## IN A LEAGUE OF HIS OWN

Billed as the "Duel on the Downs" and a match race beforehand, yesterday's G1 Qipco Sussex S. proved a one-horse affair, with **Frankel (GB)** (Galileo {Ire}) at his devastating best as he refused to give **Canford Cliffs (Ire)** (Tagula {Ire}) a look-in. Despite the initial

reluctance of Tom Queally to lead, the 8-13 favorite found himself in front after the first furlong and had already shaken off the attentions of his main rival passing the quarter pole. Striding clear as Canford Cliffs drifted markedly left under pressure, the homebred powered to the line to win by five lengths and

stretch his unbeaten record to eight in front of an appreciative Goodwood crowd. Afterwards, he earned the ultimate plaudit from connections, who also pledged to keep him in training in 2012. **Cont. p2**

## CREATING MORE MEMORIES

Phillips Racing Partnership's **Winter Memories** (El Prado {Ire}) exacted her revenge on **More Than Real** (More Than Ready), overcoming a bit of traffic before streaking home a much-the-best winner of the GII Lake George S. at Saratoga. A troubled runner-up to More Than Real in the GII BC Juvenile Fillies Turf last November, the gray was up in the final jump to land the GIII Appalachian S. in her seasonal debut at Keeneland Apr. 21 and drilled the competition by three lengths in the GII Sands Point S. at Belmont May 30. Content to

trail here for the opening six panels, Winter Memories moved in tandem with More Than Real on the turn, but was forced to steady in behind horses nearing the stretch. Steered out to the grandstand side a few strides thereafter, she turned on the afterburners and stormed past **Bellamy Star** (Bellamy Road) for another convincing victory. Prior to Royal Ascot, few ventured that Frankel would find a rival to match his immense talent for the immediate future with the memory of his 2000 Guineas performance burning brightly. In just over an hour on the opening day of the Berkshire meeting, that faith had begun to be shaken with the Juddmonte star just holding on at the end of the G1 St James's Palace S. and Canford Cliffs dethroning Goldikova (Ire) (Anabaa) in style in the G1 Queen Anne S. With the Hannon stable subsequently banging the drum for their five-time Group 1 winner, Frankel and Canford Cliffs were initially inseparable in the ante-post market leading up to this hype-fest. Only in the latter stages of the build-up did the margin start to widen in the betting, with Sir Henry Cecil and Tom Queally's quiet confidence seeping through. That staunch belief in their colt translated into a performance for the ages in a race won by the likes of Brigadier Gerard (GB), Kris (GB), Giant's Causeway and Rock of Gibraltar (Ire). Despite having no pace to aim at exiting the gates, Frankel was not as keen as he had been in his earlier races and soon settled once Queally accepted the situation and let him stride on. Frankel was gliding over the undulating terrain of these Downs, in contrast to the workmanlike Canford Cliffs, who was never able to get within two lengths, and the sense of inevitability was growing by the time he reached the final quarter. His chief foe was in trouble there before he started his wayward drift under Richard Hughes, and Frankel surged on without his rider needing to use the whip. "He's absolutely amazing and is a freak," Queally said. "He's got that turbo, and he settled well today and gradually picked himself up furlong by furlong. He was rolling before I wanted him to, but that's often the case. He was amazing today, and I'm just very fortunate to be playing a small part in it." **Cont. p3**

At the end of the day, Frankel got his way and was allowed to bowl along up front, but that's not exactly how connections drew it up. "Plan A would have been having him in behind, but the main thing was to get him to settle, so I used my initiative and, thankfully, it worked out," Queally reported. "I kept squeezing away and he kept finding--he made the other horses look ordinary, and they are very good. He liked the track and

does a lot of it by himself. I could feel the revs building up and I was thankful of the barrier in the pull-up area in the end. He is growing up and, even though I went a bit quicker to post today, he bowed his head and did everything nicely. He stays well, has a turn of foot and ticks all the boxes, so from a jockey's point of view, he is flawless--that performance speaks for itself. When you ride a horse of this calibre,

people watch everything you do, and I have to deal with that. I think I do it quite well, and I wouldn't swap it for anything." Khalid Abdullah added, "I was expecting that he was going to win, as Henry thought he was better than ever, and he was right. We haven't decided on plans, as I would like to talk to Henry, but probably we will go to Ascot for the [Oct. 15] G1 Queen Elizabeth II S." Cecil, who received his customary three cheers in the paddock from the crowd who had also voiced their appreciation as the star colts went to post, later confirmed that mile contest as the target before being put away ahead of a four-year-old campaign. "I am not being facetious, but I did think he could win very easily, and I wanted to let him do the talking, as I did respect the second horse an awful lot," Cecil said. "I've got to thank the Prince and all those involved with him--his work rider Shane Featherstonehaugh and Bullet Train (GB) (Sadler's Wells), his three-parts brother, who has led him all year. I don't know about the days of the match races and Tudor Minstrel, but I would think he's the best in my lifetime. You get that feeling as things go along. He really wants to please and does it so fast--he's just a brilliant horse. It was like a dentist's appointment, but I haven't had all my teeth taken out and am still here, so it's been a marvelous day." Paying his colt perhaps the highest compliment, Cecil also chimed in. "I think he's the best I've ever seen and compares with Blushing Groom at his best and Shergar."

Frankel's performance is set to propel him to clear-best in the world in the official rankings. Having gone into the race as the joint top-rated performer alongside Black Caviar (Aus) (Bel Esprit {Aus}), he is set to eclipse that brilliant sprinter when the decision is made next week. Dominic Gardiner-Hill, the British Horseracing Authority's senior mile handicapper, said, "My initial reaction is that this performance will undoubtedly put him top of the world rankings. He's proven today that he's a 130-plus horse. In my opinion, he is worth at least 132 and very possibly more, but this will have to be discussed with our international colleagues before his position in the World Thoroughbred Rankings is confirmed." The success also took Cecil and Queally to the head of the QIPCO British Champions Series trainers' and jockeys' tables respectively. **Cont. p4**

**Taking Stock...**

Canford Cliffs, who was looking for a sixth consecutive top-level win, had connections scratching their heads afterwards. Following his alarming drift in the closing stages, trainer Richard Hannon was befuddled. "Hughesie said he was beaten three out, and what made him go across the track like that, I don't know," he said. "He also drifted in the Greenham last year, but I don't think this is his track, as he doesn't like going downhill. We scoped him and blood-tested him and everything is perfect inside, so the winner is probably a very good horse. I wouldn't be afraid to have another go on a decent track. We'll have to go home and rethink it, but I'm sure it's due to the racecourse and there is plenty of season left." Hughes told *PA Sport*, "I don't want to make any excuses. Frankel is a brilliant horse and he was the best horse on the day. My lad didn't move great and he didn't really stretch and hung badly. I was off the bridle today five furlongs out. I know Frankel was bowling along going a good gallop, but I've never known Canford Cliffs off the bridle in the middle of a race. The only time he has hung is when he has got beat, and we thought all that was behind him. It definitely wasn't a 100% run." Godolphin's Racing Manager Simon Crisford said of Rio de la Plata, "We are as proud as punch with his third here, which we expected and we thought was better than going to Germany to have a winning chance in a Group 1 there. When you are talking about a race at this level, he is very good, but not that good. The winner is a superstar, and we are all very lucky to be here to see him. When a good horse like Rio de la Plata comes into this with an official rating of 120 and is comprehensively beaten, it shows how good these horses are, and sets the standard for British racing. Certainly in all our years and for many to come, we see Frankel as a fantastic horse and it was scintillating to watch. We all loved it and it was what racing is all about."

Chandlery started out with a short-head defeat of his smart stable companion and subsequent dual winner Coupe de Ville (Ire) (Clodovil {Ire}) in a six-furlong maiden here June 3 before running 11th in the G2 Coventry S. at Royal Ascot June 14. Bouncing back with a second to Red Duke in the G2 Superlative S. over this trip at Newmarket last time July 9, the bay took advantage of a three-pound pull with that rival to reverse form and lead home a one-two for the Hannon stable here. In front from the outset, he kept up the gallop under Richard Hughes, as Red Duke found trouble in behind inside the final quarter, and in the end, had a comfortable advantage over his stable companion Rockinante, with the luckless Red Duke crossing the line under hand riding. "He is a straightforward horse, but was a bit keen going down to the start, and so I put him in front and he had a look and settled lovely," Hughes explained. "He was up in the air with 1 1/2 furlongs to run, but really lengthened after that, and has a huge stride on him. He has definitely improved since the Superlative and he'll get a mile, no doubt." Trainer Richard Hannon added, "He's a good horse and so is the second. This race re-opened, and we swapped Rougemont (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}) for this one, so that was the right decision. I told Hughesie to let him use himself, as he gallops from end to end. We'll run him in the DBS Premier Yearling S. [at York Aug. 18] next."

**Goodwood Cup cont.**

Last year's G1 Sandown Classic third **Manighar** bids to build on a latest fourth in the G1 Gold Cup at Royal Ascot June 16, where **Opinion Poll** was two places ahead. Manighar's trainer Luca Cumani told *PA Sport*, "The drop back in trip will help, as two miles is absolutely spot-on for him. He's in good form, and there are a lot of runners in the race, so we're going to need a bit of luck in running." Opinion Poll had his favored rain-softened conditions to help his cause at the Royal meeting, but showed that he handled quicker footing when taking the G2 Lonsdale Cup over this trip last August. Conditioner Mahmood Al Zarooni is hoping he can register a first win in the Royal blue, having joined the operation from Michael Jarvis at the end of last year. "I think that he has improved since Royal Ascot," he commented. "His last piece of work was very pleasing, and he has run well at Goodwood before, so the course should be no problem. He ran very well in the Gold Cup, but the step back to two miles will suit him." **Red Cadeaux** proved he was a stayer on the upgrade when winning by nine lengths in the G3 Curragh Cup over 14 furlongs last time June 25. "Red Cadeaux obviously enjoyed the rain-softened ground when he sluiced home in The Curragh Cup," trainer Ed Dunlop said. "But he does not necessarily need a mudbath, and I think he will be fine on the ground. He stays two miles well, and there are precious few options for a horse like him, so we have decided to throw our hat in the ring."

# NTRA REPORT FROM CAPITOL HILL



## BOEHNER FOCUSES ON SPENDING CUTS

House Speaker John Boehner (R-OH) released a two-part plan to address the nation's debt ceiling crisis with a focus on spending cuts rather than tax increases. Earlier discussions on a resolution involved a wide variety of tax reforms, including those that would affect the horse racing industry.

Originally set for a House vote on Wednesday, Republican leaders now have postponed action on Boehner's plan until Thursday at the earliest due to inaccuracies found by the Congressional Budget Office (CBO) in the amount of the spending cuts.

The first part of Boehner's plan immediately provides cuts in government spending over the next 10 years (target is \$1 billion) and an increase in the debt ceiling that will permit the United States to borrow until February 2012.

The second part of the plan calls for creation of a 12-member bipartisan Joint Committee of Congress that would establish comprehensive legislation by November 23, 2011. This resulting legislation must reduce spending by at least \$1.8 trillion over the next 10 years and, if enacted, would permit the President to increase the debt limit by an additional \$1.6 trillion. The NTRA will actively monitor the work of the Joint Committee should the Committee consider tax reforms as part of its legislation.

**Riding the Money Train...**

Fresh Start Stable's **J J's Lucky Train** (Silver Train) heads to the big leagues in Sunday's GI Haskell Invitational S. exactly one year after debuting with a professional-looking 2 1/2-length win versus \$40,000 maiden claimers at Monmouth Park July 31.

Halted from his unveiling by conditioner Bill Anderson off owner Jeff Heslep and trainer Edward Plesa Jr., the \$35,000 FTMMAY juvenile graduate has gone to earn more than \$300,000 for his new connections, anchored by wins in Laurel's Miracle Wood S. Feb. 26 ([video](#)) and the GIII Bay Shore S. at Aqueduct Apr. 9 ([video](#)). What was so appealing about the firster out of Delta Sensation (Thunder Gulch), SW & GSP, \$167,226, that led Anderson to fill out the claim slip that day?

"Pretty much everything," Anderson replied. "I watched the videos of when he worked at the Maryland sale and I liked his pedigree. He was a real good-looking individual."

J J's Lucky Train has finished off the board only once in nine subsequent attempts since changing hands, a sixth-place finish at second asking in last term's GIII Sapling S. Sept. 4. Anderson is willing to take the blame for that sub-par performance.

"I thought the race that I claimed him out of was a very good race," Anderson explained of his reasoning at taking a swing at the Sapling. "He was training great and we thought he deserved a shot. Obviously, that's the only race he's really run bad for us. I looked at the race and thought that there was a lot of speed in it. We tried to take a hold of him and take him off the pace, but he got dirt in his face and just ran real green. It was a tactical error on my part that he ran so bad."

J J's Lucky Train has done little wrong since. The dark bay got back on track with a sharp starter allowance score at Monmouth Oct. 9, then added a first-level allowance negotiating two turns for the first time at Philly Park in his seasonal finale Nov. 13. Is it safe to say that the former claimer has exceeded expectations?

"Absolutely," said Anderson, who has an eight-horse string split between Monmouth and Philadelphia. "I thought we had a good horse, but there was no way of knowing that he'd turn out this good. That's why I put him in the Sapling. He's obviously gone on to be more than I thought he could be."

J J's Lucky Train rolled a pair of two's to kick off his sophomore campaign in Aqueduct's Count Fleet S. Jan. 1 and Whirlaway S. Feb. 5. He was favored at 8-5 over subsequent GI Wood Memorial S. hero Toby's Corner (Bellamy Road) in the latter.

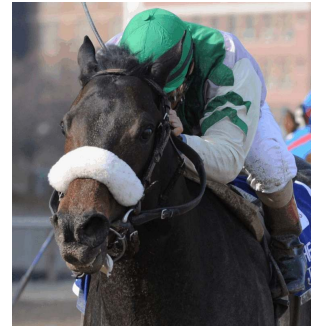
Turned back to one turn for the remainder of the year, the Kentucky-bred put together hard-fought 1/4-length victories in the aforementioned Miracle Wood and Bay Shore, then placed a credible third in the GIII Cliff's Edge Derby Trial S. at Churchill Downs Apr. 30. J J's Lucky Train heads to the Jersey Shore's main event following a runner-up effort going seven furlongs over a saturated Belmont main course in the GII Woody Stephens S. June 11. He hasn't routed since the Whirlaway.

"That is a concern of mine," Anderson said of his charge going nine furlongs for the first time. "It will all depend on how the race sets up. If [jockey] Paco [Lopez] can get him to relax, he thinks he can [get the distance]. There's plenty of other speed in the race. Hopefully, he can get him to relax and maybe sit just off the lead." **Cont. p11**


He continued, "[He's training] real good. He galloped 1 1/2-miles [Tuesday] morning, and we let him pick it up the last five eighths, and he went real well. He likes Monmouth and just bounces over the track. He's doing well."

Anderson trains the Haskell hopeful on behalf of long-time clients Jay Schnoor, Anthony Knapp, Brett Lief and Jack Larkin.

"We've got some 2-year-olds and a couple of other horses," Anderson said of the Fresh Start Stable ownership group. "Most of the guys I've had for a number of years. They've been involved in other partnerships that we've put together. I've been here in New Jersey since 1979 and the owners are all also from here. It would be a great thrill to win the Haskell at Monmouth." -SS

J C's Pride breezed an eighth in [:10.1](#) at Fasig-Tipton's Midlantic Sale and wound up selling to Joseph Bucci for \$200,000. The chestnut got right to work at Belmont a few weeks later and went postward as the 2-1 second choice in his July 1 opener. The 3-5 favorite that day was Overdriven (Tale of the Cat), who scored by 3 1/2 lengths, but runner-up J C's Pride wound up 13 lengths clear of the others ([video](#)), and that effort looked pretty solid when Overdriven went on to land the GII Sanford S. at Saratoga last Sunday. The bettors made J C's Pride 1-5 this time, and the colt was up to the task. After an alert start from the three hole, he was quickly in front, and was moving effortlessly through splits of :21.87 and :44.65 over an admittedly glib Saratoga surface. J C's Pride turned for home under a motionless Jose Lezcano and kept up a steady beat to establish a new track record, lowering the previous mark by 0.17 seconds. "[Lezcano] said if he bore down on him at the eighth pole, he would have went in :55," said winning trainer Bobby Barbara. "I'm glad he didn't. He's a really nice colt. He's a sweetheart; he's like an old horse. He does everything so right. He handles himself with a lot of class." J C's Pride, whose winning dam is a half-sister to the solid turf performers Blind Date (Not for Love) and Sales Tax (High Yield), was also a \$190,00 KEENOV weanling and \$90,000 KEESEP yearling. Bucci, who founded the upstate New York-based American Rock Salt company, has been in the racing game for a few years. "I've trained for him for five or six years, but he decided this winter that he'd try to get some better horses, so we bought four at Midlantic," explained Barbara, who also expects bigger things from another Bucci colorbearer, the 4-year-old Avenging Spirit (Tapit). The affable conditioner was high on J C's Pride from the beginning. "I thought he'd win first time out, then run in the Sanford," Barbara recalled. "That was until Todd [Pletcher] brought Overdriven to the paddock. I thought that horse looked like the real McCoy, so I guess it's okay that we ran second." Barbara indicated that no decision has been made yet as to where the stylish colt will run next. "We'll see how he comes out of it and talk about it," he said. The winner's dam, Hi Lili, has a Tapit yearling filly. No report was filed after the mare was bred back to Henny Hughes, but she was covered by Lookin At Lucky this past spring. ### J C'S PRIDE (Henny Hughes)

J C's Pride is one of 14 runners in the burgeoning racing stable of New York native Joe Bucci. Bucci is co-founder and co-CEO of American Rock Salt Company, a salt mining company based in Hampton Corners, New York.

Growing up in a mining town in western New York, horses were always part of Bucci's life, and it was a natural progression to racehorse ownership.

"Western New York is big foxhunting country," Bucci said from Saratoga yesterday. "And I used to travel around with my uncle who had harness horses. I live in a rural area and ever since I was young I was interested in horses. I rode a lot as a youngster and I still do. Then about 10 years ago I got into Thoroughbreds through friends of mine."

In addition to his racing stable, Bucci has three broodmares on his 300-acre farm in upstate New York. He sends the mares to be bred in Kentucky before returning to New York to foal.

Bucci has been gradually increasing his stable recently. "I guess I like the excitement," he explained with a chuckle.

**Avenging Spirit** (Tapit) was acquired by Bucci for \$100,000 out of the 2008 Keeneland September sale. The 4-year-old has won three of his last four starts, including two straight allowance efforts at Belmont Park, and Bucci calls the gelding his best horse to date.

"Avenging Spirit is really doing well now," Bucci said. "He will probably run in a stakes race in his next start. He would be my first stakes horse." Pause. "But this one might beat him to it, the way he is going."

J C's Pride is one of four horses Bucci purchased out of the Fasig-Tipton Midlantic sale in May. He gave all of the credit for picking the colt out to Bobby Barbara, who has been training his horses for the last six years.

"I didn't have anything to do with it," Bucci offered. "I thought he was impressive-looking, but, I have to be honest with you, sometimes they all look alike to me."

J C's Pride is named after a childhood friend.

"I grew up in a mining town with 99 houses," Bucci recalled. "I've stayed close to the people I grew up with because that is what I do--I am one of the owners of a salt mine now. This kid that I grew up with in the mining town is named Johnny Cichelli. He is retired and comes to the farm everyday and helps out. We had a horse named after him, but we had to put [the horse] down after he shattered a leg kicking a fence. So when we went to the sale, I said, 'The best horse at the sale, I'll name him after you again.' We couldn't use the same name, so we named him J C's Pride."

Bucci was at his farm watching as Overdriven (Tale of the Cat) strode home first in Sunday's GII Sanford S. Knowing his colt had run second to that runner in his July 1 debut gave his owner plenty of confidence going into yesterday's race, but Bucci admitted he was still surprised by J C's Pride's big effort.

"I thought he was going to win, but I didn't think he was going to win as easy as he did--with the jockey just riding him and not having to go to the whip," Bucci smiled. "[Cichelli] is here with me [at Saratoga] and we got pretty emotional--you've got to remember we grew up in a mining town, where every house was owned by a company. This is a long way from there."

**The Factor, Brigand Possible for Spa Appearances:**

**The Factor** (War Front), unraced since a seventh as the odds-on favorite in the GI Arkansas Derby Apr. 16, is currently being pointed for a start in the GI Foxwoods King's Bishop S. at Saratoga Aug. 27, trainer Bob Baffert told *Daily Racing Form*. Accorded "TDN Rising Star" status off a track-record setting maiden win last Dec. 26, the grey took the GII San Vicente S. over the King's Bishop distance of seven furlongs Feb. 20 prior to a 6 1/4-length success in the GII Rebel S. Mar. 19 in his first attempt at a route of ground. This past May, The Factor was diagnosed with a hairline fracture of his left hind ankle, but was on the Del Mar worktab Tuesday, going an easy half-mile in :49. "It's a possibility," Baffert said of the King's Bishop. "I'm trying [to make the race]." Stable companion **Brigand** (Flatter) is also a candidate to make the trans-continental trip to the Spa, as he is a "better horse on dirt," Baffert told *DRF*. The \$925,000 topper at this year's OBS March sale, Brigand broke his maiden at first asking before finishing runner-up in the GIII Hollywood Prevue S. on two weeks' rest July 17.
