Farish, Jr., also won the 2009 GIII Durham Cup. He was third in the 2009 GI Autumn S. and runner-up in this year's GI Elkhorn S. On the board in 17 of 28 starts, Pool Play won six times and earned \$909,556.

"It's just a shame this had to happen, because he was just beginning to prove to everybody how good he is," Casse added. "I feel bad for Bill. As for me, it was nice to have had him, and I'm glad he at least was able to win a Grade I race and prove to people how talented he is. Hopefully, he'll go somewhere and be a stallion."

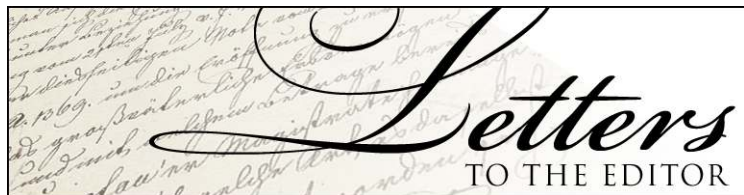

**Attendance, On-Track and Overall Handle Up at Belmont:**

The spring/summer meeting at Belmont Park, which concluded Sunday, July 17, posted gains in attendance, on-track and total handle and NYRA Rewards account wagering, officials at the New York Racing Association have announced. Total attendance leapt by 14.4%, while total on-track handle--including money bet on simulcast races--increased to \$141 million from \$82 million. Total all-sources handle was ahead by 1.2%, from \$572 million to \$579 million, and NYRA Rewards wagering, in the backdrop of the closing of NYC OTB, jumped 146 percent from \$5.4 million to \$13 million. "We are very encouraged by the results from the recently concluded Belmont Park meet," commented NYRA President and CEO Charles Hayward. "The large increases in attendance and on-track handle continue the strong trends that we have set since the closure of New York City Off-Track Betting, and it is an especially positive sign that our total all-sources handle increased during the Belmont meet. These indicators give us plenty of optimism as we get ready to open the 143rd renewal of the prestigious Saratoga Race Course meet on Friday."

**Race Named in Honor of Wounded Congresswoman:**

The seventh race on Friday's opening-day card at Saratoga will be named in honor of Gabrielle Giffords, the Arizona congresswoman who was wounded in a shooting at a constituent rally in early January. A field of 11 is set to go postward in the 2-year-old maiden special weight for New York-bred fillies. Giffords' husband Captain (USN) Mark Kelly will make the winning presentation. Kelly is a NASA astronaut who commanded the final flight of the space shuttle Endeavour, which landed June 1 after a 16-day mission to the International Space Station. Giffords' Chief of Staff, Pia Carusone, is a Saratoga native and the daughter of John Carusone, an attorney at Carusone & Carusone, located on Broadway.

**DEBT CRISIS PLAN INCLUDES MAJOR TAX REFORM**

NTRA is actively monitoring the steady stream of tax reform measures that have emerged as lawmakers work overtime to address the debt ceiling crisis. In the current environment, every provision in the tax code is under intense scrutiny and every industry - including horseracing - must be alert to both threats and opportunities.

One deficit reduction plan is drawing particular interest. A bipartisan group of six Senators, known as the Gang of Six, introduced a proposal to cut the nation's deficit by more than \$3.6 trillion over the next decade. According to a summary from the Gang of Six, the plan uses a two-step legislative process: (1) an initial bill that makes immediate cuts; and (2) a process for a second bill to enact comprehensive reform.

A significant portion of the plan includes fundamental changes to the tax code. For example, the Gang of Six calls for permanently repealing the \$1.7 trillion Alternative Minimum Tax. It also outlines the reform of a wide variety of tax expenditures including those for charitable giving, retirement and homeownership, which could result in an end to the current home mortgage tax deduction--the centerpiece of most taxpayers' itemized deductions.

President Obama referred to the plan as a "very significant step."

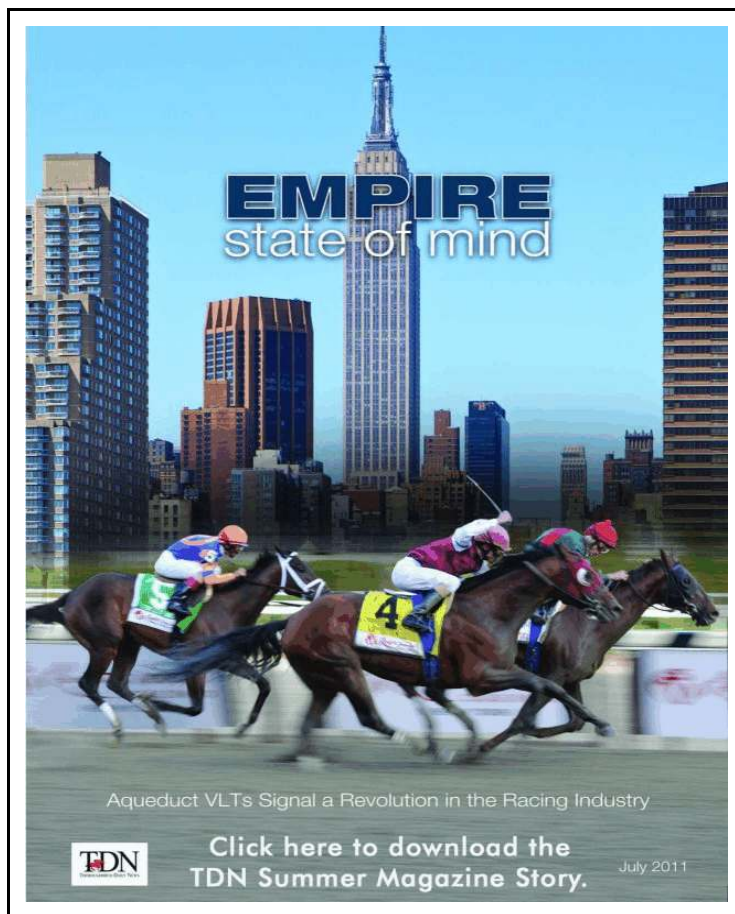
Making his first appearance since finishing down the field behind Shackelford (Forestry) in the GI Preakness S. May 21, Mr. Commons bided his time one from the tail down the Del Mar backstretch, advanced on the turn, bid four wide at the quarter pole and went on to a good-looking victory in the Oceanside S. on opening day of the meeting at the seaside oval. A daylight maiden winner sprinting down the hill in January, the striking bay took a two-turn allowance prior to a third in the GI Santa Anita Derby in April. **1st-DMR, \$66,050, Alw, Opt. Clm. (\$40,000), NW1\$X, 3yo/up, 1m (AWT), 1:37 1/5, ft. PRICE (g, 5, [Even the Score--Starlight Gazer {SW & GSP, \\$322,782}](#), by Tejabo) scored when unveiled for a \$32,000 tag at Hollywood in December 2009, but didn't see action again until Sept. 2, when he captured a starter allowance over this surface. Benched after finishing a close sixth in an open allowance on the Hollywood weeds Oct. 17, the dark bay came back to finish third by 3/4 of a length on the Inglewood Cushion Track May 14. He followed that with a fourth behind Sway Away (Afleet Alex) in a seven-furlong test on the Hollywood main track June 19, and was the 4-1 third choice while stretching out here and shedding the hood. Content to race in fourth as favored Eye On Jacob (A.P. Indy) rolled along on the front end, Price took aim on the chalk in the lane and swept past him late to record a 1 1/4-length success. It was trainer Howard Zucker's first winner of 2011. Eye On Jacob clung on for second by a nose over Times Gone By (Giant's Causeway). Times Gone By was claimed for \$40,000 by Belmonte, La Vida Loca Racing and Little Red Feather Racing and trainer Mike Mitchell. He was previously conditioned by John Sadler for Great Friends Stable. **LAST STING (f, 4, [Scorpion--Fachosa's Last, by Laubali](#))** outran her 37-1 odds when second in her career opener, a \$30,000 maiden claimer on the Gulfstream grass Jan. 8 for breeder Santa Cruz Ranch and trainer Jesus Chavez. Sold privately afterwards to her current connections, the bay finished fourth in a Santa Anita maiden special weight Apr. 15, then ran fifth behind recent Grade I winner Nereid (Rock Hard Ten) in a May 7 test on the Hollywood lawn. The blinkers came off for her most recent appearance at Golden Gate May 20, but the bay hit traffic and wound up second as the 4-5 chalk. Dismissed at 10-1 here, Last Sting was content to race in sixth as Born Lucky (Flower Alley) and Simply Carina (El Prado {Ire}) disputed the pace. **Canterbury Park to Reopen Today:**

The banner on the Canterbury Park website says it all: "Back in the Saddle." Following approval of state budget Wednesday morning, officials at the Shakopee facility announced the end of the shutdown, which cost the track 12 of its 62 scheduled dates. "We are relieved that this shutdown has come to an end. It has caused undue hardship to far too many," Canterbury President Randy Sampson said. "Suspending Canterbury's operations was extremely painful to the 1,000 employees of Canterbury Park who were laid off without pay, to those employed on our backside and to thousands otherwise involved in Minnesota's horse industry. Since the shutdown occurred during the heart of racing season, we estimate that Canterbury Park lost as much as \$1 million in revenue each week, but we won't know the final impact until the racing season is over. We look forward to welcoming back our loyal employees and customers and to allowing the horsemen to again compete for purses." Because Minnesota law mandates a 24-hour waiting period for monies to be distributed to the state's agencies, the card casino will reopen this morning at 10 a.m., simulcasting will commence at 11 a.m. and the first live program in three weeks kicks off at 7 p.m.

### AUSTRALIAN SALES CODE OF CONDUCT

**UNVEILED** Eight of Australia's major racing entities have joined together to create a new Australian Sales Thoroughbred Code of Conduct, designed "to bring greater transparency and accountability to agents acting on behalf of buyers," according to a release from Thoroughbred Breeders Australia. The code was signed by The Australian Racing Board, Thoroughbred Breeders Australia, Magic Millions, William Inglis and Son Ltd, Federation of Bloodstock Agents Australia, Australian Trainers Association, NSW Trainers Association and Equine Veterinarians Australia. "Complaints against agents--defined as any person representing or advising a buyer or seller at a sale--are infrequent to the point of being rare, but all of us have a vital interest in maintaining confidence in the sales system and answering any criticisms, however ill-informed or unjustified," explained Thoroughbred Breeders Australia CEO Peter McGauran. "The code imposes a number of specific obligations on agents in regard to disclosure as well as prohibiting payment of inducements or secret commissions. Importantly, however, the code incorporates sweeping provisions under which agents are held to the highest ethical and professional standards of their professions. We are confident that every potential wrongdoing is covered by the code which has been two years in the drafting." The new code creates a Complaints Advisory Panel to mediate discrepancies and avoid costly litigation. "The Panel's responsibility is to use its best endeavours to conciliate and mediate any dispute taking into account written submissions and a conference with the complainant and respondent," McGauran explained. "If no resolution is possible, then the complainant will be advised of their legal rights and, if necessary, the conduct of the agent referred to their relevant professional association for action under their disciplinary rules.
