ENTREE TATTERSALLS

The hors d'oeuvres have already been served at Goffs, Doncaster, Fairyhouse and Deauville, but this morning in Newmarket, Europe's biggest yearling sale gets underway. Numbers are down at the Tattersalls October Sale this year with the smallest Book 1, of just 508 lots, since the fixture was recreated in its present guise in 2004. But there is no doubting the catalogue's quality on paper with Galileo (Ire), for many currently the

world's best sire, the best-represented stallion with 34 lots. As well as some outstandingly bred colts, the Coolmore resident has a number of fillies with great paddock potential whatever they achieve on the track.

There was an international clientele viewing yearlings at Tattersalls' Park Paddocks yesterday, with representatives of buyers from the likes of America, Australia, New Zealand, Hong Kong, Japan, South Africa, Dubai, Abu Dhabi, Kuwait, Qatar, Singapore and Russia all in evidence. Although Australian owner Paul Fudge, who bought the saletopper at Deauville in August, is targeting the French premium system and not expected to be buying, pretty much all the other current European major buyers were in evidence.

Sheikh Mohammed was inspecting yearlings, as was his brother Sheikh Hamdan Al Maktoum, accompanied by a big entourage including Shadwell USA manager Rick Nicholls, while John Magnier and the Coolmore team were also present. Curlin's San Francisco-based co-owner George Bolton, a big spender at the U.S. sales, was an interesting newcomer at Tattersalls, accompanied by his agent John Moynihan. Kazakhstan-based Nurlan Bizakov, the new owner of Hesmonds Stud, was also at Park Paddocks, as were advisors to Sir Robert Ogden, Dr. Jim Hay, Sheikh Fahad Al Thani and the Hong Kong Jockey Club.





"There is a good feel ahead of the sale--we were busy over the weekend and again on Monday and Tuesday, and all the right faces from around the world are here," said Tattersalls' Marketing Director Jimmy George. "This is the premier yearling sale in Europe, and we felt beforehand that this year's Book 1 was the best we'd compiled for a number of years. We've been pleased to get similar feedback from those on the sale grounds over the past few days." **Cont. p2**

Locally based agent Tom Goff of Blandford Bloodstock has been busy at the yearling sales on both sides of the Atlantic already this year, and is impressed by the standard of youngster on offer.

"We have been looking for a couple of days now, and the quality overall is extremely solid this year," said Goff. "There are plenty of nice colts and nice fillies, so everything stacks up well compared to the other leading sales this year. There is definitely a buzz around the place, and people seem to have kept their best horses for this sale. The market has held up extremely well so far in 2010, certainly in the Northern Hemisphere."

John Deer's Oakgrove Stud topped the sale two years ago with the 700,000gns colt Rudolf

Valentino (GB) (Oasis Dream {GB}), and the Wales-based farm has four catalogued this time, including Lot 183, a Green Desert 3/4-brother to that colt.

"We have been very busy--more busy than last year I would say," reported Oakgrove's manager Tim Lane. "It has been very hot with the right kind of people coming to have a look. We have had well over 100 shows today. I think there is certainly a bit of a buzz, it has been quite amazing. I think some of that is down to there being a really good selection of horses here and, if you look at the catalogue, it seems that every year gets better. This year is no exception.

"Hopefully, it will be a good few days," Lane added. "We have four nice yearlings and they're all out of good families. You just hope you have a bit of luck, and it's in the lap of the gods as to when the hammer falls. The two colts we have are particularly nice. As well as the Green Desert, the Royal Applause (GB) out of Crystal Power (Pleasant Colony) [Lot 2] is divine--he's a really big, scopey, quality-looking horse, and he has been very busy."

Many of the agents looking yesterday had been to the Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe raceday in Paris on Sunday after the decision was taken to begin Book 1 this year on Wednesday, rather than Tuesday in the past.

"The new format is much better, selling on Wednesday, Thursday, Friday and then going racing on Saturday," said Peter Stanley of New England Stud, who has six catalogued in Book 1. "It allows people to attend Arc day, come here to the sales and then go on and enjoy Future Champions Day [at Newmarket Saturday]. I think Tattersalls has to be applauded for that shift in the format." **Tatts cont. p3**

Looking ahead to the sale, Stanley added: "We have been very busy with a lot of shows, so we have to be cautiously optimistic. We certainly can't put that down to the economic climate, but what we have seen is a reduction in the numbers of mares with some mares going overseas, and so we have reduced numbers [catalogued] on each day."

Graduates of the Book 1 sale will again qualify for a series of six races worth a total of £1.3 million in prize money. Book 1 runs today through Friday with selling beginning at 11:30 a.m. each morning with Book 2 resuming on Tuesday next week. Catalogues are available online at www.tattersalls.com.

This March-foaled bay hails from a network of speedy talent headed by his half-brother, Cape of Good Hope (GB) (Inchinor {GB}), one of the premier sprinters of recent times who was successful in the 2005 G1 Australia S. and G1 Golden Jubilee S. His other half-sibling is Ballydoyle's impressive recent debut winner Nephrite (GB) (Pivotal {GB}), who cost 230,000gns here last year and has entries in Saturday's G1 Middle Park S. and G1 Dewhurst S. Other smart performers on the page are the Henry Candy-trained duo Corrybrough (GB) (Kyllachy {GB}) and Amour Propre (GB) (Paris House {GB}), who provided a significant update recently when adding the G3 Flying Five to his tally.

13, f, Galileo (Ire)--Cheyenne Star (Ire), by Mujahid

Consigned by Barronstown Stud

On a day when Galileo dominates with abundant bluebloods, this is a particular highlight as the first foal out of the tough and classy Cheyenne Star. Successful twice at Group 3 level and also twice in listed company, she hails from the extended family of champions Exceller and Capote.

14, f, Dalakhani (Ire)--Chiang Mai (Ire), by Sadler's Wells

Consigned by Castlemartin Stud

Chiang Mai, who was successful in the 2000 G3 Blandford S., has already produced the high-class Chinese White (Ire) from a mating with Dalakhani, and this February-foaled grey is a prized offering from the O'Reillys' operation. Alongside her multiple pattern-scoring and G1 Pretty Polly S.-winning full-sister, she also boasts the sire sensation Invincible Spirit (Ire) and promising Kodiak (GB) in her immediate family. Her page has been upgraded further in recent weeks with the smart 2-year-old filly Nayarra (Ire) (Cape Cross {Ire}) placing in the G3 Oh So Sharp S.

31, c, Duke of Marmalade (Ire)--Damson (Ire), by Entrepreneur (GB)

Consigned by Goldford Stud

Damson was one of the leaders of her generation at two, winning the G2 Queen Mary S. and G1 Phoenix S. and finishing third in the G1 Cheveley Park S. Her third foal is this year's precocious talent Requito (Ire) (Dansili {GB}). Successful in the G2 Flying Childers S. and G3 Molecomb S., he is another star juvenile from this prolific family, alongside his dam, Geminiani (Ire) (King of Kings {Ire}), Blue Dakota (Ire) (Namid {GB}) and Arcano (Ire) (Oasis Dream {GB}).

85, c, Dansili (GB)--Flawly (GB), by Old Vic (GB)

Consigned by Newsells Park Stud Ltd

This March-foaled bay has much to commend him, being a son of the millennium G1 Garden City Breeders' Cup H. bridesmaid Flawly. That makes him a half-brother to the 2006 G1 Prix du Jockey Club runner-up and G3 Prix du Prince d'Orange hero Best Name (GB) (King's Best), who was also fourth in that year's Arc. Early last month, his half-sister February Sun (GB) (Monsun {Ger}) added more gloss when annexing the G3 Stuten-Preis von Baden for the Jean-Claude Rouget stable.

112, f, Galileo (Ire)--Gwynn (Ire), by Darshaan (GB)

Consigned by Camas Park Stud

Timmy Hyde provides the opening session's highlight here and she should not disappoint. A 3/4-sister to this year's Epsom Derby hero Pour Moi (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}) and to the 2008 G1 Prix de Diane and G1 Prix Saint-Alary runner-up and G1 Irish Oaks third Gagnoa (Ire) (Sadler's Wells), her family also has significant depth being that of top-drawer performers Lammtarra, Hector Protector and Bosra Sham. Last year, her full-sister--named Kissed (Ire) and debuting for Ballydoyle at Navan today--topped this sale at 900,000gns here even before Pour Moi had metamorphosed into such a stellar performer.

131, f, Galileo (Ire)--Ionian Sea (GB), by Slip Anchor (GB)

Consigned by Bugley Stud

Another of the Galileo collection to sell today, this May foal is a 3/4-sister to some serious middle-distance talent, including the 2003 Epsom Derby runner-up The Great Gatsby (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) and his Group 1-placed full-siblings Roman Empress (Ire) and Magritte (Ire). Ballydoyle's 2-year-old full-brother Imperial Monarch (Ire), who earned ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ status on debut at The Curragh last month, looks primed to add more luster to this impressive page.

144, c, Pivotal (GB)--Kitty Matcham (Ire), by Rock of Gibraltar (Ire)

Kitty Matcham, heroine of the 2007 G2 Rockfel S., shares her illustrious dual Classic-winning dam Imagine (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) with ill-fated 2005 G1 Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere hero Horatio Nelson (Ire) (Daneshill) and last year's G1 Eclipse S. third Viscount Nelson (Giant's Causeway), as well as her Group 1-placed full-brother Red Rock Canyon (Ire). Her first foal is one of the stand-outs of day one, with this year's G1 Prix Maurice de Gheest heroine Moonlight Cloud (GB) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) and G3 Solario S. scorer Talwar (Ire) (Acclamation {GB}) continuing the ongoing success story of this Doff the Derby dynasty.

Ponti Raid: Gio is Back for Turf Mile Glory...

From Monmouth to Meydan, Castleton Lyons' 6-year-old champion **Gio Ponti** (Tale of the Cat) has taken trainer Christophe Clement around the world and to three different Breeders' Cups. This Saturday, he'll

bring Clement to Keeneland in October for the third time in five years as he attempts to defend his title in the GI Shadwell Turf Mile.

It's been something of an unlucky year for the \$5.6-million-earning Gio Ponti. In four starts, he's yet to find his ideal running conditions, which are, arguably, between a flat mile or

1 1/4 miles over firm ground. A close-up fifth on the Tapeta in the 10-furlong G1 Dubai World Cup at Meydan in March in his season opener, Gio Ponti had to deal with yielding sod on return to the States in the GI Manhattan H. at Belmont. And, considering the eventual winner Mission Approved (With Approval) got away with six furlongs in a yawn-inducing 1:17 3/5, he ran a fine race to close from well back and finish third, beaten 1 1/4 lengths. The ground was a bit tighter, but still listed as good in the 1 3/8-mile GI Man O' War S. at Belmont July 9, when he completed the exacta under Cape Blanco (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) after again trailing slow fractions. In Gio Ponti's latest, the GI Arlington Million Aug. 13, Cape Blanco, yielding ground and slow fractions all equated to another second-place effort.

Clement applauds the efforts considering the conditions. "The great thing about Gio Ponti is that he's a very versatile horse," said Clement. "He can compete against the best at a mile or a mile and a quarter, but he's especially good on firmer ground. This year, when we stretched him out to a 1 1/4 and 1 3/8 miles, not only did we stretch him, but he also had softer turf against him. But the forecast [for the Shadwell] is very good, and you get pace [to run at] at a mile anyway, so I'm very excited about it."

Clement added, "His greatest asset is his remarkable turn of foot, and that turn of foot is even more efficient when you get pace in the race and on firmer turf. On paper, there should be a contentious pace and firm turf. [But] even when the conditions are against him, the great thing about Gio Ponti is that he always tries. He's such a genuine horse."

Last year, Gio Ponti used a second-place finish--over good ground--in the Arlington Million as a springboard to victory in the Shadwell Turf Mile, and Clement doesn't see any evidence that his charge has lost a step at six. "Training wise, he's as solid as he's ever been, and if you believe in numbers [speed figures], he's run the same numbers as he's always run," said Clement. "He looks more powerful than ever."

Clement said the ultimate goal for Gio Ponti is the same target he had last year: a match-up against Goldikova (Ire) (Anabaa) in the GI Breeders' Cup Mile at Churchill Downs. Gio Ponti ran second to the supermare, a year after running second behind another distaffer, Zenyatta (Street Cry {Ire}), in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic over Santa Anita's synthetic track. Clement said he's looking forward to taking another crack at the three-time Mile heroine. "Very much so," he said. "I know she beat us last year, but that's what racing is all about."

This will likely be Gio Ponti's last year in training before being retired to stud, and so it would be understandable if connections looked at a possible start in the Classic, as Gio Ponti has never started on conventional dirt, and a good effort might enhance his stud value. Clement doesn't see it that way. **Cont. p6**

“For me, it's a no-brainer,” said Clement. “We do the same thing we did last year. We do the Shadwell Turf Mile, and, as long as he's competitive and comes out of the race in good order, we will aim for the Breeders' Cup Mile on the grass. I know my owners entertained the idea of running in the Classic, but myself, I don't know what the point is of trying something new with a 6-year-old in his last race. I don't think it's as wise as running in the Breeders' Cup Mile, but that is up to my owners to make the decision.”

Gio Ponti first came to Keeneland in October of 2007 as a juvenile, when he won the Bourbon S. over next-out Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf winner Nownownow (Whywhywhy). Then was eighth in the Breeders' Cup that day over a rain-soaked Monmouth bog, and Clement has had the veteran in his barn for some five years now. “He's a very kind horse,” Clement said when asked about his charge's personality. “He's a 6-year-old horse, but he's very easy to deal with. He's easy to ride in the mornings--though he's been fresh in the mornings lately, because we've had cooler weather in New York. But he doesn't kick, he doesn't try to bite other horses, he's very easy. He's a very good-looking horse; he's very pretty. He's amazingly athletic. If you watch him walk in the paddock before the race, even if you weren't aware he's Gio Ponti, there's no doubt he's a good horse. He's a most beautiful mover.”

Clement hopes Gio Ponti moves beautifully right into the winner's circle come Saturday, and then, right on to Churchill Downs.

Third Race, Third Test for 'Jojo' Property...

Jerry Namy's **Shared Property** (Scat Daddy) successfully handled a field of Ellis Park maidens sprinting on the dirt in his debut July 30, then was a winner adding ground and switching to the Polytrack in

the Gill Arlington-Washington Futurity Sept. 10. On Saturday, the 2-year-old gelding will have bit more thrown at him--namely two turns and, more importantly, Grade I company. The challenges will be offered up in the form of the 1 1/16-mile Dixiana Breeders' Futurity, for which

Shared Property will be among the favorites. Trainer Tom Amoss is confident his charge is up to the task.

“He's training like he's supposed to, and his races have been spaced accordingly in order for him to recover from his Arlington-Washington Futurity victory,” the trainer said on an NTRA conference call yesterday. “The idea of trying to two turns seems appropriate given his running style, and there are a lot of things we like going into the race.”

Shared Property has worked three times since his breakout win at Arlington, including a five-furlong drill at Keeneland in 1:01 flat (13/21) on Monday.

“That work was from the half-mile to the 7/8ths pole, getting him used to making the clubhouse turn instead of pulling up past the wire, as these young horses can do until they go two turns,” informed Amoss. “It was a good work, a controlled work”

Amoss believes his charge has other things going for him come Saturday, as well. “He’s been in big fields before, and it looks like Saturday’s field will be very crowded,” he said. “He handles traffic well--he’s very smart.”

Shared Property has been ridden exclusively by Leandro Goncalves, and the young rider will retain the mount. “It’s his

horse,” said Amoss. Asked about Goncalves’s attributes, Amoss added, “He’s in the same category as a lot of riders in that he’s very good on a horse, but what really separates him from the majority of riders is that he’s very good *off* of a horse. He helps me a great deal, telling me a lot about my horses when he gets off them. He makes it a lot easier for me to train appropriately. He’s been invaluable to our stable.”

According to a sales catalog entry, Shared Property was gelded sometime between the time he was bought back as a yearling for \$12,000 at KEESEP and when he sold to agent Joe Brocklebank for \$90,000 at this year’s FTMMAY Sale. And while he came without certain things, he was equipped with others. “He was actually named when we got him,” said Amoss. “It’s hard to refer to a horse as Shared Property, so his nickname is Jojo. One hot day over the summer, I had pulled up to the barn at Churchill, and I was probably 15 feet from his stall and took my time getting out of the car, and the radio was on. It was playing an old Boz Scaggs song called ‘Jojo,’ and he came right to the front of the stall, and his ears started pricking back and forth. I left it on for the whole song--he seemed to like it. I said, ‘Well, that’s going to be your nickname.’ When it comes to music, I live in the ‘70s, and I guess he’s going to have to, too.”

Shared Property is owned by Jerry Namy, an oilman from Dallas, Texas. “He’s been in racing for a while, and I’ve been training for him for a couple years,” said Amoss. “We started off very small--it’s fair to say with claiming horses--and as a couple of guys working together, we hit it off well. I have three horses for him now, and we bought a few at the yearling sales. Hopefully, we’ll move forward from here.”

AGA KHAN CALLS FOR CLEAR DRUG-TESTING POLICIES

The Aga Khan, who celebrated 50 years running his family racing and breeding interests in 2010, has called on international regulatory authorities to abide by a common set of raceday drug-testing policies that are "perfectly clear and transparent about what is, or is not tolerated".

Addressing the highest-ranking officials from around the world at the International Federation of Horseracing Authorities annual conference in Paris (Monday), he stressed that he vigorously supported drug-free racing and a strong non-tolerance policy.

However, he added: "In the absence of standards which are clearly defined, known to all and equitably enforced, the drug-detection process loses its credibility, and its effectiveness.

"A problem arises when control laboratories replace old research methods by sensitive new equipment or a refined process that identifies substances at much lower levels than before. Indeed, these new levels may have no impact on a horse's performance.

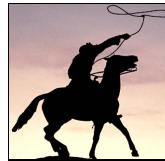
"The problem is vastly compounded when these changes are kept secret from the industry, and trainers and veterinarians are unaware of new standards for judgement."

The Aga Khan, who figured in one of the highest profile drug-testing cases of recent years, involving the disqualified 1989 Oaks winner Aliysa, described how his racing and breeding experience had been punctuated by "some reversals," including his being "exposed to some of the worst science possible from regulatory laboratories that break all the rules of good practice."

Taking up the drug-testing theme on Monday, he said: "Rigorous, reliable and competent scientific control has too often been lacking in our industry, and situations have arisen, both in America and Europe, resulting in procedures which are unethical to owners, trainers and veterinarians, the very people whose skills must be mobilised to keep our activity clean."

He said his particular concern at present was the spate of positive cases in France for the anti-inflammatory drug betamethasone, which had "highlighted the gulf between racing professionals and the regulatory laboratories." To read Howard Wright's complete report, click here:

EXCELEBRATION GETS QEII GREEN LIGHT

Trainer Marco Botti confirmed **Excelebration (Ire)** (Exceed and Excel {Aus}) is on course for next Saturday's G1 QIPCO Queen Elizabeth II S. at Ascot. Connections of the Sept. 11 G1 Prix du Moulin de Longchamp winner had been weighing up the alternative option of the Breeders' Cup, but have come down on the side of a clash with Frankel (GB) (Galileo {Ire}) on the inaugural QIPCO British Champions Day. "He's been in good nick, I'm pleased with the horse and everything is going well for Ascot," Botti told *sportinglife.com*. "We'll keep an eye on the weather and the ground, but he's being trained for Ascot now. The Breeders' Cup is unlikely now. If he runs at Ascot, it's very unlikely he'll run in both."

CARLTON HOUSE BACK IN 2012 The Queen's **Carlton House** (Street Cry {Ire}) will remain in training at four, connections announced yesterday. While a possible tilt at the G1 Qipco Champion S. had been on the agenda, the bay colt will now be put away for next season. "It's unlikely that he'll run," Racing Manager John Warren told *Racing Post*. "Taking everything into account, I think we'll leave him until next year. We would rather train him to be next year's horse." Carlton House captured the G2 Dante S. May 12 before finishing third in the G1 Epsom Derby June 4.

FENCING FOR DEWHURST George Strawbridge's **Fencing** (Street Cry {Ire}) is set to run in Saturday's G1 Dubai Dewhurst S., trainer John Gosden revealed yesterday. Giving the green light to the Aug. 13 Listed Washington Singer S. winner, Gosden said, "Fencing will take his chance in the Dewhurst if the ground isn't too quick. He had a spot on his back, which stopped us running in the G2 Royal Lodge S., but he seems well now, and I'm very happy with him."

'TIMES' ON ROCKFEL MISSION Trainer Peter Chapple-Hyam yesterday confirmed **Sunday Times (GB)** (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}) on course for Saturday's G2 Rockfel S. at Newmarket. Beaten a half length by Lightning Pearl (Ire) (Marju {Ire}) when runner-up in the track's G1 Cheveley Park S. Sept. 24, Allan Belshaw's juvenile will be stepping up to seven furlongs for the first time. "She is in good form and I was delighted with her run in the Cheveley Park S., in which she showed what we always felt she was capable of," Chapple-Hyam commented. "The way she finished her race that day suggests stepping up to seven furlongs will suit her. It won't be a problem and there is every reason to think that she will be competitive again on Saturday, as long as the ground is in her favour."

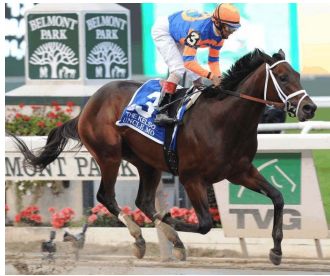

WEEKEND STARS

Though Belmont was handicapped by a muddy track, and Longchamp by lightning-fast going, the stars were out last weekend in force. First among equals in North America was undoubtedly last year's 2-year-old

champion, Uncle Mo (Indian Charlie), who buried Jackson Bend (Hear No Evil) and two others in the Gil Kelso H., ripping off a mile in 1:33:4/5 and earning an attention-grabbing Beyer 118 in the process. I'm always wary of big-number performances on wet tracks, but you could see when he just grabbed hold of the track and took off. His

impressive all-the-way win at Churchill Downs in last year's GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile proves he handles that track, so that's one worry out of the way--at least, he handled the track last year.

You can understand, too, why owner Mike Repole is keen to run him in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic, and, if he can run a mile and a quarter like he just ran a mile, he'll win it and get Horse of the Year, too. But that last two furlongs at Churchill Downs--that's a big if. Whatever he does in the Classic, though, the Kelso (as these Grade IIs can sometimes do) established Uncle Mo as a top-drawer sire prospect: undefeated, untested champion 2-year-old comes back and runs a 118 over a mile in a graded race at three. From the point of view of the commercial breeder, anything else he does from now on is gravy. The Kelso confirmed he's back big-time; the breeders should flock to him after that.

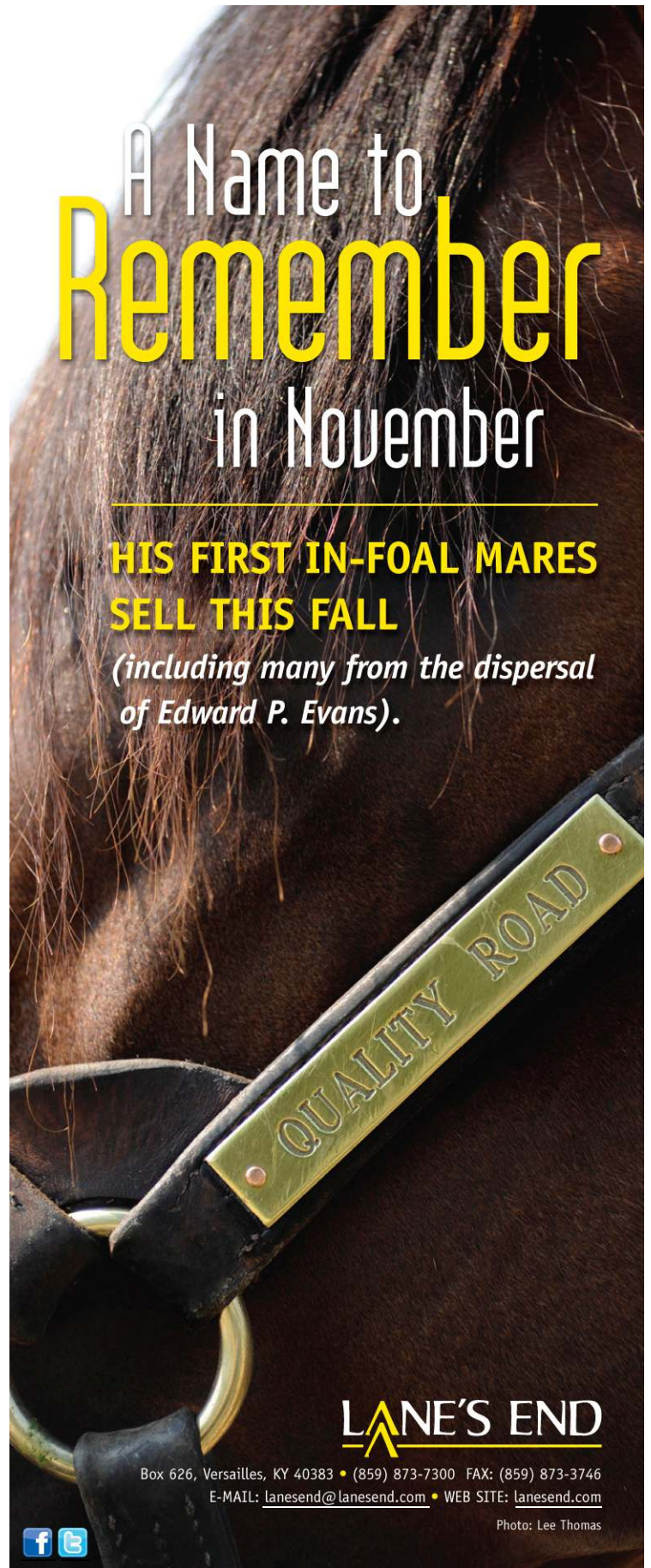
That said, the GI Breeders' Cup Classic is shaping up as a very good race--Uncle Mo and Repole's other entry, GI Travers S. winner Stay Thirsty (Bernardini); GI Jockey Club Gold Cup winner Flat Out (Flatter) and his GI Whitney H. conqueror (also winner of the GI Met Mile H.), Tizway (Tiznow); and a super filly who has already won the GI Woodward S. over colts (Flat Out second there, too), Havre de Grace (from the only crop, unfortunately, by Saint Liam). She won the GI Beldame Saturday at odds of 2-5. They're not going to lay down and give it to Uncle Mo, that's for sure.

In the year of the filly, Sunday's Arc saw a remarkable 1-2-3 finish by the fairer sex, featuring, of course, the new German wonder filly, Danedream, by the top German sire Lomitas. Andrew Caulfield related Lomitas's history in his column yesterday, and I have only to add that his very good son, Silvano, winner of the 2001 GI Arlington Million, is now one of the top sires in South Africa.

A recitation of the accomplishments of German-breds in 2011 might take the rest of the day, and it's pretty remarkable considering, as I mentioned a couple of months ago, the whole country won't have produced many more than 1,000 foals this year. A lot of people thought

Danedream's win was a big shock, but it wasn't. She had won Group 1s in Germany in her last two starts, slamming older rivals by five and six lengths, respectively. If you subscribe to the notion that once they start to get good, there's no telling how good they're going to get, she wasn't an impossible winner by any means. She was discounted partially because her last win had been on very soft ground, but the one before, in which she beat reigning German Horse of the Year Scalo (Lando) by five lengths, was on good ground. Plus, she was just getting this good, that fast. And one shrewd operation, the Yoshida family of Japan, had figured it out, like they do most things. Teruya Yoshida bought a half-interest in Danedream the week before the race. Good call.

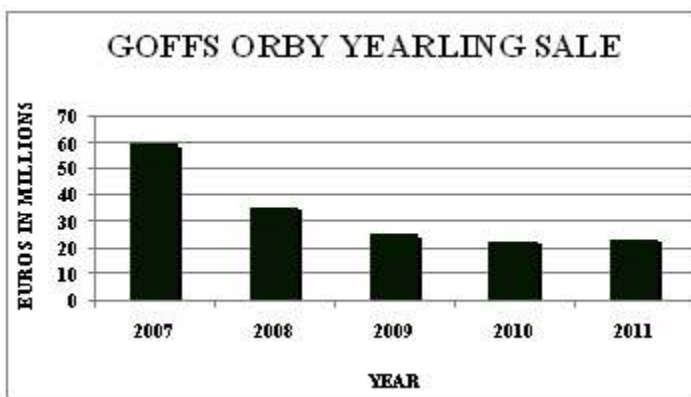
The other horse I thought deserved special mention from an all-star weekend was Dream Ahead (Diktat), who scored his fifth Group 1 win in defeating Goldikova (Anabaa) in the seven-furlong G1 Prix de la Foret. I didn't actually think this was a huge surprise, either. Great as she is, Goldikova might have lost a step this year at six, and she was beaten two years ago in the Foret before winning her second GI Breeders' Cup Mile. And Dream Ahead had won four Group 1s already--the Morny and the Middle Park at two last year, and he defeated older horses twice this year in six-furlong Group 1s, the July Cup at Newmarket and the Haydock Sprint Cup. He needed 'cut' in the ground earlier, but handled both the fast conditions and the step up in trip last weekend, no problem. It's now been announced that he will retire to Ireland's storied Ballylinch Stud.

Diktat (who stands in Spain, at last report) isn't everybody's cup of tea, but, you know what, when a horse wins five Group 1s and has that kind of speed and ability, breeders are sure to flock to him--at a workingman's price, of course. Interestingly, though he is by one non-Phalaris-line sire (Diktat) and out of a mare by another non-Phalaris-line sire (Cadeaux Genereux), both Sadler's Wells and Danzig do appear in his fourth generation, raising intriguing inbreeding possibilities, too. Good horse, should not be discounted.

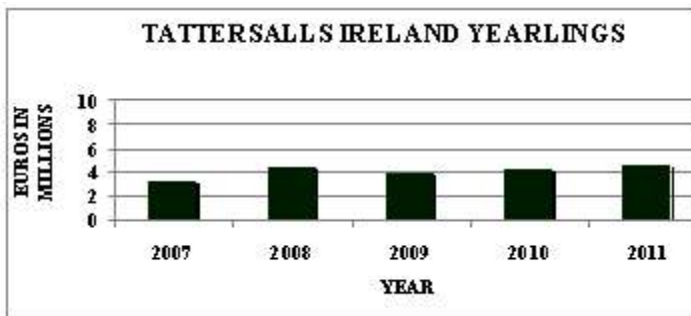
Weekly Sales Ticker

"Goffs' Orby sale last week was up a fraction of a percent in gross and down a minimal three percent in average compared to 2010. After the collapse in Ireland's economy in general, and horse economy in particular, between 2007-2009, the Orby sale figures have leveled off: this year's gross was down 9% from the comparable 2009 gross, the average down 7%. A bright spot is that the clearance rates are at high levels now. The earlier Tatts Ireland Fairyhouse sale has even higher clearance rates, although at a lower level, with gains in gross and average over both 2010 and 2009 figures."

EUROPE'S BEST ON SHOW

Usually, we are reporting on the first day of Tattersalls' October 1 Yearling Sale in this day's corresponding edition, but in the latest date reshuffle, the sale kicks off today and runs through Friday. The

main statistical note to make is that the number catalogued in the three days is down by 26% from last year. In the last three years, when there have been 611, 676 and 689 catalogued, the grosses have totaled 49-million, 53-million and 48-million guineas, respectively. Given a fall of over a quarter in the

number catalogued, no matter how strong the sale is, it will surely prove impossible to match those totals. If everything remained stable, we would expect a gross of 12-million guineas per day, and 36 million for the sale. If it is up 10%--a very reasonable expectation given the results so far this sales season--the gross should top 40-million guineas, with a figure of around 13.3 million per day.

But, I can report, the joint is absolutely jumping. Many potential buyers from many countries were on the grounds yesterday scouting the talent. We need to be careful to compare the results not just to past years, but to reasonable projections of what this year would do as well. One figure you can look at in an instant and get a good idea will be the daily gross, which should range between 12-15-million guineas; the closer it edges towards 15 million, the hotter the action is. The top first-year sires should be Darley's New Approach (Galileo) and Raven's Pass (Elusive Quality); Coolmore's Duke of Marmalade (Danehill), and a scattering by Henrythenavigator (Kingmambo); Derrinstown's Tamayuz (Nayef); and Newsells Park's Mount Nelson (Rock of Gibraltar).

Speaking of Newsells Park, what would an Oct. 1 sale be without a special mention of Georgia Dollar's goodies, available exclusively at the Newsells Park consignment (since she's the missus of stud manager Julian Dollar). This year ("for our American friends," assures hospitality whiz Isabel Anthony) Georgia has really outdone herself: not just the killer carrot cake, flapjacks, rocky roads, etc., but mini-burgers and gazpacho are new to the menu as well. Note to self: must see Julian Dollar, first thing today; important business. They make the good coffee, too.

HARD SPUN COLT TOPS FTMOCT A colt by Hard Spun sold for \$200,000 to top yesterday's opening session of the Fasig-Tipton Eastern Fall Yearlings sale, which got off to a strong start in Timonium yesterday. In total, 170 yearlings sold for \$3,194,500. The average of \$18,791 was up 20.2%, while the median doubled to \$10,000.

The first crop of runners from Darley's Hard Spun have performed well on both sides of the Atlantic, and bloodstock agent Peter Bradley hopes to ride that wave into next year's 2-year-old sales season after signing the session-topping \$200,000 ticket on hip 118 to lead the way in Timonium. "He was a very nice horse, and unfortunately, when you have a nice horse and pedigree to go along with it, you have to pay a little more," Bradley commented. "But, if he does everything right on the track, we think he'll be a standout at any 2-year-old sale. He's by a very nice sire and it's a pedigree that can be a sire's pedigree. He has the wherewithal to catch the eye of all the top buyers. He's a balanced and athletic horse as well." Consigned to the sale by Paramount Sales as agent, hip 118 is a son of MSW & GISP Lucky Lavender Gal (Carson City), a full sister to La Ville Rouge, the dam of Barbaro. Lucky Lavender Gal is herself the dam of SW Lavender Lass (Skip Trial) and GSP Lavender's Lad (Gate Dancer). Bradley was uncertain which juvenile auction his purchase might show up in, but thinks the colt has all the tools. "He's not just a sprinter type," Bradley opined. "He's got some length and scope and a great hind-quarter. He should have some speed, but he also has the length and athleticism to be a two-turn horse. Speed doesn't get it done at 2-year-old sales anymore." Bradley, who said his buyers are "an eclectic group of investors from different walks of life and rarely lose a lot of money doing it," also signed the ticket on hip 89, a colt by the successful young sire Scat Daddy, for \$30,000.

FORMER CLASSICSTAR INVESTORS

AWARDED \$65 MILLION In an opinion entered Friday in a Lexington court, Senior U.S. District Judge Joseph M. Hood ordered that defendants in the ClassicStar case pay \$65 million to defrauded former investors. The defendants named in the suit are David

Plummer and his son, Spencer, who ran the ClassicStar farm, as well as ClassicStar's parent company, Geostar, and Geostar executives Tony Ferguson, Thom Robinson and John Parrott. The plaintiffs involved are Arbor Farms LLC, Jaswinder Grover, Monica Grover, MacDonald Stables LLC, Nelson Breeders LLC and West Hills Farms LLC. Finding that the defendants had violated the Racketeering Influenced and Corrupt Organizations Act, Judge Hood ruled that they must pay \$49.4 million in damages, three times the plaintiffs' original investments, and

\$15.6 million in interest. According to Friday's filing, ClassicStar sold more than \$600 million in mare leases between 2001 and 2005 to high-income investors. An investor leased the mare for a year, bred her, and kept the resulting foal. But, in addition to its exaggerated claims of success and of the tax benefits involved, ClassicStar also sold an average of \$150 million in mare lease packages annually between 2001 and 2004, while the value of its broodmare band during that time frame started at \$10 million, and reached a peak value of \$56 million in 2003. As the leases were purportedly priced at 30% of the mare's value, the standard industry rate, ClassicStar would have needed more than \$300 million worth of bloodstock to support its leases. To cover up the deficit in assets, it eventually began filling the blanks with vastly overvalued Quarter Horse mares owned by the Plummers. The ClassicStar principals also encouraged investors to trade their mare leases for shares in the Geostar affiliated Gastar Exploration Ltd., which was developing wells to extract natural gas from coal beds. Ultimately, the opinion revealed, "The Court gathers that GeoStar acquired and operated ClassicStar as a means of financing the development of its mineral properties." The IRS began an investigation of ClassicStar in 2004 and, shortly after the Plummers cut ties with the operation, raided the Kentucky farm in 2006. ClassicStar dispersed in bloodstock that fall, and filed for bankruptcy in 2007. The Plummers and Parrott, as well as ClassicStar accountant Terry Green, pled guilty to \$200 million in tax fraud two years ago, and could face prison sentences of five years. Gastar paid out \$21.5 million in settlements after coming to an agreement with investors and with the bankruptcy trustee last November. There remain more than a dozen unsettled lawsuits against ClassicStar.

D'Accord Dies:

Pensioned New York sire **D'Accord** (Secretariat--Fanfreluche, by Northern Dancer) was euthanized Oct. 3 at Akindale Farm due to the infirmities of old age. He was 32 years old. "He was looking his age, but he was in good spirits all the time," Akindale's Kate Feron commented. "For us that were around him all the time, he was fun to be around. He was a powerful animal, but very gentle and playful and he will be sorely missed." A Grade II-winning 2-year-old, D'Accord became a solid sire while standing in the Empire State and was responsible for 19 black-type winners, five of them at the graded level, including Montreal Red, winner of the 1994 GI Futurity S. His son North East Bound was his sire's most prolific stakes winner, accounting for a total of a half-dozen Grade II and Grade III events, but it was his effort in the GI Breeders' Cup Mile that is the stuff of legend. The New Jersey raider held the advantage deep into the final furlong, with a single Pick 6 ticket and a massive pot hinging on the outcome. He was run down on the wire by War Chant and was an unlucky runner-up. His other graded winners included Lady D'Accord, Warfie and Yesterday's Kisses, and his progeny banked in excess of \$15 million. A very successful broodmare sire as well, his daughters were responsible for the likes of Grade I winners Franny Freud, D'wildcat and Buy the Sport.

Vinery Consolidates New York Stallion Operation:

Vinery announced its plan to consolidate its New York stallion operation and stand its entire Empire roster at Sugar Maple Farm in Poughquag in 2012, according to *Daily Racing Form*.
