EIGHT SET FOR CHARIOT TEST

Teruya Yoshida's **Sahpresa** (Sahm) will face seven rivals in tomorrow's G1 Kingdom of Bahrain Sun Chariot S. at Newmarket. Her attempt at a third consecutive renewal was made easier by the withdrawal of Khalid Abdullah's G1 Matron S. heroine **Emulous** (GB) (Dansili {GB}).

Another notable absentee at the declaration stage was Sheikh Ahmed bin Rashid Al Maktoum's unbeaten **Nahrain** (GB) (Selkirk), but the race still looks to have a competitive feel with the supplemented Sept. 8 G3 Sceptre S. winner **Alanza** (Ire) (Dubai Destination) and **"TDN Rising Star"** and July 8 G1 Falmouth S. scorer

Timepiece (GB) (Zamindar) set to keep the French mare on her toes. Back for a third time here is Fawzi Abdulla Nass's **Strawberrydaiquiri** (GB) (Dansili {GB}), who was 4 1/4 lengths behind Sahpresa when fourth two years ago and 1 3/4 lengths second to the Collet flagbearer 12 months ago when trained by Sir Michael Stoute. Now with Brian Meehan, the grey was fifth in the Feb. 18 G2 Balanchine and seventh in the Mar. 26 G1 Dubai Duty Free at Meydan and was having her first start since when seventh behind the subsequent G1 Garden City S. runner-up Theyskens' Theory (Bernardini) in Sandown's Atalanta S., which looked much stronger than its listed status Aug. 20. "She is a smart mare who was runner-up in this last year and shaped with great promise in seventh in the hot Sandown listed race won by stablemate Theyskens' Theory," Meehan said. "She is working nicely and looks set for a big run."

RAHY PASSES AWAY

Rahy (Blushing Groom {Fr}--Glorious Song, by Halo), pensioned from stud duty at Three Chimneys in 2009, died from the infirmities of old age, it was announced Thursday. He was 26. From 19 crops, Rahy sired 13 Grade/Group 1 winners, including champions Dreaming of Anna, Fantastic Light and Serena's Song. The chestnut also made a big mark as a broodmare sire, and is responsible for Grade/Group 1 winners After Market, Giant's Causeway, Life at Ten, Megahertz (GB), Osceola (Brz), Rahy's Attorney, Rutherienne and Sophisticat.

"Rahy was a cornerstone in the development of Three Chimneys," Three Chimneys owner Robert Clay commented. "He was a little horse with a lot of heart. We owe him so much. We will be forever grateful to Sheikh Maktoum for giving us the opportunity to stand Rahy, and to the Maktoum family for partnering with us in developing his magnificent stud career." Cont. p3

BREEDERS' CUP ANNOUNCES POST TIME & WAGERING MENU *Edited Press Release*

The Breeders' Cup announced the wagering menu and post times for the 28th World Championships, to be held Friday, Nov. 4 and Saturday, Nov. 5 at Churchill Downs in Louisville, Kentucky. There will be a total of 10 races (six BC races) on the Friday program (post time 2:00 p.m. EDT), and 12 races on Saturday (9 BC races). The tentative order for Friday's Breeders' Cup races are: \$500,000 Juvenile Sprint (4:10 p.m.); \$1-million GII Juvenile Fillies Turf (4:50 p.m.); \$1-million GI Sentient Jet Filly & Mare Sprint (5:30 p.m.); \$2-million GI Grey Goose Juvenile Fillies (6:10 p.m.); \$2-million GI Emirates Airline Filly & Mare Turf (6:50 p.m.); and \$2-million GI Ladies' Classic (7:30 p.m.).

On Saturday, first post time is 12:05 p.m. EDT, beginning with an allowance race and a stakes race. The tentative order of Breeders' Cup races are: \$500,000 GII Marathon (1:20 p.m.); \$1-million GI Juvenile Turf (2:02 p.m.); \$1.5-million GI Sentient Jet Sprint (2:37 p.m.); \$1-million GII Turf Sprint (3:21 p.m.); \$2-million GI Grey Goose Juvenile (4:01 p.m.); \$2-million GI TVG Mile (4:45 p.m.); \$1-million GI Dirt Mile (5:25 p.m.); \$3-million GI Emirates Airline Turf (6:07 p.m.); and \$5-million GI Classic (7:00 p.m.). An additional stakes race will be the 12th race at 7:40 p.m. There will be an Ultra Pick Six with a guaranteed gross pool of \$2 million on the Saturday program, beginning with the Turf Sprint and concluding with the Classic. The Official race order for both days of the World Championships will be finalized Wed., Oct. 26. The remainder of each day's card will be set after entries and post-positions are drawn Monday, Oct. 31.

Featured on this year's wagering menu is a new Breeders' Cup Pick 5 with a 50-cent minimum bet value. The wager will be offered on the first five Breeders' Cup races each day. The wager offers a mandatory payout on each championship day.

Also featured on the Breeders' Cup cards:

- Fridays Ultra Pick 6 will have a guaranteed gross pool of \$750,000, while Saturday's Ultra Pick 6 will feature a \$2-million guaranteed gross pool. If no one hits the Friday Ultra Pick 6, the pool will carry over into Saturday's Ultra Pick 6. The wager is a mandatory payout at the end of the Saturday program.
- A Daily Double wager linking the Breeders' Cup Ladies' Classic on Friday to the Breeders' Cup Classic on Saturday will again be offered.
- Both days will feature The Pick 4, with a 50-cent minimum. Friday's all Championships Pick 4 (races 7-10), will have a guaranteed pool of \$750,000. On Saturday, there will be two guaranteed Pick 4s. The early all Championships Pick 4 (races 4-7) will have a \$1-million guaranteed gross pool and the late all Championships Pick 4 (races 8-11) will have a \$1.5 million gross pool.
- A Super High Five wager on both the Ladies' Classic and the Classic will be offered. Bettors are required to select the first five finishing places on one ticket. If no one hits the Super High Five on Friday, the pool will carry over to Saturday's Super High Five on the Classic. The wager is a mandatory payout after the Classic.

Rahy, a \$2-million KEEJUL yearling purchase by Sheikh Maktoum bin Rashid Al Maktoum, began his career overseas with trainer Sir Michael Stoute, winning

the Listed Sirenia S. and placing in the G1 Middle Park S. at two. He annexed one of three starts during his sophomore season, then was shipped to the U.S. and transferred to Neil Drysdale for his 4-year-old campaign. Rahy posted a 10-length victory in the GII Bel Air H. at

Hollywood Park and concluded his racing career with runner-up efforts in Santa Anita's GIII Goodwood H. and GIII Harold C. Ramser Sr. H.

Three Chimneys purchased a 50% interest in Rahy following his retirement in 1989, and stood him in partnership with the Maktoum family for the duration of his breeding career. His stud fee reached as high as \$100,000.

"Rahy is one of the most important stallions we've had," Three Chimneys President Case Clay said. "As a stallion, he had a profound and lasting impact on the breed and was integral to the development and success of Three Chimneys. He was truly a world-class international sire."

Bred by Hill 'n' Dale Farm in Kentucky, Rahy is out of Canadian Horse of the Year and two-time champion older mare Glorious Song, who is a full-sister to champion Devil's Bag and leading sire Saint Ballado. Glorious Song also produced multiple champion Singspiel (Ire) (In the Wings {GB}).

Rahy will be buried in the Three Chimneys stallion cemetery.

"He was the ultimate 'great things come in small packages' kind of horse," stallion manager Sandy Hatfield said. "He was really a little s--t! He kicked harder and faster than any of the other stallions, but that definitely wasn't a reason not to love him. I have so much respect for that horse. We'll miss him a lot."

Crius opened his account on debut in a Warwick maiden July 7 before adding a novice event on the July Course here 22 days later. Runner-up in a mile nursery at York's Ebor meeting Aug. 20, the bay filled that same spot in the Listed Ascendant S. at Haydock back at that trip last time Sept. 3. He showed plentiful speed dropped back in distance to put some smart reputations to the sword in this intriguing affair. Leading the eventual third-place finisher Zip Top as that pair raced alone towards the stand's side, Crius was on top overall before the quarter pole and never looked caught as the favorite Farraaj made heavy weather of the task in hand. "I gave him an awful ride at York and when I made the running on him at Haydock on slow ground, I thought I should have gone faster, but with the tailwind today I let him rip," jockey Richard Hughes said. "I knew if I was quite near to the rail and he was getting tired I wouldn't have far to go to get to it. This was a little bit sharp for him and he's a big, tall horse who has done us proud today, so maybe we'll leave him off for the year. We wouldn't put him down as our Guineas horse, but he's decent and could go for the Craven."

MORE BLUE LIGHT?

Newly moved to Newmarket from Ascot, today's G1 Shadwell Fillies' Mile features **Lyric of Light**, who bids to extend her unbeaten record for a stable which has enjoyed a purple patch with its juvenile fillies so far in 2011. Her neck defeat of ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ **Fallen For You** in Doncaster's G2 May Hill S. a fortnight ago was characterised by some late wandering and this tough test, which was originally the target of her stable companion Discourse (Street Cry {Ire}), comes up quickly on the back of that run. "Lyric of Light is in good form and she has improved since Doncaster," trainer Mahmood Al Zarooni said. "She came on a lot for her first start at Newmarket and I hope that she has learned plenty from the May Hill S., because she was still very green. She has improved with every start this season, so I am hopeful that she can continue her upward curve." Whether Fallen For You can reverse May Hill form is debatable, as she appeared to be second-best with no excuses that day. But connections hold her in the highest regard and the manner of her debut success on the July Course here July 30 suggests she could be out of the top drawer. **Samitar**, who took the G3 Albany S. at Royal Ascot June 17, was 3 1/4 lengths behind that duo in the May Hill. Other interesting prospects could be the unexposed pair **Albamara** and **Firdaws**. Both daughters of significant Group 1 winners, the former scored by four lengths at Epsom Aug. 30

Firdaws opened her account in a seven-furlong maiden at Salisbury Sept. 1. "Firdaws is obviously a filly of great promise," the owner/breeder Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum's Racing Manager Angus Gold said of the Roger Varian trainee. "She won in workmanlike fashion at Salisbury, but I hope that was due to the ground--it was very dead that day and she didn't quicken like she did at Newbury [on debut]. The mile is going to be in her favour and she will like the forecast faster ground at Newmarket. We don't know if she is good enough to win a Group 1, but it would be particularly fitting if she did."

FINDING HIS VOICE

This newly upgraded part of the Champions' Series has attracted a disappointing turnout, with last year's G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. winner **Poet's Voice** looking to put a below-par comeback effort in the G2 Celebration Mile behind him. Only seventh in that Aug. 27 Goodwood contest, he is joined by **Emerald Commander**, who needs to find improvement on his latest third in the Listed Fortune S. at Sandown nine days ago. "Poet's Voice came out of his Goodwood run very well and he has improved for that race," trainer Saeed bin Suroor commented. "He did a very good piece of work on Saturday and he looks physically better than last month. This is the right trip for him and I am hopeful that he can run a better race this time. Emerald Commander has been working well lately and I have been pleased with his preparation." Sir Michael Stoute puts forward **Tazahum**, who has progressed all season and put up one of his best efforts when a latest second to the subsequent G3 Arc Trial winner Green Destiny (Ire) (Marju {Ire}) in York's G3 Strensall S. over a furlong further Aug. 19. Veteran **Premio Loco** took a poor renewal of the G2 Park S. over seven furlongs at Doncaster last time Sept. 10, but has a fine record in small-field events and warrants respect.

A SHARP TRIO

Godolphin hold the aces in the juvenile fillies' category this year and send an intriguing trio in this early 1000 Guineas pointer headed by the G3 Prestige S. runner-up **Rakasa**. The choice of Frankie Dettori holds the re-opposing **Questing** on the form of that Aug. 27 Goodwood contest. **Desert Gazelle** earned a ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ tag with a four-length winning debut over six furlongs at this town's July Course July 9 before failing to build on that performance when only fourth behind Discourse (Street Cry {Ire}) in the G3 Sweet Solera S. over seven furlongs of the same strip last time Aug. 6. That form has received a boost after the fifth-place finisher Wahylah (Ire) (Shamardal) took the £100,000 Tattersalls Millions race here recently and she has another chance to confirm her initial promise. **Minidress** is no back-number. The Al Zarooni trainee was an impressive four-length winner of a seven-furlong maiden on the Sweet Solera card. "Rakasa surprised us a little at Goodwood with how well she ran and has improved a little bit since then," Mahmood Al Zarooni commented. "There is a bit of a question mark over how she will cope with the ground, but she is in good form at the moment. Minidress has also improved for her debut, but she is still a little weak. She is a tough filly and we will find out more about her ability." Saeed bin Suroor said of Desert Gazelle, "She won nicely on her debut, but we were a little disappointed with her latest start. She came out of that race very well and worked nicely on Tuesday morning. She deserves another chance in a group race and I am looking forward to seeing her run well." **Albaspina** beat a lesser crew in a Carlisle maiden on debut Sept. 7, but there was a lot to like about the way she went through the race. The grey is yet another from the famed Alruccaba (Ire) dynasty to run for Kirsten Rausing and Sir Mark Prescott.

Weatherbys Insurance £300,000 2-Y-O S. at Doncaster, earned champion status in France when victorious in Longchamp's G1 Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere. On the latter occasion, he had the subsequent Group 1 winners Tin Horse (Ire) (Sakhee) and Moonlight Cloud (GB) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) behind. After a spring setback, the bay was fifth in the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains back at Longchamp in May and seventh in the G1 St James's Palace S. at Royal Ascot the following month. Reverting to sprinting for the G1 Prix Maurice de Gheest at Deauville in August, he was fifth there before a tame effort when trailing in the G1 Haydock Sprint Cup three weeks ago. 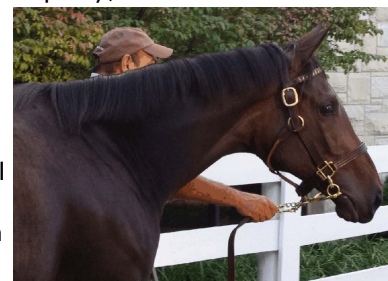

Adena was plenty busy Thursday, buying four of the five top-priced yearlings and 12 prospects overall. That pushed Adena's overall ledger to 37 horses bought for \$4,466,000. Consigned by Select Sales as [hip 3401](#), the filly is from the family of GISW Behaving Badly (Pioneering) and hails from her sire's first North American crop. "She was just a big, strong-walking filly who was just one of those who fell through the cracks last November," said Craig Brogden. "We're always looking for a good one, and it all worked out."

Elle Moreno Strikes Again...

There's a young up-and-comer in the sport who is no doubt bound for success...and who has been making an impact on the sales sheets at Keeneland. Her name is Elle Moreno, and she's the 7-year-old daughter of Southern Equine Stable's Mike Moreno and his wife Tiffany. Elle's name has now appeared on three tickets at September, most recently yesterday, when Bluewater Sales signed as agent for [hip 3478](#), a colt by Majestic Warrior--Distorted Lady, at \$75,000. Earlier in the sale, Elle's name was also on the slips for [hip 1384](#), a colt by Mineshaft--Fi who went for \$180,000; and [hip 1509](#), a filly by Tapit--Sindy With an S who also sold for \$180,000. When the horses hit the track, they'll run in Elle's own silks, reportedly. Asked if she's been playing a role in the selection process, Bluewater's Mike Levy said, "Well, she said she wanted a gray horse, so we were able to get her a Tapit filly. Bill Oppenheim was a thought provoking speaker at the Pedigree, Genetics & Performance Conference earlier this month, and I am glad that the TDN took time to reproduce his talk in its entirety (TDN 9/21/11). Bill raised some interesting points in his talk, which I would like to take some time to comment on.

First was the issue of 'false positives' in pedigree analysis. As discussed at the conference, the Thoroughbred is not a good model for breed improvement: there is a long intergenerational gap (mares and stallions are generally 10 years old before we find out their worth), mares are able to produce only one foal a year, and we have a very poor method of evaluating genetic merit.

When you actually deal with it every day, the wastage or misallocation of resources when it comes to matings is truly mind-blowing in this industry, especially when compared to other breeds with far less money that use better measurements of breeding merit and genomic-based selection tools and get better and more consistent results.

Bill's assertion that he is more interested in looking at success rather than opportunity is one that I have (unsurprisingly) a dissenting view on. The odds, as Bill put it, are indeed against success; however, I believe that--within the context that we selectively focus on the subset of information that appears to reinforce our established "picture" or viewpoint--the more data available to breeders equals better decisions being made.

If the data is not presented to the contrary, as it is with the TrueNicks Enhanced Report and in other EquineLine products, breeders would be none the wiser, believing that one or two successes is repeatable and further misallocating resources resulting in continued waste. Environments of asymmetric information invariably result in adverse selection. **Cont. p12**

While there are plenty to choose from, a good example here is the Storm Cat stallion Forestry. When he retired to stud many thought that he was a 'lock' to appreciate Mr. Prospector line mares. His own sire had done well with them, and Forestry was from the family of Mr. Prospector (for whatever that is worth). To date, there have been 308 foals by Forestry out of Mr. Prospector line mares for 11 stakes winners. It is not a great cross for Forestry and he has done much better with mares from other broodmare sire lines. The one son of Mr. Prospector that has done well with Forestry is Fappiano. He is the sole exception. Mares by his sons and grandsons have produced 76 of the 308 foals for 5 of the 11 stakes winners, including this year's Preakness winner, Shackleford.

The data, when it is presented for intelligent interpretation, tells the story. When it comes to Mr. Prospector line mares, unless you have a Fappiano line mare, there are better options than Forestry. TrueNicks currently rates the generic Forestry/Mr. Prospector line nick a "D" and the Forestry/Fappiano nick a "B+." Nicks has both as an "A." I have to think that presenting the data, as we do in the TrueNicks Enhanced Report, gives breeders the opportunity to not only evaluate how the cross has done (as we display the number of times it has been tried), but also the quality of the horses that have been bred on the cross. As predictive as the rating is, a considerable proportion of the report's power lies in its reflective nature, its ability to show where genetic affinity has not occurred. This knowledge puts breeders in a far better position than they were blindly relying on a rating without any data context.

Even considering the long intergenerational gap that Thoroughbreds are produced upon, I also can't seem to find agreement with Bill's statement that "as soon as we know something works, it is outdated..." especially in this era of large stallion books where what 'works' is found more quickly than before. As noted industry consultant John Sparkman immediately questioned at the completion of Bill's talk, "Does that mean Coolmore should stop breeding Danehill mares to Galileo?"


While Bill obviously knew that question was coming, the Galileo/Danehill cross is worth understanding on three levels: 1) The cross itself is a very successful one. For Galileo, in terms of SW to foals percentage, it is one of his best; 2) When Galileo is bred to all other broodmare sires, by percentage of SW to runners there are none better than Danehill mares; and 3) Those Danehill mares that have been bred to Galileo have not, as a collective group, done better with any other sire or sire line. The point is, it is not only important to measure simply the success of the cross (i.e. the number of times that it has been tried). That is one-dimensional, and to a certain extent Bill is right, it doesn't mean much. But it is just as important to measure the alternatives for the sire and broodmare sire to give the cross context, which is what TrueNicks does.

Timeform ratings are developed on the basis of not only the performance of the horse, but the previous and subsequent performance of the horses that ran on the day and the previous performances of past horses. Context of opportunity is vitally important.

Bill's column does raise one issue that data can create, and it fits somewhat into his statement that success is not repeated at the same rate, I also think I can presume that he would agree with what I am about to say. Successful nicks/crosses lead breeders to believe that there is some type of magic at work that can overcome anything. Having worked as a buyer and seller of horses, as a stallion manager and breeder, as a pedigree analyst and now one that is using genomic tools to optimize selection, I am thoroughly convinced that it is much more important to really know your mare (or stallion), what he/she looks like, and who he/she represents in their pedigree. There is a nuance here that is lost on many breeders each year as they select the stallions for their mares. Data does not represent fact. Just because the mare is by Danehill doesn't mean that she inherited any of his genetic goodies. She got about 50% of his genes, but he may have given her none of the good versions of them. She could well be a Danehill mare in name only, a genetic null, and sending her to Galileo could be a complete waste of time. Genomics is going to start to sort this out.

Finally, Bill opines that the stakes system is not the optimal way of measuring success and promoting genetic improvement in the breed. I am in 100% agreement with him on this. It is a system that serves a purpose to classify performance, but as a breeding industry there are a lot better measures of performance that we could develop and implement to breed better and sounder racehorses. Using prize money, as the APEX rating does, to delineate class is possibly an even worse measure of performance than using black-type winners. The horse that finishes 6th in a Grade 1 race receives no prize money, and thus is not considered a superior runner based on that performance, but the horse winning a weak slots-fuelled state-bred maiden race receives almost enough to be considered an “A Runner.” The latter would most likely be beaten a furlong if the two ever met. Using prize money as a class discriminator presumes that prize money is rationally distributed and reflective of class and we all know that is not the case. Either way, as a collective worldwide group, breeders are doing a great and avoidable disservice to themselves.

A private study completed by a prominent owner/breeder this year pointed to mares that won listed races as being the worst group of mares to try to breed a stakes performer from. You have to overpay for them in the sales ring for what they are, and they usually disappoint as producers. There are a number reasons for listed winners being a bad bet in the breeding shed, trainer effect being the largest reason, but suffice to say, as an industry, rather than relying on black type status as a measure of merit, or “A Runners”, we would be better served developing a breeding value that had known heritability, allowing breeders to make informed purchase and selection decisions.

Today, breeders select their breeding stock (stallions and race mares), on the belief that what they are selecting for is heritable, but they really have no idea if it is or not. We buy mares because they won a stakes race, ran a 100 Beyer or a 4 on the sheets, but we have no information to tell us if a mare that ran a 4 on the sheets is more or less likely to produce a foal that is capable of running a 4 on the sheets. Fast mares are seemingly always popular to buy and fast stallions popular to breed to, but does it really matter if being “fast” itself is not heritable? On speed figures, Formal Gold would beat A.P. Indy, which should tell you enough about the foolishness of using handicapping figures for breeding selection.

Most breeders are in this game to firstly breed a good racehorse, breed a good horse more consistently, and by proxy improve the breed. Taking Bill’s statement on black type one step further, and knowing the limitations of using prize money as an arbiter of class, it would actually help us all if we had an accurate measure of not only what performance is, but what genetic merit and breed improvement meant in the first place.

Purses Increased at Suffolk:

The fall schedule at Suffolk Downs will include higher purses, two additional four-day race weeks, and the running of the \$100,000 Robert M. O'Malley Sprint S., the track announced yesterday. CHRB APPROVES SIGNAL DISTRIBUTION FOR SANTA ANITA MEET

Edited Press Release

The California Horse Racing Board announced Wednesday that it has agreed to offer free and total Internet access to HRTV programming during the upcoming fall meet at Santa Anita Park, scheduled to begin Sept. 30. The free Internet streaming will be available to anyone with Internet connectivity, regardless of device. The new distribution plan differs from the one presented to the Board at the Aug. 25 meeting, which was limited to PC computers and excluded Apple products and all mobile devices. At that meeting, the Board conditionally approved the license of the Pacific Racing Association to operate a race meet this fall at Santa Anita subject to submission of a signal distribution plan acceptable to the chairman and executive director. In a letter to Scott Daruty of the Stronach Group, CHRB Counsel Robert Miller indicated the chairman and executive director "reviewed the distribution program subsequently submitted by the Pacific Racing Association and approve the expanded program. Therefore, the Pacific Racing Association has met the condition mandated by the Board and the application is approved in its entirety." The letter continued, "the approval of the live racing signal program instituted by the Pacific Racing Association for the fall meet at Santa Anita is only applicable to the 2011 racing season."

Wallace, Grening & Jockey's Fund Honored by NTWB:

The National Turf Writers And Broadcasters will honor recently retired Oaklawn Park track announcer Terry Wallace, the Permanently Disabled Jockeys Fund, and New York-based turf writer David Grening at its annual awards dinner Nov. 2. Wallace, who has been called the "most recognizable voice in Arkansas," will receive the Mr. Fitz Award during the 52nd annual NTWAB Awards Dinner at the Louisville Slugger Museum in downtown Louisville. Presented annually to an individual or group for typifying the spirit of horse racing, the Mr. Fitz Award is named for the late Hall of Fame trainer Jim "Sunny Jim" Fitzsimmons. The Permanently Disabled Jockeys Fund, a public charity that provides financial assistance to nearly 60 former jockeys who have suffered catastrophic on-track injuries, will receive the Joe Palmer Award. Named for the former New York *Herald Tribune* turf writer, the Palmer Award is presented annually for meritorious service to racing. Led by the tireless and respected Nancy LaSala, the Permanently Disabled Jockeys Fund has disbursed more than \$2-million to those jockeys, many of whom have sustained paralysis or brain injuries. Grening, the lead Turf writer in New York for *Daily Racing Form* since September 1998, will receive the Walter Haight Award. Named for the former Washington *Post* turf writer and columnist, the Haight Award is presented annually for career excellence in Turf writing.
