GALILEO FILLY STARS AT DEAUVILLE

After an opening session that failed to produce any fireworks, Arqana's August Yearling Sale exploded during the initial minutes of Tuesday's trading with the selling of a daughter of Galileo (Ire) for €1.7 million (US\$2,452,272). As on day one, it was Paul Fudge's Waratah Thoroughbreds that made the headlines by securing the topper on a day when fillies dominated, and [lot 138](#) has boundless potential for the track and the paddocks.

Consigned by Haras de la Perelle, the bay is the first foal out of His Highness The Aga

Khan's smart Sanjida (Ire) (Polish Precedent), a three-time group-placed half-sister to Sarafina (Fr) (Refuse to Bend {Ire}). That high-class 4-year-old is being geared towards the Arc this term and is already a treble winner at the highest level, including in last year's G1 Prix de Diane. Michael Goodbody, who was again acting on behalf of Fudge, said, "There is no doubt that she was the best-looking filly in the sale and, when you look to the top, you have to pay the price. She is absolutely gorgeous and is by the hottest sire from a top-class family."

Consignor Jurgen Winter was overjoyed afterwards. "It is fantastic--I didn't expect such a price," he commented. "She looked good, but my reserve was around €500,000. Usually, I keep the fillies and sell the colts, but I felt that this was the right time to sell this one, and also we have the mare, who is very young." Winter added, "I bought her in a private deal with the Aga Khan before Sarafina came around, and she is now in foal to Dubawi (Ire)."

Moments earlier, Waratah had come out on top for another Galileo, this time a colt from the draft of Ecurie des Monceaux. [Lot 133](#) is out of the 2007 GI Beverly D. S. winner Royal Highness (Ger) (Monsun {Ger}), who also placed in the GI Joe Hirsch Turf Invitational, G1 Prix Ganay and in two renewals of the G1 Prix Vermeille. Goodbody added, "He has a stallion's pedigree and is also a great-looking horse and a great mover. We will sit down and discuss everything after the sale, but they will both stay in France. We currently have horses in training with Andre Fabre and Carlos Laffon-Parias, but nothing has been decided yet."

'Makin' an Impact...

Denied the day one topper, Paul Makin was set on purchasing another jewel of the Monceaux draft by Montjeu (Ire) yesterday. Out of listed winner Prudenzia (Ire) (Dansili {GB}) and therefore closely related to that mare's half-sister Pacifique (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire})--runner-up in the G3 Prix Minerve this month--[lot 125](#) descends from a Fittocks Stud family that was put in the spotlight by the brilliant triple Oaks winner Alexandrova (Ire) (Sadler's Wells). That luminary's G1 Cheveley Park S.-winning 3/4-sister Magical Romance (Ire) (Barathea {Ire}) and her full-sibling Saree (GB) have sold as broodmare prospects for 4.6-million guineas and \$2 million, respectively. Montjeu's influence on this family has already been in evidence via his talented son Washington Irving (Ire), who finished in the mix in the 2008 G1 Epsom Derby. Grant Pritchard-Gordon of Badgers Bloodstock sat with Makin, and outlasted Demi O'Byrne with a bid of €600,000. "She is a beautiful filly from a quality family that is only going to extend its influence," the agent explained. "Paul [Makin] also has a Galileo 2-year-old three-parts sister to Alexandrova in training in Chantilly with my nephew Rupert Pritchard-Gordon and also has horses in training with John Hammond, so, although this filly will stay in France, we have not decided who will train her yet." Makin, who was paying his first visit to Deauville, added, "It's only money. We enjoy it and let's hope she develops into a nice filly." **Arqana Coverage cont. p2**

A Dansili (GB) full-sister to Prudenzia and half to Pacifique as lot 119 had added further luster to the Monceaux draft when selling to Alan Cooper for €500,000. “She has been bought for the Niarchos family and I think the bidding said it all,” Cooper commented. “We really liked her and were keen to have her. She is by a hot sire from a good family and, being French-bred, I would imagine she will stay in training here.” Henri Bozo of Haras de Monceaux celebrated the leading vendor title. “We had two fantastic fillies from the same family to sell today and both were looking well,” Bozo noted. “Lucien Urano and Lady O’Reilly were partners in the two fillies and were advised by Patricia Boutin. They have invested a lot of money over the years, and it is nice to see them have some reward.”

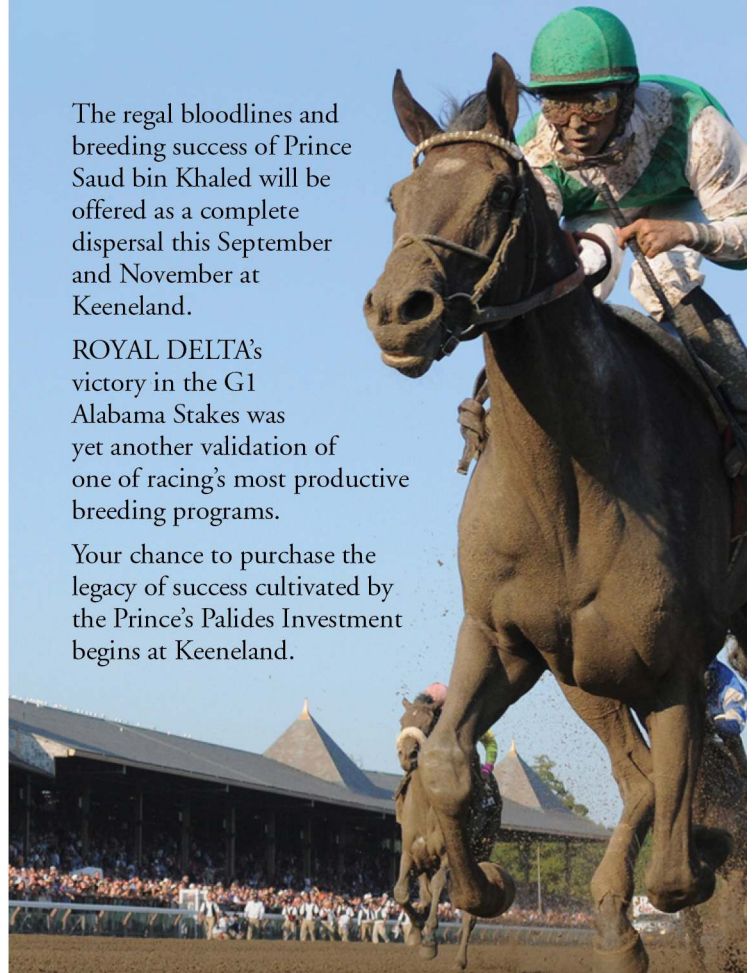

‘Cloud’ the Issue...

Moonlight Cloud (GB) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) showed herself to be out of the top drawer by tearing apart a competitive field assembled for the G1 Prix Maurice de Gheest earlier this month, and her half-sister by Darley’s freshman Manduro (Ger) (Monsun {Ger}) was guaranteed to make an impact here. Consigned by Haras d’Etreham as lot [187](#), the February-foaled chestnut has significant roots in Ireland, and that is where she will be headed after Demi O’Byrne prevailed with a bid of €400,000. Her listed-placed dam Ventura (Ire) (Spectrum {Ire}) was campaigned by Charles O’Brien for his famous father Dr. Vincent O’Brien, who also trained the second dam, the 1989 G3 CL Weld Park S. winner Wedding Bouquet (GB) (Kings Lake). This family also features a clutch of Aidan O’Brien’s stable stars, headed by the champion Imagine (Ire) (Sadler’s Wells) and her high-class, but ill-fated son Horatio Nelson (Ire) (Danehill). “She is an extremely good-looking filly with a fabulous pedigree, but what is also important is that she is from a family that can run and are real racehorses,” O’Byrne said. “Considering all that, I don’t think I overpaid for her.” O’Byrne’s other purchase was also from the Etreham draft. Lot [201](#), a Danehill Dancer (Ire) colt whose dam has produced the dual group-winning Zinziberine (Zieten), herself responsible for the 2009 G3 Prix de Cabourg winner Zanzibari (Smart Strike), was bought for €260,000.

New Blood...

Whereas Raven’s Pass (Elusive Quality) had stolen the show among the first-crop sires on Monday, it was the turn of New Approach (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) to take centre stage yesterday. Two of his yearlings made it into the top seven. The first fell to Robert Collet, who stepped in to pay €260,000 for Knocktoran Stud’s lot [193](#), a colt whose family is synonymous with that trainer. He campaigned the group-winning dam Zelding (Ire) (Warning {GB}) and her similarly talented daughter Beauty Is Truth (Ire) (Pivotal {GB}), as well as her current representative Glorious Sight (Ire) (Singspiel {Ire}). The latter placed in both the G1 Poule d’Essai des Pouliches and G1 Prix de Diane this term, while Beauty Is Truth’s daughter Fire Lily (Ire) (Dansili {GB}) won the G3 Anglesey S. and finished second in the G2 Lowther S. since the book was printed. Darley’s freshman was also responsible for lot [211](#), a daughter of the 2007 G3 Prix Andre Baboin winner Bal de la Rose (Ire) (Cadeux Genereux {GB}), who is herself a half to last year’s G1 Poule d’Essai des Poulains and G1 Prix du Jockey Club hero and sire Lope de Vega (Ire) (Shamardal). Meridian international was successful with a bid of €280,000. Ghislain Bozo said, “She has been bought for a Russian client and will stay in France to be trained. She was a lovely-looking filly with a top-class pedigree.”

After Anabaa...

Anabaa's legacy will live long after his untimely death in 2009, and his final group of yearlings to be offered featured a pair of in-demand lots from Haras du Quesnay yesterday. First up was lot [134](#), a January-foaled filly whose dam is a half to Anabaa's 2002 G1 Prix Jean Prat hero and sire Rouvres (Fr). She was knocked down to Gill Richardson Bloodstock for €250,000. Later, the Hirai brothers paid €200,000 for lot [150](#), his grandson of the 1985 G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches winner Silvermine (Fr) (Bellypha {Ire}). She is the dam of Sillery and ancestress of this year's G2 Grand Prix de Chantilly winner and G1 Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud third Silver Pond (Fr) (Act One {GB}).

It's Good to Be the King...

Another sire whose influence is set to extend far beyond his stud career is the recently pensioned Kingmambo, and his sole representative did not disappoint. From Haras des Capucines, lot [127](#) is a son of the 1997 GI Santa Anita Oaks runner-up Queen of Money (Corporate Report), making him a half-brother to GSP Quiet Cash (Real Quiet). Prime Equestrian had the final say at €220,000. Moments later, they paid the same amount for Haras d'Etream's lot [139](#), a full-sister to 2009 G1 Preis der Diana runner-up Soberania (Ger) (Monsun {Ger}) from the Monsun-dominated family of Schiaparelli (Ger), Samum (Ger) and Salve Regina (Ger).

Sylvain Swoops...

Bloodstock agent Sylvain Vidal, a regular feature at this venue, he snapped up a pair of choice yearlings in a daughter of Teofilo (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) and son of Hurricane Run (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}). The first was offered as lot [178](#) on the behalf of Team Hogdala by the Coulonces Consignment and is a half-sister to Gerard Augustin-Normand's recent Deauville debut scorer Beauvoir (Ire) (Footstepsinthesand {GB}), a colt trained by Jean-Claude Rouget. "She is a lovely filly who is very racy and athletic, and Beauvoir won nicely first time out," Vidal said after receiving no counters to his bid of €240,000. "Teofilo ought to have everything to make a nice sire, and we have happy memories buying from this consignor after they sold us Le Havre (Ire) (Noverre). The owner will decide which trainer he sends the yearlings to afterwards." The Hurricane Run colt from d'Etream as lot [195](#) is a half to last year's G2 Prix Greffulhe runner-up Handsome Devil (GB) (Footstepsinthesand {GB}) from the immediate family of Hurricane Run's recent G3 Prix du Lys hero Kreem (GB). He cost Vidal €220,000.

They Came From All Over...

This sale has been marked by its variety of buyers. Alongside the Australian, Russian and Japanese presence was the Saudi connection represented by Jean-Pierre Deroubaix's French Bloodstock Agency. He paid €200,000 for lot [118](#), a son of Galileo from Haras des Capucines who is out of the 1994 G1 Prix Marcel Bousac runner-up Piquetno (Private Account). That makes him a half-brother to the group winner and stakes-producer Dietrich (Storm Cat) from the family of Denon, Aldebaran, Good Journey and Spinning World. "I also bought lot 97 for a Saudi Prince yesterday and one will stay in France, while the other will go to England," Deroubaix commented. Also selling for that sum were two other progeny of Galileo from the Capucines draft. Lot [197](#), a son of the 2000 G3 Queen Mary S. runner-up Al Ihsas (Ire) (Danehill), was sold to Mohammed Kazeem Al Anseari, while Horse France snapped up lot [219](#), a daughter of the 2004 G1 Phoenix S. fourth Billet (Ire) (Danehill) from the family of GISW Talinum (Alydar). Also on the €200,000 mark was Mezeray's lot [168](#), a Danehill Dancer half-sister to the 2008 G1 Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere hero Naaqoos (GB) (Oasis Dream {GB}) who was another added to the Meridian International roster. That agency's Ghislain Bozo revealed that she had been bought for members of a syndicate that he created named Capital Pur-Sang and which own half of yesterday's G2 Prix de la Nonette heroine Dream Peace (Ire) (Dansili {GB}).

Numbers Game...

Yesterday's steep upturn in fortunes meant that the session clearance rate of 78%, average of €155,217 and median of €110,000 all represented marked improvements on 2010. While the overall average of €145,510 is down by 3% on its equivalent, the cumulative median stood at €115,000 which was up by 3% on last year. Arqana President Eric Hoyeau commented, "We are very pleased with tonight's stronger momentum, which confirmed the upward trend we observed in the second part of Monday's session. All key indicators have reacted positively and it was very positive, once again, to see so many individual investors acting at the upper end of the market." Coil Fires Bullet Workout...

Karl Watson, Mike Pegram and Paul Weitman **Coil** (Point Given), last seen annexing the GI Haskell Invitational S. at Monmouth Park July 31, fired a four-furlong bullet in :46.12 at Saratoga Tuesday in preparation of a likely start in Saturday's GI Travers S. He worked in company with stablemate and fellow Travers candidate GII West Virginia Derby winner **Prayer for Relief** (Jump Start), who stopped the clock in :47.31. Coil galloped out five furlongs in :58.44 with jockey Martin Garcia aboard. "Coil, if he looks great tomorrow, he is definitely running in the Travers," trainer Bob Baffert revealed. "I liked his work today. He showed a lot of energy going to the pole. Martin [Garcia] said he hasn't felt that great in a while. I was looking for something like that. Prayer for Relief is a really nice horse and he gave him a big head start, and [Coil] came to him the way he usually does like he's not moving. I can't believe he worked as fast he did, but he's just a really good horse. So right now, all systems [are] go." Coil breezed with a protective cup shielding after scratching his right eyeball last week. "I was having a little problem with the eyeball, but I worked him with a protective cup that he could see through and I'm glad I did because he had a lot of mud on it," Baffert added. "He came back and it looks like he's cooling off like it wasn't really hard on him. The last few times we've worked him here he's come back here and wanted to step on his tongue coming off the track because it was really deep. But the track was pretty fast today, [NYRA] had it in great shape." **Click for video** of the workout.

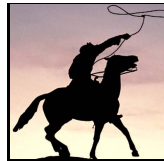

Dream Peace hit the board for owner Richard Strauss in the Sept. 6 Listed Criterium de l'Ouest at Craon and, having changed hands at Arqana's Oct. 2 Arc Sale, did so again wearing fresh silks in the Oct. 26 Listed Prix des Sablonnets at Nantes. Opening this campaign with a May 7 conditions score at Saint-Cloud, she bagged the Listed Prix Volterra back there 11 days later before hitting the board again in the July 3 G3 Prix Chloe at Chantilly. Dream Peace lined up here off a narrow loss to Dalarua (Ire) (King's Best) in the G3 Prix de Psyche over course and distance July 30, and exacted revenge on that rival to claim a career high. Settled in rear until inching closer on the home turn, she loomed large in the straight to lead inside the two pole and was ridden out to hold the late thrust of Epic Love a shade cozily. "It is a misconception that Dansilis can not go on soft ground, and today's result has shown that," said trainer Robert Collet. "It seems Dream Peace has taken on the characteristics of her dam, who, along with her granddam, loved soft going. She has won on fast, too, so can go on any ground. She is a Group 2 winner now, so we have no other choice than to go for a Group 1. The [G1] Prix de l'Opera [at Longchamp Oct. 2] would therefore be a logical step."



Racetrack Round-Up

Morny Hero Dabirsim Staying Home...

Trainer Christophe Ferland has had a change of heart and will not point Sunday's G1 Prix Morny hero Dabirsim (Fr) (Hat Trick {Jpn}) at the G1 Middle Park S. Instead, Ferland will aim his star juvenile at the Oct. 2 G1 Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere. The conditioner initially nominated Newmarket's six-furlong dash as the likeliest target, citing a reluctance to go beyond that trip at this stage, but after reflection has decided to target Longchamp's seven-furlong event. "It was a very good result and fantastic to win such a big race, especially at Deauville, as the atmosphere was fantastic," Ferland said. "At the beginning of the year, I didn't dream of having a horse as good as Dabirsim. It is very kind that people rate him as the best 2-year-old, and I agree. We have to see the others run, but so far he is the best one in France. I don't know if he is the best in Europe--we need to run against the other good horses in Britain--but he's won the premier Group 1. He hasn't been entered in the Middle Park, and I think I'm going to give him a seven-week break before the Prix Lagardere on Arc day. Frankie Dettori will ride him again."

Overdriven Out of Hopeful; 'Surprise' Likely Retired...

Repole Stables's **Overdriven** (Tale of the Cat) will not contest the Sept. 5 GI Hopeful S., owner Mike Repole told *Daily Racing Form* yesterday. After missing a pair of works, the undefeated colt was shipped to the New Bolton Equine Clinic in Pennsylvania where a nuclear scintigraphy proved inconclusive. Additional X-rays taken Monday are still under analysis by vets. "I do know the Hopeful is 100% out," Repole said. "We haven't ruled out the [Oct. 8 GI] Champagne S. [at Belmont]." Overdriven--a \$350,000 KEESEP yearling--won his career debut by 3 1/2 lengths at Belmont July 1 before posting an easy four-length victory in the July 24 GII Sanford S. In other news from the Repole barn, **Giant Surprise** (Giant's Causeway) will likely be retired after sustaining a leg fracture shortly after his debut July 30, Repole told *DRF*. Repole told *DRF* that he is "99%" certain that the bay will be retired after he won a six-furlong maiden race at Saratoga, running six furlongs in 1:10.23. The colt was pulled up during the gallop out shortly after his 4 1/4-length win.

WHO'S HOT NOW

One statistic that really jumped out at me, when I was reading over the initial sorts of material from the Aug. 1 run of new APEX ratings (I know, get a life), was how far ahead of their contemporaries Giant's Causeway and Distorted Humor are as sires of 2005-2011 ABC Runners (top eight percent earners). Even given that the same horse can count as more than one year-starter ('runner'), and A, B, or C Runner each year it races (up to seven), for **Giant's Causeway** (305) and **Distorted Humor** (294) to be so far ahead of their pursuers (**Danehill Dancer** is third, with 235) has to be significant, has to tell us something. In this case, I think it's about class, combined with unusually good (relatively speaking) durability.

One of the key concepts in the APEX method of stallion analysis is to measure the frequency with which a stallion sires good runners. 'A Runners'--top two-percent earners--are key because they are the class horses, but B and C Runners are important to know about, too, because the sobering fact is that only about eight percent of runners--essentially, ABC Runners--break even or better. It's important to know which are the most consistent sires at producing those, as well as which are the most consistent sires of 'top two percent' horses, or A Runners. Today I'd like to focus on the 2011 APEX statistics: which have been the best sires for producing A Runners, and ABC Runners, in 2011?

In 2010, the leading sire of new A Runners was the Japanese sire **King Kamehameha**, a son of Kingmambo whose first foals were just 4-year-olds last year. Japanese sires do have vast numbers of foals and runners; sometimes we count their statistics in with the results for North American and European sires, sometimes we don't. In any case, last year King Kamehameha sired 17 new A Runners to lead all sires. In 2011, now with his first 5-year-olds, he is again the leader, with 15 new A Runners. As I've mentioned elsewhere, most of the top Japanese sires are sons of Sunday Silence, so when you get one who isn't, like King Kamhehameha, he's liable to work over Sunday Silence mares. Sure enough, eight of his 15 new 2011 A Runners are out of Sunday Silence mares, and a ninth is out of a mare by Fuji Kiseki, a son of Sunday Silence.

The leading North American and European sires of new 2010 A Runners were--there they are again--**Distorted Humor** (14) and **Giant's Causeway** (13). They lead the corresponding 2011 list, too; **Distorted Humor** has 13 new A Runners so far this year, **Giant's Causeway** has 11. But a horse who has suddenly jumped up and is having a huge year is **Kitten's Joy** (El Prado), with 10 new A Runners this year.

This ties him with the young Japanese sire **Deep Impact**, one of Sunday Silence's top sons on the racetrack, and who is racking up huge numbers, with his first crop just 3-year-olds this year. Kitten's Joy just has 4-year-olds, and is having such a good year that he even has more new A Runners than the top sire with first 4-year-olds, the sensational **Dubawi**, who has nine new A Runners in 2011. Anybody who beats Dubawi at anything has to be doing something right. Five horses are tied with eight new 2011 A Runners each: Seattle Slew-line **Malibu Moon** (A.P. Indy) and **Tapit** (Pulpit); the very useful In Reality-line sire **Successful Appeal** (Valid Appeal); **Stay Gold**, another Japanese son of Sunday Silence; and **Trippi**, whose first South African yearlings sold so well earlier this year. Trippi is by End Sweep, a son of Forty Niner.

We like to know who the current leading sires of ABC Runners are, because these are the sires that are making people money. Here we placed the Japanese sires in a separate list, as we did for the statistics through the end of 2010 (*TDN, February 9, 2011, pp10-11*). Last year, King Kamehameha led all sires, with 75 ABC Runners in 2010; this year, he already has 69. **Kurofune** (69 last year), a son of French Deputy, is again second in Japan--albeit a distant second--with 45 ABC Runners in 2011; **Manhattan Cafe**, another of the most successful sons of Sunday Silence, is third, with 43.

Among North American and European sires, Distorted Humor (42) leads Giant's Causeway (39) in yet another one-two finish. Tapit, with just his first 5-year-olds, is a strong third, with 37 ABC runners this year. His F2006 contemporaries aren't too far behind, either. In fact, all are also in the top 20 NA/EU sires of 2011 ABC runners: **Medaglia d'Oro** and **Speightstown** have 29 ABC Runners each thus far in 2011; **Candy Ride** has 24. But, after Tapit, number four in NA/EU in 2011 is Malibu Moon (34), followed by **Smart Strike** and **Galileo** (33 each), and Dansili (32).

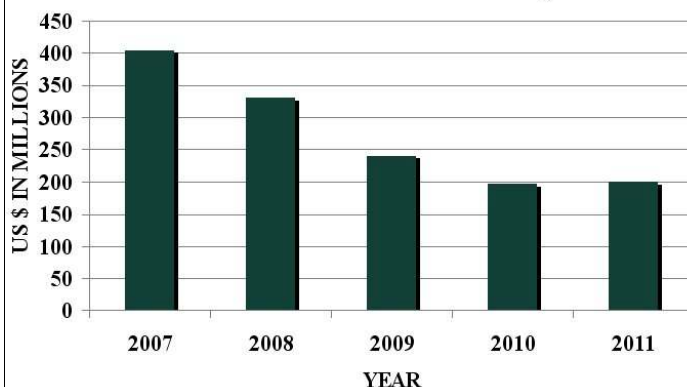
Looking at sires with their first 4-year-olds racing this year (third-crop sires, F2007, first foals 2007), two Japanese sires head this list: **Zenno Rob Roy**, another son of Sunday Silence, with 26 ABC runners thus far in 2011; and, making his first appearance on a leaders' list, 2005 G1 Dubai World Cup winner **Roses In May**, a son of Devil His Due. He has 24 ABC runners this year. Tied for the lead among North American and European F2007 sires, with 23 ABC runners each, are **Dubawi**; **Shamardal**; and a rapidly rehabilitating **Ghostzapper**. Among sires with their first 3-year-olds, Japan's Deep Impact is in another county, as they say, with 33 ABC runners in 2011. Canadian sire **Old Forester**, a son of--you guessed it, Forestry--is a distant second, with 18. Then come **Bernardini** (16); **War Front** (14); another Japanese-based son of Sunday Silence, **Heart's Cry**, and **Holy Roman Emperor** (13 each). **Henny Hughes** is next, with 12.

Weekly Sales Ticker by Bill Oppenheim

"The Year-to-Date auction totals for North American and European sales reported by TDN are revealing, as you'd expect. The market has held its own against last year's figures -- gross and clearance rate up a little, average down a little -- but no real growth. The gross for the corresponding sales has still been cut in half since 2007, the number catalogued and sold is down by 45 percent - so the average, for the survivors, is down only by about 13 percent from 2007. But at least, after four straight years of decline, revenues are slightly up in 2011".

Purse Increase for Arlington Park:
Edited Press Release

Arlington Park management has announced that average purse distribution will be increased by \$10,000 per day from \$202,000 to \$212,000, effective with the Thursday, Aug. 25 racing program. The purse hike is a result of strong purse earnings from the pari-mutuel handle on the Aug. 13 International Festival of Racing program. "The success of last week's International Festival of Racing exceeded our projections and, as a result, we are able to again raise our purses for overnight races," Arlington Park General Manager Tony Petrillo said. "When Arlington Park is able to bring top quality stakes races to a national and international market, the revenues earned from those races allow us to bolster our overnight program for the horsemen who race with us season long."



New Jersey Breeders File Appeal:

The Thoroughbred Breeders' Association of New Jersey has filed an appeal with the Superior Court Appellate Division in response of Governor Chris Christie's July 1 veto of legislation which would have allocated \$15 million in state subsidies from casinos to benefit the racing industry in the Garden State. During a June 29 meeting, the New Jersey Racing Commission gave the racing-friendly legislation, which was approved in February, the green light, but Christie quickly vetoed the measure two days later. "The purpose to this litigation is to clarify the racing commission's award of funds for New Jersey-bred Thoroughbred horse racing and to seek a resolution with the New Jersey Racing Commission that will encourage the growth and continuation of this industry," Michael D. Schottland, attorney for the Thoroughbred Breeders' Association of New Jersey, said in a statement.

Selena Gomez Bumps Timonium Opening Race:

A sold-out appearance by Disney star Selena Gomez has prompted Timonium officials to make first post for Friday's opening day card at the Maryland State Fair at 12 p.m., an hour earlier than previously announced.
