**300K MONTJEU COLT TOPS ORBY OPENER**

Montjeu (Ire) picked up another pair of Classic wins in 2010 to boost his impressive stud record, and boasts one of the year's best in Pour Moi (Ire). No stranger to the limelight, the Coolmore resident has just five representatives in the Goffs Orby catalogue, but the first to come under the hammer was the topper Tuesday. Several interested parties were lined up when Hip 170, from Flash Conroy's Glenvale Stud, made his entrance into the ring in late afternoon. After a

high-octane round of bidding, it was Sir Robert Ogden's name on the docket after his Racing Manager Barry Simpson saw off Roger Varian, Tom Goff and Charlie Gordon-Watson to prevail at €300,000 (US\$407,764). "He was a very attractive colt," said Simpson, who took instructions by telephone from Sir Robert Ogden. "We've spent three days looking here, and we felt that he was the nicest Montjeu that we saw. He's got a good, solid pedigree." The bay is the first foal out of listed-placed

**TRIO OF NEW GROUP 1 EVENTS IN DUBAI**

The Emirates Racing Authority has announced that three of the Dubai Carnival races have been upped to Group 1 status for their 2012 renewals at Meydan Racecourse. The \$1-million Al Quoz Sprint, contested at 1000 meters on turf as part of the Dubai World Cup program Mar. 31, will now be a Group 1 event. A pair of races on the 2012 Super Saturday card, set for Mar. 10, the Jebel Hatta going 1800 meters on turf and the Al Maktoum Challenge - Round III at 2000 meters on the main track, have also been upgraded. "This is another significant step in the development of the sport of horse racing in the UAE," said Malih Lahej Al Basti, chairman of the Steering Committee for the Emirates Racing Authority. "The history of horse racing in this region is centuries old, and our efforts to upgrade our stakes are an example of our passion for the sport. This is a great gain for racing and all the UAE, as this accomplishment will gain positive attention and attract visitors to come and share our enthusiasm." **Kilcarn Carry On...**

Kilcarn Stud's fortunes have been intertwined with this famous auction, and Pat O'Kelly's success story showed no sign of abating yesterday. Saturday's G1 Cheveley Park S. success of Lightening Pearl (Ire) was a fitting tribute to her recently pensioned sire Marju (Ire), and the ongoing legacy of the Derrinstown stalwart was in evidence in Kildare once again at the latest renewal of Ireland's flagship sale. His daughter, consigned as hip [171](#) by the nine-time Orby-topping nursery, was next into the ring after the session-topping Montjeu colt, and made for an intense few minutes of action.

The filly's half-sister My Renee (Kris S.) raced in the O'Kelly silks and, after winning two listed contests, rounded off her career with a second in the G3 Princess Royal S. at Ascot in 2004. She has gone on to produce the Jim Bolger-trainee Banimpire (Ire) (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}), and that star

sophomore has held a virtual stranglehold on all bar the very best distaff contests in her native Ireland during the current season.

Beaten a short head in the latest edition of the G1 Irish Oaks, she shares with this yearling the second dam, the 1980 Arc heroine Detroit (Fr) (Riverman), who also has the 1994 winner Carnegie (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) under her auspices.

In the week of the famed Longchamp highlight, hip 171's sale proved fitting, and she will race in the Shadwell livery of her esteemed sire after Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum's establishment prevailed with a bid of €260,000.

"We have a huge history with Kilcarn Stud and it's a fantastic nursery," Derrinstown's Stephen Collins said. "This was a lovely filly from a fantastic and current pedigree. This season alone, it has produced Banimpire, and this filly is a granddaughter of Detroit. She was an obvious one for us. Marju has been a very good servant to us, and this filly was from one of his final yearling crops."

**Going Loco for Limpopo...**

Now at an advanced age, Limpopo (GB) (Green Desert) has gained a reputation as a prolific producer of class acts; heading her own hall of fame list is Pipalong (Ire) (Pips Pride {GB}). Apart from being a fairytale performer on the track for the Easterbys of Yorkshire, the champion sprinter has continued her sterling work in the paddocks by producing the 2009 G3 Anglesey S. winner and G1 Phoenix S. third Walk On Bye (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}). Limpopo also produced three other black-type runners, along with Ripalong (Ire) (Revoque {Ire}), whose offspring include the very smart duo of Shamwari Lodge (Ire) (Hawk Wing) and Imperial Rome (Ire) (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}).



**Walk On Bye**

Not surprisingly, Limpopo's hip [151](#), a grey daughter of the recently deceased Verglas (Ire) from Swordlestown Stud, was in demand. She went to Oliver Cole, son of trainer Paul Cole, after a decisive bid of €210,000 on on behalf of Prince Faisal Salman.

"She's a very nice filly from a great family," said Cole. "She's lovely and well-balanced and has everything that you would want. She could be an earlier sort--maybe even one for the Queen Mary. Eventually, she will be a very nice broodmare for the Prince's Denford Stud."

**Business As Usual...**

Galileo (Ire) is always one of the main players here, and his top-priced representative at the first session sold just over halfway. Churchtown House Stud's hip [127](#) is a full-brother to Ballydoyle's Learn (Ire), who was an impressive five-length winner of a Leopardstown maiden early last month. The March-foaled bay, who hails from the family of the 2005 G1 1000 Guineas heroine Virginia Waters (Kingmambo) and GSW Chevalier (Ire), was bought by Stephen Hillen on behalf of Dr. Jim Hay for €205,000.

"This is the first horse that I have bought for Dr. Hay," Hillen explained. "I said to the breeder when I saw him that ones like him don't come along too often. We were delighted to get him."

Galileo, who has been represented by 10 individual Group 1 winners so far this term, had been responsible for another star turn when his first colt through the ring was knocked down to BBA Ireland for €150,000. Offered as hip [86](#), the chestnut from Rockfield Farm is from the family of the 2004 G1 Epsom Derby hero North Light (Ire) and the 2004 G1 Grand-Prix de Saint-Cloud victor Gamut (Ire) (Spectrum {Ire}), and is a sibling to three stakes performers.

His page was further boosted by this month's success of his 3/4-brother Saddler's Rock (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) in the G2 Doncaster Cup. Last through the ring was a Galileo filly consigned by Glenvale as hip [231](#). The distant relative of Green Dancer and Val Danseur was snapped up by Form Bloodstock after a final salvo at €140,000.

**Gordon-Watson Signs Dream Ticket...**

Oasis Dream has had another stellar year on the track, with Group 1 winners Midday (GB), Prohibit (GB) and Power (GB) advertising the Juddmonte sire's wares.

He generated the predictable keen interest during the afternoon when Charlie Gordon-Watson went to €200,000 for one of his sons from Rathbarry Stud. Offered as hip 102, the March-foaled bay is out of listed-placed Hovering (Ire) (In the Wings {GB}), from the family of the 2000 G1 Prix Marcel Boussac victress Amonita (GB) (Anabaa). "He's for an

established client who has just started buying horses again, and he will go into training in Newmarket, although I'm not sure where," Gordon-Watson commented. "I love Oasis Dreams, and he's bred on the same cross as the Group 2 winner Sri Putra. This horse is a very nice, straight forward individual." Oasis Dream was also responsible for hip 140, a colt from the Abbeville & Meadow Court Studs consignment who was knocked down to Robin O'Ryan for €120,000. His listed-placed dam La Reine Mambo (High Yield) is a half to MGSW Danzon (Royal Academy).

**Duke of Marmalade Colt Bound For Wachman...**

Duke of Marmalade (Ire) (Danehill), who topped last week's sheets at Tattersalls Ireland's September Sale, set the early pace here when Alex Cole, acting on behalf of Dr. Jim Hay, got the final nod at €190,000 for Lynn Lodge Stud's colt from his first crop. Offered as hip 40, the half-brother to the 2007 Listed National S. winner and GSP Sweepstake (Ire) (Acclamation {GB}) provided a handsome return for Eddie O'Leary's establishment, having cost €88,000 at this venue's Foal Sale in November. The March-foaled bay hails from the family of last term's G1 Phoenix S. hero and MG1SP Zoffany (Ire) (Dansili {GB}), and is destined for Co. Tipperary to be trained by David Wachman.

"This a lovely colt," Cole said. "We like the sire and we have some mares in foal to him. We thought that this was the nicest one that we have seen."

Two other colts by the Coolmore incumbent fetched €140,000 apiece from Demi O'Byrne, who only bought a trio of yearlings yesterday. They were Ballylinch Stud's hip 98, a 3/4-brother to last year's G1 Coronation S. and G1 Matron S. heroine Lillie Langtry (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}); and Manister House Stud's hip 143, a half-brother to the 2003 G3 Prestige S. winner Gracefully (Ire) (Orpen) and her similarly smart full-sibling Lady Grace (Ire).

**Shadwell Back With Teofilo Purchase...**

The first crop of Teofilo (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) has been well-represented on the track by this term's G3 Tyros S. victress Remember Alexander (GB), the Listed Naas Fillies' Sprint S. winner Teolane (Ire) and Sunday's Listed Winterfavorit-Trial scorer Black Arrow (Ire), as well as the G2 Futurity S. runner-up Parish Hall (Ire). His stock received early attention and Ballyhimikin Stud's hip [7](#) marked a welcome return of Shadwell's buying power to the European sales fold when realising €180,000. The May-foaled grey is a son of the dual Group 2-winning Cassandra Go (Ire) (Indian Ridge {Ire}), who also ran second in the 2001 G1 July Cup. She has already produced 2008 G1 Irish 1000 Guineas, G1 Nassau S. and G1 Sun Chariot S. heroine Halfway to Heaven (Ire) (Pivotal {GB}) and GSW Theann (GB) (Rock of Gibraltar {Ire}).

"He's got great size and substance for a May foal," Shadwell's Stephen Collins commented. "It's a terrific family and he's got a stallion's pedigree. He's a lovely, athletic horse, and there was a lot to like about him."

More Maktoum presence was in evidence during the opening salvos when John Ferguson completed the first of six transactions when paying €170,000 for Camas Park Stud's hip [3](#), a Shamardal half-sister to 2008 Listed Hilary Needler S. winner Knavesmire (Ire) (One Cool Cat).

A notable pinhooking success for Timmy Hyde's operation, the bay from the family of 2004 G2 Lowther S. victress Soar (GB) (Danzero {Aus}) and dual Scandinavian champion Entangle (GB) (Pivotal {GB}) cost just €60,000 at last year's November Sale. "She's a lovely, athletic filly by a sire who has been in the headlines," Ferguson said. "I was delighted to get her."

**'Yuz' The Man...**

Shadwell's Tamayuz (GB) (Nayef) has his first yearlings at the sales this year. After a solid but unspectacular start to the session, things clicked into gear for the 2008 G1 Prix Jean Prat and G1 Prix Jacques le Marois hero. First to make waves was Rathasker Stud's hip [177](#), a half-sister to Salford Art (Ire) (Sir Percy {GB}) who was an eye-catching fourth in Friday's G1 Fillies' Mile at Newmarket. Shadwell paid €140,000 for that March-foaled chestnut.

A few minutes later, that price was matched by Peter and Ross Doyle Bloodstock for Gormanstown Stud's hip [186](#), a half-brother to listed winner Nice Applause (Ire) (Royal Applause {GB}). Shadwell stepped in again moments afterward for Ballyhimikin Stud's hip [203](#), a granddaughter of Cassandra Go--the dam of hip [7](#) also purchased for Sheikh Hamdan earlier in the day. At €170,000, she holds the distinction of the most expensive yearling sold by the sire so far.

**Lots to Note...**

Invincible Spirit (Ire) has had another year in the headlines, thanks mainly to his star distaffers Moonlight Cloud (GB) and Yosei (Aus), but it was one of his colts from Lodge Park Stud who caused a stir yesterday.

Hip [87](#) is a March-foaled bay out of the 2008 G3 Ridgewood Pearl S. winner Grecian Dancer (GB) (Dansili {GB}) from the family of Hong Kong Group 1 winners Firebolt (Ire) (Flying Spur {Aus}) and Industrialist (GB) (Rudimentary), who raced as Mensa (GB) in Europe. Ed Sackville of SackvilleDonald paid €150,000 for the colt.

A few minutes later, Terry Finley of West Point Thoroughbreds paid €130,000 for a daughter of Footstepsinthesand (GB). From Lynn Lodge Stud, hip [92](#) is a half-sister to dual listed winner Super Motiva (GB) (Motivator {GB}). "We bought three here in 2009, and all three of them won and were very well-received in America," Finley said. "Obviously, we're not so familiar with the pedigrees, but we try

to look for something a little different to put in front of our clients. The last time we bought here, the horses were well liked by our investors."

At the close of play, the session average of €61,063 and median of €42,000 were lagging by six and 16%, respectively, on their 2010 equivalents, but the clearance rate had improved from 76% to 84. Dancing Rain has been the perfect advert for her sire—who is responsible for three individual Group 1 scorers this campaign—by winning the G1 Epsom Oaks and G1 German Oaks. 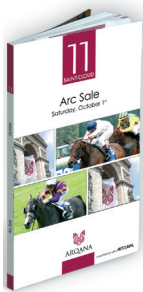

colorbearer has posted two workouts at Delaware Park since, including an easy five-eighths breeze in 1:02 1/5 Sept. 26. "She's dead fit right now," trainer Larry Jones said on yesterday's NTRA teleconference. "She's had two works; I think a little better than what they show on paper. We've let her start off kind of slow

and finish well. The overall time was probably a little slower than what you're used to seeing her do. She's working well and training well. I think we've got her right now as good as she could be." Havre de Grace has bounced back better than anticipated following her monumental win at the Spa, Jones reports. "I was expecting to get back [to Delaware] after shipping the next morning with somewhat of a tired animal, but she never missed a bite," Jones said. "It took surprisingly little out of her. We did take it easy with her for a few days, but it was sure nothing from her telling us to do that." If all goes according to plan in the Beldame, Havre de Grace will be pointed toward the GI Breeders' Cup Classic. Jones welcomes the opportunity to re-engage arch-rival Blind Luck (Pollard's Vision) in the \$5-million centerpiece. "The greatest scenario for us, which Jerry [Hollendorfer] has acted like it's not in his agenda, would be for Blind Luck and Havre de Grace to be in the Breeders' Cup Classic against all the boys," Jones said. "What a joy it would be to be put in at a mile and a quarter against her and all those boys." Plans are for Havre de Grace to continue racing as a 5-year-old in 2012. "He's a great sportsman and he's very good for the game," Jones said of owner Rick Porter. "He intends to race her in 2012, if all goes well, and right now I don't how it can go better."

**St Trinians to Go Under the Hammer...**

Daniel Capen and Laura Chavers's GSW **St Trinians (GB)** (Piccolo {GB}--Cherrycombe-Row {GB}, by Classic Cliche {Ire}) has been retired and will be offered at auction in November, *Daily Racing Form* reports. The 6-year-old mare captured the GII Santa Maria H. and the Paseana H. and ran second by a half-length to Horse of the Year Zenyatta (Street Cry {Ire}) in the GI Vanity H. last year. She added a victory in the Adoration S. at Del Mar Sept. 4 in what would be her final start. She hit the wire first in the GII Milady H. at Hollywood in May, but was DQ'd and placed fourth. Explaining the decision to call it quits on the mare's racetrack career, trainer Mike Mitchell told *DRF* that she had exited a five-furlong workout at Hollywood Saturday with inflammation in her ankle. "She showed up with some ankle fluid, and it's the same ankle I've had trouble with in the past," Mitchell told the trade daily. The bay retires with a record of 19-8-1-4 and earnings of \$440,711.

### Nathaniel Doubts for Arc...

Sunday's G1 Qatar Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe featured a list of 19 at yesterday's six-day stage, and the connections of **Nathaniel (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) cast doubts on the long-planned supplementing of their star 3-year-old colt. With a dry and unseasonably warm forecast leading up to the Longchamp showpiece, Lady Rothschild's G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth S. hero looks unlikely to be added at a fee of €100,000 during tomorrow's window. Trainer John Gosden's Racing Secretary Peter Shoemark told *PA Sport* yesterday, "If he's going to run, he'll have to be supplemented on Thursday, but we're monitoring the weather." Gosden may still be represented by last year's G1 St Leger winner **Arctic Cosmos** (North Light {Ire}), who has not been seen since that Doncaster Classic. "He's been left in at this stage," Shoemark added. "We want to have a look at it. He's in the Arc and also in the G3 Cumberland Lodge S. at Ascot on Saturday, so, hopefully, he runs somewhere this weekend."

Whether Nathaniel lines up or not, the King George form is set to be represented by last year's Arc victor **Workforce (GB)** (King's Best), last seen finishing runner-up in that July 23 Ascot feature; and also by Derrick Smith's June 3 G1 Coronation Cup winner **St Nicholas Abbey (Ire)** (Montjeu {Ire}), who was third at Ascot. The latter is one of six from Ballydoyle alongside **So You Think (NZ)** (High Chaparral {Ire}). That globe-trotting star will be re-opposed by Cristina Patino's **Snow Fairy (Ire)** (Intikhab) after the pair filled the first two places in the Sept. 3 G1 Irish Champion S. at Leopardstown.

His Highness The Aga Khan has the two fillies **Sarafina (Fr)** (Refuse To Bend {Ire}) and **Shareta (Ire)** (Sinndar {Ire}) engaged. Trainer Alain de Royer-Dupre is responsible for both, as well as the Pride Racing Club's June 5 G1 Prix du Jockey Club and Sept. 11 G2 Prix Niel victor **Reliable Man (GB)** (Dalakhani {Ire}). Freddy Head is set to saddle the Wertheimers' Sept. 11 G1 Prix Vermeille heroine **Galikova (Fr)** (Anabaa), who along with Workforce and Sarafina makes a notable presence for the ☆ "TDN Rising Stars" ☆.

Japan is set to have its usual representation via **Hiruno d'Amour (Jpn)** (Manhattan Cafe {Jpn}) and **Nakayama Festa (Jpn)** (Stay Gold {Jpn}). The Japanese runners were second and fourth, respectively, in their warm-up in the course-and-distance G2 Prix Foy Sept. 11, and the latter will be bidding to go one better than when second in this highlight 12 months ago.

Godolphin have left in last year's G1 Racing Post Trophy winner **Casamento (Ire)** (Shamardal), but Racing Manager Simon Crisford confirmed yesterday, "Casamento is not an intended runner in Paris."

A statement from governing body France Galop read yesterday, "Taking account of the prevailing weather forecast for the week of warm weather, light winds and no foreseeable rain, a watering plan has been put in place. Final regulation of the ground will take place on the night of Thursday into Friday, with the aim of producing good ground for the weekend. The official forecast, as provided on Monday evening, is for temperatures of 24 degrees centigrade on Tuesday, rising to 26 for Wednesday and Thursday."

### Goldikova on Target for Foret Foray...

Trainer Freddy Head will be represented by **Goldikova (Ire)** (Anabaa) in Sunday's G1 Prix de la Foret after the trainer decided to

bypass the event with G1 Prix Maurice de Gheest victress **Moonlight Cloud (GB)** (Invincible Spirit {Ire}). Goldikova, who has used Longchamp's seven-furlong contest as a stepping stone to two of her three G1 Breeders' Cup Mile victories, will attempt to claim back-to-back renewals at the Bois

de Boulogne track. Moonlight Cloud will instead point to Ascot for the G2 British Champions Sprint S. Oct. 15. "Goldikova is very well and the plan is still for her to run in the Foret on Sunday," Head told *PA Sport*. "I am very happy with her at the moment, and the ground looks like it will be on the fast side of good, which will suit her. We've decided Moonlight Cloud will not be going, and she will instead wait to Ascot and run in the Sprint."

**SPEED CITY**

With the European yearling sales now full steam ahead for the next four weeks, kicking off with Goffs Orby yesterday, it's especially relevant to note the strong showings being made by 2011 European sires of 2-year-olds (see chart, p14). It's a particularly fierce contest this year, with three sires having juvenile earnings of more than £580,000; five other sires with three or more 2-year-old black-type winners; and three freshman sires with 26 winners each, plus another with 23, according to figures supplied by Hyperion Promotions through Sunday.

Coolmore's **Holy Roman Emperor** tops the list by progeny earnings with his second crop of 2-year-olds, hotly pursued by Rathbarr's **Acclamation** and Juddmonte's **Oasis Dream**. The leader is a son of Danehill, the third a son of Green Desert. Sons of Danehill fill four of the top 10 places (Coolmore's **Rock of Gibraltar** fifth, Juddmonte's **Dansili** eighth, and Darley's **Exceed and Excel**, ninth), while Darley's **Kheleyf**, in 10th, is a second son of Green Desert in the top 10, making it six of the top 10 spots for the Danzig line.

Acclamation and his son, **Dark Angel**, who stands at Morristown Lattin and is second leading European freshman sire, take two of the other spots. Leading freshman sire **Dutch Art**, a son of Medicean who stands alongside his sire at Cheveley Park, is fourth on the European 2-year-old sire list (Dark Angel is seventh); and Coolmore's **Galileo**, the sire of three European champion colts in his first six crops of 2-year-olds, ranks sixth.

Though Holy Roman Emperor is having a good year with his 2-year-olds, his lead over Acclamation is entirely down to two wins in sales races: Charles the Great, subsequently third in the G3 Molecomb S., collected a £98,000 paycheck when winning the Weatherby's Super Sprint over five furlongs at Newbury in August; and Mehdi, who is not one of Holy Roman Emperor's six 2011 group-placed 2-year-olds, earned £73,000 by winning one of the Tattersalls' Millions auction races and running third in another. It's a good performance, especially considering he has two 2-year-old listed winners and eight 2-year-old black-type horses, but no 2-year-old group winners yet this year.

Acclamation, meanwhile, has five 2-year-old group winners this year, and that makes him a finalist in the Hottest Sire of 2011' category. It's all about speed with him: a son of Royal Applause, who won the G1 Middle Park S. at two and came back at four to be just about Europe's best sprinter in 1997, Acclamation himself gained just reward as a 4-year-old in 2003, winning the G2 Diadem S. at Ascot, having run second to Choisir in the then-G2 King's Stand and third to Oasis Dream in the G1 Nunthorpe. He was rated Timeform 118 in Racehorses of 2003.

A top freshman sire in 2007, he then got better mares in 2008, resulting in foals of 2009--this year's 2-year-olds--and boy, has he 'stood the raise.' Yes, they have to prove they will train on, but that can't happen or not happen until 2012 anyway. All we know at this point is that Acclamation has got a cracking crop of 2-year-olds in 2011.

His son Dark Angel, winner of the G1 Middle Park in 2007 and then sent to stud himself, is number two in 2011 progeny earnings among European freshman sires, and as mentioned above, is one of three freshmen tied for number of winners (26) with Dutch Art and Red Clubs.

Oasis Dream, arguably the premier sprint sire from the Danzig sire line right now, is a close third on the 2011 European juvenile sire list, primarily because he's the sire of the tough G1 National S. and G2 Coventry S. winner, Power. Leading freshman sire Dutch Art is the sire of dual Group 2 winner Caspar Netscher (G2 Mill Reef S., G2 Gimcrack S.). Rock of Gibraltar's 2008 crop was sired in Japan, but he was back in Ireland for his 2009 crop, and that includes last weekend's G3 C. L. Weld winner Coral Wave, plus Samitar, a game second to Lyric of Love in the G1 Fillies' Mile, having previously won the G3 Albany S. at Royal Ascot.

He is followed by Galileo, sire of Europe's top 2-year-old filly to date, Group 1 winner Maybe, and last weekend's G2 Beresford S. winner David Livingston. Dark Angel's best is probably the aptly named colt Tough As Nails, second in the G2 Railway S. and third in the G1 Phoenix S. Then two more sons of Danehill: Dansili, with three 2-year-old GSWs so far this year; and Exceed and Excel, sire of seven 2-year-old stakes horses, four of them black type winners, including the dual Group 2-winning filly Best Terms. It's a formidable array of precocity, featuring Danzig, with Royal Applause playing a supporting role, and the Mr. Prospector-line Dutch Art and world number one Galileo thrown in for good measure. There should be plenty of demand for precocity at these upcoming sales, which is good, because there's beginning to be plenty of supply of it.

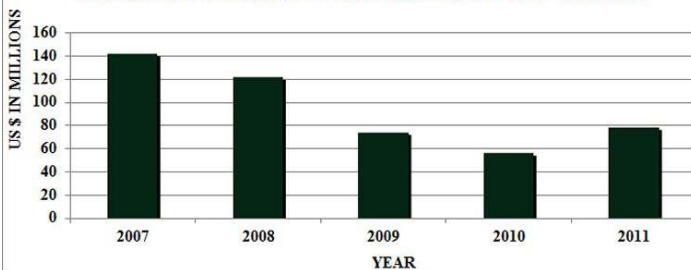
# Weekly Sales Ticker

"Keeneland September Week 1 was up \$3.2-million in gross even with one day less in Book 2; for the week, 20% fewer sold than last year, yet the gross was up. In Week 2, the combination of horses pushed back from last year's four-day Book 2 PLUS the continuing welcome contraction of numbers at the bottom combined for big Week 2 gains compared to 2010. Only five percent fewer yearlings were catalogued in Week 2, in fact two percent more sold, for a 39% (\$22-million) jump in gross, and 36% (almost \$10,000) jump in average. 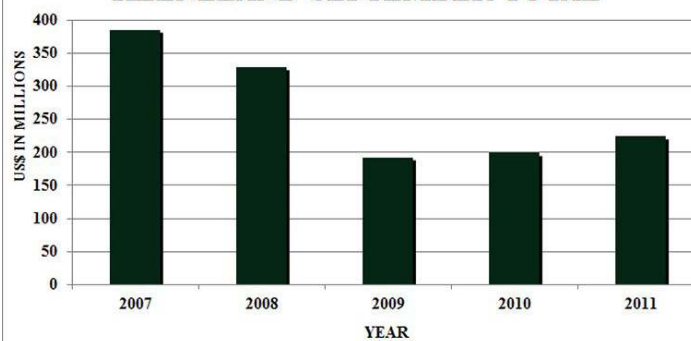

**Keeneland September: Off the Mat...**

As mentioned in the Weekly Sales Ticker, Keeneland's remarkable Week 1 of selling had one less day of selling and 20% fewer horses sold than last year, yet the gross was actually up, by \$3.2 million, and the first-week average was up an impressive 28%. The second week was equally impressive. This year, that was eight days of selling, Books 3-6, including, of course, at least a couple of hundred horses pushed back from the first week, but also including probably at least one less day of poorly bred horses at the end of the sale. However those two factors combined, compared to the 2010 second week, there were 5% fewer horses catalogued, yet 50 more (2%) sold this year than last year. The second-week gross vaulted by \$22 million (39%), and the average leapt by almost \$10,000 (36%). The percentage sold from the catalogue went from 63% to 68%, which is a very significant increase. Of course, profitability is a whole different question: 2009 stud fees were less than in 2008, but there were still a ton of second-week yearlings by expensive, 'first-week' sires. But the point is the 20% rise means sellers were 20% better off than they might have been; they knew it, and they appreciated it. The entire sale was up 13% in gross and 16% in average from 2010, with 11% fewer catalogued, but just 5% fewer sold (clearance rate from catalogue up 4.5%). But the most meaningful comparison is still with 2009, the actual bottom of the market (2010 was marginally better). Compared to 2009, there were 17% fewer yearlings catalogued to Keeneland September, but just 8% fewer sold, signifying an improvement in the clearance rate from the catalogue from 61% to 67.6%. Compared to 2009, with 8% fewer sold, the gross improved by 16% (over \$31 million), and the average increased by 26% (almost \$16,000). Maybe we need to let the outside world know the economy's improving.

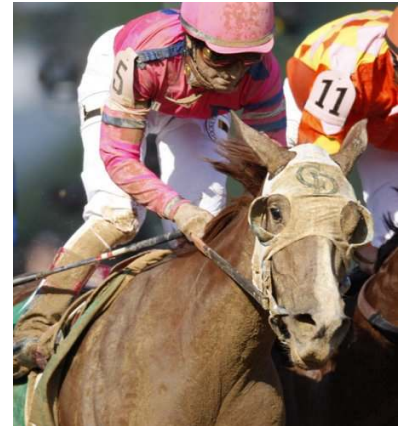

**Blind Luck Works for Lady's Secret; Hollendorfer Considering a 5-Year-Old Campaign...**

Champion **Blind Luck** (Pollard's Vision) tuned up for Saturday's GI Lady's Secret S. with a sharp four-furlong move in :47.60 at Hollywood Park Tuesday. The chestnut, owned in partnership by Mark DeDomenico, John Carver, Peter Abruzzo, and Hall of Fame trainer Jerry Hollendorfer, was last seen defeating Havre de Grace (Saint Liam) in heart-stopping fashion by a nose in the GII Delaware H. July 16.

"She worked really good," Hollendorfer said on NTRA's teleconference yesterday. "She galloped out real strong. I think she's on edge. We're hoping for her to run a good race."

Hollendorfer maintained his stance on keeping Blind Luck against her own sex in the GI Breeders' Cup Ladies' Classic at Churchill Downs Nov. 4. She finished second as the 3-2 favorite behind Unrivaled Belle (Unbridled's Song) in last year's renewal at Churchill.

"In my opinion, we're not considering the [Breeders' Cup] Classic," he said. "Maybe that could come up later, and I'll certainly discuss it with my partners out of a matter of respect if they wanted to do that, but we're shooting for the Ladies' Classic. We came up a little short last year, but we'll look to try to win that race this year."

Hollendorfer continued, "I want to keep on that course. If something was to persuade me to change my mind about one race or another, then I would change my mind. But right now I'm focusing on the Ladies' Classic. I don't really want to look beyond this race on Saturday. Blind Luck has a big job to do, and we need to get that done first before we start talking about any other races."

Blind Luck, never worse than third in 21 career trips to post, is likely to return to the races as a 5-year-old, Hollendorfer revealed yesterday.

"That's the reason why we gave her a little bit of a break this summer and decided not to run at Del Mar and not to ship back East for another race," he said. "I'm hoping to run her next year, and so far we think that's pretty much a possibility."

**ILLINOIS RACING BOARD APPROVES 2012 DATES**

The Illinois Racing Board approved a 2012 racing calendar in line with the 2011 schedule at a meeting in Chicago Tuesday. Arlington Park had submitted a request that would have eliminated the winter/spring stand at Hawthorne Park, with Arlington racing four days a week Apr. 30 through Sept. 30, and Hawthorne offering five live cards weekly from Oct. 1-Dec. 31. Under Arlington's proposal, the revenue generated from simulcast wagering during the first four month of the year would have been added to the Arlington purse account. The argument was that fewer racing days and better purses at Arlington would promote the sport in the state, but, after holding hearings in the middle of September, the IRB opted to go with dates that mirrored this year's schedule. "We're befuddled, bewildered and don't understand how the same schedule is going to produce different results," Arlington Park general manager Tony Petrillo told the Chicago *Daily Herald*. Hawthorne was awarded meets from Feb. 17-Apr. 30, and from Oct. 3-Dec. 31. Arlington will host its 2012 season May 1-Sept. 30. Arlington was given the go-ahead for its request to hold three nighttime cards next year, but it has not yet been decided if they will proceed with those plans. "Night racing, as we said in our application, is a significant investment--between \$1.2 and \$1.5 million for the lighting infrastructure and the promotion and entertainment aspects," Petrillo told the paper. "In order for us to do that, we need a new source of revenue. I'm not sure how we find other sources of revenue within our existing race schedule, and the schedule the board approved for 2012 to justify that expense." He added, "We fought hard, we had a plan and we stuck with it this year. We've shown a lot of improvement, being that we're slightly up in handle, but that slight margin that we're up in handle is nowhere near the financial resources we need in order to invest in night racing."

### Fundraiser for Jacky Martin Saturday:

A national fundraiser for Quarter Horse jockey Jacky Martin, who was paralyzed in a spill at Ruidoso Sept. 2, has been scheduled for racetracks around the country on Saturday, Oct. 8. On that day, all Quarter Horse and Thoroughbred jockeys are being asked to donate one losing mount fee to a fund being organized to offset the medical and rehabilitation costs that Martin has incurred as a result of his injuries. Owners R.D. and Joan Dale Hubbard have already contributed \$100,000 to the cause. In addition, jockeys can apply a decal to their riding boots in an effort to bring awareness Martin's plight. Ruidoso does carry an insurance policy, but the costs associated with Martin's long-term care are expected to far exceed the \$500,000 cap to that policy. Terry Meyocks, national manager of the Jockeys' Guild, said, "We are asking jockeys and individuals to help Jacky carry on his life after this catastrophic event. All donations are appreciated." ### JOCKEYS FACE NEW WHIP RULES

British riders will face stricter whip rules when the British Horseracing Authority (BHA) introduces a new set of guidelines Oct. 10. Animal welfare organisations were consulted during a 10-month review of the rules, but an outright ban on use of the whip was discounted. Stiffer punishments will be enforced, and jockeys are to be restricted on how often--seven times during a Flat race--they can use the whip. Any jockey incurring a ban of three days and above will forfeit his/her riding fee and prize-money percentage, and a five-day minimum suspension will be implemented for those not adhering to the new frequency limits. There is also a sliding scale of penalties for serial offenders. Frankie Dettori, who was banned nine days after hitting the ill-fated Rewilding (GB) (Tiger Hill {Ire}) 24 times in the closing stages of the G1 Prince of Wales's Stakes at Royal Ascot, approved of the guidelines. "I am not proud of having fallen foul of the whip rules in the past, but I have never harmed a horse," Dettori told *PA Sport*. "These new rules are easy to understand, which will help all jockeys ride within them. I accept these new rules are in the best interest of our great sport."
