CANFORD CLIFFS RETIRED

Star miler **Canford Cliffs (Ire)** (Tagula {Ire}--Mrs Marsh {GB}, by Marju) has been retired to Coolmore Stud after injuring his left front pastern last week when second in the G1 Sussex S. at Glorious Goodwood. Robin Heffer, Michael Tabor and Derrick Smith's 4-year-old sustained the injury when beaten by Frankel (GB) (Galileo {Ire}), having veered left in the closing stages of the mile

contest. Entering that race, he had won five consecutive races at the top level for the Richard Hannon stable. Those wins came in last year's Irish 2000 Guineas, St James's Palace S. and Sussex S., and in this term's Lockinge S. and Queen Anne S. He was also the winner of the 2009 G2 Coventry S., and was third in that year's G1 Prix Morny, as well as in the 2010 G1 2000 Guineas. "Canford Cliffs was a very rare type, in that he had such great early speed as a 2-year-old, but also stretched out to be a superb miler at three and four," Hannon commented. "He is without doubt the best horse I have had in over 40 years as a trainer. The scan revealed that he had a shadow on his pastern, which could cause serious damage if we had gone on with him. Canford Cliffs is too great a horse to take chances with, and I would hate anything even more serious to go wrong, so we have taken the decision to stop before the problems exacerbate. It's bitterly disappointing for his owners and for everyone here in East Everleigh that he had to be retired due to injury, but at least it does explain why he hung so badly at Goodwood. We were very much looking forward to taking on Frankel again. I knew it was not the real Canford Cliffs at Goodwood, and at least now we have a reason why he hung so badly. Frankel might be a superstar, but we were looking forward to taking him on again in the QEII at Ascot. There is no way that Frankel would have given our horse the beating he did had we been right." **Cont. p2**

EIGHT TO CONTEST SORRENTO

Killer Graces (Congaree) will look to secure the third stakes victory of her young racing career in tonight's 6 1/2-furlong GIII Sorrento S. at Del Mar. The filly, favored at 2-1 on the morning line, broke her maiden in the June 11 Cinderella S. before handing **Mighty Caroline** (Stormy Atlantic) a half-length defeat in the July 16 Landaluce S. last time out. Mighty Caroline, looking to avenge that runner-up effort, is 5-2 on the morning line. The gray filly captured her five-furlong debut at Hollywood June 12, and led most of the way through fractions of :21 4/5 and :45 before being past late in the six-furlong Landaluce. "She's a very big filly and, going into the maiden race, it looked like she was going to be more of a two-turn horse," trainer Melody Conlon said of the John Liviakis colorbearer. "Of our six 2-year-olds, I thought she'd probably be the last to make it to the races. But she never missed a workout, and she was fit enough she could have run a mile. So I thought, she's ready, and we might as well run her in a five-furlong race. We were surprised she showed so much speed and won that race." Conlon was not discouraged by Mighty Caroline's Landaluce defeat. "In the Landaluce, we wound up on the lead again and dueling with horses in the first part," Conlon explained. "She set such fast fractions that she got nailed at the wire. If we can get her to rate a bit, I think the 6 1/2 [furlongs] will be fine."

Trainer Richard Hannon added, "Canford Cliffs did so much for us and we will all miss him, but we have the memories and the videos, and, hopefully, we will have some of his sons and daughters back here at Herridge



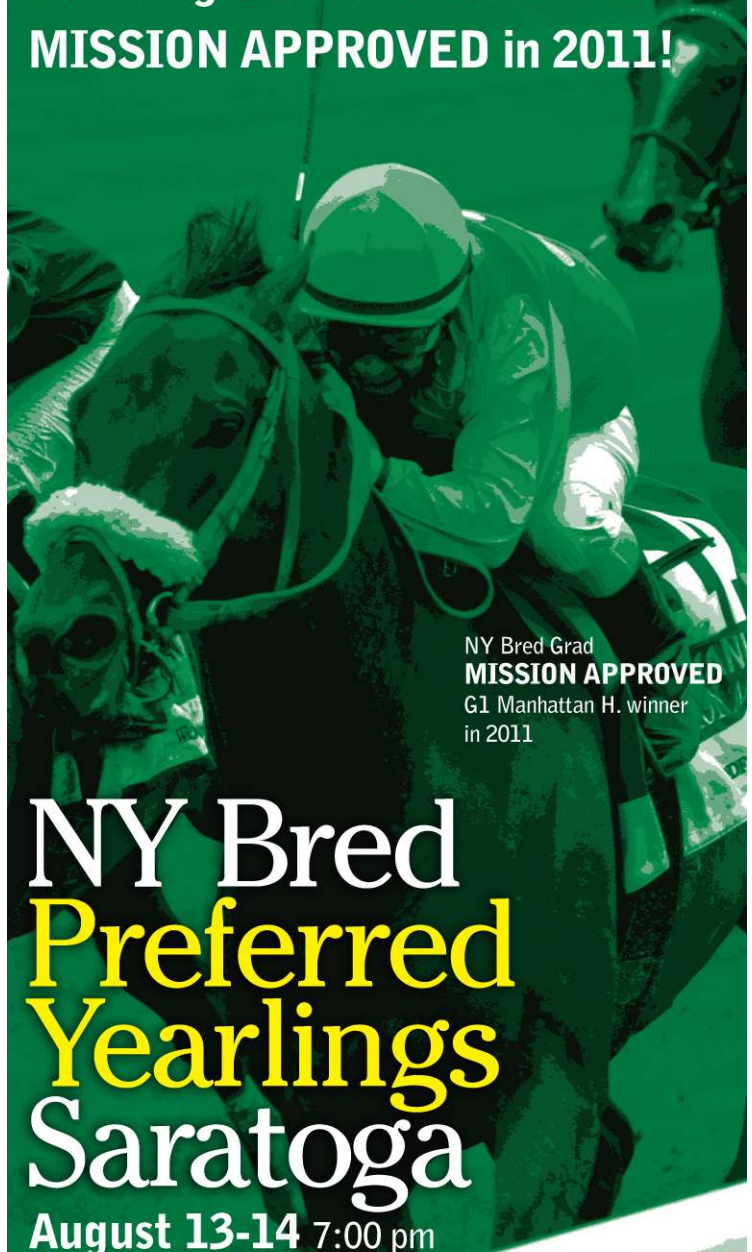

in the not too distant future." Jockey Richard Hughes described the winner of seven of his 11 starts and over £950,000 in prizemoney as "the best and fastest I have ever ridden." Bloodstock agent Peter Doyle, who purchased the star at Doncaster in 2008, added, "Canford Cliffs' quality was always evident; he was a standout as a yearling. He is built like a tank and had a great walk and constitution, too." Coolmore's M.V. Magnier stated, "It's very unfortunate that he has been retired, as a rematch with Frankel would have been a race to savour, but Canford Cliffs is an exceptional-

looking individual, and he joins a select band of stallions to have won five or more consecutive Group 1 races. Ever since we bought into him last year, many of the top breeders in Europe have shown a very keen interest in him, so I have no doubt he will be a very popular stallion."

Bred in Ireland by S and S Hubbard Rothwell, Canford Cliffs was purchased as a weanling at Goffs by Redpender Stud for €46,000 from the Rathbarry Stud draft. Peter Doyle secured him as a yearling in 2008 at Doncaster for £50,000. The powerfully built bay is a great-grandson of the U.S.-based stallion Stop the Music, and hails from an American female family as well. His third dam Triple Tipple (Raise a Cup) began her racing career in Europe before returning home to secure the Gil Wilshire H. and Gill Palomar H., and also was runner-up to Sabin in the G1 Gamely H. for trainer Richard Cross. Canford Cliffs, in whom an interest was sold last season to Michael Tabor and Derrick Smith, has a 2-year-old half-brother by Holy Roman Emperor (Ire) named Mayo Lad (Ire). That bay colt, sold for 100,000gns to Peter Doyle as a yearling at Tattersalls October, has joined the Hannon yard. Their dam Mrs Marsh has an Excellent Art (GB) yearling colt, and produced a Sea the Stars (Ire) filly this past March. [Click here](#) for Andrew Caulfield's June 21, 2011 column on Canford Cliffs.

Sense of Purpose, one of the most aptly named horses in training, leaves nothing in the stable, and her high workrate garnered a first pattern-race success here. Outclassed by Banimpire (Ire) (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}) when three-lengths second to her high-class compatriot in the G3 Noblesse S. at Cork June 12, the chestnut warded off Bob le Beau to earn a first black-type win in the Listed Challenge S. over two furlongs further here last time July 14. Despite this three-pound penalty and a trip short of her optimum, the homebred gave all when leading at every step for Pat Smullen to keep that rival and Ballydoyle's Marksmanship at bay. "This is such a courageous filly, and it was a wonderful ride from Pat," commented winning trainer Dermot Weld, who had won this contest in the past with the stable stars Vinnie Roe (Ire) (Definite Article {GB}) and Profound Beauty (Ire) (Danehill). "A mile and a half is really too short for her, but she tries so hard. The G1 Irish Leger [at The Curragh Sept. 10] is a definite possibility, but we'll see what is likely to be in the race, and the [Sept. 8] G2 Park Hill S. at Doncaster is an alternative option. She has had a busy year and puts so much into it--the Melbourne Cup is a possibility next year."

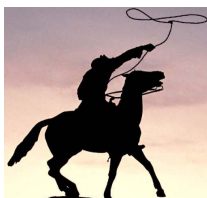

PLUM PRETTY WORKS

GI Kentucky Oaks winner **Plum Pretty** (Medaglia d'Oro), coming off a runner-up effort in the July 23 GI Coaching Club American Oaks, worked four furlongs at Saratoga yesterday in :48.05, second fastest of 31 at the distance. "She cruised around there in :48 and [was] out [five-eighths] in a minute," said trainer John Terranova, who oversees Bob Baffert's horses in New York. "She looked fantastic. It couldn't have been any easier or better. She hit the ground beautifully, and it looks like she came out of the race really well." Of Plum Pretty's next start, Baffert said, "I'm going to work her again next week and see how she trains, and then decide."

HYMN BOOK AIMS FOR BARUCH

Stuart Janney III's **Hymn Book** (Arch) will make his next start over the turf in the Aug. 26 Gil Bernard Baruch H. after trainer Shug McGaughey decided to skip Saturday's GI Whitney H. Hymn Book was most recently second in the July 2 Gil Suburban H. "I think he might be a little better on grass," McGaughey explained. "We ran him in the Suburban and we caught that horse Flat Out (Flatter), who ran a 113 Beyer. The Whitney has a big field; Secretariat wasn't in there, but we decided to find something a little better for him." McGaughey's longer-term goal with the 5-year-old is the Oct. 2 GI Jockey Club Gold Cup Invitational over Belmont's sweeping oval. "He likes that main track down at Belmont," the trainer added.

Alan Cohen, who purchased his 500-acre Arindel Farm in Ocala in 2004, didn't have long to wait for his first star. **Wait a While** (Maria's Mon), one of three fillies purchased by Cohen out of the 2005 OBS February

sale, became a three-time Grade I winner and was named the champion 3-year-old filly of 2006. She joined the Arindel broodmare band in 2009 and her first foal, a colt by Distorted Humor, will sell during Monday's first session of the Fasig-Tipton

Saratoga sale as [hip 68](#).

Cohen, an entrepreneur in the pharmaceutical industry, is a former owner of the Florida Panthers hockey team. His love of horses was nurtured as a youngster by trips to New York racetracks with his father. He got his feet wet with a single runner, Ravidashinal (Storm Boot), in the early 2000s, but soon started to think bigger.

As his business interests started taking up less of his time, Cohen has increasingly been able to indulge in his passion for horses over the past seven years. And, as his broodmare band and racing stable have increased, his wife, Karen, and his five children, aged from five to 25, have joined in his passion. **Cont. p6**

"I always wanted to have a horse farm and hang out with Thoroughbreds," Cohen recalled. "But I was always too busy working to really do anything about it. As I've gotten older, I have more time, and now the kids want to do it. We all decided to do more of it. The whole family has just gotten into it. It's hard not to love the horses--we have 100 horses on the farm. They are beautiful animals and the kids just love it."

He added laughingly, "We go through a lot of carrots."

The whole progression from fan, to racehorse owner to farm owner and breeder, almost seems accidental.

"It's just grown," Cohen said. "We stepped into it a little bit over the years and I've just gotten to like it more and more."

Arindel Farm is currently home to 30 broodmares, and Cohen could see that number increasing to up to 50 mares. For now, the plan is to put about 20 horses in training each year, and sell the remaining foals. But you quickly get the sense that, for Cohen, where his horses are concerned, plans are always fluid.

"That's the good thing about what we're doing," he explained. "We just make up our minds as we're doing it. The best thing about having a business like this is that it's just us and we can do what we want. We don't need a business plan."

While he might not have a concrete plan for his breeding operation, Cohen does have goals.

"We want to be great breeders," he said. "We want to be known for breeding really quality horses."

Cohen and farm manager David Nowicki were busy trying to make that goal a reality last winter, buying some 15 mares between Fasig-Tipton November, Keeneland November and Keeneland January. Among

their purchases at Keeneland November was the 12-year-old Miss Doolittle (Storm Cat), a daughter of champion Eliza (Mt. Livermore), who was in foal to Curlin. Cohen snagged the mare for a mere \$85,000 just days before her juvenile colt Dialed In (Mineshaft)

won his debut and only months before the colt became favorite for the Kentucky Derby with wins in the GIII Holy Bull S. and GI Florida Derby. Arindel also purchased Sara's Success (Concorde's Tune), the dam of multiple graded stakes winner Amen Hallelujah (Montbrook) for \$40,000; and multiple graded stakes winner Solvig (Caerleon) for \$100,000.

The buying spree was part of a plan to beef up the broodmare band, which conveniently dovetailed with market conditions.

"It just so happened, we were looking to expand, and the market was what it was," Cohen said. "It was the plan six or eight, nine months before the November sale. And then the market was right for buyers. But it wasn't for that reason that we went there. We just wanted to get up to 30 mares, and that is what we did."

He continued, "Since we breed mostly to race, it seems that our sweet spot is the 11 to 12-year-old mare that has either a good race record or produced something significant, but maybe the commercial breeder doesn't want to buy her anymore."

Cohen admitted he enjoys the action-packed atmosphere of the sales ring.

"I love it," he said. "That's the problem. I get there and all the plans fade away."

Cohen is enthusiastic about Wait a While's start as a broodmare. Of the eight-year-old mare's Distorted Humor yearling, he gushed, "He's beautiful. He's gorgeous."

Wait a While also has a weanling filly by Medaglia d'Oro and is back in foal to Distorted Humor.

"The idea was always to sell the first few foals out of Wait and then race the rest," Cohen explained. "That was what I always felt like I was going to do. I root for them just as hard whether they race for us or we sell them." **Cont. p7**

Typically, however, Cohen is keeping all options open for the Medaglia d'Oro filly.

"We're more prone to keep the fillies as broodmares. So that will be a tough decision," he confirmed. "If she has another filly this breeding season, maybe we'll sell [the weanling]. The idea was to to sell the first couple and that would be it, but it would be hard to sell her. Plans are made to be broken."

For today, Cohen is just enjoying life on the farm with his family and his horses.

"The farm is a beautiful place with a lot of beautiful horses and we have fun going to the races," he said. "Our goal is to race quality horses and have a reputation for selling quality horses. Wherever that ends up, is where it ends up." -*Jessica Martini*

RMTC APPROVES NEW RECOMMENDATIONS

The Racing Medication and Testing Consortium Board of Directors yesterday voted to support a requirement that furosemide be administered on race day only by regulatory veterinarians. The board also voted to support the elimination of adjunct bleeder medications, enhanced security measures and more severe penalties for medication violations. The vote came after Alex Waldrop, president of the National Thoroughbred Racing Association, presented the recommendations of the RMTC's race day medication committee. The board will now work to develop a 'Model Rule,' which will be presented to the Association of Racing Commissioners International. "This Model Rule is designed to cause the regulatory community to assume the responsibility for the race day administration of Furosemide," Waldrop said. "Administration of any other medications on race day, including adjunct bleeder medications, shall be strictly prohibited. These steps will eliminate the need for private veterinary involvement on race day." Alan Foreman, RMTC Vice Chairman and CEO of the Thoroughbred Horsemen's Associations, presented recommendations from the RMTC Penalty Guidelines Committee. Based on that presentation, the board voted to establish a June 1, 2012 deadline for lowering the Phenylbutazone threshold, to establish uniform penalty guidelines, and to develop a list of approved therapeutic medications with corresponding withdrawal time guidelines. "The board approved a number of significant recommendations today," said RMTC Chairman Dr. Robert Lewis. "All four committees were given expanded charges to continue their work. This was a very productive meeting, and we look forward to additional recommendations from these committees at our Oct. 6 board meeting." The RMTC consists of 25 racing industry stakeholders and organizations from Thoroughbred, Standardbred, American Quarter Horse and Arabian racing.

This is a very interesting and evenly matched group with a number of capable longshots. Of the potential price plays, I prefer **#7 Sanagas**. A German import who was 4-for-5 against what appear to be weak foes in his native land, he resurfaced stateside for Graham Motion in the GIII Arlington H. July 9 ([TDN Video](#)). Sanagas made a very odd run that day when finishing 7th, beaten 3 1/2 lengths. Unhurried early, the 5-year-old tried to bear out around the far turn and in upper stretch and was never really asked by Rajiv Maragh thereafter while making up ground and racing inside of horses in traffic. Watch both the pan shot and head-on--Sanagas never got uncorked and still came home in :23.60, third-fastest in the field. "He was lugging in quite badly," Motion explained to *DRF*. "The only thing I can think of is when he ran in Europe, he went right-handed; maybe [left-handed] was new to him. We put an extension blinker on one side of him and he handled it very well when he worked on the grass." Motion and owner Andreas Jacobs have had previous success together, and unveiled yesterday's impressive maiden winner Humadea (GB) (Medicean {GB}) (see above), so one would think that the connections have a handle on Sanagas' ability and are spotting him accordingly.
