Goffs stages its flagship Orby Sale over the next three days, hot on the heels of the success of last year's €125,000-graduate **Lightening Pearl (Ire)** (Marju {Ire}) in Saturday's G1 Cheveley Park S. at Newmarket.

Over the past 12 months, the likes of **Cape Blanco (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) and **Dancing Rain (Ire)** (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) have further advertised an auction which has long enjoyed the limelight in the major European yearling calendar. Dancing Rain, who followed her G1 Epsom Oaks victory with more Classic glory in

the G1 Preis der Diana, has a full-brother for sale from the draft of Camas Park Stud. [Hip 251](#) is seriously hot property, as his three-parts sister Sumora (Ire) (Danehill) is also the dam of this year's 2-year-old filly sensation Maybe (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}).

Dancing Rain is the latest Classic/Group 1 winner to add to an Orby honor roll that features **Bethrah (Ire)** (Marju {Ire}), **Alexander Goldrun (Ire)** (Gold Away {Ire}), **Bachelor Duke** (Miswaki), **Elusive Wave (Ire)** (Elusive City), **Fleeting Spirit (Ire)** (Invincible Spirit {Ire}), **Grandera (Ire)** (Grand Lodge), **Halfway to Heaven (Ire)** (Pivotal {GB}), **Lush Lashes (GB)** (Galileo {Ire}), **New Approach (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}), **Red Rocks (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}), **Septimus (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells), **Scorpion (Ire)** (Montjeu {Ire}) and **Vinnie Roe (Ire)** (Definite Article {GB}). Alongside the usual heavyweight sires are the first-crop names Big Brown, Duke of Marmalade (Ire), Henrythenavigator, the aforementioned New Approach (Ire) and Raven's Pass.

There are three additions to the sale and they include [hip 136](#), Tinnakill House's Dalakhani (Ire) half-sister to the 2009 G1 Prix Marcel Bousac runner-up On Verra (Ire) (Smart Strike) and Mount Coote Stud's [hip 297](#), an Oasis Dream (GB) filly who is a close relation to the 2004 G1 Irish Oaks third Hazarista (Ire) (Barathea {Ire}). Twelve months ago, Kilcarn Stud extended its legacy here when supplying a ninth sale topper in the last 18 renewals. Pat O'Kelly's nursery provides another highlight this time in [hip 246](#), a filly by Invincible Spirit (Ire).

The first foal out of Queen of Tara (Ire) (Sadler's Wells), she is an unraced 3/4-sister to the Group 1-winning Second Empire (Ire) (Fairy King) from the great Welsh Flame (GB) dynasty of Salsabil (Ire) and Marju (Ire). "Irish vendors have given us a very strong catalogue, with some close relatives of some of the best horses in training this year," Marketing Director Joey Cullen said. "We've got a great team and we've worked very hard this year in putting together a catalogue of exceptional horses. There is a varied stallion profile and we have the only two Tapits for sale in Europe this year alongside the Galileos, the Danehill Dancers and Oasis Dreams. We are offering the creme de la creme of the yearlings in Europe this year, so we'd be very hopeful that the sale will hold up strong." Goffs Chief Executive Henry Beeby added, "It is my firm belief that this year's offering is the best for quite some time, both in terms of pedigree and individual. On paper, our yearlings are by the most diverse sire profile with all the big names well represented, whilst the dam lines are packed full of Classic winners and Group 1 siblings. The focus of Goffs' yearling inspection team has been very much on the horse and on providing buyers with a catalogue of good-looking, well-conformed youngsters...Goffs has sold a Classic winner in each of the last 8 seasons with 10 individual Classics falling to Goffs graduates in just the last four years." New Approach, who graduated for €430,000 here five years ago, has five first-day colts from his initial crop on offer and the third of them through the ring is presented by the sire's breeder Lodge Park Stud. Out of a winning half-sister to the Classic-placed champion Mona Lisa (GB) (Giant's Causeway), this March-foaled bay is a half-brother to the 2008 Listed BMW Preis winner Flashing Colour (Ger) (Pivotal {GB}). Further down the page, which is awash with Meon Valley Stud-bred Group 1-winning stock, recent updates have been provided by the juveniles Lyric of Light (GB) (Street Cry {Ire}), winner of Friday's G1 Shadwell Fillies' Mile; and Caspar Netscher (GB) (Dutch Art {GB}), who has annexed both the G2 Gimcrack S. and G2 Mill Reef S. since last month.

Banimpire (Ire), a €52,000 buy here two years ago and a walking catalogue update, has won six black-type events this year. This March-foaled bay is her full-brother.

Monsun's influence has stretched worldwide this year with Stacelita (Fr) garnering Arlington's G1 Beverly D S., Pure Brise (Jpn) running second in Tokyo's G1 Yushun Himba, Selkis (Ger) winning Germany's G2 Diana Trial and Tertullus (Fr) bagging Sweden's G3 Stockholms Stora Pris. From a family of sires and champions, this March-foaled chestnut--his sire's sole offering at the sale--is a half-brother to a pair of stakes performers, one of which is the 2008 G1 Prix de l'Opera winner and G1 Preis der Diana runner-up Lady Marian (Ger) (Nayef). The page was boosted by Lagalp (Ger) (Galileo {Ire}) winning July's Listed Hanshin Cup and running third in Sunday's G3 Kolner Herbst-Stutenpreis.

FRENCH CHAMP BOEUF CALLS TIME

Four-time French champion jockey Dominique Boeuf yesterday announced his retirement at the age of 43. Originally an apprentice to Pierre and Patrick Biancone, the son of former jump jockey and trainer Georges

Boeuf rode his first winner in 1984 and was champion apprentice a year later. He partnered Groom Dancer to a first top-level success in the 1987 Prix Lupin. Boeuf captured his first championship in 1991 during a spell as the retained jockey for the Wildenstein family, but his career took a turn for the worse soon after when sentenced in 1995 for three years' imprisonment for his role in a drug ring alongside fellow riders including Olivier Doleuze. Boeuf's sentence was later commuted to a

suspended term. After retaining the jockeys' title in 1998 and adding a third in 2001, he was back in favor with the Wildensteins, which helped him to a fourth championship in 2002. Among the best he partnered were the multiple Group 1 winners Westerner (GB) (Danehill) and Aquarelliste (Fr) (Danehill), while other highlights of his career include capturing the 2003 G1 Hong Kong Vase on Vallee Enchantee (Ire) (Peintre Celebre) and 1996 G1 Prix Lupin on Helissio (Fr) (Fairy King). "I have ridden many good horses and Groom Dancer was the best," Boeuf declared yesterday. "He gave me my first Group 1. I have won in Hong Kong, I have won in England and everywhere. I don't know about the future. I need to decide with my wife and my kids. I have ridden for all the top owners and the top trainers. My career was very lucky."

DROSSELMAYER, BIRD RUN TARGET MARATHON VIA GOLD CUP

GI Belmont S. winner **Drosselmeyer** (Distorted Humor) and **Birdrun** (Birdstone), victorious in the June 10 GII Brooklyn H., appear likely to use Saturday's GI Jockey Club Gold Cup as a launching pad for the Nov. 5 GII Breeders' Cup Marathon at Churchill Downs, and not the more traditional spot of the Classic on the same afternoon. Last year's Belmont S. winner, Drosselmeyer, finished last of seven in his latest start in the GI Sword Dancer Invitational over the Saratoga sod Aug. 13. "I hope it was the turf," trainer Bill Mott told *Daily Racing Form* yesterday. "If it's more than the turf, we're in trouble." Earlier this spring, the WinStar runner won Belmont's 10-furlong One Count S. before finishing runner-up behind fellow Mott runner Birdrun in the 1 1/2-mile Brooklyn H. June 10. The latter, campaigned by Preston Stables, was second most recently in the July 16 Greenwood Cup at Parx. The chestnut, who worked five furlongs in 1:02.23 in company at Belmont Monday, will be coupled in the wagering this weekend with fellow Preston entrant **Flat Out** (Flatter).

STREAMLINED SELECTION AT TATTS OCT

The 2011 Tattersalls October Yearling Sale will not be the marathon that was 2010. This year's event, beginning in Newmarket next Wednesday, Oct. 5, offers 1,687 lots over the three books of the 2011 October Sale, down from 2,230 a year ago. It is the smallest allotment for Tattersalls' autumn yearling auction in eight years. "We catalogued more than we expected last year, and probably more than we would have wanted in the days available," Jimmy George, marketing director at Tattersalls, remarked. "A conscious effort was made to streamline everything this year without diluting the quality, and the catalogues reflect that. There has been a fairly significant drop in the foal crop, and it shows in the numbers. This is the first post-recession crop of yearlings--there were significantly less born in Britain and Ireland in 2010, compared to 2009, and that trend will continue. It is also the first-crop conceived at post-recession covering fees."

With satisfactory results at Deauville, Doncaster, Keeneland and Tattersalls Ireland so far this year, George believes it bodes well for the two-week event in Newmarket.

"You would have to be encouraged by what has happened at the yearling sales so far this year--supply is beginning to meet demand," he said. "The two had been out of kilter, but are starting to even out this year."

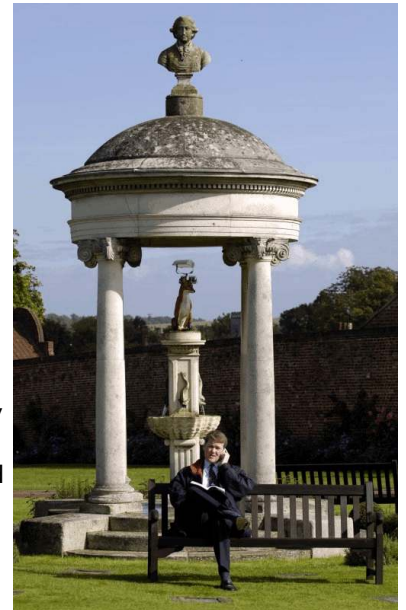
"We try to cover as many bases as possible on promotional trips and, hopefully, that will pay dividends at the October Sale," he added. "I think we'll see some new faces in Books 1, 2 and 3, and we have had considerable interest from all corners of the world. I would expect to see more participation from America and Australia than in recent years, and a greater diversity of buyers from the Gulf region. I think a lot of those people are looking to race here in England."

There are 35 yearlings by Galileo (Ire)--regarded as the world's best sire by many at present--catalogued in Books 1 and 2, and George feels they will serve as an incentive to buyers.

"This year's Book 1 is, by common consent, regarded as the best we've compiled for a number of years," he stated. "It's the premier yearling sale in Europe, and I think the extraordinary quality of stallions here at the moment is something buyers are latching onto. The top stallions in Britain and Ireland are the top sires in the world at present. It's caught the attention of the leading owners from all parts of the globe."

The restructured sale gives buyers the opportunity to attend Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe day in Paris Oct. 2 before heading on to Newmarket, where the sale is now punctuated by the new Future Champions raceday Saturday, Oct. 8.

"Last year, with the sheer number we catalogued, it would have been impossible to structure the sale as we have done this year," George continued. "But tightening up the three books has enabled us to hold Book 1 from Wednesday to Friday, lead into Future Champions Day at Newmarket on the Saturday and go smoothly into Book 2 the following Tuesday. When we restructured the sales in 2004, our aim was to produce a Book 1 that would appeal to buyers at all levels of the market, and for that you need a certain number of yearlings in the catalogue, otherwise it can be perceived as being too rarefied." **Cont. p7**

Tatts October Preview cont.

While Goffs dropped its Millions series of races last year, graduates of Tattersalls Book 1 will continue to be eligible to run in a group of contests worth a total of £1.3 million. The races have not enamored everybody, and were criticised by jockey Richard Hughes in a recent *Racing Post* article, suggesting that juveniles were skipping pattern races to contest the big-money sales events. Tattersalls officials do not agree.

“All you need to do to assess the importance of a series like the Tattersalls Millions is to talk to the connections of runners and see their excitement on the raceday,” said George. “At a time when the issue of prize-money levels has never been more acute, it’s vital that we all explore ways to provide owners with opportunities to run for significant prize money. To produce a series of races worth a seven-figure sum, catering to both 2- and 3-year-olds, and specifically framed to give opportunities below the top level of Book 1 is very important.

Gormanstown Stud is a new name among the list of consignors at this year's Tattersalls October Yearling Sale, but Edie Murray-Hayden, the driving force behind the 35-acre Kilcullen, County Kildare, farm is certainly no rookie when it comes to readying yearlings for the auction ring. With a resume that includes notable spells at two of Ireland's powerhouse studs, Coolmore and Kildangan, and a 14-year apprenticeship working alongside the late and hugely respected agent Brian Grassick, Murray-Hayden's is a name to note in what is her first year riding solo at the helm of the family farm. Furthermore, her sole offering at Book 1 will receive more than passing interest, thanks to a timely pedigree update.

The yearling in question is lot [319](#), a colt by the recently retired Shadwell stallion Green Desert out of Rosie's Posy (Ire) (Suave Dancer).

Murray-Hayden purchased the then foal at last year's Tattersalls December Sale for 43,000gns, and is hoping

the youngster will prove to be a profitable pinhook following the Group 1 exploits of his half-sister, the Simon Callaghan- trained Dubawi Heights (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}). Murray-Hayden owns the colt in partnership with Grassick's widow Sheila, who runs her family's Newtown Stud, and

was bought via the late agent's daughter Cathy. The team are not altogether surprised by Dubawi Heights' victory in the G1 Gamely S. at Hollywood in May and her runner-up finish behind Stacelita (Fr) (Monsun {Ger}) in the G1 Beverly D. S. at Arlington in August.

"It is always a massive help when a close relative wins a Grade I," Murray-Hayden said. "Dubawi Heights is part-owned by a friend of ours, Clodagh McStay, who Cathy and I know very well. Cathy actually bought Dubawi Heights as a 2-year-old, and a Cape Cross (Ire) half-brother--for Clodagh--who sold well last year, so we knew the family. They had an idea that Dubawi Heights had plenty of ability. She was a decent 2-year-old in England--she was injured last year and didn't run, but they knew she was up to winning something nice.

"She won the Gill [Wilshire H.], and that was very nice, and then to go and win a Grade I, it is a very exciting thing to have happen," she added. "Saying that, pedigree does not always win races, the individual has to do it, too, but it does help because it gets people to come to the door, which is a start. I've had a few people look at the colt here at home. I'm next door to Gilltown Stud, so we have a lot of passing traffic, and it is close for a lot of people to come and look at them."

Murray-Hayden's parents, Peter and Angela, originally established the stud as a cattle farm in 1967, later boarding Thoroughbred mares. In more recent times, Newtown Stud yearlings grazed the lush Kildare grass before Brian Grassick and Murray-Hayden started using Gormanstown as the base for their successful pinhooking partnership.

Should Murray-Hayden make a profit on the Green Desert colt, whose dam is a winning half-sister to G1 Haydock Sprint Cup winner Tante Rose (Ire) (Barathea {Ire}) out of the G1SP My Branch (GB) (Distant Relative {GB}), it will not be her first notable pinhook success. Along with her mentor, she purchased last year's G2 Norfolk S. and G2 Gimcrack S. winner Approve (Ire) (Oasis Dream {GB}) as a foal, and turned a profit despite the duo initially having to buy him back as a yearling at Tattersalls in October 2009.

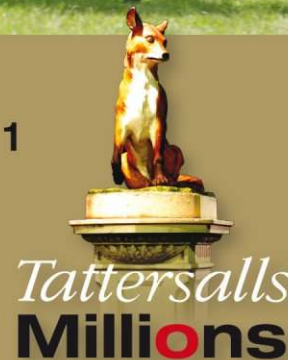

“Approve was the last horse Brian bought,” recalled Murray-Hayden. “He was part of our partnership and we made a bit of money on him. We bought him for €52,000 as a foal, and we sold him privately for about €60,000; we didn’t sell him in the ring. We didn’t make a fortune out of him, but I would rather sell good horses than expensive ones. That is the most important thing with racehorses--people will come back if you sell good ones.”

And that is the hope for the Green Desert colt, which will be the second of two Gormanstown yearlings heading to major sales this year. The first is a Tamayuz (GB) (Nayef) colt catalogued as [lot 186](#) at the Goffs Orby Yearling Sale next week, who Murray-Hayden refers to as “a real ball of energy and a very similar type to Approve.”

She continued, “The Green Desert is a nice horse, he is a late foal and he is growing. He is a little immature at the moment, but he will be a nice horse when he

matures. He is quite big and he is going through a growth phase at the moment. The frame is there and he is a nice horse to work on. He is a completely different character to Approve, who was always going to be a 2-year-old, but this horse will be more a 3-year-old. We will get these two off, and then

it's back to the sales at Goffs and Newmarket to hopefully reinvest for next year. These horses are never value until you get your return from them.”

A successful pinhook is at the heart of Murray-Hayden's business plan for Gormanstown Stud, and she is unwavering in her almost sage philosophy as to what constitutes success.

“For me,” she affirmed, “the most important thing is that they go on and run and that you are seen to sell nice horses. You do not necessarily have to make a big profit straight away, but if you sell nice horses, people will see it is down to you and that will pay off in the long run.”

They've Got Spirit, How 'Bout You?...

Those at Nick and Jane Forman-Hardy's Nottinghamshire-based Car Colston Hall Stud might have high hopes for all three of their offerings in Book 1 at Tattersalls next week, but there is no doubting which of the trio is the apple of the team's eye. Lot [312](#), an Invincible Spirit (Ire) half-brother to promising two-year-old Riot of Colour (GB) (Excellent Art {GB}), has always been considered a bit out of the ordinary by connections.

“We've got three nice colt, but the Invincible Spirit is awesome, he'll turn a few heads,” said stud manager Keith Haggins. “It's a big thing to say, because I've been involved with some very good horses, but he's probably the nicest yearling I've ever had to sell. He has it all, and there wouldn't be many nicer yearlings at the sale than him. I'd be pretty bullish.”

The stud is selling two other homebred colts in Book 1. Lot [218](#) is a Rock Of Gibraltar (Ire) three-quarters brother to Brian Meehan's promising juvenile Sir Bedivere (Ire) (Dansili {GB}), while lot [464](#) is a Dalakhani (Ire) half-brother to Ticker Tape (GB) (Royal Applause {GB}), winner of the GI American Oaks and GI Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup in 2004.

(Rainbow Quest), who appears on the page of lot 312, and Soldier Hollow (GB) (In the Wings {GB}), a four-time Group 1 winner Germany and Italy.

“The stud sold all three Group 1 winners as yearlings at

Tattersalls--we are not afraid to sell a good one,” added Haggins. “The main goal here is to produce good mares for the future, and ideally we like to keep as many fillies as possible and usually sell the colts, although sometimes you have to sell fillies because of numbers, particularly if we are top-heavy on a family.”

There are only nine mares at the 140-acre stud, and the Forman-Hardys are happy to let Haggins get on with the day-to-day running.

“The owners started with a couple of mares boarding at Whatton Manor Stud before building up this stud farm,” Haggins explained. “It’s a beautiful place, converted from an old dairy farm. Anyone that sees it is blown away by it, and it’s been done perfectly, with lovely paddocks.”

Haggins, a native of Drogheda in Ireland’s County Louth, joined Car Colston in January 2010, having previously managed Tom and Geraldine Molan’s Riversfield Stud, breeders of leading juvenile Harbour Watch (Ire) (Acclamation {GB}). He also spent five years with Jacqueline Norris at Jockey Hall Stud.

“I’m happy being hands-on and doing the jobs myself. I’ll drive the tractor, muck out a stable or handwalk a yearling,” he said.

Riotous Applause (GB) (Royal Applause {GB}), dam of lot 312, is in foal to Azamour (Ire), with a Shamardal colt foal, and she could gain further a pedigree boost in coming weeks from her full-sister Forest Crown (GB), in training with Chad Brown at Belmont. Twice listed-placed in Britain, she made her U.S. bow in an optional claimer going seven panels on the turf at Belmont Park July 14 and ran second by a nose.

“Forest Crown is a really nice filly,” commented Haggins. “The winning post just came too quick on her only start [in the U.S.], and she is being aimed at a Grade III in mid-October.”

Bulgarian Ganchev Looking to Open Eyes...

A Bulgarian former wrestler, whose astute business acumen secured a fortune during the post-communist carve-up of the mid-1990s, is aiming to make inroads at the sharp end of European bloodstock. Grisha Ganchev, operating under his Litex Commerce banner, purchased Britton House Stud in Somerset following the departure of previous owner Roger Baines, who wound down his operation ahead of a complete stock dispersal in 2006. Ganchev owns several companies in Bulgaria, including the successful Litex Lovech soccer club, and made headlines in December 2010 when he secured a lucrative contract with Chinese automotive manufacturer Great Wall Motors to build a new automobile plant in his homeland.

The 48-year-old tycoon’s substantial horseracing investment includes a private stable in Germany, where trainer Miltcho Minchev supervises a string of around 20 horses. At Britton House Stud, director Steven Corps oversees 16 broodmares. Among that band are the dams responsible for the three-strong consignment heading to Book 1 at the Tattersalls October Yearling Sale.

Of those, the 2008 G2 German 1000 Guineas heroine Briseida (GB) (Pivotal {GB}) is also a Tattersalls Book 1 graduate. Edward Butler paid 85,000gns on behalf of Litex in 2006 for the half-sister to Titus Livius (Fr), (Machiavellian) and her first foal is lot [504](#), a filly by Dalakhani (Ire).

“Briseida’s filly is very correct. She is a little on the small side, but then so was her mother--she is just like her mother in that she is a compact individual and a very nice walker,” said Corps, who has been at the Britton House Stud helm since Ganchev started moving in mares about three years ago.

Alharir (Zafonic), a half-sister to the outstanding European champion Sakhee (Bahri), is the dam of lot [440](#), a colt by Arch, while the farm’s remaining offering, lot [153](#), is regarded as the pick of the trio, being a Giant’s Causeway (Storm Cat) filly out of the multiple Grade III-placed mare Lady Linda (Torrential).

Bloodstock agent Anthony Penfold, whose involvement with Britton House Stud stretches back to 1999 when Dick Fowlston sold the farm to Baines, acts as an advisor. It was he who signed for both mares at Keeneland in January 2009, when paying \$130,000 for Alharir and \$120,000 for Lady Linda, as well as picking up the latter’s dam, La Cucina (Ire) (Last Tycoon {Ire}), for \$150,000.

“The Giant’s Causeway is a very nice filly out of Lady Linda,” commented Penfold. “The dam has bred winners, but has never had anything as good as herself yet. She was a good turf mare. This filly is by a proper stallion in Giant’s Causeway, and she is a lovely big individual with lots of quality and a great way of going. I would hope she will get on a few lists.

“Alharir is a half-sister to Sakhee, and she has produced a good colt,” he added. “We bought her in foal to Theatrical (Ire), and Litex retained that colt and sent her to Miltcho Minchev in Germany. This Arch colt is very nice, and the stallion has a pretty good record over here as well as in the States. The few runners he has had in Europe he has done very well with. Alharir is in foal to Mastercraftsman (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) now, and we are hoping to get a filly from her. She’s getting to the age when you need to get a daughter, because it is a wonderful family.”

The stud’s flagship mare is the former Domino Stud stalwart La Cucina, whose progeny include GII Arkansas Derby hero Sir Cherokee (Cherokee Run) and the high-class MGSW and GISP Miss Isella (Silver Charm). Her first Britton House Stud produce, an Empire Maker filly, sold to BBA Ireland for 200,000gns at last year’s Book 1.

“La Cucina would be our standout mare at the moment,” said Corps. “We have a very nice yearling filly here at the stud out of her but she is not going to the sales; we are going to retain her. She is by Mr. Greeley (Gone West).

He continued, “The stud is run on partly commercial lines, but it is also Mr. Ganchev’s passion, and it just makes sense to sell some and keep others. He is passionate about horses and also has a large stud in Bulgaria where he breeds Arabians, Thoroughbreds and show jumping horses.”

Mount Nelson, a two-time Group 1 winner in Europe, was knocked down to Coolmore's Demi O'Byrne for 320,000gns at Tattersalls in October 2005, and was sold on to the Jacobs family's operation upon his retirement from the racetrack. Penfold is impressed with the sales results so far for the stallion, and has high hopes for lot [162](#), a youngster with a solid if unspectacular page, being out of the unraced 8-year-old mare Last Slipper (GB) (Tobougg {Ire}).

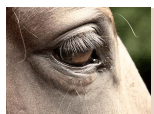

"We have a very nice filly from the first crop of Mount Nelson," he said. "I am a big fan of the sire, and I think this filly is very special. His yearlings have sold well so far, he had a couple that made €120,000 at Deauville in August, and they are averaging a very good multiple of his stud fee at the moment. This is a beautiful filly--big, strong and correct, with great substance. She is the sort of filly you dream of breeding. It is a solid family. In fairness, you could look at the page and say at this stage, being a young mare, it is a Book 2 page, but she is definitely a Book 1 individual--she is a very classy filly."

Bugley Stud has also catalogued a pair with high-class pedigrees by Coolmore's champion sire Galileo (Ire). Lot [131](#) is a close relative to G1 Epsom Derby runner-up The Great Gatsby (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) out of Ionian Sea (GB) (Slip Anchor {GB}), while lot [143](#) is out of Kite Mark (GB) (Mark Of Esteem {GB}), making her a full-sister to Godolphin's Group 2 winner and G1 St Leger second Kite Wood (Ire).

"The Galileo filly out of Ionian Sea is beautiful," continued Penfold. "We sold her full-brother last year, Imperial Monarch (Ire), who has won his only career start since the catalogue was released. He was impressive and looks like he could be a serious horse next year. We are selling another nice Galileo filly, who is a sister to Kite Wood. She is a pretty chestnut filly, and the mare has a Galileo colt foal, too."

For the third consecutive Saturday, first-crop sire Scat Daddy achieved the notable feat of being represented by a group/graded winner. Having set the ball rolling with Shared Property in the GIII Arlington-Washington Futurity on September 10, the Ashford stallion followed up with Finale in the GIII Summer S. a week later and then completed a notable treble when Daddy Long Legs led home an Aidan O'Brien 1-2-3 in the G2 Royal Lodge S. three days ago. This encouraging sequence means that Scat Daddy now holds a lead of nearly \$380,000 over his nearest pursuer, Hard Spun, among the freshman sires.

Of course, even a lead as substantial as this can disappear during the Breeders' Cup, but it is possible that Daddy Long Legs will be at Churchill Downs to help defend his sire's lead. The GI Dixiana Breeders' Futurity was named as Shared Property's target after his Arlington victory and Finale may also attempt a first Grade I victory, as his Summer S. success earned him a starting slot in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf.

If Daddy Long Legs or Finale were to contest the Juvenile or Juvenile Turf, they would continue a remarkable sequence. Although the Breeders' Cup was first contested as comparatively recently as 1984, they would become the fifth generation of the Storm Cat male line to compete as 2-year-olds at the Cup.

Storm Cat failed by just a nose to hold off Tasso in 1985. It was a similar story 10n years later when Storm Cat's son Hennessy was caught close home by Unbridled's Song, but the third generation enjoyed better luck in 2001 when the extraordinary Johannesburg, a colt from Hennessy's second crop, took the Juvenile to become a Grade 1 winner in four different countries.

Scat Daddy, a colt from Johannesburg's first crop, was expected to carry on this excellent work in the 2006 Juvenile. He started second favorite behind Circular Quay on the strength of a record of three wins from his first four starts. Although defeated by Circular Quay after stumbling at the start of the GI Hopeful S., Scat Daddy had bounced back to win the Champagne S. Unfortunately, Scat Daddy let the side down, managing only fourth place behind the 10-length winner Street Sense.

Perhaps that setback was because he was a less of a specialist 2-year-old than his male line antecedents. Remember that Storm Cat's sire Storm Bird made just one unsuccessful appearance at three, having been Europe's champion two-year-old. Storm Cat made only two appearances after the age of two, winning only an allowance at the Meadowlands. Hennessy didn't even race at three and Johannesburg's juvenile exertions took their toll to the extent that he managed one third place from three starts.

By comparison, Scat Daddy did very well to win two of his four starts during a 3-year-old campaign which ended with a disappointing effort as third favorite behind Street Sense and Curlin in the Kentucky Derby. By then, though, he had landed the GII Fountain of Youth S. and GI Florida Derby, showing a bit more stamina than we normally find in Johannesburg's offspring.

There was every reason to expect Scat Daddy to make the grade as a stallion, not least because he has two lines to two of the greatest stallions of modern times--4x2 to Mr. Prospector and 5x4 to Northern Dancer. He also boasts a strong female line. While his dam Love Style never raced, she is by Mr. Prospector out of a Nijinsky mare, which means she is bred to the same cross as seven graded winners, plus the dams of another seven. The Nijinsky mare in question is Likeable Style, winner of the GI Las Virgenes S. This female line traces to the celebrated Rosetta, ancestress of several British Classic winners, and Scat Daddy comes from the same branch as the GI Breeders' Cup Mile winner Royal Heroine and the high-class Californian horse Quack.

The big question now is whether Scat Daddy can maintain his impetus. Johannesburg fell out of favor despite siring the remarkable total of 10 graded stakes winners in his first crop and is now in Japan. Scat Daddy has possibly found things a bit more difficult for being a son of Johannesburg. Despite being based at a farm noted for maintaining support for its stallions, Scat Daddy reportedly has 69 live foals in his second crop, compared to 113 in his first, and his third numbers 53.

This slide occurred despite the fact that Scat Daddy's fee in his first four years went from \$30,00 to \$22,500, then to \$15,000 before falling to \$10,000 this year, in his fourth season. Of course, this type of difficult start is almost becoming the norm in today's industry, but Scat Daddy is guaranteed to be popular next year, especially as his second-crop yearlings (from his \$22,500 crop) have averaged over \$50,000 so far this year.

It isn't hard to guess how the mating which produced Daddy Long Legs came about, as his dam Dreamy Maiden is a stakes-winning daughter of Meadowlake. It was another daughter of Meadowlake who visited Scat Daddy's grandsire Hennessy to produce Henry Hughes, the top sprinter of 2006. Meadowlake mares have also produced graded winners to several other Storm Cat line stallions, including Stormy Atlantic, Forestry and Lion Heart, but their success hasn't been limited to this line. They produced Daddy Long Legs's fellow 2011 2-year-old graded winners Weemissfrankie and Majestic City to Sunriver and City Zip respectively, plus the 2011 Japanese Group 1 winner Real Impact to Deep Impact.

Daddy Long Legs has already proved himself suited by a mile, and he will probably manage another furlong, perhaps two. Dream Maiden gained her stakes victories over seven furlongs and a mile but the next dam, Sparrow Lake, numbered the mile-and-a-quarter Wonder Where S. among her successes.

So, thank you to those who shared their memories of Rahy, introduced us to his progeny that are now broodmares, show horses, or riding partners, or who just let us know that they loved him too and understand the pain we feel.

You were loved, admired and respected. Rest in peace, Rahy.
