



**NO NEED TO TELL THE KELLYS;
 TAPIT COLT TOPS KEENELAND WEDNESDAY**

A Tapit colt bred and sold by Gainesway Farm topped Wednesday's fourth session of the Keeneland September sale with a final bid of \$650,000 from Jon and Sarah Kelly. Repole Stables was among the

underbidders on the handsome chestnut. Out of Don'tellmichelle (Regal Classic), the yearling is a full brother to multiple graded stakes winner Hightap. Asked what he liked about the yearling, Jon Kelly said, "Well he's by Tapit and he's got a sibling that has the same breeding and is a stakes winner. His conformation was excellent,

the walk was great. He scoped perfectly and was vet-approved." Kelly paused briefly before gesturing to Sarah Kelly and adding, "My wife wanted him; that gets to the bottom of it, doesn't it?"

The Kellys, who campaigned Grade I winners Borrego and Vacare, were making their third purchase of the September sale. They also purchased a filly by More Than Ready ([hip 489](#)) for \$360,000. The California couple maintain a small broodmare band, and Kelly admitted the market could be tough on both sides of the equation. "As a breeder and as a seller, they are not lining up," Kelly commented. "As a buyer, they are too high. That's the way it always is," he laughed. "The market is down from three years ago and it is reflected in the whole industry. But I am happy to be here and happy to buy a beautiful horse."

Gainesway, in partnership with Ron Winchell, campaigned Hightap, winner of the 2009 GIII Iowa Oaks and GIII Dogwood S. The Lexington nursery acquired the mare Don'tellmichelle three years ago. "We had an inkling Hightap could run and we bought the mare privately," explained Gainesway's Michael Heron. The first foal bred out of the mare by the farm was a Corinthian colt who sold for \$250,000 at last year's Fasig-Tipton Saratoga sale.

The mare's Tapit yearling was popular with potential buyers all week, according to Heron. "This colt had great appeal and we knew he was very highly regarded and held in high esteem," Heron said. "He had over a dozen vets at the barn. He was produced to the minute on the day. He had great composure when he came down here and showed his class in the ring and he was very aggressively bid on."

Heron added, "He is a very good-bodied, very muscular colt. He looks to me like he'll be quick as lightning and he'll come early."

In addition to yesterday's session-topper, Gainesway also sold a \$1.2 million Street Cry (Ire) colt on behalf of Stonestreet during Sunday's opening session of the

auction. Asked his impression of the market, Heron said, "Demand is outstripped by supply, consequently you've got to bring a horse here who passes a lot of tests. They must vet, that's critical. You need to have your

horses positioned in the sale accurately. If you miss the mark, you miss and it's not a close miss. You just miss. So far, we've had a great sale and we're very pleased to this point. We hope to continue to sell well through the balance of the sale and we've got plenty more good prospects to offer through the sale." -*Jessica Martini*

Big Gains in Average, Median...

It was another heartening day of horse trading at Keeneland September. The second of three Book 2 sessions concluded with big increases in average and median, and for the first time during a sale, the clearance rate edged past the 75% mark. Average for the session was \$152,649, up 25.4% from a year ago; the session median of \$130,000 was up 52.9%; and the 66 horses that RNA'd equated to a rate of 23.5%. Keeneland Vice President of Sales Walt Robertson said good horses, and a stronger concentration of them because of a slimmed-down Book 2, were the reasons for the increases. "When you take quarter of the deal away, it tightens up selection," he said. Keeneland Director of Sales Geoffrey Russell, adding that the four-session Book 2 from a year ago was probably too big, elaborated, "Our goal last year was to put as many horses in front of people before the break," he said. "I think we outdid ourselves on that, and by taking those horses out, we brought these other horses to the fore. For the most part, the lower-end horses have been pushed back. They are not all back there yet, but we're getting there. The selection process has worked. We've worked with our consignors to put this together--it's not just us. We work with them to find the horses we believe belong in this book. It's an ongoing process. This year we tried it, and next year we'll try it again, and hopefully, we'll tighten down again."

The three previous sessions of September saw the buy-back rate hovering around the 30% mark, and Russell gave further credit to consignors. "They adjusted to the market and are not being overly bullish," said Russell. "They are being conservative on their reserves. So they are letting the market dictate what the horses are worth. And they've done a very, very good job."

Valkyre Success Continues with Bernardini Colt...

Cathy Parke's Valkyre Stud, which bred and consigned Tuesday's \$1.2-million session-topping Bernardini filly, continued its run of success with the \$625,000 sale of a colt by the Darley stallion. John Ferguson signed the ticket for the dark bay yearling ([hip 664](#)) out of Ava Knowthescode (Cryptoclearance). Parke was selling the colt on behalf of Patricia

Klussman's Oakbrook Farm. "I just absolutely loved him," Parke said of the yearling. "He had perfect conformation, a great walk. And he was so quiet--he had a disposition to die for."

Parke was enjoying yesterday's success with a longtime client. "Patricia Klussman and her late husband, Bill, were one of my very first clients back in 1976," Parke recalled yesterday.

Parke purchased multiple stakes winner Ava Romance (Avatar), the dam of Ava

Knowthescode, on behalf of the couple for \$95,000 out of the 1989 Keeneland November sale.

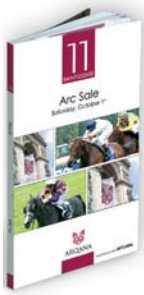

Lot 2 **Salto** (rating : 110 / 1600m)

c.2008 - Pivotal x Danzigaway

From one of the top Wertheimer families (his dam, the brilliant Danzigaway is a half-sister to Gold Away who has already produced Silent Name), Salto showed his talent from the age of two. 2nd to Godolphin's French Navy on two occasions, he lost his maiden tag at third asking and capped his juvenile season with a 2nd to Roderic O'Connor in the Criterium International (Gr.1, 1600m). At three, the Freddy Head trainee returned to winning ways at Deauville, taking a competitive conditions race over the Deauville mile. He was last seen when a close 4th in the Prix Quincey (Gr.3, 1600m), finishing less than two lengths behind the very smart Sandy's Charm. Salto is a pure miler who has performed over right handed, left handed and straight courses.

c.2008 - Dansili x Ecoutila

A half-brother to the smart Enticement, from the family of Green Tune and Pas de Réponse, Surfrider won first time out at Deauville as a juvenile before running 3rd in the Prix des Chênes (Gr.3). He took another step up at three when landing the competitive Classic trial Prix Djebel (Gr.3) over 1400m at Maisons-Laffitte. He has not been since his unplaced effort in the Poule d'Essai des Poulains, where he was not able to perform at his best, and is offered to dissolve a partnership with only three outings under his belt this season.

A half-brother to the triple Gr.1 heroine Sarafina, Sandagiyr notched two victories this year over Chantilly's selective mile.

He notably took the Prix de Pontarmé (L.) in good style, defeating the smart Cool Dude and Mister Iceman, and started in the Gr.1 Prix du Jockey Club only days later.

Fresh on the back of a good summer break, this talented, lightly-raced colt is ready to tackle an end-of-season campaign with serious ambitions.

5th on his debut, French Fifteen opened his account at second asking and hasn't looked back since, notching four wins in a row. The easy winner of a conditions race, he stepped up effortlessly to Stakes level, landing the Criterium de l'Ouest (L.). Last year's winner of this race was Dream Peace, who was subsequently sold at the Arc Sale...and went on to even greater things at three, notably winning the Gr.2 Prix de la Nonette.

Out of the Group victrix Toupie, Cool Dude opened his account at second asking.

Stepped up straight to Stakes level, he ran 3rd in the Prix de Suresnes (L., 1800m), only two lengths from the smart Slow Pace who subsequently filled the runner-up spot in a very hot Prix Guillaume d'Ornano Gr.2. 2nd in the Prix de Pontarmé (L.) a month later, Cool Dude returned to winning ways in a coveted conditions race at Chantilly over 1800m, before achieving a close 5th in the Prix Eugène Adam (Gr.2, 2000m), only a head behind Slow Pace and less than two lengths from the winner.

Lot 49 **Glorious Sight**

(rating : 115 / 1600 - 2000m)

f.2008 - Singspiel x Zelding

Glorious Sight hails from the wonderful family of Last Tycoon, Zipping, Valentine Waltz, which is still extremely current as reminded by dual Gr.1 winning miler Immortal Verse, and Anglesey St. victrix Fire Lily (f.2009, a grand daughter of Zelding). And she has lived up to this extraordinary lineage throughout the season. The winner of three races in three weeks, culminating with the Prix Finlande (L.), she only found Golden Lilac too good in the Poule d'Essai des Pouliches, and ran against the same champion as well as Goldikova's younger sister Galikova in a top class renewal of the Gr.1 Prix de Diane, where she finished third. A gorgeous and tough-as-nails filly with an immaculate pedigree, Glorious Sight looks an outstanding racing and breeding prospect - a very rare commodity.

“Ava Romance wasn’t all that big, but she was very correct and very well-made,” Parke said. “She had a really great race record and, for the time, she had earned plenty of money. So I knew that, not only did she have the ability to run in stakes company, but she had a lot of soundness, as well. And she has passed that on to her offspring. They have all been as tough as hickory.”

Running for the Klussmans, Ava Knowsthecode was graded-stakes placed and earned \$156,596 on the racetrack, but it has been as a broodmare that she has really shined. Ava Knowsthecode is the dam of multiple graded-stakes winner Keyed Entry (Honour and Glory), Grade I stakes placed Justin Phillip (First Samurai) and graded stakes winner Successful Million (Successful Appeal). Her 2-year-old colt Algorithms (Bernardini) was an impressive debut winner at Belmont in June in his only start to date.

Bill Klussman, who died in 2003, was in the construction business in Southern California. The couple owned Oakbrook Farm in California. In addition to breeding Ava Knowsthecode, they bred Grade I winner Northern Emerald (Green Dancer).

Patricia Klussman currently owns four broodmares and co-owns an additional two mares with Parke. “She typically sells colts and keeps the fillies,” Parke explained. “It seems like the mare has had a lot of colts recently, but one day hopefully she’ll have another filly for her.”

While Justin Phillip sold for \$400,000 at the 2009 Keeneland September auction, yesterday’s \$625,000 sale was Klussman’s biggest sales success to date. “She was very pleased and pretty overwhelmed,” Parke said.

Parke admitted her own string of successes hasn’t quite sunk in yet. “I’ve had a couple really nice sales for clients before, but never back-to-back like this,” Parke said.

After signing the ticket for the Bernardini colt, Ferguson was quick to give credit to the youngster’s connections. “[Parke] brought two lovely yearlings here; she gets

\$1.2 million for one and \$625,000 for the other,” Ferguson said. “She deserves it because they are two beautifully presented yearlings with great pedigrees. I am delighted that she has been rewarded. I say all the time that people outside the business don’t realize how hard it is to produce horses that look like that. They should be very proud of themselves.” **Cont. p6**

Of the yearling's pedigree, Ferguson added, "Obviously Bernardini goes from strength to strength. He's got horses on both sides of the Atlantic and he's got three Group 1 winners already. He's really doing it everywhere. [The female family] is solid as a rock. The mare has done it every time. Although the 2-year-old is on the sidelines at the moment, I understand he's coming back and will be a real performer."

Cauthen One and Done...

Agent Doug Cauthen didn't appear to have much luck early in Wednesday's session at Keeneland, however, he finally struck with [hip 770](#), a colt by WinStar stalwart Tiznow, who brought a \$550,000 final bid. Out of multiple graded stakes placed Ex Caelis (Fusaichi Pegasus), the dark bay was purchased for a syndicate, which will also include the colt's breeder, Diamond A's Gerald Ford. According to Cauthen, the dark bay will eventually join Richard Mandella's string in Southern California.

"He was like a lot of the nice Tiznows," said Cauthen. "He was a big, strong and strapping horse."

In addition to the similarities to the colt's sire, Cauthen was pointed out that the yearling's 8-year-old dam-- a \$470,000 FTKJUL yearling that developed into a \$825,000 FTKNOV broodmare prospect--was also well represented.

"He has the the best qualities of the dam as well," Cauthen confirmed. "He's a really nice horse and, hopefully, he can really run." Cont. p7

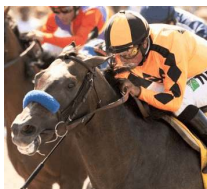

While Cauthen hadn't signed a ticket for his agency until yesterday's session, he indicated that he did serve as an advisor to Bill Casner for the purchase of hip 400, a full brother to Tapit (Pulpit), that sold for \$450,000 during Tuesday's session. According to Cauthen, Casner bought the colt for his wife Susan as a birthday present and signed her name to the ticket.

Despite some minor logistical issues with the changes added to this year's sale, Cauthen feels the overall vibe so far has been positive.

"It seems like there are a few new players here, so there seems like there is a little bit of an upswing, anyway," Cauthen explained. "Hopefully, as an industry, things will continue to improve. We're all in it together, whether you are a breeder or a buyer. Things have to work on all levels."--C Bossinakis

War Front Continues to Roll With \$435K Colt...

Claiborne's breakout sophomore sire War Front (Danzig) continues to roll on the track and in the ring. Boosted by the exploits of his recent Grade I winners The Factor and Summer Soiree, War Front has seen yearlings at September sell for \$435,000 ([hip 24](#)), \$425,000 ([hip 119](#)) and \$300,000 ([hip 383](#)).

Yesterday, he added [hip 605](#) to the list of notable sales. A colt produced by Bobbin (Pulpit), a full sister to MGSW Wend, went to Roy and Gretchen Jackson's Lael Stable for \$435,000 after bloodstock advisor Headley Bell of Nicoma Bloodstock saw off all challengers for the Mar. 10-foaled bay. The Hancock family's Claiborne Farm bred and consigned the youngster. Bell was on a cell phone up front while bidding on behalf of the operation that has campaigned, among others, GI Kentucky Derby hero Barbaro (Dynaformer).

"We're thrilled he's going to a great home," said Dell Hancock, who came up to congratulate Bell in the pavilion and was able to say thanks to the Jacksons on Bell's cell phone, too. Cont. p8

“He’ll have every opportunity, and I think he’s a wonderful horse. He was shown a lot back at the barn, and he was always so good. He’s got the right temperament to be a good racehorse, and I hope they have a lot of luck.”

The colt’s second dam is Claiborne’s multiple stakes-winning homebred Thread (Topsider), and while his dam Bobbin was another Claiborne homebred, she took a somewhat circuitous route to the historic farm’s breeding shed. That’s because Claiborne offered Bobbin as a yearling at the 2004 Keeneland September Sale, where she sold to Ray Bauch for \$100,000. Racing for Blyar Stable, Bobbin earned over \$32,000 on the track for trainers Todd Pletcher and Michael Matz. Bobbin was put back through the Keeneland January sale in 2008, and Seth Hancock brought her back into the Claiborne fold with a successful \$175,000 offer. The War Front colt was Bobbin’s second produce. “That female family’s been good to us, and we’ll keep our fingers crossed for the Jacksons,” Dell Hancock added.

War Front is currently the second-leading second-crop sire in the nation behind Bernardini. He has seven black-type winners in 2011, which leads all sophomores. “Stallions are so hard to come by these days, and they’re very hard to make,” said Hancock. “War Front’s by Danzig, who stood at Claiborne, and we raised him at Claiborne. Joe Allen [who bred and campaigned War Front] has been a client and a friend of ours, and it’s been a dream come true to see a horse come back home and do what he’s done.” -L Marquardt

Donegal Aiming for Derby 2013...

Jerry Crawford's Donegal Racing partnership enjoyed instant success when Paddy O'Prado (El Prado {Ire}), part of the group's first yearling purchases in 2008, finished third in the 2010 GI Kentucky Derby. Crawford is back in action at the September sale, looking for horses to join Donegal's Derby Dreams 4. Crawford, bidding alongside trainer Dale Romans, has already signed the ticket on three yearlings. The most expensive of the trio is a colt by Tiznow ([hip 792](#)) who sold for \$450,000 yesterday. "I told my team I think he looks like a Corvette," Crawford said after signing the ticket on the yearling out of GSP Flaming Heart (Touch Gold). "I think if we lead him over for a maiden special this fall at Churchill, on looks, he'd be the favorite. Breeding aside, I think he'll be a miler type, with just all kinds of speed in the pedigree. So that's a little deviation from our usual strategy of Derby, Derby, Derby." Crawford signed the ticket at \$350,000 for a colt by Giant's Causeway out of Questress (Seeking the Gold) ([hip 210](#)) Monday night and purchased a Street Sense colt out of Diamonds for Lil (Summer Squall) ([hip 722](#)) Wednesday for \$320,000. Crawford has been happy with the results.

"We've lost out on one and got the other three we've bid on," he said. "But we've been willing to pay. The Tiznow colt I thought would go into the \$600,000s. So I was well-pleased with that. And the Giant's Causeway on Monday was just a magnificent yearling and we only had to pay \$350,000--I was stunned." Donegal added a new element to its repertoire last year, with Crawford taking the partnership international. "We've started racing in Ireland now," the Iowa native said. "We're working with [trainer] David Wachman over in Ireland. Last year we bought a horse here and sent it to him. This year, we might buy one here or at Goffs." The 2011 partnership will likely include eight yearlings and could have around 20 members, with a focus squarely on enjoying the experience. "We don't run this as a for-profit operation," Crawford explained. "We don't mark the horses up, we don't charge a management fee. We're sort of sportsmen, who are doing this because we love the sport. It's fun for me. Most of the partners are my friends. Especially after Paddy O'Prado, Donegal is kind of a household name in Des Moines right about now." -JM

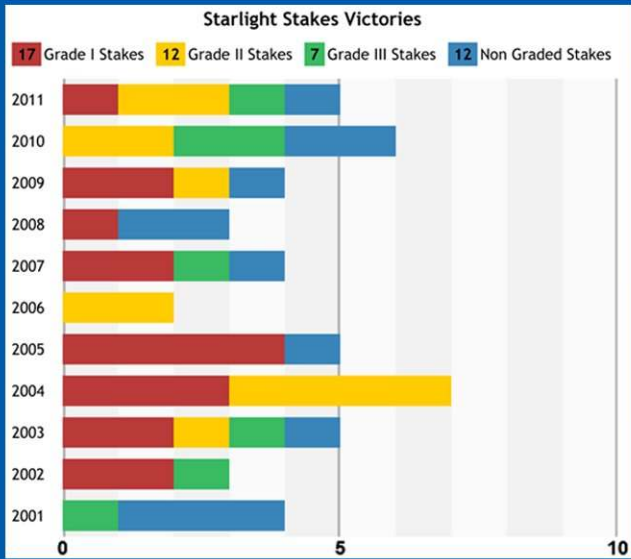

West/Glass Come Out Running...

Owner Gary West kicked off Keeneland's Wednesday session quickly, collecting the first yearling through the ring, [hip 524](#), a colt by Lemon Drop Kid. Accompanied by bloodstock advisor Ben Glass in the corner of the pavilion, the telecommunications mogul went up to \$260,000 to secure the colt out of multiple stakes placed A Bit of Pleasure (High Yield), a half-sister to GISP Past the Point (Indian Charlie). Glass signed the ticket for the bay, who was consigned by Nursery Place.

"We really liked him as an individual," said Glass. "We thought he was very racy and athletic looking, and we think he's correct enough to stay sound as a racehorse. But that's pretty much our criteria for all the horses we purchase."

Just a few hips later, the West/Glass team was back in action, purchasing [hip 538](#), a colt by Tapit for \$375,000. Out of Grade III winner Alpine Garden (Lemon Drop Kid), the chestnut was consigned by Indian Creek (Dave Parrish Jr), agent.

"I think it's a misconception that Tapit is a 'filly sire,' because we've had some colts that can run by him," offered Glass. "This colt fit all of our criteria and we liked him as an individual. And the stallion comes from a farm that I like very much, so we like to support them."

Rounding out yesterday's purchases was [hip 655](#), another son of Lemon Drop Kid, who brought a \$340,000 final bid. Offered by Lane's End--handling the dispersal of the Estate of Edward P. Evans's Spring Hill Farm--the dark bay is a full-brother to GII Futurity S. and GII Peter Pan S. winner Charitable Man.

"We were prepared to go a little bit higher for him, but we got him for less than we thought he would sell for," admitted Glass.

During Book 2's second session, Glass's affinity for the Lane's End stallion Lemon Drop Kid was in strong evidence, and for good reason. Among homebreds campaigned by Gary and Mary West is Pass the Dice (Lemon Drop Kid), winner of all three lifetime starts for trainer Wayne Catalano (Lemon Drop Kid). In his latest start, the dark bay 3-year-old won at Arlington Park Sept. 8.

"We love Lemon Drop Kid," he said. "He's a pretty solid, all-around sire. I think he's going to get stronger; he's getting better mares, and his yearlings are very nice looking."

The 15-year-old Lane's End resident is not the sole reason for Glass's strong affection for the stallion.

"I think Lane's End is one of the most accommodating stallion farms around,"

he added. "The people are good, the farm is good, the horses are good."

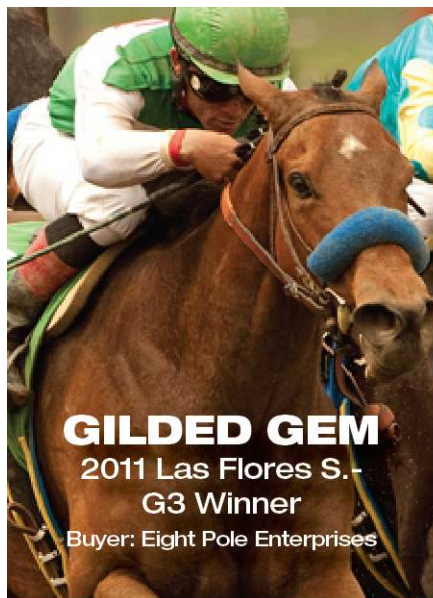
As for his general sense of Wednesday's session, Glass added, "I think the prices have been high on everything we bid on. For the three I bid on today, I think it's a very solid market."

In Book 1, West secured [hip 26](#), a son of Distorted Humor out of X Star (Pulpit) for \$350,000. Earlier in Book 2, he purchased [hip 301](#), a colt by Pulpit out of Shop Again (Wild Again) for \$360,000; and [hip 455](#), a son of Arch out of Uppity Kitty (Tale of the Cat) for \$260,000. -C Bossinakis

Joyful Victory Breeder Sells Lion Heart for \$290K...

Windhaven Farm's William D. Graham, breeder of this year's good 3-year-old filly Joyful Victory (Tapit), earned every drop of the celebratory beverage he was sipping in the Northern Dancer bar yesterday after a Lion Heart colt he bred out of the mare Captivating (Arch) brought \$290,000 at September. The Ontario-bred colt, consigned by Four Star Sales, sold as [hip 631](#) to Canadian-based trainer Mark Casse, agent. Graham had purchased the colt's dam as a yearling for C\$65,000 at the 2003 FTCSEP sale, and while Captivating didn't win on the track, she's already been a fine producer for her connections. Her first foal is the Windhaven homebred Dancing Raven (Tomahawk). That multiple

stakes-winning 4-year-old filly has been first or second in nine of 15 and earned in excess of \$370,000. She most recently was third in the Algoma S. at Woodbine Sept. 5. Captivating's second foal, the unraced 2-year-old Penelope Plum (Badge of Silver), turned a solid profit as a \$75,000 KEESEP yearling last year, but the Lion Heart colt proved different class in the ring yesterday. Graham said he anticipated plenty of interest, but that the colt exceeded expectations. "We thought maybe he'd bring \$200,000," said Graham.

Lion Heart, who now stands in Turkey, is coming off a big 2010. He ended the year as the leading third-crop sire by progeny earnings and was the sire of the GI Breeders' Cup Turf upsetter Dangerous Midge. This year's he's been represented by the stakes winners Gran Lioness and Ronron.

Based in Ontario, Graham is the president and CEO of Graham Bros. Construction Ltd., which is involved in road construction. Graham has been in horse racing since the early 1960s and has campaigned the likes of Blondeinamotel (Bates Motel), who won the Woodbine Oaks under jockey Pat Day in 1989. The filly also ran second in that year's GI Ashland S. here at Keeneland and ran third in the GI Kentucky Oaks. Blondeinamotel was trained by Michael Doyle, who sat alongside Graham yesterday at the sale. Graham has two farms--one in Lexington, across from Darby Dan Farm--and one in Ontario. Both operate under the Windhaven banner. Graham has about 25 mares split between them. **Cont. p12**

Graham sold Joyful Victory here for \$60,000 as a short yearling at the 2009 January Sale. Winner of this season's GII Fantasy S. and GIII Honeybee S. and runner-up in the GI Mother Goose S., Joyful Victory has banked over \$485,000. Graham said he intends to sell her dam, the 17-year-old Wild Lucy Black (Wild Again), in foal to Congrats, at Keeneland November. He won't have to wait that long for more action at Keeneland, though. Today, he sells [hip 1003](#), a colt by Hard Spun--Meandering (Gone West) who hails from the VanMeter Sales draft. "He's a nice colt; he's just as nice as this one, I think," said Graham. -L Marquardt

ALLIANCE TO ACCREDIT UP TO 25 TRACKS IN 2011

The NTRA Safety and Integrity Alliance expects to accredit as many as 25 racetracks in 2011—a 66 percent increase over the number certified in the first accreditation cycle than ran from 2009 to 2010. All but one of the 15 originally accredited tracks are on schedule to be recertified this year.

Keeneland, Churchill Downs, Pimlico, Arlington Park, Hollywood Park, Belmont Park, Del Mar, Saratoga, and Calder have been recertified. Tracks in the accreditation pipeline include Turfway Park, Monmouth Park, Santa Anita, Aqueduct, Woodbine and Fair Grounds.

Up to seven never-before certified tracks are likely to be reviewed this year.

The Alliance certifies tracks meeting a minimum set of standards in six areas: Injury Reporting and Prevention; Safety Equipment and a Safer Racing Environment; Medication and Testing; Health and Safety of Jockeys; Aftercare of Retired Racehorses; and Wagering Security.

"I would say that consignors are being very realistic. Selling the horse is coming first, not getting the home run. If you get the home run, great, but the first thing is that you have to be aware that you have to sell your horse."

Jury Out for Cup Bid...

⊛ **"TDN Rising Star"** ⊛ Jukebox Jury (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}) will be aimed at the G1 Emirates Melbourne Cup, connections announced yesterday. After Alan Spence's 5-year-old dead-headed in Saturday's G1 Irish Field St Leger at The Curragh, the Nov. 1 Flemington highlight is on the cards. "I've spoken to Mark and the plan is to go, as his owner is very keen," the trainer's wife and assistant Deirdre Johnston told *PA Sport*. "He's a great traveller, is very laid-back and goes on any ground. He's very versatile--he's won a Group 1 over a mile and a half and a mile and three-quarters--and has come out of the race great."

Japanese Pair on Target for Arc...

Connections of Hiruno d'Amour (Jpn) (Manhattan Cafe {Jpn}) and Nakayama Festa (Jpn) (Stay Gold {Jpn}) have given the green light to the duo ahead of the Oct. 2 G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe. Second and fourth, respectively, behind Sarafina (Fr) (Refuse To Bend {Ire}) in Sunday's G2 Prix Foy over the Arc trip at Longchamp, they were reported to have come out of that contest without any problems by the Japan Racing Association's Representative Shingo Soma. "I spoke to the trainers after the race and they were both happy, as both horses ran good races," he told *PA Sport*. "It was Nakayama Festa's first run since the Japan Cup last November and he led for a long way before getting tired. There were only four horses in the race and I think that is the reason Nakayama Festa went to the front. But the Arc will be much different, with many more horses and I think he will race differently then. Hiruno d'Amour had not run since winning the Tenno Sho at Kyoto at the start of May and he was only just behind Sarafina. Sarafina is a brilliant filly, but the two Japanese horses were not too far behind her and they should both have a chance to get a place next month. Both trainers expect their horses to improve on their performance when they run in the Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe and I am very optimistic."

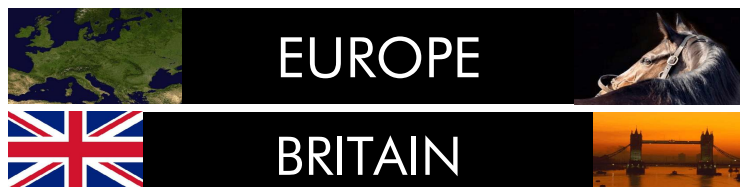
