Olivier Peslier gave her an excellent ride and he timed his run to perfection from what seemed an impossible position. If she comes out of this race fine she will definitely come back in the [G1] Prix Marcel Boussac [over course and distance Oct. 2]."

SEA FACES EIGHT

Khalid Abdullah's Sea Moon (GB) (Beat Hollow {GB}) will have to tackle eight rivals as he bids to justify short-priced favoritism in tomorrow's G1 Labrokes St Leger at Doncaster. Highly impressive when an eight-length winner of the G2 Great Voltigeur S. at York Aug. 17, the Sir Michael Stoute-trained three-parts brother to the 2003 hero Brian Boru (GB) (Sadler's Wells) has pleased in his subsequent work and all the signs are positive for the up-and-comer. "We've always liked him and were hopeful going to the Voltigeur, but we didn't expect him to win in that fashion," Stoute commented. "The way he traveled through the race and then picked up was impressive and that was only his fourth race. We had the Derby in mind with him, but he had mucus on his lungs in the spring time and a fungus and it took a little time to clear up. We got more than we expected at York, even though he'd gone forward in his preparation. He loved the conditions at York, where it was a bit moist and dead and we'd love the same ground at Doncaster. The vibes are good with him, but it's the most competitive St Leger we've had for many years. He's got a proper Leger pedigree, his three-parts brother won the race so you'd be hopeful that stamina wouldn't be a problem." Field, p6

RCI REPORT: THE FACTS ON DRUGS IN U.S.

RACING The Association of Racing Commissioners International released a report Thursday entitled, "Drugs in U.S. Racing - 2010, The Facts," which underscored the RCI statement, "With more rigorous standards than the Olympics, professional horse racing has the most aggressive drug testing program in professional sports, testing for more substances with greater sensitivity than anyone else." Citing an article printed in *USA Today* in May, the RCI report refuted the perception that illegal drugs are "rampant," "endemic," and "widespread" in horse racing. Statistics on Lasix use were reported separately, and demonstrated that the number of violations was a microscopic 36 from 324,215 samples tested, or .0001%. The number of Lasix violations was down 33% since 2001. The report added, "EIPH [exercise induced pulmonary hemorrhage] is the only equine condition that has warranted an exception to permit a prophylactic treatment on race day with medication. It is wrong to equate the use of this medication to paint a picture that racing is "drug ridden." However, it went on to say, "The statistics in this report should not be interpreted to say that there are not challenges facing horse racing's drug testing program." While lauding the efforts of the industry, particularly through initiatives such as the Racing Medication and Testing Consortium and the National Thoroughbred Racing Association's Safety and Integrity Alliance, it added, "These efforts do not mitigate the need to ensure that racing commissions have adequate resources available to maintain an expansive and effective drug testing program that can evolve as scientific advances are made in both testing technology and equine care." SUMMARY OF RCI REPORT

- 324,215 biological samples taken from racing horses were submitted to testing labs in 2010
- Less than one half of one percent (.493%) of those tested samples were found to contain a substance not allowed by medication rules
- Of those, 94% were overages of legal therapeutic medications at concentrations in excess of permitted levels. These medications are used routinely in equine care by licensed veterinarians and cannot be equated with "horse doping"
- Only 47 of the over 320,000 samples tested in 2010 contained a Class 1 or Class 2 substance that could qualify as "horse doping"
- Possible "Horse doping" accounted for 0.015% of total samples tested. Such instances have remained rare for the past 10 years despite dramatic increases in testing sensitivity.
- Overall medication violations in 2010 were 20% less than 2001.
- The \$35 million collective investment by the US state racing commissions on drug testing dwarfs the entire \$26 million budget for the World Anti-Doping Agency.

CLARIFICATION: Thursday's *TDN* incorrectly stated the payments that would be required for G1 Del Mar Futurity hero **Drill** (Lawyer Ron) to be eligible for the Breeders' Cup. There is no longer any "supplementing" into a Breeders' Cup race for horses that were not nominated as foals. Runners not nominated to the Breeders' Cup program as foals who were sired by a nominated stallion in the year of conception to the Breeders' Cup, European Breeders' Fund or the Common Fund or through the new international stallion program of 2011, must be nominated by Oct. 24 as a Horse of Racing Age for \$100,000 for lifetime eligibility to the Breeders' Cup program. Runners whose sires were not nominated to the Breeders' Cup program in the year of conception must have a \$200,000 payment made for them by Oct. 24 through the HORA program. The owners of all horses nominated through the HORA program then pay the appropriate pre-entry and entry fees, unless their horse won a Breeders' Cup Challenge race. Since Drill was not nominated as a foal to the Breeders' Cup program, but his sire, Lawyer Ron, was nominated in the year of conception, the owners must pay \$100,000 by Oct. 24 to join the Breeders' Cup program. As the Del Mar Futurity was a Breeders' Cup Challenge race, his owners then gain free entry into the Juvenile and a \$10,000 travel allowance to Louisville for the Championships. There are no additional payments required.

WINSTAR TO AWARD SEASONS IN KENTUCKY CUP DISTAFF *(Edited press release)* The owners of each of the first three finishers in the GIII Kentucky Cup Distaff on the WinStar Kentucky Cup Day of Champions Sept. 24 at Turfway Park will be awarded a complimentary season to a WinStar Farm stallion in addition to purse earnings, it was announced Thursday. The stallions with a 2012 season to be given away are 2010 GI Kentucky Derby winner Super Saver (Maria's Mon), MGISW Colonel John (Tiznow) and MGSW Hold Me Back (Giant's Causeway), who won the GII Lane's End S. at Turfway as a 3-year-old. The Kentucky Cup Distaff, a 1 1/16 mile race for fillies and mares, three and up, carries a \$100,000 purse. Nominations close Sept. 15. "This concept is a throwback to the old days when Atlantic City used to run the Matchmaker [GIII, now run at Monmouth]," said Elliott Walden, president and CEO of WinStar. "With these three exciting young stallions, we see this as an opportunity for an owner to get their mare off on the right foot."

DEL MAR CONCLUDES With attendance on par with the 2010 meet, and total handle figures down just 4.2%, Del Mar officials were pleased with the results of the 2011 season that ended Wednesday. "I'm not going to get into the obvious things about the economy and lack of racing stock and all those other ready-made excuses," Del Mar CEO Joe Harper said. "What I want to say is this: We adapted, we adjusted, we partnered, we promoted and we worked hard. In the end, we managed to do what most everyone in this business hopes to do--we conducted a helluva good race meeting that was fun for everyone involved." The track had announced a record purse underpayment Sunday that will result in an additional \$1.5 million to horsemen, a result of the better-than-projected business this summer. Daily average overnight purses at the meet totaled a record \$630,000, up 13.7% from a year ago, and the highest in North America. The "Ship and Win" program, which offered bonuses for horses that came in from out of state to race at Del Mar, attracted 107 runners. Field size was 8.4 horses per race, up from 8.2 in 2010. Opening-day attendance was up for the seventh straight year, with a single-day record crowd of 46,588.

Meeznah could be on her way to Flemington for the race that stops a nation after trainer David Lanigan suggested the Nov. 1 G1 Melbourne Cup as an option following her decisive success in this "Fillies' St Leger". In the doldrums after a near-miss in last year's G1 Epsom Oaks--after which she was disqualified due to testing positive for a prohibited substance--the bay looked to be back to her best when breaking Goodwood's track record in the July 28 G3 Lillie Langtry S., but may have been jaded by that experience when subsequently down the field in the G3 Geoffrey Freer S. at Newbury Aug. 13. Always traveling with ease here, she followed the two leaders throughout, and once she was committed approaching the quarter pole, was always keeping Set To Music comfortably in arrears. "She was a bit flat at Newbury because I think her run at Goodwood took a lot out of her, but was in tremendous shape today," jockey Frankie Dettori said. "I was always traveling like the winner." Lanigan added, "We can't make heads nor tails of her run at Newbury, and I was a little bit worried I'd gone to the well once too often, but the ground was loose on top and they finished strung out there. We gave her a good check-up and freshened her up, and she had the right ground today. I'll talk to the owners about a plan, but I entered her in the Melbourne Cup with a view to seeing how she got on today."

Alanza had shown abundant speed earlier in her career, and stamina in her recent races, and Johnny Murtagh utilised that combination to notch a first pattern success for the Aga Khan homebred. After displaying a potent finishing kick when annexing the Listed Platinum S. over a mile at Cork July 31 and Tipperary's Listed Fairy Bridge S. over nearly 7 1/2 furlongs last time Aug. 18, the chestnut was held on to early among the group racing towards the stand's side. As Chachamaidee hit the front approaching the final furlong, Alanza quickened impressively to join the fray and, in the end, it was her staying power that saw her assert in the final yards. "She has come on leaps and bounds, as she was a little bit buzzed up earlier in the year and not a great ride," Murtagh said. "She was running over shorter trips to help her settle, but the penny has dropped and now she's on an upward curve." Trainer John Oxx's assistant Jimmy O'Neill told *PA Sport*, "We have not had many horses to bring over this year, as we are lacking a bit of class. She is really a miler, but we had to bring her here and drop back to the seven furlongs, as there are not many options for her. The race didn't suit her, as there was no pace and she has to be held up, but we have learned a lot about her today." O'Neill added, "I would say that will probably be it for the year as she is very, very ground-dependent, and she will stay in training next year."

Aidan O'Brien yesterday scratched Wonder of Wonders (Kingmambo) and Freedom (Ire) (Hurricane Run {Ire}), leaving just **Seville (Ger)** to represent Rosegreen. Second to Casamento (Ire) (Shamardal) in the G1 Racing Post Trophy here in October, he was in the same spot in this term's G2 Dante S. at York May 12, G1 Irish Derby at The Curragh June 26 and G1 Grand Prix de Paris at Longchamp July 14. An unplaced effort in the June 4 G1 Epsom Derby and a below-par third in the Voltigeur last time out are the only blemishes on his otherwise consistent profile, and his trainer is unconcerned about his most recent disappointment. "Seville ran very well in the Dante at York in May, but then was slowly away and got a long way back at Epsom," O'Brien explained. "He then found it strange going down the hill, and it all may have happened a bit too quick for him that day. He worked well after that and then ran a good race at The Curragh. He then had a tough race in the Grand Prix de Paris, but came out of it well. We always had one eye on the St Leger after that, and wanted to slot in one race beforehand. He ran well at York; he might have disappointed some people, but the pace was a bit in and out and we were always looking towards the Leger." Aidan's 18-year-old son Joseph was announced as the rider yesterday, in line with many of the stable's raiders in Britain in 2011. Another young rising star in the firmament, Silvestre de Sousa, was named as the rider of Godolphin's **Genius Beast**. Currently second to Paul Hanagan in the Jockeys' Championship, the Brazilian-born jockey told the *Racing Post*, "To have a ride in a Classic for Godolphin is a big thing for me." Racing Manager Simon Crisford said of the Apr. 24 G3 Sandown Classic Trial winner, who was a latest fourth in the Voltigeur, "Genius Beast is an interesting horse. He does need to improve six to eight pounds to get into the mix, but his dam Shawanda (Ire) (Sinndar {Ire}) was very special and won the Irish Oaks. He is a nice horse, a Group 3 winner who we do think will stay quite well. He definitely deserves to take his chance and will give a good account of himself." 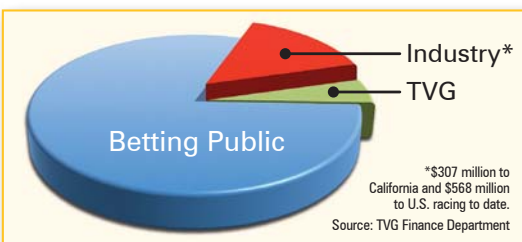

Godolphin's July 28 G2 Goodwood Cup and Aug. 20 G2 Lonsdale Cup hero **Opinion Poll** bids for a Cup treble in today's G2 Doncaster Cup, which is lacking a star but has a competitive look to it. After registering back-to-back successes in the latter contest at York, the 5-year-old renews rivalry with **Tastahil** and **Motrice**, who were ahead of him when second and third in this race 12 months ago, respectively. Trainer Mahmood Al Zarooni said, "Opinion Poll heads to Doncaster in good form. We had the option of going for the Irish St Leger on Saturday, but we decided to stay in England with him. Two and a quarter miles will suit him well and I think that the ground will be no problem--he won on good-to-firm at Goodwood and good going at York. I expect him to be there or thereabouts once again." Frankie Dettori added, "He's a model of consistency and never runs a bad race and gives 100 percent. It's going to be difficult and there are some decent horses in there, but he's the one they have to beat." One potential improver is **Tactician**, who followed a win in the 14-furlong Listed Silver Cup at York July 9 with a game second in the prestigious Ebor H. back over that track and trip last time Aug. 20. "It's obviously a big step up in class and trip, but the horse looks as though he will stay and every run this year he has improved," trainer Michael Bell told *PA Sport*. "With a little bit more improvement it will put him in the mix." Last year's runner-up **Tastahil** needs to do better than when beating only one home in the Goodwood Cup on his latest outing, but trainer Charlie Hills is hoping that his seasonal revival take place as normal. "He normally comes good at this time of year," Hills commented. "He ran a great race here a year ago and looks well in himself."

Sean Avery Sidelined With Bowed Tendon...

The on-again, off-again career of **Sean Avery** (Cherokee Run) is on hold--perhaps permanently--after the 5-year-old was diagnosed with a bowed tendon, *Daily Racing Form* reports. Owned by Black Swan Stable, the bay had quietly made a name for himself as one of the fastest short-track horses in the Midlantic region, with a runaway 11 3/4-length victory in the June 5 Longfellow S. at Monmouth Park (Beyer 112) and his recent upset of Trappe Shot (Tapit) in the GI A. G. Vanderbilt H. at Saratoga Aug. 7. He will be given time off and will be examined next spring to assess his ability to train on. "We caught it very early," John Destefano, the racing manager for Black Swan Stable, told the *Form*. "The plan is to send him to the farm and in six months we'll re-evaluate. If it looks good then we can start him back in training." The injury is similar to one that kept Sean Avery out of training for a year during his 3- and 4-year-old season. Trained by Allen Iwinski, Sean Avery has compiled a record of 10-6-1-2 and earnings of \$338,180.

Her first foal for Ashview was graded stakes winner **At the Half (Seeking the Gold)**, who in turn produced multiple graded stakes winner **Lu Ravi (A.P. Indy)**. At the Half sold in foal to **Storm Cat** for \$950,000 at the 1996 Keeneland November sale. At the same sale, the Wertheimers purchased her weanling by **Deputy Minister, Half Queen**, for \$325,000.

While **Half Queen** didn't exactly tear up the track, her first foal was the champion 2-year-old filly **Halfbridled (Unbridled)**.

"We're pretty proud of our involvement with the family," Gray Lyster admitted. "My dad has had this family for five generations back, and it's been really good to us."

So when the opportunity to obtain a daughter of **Half Queen** came available, the Lysters were ready to make a big investment.

"We follow the family quite a bit," Lyster explained. "We wanted to get back into it. We had sold **At the Half** after we got a couple of her daughters. We bred **Lu Ravi** and we sold **At the Half**. Although we do have a couple of other pieces of the family, we didn't have anything from the **Halfbridled** side."

A Wertheimer homebred, **Half A.P.** made only one start, finishing third in a Keeneland special weight in October of 2006.

“Todd Pletcher had Half A.P. and he really liked her,” Lyster recalled. “She ran one time at Keeneland. She broke poorly, she was trailing the field by 15-20 lengths, made a huge move and looped around most of the field and was still coming hard at the end. Through the grapevine, I was told that she had some freak accident in the stall and they were really disappointed.”

The Wertheimers put the filly through the ring at the 2007 Keeneland November sale and the Lysters pounced, securing the then 3-year-old for \$825,000.

“You don’t get a chance to get into families like this, so it was going to be real expensive, but we thought she had the ability and just hadn’t gotten the opportunity to show it,” Lyster said. “Plus she’s a gorgeous Pulpit mare. It was kind of a no-brainer.”

The investment looked like a shrewd one when the mare’s first foal by Empire Maker brought \$435,000 last August at Saratoga and then matured into a \$1.35-million juvenile purchase by John Ferguson.

Is there any disappointment in not holding on to the filly a few months for the chance at a bigger payoff?

“Lots of people said, ‘Bet you feel like you left money on the table,’” Lyster said. “But that is so not the case for us. We do everything to sell a horse as a yearling. We don’t go to 2-year-old in training sales--other people do, and more power to them--but that’s not our business. At Ashview, we sell all of our horses. It’s very rare that we RNA yearlings; we have a high clearance rate. It’s our job to do our best to sell them as yearlings and if people can go on and make money from there, we’re happy for them. We just hope they get into really good hands.”

Betwixt has three published works for trainer Kiaran McLaughlin in Saratoga.

“I’ve spoken to Kiaran and he says she is doing really, really well,” Lyster reported.

Lyster has high hopes for Half A.P.’s filly by Unbridled’s Song.

“The filly is so similar to last year’s Empire Maker,” Lyster commented. “They look a lot alike. The mare is just a gorgeous strong, nice mare. You can see a little bit of influence of Empire Maker in the 2-year-old. You can see a little bit of influence of Unbridled’s Song in the yearling, and now she’s got a Distorted Humor filly by her side. You can see a little bit of the stallion in each, but the mare just kind of carries herself through. It’s a big-time filly family and people are going to be pretty happy to see her. **Cont. p13**

“When we bought the mare, obviously it was a huge investment for us,” Lyster said. “Especially when the market really kind of fell out the next year. To be able to sell her first yearling for \$435,000 like we did last year was pretty special. And to come back with a nice filly like this, it’s big time.”

Wayne Lyster and his wife Margaret founded Ashview Farm in 1978 and, with sons Gray and Bryan and daughter Meredith, it has become a family affair. In addition to multiple graded stakes winner Lu Ravi (A.P. Indy), they are co-breeders of champion Johannesburg, as well as Grade I winner Deputy’s Report. The family’s broodmare band currently has about 35 head and its primary focus is commercial breeding.

“We love racing more than anything, but we can’t afford to have more than one or two in training at a time,” Lyster said. “It’s our business to sell. We get as much enjoyment from selling a really nice horse as we do from winning a race. That might sound crazy, but it’s what we do on a daily basis. We get up to foal mares and prep yearlings and our payoff is when we pass them on to somebody on the other side of the sales ring. We like to keep a filly every once in a while to keep families around--a lot less than we keep one around because we couldn’t sell it.”

Gray Lyster grew up on the farm, and in the family business. He admits he had every opportunity to change directions, but the Blue Grass kept calling him home.

“I went to boarding school in Connecticut and I went to Vanderbilt University in Nashville,” Lyster said. “But every time I came home, I was always working on the farm. We didn’t have babysitters when we were kids, we worked with the guys on the farm. It’s kind of all we knew. My parents never forced me or pushed me to do it, but our family is really, really tight. My mother, father, brother and sister, we work side by side every single day. I think it’s rare for a family to be able to do that and not want to strangle one another.”

“I went to Alaska for three summers and falls and I worked up there as a hunting and fishing guide right after I graduated and I was exceptionally passionate about that,” he continued. “But Alaska didn’t have any racing and they didn’t have my family, so Kentucky won out. I love the horses and the industry, but it’s more that this is my family. The farm and the guys on the farm are my family, even the dog. It sounds a little a corny, but I can’t imagine not being around them.”

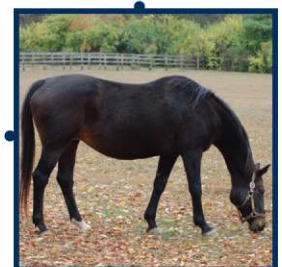

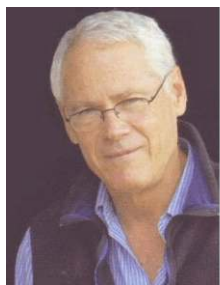

WHY THE BREEDERS' CUP IS REALLY IMPORTANT TO AMERICAN RACING AND BREEDING

Two reasons define the Breeders' Cup as the American organization with the most leadership potential: (1) Unlike other groups that may bark but have no teeth, the Breeders' Cup can establish rules for participation related to drug use, whipping, and other practices in need of reform, and then actually enforce compliance; and (2) by attracting a greater number of elite international stars to its signature event, the Breeders' Cup may eventually stage a true "World Championship" that will secure an important American presence in the rapidly evolving globalization of top-quality racing.

The Breeders' Cup is poised to lead. Whether they choose to expand their role or not is another matter. Should they decide to pursue a broader leadership agenda, however, the Breeders' Cup has positioned itself to grab the reins and make a difference.

As our industry wallows in dysfunction and self destructs through in-fighting and inaction, we need a group to rally behind that can provide relative cohesion and targeted direction that is aimed at raising all boats.

It is obvious to all that we need a centralized "league office" and standardization of racing rules, procedures, and penalties. Sadly, it is equally obvious that this will not occur without Congressional action. However, because industry resistance to Federal intervention is so entrenched and widespread, our only hope for some degree of reform and standardization must come from the emergence of one industry group with enough muscle and clout to go beyond simply forming committees and conducting studies.

The Breeders' Cup can never become the "league office" that we need. However, it has uniquely positioned itself to lead on important issues. Furthermore, it is especially qualified and unique in that it has increased its internal cohesion and outward effectiveness by introspectively examining itself, not by studying what others are doing or need to do.

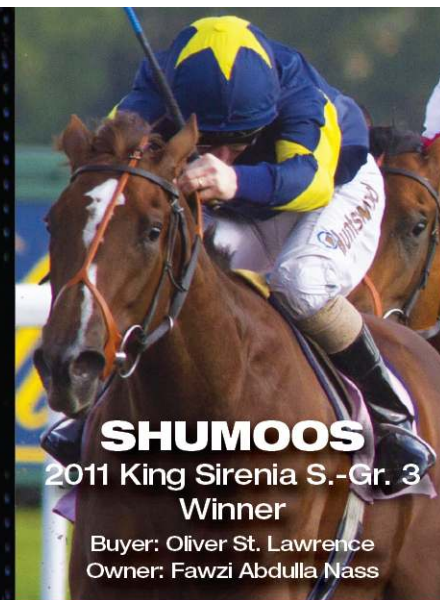
This self-examination has led to increased transparency, accountability, cooperation, and team building among Board members. Changes in governance have also resulted in the assembling of a Board composed of active and experienced horsemen with "skin in the game" who, on a volunteer and un-paid basis, are largely motivated by passion for the sport and a genuine desire to benefit the entire industry.

An organization with momentum and global perspective. Exciting achievements have been accomplished in a short period of time because of the hard work, common sense, perspective, and cooperative effort by Board members and management who collectively appear to understand the big picture and know how to get things done. Eligibility requirements for foreign horses have been revamped; an extensive "Win-And-You're-In" format has been strategically refined; and travel subsidies for foreign horses have been established to motivate and increase foreign participation. In addition, innovative marketing ideas have been developed to raise event awareness and to bring more people to the track on Breeders' Cup Saturday (e.g., "The Mystery Mutuel Voucher" and the "Classic Ownership Challenge," etc.). The nature and breadth of these accomplishments indicate that this group is functioning very well and also suggests that they are only getting started.

In short, the Breeders' Cup is currently defining itself as one of the foremost "can do-will do" organizations within the industry. As events unfold, its leadership stature and scope will be further defined by its resolve to establish policies and enforce penalties related to important issues such as drug use and whipping. If the Breeders' Cup is inclined to boldly lead by example in this regard, its actions will likely have trickle-down effects that can ripple across the industry to inspire others to also "be the change [they] wish to see in the world."

MARJU PENSIONED Shadwell yesterday announced the retirement of the 23-year-old **Marju (Ire)** (Last Tycoon {Ire}--Flame of Tara {Ire}), by Artaius). Having stood at Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum's Derrinstown Stud in Ireland since his racing career ended 20 years ago, the sire of Soviet Song (Ire), Viva Pataca (GB) and Indigenous (Ire) has covered for the last time. "Age has finally caught up with him," Derrinstown's General Manager Stephen Collins commented. "He's been here almost as long as I have and was one of the first horses to stand at Derrinstown. He hasn't been at his best recently and, after a spectacularly successful stud career like his, he owes us nothing." Bred by Pat O'Kelly's Kilcarn Stud and sold at the 1989 Goffs yearling sale for 440,000 Irish guineas, the three-parts brother to the brilliant Salsabil (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) was trained by John Dunlop. After finishing runner-up in the 1991 G1 Epsom Derby, he took the G1 St James' Palace S. at Royal Ascot just 13 days later before being retired due to a recurring injury to his stifle. His first crop included the G1 Prix Vermeille and G1 Yorkshire Oaks heroine My Emma (GB) and G1 Prix de Diane winner Sil Sila (Ire). He stood at a peak fee of €25,000 for the 2005 and 2006 seasons. He is best remembered for his five-time Group 1 scorer Soviet Song and Viva Pataca, one of Hong Kong's finest performers who garnered a total of eight victories at the top level. Indigenous also excelled there with four Group 1 wins, while recently he had been responsible for last year's G1 Irish 1000 Guineas heroine Bethrah (Ire) and GI United Nations S. scorer Chinchon (Ire) and Green Destiny (Ire), who looks an exciting prospect following his success in last month's G3 Strensall S. His record as a broodmare sire also stands up, with Canford Cliffs (Ire) (Tagula {Ire}) and the up-and-coming sire Big Bad Bob (Ire) (Bob Back) advertising his wares. "We have been very fortunate to stand Marju during his long and illustrious stud career," Collins continued. "His great looks, superb pedigree and his outstanding stud record certainly made our lives much easier attracting mares to him each breeding season. He was a wonderfully consistent stallion and a pleasure to deal with. He will be a hard act to follow. We all wish him well as he has rightly earned the easy life."

Consigned by Tweenhills Farm and Stud, hip [126](#) is out of the Listed-placed Vale of Belvoir (Ire) (Mull of Kintyre) and was secured by Stephen Hillen Bloodstock, who stood with trainer Kevin Ryan. A pair of colts realized final bids of £32,000, with hip [74](#), a son of Bahamian Bounty (GB) and the group-winning sprinter Lady Dominatrix (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}), snapped up by C R Marks. Consigned by Grovewood Stud, the March foal's half-sister Janina (GB) (Namid {GB}) raced in the Shadwell silks and scored at Listed level, and the new purchase will go into training with trainer John Gallagher. That price was later matched by Robin O'Ryan Bloodstock for one of the last of the Green Deserts consigned by Oaks Farm Stables as hip [112](#). That agent also signed for an Elusive City colt from the draft of Norton Grove Stud. Hip [53](#) is out of a half to one of Elusive City's finest performers in Soul City (Ire), who was successful in the 2008 G3 Prix la Rochette and was third in the following year's G1 Irish 2000 Guineas. While the median remained the same as 2010, the average of £9,966 dipped by 6%. "Tonight's St Leger Festival Sales continued where last week's Premier Yearling Sales left off, with a solid trade for the good-looking yearlings," said DBS Managing Director Henry Beeby. "Once again, there was strong demand for the best individuals and healthy interest from start to finish although it is fair to say this is an unforgiving market of any perceived faults, whether of pedigree or conformation. This sale acts as the perfect follow-up to last week and is very similar in atmosphere to the old St Leger Yearlings Sales, with a diverse crowd of racegoers and buyers."
