A Galileo (Ire) three-parts sister to this year's G1 Epsom Derby hero Pour Moi (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}) was the star turn yesterday on a buoyant opening Book 1 session of the Tattersalls October Yearling Sale, making

800,000gns. Bloodstock agent John McCormack lasted until 650,000gns, but the final exchanges were fought out between Coolmore's John Magnier and Hong Kong-based Paul Makin, who had the final say. Underbidder to Magnier on last year's 1.2 million gns Tattersalls sale-topper Was (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}), Makin, who is advised by Grant Pritchard-Gordon of Badgers Bloodstock, currently has horses in training with John Oxx in Ireland and Jeremy Nosedo in Newmarket, but he has not finalized training plans for his new purchase. The filly is also a full-sister to Kissed (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}), a 900,000gns graduate of last year's sale. The **★ "TDN Rising Star" ★** was quoted at 16-1 for next year's G1 Epsom Oaks by bookmaker Stan James after her easy win at Navan about an hour before her year-younger sister went through the ring. The filly was consigned by Timmy Hyde's Camas Park Stud and was bred, like Pour Moi, by Lynch Bages, a breeding operation headed by Coolmore's Paul Shanahan. **Cont. p2**

WORLD CHAMP RESUMES DOWN UNDER

Black Caviar (Aus) (Bel Esprit {Aus}) returns to the races in Saturday's G2 Schillaci S. going 1000 meters at Caulfield, and she is expected to start in the vicinity of a nickel on the dollar to equal Phar Lap's record of 14 straight wins to begin a career. Now a 5-year-old, the brown mare was flawless and never really challenged in taking each of her seven starts last season, including Group 1 wins in the Newmarket H., the William Reid S., the T. J. Smith S. and a last-out score in the BTC Cup in Brisbane May 14. Connections recently bypassed a barrier trial alongside G1 Golden Slipper S. hero Sepoy (Aus) (Elusive Quality), opting instead for a much easier prep Sept. 27 ([video](#)). The Schillaci shouldn't be much more taxing. "Obviously, they are handy horses up against her on Saturday, but is a shame they can't get a name horse there to give her bit more competition," Jeff O'Connor, racing manager to trainer Peter Moody, told AAP, referring to the mare's six rivals. Following Saturday's test, Black Caviar is expected to follow the same path she did in 2010--the G2 Schweppes S. at Moonee Valley Oct. 22 followed by the G1 Patinack Farm Classic at Flemington Nov. 5.

He added, "I think this sale has more depth than usual, and, hopefully, she will be good enough to one day join the eight mares I have with Rory Mahon at Mountain View Stud in Ireland. She will be broken in by Di Turner, and I don't think she will be too early."

An Eye for the Ladies...

Alan Cooper, racing manager to Maria Niarchos and family, has also been looking for fillies as long-term breeding prospects this year, and he saw off Charlie Liverton early into the day for a 700,000gns full-sister to Irish 1000 Guineas heroine Nightime (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}). The yearling was bred by Marguerite Weld and offered by the Castlebridge Consignment.

"She will be going into training in Newmarket with Henry Cecil," explained Cooper. "We have also been looking at Deauville, Keeneland and Goffs for fillies that would complement our existing bloodlines, and she fulfilled what we were looking for. She was a beautiful mover and stood up to everything very well at the sales. She's a full-sister to a Classic winner, so let's hope she can carry on the family."

Leicestershire breeders George and Jackie Smith, consigning through David and Trish Brown's

Worcestershire-based Furnace Mill Stud, enjoyed a bumper payday. Their Oasis Dream (GB) (Green Desert) colt was the subject of a sustained duel between John Magnier and trainer Andrew

Balding that saw his price rocket to 700,000gns. Magnier had the upper hand for the colt, whose fourth dam is Meon Valley Stud foundation mare Reprocolor.

"I've been selling for 36 years, and that's the biggest one we've had," said David Brown. "I'm delighted for George and Jackie. They have three mares with us and are friends as well as clients. Everyone loved him, although obviously we weren't expecting that price."

foundation mare Darara (Ire) (Top Ville {Ire}), was another filly in demand. She failed to sell at 400,000gns in the ring, but was later bought privately for 430,000gns by Al Shahania Stud, the breeding operation of Qatari royal family

member Sheikh Mohammed bin Khalifa Al-Thani.

Kazakhstan-based Nurlan Bizakov bought the historic Hesmonds Stud in Sussex last year and, acting through advisor Charlie Gordon-Watson, he paid 400,000gns to see off Seamus Burns of Lodge Park Stud for a full-sister to G1 Pretty Polly S. winner Chinese White (Ire) (Dalakhani {Ire}), sold from Lady O'Reilly's Castlemartin Stud.

"She was a lovely filly from a great family and is likely to either go into training with Sir Michael Stoute or Ed Dunlop," said Gordon-Watson.

Coolmore's other purchases included a 520,000gns Montjeu (Ire) colt out of Group 2 winner Dance Parade (Gone West), which was offered from Flash Conroy's Glenvale Stud; and a 480,000gns Dansili (GB) half-brother to G1 Prix du Jockey-Club runner-up Best Name (GB) (King's Best), consigned by Newsells Park Stud. John Ferguson was underbidder to John Magnier on the latter, who caused a rare Coolmore-Maktoum duel. Sheikh Mohammed, who like his brother Sheikh Hamdan was at the sale, enjoyed a productive day's shopping. Heading the way was a first-crop son of Darley sire New Approach (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}), for whom Ferguson, standing with Sheikh Mohammed, bid 500,000gns. New Approach's breeder Lodge Park Stud offered the colt. Ferguson also paid 480,000gns for another colt by the sire sold by Highclere Stud.

"I strongly expect them both to join one of the Godolphin stables, although Sheikh Mohammed will decide," said Ferguson. "I've been impressed by the number of quality individuals New Approach has been getting; he is by Galileo, who is a wonderful sire, and from a great family. Both yearlings come from farms we have been lucky with, and were fantastically athletic individuals."

Ferguson liked what he saw on day one at Tatts.

"I have been pleasantly surprised by the strength of the market here, especially what I'd call the lower-upper market," he offered. "That's good for the industry, because a lot of people are still wanting to buy horses."

The sale continues today, starting at 11:30 a.m.

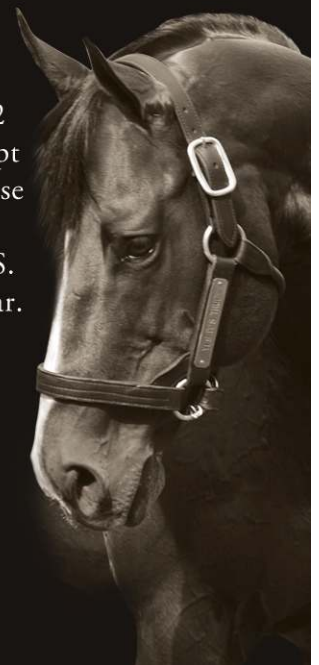

TATOCT Gets Off to a Quick Start...

Park Paddocks did not have to wait long for Book One's first six-figure transaction, as Alban de Mieuille clinched [lot 2](#), an attractive Galileo (Ire) filly out of Candy Mountain (GB) (Selkirk), for 260,000 gns. Standing alongside the Frenchman was Sheikh Abdullah bin Khalifa Al-Thani, a senior member of Qatar's ruling family, which is fast emerging as a notable force in Thoroughbred racing. Sheikh Abdullah's son is Sheikh Fahad Al-Thani, the man behind Pearl Bloodstock, who has enjoyed notable success in Europe this year thanks to Lightening Pearl (Ire)'s (Marju {Ire}) victory in the G1 Cheveley Park S. and the exploits of Hong Kong-bound Frederick Engels (GB) (Iceman {GB}), who took the G2 TNT July S.

The Sheikh's presence at Tattersalls marks a departure for a man who previously focused largely on racing and breeding Arabians as the founder and owner of Umm Qarn Farm in his homeland. Established in 1988, Umm Qarn is renowned in the world of Arabians and has raced world-class individuals such as Dahess, Al Dahma and Al Anood.

De Mieuille, the Sheikh's Qatar-based trainer, said, "She is a lovely filly and will go to France, where she will be trained by Freddy Head."

Umm Qarn later made the buyer's sheet when purchasing a 300,000gns Galileo (Ire) colt offered from Mark Dwyer's Oaks Farm Stables.

Inman Trading Now in Horseflesh...

Lawrie Inman made his name and plenty of money in his mid-20s as a precocious London futures trader, and the man with the Midas touch is hoping that the future

will bring some exciting homebreds his way after investing 250,000gns in [lot 83](#), a full-sister to Group 3 winner Needwood Blade (GB) (Pivotal {GB}) out of Finlaggan (GB) (Be My Chief). Blandford Bloodstock's Tom Goff signed the ticket. The filly's stakes-winning siblings also include GIII Senorita S.

heroine Islay Mist (GB) (Distant Relative {GB}) and German listed winner Australian Dreams (GB) (Magic Ring {Ire}). Inman's purchase of the Lofts Hall Stud consignee reflects his embryonic interest in assembling a quality broodmare band.

"This filly will go to Michael Bell, and, hopefully, she will be able to run quickly!" said Inman. "I eventually want to get more involved in the breeding side of things; I bought a filly at Goffs the other day, too, and that's the direction I'd like to go. Building up a stud is an expensive business and I'm not that far forward. We will wait and see, but initially I imagine I will board the fillies somewhere after they finish racing. I am only 30, so I like to think I've got a few years to figure that out. It takes time, and right now it's a case of putting the right things in place and getting the right mares for the future."

Inman, whose grandfather was a bookmaker, has already sampled the thrill of twice seeing his green and white colours carried in English Classic races, with Group 2 winner Monitor Closely (Ire) (Oasis Dream {GB}) finishing third in the 2009 G1 St Leger and Coordinated Cut (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}) coming home seventh to Workforce (GB) (King's Best) in last year's G1 Derby at Epsom. The latter, a 350,000gns Book 1 purchase in 2008, had landed the £250,000 Tattersalls Timeform 3-Y-O Trophy at Newmarket prior to Epsom, and was subsequently sold to race in Hong Kong as Victor Delight (Ire). Memories of those Classic days prompted Inman to pursue [lot 35](#)--another son of Montjeu--earlier in the day, but the ambitious upstart was put in his place as he finished underbidder to one of the game's established heavyweights, who sealed the colt at 520,000 gns.

"We got excited about a Montjeu colt earlier on, dreaming of the Derby and all that, but Mr. [John] Magnier gave me a slap and put me back in my box," he quipped.

In 2006, at the age of 25, Inman was named in a list of the world's top 30 traders, a testament to the fact that he is a man with the confidence to back his own opinions. But that trait does not inhibit him from tapping the expertise of Tom Goff, trainer Michael Bell and his assistant George Scott.

"I have a good wander around and look at the horses here, and then I listen to the opinions of the experts, Tom, George and Michael," he commented. "I know what I like, so I will go through the catalogue and make a list. Tom will draw up a shortlist and then I will decide. I understand the pedigrees and that's as good a place to start as any, but the final professional opinion is down to George, Michael and Tom."

Inman made a late play for a second well-bred colt, [lot 156](#), a first-crop son of New Approach (Ire), but this time had to settle for second best at 500,000gns to Sheikh Mohammed.

Bolton Pays a Visit...

George Bolton may have failed in his attempts to secure some prized horseflesh on the opening day of the Tattersalls October Yearling Sale, but Curlin's co-owner was nonetheless effusive in his praise for Europe's premier auction.

"I have been very impressed with the quality and the way the horses look--like they have been raised naturally--and very impressed with the breadth of the sale. It is very strong and certainly broad," enthused the San Francisco-based owner. "A lot of your stallions over here are throwing really good, worldwide competitors--Oasis Dream, Montjeu and obviously Galileo. A lot of horses are selling well here, not just two or three, and we have been outbid three times, so there you go."

Bolton has previously raided the European sales for 2- and 3-year-old fillies to race in the U.S., but this is the first time that he has sought to purchase yearlings across the pond.

"We have usually bought horses that are 3-year-old or 2-year-old fillies to run them in the United States," he explained. "We bought two 3-year-old fillies last week, Miss Liberty (Fr) (Statue Of Liberty) and Future Generation (Ire) (Hurricane Run {Ire}), and they just got on a plane to see Christophe Clement in Belmont. I was shooting just north of here with my friend Simon Marsh and figured that my agent John Moynihan and I would look at a few yearlings while we are here. The thinking behind that was that we might start the process a little earlier and have them run here [in Britain], and then take them to the United States. That was the thinking, and we came here to learn, to see how they are raised and see how they show the horses."

He continued, "Horses here, in my opinion, are sales prepped and have been able to live like a horse. They all look to me like they will obviously become much racier over the next 12 months, so you have to adjust your eye a little bit."

Bolton may have found himself in the unfamiliar surroundings of Park Paddocks, but he is relishing the opportunity to reacquaint with familiar faces and rekindle old memories, including that of a close encounter with a \$10.2-million flop.

"I worked in England for three months for John Dunlop in 1985," he recollected. "I rode horses down at Arundel--one expensive colt that never worked out, Snaafi Dancer, and Mummy's Favourite (GB), who was a very nice filly. So it is fun for me socially today to see old friends, Harry Herbert, John Dunlop, Ed Dunlop and, of course, my good friend Simon Marsh. We have learned a lot from being here. European horses come over to the Breeders' Cup and are so competitive, so I have to view it as a place to source horses. This sale being select is a great way to get the feel of it all."

This term it has been the turn of Entifaadha (GB) (Dansili {GB}) to continue the tradition. Successful in the G3 Acomb S. at York, he was also third in Doncaster's G2 Champagne S. Further back, this page boasts Zafonic and Zamindar and the current Group 1-winning Juddmonte distaffers Middy (GB) (Oasis Dream {GB}) and Announce (GB) (Selkirk).

228, c, Galileo (Ire)--Moonlight's Box, by Nureyev

One of the picks of the sale, this May-foaled bay is a half-brother to the brilliant Bago (Fr) (Nashwan), winner of the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe, G1 Grand Prix de Paris and G1 Prix Jean Prat in 2004 and G1 Criterium International in 2003. His half-siblings also include last year's G3 Prix Thomas Bryon winner Maxios (GB) (Monsun {Ger}), the listed-winning Beta (GB) (Selkirk) and Mr Moonlight (Ire) (Dansili {GB}), who makes his debut at Saint-Cloud today. One of the world's finest pedigrees, the second and third dams are the champion Coup de Genie and Group 1-placed Coup de Folie, respectively.

Yet another of a star-studded representation of Galileo this week, this chestnut is a daughter of the 2007 G1 Prix Vermeille and GI E. P. Taylor S. heroine Mrs. Lindsay. She descends from the famed Mrs. Penny, who also captured the Vermeille in 1980 alongside the Cheveley Park S. and Prix de Diane.

235, f, Raven's Pass--Multicolour Wave (Ire), by Rainbow Quest

This offering from Michael Morrin's operation is a 3/4-sister to the high-class Elusive Wave (Ire) (Elusive City), winner of the 2009 G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches and placed three other times at Group 1 level. Her other half-siblings include Million Waves (Ire) (Mull of Kintyre), who was placed at listed level, and Million Spirits (Ire) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}), with the latter being the dam of the impressive recent Newmarket maiden winner Spiritual Star (Ire) (Soviet Star), a supplemental entry for Saturday's G1 Dewhurst S.

Following the 3-year-old's five-length success in the Longchamp feature, connections had suggested the G1 Japan Cup [at Tokyo Nov. 27] as an alternative to the Breeders' Cup, for which she has been supplemented. "She could go for the Breeders' Cup [F/M Turf], for which I think we paid \$25,000, or we could switch her to the Turf," Schiergen told *Paris-Turf*. "The Filly & Mare is the easy option anyway. However, as she was been sold in part to Mr. Yoshida, the Japan Cup is now also an option. She would not be able to run in both, we would have to have to make a decision, but, as yet, nothing as been decided. She will tell us where to go. She has come out of the race fine and eaten up, but was understandably tired."

STARS AT SAINT-CLOUD?

Since Nureyev captured the G3 Prix Thomas Bryon in 1979, class acts have been sparring on the honor roll of this staging post with Ashkalani (Ire) and Act One (GB) two who stand out. INVESTMENT INCENTIVES EXPIRE SOON

Two major investment incentives for small businesses, including those in the Thoroughbred industry, are set to expire at the end of the year. The incentives permit write-offs of certain property with a depreciable life of 20 years or less.

1. Bonus depreciation is set at 100 percent through 12/31/2011. This incentive allows taxpayers to write off the entire cost of qualified new property that is purchased and placed in service before 1/1/2012. Property is considered new if its original use begins with the taxpayer. Examples of such property include yearlings and new farm equipment, fences and barns.
2. The expense allowance permits write-offs up to \$500,000 for qualified new or used property. Similar to the requirement for bonus depreciation, the property must be purchased and placed in service before 1/1/2012. An example of used property is a broodmare.

Although there are no investment limits with bonus depreciation, the \$500,000 expense allowance is reduced by one dollar for every dollar spent over \$2 million on qualified property.

“And at the end of the sale, we left with both a vast wealth of new knowledge and many new acquaintances. It truly was an unforgettable experience,” she added.

Our intense week at Goffs was rounded off by the annual Ambassadors’ lunch, in which a group of government and industry representatives are invited to join the trainees and several members of Darley staff for lunch at Kildangan. Guests included His Excellency Bruce Davis (Australian Ambassador for Ireland), Dr Dean Harron (chairman of the Irish Thoroughbred Breeders Association) and Michael O'Hagan (chief executive of Irish Thoroughbred Marketing). We are all aiming to develop our knowledge of the Irish racing industry as a whole, and this event was a prime opportunity to meet several leading industry figures over a beautiful lunch in Kildangan House.

We have also had some very memorable visits over the last few weeks. John Oxx kindly provided his time to speak to us at his yard and gave us a tour of the first-class facilities at his stable. In his discussion with us, he covered a broad spectrum of topics, from stabling and feeding to training and breaking regimes, and we all came away feeling inspired by his great passion, enthusiasm and experience in the industry.

A visit to Coolmore was a rare opportunity to view their famous stallions, including Galileo, Montjeu and exciting new additions Canford Cliffs and Pour Moi. We are grateful to our hosts for the hospitality extended to us and wish them our sincere appreciation and thanks.

The week was much anticipated--a chance to put our valuation, conformation and pedigree-judging skills to the test with the benefit of the discerning eyes of our agents to guide us.

For the trainees in the group with less experience at yearling sales, it was also a chance to experience the high-octane atmosphere of the sales ring. One trainee was in the fortunate position of bidding for a horse on behalf of her agent, only to find herself walking a fine line as the enthusiastic underbidder to John Ferguson!

As usual, the sales environment provided a great platform for meeting people within the industry and making new contacts, including previous Darley Flying Start graduates Mick Buckley, Carolyn Costigan, Brianne Stanley and Mick Flanagan.

Patricia Calkins, from Ohio, accompanied Tom Goff and Richard Brown of Blandford Bloodstock. Reflecting on her experiences of the sale, she said, “The generosity extended to us not only by our respective bloodstock agents, but also by numerous individuals of influence, perfectly captures the depth of experiences presented to us by the Darley Flying Start program. From dissecting pedigrees and analyzing conformation to purchasing decisions and client negotiations, we had the privilege of being exposed to all aspects of yearling sales at the highest level.

STRIKE TWO FOR CHARLTON AT TIMONIUM

Charlton Bloodstock's Rick and Dixie Abbott marched into last year's Fasig-Tipton Eastern Fall Yearlings Sale in Timonium, Maryland with an After Market colt they bred out of Christmas Strike (Smart Strike), and promptly topped the auction. The as-yet unraced juvenile, currently in training with Rick Dutrow, Jr., brought a bid of \$250,000 from the Siegel family's Jay Em Ess Stable. Yesterday, the Abbotts returned to the sale with a Harlan's Holiday half-brother to that one, and while their latest offering didn't top the sale, it came close, eliciting the auction's second-highest price, \$180,000, from Barlar LLC. Both colts are registered Pennsylvania-breds. A colt by Hard Spun--Lucky Lavender Gal sold Tuesday for a sale-topping \$200,000.

Of the Harlan's Holiday colt, Rick Abbott said, "We knew he was a lovely horse, and I always say, you can guess that they're going to bring over \$100,000, but beyond that, you never know who's going to hook up. We had a lot of vet work, and we knew we were in good shape, but he outsold our expectations by quite a bit."

Catalogued as [hip 494](#), the colt was produced by Christmas Strike, a Ned Evans-bred daughter of MGSW Christmas Gift (Green Desert) and thus half to GISW Christmas Kid (Lemon Drop Kid) and SW Elusive Gift (Elusive Quality). Now 13, Christmas Strike has been an outstanding producer for the Abbotts, who are based in Cochranville, Pennsylvania. The husband-and-wife team purchased Christmas Strike privately as a 3-year-old in 2001 after she went unsold for \$19,000 at KEENOV

"I paid \$10,000 for her after the sale," Abbott explained. "She was in foal to Pleasant Tap on a July 7 cover, and we sold that foal for \$35,000. We gave her the next year off because she was so late, then bred her to Holy Bull, and sold that foal for \$100,000."

Both of those horses, No Passing Zone and Holy Christmas, respectively, went on to earn black-type. The mare's next foal, sold for \$42,000, was the durable 16-time winner and black-type winner Double Down Vinman (Out of Place), who has career earnings of over \$465,000.

Christmas Strike's other foals include the winning Lion Strike (Lion Hearted), a \$70,000 yearling here in 2007; and the winning Agnostic (Stormin Fever), who made a solid \$65,000 here two years ago. Last year's After Market colt, named Market Strike, was the young Storm Cat sire's highest-priced yearling in 2010.

"The mare reproduces [the traits] of whoever you breed her to, which is a blessing in a mare," said Abbott. "The After Market from last year was a big, tall, very substantial horse, and this one was more Harlan's Holiday-like. He wasn't quite as bit, but he had big hindquarters and was real correct through his knees, and he had a great walk."

Christmas Strike had a Hard Spun colt in 2011 and is not in foal. The mare has returned to the ring twice since the Abbotts purchased her. She sold to Tower Hill Farm for \$39,000 at the 2006 FTFEB Sale, but that transaction was simply the Abbotts buying out a partner. She then went unsold for \$95,000 at the 2008 KEENOV sale carrying last year's After Market topper.

The Abbotts have now sold \$742,000 worth of yearlings out of a mare they paid \$10,000 for.

“And, taking into account breeders’ awards, we’re well over \$800,000,” said Abbott.

The top price paid for a filly yesterday was the \$105,000 Michael Moran paid for [hip 358](#), a filly by Broken Vow--Threadneedle (Dynaformer). Warrendale Sales consigned the March-foaled miss for Lazy Lane Farms. -LM

Numbers Encouraging at Fasig...

It was another round of encouraging figures at the conclusion of a North American yearling sale. The 2011 Eastern Fall Yearlings catalogue, trimmed down by over 110 horses from its predecessor, yielded 450 horses sold for \$6,149,600. That equated to an average of \$18,523, up a solid 15.3% from 2010. The median of \$9,250, meanwhile, represented a huge 72.9% jump. Buybacks were also down, from a rate of 30.1% a year ago to 26.2% this term.

Adena Back In Action at F-T Midlantic...

Less than a month after flexing some serious muscle at the Keeneland September sale in Lexington, the Adena Springs team was back in action Wednesday at the Fasig-Tipton Eastern Fall Yearlings sale in Timonium, Maryland. After signing the tickets on seven horses during Tuesday’s opening session, Frank Stronach’s bench was back on line yesterday, purchasing an additional seven yearlings, including a Holy Bull colt who topped the list at \$110,000. Out of the 9-year-old unraced mare Toasty (Polish Numbers), [hip 367](#) was consigned by Candyland, acting as agent on behalf of Dreamtime Stable.

“Adena has done well with Holy Bull, including [Juvenile champion and GI Breeders’ Cup hero] Macho Uno, so the pedigree also factored into the decision,” confirmed Mark Roberts, who was doing the bidding on behalf of Stronach.

“He has a lot of the sire in him,” explained Roberts. “He is very powerful horse, and a very smooth and fluid-moving horse as well.”

Bred in Pennsylvania by Dreamtime Stable, the gray is registered as Delaware certified. Asked whether that factored in any way into the purchase, Roberts said, “Being eligible for the state-bred programs is a big plus, particularly for Pennsylvania and New York, but the main thing with that horse was that he is an athlete. Honestly, he looks like he can compete anywhere he is sent to compete.”

Roberts confirmed that the last two day’s purchases were the first-ever for Adena Springs at the Midlantic sale. Also secured on behalf of Adena yesterday--[hip 392](#), a daughter of Yes It’s True that brought \$77,000; and [hip 498](#), a colt by Lemon Drop Kid that sold for \$75,000.

Over the course of two sessions, Adena’s purchases ranged from a high of \$110,000 down to \$8,000, a sum realized by a colt by Spring At Last during yesterday session.

“The bottom line is we’re looking for athletes, so we thought we could find some here,” explained Roberts.

With Adena representatives--consisting of Jack Brothers, Dan Hall and Roberts--seen out in force over the past several weeks, it has been apparent that the operation has shifted into another gear this term. Chief among Adena’s recent purchases was a colt by Awesome Again, secured for \$1.35 million at last month’s Keeneland September sale.

“We’re just trying to build up the racing program,” confirmed Roberts. “The price doesn’t really matter, we’re just looking for a racehorse.”

Adena Springs also made headlines on the racetrack yesterday with champion juvenile filly Awesome Feather (Awesome of Course), who marked her return to competition with a two-length victory in the seven-furlong Le Slew S. at Belmont Park (see below).

Awesome Feather began her career for breeder Jacks or Better Farm and trainer Stanley Gold, taking through her first five starts at Calder, including a clean sweep of the Florida Stallion Stakes series for fillies. That culminated with an 8 1/4-length victory in the My Dear Girl S. Oct. 16, which saw her go postward as the 4-1 favorite in the GI Breeders’ Cup Juvenile Fillies at Churchill Nov. 5. The Florida-bred bay duly obliged by defeating R Heat Lightning (Trippi) by 2 1/4 lengths, and clinched the Eclipse Award. Acquired by Frank Stronach 48 hours later for \$2.3 million at FTKNOV, Awesome Feather was turned over to trainer Chad Brown, but sustained a tendon injury, and was patiently handled thereafter. **Cont. p3**

Content to let Flying Train show the way through splits of :22.60 and :45.30, Awesome Feather collared the pacesetter in the lane, edged clear and dug in to prevail over Sentimental Lass. "There was a lot of pressure today," admitted Brown. "You can never have a

horse coming off this type of injury...[at] a full fitness level. We brought her in here a little short fitness-wise, but nice and sound and healthy. We figured this was as close as we were going to get and gave her a shot, and she ran really well. It might have not been a stellar group, but she got the job done. I think she'll be better off for it in the long run, fitness-wise. With this situation, really, we've got to see how she comes out of the race and make sure she's perfectly sound. At that time, I'll discuss things with the Stronachs and see what direction they want to go with her." The conditioner continued, "She had a pretty standard bowed tendon, which is a lesion in the tendon. She stayed in my care the whole time. She never went to the farm. Indy), a 4 1/4-length debut winner at Saratoga July 30 ([video](#)), has been retired and will stand for Vinery New York at Sugar Maple Farm near Poughquag in 2012. Owned by Mike Repole and trained by Todd Pletcher, the colt suffered a non-displaced, condylar fracture to his left front leg in the race in what would be his lone career start. The bay, a \$130,000 KEESep purchase, was bred by George and Charles Bolton. His second dam is MGISW Twist Afleet (Afleet).
