(Macho Uno), and this year, it will be Fox Hill Farm's **Havre de Grace** (Saint Liam) trying to carve her place in history. Winner earlier this term of the GI Apple Blossom H., the 4-year-old filly exits a nose defeat at the hands of arch-rival Blind Luck (Pollard's Vision) in the GI Delaware H. July 16, but the effort has not deterred connections from taking on a deep Woodward field, which is missing only GI Whitney H. hero Tizway (Tiznow). "[Trainer] Larry [Jones]

and I have been talking about what we were going to do," Rick Porter told a Tuesday afternoon NTRA teleconference while explaining the rationale to run in the Woodward. "We were looking at our numbers and we're improving, and even though we got beat [in the Del 'Cap], we thought it was time to take on the boys. We really didn't want to run in the GI Personal Ensign unless Blind Luck had come, but when we saw she wasn't coming, we figured we'd take on the boys." The Woodward assumes added importance in terms of year-end implications, given that the connections of Blind Luck took a pass on last weekend's GI Pacific Classic. A win by Havre de Grace in the Woodward would go a long way towards clinching a divisional championship and possibly more. "After we got beat by a nose, we felt we had to do something aggressive to get everybody's attention," Porter explained. "We either needed to run against Blind Luck again, or take on the boys. We'd like to make history and let her go on and possibly be in the same league as Zenyatta by winning the [GI Breeders' Cup] Classic." **Cont. p2**

**HEFFERNAN RETAINS SO YOU THINK RIDE**

Seamie Heffernan will be back aboard **So You Think (NZ)** (High Chaparral {Ire}) in Saturday's G1 Irish Champion S. at Leopardstown, it was confirmed yesterday. Having partnered the 5-year-old to success in the G1 Eclipse S. at Sandown July 2, the Ballydoyle stalwart earned another chance to pilot the ex-Australian champion in the 10-furlong contest. "The information I have from Coolmore is that Seamie Heffernan takes the mount again, and we're very pleased to have him," Duncan Ramage, racing manager to co-owner Dato Tan Chin Nam, told *Racing Post* yesterday. "The decision is made by Coolmore for us, as we're pretty much the silent partner now. They know what they're doing. We're delighted Seamie is riding the horse as he's unbeaten on him and, hopefully, he can keep that run going on Saturday." Ramage revealed that a possible tilt at the G1 Tatts Cox Plate at Moonee Valley Oct. 22 is looking unlikely, adding that a crack at the Oct. 2 G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe at Longchamp is under consideration. "Put it this way, if he's to come to Australia, he's coming for only one race, which involves traveling across the equator to the Southern Hemisphere, while if he remains in Europe there are multiple options," Ramage pointed out. "Coolmore said they wouldn't talk about it until after Saturday, and you don't need to teach them to suck eggs. My opinion is that it would be fantastic for Australia if he were to go and win the Arc and make history."

In advance of Saturday's test, Havre de Grace was on the Delaware main track for an Irene-delayed breeze Tuesday morning, blowing out three furlongs in :35 3/5. Porter minces no words in assessing his filly's place amongst horses he has campaigned, like the late Eight Belles, Round Pond and Hard Spun. "Larry thinks she's the best horse he's ever trained," Porter offered. "She's got the best Ragozins of any horse I've ever had. I think she and Blind Luck, depending on distance and how many horses are in the race, are the two best horses, male or female." Havre de Grace will have one additional prep between the Woodward and Breeders' Cup weekend, where, if all goes well, she'll be a candidate for the Classic, in addition to the GI Ladies' Classic. While Porter would favor a start in the GI Beldame S. at Belmont Park Oct. 1, Jones is considering sending the filly to Keeneland for the GI Juddmonte Spinster S. Oct. 9.

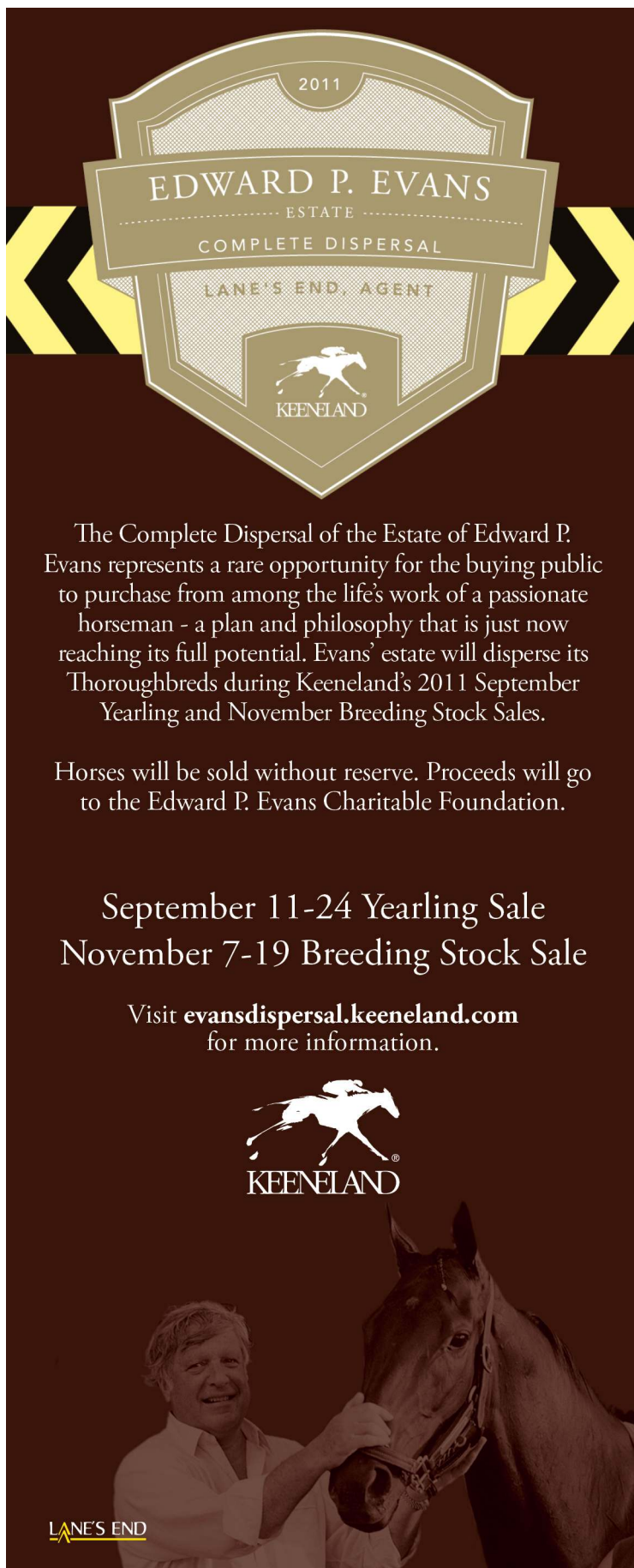

## THE MAIN EVENT


The preliminaries are pretty nearly over. In the last two months 1,263 yearlings have sold for \$107,333,450 in three Fasig-Tipton sales (Kentucky July, Saratoga, and Saratoga NY-breds), the OBS August sale, and at Deauville. This was 7% fewer sold than last year's corresponding 1,356 yearlings that grossed \$102,497,000. So the turnover is up 5%, and the average for those sold is up 12%, from \$75,588 last year to \$84,983 this year. Those figures exclude yesterday's Fasig-Tipton sale in Texas; Doncaster, in England, today and tomorrow; Baden-Baden, in Germany on Friday. The Washington sale in Seattle and the Canadian sale at Woodbine next week are also coming up before Keeneland, too.

It's fair to say the yearling market has at least held its own so far this year, but they've basically just been warming up the stage for the main event: the Keeneland September Yearling Sale, opening, as it did last year, with evening sessions Sunday and Monday, Sept. 11-12 making up Book 1; and finishing, after 13 days of selling, Sept. 24. Over the course of 14 days last year, 3,059 yearlings sold for a total of \$198,257,900. Keeneland September alone accounted for 31% of the 9,890 yearlings sold at the principal North American and European yearling sales in 2010, and for almost 37% of the \$540 million in revenues generated. It is the world's biggest and most important yearling sale, no doubt about it.

Keeneland has conveniently catalogued 211 yearlings in Book 1 this year, the exact number they catalogued last year, which was the first of the new, revised first-week format. At least after Book 1 we'll be able to make direct comparisons with last year, when 127 yearlings (60% of those catalogued) brought in \$44,305,000, and averaged \$348,858. The comparative figures we see Tuesday morning the 13th will be direct comparisons.

After that it gets murky. Book 2 last year was four days, with 1,302 horses catalogued; this year Book 2 is three days, with 935 catalogued. The number of days in Book 2 has declined by 25%; the number of yearlings catalogued by 28%. If prices remained stable at last year's averages, that would translate into about a \$25-million drop in first week revenues, which were just under \$142 million last year. Interestingly, though, the first two books have 1,146 yearlings catalogued this year; in 2009, when the first week was four days (now five), with two full days each for Books 1 and 2, there were 1,212 yearlings catalogued (just 5% more than this year), and the week grossed \$117.6 million--almost exactly \$25 million less than in 2010.

Anyway, there's sure to be a big drop in Book 2 gross, but that should also mean the beginning of the second week should be stronger than the beginning of the second week last year and recover some of the Book 2 losses.

Every year it is striking what a high percentage of yearlings are sired by a relatively small number of stallions. In the first week this year, 86% (984) of the 1,146 yearlings catalogued are by no more than 37 stallions which each has 10 or more catalogued in Books 1-2. Eleven stallions with 30 or more catalogued in Books 1-2 account for half of those, or 43% of all yearlings catalogued in the first two books. You can see who these market-makers are in the accompanying Table, compiled by *TDN's* Gary King. Just look in the "Bk 1-2" column for those with 10+, or 30+, and you'll see right away who the big guns are: in fact, you'll see one of those 11 names in the sire slot in the three-cross pedigree almost 500 times in the first two books, and you'll see one of those 37 names almost 1,000 times. As they go, so goes the week, and the sale.

Four sires have 50 or more catalogued in the first two books: they are this year's uber-commercial stallions. When these yearlings were bred in 2009, two of these four were just having their first 3-year-olds, while the other two were established sires, standing for \$125,000 each in 2009. I think **Medaglia d'Oro** breaks **Giant's Causeway's** record for number of horses catalogued in the first week, with 73; and, by the way, with another 22 catalogued in the second week, there are 95 yearlings by Medaglia d'Oro catalogued in the entire sale. I'm sure that's a record, too. He's one of the F2006 'Fearsome Foursome,' and another of them, **Tapit**, has 56 yearlings catalogued in the first week (78 overall). The two \$125,000 stallions among these four are Unbridled's Song, with 66 catalogued in the first two books (83 overall); and the aforementioned former record-holder, Giant's Causeway, with 53 catalogued in the first two books (68 overall). **Bernardini** (45) and **Tiznow** (41) come next on the week 1 roster.

As you'd expect when the markets are low, the emphasis is on proven stallions: 29 of the 37 sires with double-digit numbers in the first week are proven (meaning, in this case, they have 3-year-olds and up); that's 78%, whereas when the markets are flying and the unproven horses are back in favor, it's more like 50-50. Just three sires with their first 2-year-olds this year have 10 or more catalogued in the first week: Darley's **Street Sense** (37) and **Hard Spun** (29); and Gainesway's **Corinthian** (12). Five first-year sires have 10 or more catalogued, headed by Lane's End's **Curlin** (29) and Ashford's **Henrythenavigator** (27). Also with double-digit first-week representation are: Hill 'n' Dale's **Midnight Lute** and Darley's Irish-based **Raven's Pass** (11 each); and Three Chimneys' **Big Brown** (10).

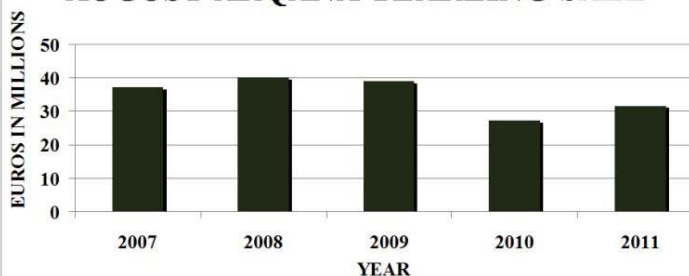
# Weekly Sales Ticker

"Though their average didn't advance that much (three percent), in the other important metrics Arqana's flagship Deauville August Sale bounced back after receipts dropped by nearly a third in 2010. This year's gross was up 17 percent from that, and the number of horses sold was up 13 percent from last year, with virtually the same number catalogued. The sale's gross this year was 21 percent below the record 2008 gross, which outperforms the market generally. OBS held its own but that is a market that has just about been cut in half since 2007."

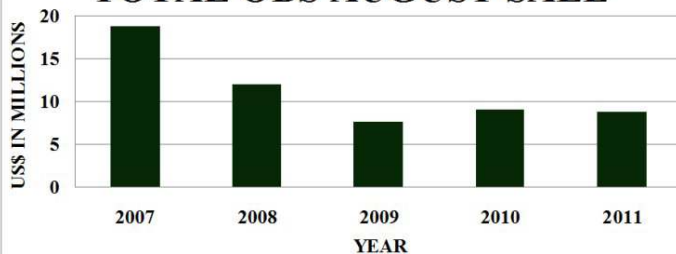
## AUGUST ARQANA YEARLING SALE

## The SARATOGA Spotlight Race of the Day



### Race 8 - P.G. Johnson S., f, 2yo, 1 1/16mT

In races with very lightly raced runners, it's important to find those who can improve and it usually helps to be skeptical of those who look best on paper off just one or two starts. While Crazy Party (A.P. Indy), Alaura Michele (Arch) and My Due Process (Henny Hughes) appear to be the most talented off of their maiden scores, all three will be overbet. Crazy Party looked good graduating over this trip, but she could not have had an easier ground-saving journey; Alaura Michele appears to have beaten a weak field at Belmont, and while she should have no problem stretching out based on pedigree, her ample early speed could do her in; My Due Process seems unlikely to get the distance--especially if she gets caught in a duel with Alaura Michele. **New Wave** (Tale of the Cat) has upside and dirtied form. The \$300,000 KESEP yearling was well-backed for her sprint debut on the synthetic at Arlington July 9, and dueled throughout an above-average pace to score by a neck. Show horse Stephanie's Kitten (Kitten's Joy) returned to impress when stretched out on the grass, and would probably be the second choice in this spot. New Wave was confidently placed in the GII Adirondack S. by trainer Rusty Arnold here Aug. 14, and never factored to be fourth of five. It's quite possible she's strictly a turf/synthetic horse, though, and it would be wise to draw a line through that race. By a sire who can obviously produce turf routers (see Gio Ponti), New Wave is a half-sister to General Quarters (Sky Mesa). While General Quarters was a graded stakes winner on conventional dirt, his two most noteworthy wins came in the GI Blue Grass S. and GI Woodford Reserve Turf Classic--both at nine furlongs and on Polytrack and turf, respectively. Bourbonstreetgirl (Langfuhr) is another one to use by default--she has a win over course and distance and had minor trouble in her debut for a conditioner who doesn't win much first out. Note that Visionaria (GB) (Byron (GB)) is expected to scratch. *For more Saratoga analysis, visit the [TDN Blog](#).*

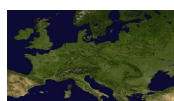

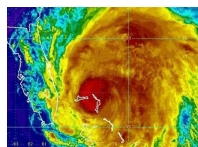
