'CALEB' DELIVERS AMSTERDAM VICTORY

Caleb's Posse (Posse), overlooked at 12-1 by the Saratoga faithful, made the most of a contentious early pace to lead his connections to the promised land with a four-length victory over **Redeemed** (Include) in Monday's GII Amsterdam S. Camped at the back of the pack as 3-1 choice **Arch Traveler** (Sky Mesa) and **To**

Honor and Serve (Bernardini) carved out an opening quarter in :22.45, the Donnie Von Hemel trainee was ahead of only one rival--the sluggish starting **Travelin Man** (Trippi)--before swinging out five wide turning for home. Ready to roll at the top of the lane, he was firing on all pistons to sweep to the front midstretch and strode clear to post the upset as the longest shot on the board. "It seemed like there was some

speed in the race," said winning rider Rajiv Maragh. "My horse is definitely a closer, I was just hoping not to get disconnected early and have enough late to run. I felt like I had a lot of horse and I just didn't want to get impeded by any means, so I took him to the clear and he kicked home really strong." **Cont. p2**

SNOW FAIRY IS YORKSHIRE OAKS BOUND

Ed Dunlop yesterday pointed to the Aug. 18 G1 Darley Yorkshire Oaks for **Snow Fairy (Ire)** (Intikhab). Beaten two lengths by arch-rival **Middy (GB)** (Oasis Dream {GB}) in Saturday's G1 Nassau S. at Glorious Goodwood, she will renew rivalry with the Juddmonte star in York's 12-furlong contest. "Middy beat us three lengths in last year's Yorkshire Oaks, so we are getting closer to her," Dunlop said. "The best filly on the day won at Goodwood, but Snow Fairy has always been better when asked to quicken off a strong pace, and they went very slow early on in the Nassau. [Jockey] Frankie [Dettori] is adamant that she will come on again for this race, so we are getting there and we could take on Middy again at York. There is the Breeders' Cup, Japan and Hong Kong--everything is in the mix."

DOBSON INVESTS IN 3 CHIMNEYS STALLIONS

Soon after Caleb's Posse's victory in yesterday's GII Amsterdam S. at Saratoga, it was announced that Everett Dobson--whose Cheyenne Stables is a part owner of the colt--has invested as a minority partner in Three Chimneys Stallions LLC. Dobson's investment does not include Three Chimneys Farm or any of their other lines of business, which include consignment, boarding and bloodstock management. "With this injection of new capital, we have strengthened our ability to continue to compete for top new stallions," said Three Chimneys President Case Clay. **Cont. p2**

Spa Showdown...

Gallant in defeat was runner-up Redeemed, who also settled off the early pace, but lacked the needed punch to overtake the winner. "I really wanted to be on the speed or right behind the lead, but when the dirt hit us, he reacted to it, and we ended up a little further behind than I wanted," said jockey Edgar Prado. "He was jumping up and down from the dirt on the turn, but once he figured it out, he finished full of run in the stretch. I was very happy with the effort. I definitely think he is stakes caliber." Caleb's Posse, third in the one-mile GIII Arlington Washington Futurity at two, added a score in the Nov. 6 Clever Trevor S. over seven furlongs. He launched 2011 with a score in the one-mile Smarty Jones S. at Oaklawn Jan. 17 before finishing sixth in the GIII Southwest S. Feb. 21. Runner-up in the Mar. 19 GII Rebel S., he failed to recover from a rough start in the Apr. 16 GI Arkansas Derby and had to settle for 12th. Coming from off the pace to take the the GIII Ohio Derby at Thistledown June 4, Caleb's Posse mounted a mild bid in the stretch of latest start and finished fourth--beaten 8 3/4 lengths--in the 1 1/16-mile GIII Iowa Derby at Prairie Meadows June 25. "If you looked at his races last year, he's a capable sprinter that we were stretching out, because of the opportunities the 3-year-olds have through the spring," explained trainer Donnie Von Hemel. "It turned out that maybe we should have been sprinting before now. I think we had exhausted what we could do going long and we were going to end up fourth or fifth in some of those graded races the rest of the year. It was an experiment that had a good chance, considering his pedigree, to succeed." Intent on keeping the colt sprinting, Von Hemel added, "[The GI Foxwoods King's Bishop Aug. 27] is a conversation we'll have to have with the ownership. It looks like it will be a little tough for him in that group also, but with the way he performed today, maybe he can handle that, too."

Jenny's So Great, a winner sprinting on the Polytrack for a \$40,000 tag last July, scored against opening company while trying seven panels over this turf course Aug. 5. Runner up going a mile in the Aug. 28 Ontario Colleen S., she was a well-beaten sixth in the nine-furlong GII Canadian S., but came back to score in the Carotene S. against Ontario-breds Oct. 3. Stepping up in company for the GIII Valley View S. at Keeneland Oct. 22, she failed to land a blow and had to settle for eighth--beaten 9 1/4 lengths. In her 2011 reappearance, the Bill and Vicki Poston representative was second in a 6 1/2-furlong off-the-turf test here May 20 before coming through with a narrow score in the seven-furlong Zaracarta S. for Ontario breds on the sod June 18. Taking a stab at a route once more in her latest start, the 4-year-old was ninth in the nine-furlong GII Dance Smartly S. July 10. Content to drop to the back of the pack through an opening quarter in a quick :21.86, the bay still trailed the field turning for home. Threading her way through the pack midstretch, she powered to the fore late to collect her first graded win while geared down. Bred in Ontario by David Cassidy, the filly was purchased for \$53,000 at the 2009 Fasig-Tipton Midlantic Sale. "The major draw was that she was Canadian bred," said agent Buzz Chace, who signed the ticket on the filly. The Poston's also secured a half brother by Read The Footnotes at last summer's F-T New York-bred Sale at Saratoga.

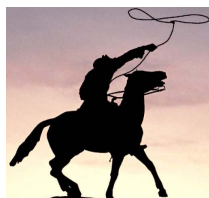

RACETRACK Round-Up

Middle Park Route for Watch...

Friday's G2 Richmond S. scorer **Harbour Watch (Ire)** (Acclamation {GB}) is likely to stay at six furlongs for the remainder of the term, with the G1 Middle Park S. high on his agenda, connections announced yesterday. Robin Heffer's unbeaten 2-year-old colt was the impressive 2 1/4-length winner of Goodwood's six-furlong contest, after which Sheikh Fahad Al Thani's Pearl Bloodstock purchased a 50% share. Trainer Richard Hannon said, "Harbour Watch is a tall colt who still has some strengthening up to do, and when he has filled his frame through the winter, we are confident that he'll get the mile. We don't need to think about a mile until next year, and, while we will consider trying seven furlongs in the Dewhurst, for the time being we will stick to what he is doing well just now, so carrying a three-pound penalty in the [Sept. 17] G2 Mill Reef S. at Newbury and/or then stepping up to Group 1 company for the [Oct. 8] Middle Park S. at Newmarket three weeks later is the logical route to take. He is one of the best that we have got, and he could go all the way."

Get Stormy Improves...

Dual Grade I winner **Get Stormy** (Stormy Atlantic), who skipped Saturday's GII Fourstardave S. after a small bump was detected on the edge of his right front tendon last Thursday, was given the green light and may return in the Aug. 26 GII Bernard Baruch H. "We scanned him again and everything looks clean," said trainer Tom Bush. "We'll probably be a little conservative and give him a couple more days of tack walking and jogging, but I think we're okay." As for the possibility of getting another crack at the Spa, Bush added, "The Bernard Baruch is not out of the question, but we'll just have to see how we do here for the next five or six days before we can really say for certain," Bush said. "On ultrasound, we seem to be in good shape, so hopefully it will stay that way." Winner of the GII Fourstardave S. and the GII Bernard Baruch S. at Saratoga last term, he took the Apr. 15 GI Maker's Mark Mile at Keeneland before adding the GI Woodford Reserve Turf Classic at Churchill Downs May 7. Most recently, he was third in the June 12 GIII Monmouth S.

EARLY NUMBERS UP AT DEL MAR *Edited Press release* On-track attendance, field size and purses showed accross the board increases at Del Mar as the seaside oval put its first two weeks of action into the record books Sunda. Most significant of the track's stats after two weeks was the 4.8-percent rise in attendance. The daily average attendance registered in at 20,737 after 10 of the track's scheduled 37 racing programs. Last year, Del Mar averaged 17,906 per afternoon, which was a 4.2 percent increase from 2009's daily average of 17,181. Overnight purses are the highest in Del Mar history and have led to an increase in field size at the track--to 8.3 horses-per-race from 8.1 in 2010. "We have the highest purses on a race-by-race comparative level of any track in the country," said Del Mar's Executive Vice President for Racing and Industry Relations Tom Robbins, who is also the racing secretary. "We are very proud of that and we appreciate the support of our horsemen in that regard. Despite real concerns about the number of racing days and the size of cards, we've run the same number of races (88) as we did through 10 days last year. That's no small feat in this current environment."

On to Midsummer Derby for Coil?

GI Haskell Invitational winner **Coil** (Point Given), scheduled to arrive at Saratoga today, will be considered for the Aug. 27 GI Travers S., according to trainer Bob Baffert. "We're going to give him a week and see how much energy he has before making a call," said Baffert. "The Travers is a strong possibility if I like what I see these next couple of weeks." Baffert added, "If he shows me what he was showing me leading up to this race, then he'll run. If he shows me he is on his game, he'll go." Accustomed to showing speed in the early going, the winner of the GIII Affirmed H. came from off the pace in Sunday's Monmouth feature to score by 5 1/2 lengths over **Shackleford** (Forestry).

"That [1 1/4-mile] distance [of the Travers] should not be a problem for him with his new running style," Baffert said. The GI Preakness S. hero, Shackleford appears to be no worse for wear following his runner-up finish behind Coil. "He came out of [the Haskell S.] real good," said trainer Dale Romans. "He comes back real quick." As for where that might be, Romans added, "We can run him in the Travers or the [Sept. 3 GI] Woodward [S.] against older horses. The obvious thing is to go in the Travers and take on the 3-year-olds, but then we've had a few discussions about the Woodward, which gives us an extra week; it's 1 1/8 miles, and we'd get a little bit of weight. It's something to look at."

Leonard Lavin's Glen Hill Farm continued its banner 2011 season Sunday with stakes success both as an owner and as a breeder. Just hours after the Glen Hill-owned **Marketing Mix** (Medaglia d'Oro) stormed to a 4 3/4-length initial stakes victory in the Wonder Where S. at Woodbine, **Coil**, bred by the Ocala-based farm, surged to victory in the GI Haskell Invitational S. at Monmouth Park.

Lavin, founder of the Alberto-Culver Company, purchased the 400-acre Glen Hill Farm in 1966. First under the tutelage of conditioner Willard Proctor, the

farm's runners are now trained by Proctor's son, Tom. Among the distinguished runners to carry the farm's orange, black and gold colors are Relaunch, Potentially, Carload, Media Plan and One Dreamer.

When Lavin's grandson Craig Bernick took over as Glen Hill president and CEO in 2008, he pledged to upgrade the farm's breeding program. If recent results are anything to go by, he is well on his way. Already in 2011, the farm has been represented by **Dilemma** (Grand Slam),

who got the year off to a rousing start with a win in the Jan. 1 Gill Daytona S., and **Banned** (Kitten's Joy), who scored back-to-back wins in the Gill American Turf S. and Gill Jefferson Cup S. before being narrowly beaten when second in the Gill Virginia Derby. Homebred **Broken Dreams** (Broken Vow) was runner-up in the Gill Monrovia S.

Haskell winner Coil began his racing career last October at Hollywood Park for Glen Hill and Proctor. The chestnut colt was third that day ([video](#)) in a race won by the Bob Baffert-trained Awesome Patriot (Awesome Again). A few days later, Bernick's phone was ringing.

"Baffert saw Coil in the paddock and called us a day or two later and offered to buy the horse," Bernick recalled. "Bob was admittedly chasing a Point Given. He told me that he thought Coil was the best Point Given that he had seen."

Coil's win in the Haskell for the ownership triumvirate of Mike Pegram, Karl Watson and Paul Weitman, does put the deal in a different light.

"At the time, what they offered us was a huge offer and we accepted it, but it's not a big offer anymore," Bernick laughed.

Glen Hill, which retains Coil's dam Eversmile (Theatrical {Ire}), can still reap benefits from the colt's exploits.

"We wouldn't do the same deal today, but it's nice to sell a horse to somebody like that because they get a

lot out of their horses," Bernick said. "We own the mare and she's young. She's got two fillies that we really like and she's back in foal. I would have rather won the Haskell ourselves, but the fact that we've got the

mare and we own the family and the mare is only 10, it's a great thing."

Eversmile was purchased by Glen Hill for \$275,000 out of the 2002 Keeneland September Yearling sale. She won just once in five starts, but with Coil, her second foal, she has proven her worth as a broodmare. The mare has an unraced 2-year-old filly by Eddington named Level Headed, and a yearling filly by Arch. Both will likely race in the Glen Hill colors.

"We really like the Eddington 2-year-old and we like the Arch yearling even better than the Eddington," Bernick reported. "We always liked them and we've got to like them even more now."

Eversmile is currently in foal to Kitten's Joy.

Glen Hill Farm's Marketing Mix gave a break-out performance in the Wonder Where S., the third leg of Canada's Triple Tiara series. The filly competed in both previous legs of the series, but put all the pieces together in her first turf appearance Sunday.

"The Canadian-bred purses are really huge," Bernick said. "And it was her last chance [to take advantage of that]. There were a bunch of races for 2-year-olds, but she had some problems and didn't make it to the races until she was three. We always thought she was a race or two behind

where she really needed to be in those races. So finally yesterday, we had her right and we always liked her against those horses. She finally put it together. Usually we don't throw maiden winners into stakes, but the money was so big, we were sort of unconventional in that, but it ended up working out."

Marketing Mix was acquired for \$150,000 out of the 2009 Keeneland September sale. Being an Ontario-bred was a nice bonus, but not a factor in the purchase, according to Bernick.

"[2009] was the year Medaglia d'Oro had all the big-priced fillies," Bernick explained. "Rachel Alexandra was a 3-year-old and we liked a bunch of them and ended up buying her. The Canadian-bred, that's an option if they can run, but you have to buy horses that you think can win open. If there is money to be made with the state-breds, that's OK. We've never had any success buying a horse just because he was a New York-bred or Canadian-bred or Cal-breds, or whatever. Usually it's about the horse and not where they are bred. But it does give you an option. If they can run, we'll find a spot for them."

Marketing Mix will head into open company and stay on the turf, with Arlington Park's Sept. 17 Gill Pucker Up S. next on the agenda. A win in that nine-furlong event could send the Ontario-bred filly on to Keeneland for the Oct. 15 GI Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup.

Long-term, the filly has earned a spot in the Glen Hill broodmare band.

"She cost \$150,000--which is good money, and she has a good pedigree in the third dam, but if she hadn't run she probably wouldn't have been good enough to be in the broodmare band because the first two dams are a little bit shaky," Bernick stated. "But now she's a stakes winner and hopefully she'll go on and get some graded races under her belt and down the road she'll definitely be in the broodmare band."

Glen Hill currently has a broodmare band of 33, as well as 26 horses in training. The operation's primary focus is on breeding to race, while purchasing a few select yearlings.

"We're trying to build the best broodmare band we can and we are racing focused," Bernick explained. "But my grandpa is 91--he's doing very well--but the more good broodmares we can get and the more valuable horses we can come up with, it certainly gives us options down the road as to what to do with the horses. But right now we are racing focused."

Bernick has been active at the yearling sales in recent years, but he admits he might not be quite as busy this year.

"This yearling crop is the first group of yearlings that I was responsible for the matings," he explained. "I think there was more of an urgency in the last couple of years on my part to buy some yearlings to supplement the homebreds. We've really significantly improved the quality of the stallions we bred to for the last three years, so we probably won't be as active as we have been. But we may look for a little more quality. Instead of buying 10, maybe buy four for the same price."

Taking charge of the family business might be a stressful proposition, but Bernick is clearly enjoying his role.

"Thankfully, I didn't have to take over the real family business, which is a shampoo company," he laughed. "I could just take over the fun business. It's been a great opportunity. And it's nice to be able to do it with my grandfather--we've always been close and we talk all the time. It's all I've ever wanted to do."

"My job is to just get better horses into the pipeline and to breed to better stallions, make sure to get the broodmare band as good as we can get and buy better horses at the sale," he continued. "Everything is in place, and if we bring better horses through the pipeline, we should be successful."

Whatever happens in the future, Bernick has every reason to appreciate the here and now.

"If we don't have fun now, we're not going to have fun," he said. "We have some nice horses and it seems like every Saturday or Sunday we have a horse with a big shot in a stakes. We're having a great year and it's very gratifying. A lot of the horses we bought the last couple of years and the homebreds, like Coil, are doing well. So it's been a really good seven months of the year." -*Jessica Martini*
