**SANTA ANITA TO HOST BREEDERS' CUP 2012**

As had been speculated, the 2012 Breeders' Cup World Thoroughbred Championships will be held at Santa Anita. The two-day event will take place Nov. 2-3. The announcement was made at a press conference at LA Live in Los Angeles Wednesday. It will be the sixth time the Breeders' Cup will be staged at the Arcadia, California, oval, which last played host in back-to-back years 2008 and 2009. Santa Anita boasts the Breeders' Cup

records for handle and attendance. "We are thrilled to bring back the Breeders' Cup to Southern California, which is always a strong draw for horse racing fans from around the world, and where the Breeders' Cup has always been embraced by the community," said Craig Fravel, president and CEO of Breeders' Cup. "Santa Anita Park is a world class racing venue that will once again provide a spectacular setting for two days of the best in international racing." Frank Stronach, whose The Stronach Group owns and operates the track, added, "Hosting the Breeders' Cup is important to the California horse racing industry, and it is an honor for Santa Anita to be chosen as host of the Breeders' Cup for the sixth time. Our team looks forward to the challenge of building on the success of 2008 and 2009 with the 2012 Breeders' Cup." Belmont Park was a finalist for 2012. Reacting to the announcement that his track had not been chosen, New York Racing Association President and CEO Charles Hayward said in a statement, "Congratulations to Santa Anita, but we are disappointed that Belmont Park was not selected to host the 2012 Breeders' Cup World Championships. The event was most recently held at Belmont in 2005, and since then, two different tracks--Churchill Downs and now Santa Anita --have hosted the Breeders' Cup three times. We remain hopeful that Belmont will remain a serious option for the 2013 Breeders' Cup."

**LASIX BANNED IN 2YO GRADED RACES IN '12**

The American Graded Stakes Committee announced Wednesday that it has voted to implement a ban of race-day medications, including the anti-bleeding drug Salix, for 2-year-old graded-stakes races in 2012. The new policy will be re-evaluated at the end of next year. "There have been questions in many quarters about the integrity of the breed when so many of our horses race on medication," said Dr. J. David Richardson, chairman of the Committee. "We view this as a positive step for the elite level horses that will race in graded stakes, the ones most likely to perpetuate the breed. We are reaching out to the regulators and tracks in each of the six states that currently conduct 2-year-old graded-stakes races, and look forward to working with them to implement this policy." The Breeders' Cup announced in July that it plans to develop protocols that will eliminate race-day medications in horses competing at the Breeders' Cup World Championships by 2013, beginning with the juvenile races of next year. In 2011, there were 49 graded-stakes races for juveniles.

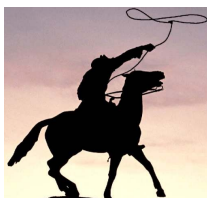

## ***Baffert Big Guns Breeze at Spa...***

Karl Watson, Mike Pegram, and Paul Weitman's **Coil** (Point Given) fired a four-furlong bullet in :46.15 at Saratoga Wednesday, his first workout since annexing the GI Haskell Invitational S. at Monmouth July 31. He worked in company with allowance winner Saddleranch (Vindication), who scored at the Spa in impressive fashion July 23. Coil, with Shaun Bridgmohan in the irons, slightly outfinished his workmate. "I told him to go :48, but he couldn't have done it easier," trainer Bob Baffert commented. "It looked like they were going in 49, didn't they?" The handsome chestnut is pointing for the GI Travers S. Aug. 27. "He didn't get tired or anything," Baffert continued. "I've been watching him on the Oklahoma track and he doesn't look that great on it. He worked fast, but he sort of goes through the motions. The other horse [Saddleranch] is a very good work horse."

Peachtree's GI Kentucky Oaks heroine **Plum Pretty** (Medaglia d'Oro) also breezed at the Spa yesterday, covering six furlongs in 1:11.87. Bridgmohan was aboard the GI TVG Coaching Club American Oaks runner-up as well. "She looked good," Baffert said. "She got a little tired at the end there." Plum Pretty is being considered for the GI TVG Alabama S. Aug. 20. "I wasn't thinking Alabama," Baffert continued. "But after watching her work today, she deserves a chance." ## ***Best Pal Rematch Shaping Up in the Futurity...***

**Creative Cause** (Giant's Causeway) and **I'll Have Another** (Flower Alley), one-two in the GII Best Pal S. Aug. 7, will meet again in the GI Del Mar Futurity Sept. 7. The ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ Creative Cause earned an 88 Beyer in the Best Pal. "We were a little disappointed [with the speed figure] because we thought that was a pretty fast race," trainer Mike Harrington said. "But we got the money and that's what counts." I'll Have Another, trained by Doug O'Neill, finished 1 3/4 lengths behind Creative Cause last time. "We're pretty happy with the race he ran," O'Neill's assistant Leandro Mora said. "But we're going to have to come up with a different plan if that winner keeps running the way he did."

**Flashpoint Off to King's Bishop...**

**Flashpoint** (Pomeroy), Peachtree Stables' runaway winner of the GIII Jersey Shore S. at Monmouth Park July 3, will be sent to contest an intriguing field in the GI King's Bishop S at Saratoga Aug. 27. "He's tearing the barn down," trainer Wesley Ward boasted. "He's

done everything we've asked and is training outstandingly." The King's Bishop may also mark the return of juvenile champion **Uncle Mo** (Indian Charlie), and GII Rebel S. winner **The Factor** (War Front), who has been sidelined since a seventh-place finish in the GI Arkansas Derby on April 16. Uncle Mo has been out of action since a third-place finish in the GI

Wood Memorial Apr. 9. Ward remains confident in his charge despite the looming presence of the aforementioned pair. "He's on target for a big one," Ward said. "There's ample spacing from his victory in the Jersey Shore. He came out of that race with resounding confidence." Following his 1:01.05 breeze at Aqueduct Aug. 4, Flashpoint will finish his official works at the Queens racetrack before shipping to Saratoga and galloping the week of the race.

**'Dick' Set for Marois Challenge...**

John Manley's **Dick Turpin (Ire)** (Arakan) looks set to take his chance against **Goldikova (Ire)** (Anabaa), et al, in Monday's G1 Prix du Haras de Fresnay-le-Buffard-Jacques le Marois at Deauville, for which 17 stood their ground following the first forfeit stage yesterday. Successful in the G2 Summer Mile at Ascot last time July 9, the 2010 G1 Prix Jean Prat hero is also entered in Saturday's G2 Hungerford S. at Newbury, but trainer Richard Hannon--who also has the G1 English and Irish 2000 Guineas runner-up Dubawi Gold (Ire) (Dubawi {Ire}) on the list--is favoring a cross-Channel raid. "They are more likely to get the rain in France than here, so Deauville looks favourite," Hannon said. "Dick Turpin worked on Tuesday and is in great form. If he gets his ground, he'll ruffle Goldikova's feathers." Goldikova is likely to be joined by her regular pacemaker **Flash Dance (Ire)** (Zamindar) and, potentially, **Polemique (Ire)** (Poliglote {GB}), as well as the fellow Freddy Head trainee **Rajsaman (Fr)** (Linamix {Fr}), who was a latest fourth in the G1 Sussex S. at Goodwood July 27. Khalid Abdullah could be represented by the Roger Charlton-trained G1 Queen Anne S. third **Cityscape (GB)** (Selkirk) and the unbeaten Andre Fabre-trained 3-year-old **Mutual Trust (GB)** (Cacique {Ire}), who was successful in the July 3 G1 Prix Jean Prat at Chantilly last time.

**Cecil Aims Duo at Juddmonte...**

Sir Henry Cecil has given the green light for **Midday (GB)** (Oasis Dream {GB}) to join stable companion **Twice Over (GB)** (Observatory) in Wednesday's G1 Juddmonte International at York. While the 5-year-old remains engaged in the following day's G1 Yorkshire Oaks at the Ebor meeting, Cecil is keen to have another crack at the colts following her third win in Goodwood's G1 Nassau S. July 30. Twice Over, who came back to form in the G2 York S. over the Juddmonte course and distance last time July 23, is expected to be partnered by Ian Mongan, with Tom Queally on Midday. After the Khalid Abdullah pair worked on Newmarket's watered gallop yesterday, Cecil commented, "There is a chance that Twice Over and Midday will both contest the Juddmonte International. Twice Over definitely goes for the race. Midday is also entered in the Yorkshire Oaks, but, hopefully, if we are happy with her well-being, we will be more likely to give the owner a double representation in his own race, which he would dearly love to win for the first time. It was nice to see Twice Over come back to himself last time at York. He is working well. I was very pleased with them both this morning, as Midday also worked very nicely."

**DEAUVILLE 2YOs TO THE FORE**



Two-year-old's bought from last year's **ARQANA** August yearling sale have been very prominent this spring. Several have even already showed Classic potential, notably **DABIRSIM**, who is still unbeaten in three starts. The son of Japan's **Hat Trick** started his career with a bang, romping away by ten lengths in a

1200 metre maiden at La Teste, where his trainer Christophe Ferland is based. A month later, he put up another impressive win over course and distance. His connections then made the decision to contest the **Prix de Cabourg Gr.3** at Deauville, still over 1200 metres but against opponents of a different calibre! Dabirsim didn't seem to notice much of a difference though, and he produced a smashing turn of foot to score easily. The **Gr.1 Prix Morny** is his next target... Four days later, on Thursday 25 August, his half-sister by Slickly(**lot 392**) will go under the hammer in the nearby ARQANA sales ring. She will be consigned by Grandcamp, as was Dabirsim before being knocked down to owner Simon Springer for €30,000.

**MO' BETTER AT SARATOGA**

Teams Repole and Pletcher seemed very happy with last year's 2-year-old champion Uncle Mo (Indian Charlie)'s bullet work at Saratoga, but just as happy were the consignors of the 10 of the 16 Bernardini yearlings catalogued for the Saratoga Sale that were bought either by John Ferguson (five), or one of four other bloodstock agents or trainers who often buy for Darley interests, who signed for five more. Dubai's ruler Sheikh Mohammed has been the greatest supporter of the horse business for the last 30 years, so his presence at Saratoga was about the best news the horse business will get this year. Yes, a Dubai-based company owns the sales company; and yes, he may or may not show up in person at many other sales this year. But his unwavering support of this business has improved the quality of life of many, many people, and at this stage of the proceedings, there aren't many people who begrudge him his success--and his fun.

That said, the Darley group's buying pattern at a boutique sale doesn't necessarily tell us a lot about what we can expect from the broader yearling market yet to come. John Ferguson signed for 13 yearlings himself, of 103 sold, for a total of \$8,530,000--26% of the sales company's \$32,892,000 gross. But Anthony Stroud, Blandford Bloodstock, John Gosden, John McCormack, Mark Johnston, and Rabbah Bloodstock also signed for a total of 17 yearlings, and all of these agents and trainers have signed for Darley horses before. Darley interests could have bought as many as 29 yearlings for over \$14 million, which would be 43% of the total gross. In any case, it makes it difficult to know what we should infer about the much bigger market to come. The best clue is that 74 yearlings definitely not bought by Darley interests averaged \$253,000.

You hate to postulate much about a market with 6,000 more yearlings yet to sell on the basis of 74 horses, but the positive side was that there was spirited and competitive bidding from a number of American buyers for "the right stuff." The question is, how perfect does a yearling have to be, from here on out, to qualify as "the right stuff?" Over the past 30 years, when the markets are strong, as many as 22% of yearlings make money; when the markets are weak--as they still are now--it's more like 14%, one out of seven. If only one out of seven is going to make money for its breeder or consignor, it has to make a lot of money to keep the ship afloat, and the more perfect a yearling has to be--especially at the 'select' level--the more difficult that is.

### A.P. INDY TOPS MIDYEAR APEX

Speaking of worlds, in the world of stallion analysis, it is always difficult to answer the question, “who are the top sires, really?” The most prominent sires are those whose names you see every week, the leaders on the general sire lists, and the stallions with the highest stud fees--those are who the market likes. As our veteran readers know, we have another take on it: the APEX (Annual Progeny Earnings index) sire ratings, covering results for the last seven years (now 2005-2011) for sires with 10 or more 3-year-olds and up of the current year.

For a full discussion of what the ratings are and how they work, can I suggest going back and downloading the TDN issue of Jan. 13, 2011 ([click here](#)), where we go into the various aspects of the ratings in some detail. As you'll remember, we calculate indexes for three “class bands” based on annual earnings: the top 2% of earners from runners are designated ‘A Runners’; the next 2% ‘B Runners’; the next 4% ‘C Runners’; and the top 8% combined are designated ‘ABC Runners’.

In all, there are 17 different indices, including regional (North America, Europe, Japan) and age (2-year-old; 3-year-old; 4-year-old; and 5-year-old and up), as well as class ratings. These will all be on the TDN website within the next few days, when we finish reconciling the TJCIS (The Jockey Club Information Systems, which supplies the data) details about first foal years and where horses stand with our own information; we'll put a notice in the paper as soon as those are available, and on first glance, the numbers look pretty interesting, especially for some of the sires with their first 3-year-olds (we call them F2008 sires, first foals 2008), which are being rated for the first time. Those two Canadian stallions--Philanthropist and Old Forester; wow!

A total of 1,060 sires are rated in the current run, which includes racing through Aug. 1; 427 of the sires have fewer than 200 “year-starters” (a horse is counted as one ‘runner’ in this system every year it starts, up to seven; same applies to ‘A Runners’, etc.; a horse can be one A Runner as a 2-year-old, one as a 3-year-old, and so on). This group of 427 includes all but one (the new star Japanese sire Deep Impact) of the sires with first 3-year-olds this year. There are 633 sires with 200+ year-starters 2005-2011, and it is this group of 633 we use to calculate the “Leaders’ lists” included in this issue.



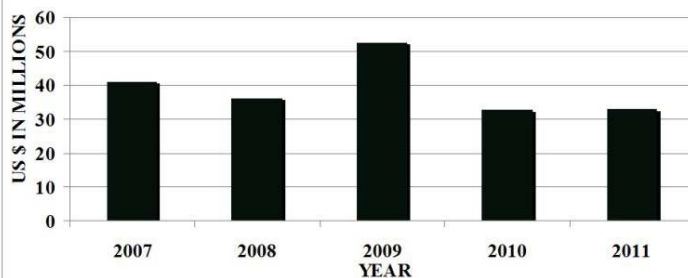

## Weekly Sales Ticker by Bill Oppenheim

“You'll note we've gone to a five-year format so we are able to measure 2011 sales against both 2007 and 2008 pre- and post-crash results. Saratoga looked plenty strong, even given Maktoum and Darley buying may have accounted for 40 percent of the gross. Fasig July and Saratoga combined actually averaged more this year (\$157,282) than in 2007 (\$156,296), but the price of sustaining that average has been a 40 percent drop – and these are top- and middle-tier values we're talking about now – in number catalogued and sold, and in gross. That's a big drop in 'commercial' values if confirmed by September's first week.”

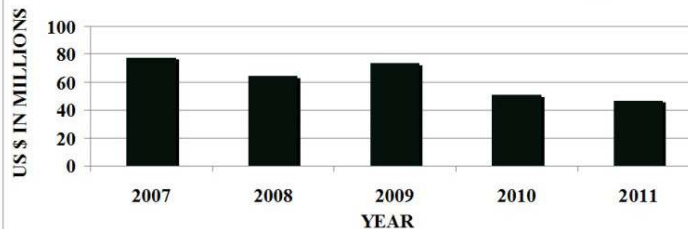

The Leading Sire by A Runner Index 2005-2011 is **A.P. Indy**, on his way to his eighth APEX 'sire championship', meaning he has been the top-rated sire by APEX A Runner Index seven times. His current A Runner Index is 4.46. which means 8.92% of his 2005-2011 runners are A Runners; that's 99 A Runners from 1,109 year-starters 2005-2011. What's notable about the list this year is that, for the first time, sires that had their first runners during the 'Big-Book Era' (first foals 1996 and later, with a very few exceptions, like Monsun [first foals 1997] and Unusual Heat [first foals 1999] who never really had big books) are beginning to dominate the upper reaches of the list. For years the top five sires were some combination of A.P. Indy, Danzig, Storm Cat, Nureyev, Danehill, and Sadler's Wells, but now a new group of sires is ascending to the top rung.

**Galileo** is the world's leading sire--we are reminded of that every time we pick up the *TDN* and see that he's the sire of seven individual Northern Hemisphere Group/Grade I winners this year (with an additional South African Group 1 winner), with barnmate Montjeu a distant second, with three. Galileo ranks fifth on the list of leading sires by A Runner Index 2005-2011, with a 3.64 index (7.28% of runners), though it's worth noting he's had 1,109 year-starters 2005-2011, whereas the three younger sires ahead of him have only had between a third and a half the number of year-starters as he has (index figures tend to drop the more runners a horse has).

Number two behind A.P. Indy is **Dubawi** (4.00, exactly 8% of runners), who has made such a sensational start and ultimately has a chance to do for Dubai Millennium (create a sire line) what A.P. Indy's sire, Seattle Slew, did for Bold Reasoning (and therefore, as it turned out, Bold Ruler) 30 years ago. Dubawi's first foals are now four (F2007). Next are two of the four North American F2006 (first 5-year-olds 2011) sires that have also made such a sensational start, and now in fact constitute four of the top 11 sires on this list.

## NTRA REPORT FROM CAPITOL HILL



### WIRE CLARIFICATION ACT INTRODUCED TO PROTECT PARI-MUTUEL HANDLE

Reps. Chris Gibson (R-NY) and Kurt Schrader (D-OR) recently introduced the "Wire Clarification Act of 2011" (H.R. 2702), a bill that amends the Wire Act to affirm horseracing's authority to conduct online pari-mutuel wagering under the Interstate Horseracing Act (IHA).

The Wire Act is a 1961 federal law that prohibits the use of wire communications to transmit bets on sporting events and contests. Violators suffer criminal penalties. By contrast, the IHA helped expand horseracing when it passed in 1978 by permitting interstate wagering (in the form of simulcast wagering). The NTRA helped secure an IHA amendment in 2000 to allow for further expansion of horseracing by permitting Internet wagering.

Despite clear Congressional intent to authorize interstate wagering on horseracing - expressed in the 1978 IHA, affirmed in 2000 in the amendment allowing Internet wagering and re-affirmed in the Unlawful Internet Gambling Enforcement Act that exempted wagers made under the IHA - the Department of Justice maintains that the Wire Act prohibits online betting of any kind. Simulcast and online wagering represent 90 percent of total annual pari-mutuel handle in the United States and the NTRA continues to defend horseracing's right to conduct lawful online wagering as authorized under the IHA.

These are: third-ranked **Candy Ride** (3.81); fourth-ranked **Medaglia d'Oro** (3.72); **Speightstown** (3.40), tied for seventh; and **Tapit** (3.28), ranked 11th. This powerful quartet looks sure to have a big impact on the North American leading sires list for the next few years.


Speaking of impact, Japan's **Deep Impact** (3.52) is making just that. His first 3-year-olds are just racing now, but such is the setup of Japanese racing that he's already had 213 year-starters, qualifying him for this list, and including already 15 A Runners (and 46 ABC Runners, ranking him number one on the list by ABC Runner Index). Two other Japanese sires made the top 50: **Zenno Rob Roy** (first 4-year-olds, 2.50 A Runner Index); and **King Kamehameha** (first 5-year-olds; already 46 A Runners, for a 2.46 A Index, and 173 ABC Runners). That's notable because all three are relatively young sires, and traditionally the distribution of purse money in Japan heavily favors older horses; for these sires to be doing so well so young is big news.

What is really striking, though, is how so many of the top-rated and most expensive Big-Book Era sires are clustered in the group with A Runner indexes between 2.50 to 3.00, or between 5 and 6% A Runners from year-starters.

There are 25 sires ranked in this group, of which 14 are rightfully considered among the best among the Northern Hemisphere's Big-Book Era sires. It has to be significant that so many are clustered here. They are, in A Runner Index order: **Lemon Drop Kid** (2.98, ranked 15th); **Mineshaft** (2.97, 16th); **Giant's Causeway** (2.91, 18th); **Smart Strike** (2.89, 20th); **Dalakhani** (2.88, 21st); **Oasis Dream** (2.86, 22nd); **Dansili** (2.83, 23rd); **Distorted Humor** (2.81, 24th); **Danehill Dancer** and **Montjeu** (2.78, equal 26th); **Awesome Again** (2.77, 28th); **Unbridled's Song** (2.74, 29th); **Pivotal** (2.60, 33rd); and **Street Cry** (2.55, 37th). What this means is that when sires 'mature' by having four or more crops, we should expect them to have A Runner indexes between 2.50 to 3.00; 5 to 6% A Runners from runners.

The two leading sires by number of 2005-2011 A Runners (remember, one horse can be counted more than once if they achieve the status in more than one year) are **Giant's Causeway** (102) and A.P. Indy (99) (click [here](#) to see the Top 50 in this category), followed by Danehill Dancer (92), Smart Strike (86), Distorted Humor (85), Sadler's Wells (84), and Galileo (83). Equally striking are the positions of Giant's Causeway (305) and Distorted Humor (294) on the list of leading sires by 2005-2011 ABC Runners (click [here](#) for the top 50); they are miles clear of their nearest pursuers in that category (Danehill Dancer is third, with 235), which is no doubt related to their contending as top-three sires on the General Sire lists (by progeny earnings) every year. Finally (for this week), Deep Impact (2.70) tops all sires by ABC Runner Index (click [here](#) for the top 50), ahead of A.P. Indy (2.60) and the resurgent **Ghostzapper** (2.50). Medaglia d'Oro and Distorted Humor (both 2.43) are tied for fourth in this category, ahead of Speightstown (2.34).

**NYRA ANNOUNCES FALL STAKES SCHEDULE**

*Edited Press Release*

The New York Racing Association has announced the stakes programs for the 2011 fall meetings at Belmont Park and Aqueduct, featuring 30 graded-stakes races and nearly \$9 million in purses. The Belmont meeting, which runs between Sept. 10 and Oct. 30, includes five Grade I races on Oct. 1--the Jockey Club Gold Cup, Joe Hirsch Turf Classic, Flower Bowl, Beldame and Vosburgh. Other Grade I races slated for Belmont this fall are the Garden City Sept. 17, and the Champagne, Frizette and Jamaica, all contested Oct. 8. The GII Nashua S. and GIII Tempted S., both typically run during the Aqueduct fall meet at a mile, have been moved to Belmont. The duo have been shortened to six furlongs and will take place Oct. 2 to accommodate the newly created Breeders' Cup Juvenile Sprint. The Aqueduct fall meeting, held between Nov. 4 and Dec. 31, is anchored by the Nov. 26 program, which features the GI Cigar Mile, GI Gazelle, GII Remsen and GII Demoiselle. "Year after year, many of the eventual year-end champions participate in the terrific stakes schedule that we feature during the Belmont and Aqueduct fall meets," said NYRA President and CEO Charles Hayward. "Once again, we are excited to offer an unparalleled slate of fall stakes that includes races in nearly every category."
