NAT'S MY BOY

Last month's G2 King Edward VII S. hero **Nathaniel (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) was supplemented, at a cost of £75,000, for Ascot's G1 King George VI & Queen Elizabeth S., and justified connections' faith with a 2 3/4-length victory in the £1-million contest. Positioned in

second as Godolphin's rabbit **Debussy (Ire)** (Diesis {GB}) set ever-increasing fractions, the 11-2 chance set sail for home at the top of the straight and refused to surrender under forceful urging to hold the errant late bid of **Workforce (GB)** (King's Best). **St Nicholas Abbey (Ire)** (Montjeu {Ire}), unable to catch the front two, was a further 1 1/4 lengths back in third. "Nathaniel is getting better and better, and showed it today," commented trainer John Gosden. "My inclination is to take him straight for the [G1 Prix de l'] Arc [de Triomphe at Longchamp Oct. 2], with perhaps a racecourse gallop beforehand." The race was marred when **Rewilding (Ire)** (Tiger Hill {Ire}) broke down and unshipped Frankie Dettori as the race reached fever pitch soon after turning for home. Godolphin's 4-year-old broke a cannon bone and was euthanized.

ACCLAMATION KEEPS ROLLING

Acclamation (Unusual Heat) followed his second straight wire-to-wire win in the G1 Charles Whittingham Memorial H. with another dominating front-running performance in Del Mar's G1 Eddie Read S. Saturday. "The horse is really good; better now than ever," trainer Donald Warren said. "He looked awfully good out there and we are very pleased." Warren continued, "[Joel Rosario] gave him the perfect ride. He broke a little slow, but he made the lead easy. I like to see him cruising on an easy lead and I always like to see a horse slip away on the last turn like he did. Just done to perfection."

WHAT A TREAT

Godolphin Stable's **It's Tricky** (Mineshaft) can be more than a handful for her connections before and after she lines up, but continues to be all business once they spring the latch. The Godolphin representative made it two straight wins at the highest level with a hard-fought 3/4-length victory over favored **Plum Pretty** (Medaglia d'Oro) in the G1 TVG Coaching Club American Oaks at the Spa Saturday. "She's tricky," trainer Kieran McLaughlin said. "It took us a long time to catch her in the stall this morning to put her halter on. But that's a good thing. You want to see that, because in Florida [well-beaten fourth in the GII Gulfstream Oaks Apr. 2], she did everything right. We want her to be tricky. And she was tricky this morning. She won, she didn't do anything wrong in the paddock or in the race, and Eddie [Castro] rode a great race." As for what's next for the G1 TVG Acorn S. heroine, McLaughlin added, "Probably the [G1 TVG] Alabama [at Saratoga Aug. 20], but we'll find out from the Godolphin people."

Nathaniel didn't have an easy introduction, having caught a tartar in Frankel (GB) (Galileo {Ire}) as he earned ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ status when they met at Newmarket last August. Things weren't any easier the following month when he was second again to Picture Editor (GB) (Dansili {GB}), who also earned ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ distinction, in his only other juvenile start at Doncaster. The bay broke through at Haydock on sophomore return Apr. 16, but was beaten a head by subsequent G1 Epsom Derby second and G1 Irish Derby winner Treasure Beach (GB) (Galileo {Ire}) in the May 5 G3 Chester Vase before slamming his opponents by five lengths and more in the G2 King Edward VII S. at Royal Ascot last time June 17. That success prompted connections to consider the July 14 G1 Grand Prix de Paris, but that plan was shelved when Longchamp's drying track conditions became disadvantageous.

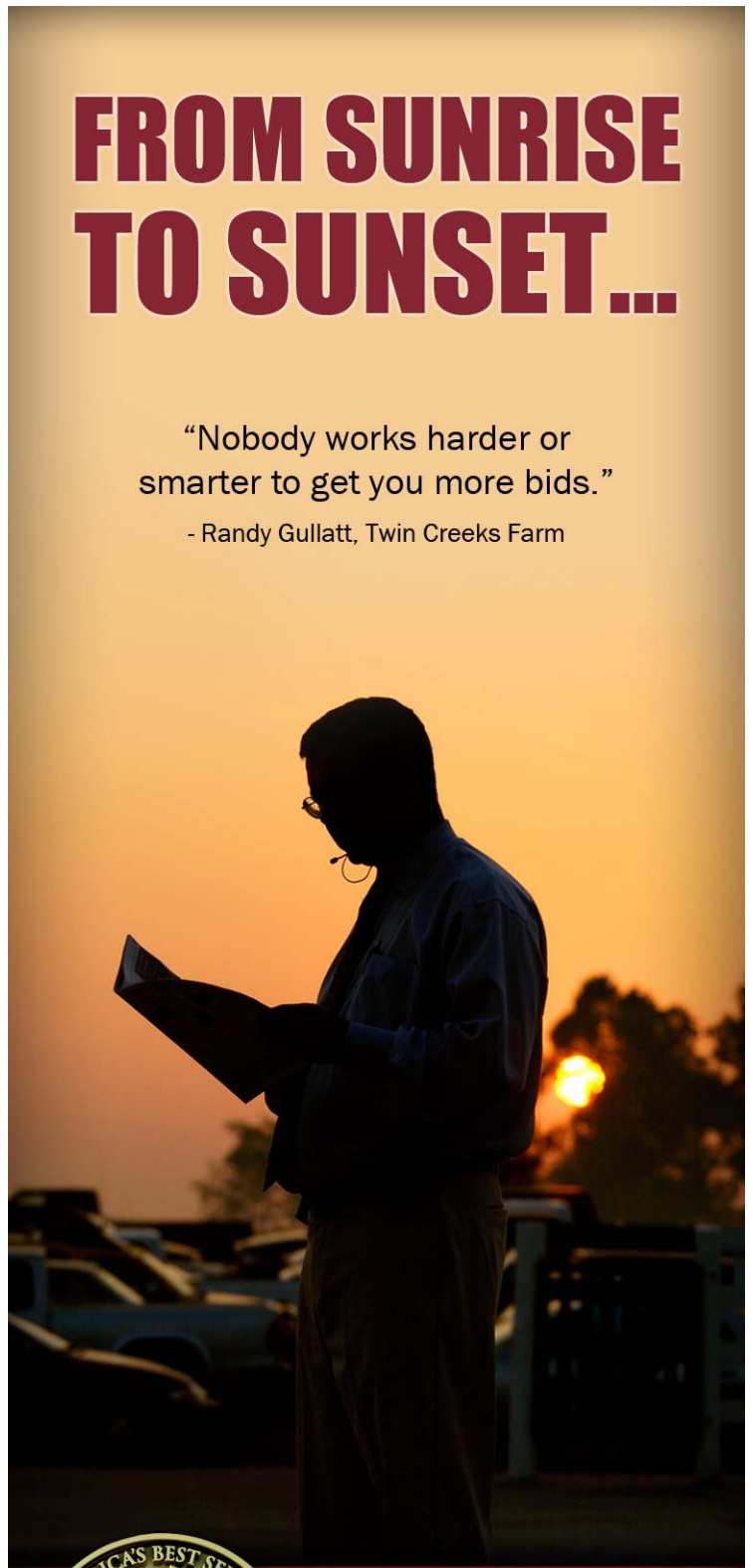

This alternative cost a £75,000 supplementary fee, and that decision was fully vindicated as trainer John Gosden registered a first triumph in Europe's midsummer championship. Nathaniel, who received a 12-pound allowance from his four elders, was positioned in second as Debussy set a sedate early

pace, so sedate that the eventual winner enjoyed a brief interlude on the front end before Godolphin's pacemaker set about his task in earnest after a half mile. Retaining his position of stealth until the home turn, the homebred Nathaniel quickly assumed command

and set sail for home at the top of the lane. The race took a nasty twist soon after when Rewilding broke down and threw Frankie Dettori to the turf. However, there was no looking back for Nathaniel, and he felt the full force of William Buick's urgings inside the final quarter mile to stave off the vain bid of Workforce, who compromised his chances by taking an errant path towards the stands' side in the closing stages. St Nicholas Abbey stayed on well, but was unable to mount a serious threat and filled the show.

"First of all, I would like to say how sorry I am for Rewilding and his connections--it's never nice to see that happen," said Buick. "My fellow jumped in front and [Debussy's jockey] Ahmed Ajtebi obviously didn't intend on making the running, so I let my horse stride along. It wasn't ideal, and I was happy when I [eventually] got a lead off Ahmed, and then I took it up turning in. This horse is getting better and better, and today he showed how good he is. I always knew he was a very good horse, but I didn't know that he was going to be this good this soon. I could see Workforce in the corner of my eye, and you've got to have a lot of respect for a horse like him, but Nathaniel was never stopping and he galloped on well to the line."

Buick added, "I remember coming along with my father [former jockey Walter] before I started riding to watch the race the year Golan won, and now I'm here winning the King George--it's just a dream come true."

Gosden said, "It's been a wet week, we've been lucky to get the [good-to-soft] ground, and he won well. He loves this track, and to finish in front of a horse like Workforce is everything. It was an intelligent ride by William and I left it completely up to him how to ride the race. He let him stride on, which was not ideal, but then again Workforce would have been better if they had gone a pace."

Always In Style...

Nathaniel's dam Magnificent Style, winner of the 1996 G3 Musidora S. for breeder Mahmoud Fustok's Buckram Oak and trainer Sir Henry Cecil, was purchased by Swettenham Stud in 1997 at KEENOV for \$410,000, and produced a series of high-class performers. Acquired privately by the Rothschilds' Kincorth Investments when the Sangster operation dispersed in 2007, Magnificent Style had Nathaniel in utero at that time. She has a 2-year-old full-sister to the King George hero named Great Heavens (GB), and produced an Oasis Dream (GB) colt this past February.

Rewilding Euthanized...

Nathaniel's crowning moment in registering a career a high, and a first King George success for trainer John Gosden and jockey William Buick, was overshadowed by the desperate sight of **Rewilding** (Tiger Hill {Ire}--Darara {Ire}, by Top Ville {Ire}) breaking down when about to reach maximum effort early in the straight. British Horseracing Authority officials were satisfied the immediate decision to euthanize the G1 Dubai Sheema Classic and G1 Prince of Wales's S. winner was the correct one. "Rewilding suddenly, and completely unexpectedly, suffered a major fracture of the lower part of his near-fore," explained the BHA's Director of Equine Science and Welfare Tim Morris. "The horse was caught and examined by the vets immediately, and the decision was made that humane euthanasia was the only option. It is a great regret, but it was the right decision for the horse." Ascot's chief executive Charles Barnett added, "This sort of incident is terribly regrettable, especially on a flagship day like today. We express our profound sympathies to Sheikh Mohammed, the Godolphin operation, trainer Mahmood Al Zarooni and jockey Frankie Dettori." John Gosden was one of the first to reach Rewilding. "I attended Rewilding with the groom--he just put his leg down wrong and the cannon bone snapped clean in two," Gosden explained. "I've seen it happen with a horse galloping in a paddock and they feel nothing. The vet was on hand as we gave the horse a final munch of grass, and he dealt with it immediately." Dettori escaped serious injury when thrown to the turf and was able to climb into the racecourse ambulance unaided. He suffered bruising to his knee, and was stood down from his remaining ride on the card as a precaution. The rider is due to partner Cavalryman (GB) (Halling) in today's G1 Grosser Preis von Berlin at Hoppegarten. Rewilding, a 500,000gns TATOCT yearling, earned £2,455,418 during his 10-race career. The son of Group 1 winner Darara was a half-brother to the first-class Dar Re Mi (GB) (Singspiel {Ire}).

Workforce Scraped Up...

Last term's G1 Epsom Derby and G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe hero Workforce drifted from the center of the track towards the stands' side rail inside the final furlong, a maneuver that compromised his chance of winning. In the immediate aftermath of the race, jockey Ryan Moore indicated that Workforce was struck into on the home bend, and it later emerged the Juddmonte homebred returned with a cut to his hind leg. "When Ryan came back, he said that Frankie's horse [Rewilding] had struck into his horse on the run, and there is a nick on his hind leg now," trainer Sir Michael Stoute confirmed.

No Excuse Needed...

Derrick Smith, Susan Magnier and Michael Tabor's G1 Coronation Cup winner St Nicholas Abbey, who drifted from pre-race favorite to third choice on the day, ran on well to claim third, but was certainly not done any favors by the lack of early pace. Trainer Aidan O'Brien resisted any temptation to use that in mitigation, however. "St Nicholas Abbey has run a lovely race, they've gone a steady pace, but we're making no excuses," O'Brien offered.

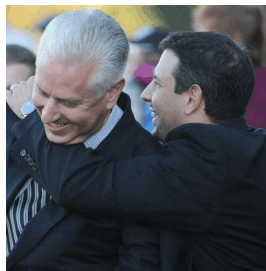

AN 'OVER'WHELMING CHOICE

It's *Overdriven's* race to lose following a sharp debut score at Belmont July 1, good for a division-leading 100 Beyer Speed Figure. The Repole Stable colorbearer returned with a snappy five-furlong move in :59 1/5 at the Spa July 18. "He had a good breeze over the track, and we're excited about running in the Sanford," trainer Todd Pletcher said. "He's a big, strong colt who carries plenty of conditioning, and we justly believe he can move forward off that race." The bay was purchased for \$350,000 as a KEESEP yearling.

"Primarily, it's the first major stepping stone in the division in the United States," Ward offered. "It's a race that gives you a good feel for quality, and it's where you start separating the men from the boys." **Power World** overcame early trouble to graduate at first asking at Churchill June 11. He enters off a second-place finish in the GIII Bashford Manor S. July 2. "I think at this stage they're all pretty much in the same boat, making their second or third starts, and all pretty good races," trainer Neil Howard said. "My horse ran a pretty good maiden race off a troubled start and he closed nicely in the Bashford Manor to finish second to a very nice horse. He's definitely a horse who seems like he'll be much better suited when he stretches out later on."

Sent off as the third-choice here, It's Tricky hounded the head-strong GI Kentucky Oaks heroine Plum Pretty through early fractions of :23.88 and :47.55. With Eddie Castro aboard, It's Tricky turned up the heat on the turn for home, and battled her way past Plum Pretty after a stirring stretch-long duel. "It was a great win for Godolphin to win a Grade I here with us," trainer Kiaran McLaughlin said. "It's special. We're pleased and privileged to train her for them. She is tricky and they didn't want to move her. So it worked out well for us, and if they move her tomorrow, we're all part of the same team. It was hard-fought down the lane and we got there. I told Eddie to try to get to the rail and go for the lead, but not to send her." Castro added, "Around the three-eighths, I knew [Martin Garcia aboard Plum Pretty] had a lot of horse, too. I had to put pressure and ride her really hard. When that filly came past her, she changed leads, and when I hit her left again, she swung back again, she fought again."

Grade I winner Winchester was the 1-2 morning-line choice for this. But that was based on his turf form, as the 6-year-old hadn't raced on a surface not colored green in 21 starts. So it was anyone's guess how'd he'd handle the Polytrack when the Stars and Stripes was forced to the main track from a single-day record of nearly seven inches of Chicago-area rain. Good but not great, appears to be the answer, as he failed to kick in the stretch and finished second to longshot Free Fighter here. The latter raced primarily in graded company in 2010 and early '11 before being risked for a \$62,500 tag at Gulfstream in March, and he was promptly haltered from Tom Fedro Sr. and breeder Team Block and trainer Chris Block. The claim looked an initial bust when Free Fighter stopped badly in the GIII Louisville H. at Churchill May 28, but the Illinois-bred nearly upset the restricted Black Tie Affair S. over Arlington's sod June 5, finishing third, and was a credible fourth in the GIII Arlington H. going 10 panels July 9. Sitting comfortably in fourth, he wrested the lead from Proceed Bee in mid-stretch and edged away to prevail in track-record time. "Mike [trainer Reavis] and I planned to let him sit comfortably wherever he was and sit off the speed a little bit," winning jockey Tim Thornton said. "It worked out perfectly. I was able to sit on the fence all the way around there and save all the ground. I was able to ease out and when I asked him to pick it up, he did."

Twice Over won his second consecutive G1 Champion S. at Newmarket in last season's closer Oct. 16, and appeared to be in the same vein of form when he opened 2011 with a victory in the G2 Al Maktoum Challenge Round 3 at Meydan Mar. 3. A poor ninth in the G1 Dubai World Cup Mar. 26 followed, before the veteran ran sixth of seven in the May 14 G1 Lockinge S. at Newbury. He worried connections when finishing a distressed fifth in the G1 Prince of Wales's S. at Royal Ascot last time June 15, but found this company more to his liking to gain an eighth black-type score. Held up in mid-division as Tazeez (Silver Hawk) dawdled through the early fractions up front, the Juddmonte homebred traveled well in the last pair turning for home. Asked for his effort by jockey Tom Queally as the screw was turned up front with three furlongs to race, Twice Over didn't have an instant response, but, when it came, he soon picked up the leaders and kept on well under a drive in the final eighth. "He's a very special horse to all of us and it's nice he's back to winning ways," said Queally. "He might have lost his way for a couple of races, but he's found his way back to the winner's enclosure. I took my time early on, and it took him a few strides to hit top gear, but when he did there was no stopping him. The extra half-furlong can find him out, but it didn't today. He was the class horse in the race, and won like it." Juddmonte acquired the unraced third dam Lost Virtue in foal to Topsider, for \$375,000 at KEENOV 1986. The mare is third dam of champion Banshee Breeze (Unbridled) as well. Second dam Quandary also produced the dam of Group 1 winners Passage of Time (GB) (Dansili {GB}) and Timepiece (GB) (Zamindar). Twice Over has an unraced 2-year-old full-brother named Visual (GB).

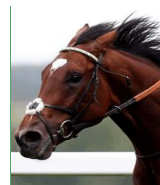

Not seen since winning a five-furlong Windsor maiden in impressive fashion on debut May 9, Angels Will Fall was restrained to race at the tail of the field through the opening stages of this pattern-race bow. Asked for her effort at the quarter pole, she was punched into the lead a furlong later and driven clear by jockey Robert Winston to complete a juvenile stakes-race double on the card for her sire. The winner may now point to the G2 Lowther S. at York Aug. 18. "When I rode her at work the other morning, I said that she was the best five-furlong filly in the country and, if they did go a slow gallop, it would play to her strengths, as she's got an electrifying turn of foot," said Winston. "She got a bit tired in the last half-furlong, and six furlongs in this ground was a bit of a test for her. I think she got it well enough, and she's open to a bit of improvement." Assistant trainer Charlie Hills added, "She's shown a good turn of foot there and been really professional. She probably got a bit tired in the last half-furlong, which we expected, and we might look at the Lowther now. She saw out six furlongs well, but it's great to have speed. That's what it's all about. If she gets six furlongs well, she might get seven when she's a bit stronger. She settles well and gives herself every chance."

Brilliant Speed Works Toward Jim Dandy...

Live Oak's **Brilliant Speed** (Dynaformer), freshened off his third-place effort in the GI Belmont S. June 11, breezed five furlongs over Saratoga's main track yesterday morning as he prepares for Saturday's GII Jim Dandy S. Trained by Tom Albertrani, the 3-year-old colt stopped the clock in 1:02.69.

"We have been pleased with the way he has been training," said Albertrani. "We gave him a little time off and kept him in light training after the Belmont. I backed off his workouts. He has always been a light-framed horse, so we didn't have to do a lot with him. He appears fit, and he got a lot out of the work today. He broke off nice and easy. After the three-eighths pole, he picked it up and galloped out well. He came back in good shape."

A 19-1 upset winner of the GI Blue Grass S. in April, Brilliant Speed finished a solid seventh in the GI Kentucky Derby in his first dirt try before running 2 1/4 lengths adrift of Ruler on Ice (Roman Ruler) in the Belmont. "It looks like he's just getting better with every race, and I would certainly expect to see him run another good race," Albertrani added. "I've been happy with his last two races, the Belmont and the Derby; I couldn't fault the surface. Hopefully, he might improve a little more again, and this might be the next step toward the [GI] Travers [Aug. 27]."

Also likely for the Jim Dandy are: GII Peter Pan S. winner **Alternation** (Distorted Humor); **Moonshine Mullin** (Albert the Great), recent winner of the Victoria Park S. at Woodbine; GIII Matt Winn winner **Scotus** (Successful Appeal); Belmont runner-up **Stay Thirsty** (Bernardini); **Tech Fall** (Birdstone), fourth in the GII Dwyer S.; and either Dwyer winner **Dominus** (Smart Strike) or GI Preakness S. third-place finisher **Astrology** (A.P. Indy) from trainer Steve Asmussen's barn. Asmussen said he would likely send one of his 3-year-olds to Sunday's GI Haskell Invitational S. at Monmouth, and keep the other in Saratoga. Both sophomores are owned by Stonestreet Stables and George Bolton; Spendthrift Farm also owns a piece of Dominus. "They are both quality 3-year-olds with common ownership interests," added Asmussen, who didn't provide a timetable on when he'd make a decision. "We want to maximize both horses."

Justin Phillip, Wine Police Target Amsterdam...

While Steve Asmussen mulls splitting up Astrology and Dominus, he will send both **Justin Phillip** (First Samurai) and **Wine Police** (Speightstown) to the same race, the 6 1/2-furlong GII Amsterdam S. at Saratoga Aug. 1. The former, owned by Zayat Stables, enjoyed a break-out win in the seven-furlong GII Woody Stephens S. at Belmont June 11. Wine Police, owned by J. Kirk and Judy Robison, was tabbed a ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ when he beat Soldat (War Front) and Santiva (Giant's Causeway) in a 5 1/2-furlong maiden at Saratoga last July. Shelved off a third to Boys at Toscanova (Officer) in the GI Three Chimneys Hopeful S. in his next outing, Wine Police returned from the nine-month absence to register a sharp score in a Churchill NW1X June 11. "He's had three solid races [and] he likes Saratoga, so we have that going for him," said Asmussen. "He's done well since his race at Churchill. There are a lot of reasons why he should run well."

Van Hemel, Stranger to Spa, Readies the Troops...

Trainer Donnie Von Hemel doesn't start many at the Spa. In fact, it's been two decades since he last had a runner here. The Arlington Park-based horseman nonetheless could be poised for a big weekend at Saratoga when he saddles Pin Oak Stable homebred **Alternation** (Distorted Humor) in Saturday's GII Jim Dandy S., and **Caleb's Posse** (Posse) in the following Monday's GII Amsterdam S. ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ Alternation, winner of the GII Peter Pan S. at Belmont May 14, tuned up for the Jim Dandy yesterday, breezing five furlongs on Saratoga's main track under Ramon Dominguez in 1:01.78. "I thought he went well this morning," said Von Hemel. "He finished real good down the lane, and Ramon was happy. [He] said he was good and smooth, and everything is set for next weekend." Von Hemel revealed Alternation was briefly being considered for the GI Belmont S. "It was one of those things where we had to decide, did we want to try the Belmont, or just back off it and come and try a couple of races here, and we chose the latter," he said. "He got here on Monday, and we might let him gallop out or something before the race, but that's probably the last work."

Caleb's Posse, a well-beaten 12th in the GI Arkansas Derby in April, bounced back to win the GIII Ohio Derby June 4, then finished fourth in the GIII Iowa Derby June 25. "He just got crunched [in the Arkansas Derby]," said Von Hemel. "It wasn't right at the start, but it was within the first 100 yards, and he just got kind of spit out the back. He never put in much of a run that day, so we decided to give him a little breather after that race and went for the Ohio Derby and Iowa Derby, which he ran all right in, but the rest of the year the races are a mile and an eighth, mostly, so we decided to start sprinting him again. We'll see how we do in the Amsterdam." **Cont. p10**

Caleb's Posse hasn't raced at a distance less than a mile since taking last November's seven-furlong Clever Trevor S. at Remington Park. Ironically, that was the last horse Von Hemel brought to Saratoga--20 years ago. The Oklahoma-bred finished second to Easy Goer in the 1989 GI Travers S., then returned two years later to be third in the '91 Forego H. "Clever Trevor ran huge in the Travers, but he just wasn't quite good enough that day," said Von Hemel. "He came back and finished third a couple years later in the Forego, and that's been the extent of my Saratoga."

The 2009 G1 Grand Prix de Paris victor hit the board in last term's G1 Grosser Preis von Baden--his only previous visit to Germany--and lines up coming off a second in the Listed Fred Archer S. at Newmarket June 25. **Dandino** has made steady progress through the ranks, earning a career high in the Apr. 30 G2 Jockey Club S. at Newmarket, and was a last-out fourth in the June 3 G1 Coronation Cup at Epsom. The home team boasts a sturdy defense, led by the 2009 G1 Preis der Diana victress **Night Magic**, who also bagged the Sept. 5 G1 Grosser Preis von Baden. She suffered defeat at the hands of **Scalo** in the Sept. 26 G1 Preis von Europa at Cologne and May 8 G2 Gerling-Preis, but comes here on a high following success in the June 5 G2 Grosser Preis der Badischen Unternehmen back at Baden-Baden. Germany's reigning Horse of the Year **Scalo** backed up his Gerling-Preis triumph with a second in the G1 Gran Premio di Milano last time June 12.

TO THE EDITOR

When I read the article that reported Gulfstream Park wanted to discontinue the use of Lasix (*TDN* 7/20), I was left with one question. Why?

Having been on the backstretch since 1974, I remember what it was like racing without Lasix. There were those horsemen who would draw their horses for 24 to 48 hours, which meant no feed, no bedding, no water. There were all kinds of remedies, from the benign to the banal, none of which the betting public knew of. I remember the despair of having a horse that bled with no treatment that was legal. Then came the legalization of Lasix, a treatment that mitigated the effects of EIPH, that was regulated by the racing commission, and reported to the public so they could take its use into consideration when wagering. Now we want to get rid of it with out offering any other treatments or really knowing the effect of Lasix on modern racing. Are you kidding me?

Some would argue that it is harmful to the soundness of the Thoroughbred and distorts the genetic integrity of the gene pool by allowing animals into said pool that would otherwise have been excluded. Nonsense. One can trace the degradation of the modern Thoroughbred to the post Korean War era--this was when the number of registered foals in North America topped 10,000, and peaked in the mid '80s around 51,000. This was when animals were allowed to breed that had previously been excluded. No longer were soundness, performance and pedigree the hallmarks of reproduction, but rather, the commercial viability of the offspring reduced centuries of sound breed management to an afterthought.

No one knew then if there was a genetic component to EIPH, and we still don't know today whether there has been a genetic change that has increased the severity of EIPH. We don't know if horses bleed at a greater incidence or any more severely than they did then because nobody was all that worried about it then, and the endoscope was not yet a routine feature of veterinary medicine. It may be that the drive to commercialization stopped the exclusion of underperforming racing stock, which underperformed because of bleeding with no one knowing it. This may have led to the unwitting greater distribution of a defect in the genetic make-up of the horse than in the past. This supposition may be correct, but we don't need to withdraw the use of Lasix to deal with it.

The fact is we just don't know why bleeding is such a problem today. Have environmental changes exposed horses to greater respiratory damage than in the past? Has respiratory illness become more virulent, causing greater damage to the airways, thus leading to greater incidence and severity of EIPH? These are questions

that need to be addressed before action is taken.

Some have suggested that unsoundness can be attributed to Lasix. Show me the evidence, I say. There are so many other changes in the way the modern Thoroughbred is raised that to identify raceday Lasix as the pre-eminent cause of the decline of the modern Thoroughbred is laughable. I seriously doubt Citation received anabolic steroids so that he would look more mature as a yearling; it seems unlikely that 2-year-olds in the '60s were treated to the kinds of anti-inflammatory steroids juveniles today get routinely. Horses were never hotheaded for sales--the list of significant variables is long. There are so many changes in the way horses are raised today that to start by banning Lasix as the cure for what ails this business is insane.

Lastly, before we summarily dismiss Lasix, lets consider the hue and cry that will occur when animals whose economic viability was preserved by Lasix no longer have a safe, legal treatment to help keep them racing. This action will make a significant percentage of the horse population no longer economically viable. I hope those who advocate the immediate withdrawal of the use of Lasix are prepared to help care for them.

Since most studies show Lasix is helpful in dealing with EIPH, let's take that away while we have done nothing to reduce the genetic component of EIPH, (which still needs to be conclusively demonstrated). But, even worse if the cause of EIPH is environmental, let's leave horsemen with nothing to mitigate the severity of a condition that at its worst is fatal. This is akin to telling people with a inheritable disease, "Even though we have a drug to make your condition liveable, we think that it is everyone's best interests if we summarily remove you from the gene pool and leave you to fend for yourself."

All I ask is, before we do something so drastic as to take away Lasix, let's take a step back, and identify the causes of EIPH with proper epidemiological studies. Identify the genetic and environmental conditions that are the causes of EIPH, and then deal with them.

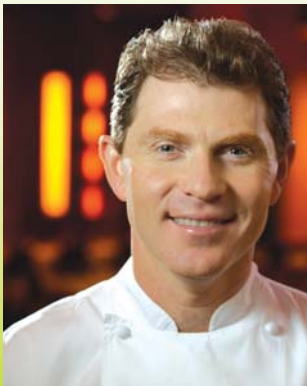
Have we learned nothing from Santa Anita's rash removal of its dirt track for something that was better, which turned out not to be better, which was subsequently replaced by the old villain that was now thought to be the best, but it appears, judging by the breakdowns this winter, that maybe the new old thing was not so great either. In other words, we don't need another farce, but maybe some thoughtful introspection with reasoned responses. EIPH was not created overnight, and will not be solved overnight with idiotic knee jerk solutions. In the long run, the removal of Lasix could be in the best interests of racing, but before we get to that point, much work needs to be done. Let's find solutions to the causes of EIPH, not remove the only viable treatment for a very serious condition.

IN EXCESS PENSIONED Leading California sire **In Excess (Ire)** (Siberian Express--Kantado {Ire}, by Saulingo {GB}) has been pensioned due to a decline in fertility. According to *Daily Racing Form*, the 24-year-old got just four mares in foal this year at Vessel Stallion Farm in Bonsal, California. He stood for \$12,500. Purchased privately by Jack Munari and trained by Bruce Jackson, the Irish-bred bay captured the GIII Volante H. and GIII San Gabriel H. on turf before turning into a monster on dirt. He put together a winning sequence in the GI Metropolitan H., GI Suburban H., GI Whitney H. and GI Woodward S. in 1991, but lost out on Eclipse Award honors after finishing ninth in the GI Breeders' Cup Mile on grass. His best race at five was a half-length loss when third in the GI Carter H. in 1992, and he retired with a record of 25-11-2-3 and earnings of \$1,739,322. Indian Charlie emerged from his second crop and captured the 1998 GI Santa Anita Derby. He was also third in the GI Kentucky Derby before developing into of the nation's most popular stallions. In Excess also sired G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches heroine Musical Chimes and GI Hollywood Starlet S. winner Romance is Diane, as well as graded stakes winners Above Perfection, Excessivepleasure, Icantgoforthat, Icecoldbeeratreds, In Excessive Bull, Notional, Romanceishope and Uncle Denny. From 16 crops of racing age, In Excess has been represented by 56 black-type winners (6%). His progeny have earned over \$41 million thus far.
