From 1996 through 2002, no trainer could touch Bob Baffert where it came to the GI Del Mar Futurity, as the silver-haired conditioner sent out seven consecutive winners of the meet-ending feature. For the next five years, he was 'shut out,' but, following the victory of **Drill** (Lawyer Ron) in yesterday's renewal, Baffert has now won three of the last four

## Been There, Done That...

In addition to Baffert racking up another Futurity, owner Mike Pegram was winning the race for the third time. He won the event--a Grade II in 2002--with Icecoldbeeratreds (In Excess {Ire}) and teamed with partners Watson and Weitman to score two years back with champion Lookin at Lucky (Smart Strike). The most expensive of his late sire's 50 first-crop yearlings to go under the hammer, Drill was nonetheless a disappointing eighth at even-money to kick off his career here July 30, but added blinkers and was a professional neck winner Aug. 13. Rafael Bejarano was in the irons for that score, but was back on odds-on **Creative Cause** (Giant's Causeway) here, and, with Martin Garcia back in the saddle, Drill settled in fifth early on as the field raced to the far turn. He appeared to come off the bridle a bit at the three-eighths, and Garcia had to get after him, but the colt was switched out to launch his bid at the quarter pole. Widest of all, he was always doing the best work and found the wire just ahead of **Majestic City** (City Zip), who came out under a left-handed stick and interfered with Creative Cause. Majestic City was subsequently disqualified to third. The Futurity is a Breeders' Cup Win and You're In event for the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile, though Drill is not currently nominated to the Breeders' Cup. His connections can make him Breeders' Cup eligible for life with a \$100,000 supplement or would have to ante up \$200,000 for a single Breeders' Cup race.

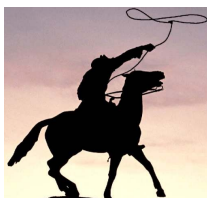

## RACETRACK Round-Up

### HILDA'S PASSION TO BE OFFERED AT

**FTKNOV** Despite undergoing surgery to repair a non-displaced condylar fracture the day after her victory in the GI Ballerina S. at Saratoga, Starlight Stables and C. E. Glasscock's Hilda's Passion (Canadian Frontier) will be offered for sale at Fasig-Tipton's Kentucky Mixed Sale in Lexington Nov. 6. The 4-year-old filly, who streaked home to take the Ballerina by 9 1/4 lengths Aug. 27, will be offered as a racing or broodmare prospect. "Dr. Larry Bramlage, who performed this routine surgery in late August, says that bringing her to the sale in November will not compromise her conform or safety in any way," Starlight's Jack Wolf said in a statement. Added Bramlage, "The condylar fracture reduced completely, and her joint is back to normal. After a two- to three-month healing process, we fully anticipate she will be capable of regaining her previous form."

**FREDERICK ENGELS SOLD** Pearl Bloodstock's **Frederick Engels (GB)** (Iceman {GB}) has been purchased by Hong Kong interests, according to *Racing Post*. Successful in the June 14 Listed Windsor Castle S. at Royal Ascot and July 7 G2 July S. at Newmarket, the former David Brown-trained colt was unplaced on his last two starts in the Aug. 7 G1 Phoenix S. at The Curragh and G1 Prix Morny at Deauville a fortnight later. However, he had excuses for both reversals, having had significant trouble in running in the former and returning from France with a respiratory infection. "We accepted an offer for Frederick Engels last week and he will race in Hong Kong," David Redvers, bloodstock advisor to owner Sheikh Fahad Al Thani, told the *Post*.

**NATHANIEL HAS CHAMPION OPTION** Lady Rothschild's **Nathaniel (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) could run in the G1 Champion S. after his tilt at the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe, revealed trainer John Gosden. While the Oct. 2 Longchamp highlight is top of the agenda for the G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth S. hero, a quick return could be on the cards 13 days later for the 10-furlong feature of Ascot's inaugural Champions' Day. "He's not having a race prior to the Arc to give us the option to go for the Champion S. as well," his conditioner explained. "Thirteen days between races is very tight, and we'll have to assess how he is after Longchamp, but, if you go into the Arc fresh, then you give yourself the chance to run in the Champion as well."

**SET TO SHINE**

Tagged as the "Fillies' St Leger," this renewal of the G2 Park Hill S. features The Queen's up-and-coming **Set To Music**, who has won her last four starts, culminating in a first black-type success in the Listed Galtres S. at York Aug. 18. In that 12-furlong contest, she had **Cracking Lass** 2 1/4 lengths back in second, with **Polly's Mark** and **Spin** in third and fourth, respectively, and it will be a surprise if she is upstaged by any of that trio. Last year's disqualified G1 Epsom Oaks runner-up **Meeznah** bounced back into the limelight when registering a decisive win in Goodwood's G3 Lillie Langtry S. July 28, but it was a case of back to the drawing board when a well-beaten seventh in the G3 Geoffrey Freer S. at Newbury last time Aug. 13. "Meeznah seems fine and nothing came to light after Newbury other than the ground was loose and she didn't seem to handle it very well," trainer David Lanigan told *PA Sport*. "We freshened her up and gave her a full check-up and nothing else came to light. She seems well and worked fine on Saturday, so we will see. It is a race that we have planned all year for her, so, hopefully, it was just the ground at Newbury." Pound-for-pound, few fillies in training are as tough as the aptly named **Sense of Purpose**, but she needs to progress again after hard-fought scores in Leopardstown's Listed Challenge S. July 14 and G3 Ballyroan S. Aug. 4. "We have been delighted with her this season, because she is not the biggest," Moyglare Stud Farm's Manager Stan Cosgrove commented. "She won the same race as our Irish St Leger runner-up Profound Beauty on her latest start, and she is very, very gutsy. She is full of heart and I love the way she puts her head down in a finish. [Trainer] Dermot [Weld] was talking about the Melbourne Cup for her, but that might come a year too soon."

**MOULIN TAKES SHAPE**

Yesterday's forfeit stage saw a clutch of withdrawals from Sunday's G1 Qatar Prix du Moulin de Longchamp, leaving a maximum of 13 still in the mix for the mile contest. While Goldikova (Ire) (Anabaa) is bound for the same venue's G1 Prix de la Foret Oct. 2, a distaff star still remaining is Richard Strauss's **Immortal Verse (Ire)** (Pivotal {GB}). She beat Goldikova in the Aug. 15 G1 Prix Jacques le Marois and is one of a trio from the Robert Collet barn in the list, alongside **Royal Bench (Ire)** (Whipper) and **Handsome Maestro (Ire)** (Dansili {GB}). The former, successful in last year's G2 Prix Daniel Wildenstein over this track and trip and second in the G1 Hong Kong Mile, was an encouraging fourth in the Marois, while Handsome Maestro bids to regain some old form, having been runner-up in the 2009 G3 Prix Paul de Moussac and fifth in that year's G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains. Alongside leading contender **Excelebration (Ire)** (Exceed and Excel {Aus}), Khalid Abdullah's **Cityscape (GB)** (Selkirk), John Manley's **Dick Turpin (Ire)** (Arakan) and Andrew Tinkler's **Dubawi Gold (GB)** (Dubawi {Ire}) buffer the British challenge. Aidan O'Brien has last year's G1 Phoenix S. winner **Zoffany (Ire)** (Dansili {GB}) and the G1 Irish 2000 Guineas hero **Roderic O'Connor (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) engaged. Godolphin have a sole contender in last year's runner-up **Rio de la Plata** (Rahy). Saeed Nasser Al Romaithi's triple group scorer **Rajsaman (Fr)** (Linamix {Fr}), Ecurie Wildenstein's Apr. 30 G1 Prix Ganay hero **Planteur (Ire)** (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) and the Marquesa de Moratalla's May 15 G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains winner **Tin Horse (Ire)** (Sakhee) complete the entries ahead of today's supplementary stage.

**BEAUTY IN THE EYE OF THE VET?**

When the Keeneland September Yearling Sale gets underway Sunday, the fanfare will focus on a few select million-dollar babies, but a growing legion of less-fancied sales horses are finding extraordinary success on the racetrack. Consignors can give plenty of examples of horses with perceived vet issues and buyers who took a chance and were rewarded handsomely.

The Consignors and Commercial Breeders Association (CBA) has taken up an initiative to educate buyers and sellers alike, with a special emphasis on vet issues and sales horses.

Joe Seitz, director of sales for his family's Brookdale Farm, is on the CBA board and serves as the group's education co-chairman. He is one of many horsemen tracking the success of sales graduates with vet issues and he knows the importance of disseminating that information to potential buyers.

"All of the breeders are trying to produce the best horses they can for the buyers, and all of the buyers are trying to get the best horse they can to go on and train to race," Seitz explained.

"Sometimes horses have issues that may be perceived as having a negative effect on their campaigns. What we are trying to do is show that some of these horses that may have had X-ray issues or throat issues have gone on to do great things. Obviously, some of those radiographic issues may be enough that they will affect that horse's career, but not all of them do. So it is great to see success stories."

Among Brookdale Farm's own success stories is 2001 Kentucky Derby winner **Monarchos** (Maria's Mon). Brookdale consigned Monarchos on behalf of pinhooker Murray Smith and partners at the 1999 Fasig-Tipton Saratoga sale. The future Derby winner RNA'd for \$90,000 at that auction before selling to John Oxley for \$170,000 the following spring at the Fasig-Tipton February sale.

"Monarchos had an OCD on his front ankle," Seitz recalled. "We thought he was a very special horse, and we were disappointed he didn't make his reserve at Saratoga. He had an OCD on an ankle, but it obviously didn't affect his career, and it was nice to see that he went on and did well."

OCDs, or osteochondritis dissecans, occur when cartilage thickens and separates from the bone and most commonly forms on front ankles, hocks and stifles. Among a host of Grade I winners with OCDs, according to the CBA, are 2001 champion 3-year-old filly **Xtra Heat** (Dixieland Heat), 2002 champion 2-year-old filly **Farda Amiga** (Broad Brush), 1997 Horse of the Year **Favorite Trick** (Phone Trick), 2003 GI Breeders' Cup Sprint winner **Cajun Beat** (Grand Slam) and 2005 GI Breeders' Cup Mile winner **Artie Schiller** (El Prado {Ire}).

"OCD--those three capital letters--it sounds worse than it is," Seitz commented. "There are different degrees, just like anything. Just like any condition that a horse or human has, there are different degrees that will help you determine whether this is an issue that should keep you from buying the horse. An OCD can be clinical and be causing discomfort or distension in the joint; it could be a fragment that might be causing problems in the joint or be perceived to cause problems in the future; or it could be a much lesser degree to where it might eventually go away. That's why, just because you hear the words OCD, it doesn't mean that it will be detrimental to the horse's career. It could also be fixable. A lot of these horses that we've been finding

were horses that were operated on and never looked back."

Seitz has history on his side.

"Two of the last five winners of Triple Crown races have reportedly had stifle surgery to remove OCDs, and one of them had screw and wire in a knee to fix an angular limb deformity," Seitz said. "By

most people's account, the Classic races are the highest tier of racing in America. If three out of the last five winners of those races had issues and went on to win at the highest level, I think it goes to show that good horses don't necessarily have to be perfect when they are yearlings."

### Taylor Has Seen it All...

Taylor Made Sales Agency has been the leading consignator at the Keeneland September sale for the past seven years. The team's Vice President of Public Sales Mark Taylor knows every horse has his own issues and none of them are perfect.

"Taylor Made has a big billboard at our yearling complex that has every Grade I winner we've ever sold on it," Taylor explained. "And it's got their yearling photos and, if you look at all those pictures and all the sires and the dams and the prices they brought, there are million-dollar ones and there are \$5,000 ones, there are big ones and little ones, and there are ones that had great pedigrees when they sold and there are ones that had no pedigrees when they sold. There are ones with ugly heads and ones with beautiful heads. There is every combination you can imagine, but the thread that runs through most of those horses is that they weren't perfect on scope and x-ray. And that is not a knock on the veterinary community. They are doing the best they can, but it's a subjective thing. It's like having me and five other people go look at your horse conformation-wise. The notes may not sound that similar. I use a different language. Some things offend me, other things might offend somebody else. It's the same way with vets."

Taylor Made consigned **Unbridled's Song** (Unbridled) to the 1995 Barretts March Sale on behalf of Ernie Paragallo's Paraneck Stable, which had bought the colt for \$200,000 the previous August at Saratoga. It looked like the gray 2-year-old had sold for a world-record \$1.4 million, but the sale was nullified when the potential owners found a chip in an ankle.

"Unbridled's Song's vet issues were never operated on, never

corrected, they were never even treated," Taylor recalled. "We really didn't think it was a big deal to begin with--it was just an unfortunate situation. The buyer was from Japan and, I think, there was a language barrier. And back then there was no repository, so he was doing a post-bidding inspection. He didn't have any time to digest it before he bid and then when they called him and told him the horse had a couple of these problems, he reconsidered and said he was going to turn the horse back."

Unbridled's Song went on to win the 1995 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile and 1996 GI Florida Derby and GII Wood Memorial and is now one of the country's leading sires.

Taylor Made sold another future 2-year-old star with potential vet issues in **Vindication** (Seattle Slew). The colt attracted plenty of attention on the sales grounds prior to the 2001 Fasig-Tipton Saratoga auction, but the talk always seemed to come back to X-rays of his ankles.

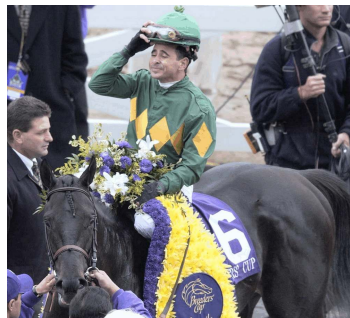

“There was a lot of debate on whether Vindication was clean enough on X-ray for people to bid on him,” Taylor explained. “We had people coming back and X-raying him multiple times and people asking us questions, asking us if he’d ever been lame. There was a lot of commotion. You could tell people really wanted to buy the horse, but they were scared because he had these problems.”

Of the 10 people who vetted Vindication at Saratoga, only two, trainer Bob Baffert, bidding for James McIngvale, and Satish Sanan’s Padua Stable, passed the colt. After a protracted bidding duel, the yearling sold to Padua for \$2.15 million. Hardly a bargain, until the colt culminated an undefeated season with victory in the GI Breeders’ Cup Juvenile and was named champion 2-year-old of 2002.

The advent of the sales repository and advancement in veterinary technology means buyers have the opportunity to obtain more information than ever before about potential purchases. The additional diagnostic tools and examinations naturally lead to more diagnoses.

“With the advances, especially in radiographic technology with the digital X-rays, it is just amazing what you can see that you couldn’t see before,” Taylor admitted. “Fifteen years ago, you would go through, say 150 yearlings at Taylor Made and we wouldn’t have one comment on a knee in an average year. You might get one horse with something in a knee every two years or something. Now, it’s like 30% of the horses have spurring in their knees, roughening in their knees. There is nothing that we’re doing differently with these horses. They are raised the same, they are fed the same, they are exercised the same and so, the only answer to me, is that with the digital X-rays, you are seeing things that have always been there, but you’re seeing them for the first time.”

Still, Taylor is not trying to put the veterinary genie back in the bottle.

“This is a big issue and I totally understand the buyer’s shoes,” he said. “You’ve got to do your due diligence and you don’t want to take any unnecessary risks, but nobody has all the answers. They can’t look in there and see what problems that might cause one horse to have a shortened career, whereas another horse might be fine with it.”

**Keeneland September on a Budget...**

Ken McPeek is a trainer who has built a solid reputation as a horsemen who finds value in sales horses. Among the stars McPeek has purchased are Horse of the Year **Curlin** (Smart Strike) and Grade I winners **Noble’s Promise** (Cuvee), **Hard Buck (Brz)** (Spend a Buck), **Prince Arch** (Arch), **Sarava** (Wild Again), **Take Charge Lady** (Dehere), **Harlan’s Holiday** (Harlan) and **Einstein (Brz)** (Spend a Buck).

Finding value at auctions often means making compromises, according to McPeek.

“I’m always looking for value, I’m trying to find a little hole in the market because I’ve never really had a huge budget,” McPeek explained. “Going back to my early years buying horses, my budget was \$6,000. So I’ve got to find that horse where maybe somebody overlooked something that I can deal with that maybe somebody else can’t. There is no such thing as the perfect horse. There is no such thing as the perfect yearling. They all have something--either the pedigree is not strong enough or they have vet issues. Or maybe they’re not conformationally perfect. So you’ve got a lot of factors.”

Two-time Horse of the Year Curlin won the 2007 GI Breeders’ Cup Classic and GI Preakness S., as well as the 2008 G1 Dubai World Cup. The handsome chestnut won over \$10 million on the racetrack, but before he was a household name to racing fans across the globe, he was a less-than-stellar Keeneland September yearling in 2005. McPeek was able to snag the future champion for just \$57,000.

“When I looked at Curlin as a yearling, he had a large left ankle where the surgery site had been,” McPeek recalled. “It was a little inflamed still and hadn’t healed yet. So I had one of my regular vets go check his X-rays and documents out. Then I had another vet go out and look at him totally with a clear mind and they both said the same thing, ‘Give him a little bit of time and he’ll be fine.’”

McPeek admits not everyone has the luxury of taking a chance on a questionable racing prospect.

“[Vet issues] completely eliminate most pinhookers,” McPeek confirmed. “That means they have to race and they have to deal with it. Having trained horses as long as I have, I know what I can deal with and what I can’t. I think, if I was buying horses as an agent and then I turned around and asked an owner to take a horse that’s got an issue, that has flaws, then it leaves you open to criticism. But in my case, I’m probably a little more independent in that. If I buy this horse, and it had a vet issue, then I have to train that horse, too. So I better be able to deal with it without complaint.”

**Dream Empress** (Bernstein) was another bargain Keeneland September purchase for McPeek. The trainer purchased the filly for \$60,000 in 2007.

“She was a filly that I bought who had chips in both front ankles as a yearling and everybody turned their noses up at her,” McPeek recalled. “I bought her anyway. I sent her straight from the sales grounds to Rood and Riddle to Dr. [Larry] Bramlage and they removed the chips out of both front ankles. And I hadn’t even sold her to anyone yet.”

Dream Empress went on to win the GI Darley Alcibiades S. and was second in the 2008 GI Breeders’ Cup Juvenile Fillies. She earned \$763,154 on the racetrack.

McPeek is a big proponent of all the informational tools available to buyer’s today.

“I think it is a great thing for the buyers,” he said. “People who do all their homework need all of that information and I’m thankful that they give it to me. It lets me do my job a little bit better.”

But there was one case where McPeek flew blind in the Keeneland sales ring and it all worked out perfectly. The Arkansas native purchased a yearling by Hold That Tiger for just \$13,000 out of the 2006 sale. Named **Old Man Buck**, the chestnut was third in the 2007 GI Lane’s End Breeders’ Futurity and was twice stakes-placed while earning \$330,094 on the racetrack.

“Old Man Buck didn’t even have a set of X-rays and nobody would even bid on him,” McPeek said. “I had to gamble because there weren’t any X-rays in there and, from what I was told, the seller didn’t even think the horse was worth X-raying. But he had the body--he had the physique to do what we needed him to do.”

“Horses are all their own little puzzle,” McPeek said. And it’s clear he thoroughly enjoys putting that puzzle together, especially when it involves picking out sales horses.

“I get a bigger kick picking out sales horses than anything I do as a horsemen,” he laughed. “I love the challenge of finding good horses in the course of a 14-day sale. Number one, you have to have the stamina. Then you have to have a really good team of people, and by the way, I’ve got just fantastic guys who work with me. Dominic Brennan is an Ocala-based trainer who has short-listed for me for 15 years and then Rory Callis, who picked out Noble’s Promise, has also helped for a long time.”

Is the team ready for the September sale?

“It’s hard to take everyone’s temperature this early, but I usually just get in the game and then, when they call, I’m ready,” McPeek explained.

**SLEW CITY SLEW PENSIONED AT AIRDRIE**

**Slew City Slew** (Seattle Slew--Weber City Miss, by Berkeley Prince), the sire of 54 black-type winners including \$5-million earner Lava Man, has been pensioned from stud duties at Airdrie Stud due to declining fertility. Himself a two-time winner at the highest level for Joseph Allen and Tayhill Stable, Slew City Slew retired to Airdrie in 1990 and soon gained a reputation as a sire of sound and talented runners who have amassed earnings to date of over \$43 million. Among Slew City Slew's other top progeny are

Win City, victorious in the 2001 Prince of Wales S. and runner-up in that year's Queen's Plate en route to Canadian Horse of the Year and champion 3-year-old colt honors. Lava Man was his sire's most prodigious earner after being claimed for \$50,000 during the summer of his 3-year-old season. The following July, Lava Man won the Hollywood Gold Cup, the first of his three consecutive wins in that race and the first of his seven career Grade I victories. He was the first to post Grade I successes on turf, dirt and synthetic tracks. "Slew City Slew was the quintessential racehorse sire. He established a great reputation amongst breeders as an affordable stallion that would get you a good, sound, tough racehorse and that's why he was able to stay competitive in the tough Kentucky market for all these years," commented Airdrie Stud's Breerton C. Jones. "He's been awfully good to us for a long time, and he'll continue to live out the rest of his life in the best of care."

**CANDY RIDE COLT TOPS WASHINGTON SALE**

A colt by nationally prominent sire Candy Ride (Arg) fetched a final bid of \$105,000 to top the Washington Thoroughbred Breeders and Owners Association's summer yearling sale held Tuesday at Emerald Downs in Auburn. For the second time in recent history, the sale was divided into a summer yearling session and a mixed horses section. Bred and consigned by Rick and Debbie Pabst's Blue Ribbon Farm, the sales-topping hip **68** was purchased by Ed and Theresa DeNike. The Washington-foaled youngster is the second produce of Sudden Departure (Demons Begone), who carried the silks of the Pabsts to victory in the King County H. at Emerald in 2007. A full brother to Washington's favorite son Noosa Beach (Harbor the Gold) was knocked down to Ken Alhadeff's Elttaes Stable for \$82,000. Hip **13** was consigned and bred by Pam and Neal Christopherson's Bar C Racing Stables. The 75 summer yearlings grossed \$933,500 for an average of \$12,447, a 20% increase on the same figure from 2010. The median of \$5,700 was marginally lower than the \$5,750 achieved in 2010.

**HOLLYWOOD RELEASES STAKES SCHEDULE**

The \$750,000 GI CashCall Futurity, to take place Sunday, Dec. 18, is the focal point on the stakes calendar during the 2011 autumn meet at Hollywood Park, which kicks off Nov. 11 at the Inglewood oval. The Futurity has produced no fewer than six winners of the GI Kentucky Derby and the winners of 15 Triple Crown races since its inception back in 1981. Lookin at Lucky (Smart Strike) took the 2009 renewal en route a 2-year-old Eclipse Award. He added a victory in the GI Preakness S. and a followed with a 3-year-old championship. The Hollywood Turf Festival shares the spotlight with the Futurity and will once again take place over the Thanksgiving Day holiday weekend. The Turf Festival features a Grade I event on each day—the Matriarch Nov. 25, the Citation Nov. 26 and the Hollywood Derby Nov. 27. The GIII Miesque S. is the supporting event on the Matriarch undercard, while the GIII Generous S. shares a spot on the Hollywood Derby program. Two other Grade I events take place during the fall meet. The Hollywood Turf Cup for older turf horses is scheduled for Sat., Nov. 19, while the Hollywood Starlet, sister race to the Futurity, is set for Sat., Dec. 10. The autumn stakes schedule, which includes a total of 17 races worth a combined \$3 million, kicks off with the Real Quiet S. Saturday, Nov. 12.
