Trained by Neil Drysdale, the bay has been assigned post eight. Joe Talamo retains the mount. "I watched the Haskell, and it was really impressive the way Coil won, overcoming all

the trouble he did," Talamo told *Daily Racing Form*. "My horse has done really well since the Swaps, and obviously the way Coil won was encouraging for us. My horse galloped out so strong in his work the other day. I'm really excited about getting the chance to ride him back." The red-hot Bob Baffert sends Zayat Stables's GIII Iowa Derby hero **Prayer for Relief** (Jump Start) in the \$750,000 contest. He breaks from the rail with Rafael Bejarano aboard. Baffert won last year's West Virginia Derby with Concord Point (Tapit). **Infrattini** (Include), off since a second-place finish in the GIII Matt Winn S. at Churchill Downs June 18, is also in the field. The Z Thoroughbreds LLC colorbearer exits from stall two with Calvin Borel.

GROUND TO DETERMINE 'ENGELS' BID

Trainer David Brown is watching the weather as he prepares **Frederick Engels** (GB) (Iceman {GB}) for Sunday's G1 Keeneland Phoenix S. at The Curragh. Successful in the Listed Windsor Castle S. over five furlongs at Royal Ascot June 14 and G2 July S. over a furlong further at Newmarket July 7, the Pearl Bloodstock-owned colt was one of 14 remaining in the six-furlong contest at the six-day stage, along with the June 14 G2 Coventry S. winner **Power** (GB) (Oasis Dream {GB}) and June 26 G2 Railway S. victor **Lilbourne Lad** (Ire) (Acclamation {GB}). "If the ground is all right, it is our intention to go," Brown said. "I have no reason to suspect that he wouldn't handle soft ground, but, in my experience, he's such a good mover I'd ideally like to see him run on a bit of good ground. Good-to-firm would be better, as he'd really quicken up off that. It can get a bit sticky at the Curragh, and I don't think he'd like that. Johnny Murtagh will be riding him and he knows a bit about the Curragh. If the ground is not right, there is the G1 Prix Morny [at Deauville Aug. 21] and the G2 Gimcrack S. [at York Aug. 19]."

Monday, Three Chimneys announced that Everett Dobson, an owner of the NBA's Oklahoma City Thunder, was investing as a minority partner in their stallions. The TDN's Sue

Everett Dobson *Finley sat down with Dobson and Three Chimneys' Case Clay to discuss the partnership.*



Case Clay

TDN: You race horses under the Cheyenne Stables banner; how and why did you decide to get involved in the stallion side of the business?

ED: My investment strategy is very long-term investments and iconic brands. The stallion business has its ups and downs, but it'll be back and with Three Chimneys management, it was the perfect way for me to expand my involvement in the thoroughbred world.

TDN: You own your own farm in Central Kentucky, so why not stand your own stallions there? Why Three Chimneys?

ED: My primary focus is building up my commercial broodmare band. This partnership allows me to do just that. I love my nursery, but it's not necessarily suitable to have stallions there. As for why Three Chimneys? Three Chimneys is a world-class brand with some promising stallion prospects - and the Clays are great folks to be partners with.

TDN: How did this partnership come about? Why did you take a minority partner in your stallions?

CC: The Thunder made the Western Conference Finals this year and I figured it would be the best way for me to get invited to sit in Everett's floor seats! No really, the world of stallion recruitment has become very competitive and increased financial strength positions us to compete for the best. **Cont. p3**

TDN: Does this investment include all of the stallions?

CC: Yes, except for Dynaformer, who is 26. We felt that in order to have a real partnership, our goals needed to be perfectly aligned, so we included Everett in what we have built to date. I can't really imagine sitting here next year if Big Brown becomes champion 2-year-old sire and saying, 'Sorry about your luck, Everett.' Similarly, if we had left Point Given out, Everett would have not enjoyed the Haskell [Sunday] as much as we did!

TDN (to both): What are your short-term goals for the partnership?

CC: To recruit one or two top stallion prospects this year.

ED: Ditto

TDN: And in the longer-term?

CC: We have 14 stallion stalls with 11 stallions. We have no plans to have more than 14 stallions, so we want each new stallion to really count. From year to year, a balance of top veterans, top young stallions and promising stallion-prospects is the goal.

ED: Continue the quality and boutique approach that has served Three Chimneys so well over many years.

TDN: Do you have an eye on someone right now you'd like to tell us about?

CC: You're awfully cheeky, Sue! We're watching all the major races!

TDN: Can other people still invest in your stallions?

CC: Since the stallion barn was built, we have had shareholders in our stallions, from Seattle Slew to Dynaformer. Many of the world's leading breeders are in our stallion syndicates now and we will continue to welcome them in the future.

'Rain' Added to Diana Field...

Dancing Rain (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) will seek a second Oaks success this Sunday after connections supplemented her for the G1 Preis der Diana at Dusseldorf. The chestnut was fifth in the July 17 G1 Irish Oaks following her victory in the June 3 Epsom Classic, and owners Martin and Lee Taylor yesterday paid the €40,000 fee to add the William Haggas trainee to the €400,000 contest. Also supplemented was the June 26 G3 Premio Mario Incisa winner **Navarra Queen (GB)** (Singspiel {Ire}) and the July 2 G3 Hamburger Stutenpreis heroine **Karsabruni (Fr)** (Speedmaster {Ger}) from the Peter Schiergen and Henri-Alex Pantall stables, respectively. At yesterday's stage, a total of 19 fillies remained, with a cut-off limit of 16 in place for the 11-furlong highlight.

Equilete Stable's **Victor's Cry** (Street Cry {Ire}--Short Time, by Clever Trick), hero of the 2010 GI Shoemaker Breeders' Cup Mile S. at Hollywood Park, has been

retired, according to *Daily Racing Form*. Stud plans haven't been finalized yet. "He's showing some wear and tear on those ankles," trainer Eoin Harty told *DRF*. "I didn't want to jeopardize his future career." The son of the graded-stakes placed mare Short Time also

won the GII Citation H. and placed second in the GI Eddie Read S. The 6-year-old, a \$150,000 FTKJUL yearling purchase, closed out his career with a third-place finish while defending his title in the Shoemaker. "He was a top-class miler," Harty continued. "[The Shoemaker] and the Citation were his two best races. He beat genuine Group 1 company." Victor's Cry retires with a record of 24-6-3-4 and earnings of \$762,021.

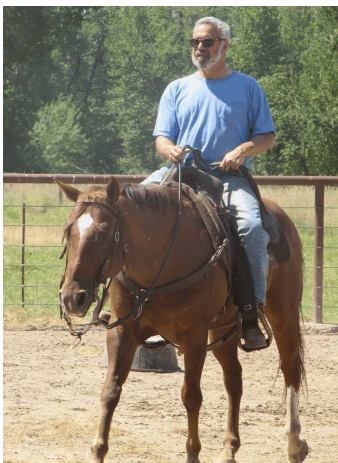


FROM THE DESK OF...

CITY SLICKERS

This all really started about five years ago, in February, 2006. My wife, Lou, had decided we would go on an activity holiday--mushing in northern Sweden. I would never have thought of it myself, not in a million zillion years, but I had to admit, I had a blast.

For the next activity holiday, we were discussing going horseback riding. This I might well have thought of myself, though my proficiency as a rider fits snugly into the category marked 'elementary.' But, as Lou put it, she wasn't interested in anything too smart--she kept finding websites reminding the ladies to bring along their 'little black dress.' This was not what she had in mind; more like the Billy Crystal movie, "City Slickers," she thought--actually doing something on a working ranch.

I'm not sure exactly why, but last November at the sale I brought the idea up to Keeneland auctioneer Cris Caldwell, brother of Scott and son of the late, legendary Keeneland auctioneer Tom Caldwell, who died in 2001. I had known the Caldwells ever since I first arrived in Kentucky in 1979, and had worked with them as an announcer on auction crews, first in California in the mid-1980's but also for nearly 25 years at the Washington Yearling Sale in Seattle the day after Labor Day. I had great respect for Tom and the two boys, who I had now known for 30 years. I knew the Caldwells had a ranch in Oregon, and basically I just asked Cris if their setup would lend itself to this "City Slickers" holiday fancy, and could we invite ourselves if it would? Absolutely, he said, come on out.

So we did. As it turned out their ranch was absolutely ideal for our "City Slickers" experience. When Tom was alive they ran cattle on another 600-acre ranch nearby, but now Gavel Ranch is a little over 200 acres, running along the Rogue River a few miles north of Medford, Oregon, in the far southwest corner of the state, just 30 miles from the California border. Tom's widow, Mary, who many Kentuckians know from her innumerable trips back with Tom to the Keeneland sales, still lives on the farm, and runs it with son Cris.

Those of you who remember Mary, sitting about four rows back, center section, may have thought, as I did, that she was 'just' being supportive, especially sitting all the way through those long sessions. But we came to find out it was a bit more than that. Having trained as an opera singer and latterly become a student of pedigrees, she was actually watching how her auctioneer family breathed and sounded, as well as keeping track of valuations. Little bit more of a secret weapon than we even thought!

As Thoroughbred breeders the Caldwells are best known for coming up with Brother Derek, Grade I winner at two and three of over \$1.6 million, and now an Airdrie Farm stallion. They still have his dam, Miss Soft Sell, as well as a 3-year-old full-sister to Brother Derek and the \$400,000-earner Don'tsellmeshort. Miss Soft Sell had a filly this year by Unusual Heat and is back in foal to the leading California sire.

The principal activity of Gavel Ranch, though, is cattle. Up until this year the Caldwells had pinhooked (well, that's what we call it in Thoroughbreds) calves, fattened them up on their land, and resold them later in the year. Now, feeling the prices for calves had gotten too high, earlier this year they bought around 80 cows with calves at foot, and are intending to be the breeders, rather than the pinhookers. From our point of view, 76 cows with calves--Angus and Charolais, since you asked--turned out to be a very manageable number.

But I must introduce you to the other principals among the cast of characters: Cris's partner Shannon (The Cannon) Webster; Shannon's dad, the veteran cowboy George Boggs; and Cris's younger daughter, 14-year-old Laurel Caldwell. Shannon, and later George, brought with them a top strain of Paint horses from Kentucky, so the horse stalls and paddocks are populated by an assortment of Thoroughbreds, Quarter Horses and Paints. **Cont. p8**

By his own admission, Cris was a little doubtful about the string of Paints when they showed up. Though they are essentially Quarter Horses, they didn't have the reputation of working cow ponies like Cris--a modern cowboy with mobile phones and Apple computers, but a cowboy nonetheless - was used to; "A little too pretty," he thought. He's a convert now, though, and so am I, after riding one.

The humans and horses are also assisted by a group of Kelpies, red Australian cow dogs, of which Tom found the original one for Cris on a trip to Australia. Gavel Ranch does have one four-wheeler, but mostly the cattle work is done by the horses and the kelpies (we have kelpies in Scotland, too, but they are water pixies. That's another story.).

We had three days on horseback (happily, no falls). Last Wednesday we 'trailed' (see how knowledgeable I'm getting?) five horses and four dogs east on highway 140 and took a four-hour trail ride with Cris, Shannon, Laurel, and dogs in the Mountain Lakes Wilderness Area. Then Thursday and Friday we worked the cows on the ranch, separating the calves from the cows for a set of inoculations and worming, before re-combining them afterwards to go back out and graze.

This was actual ranch work. The cows and calves were in separate pastures; half were cows with their first calves in one pasture, the other half cows with their second calves in the other. So the horses and dogs drove them into a smaller paddock and then the pros--Shannon, George, and Laurel, with some pretty spiffy help from Lou--'cut' the cows off from the calves, and drove them back out into the big pasture so the calves could be run through the 'squeeze chute' for their shots. I was quite helpful in this process, as my Quarter Horse Little Man and I (my Paint had been temporarily sidelined by throwing a shoe on the Trail ride) hung around by the gate to make sure nothing escaped where it wasn't supposed to. Little Man was pretty bored, but I thought we did a good job.

Then, in the actual process of running the calves through the crush, by the second day I had got particularly adept with the cattle prod, which worried quite a few of those around me...

Lou and I were so fortunate that we got exactly the sort of experience we wanted, and incalculably huge thanks to the Caldwells and extended family for including us. But, much more importantly, we got a glimpse of what modern working ranch life is like. You may know Cris Caldwell as an urbane, polished (did I mention 'fourth-generation'?) auctioneer, but believe me when I tell you in real life he is one for-real, hard-working cowboy. There isn't much he doesn't know how to do or can't figure out; the same goes for his partner, Shannon; and her daddy, George Boggs. George has cowboyyed all over the West; he once managed Dale Robertson's famous Haymaker Ranch in Oklahoma for 3 1/2 years. There isn't much he doesn't know about livestock and running a ranch, and he's such a gentleman he irons his jeans every day before he goes out to work, even though nobody but him cares. He's a pretty awesome cowboy still, at 75 years of age.

Next in line is Cris's daughter, Laurel. If you're worried about the next generation, I'll tell you the answer here and now: clone about a hundred thousand Laurel Caldwells. I don't know that I've ever met a harder-working, totally competent yet completely unassuming young person of her age. She won't even be impressed by her new star status in *TDN*. I predict superstardom in some kind of cowboy or ranch pursuit.

The Thoroughbred horse business, the world's economies, and the human race in general have a lot of problems, many of which possibly cannot or will not be fixed.

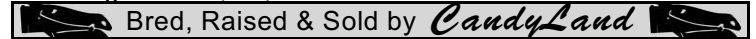

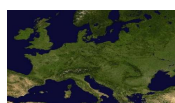
