STRONG START TO SEPTEMBER

The Keeneland September Yearling Sale kicked off its two-week stand last night in Lexington with the first of two select night sessions, and while most industry participants would have been happy with a stable market heading into the sale, they got better than that. Of the 99 horses offered, 67 sold for \$25,260,000. That equated to an average price of \$377,015, an 8.6% bump from a year ago. The real news was a huge increase in median, however. The session median of \$350,000 was up 40% from the corresponding 2010 figure of \$250,000, and Keeneland Vice President of Sales Walt Robertson said it was the highlight of his night. "Last year, on the same night, we had a \$4.2-million horse," Robertson said. "Tonight, we had two horses bring over \$1 million, another one flirted with \$1 million, and I don't know how many we've had in the \$600-800,000 range, but a significant amount. So I am pretty pleased with the median. And it is really good that the average was as flush as it was without a good horse skewing a small number of horses. We had some big, strong horses tonight, and we had a lot of play from all over the world."

Topping the session was [hip 87](#), a handsome colt by A.P. Indy--Malka from the immediate family of Grade I winners Giralomo (A.P. Indy), Super Saver (Maria's Mon) and Bluegrass Cat (Storm Cat) who went for \$1.4 million. Bloodstock agent Bob Feld, trainer Neil Drysdale and his wife Shawn Dugan advised for a buying group that included John and Jerry Amerman and Robert "Shel" Evans. The colt was bred by Hill 'n' Dale and Philip Steinberg and consigned by Hill 'n' Dale. The other seven-figure horse was [hip 63](#), a colt by Street

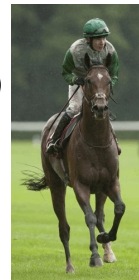
Benjamin Leon, Jr.'s Besilu Stables led all buyers with four purchases for an aggregate of \$3 million. Besilu purchased last year's \$4.2 million A.P. Indy topper. "Mr. Leon was very strong last year and was again, in a different way, this year," said Keeneland's Director of Sales Geoffrey Russell. "Obviously, he didn't have a \$4.2 million horse, but when he set his mind to buy something, he got to the finish line."

The one black mark on the evening was a high RNA rate. A total 32 yearlings, or 32.3%, failed to sell.

A.P. Indy Colt Makes \$1.4 Mil...

In 2010, John and Jerry Amerman were in the headlines opening night here when a horse they bred, Mr. Besilu (A.P. Indy--Balance), brought a whopping \$4.2 million. While a half-sibling to that colt could provide further thrills when it goes under the hammer tonight, the Amermans again kicked off a September

opener with panache, but this time on the buying end. The Amermans were part of a buying group that secured the session's top-priced yearling, a beautifully bred A.P. Indy--Malka colt who went for \$1.4 million. Hill 'n' Dale Sales Agency consigned.

Bloodstock agent Bob Feld, who advises the Amermans and selected MGISW Balance at auction for them, helped put the group together at the behest of trainer Neil Drysdale and his wife, Shawn Dugan. Robert "Shel" Evans and a third, unnamed party, completed the buying team. "It all happened fast," said Feld. "I bumped into Neil and Shawn late this afternoon, and they said that they'd come up with the idea of trying to buy the horse. I loved the idea; I was ecstatic about it."

Feld added the deal was a no-brainer. "He was a gorgeous foal, and there aren't too many A.P. Indys left," said Feld, who confirmed that Drysdale would train the colt, just as he trained his sire, A.P. Indy. "Neil thought he looked more like A.P. Indy than any other colt he's ever seen before. I called the Amermans and said I really thought it was a good idea. The upside is phenomenal on this horse. If Neil can win a stakes race, let alone a graded stakes or the Kentucky Derby, I told the Amermans it was well worth their money to invest with the other people and roll the dice a little bit."

Feld said the price tag made the transaction that much sweeter. "I can't believe he went for \$1.4 million. He's priceless as far as I'm concerned. With his looks and being by A.P. Indy--there aren't going to be many more A.P. Indys that look like that with that kind of pedigree--I thought it was a very good price. Neil's training the colt, and the plan is to win the Kentucky Derby."

The colt indeed has a sterling pedigree. He is the second foal from the Deputy Minister mare Malka, a winning 6-year-old daughter of the graded stakes-winning blue hen Get Lucky (Mr. Prospector). The full-sister to champion Rhythm has proven a brilliant foil to A.P. Indy, producing six foals by the Lane's End star, including GISW Girolamo and the graded winners Daydreaming and Accelerator. They also include the fine producers Supercharger, dam of Derby winner Super Saver (Maria's Mon) and GSW Brethren (Distorted Humor); and She's a Winner, dam of GISW Bluegrass Cat (Storm Cat) and GSW Lord of the Game (Saint Ballado).

"This horse had eight scopes, all from serious, important people, so we knew he was going to sell well," said consignor John Sikura, who bred the colt under the Hill 'n' Dale banner along with Phil Steinberg. "But you never know where they're going to finish. I wasn't surprised when it took off and kept going. We're happy with the price, and it was in the range we valued. It was a great result."

Hill 'n' Dale sold the colt's year-old full-sister, the as yet unraced Champagne Courage, to Bobby Flay last year at FTSAUG for \$625,000. *-L Marquardt*

Bolton Keeps to Familiar Streets...

George Bolton admitted he had inside information when he went to \$1.2 million to secure a colt by Street Cry (Ire), consigned by Gainesway, at Keeneland

Sunday night. The colt was bred by Stonestreet Thoroughbreds, with whom Bolton has owned horses such as two-time Horse of the Year Curlin (Smart Strike) and this year's GI Preakness S. third-place finisher Astrology (A.P. Indy). "We have

worked as partners in the past when we owned horses together and we've become friends," Bolton, speaking by phone from his California home, said of Stonestreet's Barbara Banke and her late husband Jess Jackson. "They allowed me to go to the farm and see this horse a bunch of times. As a result of that, he was the one I wanted to get tonight. I saw this horse grow up and whenever you can see a horse grow up and know a horse from its early days on, obviously it's a huge advantage for a buyer."

Bolton had expected to be at Keeneland in person last night, but his travel plans were delayed by the power outage that hit Southern California last week. Instead, Keeneland's Mark Maronde, sitting in the back row of the sales pavilion, did the bidding while speaking with Bolton on the phone. Bolton said he jumped into the bidding at \$850,000 and wasn't sure he would get the gray colt. "I went to \$1.1 million and someone countered at \$1,150,000 so fast, I thought this is it. I told Mark that this was my last number and then it got really quiet. But the way the bidding was going, I didn't think I'd get him." Bolton added he had expected the yearling to sell in the range of \$700-\$900,000.

Yesterday's seven-figure yearling is the third foal out of Stonestreet's multiple graded stakes winner Forest Music (Unbridled's Song). The mare's first foal, Maclean's Music (Distorted Humor), was bought back by Stonestreet for \$900,000 out of the 2009 Keeneland September sale. The colt was an impressive winner of his only start to date, blitzing six furlongs at Santa Anita in 1:07.1.

"Maclean's Music may be as fast as The Factor," Bolton said, referring to the speedy multiple graded stakes winner he co-owns with Fog City Stables. "Forest Music was one of the fastest mares to run this decade. When she was semi-on she was lethal, so you are putting together a first foal who was a fairly good yearling that was a buy-back and ended up winning impressively at Santa Anita. I think the mare has proven that she can throw a runner and she was a runner herself. This was [bloodstock advisor] John Moynihan's favorite—he was a standout."

The first seven-figure lot of the 2011 Keeneland sale also accomplished another first when it left an Irishman short for words.

"I am speechless--first time ever," laughed Gainesway's Michael Herson after the Street Cry colt left the sales ring. "He is a super nice-moving horse and super athletic. He is very well-related, out of a major running mare and by a top stallion." Of the yearling's final price tag, Herson added, "That was way beyond our expectations, not to say that it was unrealistic. There was good strong bidding all the way through the process. It's a great result for Stonestreet and we are delighted that they had Gainesway consign the horse."

Coolmore Nabs Bernardini Colt From Southern Equine...

In recent years, much has been made of a perceived feud between rival titans Coolmore and Darley, with talk that each side wasn't buying yearlings by the other camp's sires. Last year, however, Coolmore rep Demi O'Byrne signed for a colt from the first crop of Darley's young stallion Street Sense, the \$435,000 Castaway, who was runner-up in his debut at Del Mar Aug. 20 for trainer Bob Baffert. Last night, during the opening session of the Keeneland September Sale, the Irish conglomerate did their best to put talk of a feud to rest, purchasing the night's fourth-highest-priced yearling, a Bernardini three-parts brother to GISW Sweet Symphony (A.P. Indy), for \$875,000. The Feb. 17-foaled dark bay is a son of Brandy Rose (Distinctive Pro), a half-sister to Horse of the Year Holy Bull. **Cont. p4**

"I don't know much about the sire," said O'Byrne after signing the ticket before adding of Coolmore's most recent acquisition, "He's a good mover. He's a quality horse and Holy Bull is close in the family."

Coolmore's Richard Henry later added, "Our policy has always been to try and buy the best horses in the sale, regardless of who they're by, who consigns them, or where they're from. We're only trying to buy the best horses--that's always been our policy. We bought the Bernardini tonight, we bought a mare in foal to Bernardini her last year, and we've purchased a

Manduro (Ger)." Manduro stands for Darley in Europe.

The transaction was yet another big score at the sales for Meg Levy's Bluewater Sales and the colt's breeder, Mike Moreno's Southern Equine. Last July, they teamed to sell the topper at Fasig-Tipton, a Medaglia d'Oro--Beright colt for \$450,000, and followed up by selling the topper at Fasig-Tipton Saratoga, too, a colt by A.P. Indy--Maryfield who went for \$1.2 million. (An Unbridled's Song half-brother to the latter sells today as [hip 192](#).)

Levy said the colt lived up to expectations. "I think in this market, we were cautiously optimistic, but I think that's what he's worth," she said. "But a horse is only worth what anybody's willing to pay for him."

Asked about selling a Darley-sired horse to Coolmore, Levy commented, "I'm always glad to see people buying nice horses. I haven't actually been in the position to have worried about that too much. But it looks like Coolmore is really back in the market looking for good horses, and I don't think it matters whose camp it's by. Bernardini is a top stallion, and this was a great individual."

Levy added, "I was giggling as we led him up here because he looks like the black stallion. And he really showed his presence in the ring. He's been all class this entire sale. He's forward and happy, and everybody really loved him. We're really happy for Mike Moreno from Southern Equine."

Moreno, who has crafted a world-class broodmare band in recent years that includes 15 Grade I mares, he reports, wasn't on hand to watch the colt sell, but talked with the *TDN* by phone afterwards.

"We want to let everyone know that we're a breeding operation that also races, but we don't want to get the reputation that we only send our bad horses to the sales," Moreno said. "We hope buyers get comfortable knowing that when Southern Equine puts a horse in a sale, that they're there to sell for the right price."

In general, Southern Equine offers its best colts at auction while retaining the better fillies, said Moreno. "We try to sell our best one or two colts from each crop," he said.

The Louisiana-based businessman said he considered the colt well-sold, as the reserve was \$600,000. "We'll sell a horse for a fair price, but we're not going to give away horses, either," he said. "In general, we do our own analysis and say, 'If we were looking to buy this horse, what would we be willing to spend on him?' And that's how we set the reserves. For this horse, we thought the low end for him would be \$600,000 and the high end \$800,000, so he brought what we expected on the high end. But two or three years ago, this horse brings \$2.5 million. It's just a sign of the times. But I want to thank Mr. [John] Magnier [Coolmore principal] and Demi O'Byrne, and I'm happy for them. I hope the horse goes on to do big things for them." -L Marquardt

Fine Start for Leon...

Ben Leon marked his entrance into the American yearling sales scene in style last summer, topping Keeneland September sale with \$4.2-million purchase Mr. Besilu (A.P. Indy). Absent from the sales so far this term, he returned with a vengeance last night, purchasing four yearlings for an aggregate of \$3,000,000, and topping all buyers in the process. Leading his expenditures was [Hip 72](#), a colt by Street Cry (Ire), who was the third highest-priced colt of the session at \$975,000. The May 2 foal is out of champion 3-year-old champion filly Hollywood Wildcat (Kris S.), winner of three Grade I events, including the Breeders' Cup Distaff.

"If he can run, he will be a great stallion," said Leon. "He's got the pedigree and everything, so it's up to him."

"She is a very high quality mare--she is a little older, but she proved she can produce a nice horse," said trainer Todd Pletcher, who in addition to his father J.J. Pletcher and veterinarian Dr. Jorge Gomez, served as advisors on the purchases. "He's very well-balanced and gives me the impression that he is a horse that will continue to grow and develop. I haven't had too many Street Crys, but it's a proven cross and Mr. Leon really liked the pedigree."

During last night's proceedings, Leon jumped into the fray early when paying \$525,000 for [Hip 25](#), a Distorted Humor colt out of Words of War (Lord at war {Arg}). He also secured [Hip 83](#), a filly by Indian Charlie out of Lu Ravi (A.P. Indy), who realized \$775,000; and [Hip 104](#), a filly by A.P. Indy out of Private Gift (Unbridled) that brought the same amount.

Both the Street Cry and Distorted Humor colts were offered by session topping consignor, Taylor Made Sales.

"He was a big, gorgeous horse--he was just a hunk," said Mark Taylor of Hip 25. "When he came out, he just took your breath. He's one of those kinds of horses. We thought he might bring \$650,000, but you never know. It was in the ballpark of what we thought he might bring, so we were happy with the price."

Leon, Chairman of Florida-based Leon Medical Centers, entered the world of Paso Finos 29 years ago, but only appeared on the Thoroughbred scene three years ago. He is currently in the process of stocking his racing string, but expects to add a few more to his team at the upcoming November sale at Keeneland.

"I wanted to get my feet wet first, and take it one step at a time," said Leon, explaining his entry into the Thoroughbred game. "I don't want to run before I walk. I know what I don't know, so I've surrounded myself with people that know a lot about Thoroughbreds. I have the foundation of 29 years with show horses, but I am still learning about Thoroughbreds."

Leon currently has seven broodmares at his Besilu Farm, located just outside Ocala, Florida, and hopes to add a few more from his racing team over the course of the next few days.

"The plan is to have a group of horses on the farm for breeding that are made up of quality, not quantity," said Leon. "At the same time, we want to be able to enjoy them on the race track."

As for his vision for the future of his racing enterprise, Leon added, "I really love breeding, it's my passion. I want to assemble an outstanding group of racemares with top conformation and pedigree, so we can hopefully produce nice babies...and enjoy the process in the meantime."

As for last year's sale-topper unraced Mr. Besilu, who was the highest priced yearling sold at Keeneland September since 2006, he has been given some time off at the farm in which he was named after, and is expected to return to Pletcher later this year.

"We sent him to the farm for a little rest, and he should be back with Todd Pletcher by the end of the year, maybe November or December," confirmed Leon. "We're not rushing him, because he's a big horse like [his dam's half-sister] Zenyatta, so we don't want to rush him and burn some future riches."

Underscoring his primary directive in his racing and breeding venture, Leon concluded, "You can't collect apples if you collect oranges," he said. "If you want the best, you have to buy the best." --C Bossinakis

Good Day For Taylor Made...

Also heading its respective division, Taylor Made Sales Agency sold 15 yearlings for a total of \$5,375,000. Leading the way for Team Taylor was Hip 72 (see above).

"I thought he was the best-bred colt in the sale," said Taylor Made's Mark Taylor. "He is out of arguably the most prolific producer in the last 10 years, and he's by one of the best stallions on the world."

As for his physical attributes, Taylor added, "People could see that he is a great colt now, and imagine what he can be in a year from now. He's a May foal, and he had all the parts, but he wasn't a man yet. I have high hopes for him."

In total, Taylor Made offered 21 yearlings during Sunday's opening session, resulting in a healthy 71% success rate.

"You're always disappointed when you have an RNA-- you're looking for the undefeated season, but they're hard to come by," admitted Taylor. "It's been fair. It's been great in spots. We had a couple that brought \$400,000 that I thought might bring \$600,000, but there are so many hoops to jump through. It takes perfect horse to hit on everyone's menu. Overall, I'm very pleased. Our reserves were conservative, there was a lot of money over our reserves. That gives you a good feeling that there is a lot of depth to the market."

As for the overall health of the market, Taylor added, "I'm thrilled with the way today went," Taylor said. "If you had told me two weeks ago we would have had the results we have, I would have been doing cartwheels. I gained more optimism while we were showing these horses. I thought we had one of our best group of horses in Book 1 than we've had in a long time. So my optimism kept growing as we got closer to the sale." --C Bossinakis

Dynaformer Colt Tops Shadwell's Buying List...

The Shadwell Estate of Sheikh Hamdan, ensconced in a private room at Keeneland, secured six yearlings during last night's session of the September said. The highest-priced of the group was [hip 42](#), a colt by Dynaformer out of graded stakes winner Bohemian Lady (Carson City), who is a half-sister to GISW Any Given Saturday (Distorted Humor). The yearling, bred by Satish Sanan's Padua Stables and consigned by Three Chimneys Sales, sold for \$725,000. Sanan and Three Chimneys' Case Clay watched the colt sell from inside the sales pavilion and were happy with the final results for a horse, who according to Clay, has star power. "We are real pleased," Clay said. "The colt is all business. All week, he's been that way. When other horses go out there and get tired, he stands like a statue and says, 'Where do I need to walk?' He is going to be a great racehorse." Clay added the sale was a win for the entire Three Chimneys team. "I am so proud of the team at Three Chimneys," he said.

"The colt was conceived, raised, and prepped at Three Chimneys, so from the breeding shed to the sales ring, it's credit to the team at Three Chimneys."

RNAs were heavy during the early going at Keeneland yesterday, and Clay admitted that was a concern. "I was worried," Clay said. "However, this horse is a standout and we knew he was a standout. We had a lot of attention on him. We were concerned about the slow start, but we thought he was such a star, he would sell well. Sometimes sales get off to a slow start, but there is a lot of quality coming up. I am optimistic about the quality of what I've seen, so I think we'll be all right."

In addition to the Dynaformer colt, Shadwell purchased a Distorted Humor half-brother to Rule (Roman Ruler) out of a half to Funny Cide (Distorted Humor) ([hip 4](#)) for \$550,000; a filly by Distorted Humor out of champion Fleet Indian (Indian Charlie) ([hip 62](#)) and a Street Sense half-brother to To Honor and Serve (Bernardini) ([hip 101](#)) for \$500,000 each.

Shopping Pays Off for Gainesway...

Always on the look-out for a quality broodmare, Antony Beck's Gainesway found opportunity knocking at the 2009 Keeneland November sale. Beck secured the mare Shop Here (Dehere), in foal to Tapit, from the Hobeau Farm dispersal at that auction for \$300,000. That sale came just months after the mare's half-brother Trappe Shot (Tapit) brought a FTMMAY juvenile sales-record \$850,000 from bloodstock agent Steve Young. The colt is now a graded stakes winner and twice Grade I placed. "We liked the female family and we thought Trappe Shot was going to emerge as a good horse," explained Gainesway's Michael Heron. "She is a very attractive mare by Dehere. Deputy Minister, the grandsire, gets very attractive stock. It's the Northern Dancer line and Tapit loves being bred to that male line--although he seems to work with many mares." The purchase proved prescient when the mare's Tapit yearling ([hip 10](#)) sold yesterday at Keeneland for \$575,000, once again to the bid of Young. "She was a super balanced filly with great class and composure," Heron said of the chestnut yearling. "She came through the outer ring here and walked in there like a princess. She sold very well to a top judge, with several noted horsemen as underbidders." Gainesway currently has a broodmare band of around 75 head, but is always open to the right addition. "We're always open-minded to find something to add and, I imagine with the very good sales and the dispersals coming up in November, we'll do our homework and see if we can find ourselves something for the future," Heron added. Shop Here, a three-quarter sister to Grade I winner Miss Shop (Depuy Minister), is also the dam of GSP Fifth Avenue (Monarchos) and SP Shoptate (Orientate). She has a weanling filly by Tapit and is again in foal to the Gainesway stallion. -JM

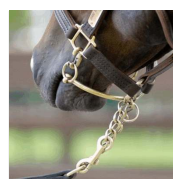

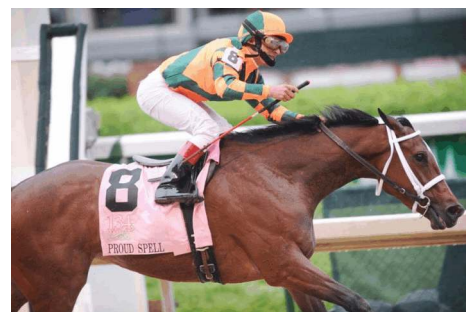

PRIDE WITHOUT PREJUDICE

Slated to go under the hammer near the end of Monday's second session are a pair of yearlings that hail from a family that has served Airdrie Stud and former Kentucky Governor Brereton Jones very well. First through the ring will be [Hip 201](#), a chestnut colt by Unbridled's Song out of Pacific Spell (Langfuhr). A mere \$7,500 claim by trainer Dale Romans at Turfway Park in 2003, Pacific Spell was taken to the Keeneland

November sale later that fall by Brereton Jones. However, the then 4-year-old failed to find any takers at \$25,000 and was led back to Airdrie. Buyers' oversight that day proved fortuitous for Jones, however, when the mare produced a filly by the young Airdrie stallion Proud Citizen in 2005. Named Proud Spell, the bay was retained to race for Jones, but not for the reason many might think.

"She was a very small filly, who had pretty long pasterns, and consequently, she wasn't a really good sales candidate and that's why we raced her," laughed Jones.

Despite her shortcomings, Proud Spell proved to be a menace on the racetrack, showing talent at two with runner-up finishes in the GI Matron S. and GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies. The filly proved dominant at three with wins in the GI Kentucky Oaks, GI Alabama S., GII Delaware Oaks and GII Fair Grounds Oaks en route to a sophomore championship. And while the hope remains the May 28 foal can match his big sister's racing prowess, Jones indicated the colt certainly didn't inherit much of her physicality. **Cont. p10**

"This colt has much more size to him than Proud Spell did," said Jones. "He is a late foal, May 28, but he is a very nice sized colt right now, not overly so, just very well put together. He is also a chestnut and she is a bay, so they really don't look anything alike."

Pacific Spell, who was bred to relatively new, unproven sires during her first five rounds in the

breeding shed, finally got her chance to meet with a top shelf bachelor in 2009. "[Pacific Spell] had not been bred to the proven stallions before she was bred to Unbridled's Song," informed Jones. "But when we did finally decide to

send her to a leading stallion, we got just what we were hoping to get."

Not long after Proud Spell's little brother exits the ring will her own yearling by Indian Charlie enter it. While Proud Spell's half-brother appears to have very little in common with his illustrious sister, [Hip 207](#)

shows plenty of evidence of exactly which cloth she is cut from.

"This filly looks much more like her mother," confirmed Jones. "She is beautifully conformed, very correct and is a wonderful moving filly. Her profile is much the same as

Proud Spell and she will probably be about the same size as her mother when she reaches maturity."

As for her father's influence, Jones added, "She's put together like so many of the Indian Charlies, by that I mean she doesn't have the longer sloping pasterns like that of her mother."

Standing in sharp contrast to Pacific Spell's roster of unproven mates early in her breeding career, Proud Spell's exploits on the racetrack earned her the services of Airdrie's marquee stallion, Indian Charlie.

"Indian Charlie is a proven stallion and I wanted to give her a start since she is a champion," explained Jones. "I wanted to give her a chance with a horse that we know can produce a champion and Indian Charlie meets that criteria. Quite frankly, we got what we were looking for." --Christina Bossinakis

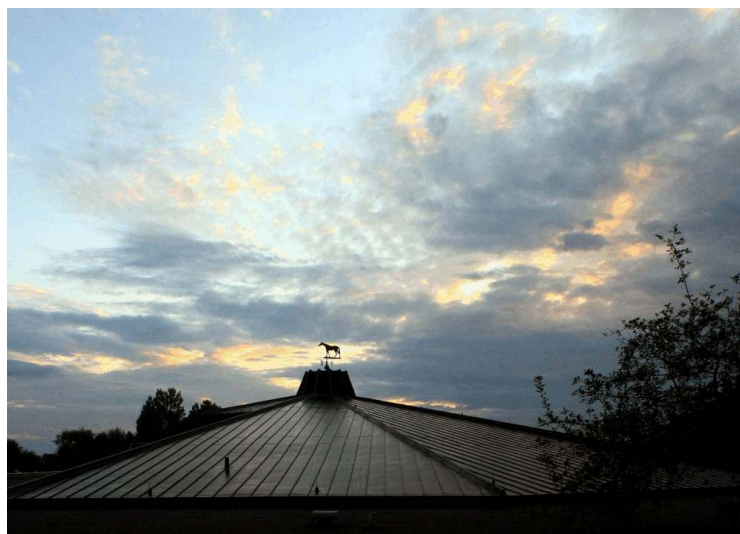

Usually that trust is based on a track record, and over the past decade, few agents in the industry have a better track record than Tom McGreevy. The man who these days operates exclusively for Rick Porter's Fox Hill Farm has purchased such major winners as champion Midnight Lute (Real Quiet), Round Pound (Awesome Again), Rockport Harbor (Unbridled's Song), Old Fashioned (Unbridled's Song), Winslow Homer (Unbridled's Song), Friesan Fire (A.P. Indy), Honest Man (Unbridled's Song) and Freefourracing (French Deputy). In 2011, he can boast about the standout 3-year-old filly Joyful Victory (Tapit), as well as one of the current favorites for Horse of the Year honors, the 4-year-old Havre de Grace (Saint Liam). All but Midnight Lute and Freefourracing ran in Fox Hill's red and white colors.

"We've been lucky each year to have a nice one," McGreevy said modestly over coffee at the Keeneland café on Friday.

"I didn't have any money to speak of, I didn't have any clients, and I didn't know anybody," he said. "But the first year I was there, I went to the sales and worked them like I usually do, knowing I wasn't going to buy anything. Each sale, I picked out the top 10 horses I liked, and afterward, I would take out an ad in classifieds of *The Blood-Horse* or the *Thoroughbred Times* or whatever, and list the horses. That way, I had it documented before they ran that these were the horses I selected."

Somewhat improbably, the idea worked. McGreevy began picking up clients, and his business gained momentum. In the '90s, he joined forces with Becky Thomas, and began pinhooking, too.

"Tom and I worked together for a long time, and he's such a nice guy and such a hard worker," said Thomas.

In 1999, McGreevy's fortunes took a serious turn. Through an old buddy from his Penn National days, trainer John Servis, McGreevy was introduced to Fox Hill's Rick Porter.

"I was here at Keeneland buying horses, and I found this one filly I loved, but didn't have a buyer for her," said McGreevy. "So I called John up and said that he needed to try and buy this horse. John had a lot of confidence in me and called up Rick, and so Rick called me and we talked a bit. He agreed to buy the filly, and we were able to get her for \$85,000."

The filly turned out to be Zonk (Farma Way), who won the GIII Delaware Oaks and GIII Affectionately H. and earned nearly \$560,000. Porter later sold Zonk, in foal to Gone West, for \$875,000. Further success with Porter soon came in the form of Round Pond, a \$105,000 KEESEP yearling acquisition in 2003. Round Pond won the GI Breeders' Cup Distaff in 2006 and earned just a tick under \$2 million. At the conclusion of her racing career, Round Pond was hammered down to John Ferguson for \$5.75 million.

"She was an interesting horse," said McGreevy. "We bought her for \$105,000, which I think was less than the stud fee at the time for Awesome Again. But she was a late May baby, and was small at the time--she grew up to be a nice-sized horse."

In 2003, McGreevy landed Rockport Harbor for \$470,000 at KEESEP. The big gray, nicknamed 'Rocky' by his connections, turned into a multiple Grade II winner on the track and is now a successful young sire at Darley.

"Rockport Harbor was probably the best-walking horse I've ever seen," said McGreevy. "He had a real presence to him--he was just a standout."

At the 2004 September Sale, McGreevy was still around shopping when a big, smooth-walking son of Real Quiet entered the ring as hip 3625. McGreevy purchased the horse, Midnight Lute, for \$70,000.

"I had bought him for my brother and myself, and we sent him to the 2-year-old sales with Eddie Woods," said McGreevy. "I know it's easy to say after the fact,

but I loved this horse. The first time I saw him gallop, I said, 'Eddie, this is the horse.' At that time, though, Real Quiet was really cold, and the mare had no pedigree, but I told Eddie I wouldn't sell him

for less than \$300,000. Everybody probably thought I was crazy. But it's not that often I feel that strongly about a horse, and you have to stand up for what you believe sometimes. I actually tried to get Rick to buy him, but he didn't like his pedigree. I bought him back at the sale [for \$290,000], but Bob Baffert called a few days later and bought him privately."

Whether that was a good transaction for McGreevy is debatable, as Midnight Lute won consecutive editions of the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint in 2007 and 2008 and earned over \$2.6 million.

McGreevy will be a short price to add a third Breeders' Cup winner to his resume in November with Havre de Grace in top form. The Fox Hill filly is coming off a victory over males in the GI Woodward S. at Saratoga, which pushed her earnings past the \$1.9 million mark. McGreevy purchased her for \$380,000 at the 2008 September Sale.

"It's funny, with the good horses, I can remember what barn they were in as yearlings, because they make such an impression," said McGreevy. "There are so many factors that make up a good horse, and they really need to be the complete package. And there are some intangibles that factor in. Those really good horses, they know they're really good, and they carry themselves a different way. Havre de Grace was like that."

Success Classified...

Born in western Pennsylvania and raised in South Carolina, Tom McGreevy wasn't raised in a family that had horses, but enjoyed the next best thing.

"We were lucky enough to live next to a farm owned by a couple who didn't have any kids, and they just kind of adopted us," he said. "We lived over there with the riding horses and cattle, and grew up that way."

After high school, McGreevy joined the Army and fought in Vietnam for a year. "It gives you a little different perspective when you come home, and I was more focused on what I wanted to do."

McGreevy went to Penn State for Animal Science, and there he hooked up with the livestock judging team.

"A lot of people aren't familiar with those, but it's a big deal over there just to make the team," said McGreevy, who credits the experience with helping refine his eye. "We judged everything from pigs to cattle to horses to sheep. In the mornings of a contest, you'd place the animals 1-2-3-4, and in the afternoon, you had to give an official judge why you did it the way you did. So it really gave me a great background in being able to reason why you liked an animal or not. You couldn't just go in and tell the judge, 'Well, I just liked the horse,' you had to really pick him apart."

During the summers, McGreevy joined his brother in New York and Delaware. His brother was an assistant for trainer Frank Whiteley, and McGreevy rubbed horses for the Hall of Famer.

After he left college, McGreevy got his trainer's license and began training at Penn National. "That was another great learning experience," he said.

McGreevy knew that what he really wanted to do, however, was bloodstock work. Hence the classifieds. And now, 25 years after placing his first ad, McGreevy is one of the industry's most-respected agents. He says that he's found the perfect fit with Porter and Fox Hill.

"Rick and I have a great rapport, and Rick has a lot of confidence in me," said McGreevy. "One thing that makes it work is that he really lets me do my job. And my job is to find good individuals. Then Rick and I get together and work on the short list, and he tries to put the pedigrees to them and see what he likes."

McGreevy added that the challenges of finding top horseflesh continues to keep the game fresh for him. "Nobody in this business has it all figured out--I surely don't--and I love that aspect of it," he said. "There just aren't that many really good horses out there. I love Keeneland because it's so competitive. Everybody from around the world is here looking for the same thing, and it's very challenging. That's my passion--to go out there and find a good horse." *-Lucas Marquardt*

Excelebration was under the radar for the Apr. 16 G3 Greenham S. on his seasonal bow, but came out the other side of that seven-furlong contest with an enhanced reputation as the only rival capable of putting it up to Frankel (GB) (Galileo {Ire}). He went on to confirm that favorable impression by winning the G2 Mehl Mulhens-Rennen with authority at Cologne May 22. Third behind Frankel in the G1 St James's Palace S. at Royal Ascot June 14, the bay was freshened up, and resumed with a six-length score in the G2 Hungerford S. at Newbury last time Aug. 13. Rank leaving the gates here as Handsome Maestro (Ire) (Dansili {GB}) set off hotly in front, he received an ideal trail from the clear second Rio de la Plata, and soon settled into a more comfortable rhythm leading the main pack along. Frankie Dettori still looked comfortable as he assumed command on Godolphin's stalwart in early stretch, but his lead proved short-lived as Jamie Spencer unleashed Excelebration to roll by with 300 meters to go. Driven out to assert, the bay was always holding the game Rio de la Plata. Whether the winner would by now be a match for a more mature and physically advanced Frankel is open to question. The evidence may come in Ascot's G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. Oct. 15, although an appearance against Goldikova (Ire) (Anabaa) at Churchill Downs is an alternative option, according to Marco Botti. "I don't know the plan yet. We'll have to sit down and discuss matters, but he could go to Ascot or the GI Breeders' Cup Mile [Nov. 5]," Botti said.

Galikova, who ran fifth in last term's G1 Prix Marcel Boussac on the Arc undercard, opened her sophomore campaign with a smooth conditions score over Shareta at Saint-Cloud Apr. 8, and garnered a first pattern-race rosette in the May 7 G3 Prix Cleopatre back there May 7. She failed by a length to reel in the G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches victress Golden Lilac (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) in the June 12 G1 Prix de Diane at Chantilly, but gained revenge on that rival in a valuable renewal of the G2 Prix Guillaume d'Ornano at Deauville last time Aug. 15. Restrained in fourth early, the homebred moved smoothly throughout--despite the rain-affected turf--and was urged closer soon after turning for home. Going through the gears as jockey Olivier Peslier continued to apply pressure inside the final quarter mile, the bay quickened smartly under whipless coaxing in the latter stages to win decisively. The victory saw her join half-sister Goldikova (Ire) (Anabaa) on the Group 1 roster, and almost certainly booked her passage to the Oct. 2 G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe back over this course and distance. "She quickened very nicely, and what I really loved was her action inside the final furlong, which was tremendously light," commented trainer Freddy Head. "I think she belongs with the best and, although I have to discuss it with the owners, I can't imagine she won't run in the Arc."

Galikova's third dam Gold River carried the Wertheimer colors to victory in the 1981 Arc. Her dam has a yearling full-brother to Goldikova named Anodin (Ire). She foaled a Galileo colt in April and was bred back to Dansili (GB).

Runner-up Testosterone may join her in Europe's end-of-season showpiece, but conditioner Pascal Bary did not immediately confirm that as a definite target for the G2 Prix de Malleret victress. "She has run a very good race, but the winner was just too good," Bary said. "She could run in the G2 Prix Royallieu [at Longchamp Oct. 1], but she has already won a Group 2, so I don't see the point. She is in the Arc and we will discuss it, along with the prospect of whether she stays in training at four, so if she goes there, it will be a late decision."

Reliable Man, patiently ridden throughout, assumed control approaching the final eighth, and needed little encouragement to easily impose his authority and book a return ticket to the Bois de Boulogne on the first Sunday in October. Unraced as a juvenile, Reliable Man hit the ground running with a three-length victory in an Apr. 12 newcomers' event at Saint-Cloud, and doubled his tally in a 10-furlong conditions event at Chantilly next time May 9. He continued his rapid rise through the ranks by returning to the Chateau to claim Classic glory in the June 5 G1 Prix du Jockey-Club. The grey sustained his first defeat when third to Meandre on unsuitably quick ground stepped up to 12 panels in the Bastille Day highlight. Third early in this Arc trial, he made smooth progress off the home turn and was given a shake of the reins by Gerald Mosse to easily take control approaching the final furlong and score in impressive fashion. The win provided trainer Alain de Royer-Dupre with a third victory, one of which came with Reliable Man's sire in 2003. "We suspected that he would be better with a little bit of ease in the ground and he has confirmed that today," trainer Alain de Royer-Dupre explained. "It was too fast for him in the Grand Prix de Paris, but today the ground was just perfect, and that helped. He was quite impressive and has the action and stride of a really good horse, so, hopefully, he will come on for that and be back for the Arc."

This was just a prep for Sarafina as the homebred is fine-tuned for the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe, in which she suffered major interference 12 months ago en route to finishing an eye-catching third. With only four runners, the expectation was that this often uninformative trial would not provide any major excitement ahead of the main feature in three weeks' time. In the event, Christophe Lemaire's daring in the closing stages as he threaded the favorite through the eye of a needle put some hearts in mouths among the Longchamp faithful. At the line, the bay flaunted her impressive acceleration once again, and registered another cozy success without any need for the whip. Despite being outclassed on the day, Hiruno d'Amour stuck to his guns to put up an encouraging Arc trial for Japan, while Ballydoyle's raider St Nicholas Abbey and the positively ridden Nakayama Festa dented their Arc prospects by fading out of contention at the business end. A stewards' inquiry was called to look into Lemaire's maneuver, but the result was unaffected. "She was a little fresh and keen and, as always when she has not run for a while, the idea was for her not to have a hard race," trainer Alain de Royer-Dupre commented. "Christophe's move was in line with the idea of not giving her a hard race, which might have been the case had she been asked to go around the Japanese horse."

Having beaten the subsequent G1 Epsom Oaks second Wonder of Wonders (Kingmambo) in a Leopardstown maiden on her final juvenile outing in October, the homebred's initial sophomore efforts were solid, but below Classic standard. Fourth in the seven-furlong G3 Leopardstown 1000 Guines Trial S. Mar. 27, the dark bay filled that same spot in the Listed Salsabil S. over 10 furlongs at Navan Apr. 17 and, despite the addition of blinkers on her next outing, was only fifth in the Listed Nijinsky S. over a panel further back at Leopardstown June 9. The headgear was retained for her game pillar-to-post victory in the G3 Kilboy Estate S. over nine furlongs here last time July 17. Manieree was sent off to set a strong gallop once more here. Kicked clear by Niall McCullagh on the home turn, she gradually strung her rivals out in the exhausting run to the line. "She likes soft ground and improved a bit today," trainer John Oxx told *Irish Racing Online*. "She has been working better and better. Niall said she was very fresh on the way to the start, but, when he asked her to go during the race, she flew. She's a good filly, and might be better if the ground is heavy. She is in the G1 Prix de l'Opera [at Longchamp Oct. 2] and I'll train her for it. If it is a soft-ground week in France, she might run there. She can make the running, which can be useful in France."

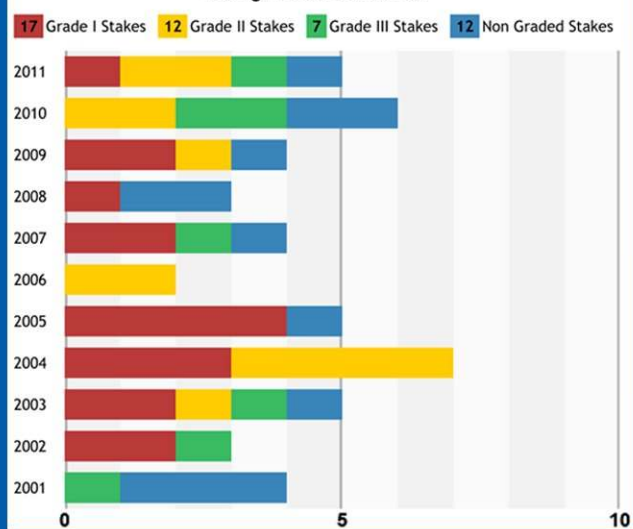

His conditioner reiterated the plan for the **TDN Rising Star** yesterday. "We are not expecting him to be his brother, as you can't expect to ever get another one like that, but it was a good effort for a horse having his first run to beat horses rated in the high 90s," Oxx said. "That means he ran to a rating of over 100, so that's a pretty good start for any horse. He's got a bit of talent--he is bred to have it, and had been showing us that in his work. We didn't really fire him up to win the first time and, although he goes through softish ground quite well, he should handle good ground fine in due course." He continued, "Seven furlongs is ideal for the moment, so we'll probably wait for the Killavullan. It's a little bit of a wait and, although I would have preferred it if we had another race a month after, unfortunately we've no other race to run in until then. We've been shuffled back by his shin soreness and started later than we expected, so we have to wait seven weeks." The conditioner concluded, "I don't lie awake at night worrying about it, but when you look at him, you have to hope he's a good horse. He certainly has some of his brother's talent, but how much remains to be seen."
