WEI NOT?

At the confluence of the Ohio and Kanawha Rivers in West Virginia stands the Tu-Endie-Wei Monument, commemorating the frontiersmen who died in the Battle of Point Pleasant, which was fought in early October in 1774 with Chief Cornstalk. The Keeneland Fall meeting gets underway this afternoon about 170 miles southwest of that landmark, and Brereton C. Jones's

★ **"TDN Rising Star"** ★ Tu Endie Wei (Johar), a daughter of Ms. Cornstalk (Indian Charlie), gets the slight nod in an ultra-competitive renewal of the GI Darley Alcibiades S. A half-sister to Canadian Horse of the Year Biofuel (Stormin Fever), the homebred was held in such high regard by the Reade Baker barn that she made her debut in the June 25 My Dear S. over the Woodbine Poly. The wagering public bought in as well, sending Tu Endie Wei off as a 5-1 chance, and the filly did her part. Despite

drawing out wide in post 13, she sat off a wicked pace and swept home a 4 3/4-length winner. The bay was much closer to a more sedate tempo in the Aug. 13 Ontario Debutante S., but the results were the same, as she held off subsequent GIII Natalma S. winner Northern Passion (First Samurai) by a half-length. "She's got a great temperament," Baker said. "She's very ratable and you can put her anywhere you want. I think she will be the same as Biofuel later on." The residual value of Alcibiades rival **Venetian Sonata** (Bernardini) appreciated markedly last weekend when her full brother Wilburn shot through an opening at the fence to win the GII Indiana Derby. The bay filly, also a half-sister to Grade II-winning juvenile Beethoven (Sky Mesa), could not quite match the feat of her dam, who won the GIII Arlington-Washington Lassie S. in 2002, but gave a good account of herself in that Sept. 10 event nonetheless. A dozen lengths in arrears early, she made up most of that deficit to finish a running-on fourth, and should love today's added real estate. Mike Mitchell starts a horse at Keeneland for the very first time, and his **Egg Drop** (Alphabet Soup) is not without a chance. Campaigned by Little Red Feather Racing, the outfit that won the 2004 GI Breeders' Cup Mile with Singletary, the grey filly graduated in her first start at Del Mar Sept. 3, besting Contested (Ghostzapper), who came back to air at Santa Anita last Sunday. **Field, p11**

UNCLE MO TO ASHFORD UPON RETIREMENT

A partnership deal has been agreed between Mike Repole of Repole Stable and Coolmore's Ashford Stud, whereby 2010 champion juvenile **Uncle Mo** (Indian

Charlie--Playa Maya, by Arch) will stand at Ashford following his retirement from racing. Repole told *TDN* Thursday that he has retained 100% of the bay's racing rights, in addition to an interest in the colt's breeding rights.

"[Trainer] Todd Pletcher said he's never had a horse as good as Uncle Mo, so that's good enough for me," commented Ashford Stud manager Dermot Ryan. "He's also a magnificent-looking horse by a very good sire, so we're really looking forward to having him when the time comes for him to retire."

Winner of the GI Champagne S. and GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile at two, Uncle Mo kicked off 2011 with a win in Gulfstream's Timely Writer S. before finishing third in the GI Wood Memorial. Among the winterbook favorites for this year's GI Kentucky Derby, the sophomore was scratched the eve of the race, and was later diagnosed with cholangiohepatitis--a severe inflammation of the bile passages and adjacent liver--which kept him sidelined at WinStar Farm for several months. **Cont. p2**

The bay marked his return with a bang-up second behind Caleb's Posse (Posse) in the Aug. 27 GI King's Bishop S. prior to a tour-de-force victory in his latest start in last Saturday's GII Kelso H. at Belmont.

While stud plans were only announced yesterday, Repole indicated that the decision was agreed upon well before then.

"The deal was made after we scratched him from the Kentucky Derby, but before the King's Bishop," confirmed Repole. "It was most important for me that I had a plan for when Uncle Mo's racing career was over, and at that time, I wasn't sure if his career wasn't already over. There was no guarantee whether he was even going to get back to the races."

Repole, who admitted he had received numerous offers to stand the **TDN Rising Star**, visited a number of farms in the Lexington area in the week leading up to the Derby.

"Anybody who has a stud farm, in Kentucky or anywhere in the world, showed interest in Uncle Mo," said Repole. "I was getting breeding offers on Mo as early as his career debut by 14 lengths [at Saratoga in August, 2010]."

Despite being given plenty of viable options, Repole finally decided to team up with Coolmore.

"One of the big deciding factors was the control of his racing career' for me staying in for a significant vested interest in the horse," Repole said. "Also, Todd Pletcher was the common denominator--I've been with Todd for two years and Coolmore has been doing business with Todd for 10 years and both of us have the utmost respect for Todd. So we always knew that Todd would advise both parties on what was best for Mo. And that's the most I could have asked for."

Repole confirmed the \$220,000 Keeneland September yearling purchase appeared no worse for wear following his latest exertions, and the short-term plan has been inked prior to a start on Breeders' Cup day. Admittedly leaning toward the Nov. 6 GI Breeders' Classic, Repole indicated a start in the same day's GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile is not completely outside the realm of possibility.

"I am 95% leaning toward running him in the Classic and Todd is confident that Mo could run well in the Classic," said Repole. "At the end of the day, Uncle Mo is going to tell us which race will suit him best."

Repole added, "Uncle Mo have this week off and will have his first work back next Sunday. Before the Breeders' Cup, he'll have two works over the Belmont track and one at Churchill. Following those three works, Todd will make the final decision in which race he will run--I won't overrule a five-time Eclipse Award winner. The horse hasn't given us any reason to think he can't handle 1 1/4 miles."

Regarding a possible campaign next season, Repole said, "It's so early to make that decision. After the King's Bishop, I wanted to make sure Uncle Mo was the Uncle Mo of last year. Now after the Kelso, I not only feel that he is the Uncle Mo of last year, but that he is better than last year. I think his next race will be a big deciding factor."-CBoss

Peace Of Love (Ger) (Galileo {Ire}), a half-sister to dual Group 3 winner **Peace Royale (Ger)** (Sholokhov {Ire}), topped day two of the Tattersalls October

Yearling Sale in Newmarket yesterday. John Magnier was keen to acquire the Gestut Etzean offering, but in the end, he could not match the 600,000gns offer of bloodstock consultant Charlie Liverton and signed for by Grant and Tom Pritchard-Gordon of Badgers Bloodstock, acting for an undisclosed client. The filly will go into training in Newmarket with

John Gosden. Liverton, who was an underbidder on a 700,000gns Galileo (Ire) filly Wednesday, commented: "She was athletic, had a wonderful eye and comes from a thoroughly tough German family. I'm delighted to have got her and she was probably our second pick of the sale."

Fillies accounted for six of the nine lots to make over 300,000gns yesterday, with a Cape Cross (Ire) half-sister to group winners **Regal Parade (GB)** (Pivotal {GB}) and **Entifaadha (GB)** (Dansili {GB}) another predictably in demand.

Charlie Gordon-Watson, acting for Craig Bennett of Merry Fox Stud, outbid Lincoln Collins, Richard Brown of Blandford Bloodstock and, finally, Shadwell's Angus Gold for the filly.

"She is going to Henry Cecil and I always like to buy from Highclere Stud," said Gordon-Watson. "Cape Cross is responsible for two of the best horses of recent years in Sea the Stars (Ire) and Oujia Board (GB), and I always feel he doesn't get the credit he deserves as a stallion."

The yearling's dam, Model Queen, will have a Sea the Stars (Ire) (Cape Cross {Ire}) colt to offer next year, to the delight of breeders John and Lady Carolyn Warren and her brother Harry Herbert and wife Chica.

"We call her the model queen and she has been an amazing mare, who delivers every year on the racecourse and at the sales," said Lady Carolyn. "She is a testament to the efforts of our staff at home and I said to Mr. Bennett that she has danced every dance and never missed a beat. We will wrap her Sea the Stars colt foal in cotton wool until next year." Cont. p4

Amanda Skiffington fought off Charlie Gordon-Watson to get an Oasis Dream (GB) half-sister to G1 Prix Maurice de Gheest winner King's Apostle (Ire) (King's Best) for 400,000gns.

The filly was offered for Bernard Kantor's Wentworth Racing from David and Diane Nagle's Barronstown Stud. She will remain in Newmarket to go into training after being bought by Skiffington on behalf of U.S.-based owners Roy and Gretchen Jackson of Lael Stables.

"I thought she was the nicest filly in the sale and she will go to William Haggas," Skiffington said. "It's some time since I bought a yearling for

the Jacksons, but I rang them and said, 'Please buy her.' I loved her."

Chris Richardson of Cheveley Park Stud, accompanied by the farm's owner Patricia Thompson, successfully bid 350,000gns to see off agent Crispin de Moubray for a Galileo filly who is the first foal out of G1 E. P. Taylor S. winner Mrs Lindsay (Theatrical {Ire}).

Another popular Galileo filly was a 340,000gns full-sister to this year's G1 Irish 2000 Guineas winner Roderic O'Connor (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) bred by the Sangster family's Swettenham Stud and offered by Ted Voute.

Richard Brown of Blandford Bloodstock, acting on behalf of Abu Dhabi royal Sheikh Sultan bin Khalifa Al Nahyan, saw off Gordon-Watson for this filly. The sheikh has increased his racing and breeding interests in recent years with the help of Brown, working alongside Isobel Peter-Hoblyn.

"Sheikh Sultan is a very busy man and the whole thing is still in its infancy," explained Brown. "But we thought this filly had great residual value as a sister to a Classic winner and her price was about what we thought she would make.

"We've bought eight or nine yearlings so far this year in Europe, and they will be allocated to trainers along with the homebreds after the sales are over."

U.S.-based owner Bjorn Nielsen, who recently installed David Lanigan as the trainer at his Kingsdown Stables in Lambourn, was at the sale and, through Tom Goff, paid 330,000gns to see off the day's most prolific buyers, Sheikh Mohammed and John Ferguson, for a German-bred Shamardal colt out of G3 Athasi S. winner Prima Luce (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}).

"He is a very good first foal out of a mare who was rated 106 and was a great mover," said Goff.

Ferguson bought a total of 16 lots for 2,759,000gns, including a 360,000gns Cape Cross half-brother to G1 1000 Guineas and G1 Irish 1000 Guineas heroine Finsceal Beo (Ire) (Mr. Greeley) sold by his breeders, the Cashman family's County Cork-based Rathbarry Stud.

Book 1 concludes today with a session starting at 11:30 a.m.

German Success at Tattersalls...

Stud manager Ralf Kredel's long journey home to Gestut Etzean, in the heart of Germany's richly forested Beerfelder Land, will seem that much shorter after

Peace of Love (Ger) (Galileo {Ire}) sold to agent Charlie Liverton for 600,000gns yesterday at Tattersalls.

The filly, a close sibling to Group 3 winner Peace Royale (Ger) (Sholokhov {Ire}) and a half-sister to fellow Group 3 scorer Peaceful Love (Ger) (Dashing Blade {GB}), out of the listed-placed mare

Peace Time (Ger) (Surumu {Ger}), was reared at the farm owned by Frau Weil-Dassbach and exceeded her consignor's expectations in pushing beyond the half-million guineas mark.

"We came here hoping for 150,000 to 200,000gns," revealed a delighted Kredel. "You never know, but after yesterday's market we thought we might get what we hoped for. Until you are in there, you don't know what is going to happen."

"I think she was one of the best-looking fillies in the sale, and that is what people told me, too," Kredel continued. "One of the things that impressed people was that she is a very good walker and that is what sold her in the end, I guess."

Of the yearling's pedigree, Kredel added, "If you look further back in her pedigree, way back, she traces to some serious horses. She has the same foundation mare as Ouija Board (GB) (Cape Cross {Ire}) and Red Bloom (GB) (Selkirk). The immediate page looks a bit light, but it is a very good family."

Gestut Etzean is a major player in Germany's bloodstock industry, but Kredel acknowledged that a selective approach is necessary when targeting Book 1 at Tattersalls.

"Coming over here, you have to specialise, otherwise you have no chance," he said. "Most of our horses are by homebred stallions and they don't have a chance here, so we select mares to be covered abroad. Peace Time was sent to Galileo with the idea to come here."

"We stand three stallions at the stud--Dashing Blade (GB), Sholokhov (Ire) and Dashing Blade's son, Lord of England (Ger)," Kredel said. "We are one of the biggest farms in Germany and have about 60 mares, but we also board mares, so about half of those are owned by the stud. We keep a few fillies to race, but the first thing is to sell. We are one of the major consignors in Germany."

Bennett Back...

Craig Bennett turned heads at Tattersalls in October 2007 with a big-money buying spree that included the 2.5-million guineas purchase of Liffey Dancer (Ire) (Sadler's Wells), still the European record price for a yearling filly. Sent into training with Luca Cumani, Liffey Dancer never set foot on a racecourse and Bennett, who made his fortune through the telecoms company Phones4U, has kept a lower profile at the major sales in recent years.

But the sanguine Cheshire-based entrepreneur has prodigious ambitions for his 'virtual' Merry Fox Stud operation and was back in the spotlight at Tattersalls yesterday. He paid 500,000gns for lot 224, a Cape Cross (Ire) half-sister to Group 1 winner Regal Parade (GB) (Pivotal {GB}), out of the Highclere Stud stalwart Model Queen (Kingmambo). As in those heady days, Charlie Gordon-Watson was the man that signed the docket.

"I'm delighted to get her--she is bought for the Merry Fox Stud, so she will join the broodmare band, but first she will go into training with Henry Cecil," revealed Bennett. "We have nine mares; eight are in foal and one is still in training with James Fanshawe. We are trying to breed some really good stuff, and we will keep some and sell some. These are exciting times for us.

"This year, we wanted to top up with new blood," he continued. "We have a lot of Sadler's Wells mares, so it is nice to inject a bit of Green Desert blood in there. Henry really loved her and it is a great family going back to some of the horses he has trained, horses like Reams Of Verse (Nureyev)."

Cecil will be training for Bennett for the first time, the owner confirmed.

"Henry has never trained for us before," he said. "Luca and James Fanshawe train for us, and we just wanted to add somebody, and you can't really think of anybody better to add than Henry Cecil. He has been very helpful over the whole process."

Bennett enjoyed his best moments on the track with Purple Moon (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}), a 2006 Tattersalls October Yearling purchase. Knocked down for 440,000gns initially as a jumping prospect, the gelding turned out to be an able athlete with runner-up finishes in both the G1 Melbourne Cup and G1 Hong Kong Vase, but was also the only racetrack success as Bennett's fillies failed to make the grade as racehorses.

One of his 2007 buys, Flame Of Hestia (Ire) (Giant's Causeway), purchased for a cool 1-million guineas, is currently a maiden in training with James Fanshawe, running in the colours of Bennett's partner, Annabelle Condon. But it is that mare's potential as a broodmare that excites the man behind Merry Fox Stud, given that her second dam is G1 1000 Guineas heroine Sleepytime (Ire) (Royal Academy). Bennett's overriding desire is to establish a successful breeding dynasty and that incentive appears as strong as it was four or five years ago.

"We came and bought seven fillies--four in 2006 and three in 2007--and in the last few years we have bought a couple of mares privately," recalled Bennett. "That breeding operation is now underway. We have three yearlings, five foals and eight mares in foal. We have lot 465 in the sale here, by Galileo (Ire) out of Arkadina (Ire) (Danahill). Of the other two yearlings, we might sell one and the other will go into training with Luca."

"I don't have a stud farm as such," Bennett continued. "Wherever the stallions are, that is where the mares are. We use Fittocks Stud in Newmarket, Lane's End in Kentucky, Mountain View in Ireland, and we board at the Niarchos family stud in France, so we like to board first class and we try to breed first class. That's the plan.

"I would like the stud to establish its own bloodlines so that, in 20 or 30 years' time, people will look at a Merry Fox page and recognise it in the way that they do a Cheveley Park page or a Meon Valley page or however many you would want to quote that are in that ilk. That's where we want to be."

Acclamation to the Fore...

Rathbarry Stud sire Acclamation (GB) (Royal Applause {GB}) has been one of the surprise stallion success packages of recent years, thanks in no small part to the support of agent Peter Doyle. The County Wicklow agent, who buys principally for trainer Richard Hannon, yesterday secured lot 207, an Acclamation colt out of Millsini (GB) (Rossini), a daughter of the speedy Group 2-winning mare Millyant (GB) (Primo Dominie {GB}), for 220,000gns.

"This colt is going to Amanda Perrett and he's for a long-standing patron of hers, John Connolly," revealed Doyle.

Connolly, chief executive at Deloitte, was once named as Britain's highest paid accountant and enjoyed his most prominent successes on the race track with the high-class stayer Tungsten Strike (Smart Strike). Perrett trained the gelding to win the G2 Henry II S. over two miles in 2006.

"I have had a lot of success with the stallion," enthused Doyle. "Thanks to Harbour Watch (Ire) this year and Lilbourne Lad (Ire), and Cake (Ire) right back at the start. Lilbourne Lad is in the G1 Middle Park S. on Saturday and Harbour Watch would have been running on the same card, too, if not for a setback.

"Acclamation is a great stallion; his progeny look the part and they run, and I believe Lilbourne Lad is going to stand beside him to take up the slack."

Winner of the G2 Railway S., Lilbourne Lad has won three of seven starts this term for Richard Hannon. Doyle clinched the colt for £80,000 at the Doncaster Premier Yearling Sale last year.

WHO WILL RISE FROM THE PHOENIX?

With cases to be made against the top two morning-line choices in today's GIII Stoll Keenon Ogden Phoenix S., the race looks ripe for an upset, and perhaps **Hoofit (NZ)** can cause the boilover. The bay, who came within a nose of finishing ahead of the top Kiwi galloper Jimmy Choux (NZ) (Thorn Park {Aus}) in Group 1 company last season, was lightly regarded when making his stateside debut in a 5 1/2-furlong allowance Sept. 2 at Presque Isle, but was under only a mild drive to take that race by an ever-widening 3 1/4 lengths. He has trained well back on the all-weather at Fair Hill, and Graham Motion likely has not sent him here for the scenery. **Flashpoint** looked like a serious Breeders' Cup contender early this season when a runaway winner of the GII Hutcheson S. in February. Following disappointing off-the-board runs in the GI Florida Derby and GI Preakness S., he posted an open-lengths score in the GIII Jersey Shore S. at Monmouth July 3. He drew inside for the Aug. 27 GI King's Bishop S. and dueled inside before drifting back to fifth. He faces a similar post and pace scenario this afternoon and seems beatable at a short number. **Aikenite** loves this surface, with three exacta finishes from four tries. His two wins over the track, while impressive, were both at seven-eighths of a mile, and one wonders if this trip is on the sharp side, and this race potentially is a prep for the GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile.

TEAM BLOCK VOWS TO NEVER RETREAT

Team Block's **Never Retreat** (Smart Strike) looks for her fifth graded victory of the year, and her first-ever Grade I tally, in Saturday's GI First Lady S. at Keeneland. The 6-year-old mare, a \$410,000 FTKJUL yearling, began her career for owner Jeff Singer and was second in the 2008 GI Mother Goose S. under the guidance of trainer Kieran McLaughlin.

Acquired privately by the Block family three years ago, **Never Retreat** has proven herself a model of

consistency. On the board in 23 of 30 starts to date, she has won 10 times and earned \$1,058,769.

While not surprised with her racing success, trainer Chris Block admits his family, which maintains a broodmare band of 22 head at its Illinois farm, was thinking long-term when they

purchased **Never Retreat**.

"Our anticipation, if she stayed healthy, was to race her this long and then look at making her a broodmare afterwards," Block explained. "We had expectations that we could hopefully get her to win a graded race, and we've accomplished that. But we didn't set our expectations when we bought her way up to where we are today. We just bought her with the thought that we could do some good with her as a racehorse and then have her as a broodmare to add to our band."

A two-time stakes winner in 2010, **Never Retreat** is enjoying arguably her best season of racing in 2011. After hitting the board in a pair of graded events over the Gulfstream lawn to start the year, the dark bay earned the first graded score of her career with a one-length triumph in the GIII Honey Fox S. in March. She added a win over the Keeneland lawn in the Apr. 16 GII Jenny Wiley S., and traveled north of the border to plunder the July 10 GII Dance Smartly S. and Sept. 18 GII Canadian S.

Block said he was happy with how **Never Retreat** is coming up to Saturday's race, but did admit he would like to have had more time between the Canadian and the First Lady.

"She wouldn't be running if she wasn't doing well," he said. "I am going in with confidence. Would I have liked four or five weeks between races? Sure. But that's not the way the timing works, so she is doing as good as she could do on three weeks' rest."

Having a win over the Keeneland course is a plus, Block added.

"[The Jenny Wiley win] is part of the reason why we're there," he confirmed. "She won over it in the spring, so we're hoping for the same kind of result on Saturday."

The one-mile First Lady drew a contentious field of 12 fillies and mares, plus two also-eligibles. The dozen include multiple graded stakes winner **Daveron (Ger)** (Black Sam Bellamy {Ire}), Irish Group 1 performer **Together (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}), Grade I winner **C.S. Silk** (Medaglia d'Oro) and MGISP **Theysken's Theory** (Bernardini).

Block knows **Never Retreat** has her work cut out for her, breaking from the 12 hole.

"She didn't draw the best post position, which is a concern, but there is nothing we can do about that," Block said. "We'll just do the best we can do. It's a Grade I, and I suspect any Grade I that is run is going to be pretty tough."

While Block hasn't planned anything definite past Saturday for **Never Retreat**, he acknowledged that this is likely the mare's final season of racing.

Team Block has its foundations with Philo, Illinois, residents Patricia and David Block, who have been in the racing and breeding industry for 40 years. The couple were joined by sons Ryan and Chris and daughter Dena, making the venture a true family affair. After three summers working in the Bill Mott stable, Chris Block took out his trainer's license in 1989. And Ryan Block manages the family's 40-acre farm in Philo. The Blocks also own an 85-acre farm in Ocala.

Among the family's graded stakes runners are **Amazing Results** (Grand Slam), **Mystery Giver** (Dynaformer), and **Fort Prado** (El Prado {Ire}).

Chris Block currently has 45 horses in his shedrow, of which roughly 20 are owned by his family. He also trains this year's GI Donn H. winner **Giant Oak** (Giant's Causeway) and graded winner **Mister Marti Gras** (Belong to Me).

Block knew from an early age he wanted to train racehorses, and he freely admits his family's involvement in the sport gave him a head start in the business.

"I'm not the norm," Block said. "I'm very fortunate to be where I am today, to be perfectly honest with you. My parents were very, very kind to give me the opportunity and the chance to train some good horses early on. I didn't have to spend a lot of time trying to work my way into the business. I'm not ashamed to say it, I was given a hell of an opportunity by them. I am very proud to have taken it and I am very thankful to them for putting me where I am today."

Block clearly values being part of the family's racing team.

"My parents are very easy to work with, my brother is a big part of it, and we all work together," the 44-year-old said. "The whole family--my wife, my brother and his family--we all work together as one. We communicate well and we support each other. It's a good combination. They let me do my job, and I do the best I can possibly do. I ask them for input very often, and we make decisions together."

The 4-year-old will be consigned by Archie St George, who formed St George Sales earlier this year.

"He's as good as any graded stakes-winning sprinter in training right now and has only once been off the board in 18 career starts," St George commented. "I have had the pleasure to work with Smiling Tiger's owners, and his trainer Jeff Bonde, on some

successful projects and I am grateful for this opportunity." He added, "The horse is tall and athletic and he has the right sire line to appeal as a stallion prospect. His good looks will carry him a long way and, with so many international racing opportunities ahead, there's no reason he shouldn't add a lot more to his current earnings of \$1.2 million." Third to Big Drama (Montbrook) in last year's Sprint, the chestnut has tacked on three graded events this season, the GII San Carlos H., the GIII Count Fleet Sprint H. and the GI Triple Bend H. Added Bonde, "Smiling Tiger is the best horse I've ever trained and there are many more races left in him." Smiling Tiger has a record of 18-8-2-6 and earnings of \$1,214,353.

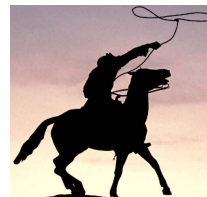
Lonhro to Shuttle to Darley America...

Australia's leading sire **Lonhro (Aus)** (Octagonal {NZ}-Shadea {NZ}, by Straight Strike) will shuttle to Darley's Jonabell Farm in Lexington for the 2012 breeding season. "Lonhro is a rare Thoroughbred--a Horse of the Year on the racetrack and then a champion sire," commented Sheikh Mohammed's bloodstock advisor John Ferguson. "He is among the most talented horses to have graced the Australian turf in living memory, and will bring to America the soundness and toughness for which Australian horses are known. As a stallion, his rise has been meteoric."

The 13-year-old stallion won 11 Group 1 races on the track and was named champion miler and Horse of the Year in Australia in 2004. From four crops to race, he is the sire of Group 1 winners Beaded (Aus), Benfica (Aus) and Denman (Aus). Ferguson added, "Lonhro is coming in at the top of his game. He's young. He's fresh. He's already proved he's a stallion of influence. He stamps his stock. And he's a great-looking horse. Lonhro has totally rewarded our faith in the Southern Hemisphere, and we believe he will be perfect for mares in the Northern Hemisphere and a real asset to breeders." Lonhro's stud fee will be announced at a later date.

NEW RACE FOR DUBAI WORLD CUP CARD

Meydan officials have added a new race to the 2012 Dubai World Cup card. The addition of the newly renamed G3 Dubai Gold Cup brings the total number of races on the Mar. 31 programme to nine and increases total prize money to \$27,250,000. The Gold Cup is a 3,200-meter turf event with a purse of \$1 million. "As the popularity of the Dubai World Cup and racing at Meydan grows, we must keep in step to encourage and foster the development of the sport," commented Meydan CEO Saeed Humaid Al Tayer. "Meydan has developed as a centerpiece of the international racing calendar, and the further growth of the Dubai World Cup and Dubai World Cup Carnival will ensure that Dubai serves as a winter destination for some of the biggest names in racing. We are pleased with our past accomplishments, but we also look to the future for even greater experiences in racing for Meydan, the Dubai World Cup and the UAE."

UNITY STRESSED AT FIRST LEADERS IN RACING CONFERENCE

Pressed by increasing competition, the sport of horse racing must not only adapt to new technologies and customer-driven approaches, the various jurisdictions around the world must connect to create a dynamic new international racing product.

Those were the main conclusions drawn at the first Leaders in Racing Conference, presented by GBI Racing and the UK Jockey Club at the Chelsea Football Club in London Oct. 6.

“Horse racing’s share has definitely gone down as sports betting has gone up,” said Hong Kong Jockey Club Chief Executive Winfried Engelbrecht-Bresges in comments applicable to both his own operation and many others. “Worldwide, we have a shrinking, aging customer base.

“The major racing players around the world have to work together,” he added, noting that commingling of pools is one initiative he feels must be realized. “The rebranding of racing is an imminent global exercise, especially to position racing as a global sport.”

Edward Wray, co-founder and chairman of Betfair Ltd., suggested that one way racing could move forward would be with an international 24-hour racing broadcast channel that would promote both the sport and betting.

“We all need to cooperate better,” Wray said. “The most destructive attitude is to look back at what was done 30 years ago, ‘the good old days.’ We need to look forward and figure out how to attract young people.”

According to the evidence presented, betting on international racing is increasing as racing organizations strive to increase their business. Paul Cross, international wagering manager for Australia’s Tabcorp, reported that Australians can bet on racing from many countries, including the United States, Japan, the UK, France and Singapore.

“The more product we bring in, the more [bettors] want,” Cross confirmed.

The conference, which drew about 180 delegates from 15 nations, featured five panels. One of the key recurring themes during the day-long discussions was how the horses and the sport must be put in sharper focus to draw more fans.

“To get people up close to the animals is a really important thing to do,” declared Rod Street, chief executive of Racing Enterprises, Racing for Change and the new British Champions Series.

Racing for Change started a program in which a retired racehorse is featured in a small paddock at the track during a British racing program. Typically, fans form longer lines to see and pet that horse than to get ice cream, Street said. He noted that the sport must try to fulfill a strong public desire to connect with horses in a modern world that does not offer many people the chance to do so.

Bill Hogwood, deputy chairman of Parx Racing and Casino, candidly stated that his operation is designed

more to showcase betting than the sport. However, he stressed that a special horse can energize bettors and fans like nothing else.

“Smarty Jones could bring 10,000 people to a morning workout,” Hogwood related. “It was amazing.”

When asked about the state of racing in North America, Hogwood said, “The industry there is in dire straits.”

While he said results for special events such as the GI Kentucky Derby and the Breeders' Cup may be good, "the rest of us are struggling. There is going to be a shakeout down the road."

Racing leaders must concentrate on developing exciting new kinds of wagers to appeal to fans, Hogwood said. "Pari-mutuel operators have got to get a hold of new technology and use it on global basis."

The funding of racing is a key issue in Britain, where work is underway to change the levy system that routes profits from bookmakers to the sport. The government is committed to developing "a sustainable long-term source of income" under a system in which "racing and gambling should be symbiotic," said John Penrose, a Member of Parliament and the minister for tourism and heritage, who oversees racing.

Simon Bazalgette, group chief executive with The Jockey Club, said the levy has generated less than 50% of the revenue for racing that it did as recently as 2008.

The funding issue, which has created a crisis with prize money, has led to a decline in the number of owners and in the number of horses actively being raced, said Paul Dixon, chairman of the Horsemen's Group. He noted that in 2007, 20% of British races had seven or fewer starters; this year, that number rose to 36%. Fewer starters lead to less betting, which in turn causes declines in the financial support to racing.

Concurrently, British owners frequently have been selling their horses to race in the Middle East, the United States or Hong Kong, where runners can earn more money.

"Sometimes you've got to open people's eyes," Dixon declared. "Prize money is the lifeblood of this sport."

Despite the challenges, some initiatives such as Racing for Change have begun to take hold and have a positive impact through focused marketing, media and fan attraction programs.

"The 'change' word is being used more times than I can ever remember in racing," said British Horseracing Authority Chairman Paul Roy during the concluding panel session of the conference. "I sense that all my constituents and stakeholders are increasingly buying into what we are trying to do. They realize that we cannot move forward if we are always at loggerheads."

Politics has nothing on horse racing when it comes to making strange bedfellows, but the group that owns the dual Grade I-winning juvenile filly **Weemissfrankie** (Sunriver) is an extreme example, even by the sport's standards. The likable partnership, who watched their emerging

star win the GI Oak Leaf S. at Santa Anita over the weekend, includes Sharon Alesia, widow of the successful Hollywood player Frank Alesia, for whom the filly was named. Frank Alesia was a character actor in several beach party movies in the 1960s and was later an Emmy-nominated director of the *Captain Kangaroo* kids series. Bran Jam Stable's Mike Mellon, who owns a number of tire retail outlets in the

Connecticut area, is another partner. Then there's Joe Ciaglia, who began his career as a landscape architect and gets the award for having the partnership's most unique job. Ciaglia is now the CEO of California Skateparks, which designs and builds world-class parks for skateboarders (think ramps and drained pools). Or maybe Ciaglia doesn't get that award. Not after he brought in his friend Rob Dyrdek, a professional skateboarder and actor who has starred in not one but two reality shows on M TV. Dyrdek's prominence among the M TV set is such that he can boast a staggering 1.4 million followers on Twitter.

The filly's other connections are interesting characters as well. Her trainer, Peter Eurton, is a long-time, small-time California conditioner, a failed jockey who began training in 1985 and who quietly puts up strong numbers year in and year out. And Larry Zap, who with Eurton selected Weemissfrankie at auction, is a former clocker-cum-radio host-cum-bloodstock agent.

How did this unique collection come to be? By all accounts, it was the charismatic, friendly Frank Alesia who provided the gravitational pull. Retired young after his success in Hollywood, Alesia had a few horses with Eurton's stepfather, Steve Ippolito, in the 1980s, and when Ippolito retired, Eurton began training for Alesia.

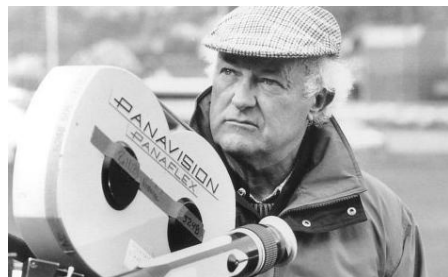

The pair developed a strong relationship over the years, often talking several times a day. Alesia wasn't too concerned about winning the

Kentucky Derby or a Breeders' Cup race or even local stakes races. What he liked most was the atmosphere and comradery of the track. When he wasn't in a private box at Del Mar or Santa Anita, he could be found at La Costa Spa in Carlsbad, California, enjoying the good life. It was at La Costa that he met

Mike Mellon in the late 1990s, and the pair soon began buying horses together, primarily claimers. A year later, Eurton introduced Joe Ciaglia to the fold.

"I worked at Ralphs Grocery Store in Arcadia when I was younger, and I went to the track quite a bit and had always wanted to own a horse," said Ciaglia. "My wife Stephanie was friends with Pete's sister, and Pete actually hired me to do some landscaping at his house. I thought it was a great opportunity to get into the business, so I did some bargaining with Pete as far as working at his house in exchange for training fees, and he introduced me to Frank Alesia."

For six months, Alesia taught Ciaglia about the business--what to look for, what to avoid--and finally the group reached in and claimed their first horse together, winning a seven-way shake for it. The horse wasn't in the barn long, as the \$25,000 claimer was taken for \$35,000 in its very next start. Their next claim would stick around longer.

In December of 2009, they halted a filly named Cee Dreams (Cee's Tizzy) for \$20,000 at Hollywood. The gray promptly won three straight in early 2010. A year later, she won a minor stakes at Fairplex and, in her penultimate career start, she secured her biggest triumph, a last-to-first victory in the \$150,000 Cal Cup Matron.

"Sadly, about a month and a half after she won the stakes race, she broke her leg," said Ciaglia. "It actually turned into a bit of a Barbaro thing. We tried to save her for months. The thing with Frank is that he knew it was probably a bad decision. At the time, I was probably a little selfish, thinking I could save the horse--she was my first big winner--and breed out of her, and Frank went along with it because he wanted me to experience it. Sometimes you do the wrong thing even if you have good intentions."

Five years ago, looking to expand beyond the typical limitations of claiming horses, the group began sending Larry Zap and Eurton to the 2-year-old sales. In their first year, Zap and Eurton unearthed Euroglide (Honor Glide) and purchased him for \$30,000 at OBSAPR. Still running this summer at the age of 7, Euroglide is a MGSP winner of over \$240,000. A year later at the same sale, they secured She's Cheeky (Black Minnalouche) for \$67,000. Third, beaten 3 1/4 lengths by Ventura (Chester House) in the 2009 GI Santa Monica H., She's Cheeky has banked over \$300,000. And while she's still looking for her first stakes win, she's going strong at 6. She finished third in the GII Milady H. this year and was runner-up in the GIII Rancho Bernardo H. in her latest Aug. 21.

In the meantime, through his skatepark business, Ciaglia met Dyrdek and began doing some work for him. Dyrdek hired Ciaglia to build an indoor "skate plaza" at Fantasy Factor, a warehouse space that serves as both Dyrdek's business office and hangout spot. *Fantasy Factory* is also the name of one of Dyrdek's reality shows on MTV, which is still going strong after four seasons on the air.

In the summer of 2010, Dyrdek and Ciaglia made history--in a way--when they joined together to build the world's biggest skateboard.

"One day, Rob came to me and asked if I could do it, and I said, 'Yeah, absolutely,'" Ciaglia recalled. "It was basically an exact replica of his skateboard."

The board came in at 38' 6" and stood 5' 6" tall. It was only

a matter of time before the world's largest skateboard produced the world's largest skateboard accident, an incident in which Ciaglia played a starring role. A clip of Ciaglia bailing from the monstrosity just prior to it flipping over has garnered nearly 3.7 million hits on YouTube ([video](#)). Ciaglia, incidentally, also built the private skate park behind Tony Hawk's house, which would be akin to installing a basketball court behind Michael Jordan's place.

Ciaglia's ties to racing and his friendship with Dyrdek ultimately led to a segment on *Fantasy Factor* where Dyrdek trained to be a jockey. After learning how to ride, he took part in a mock race at Santa Anita in 2009 ([video](#)). Dyrdek called his mount Mega Horse, a named that morphed into Mega Heat (Unusual Heat), the first horse Dyrdek owned with Alesia and Bran Jam after Ciaglia asked him to join the partnership a year ago. A winner at second asking at Hollywood last fall, the Cal-bred Mega Heat is currently on a three-race winning skein, capped by razor-sharp, last-to-first win in an open NW1X at Santa Anita Oct. 1. Dyrdek often Tweets about the exploits of his horses, and even invited fans to watch Weemissfrankie run at Santa Anita last weekend.

On Feb. 27 of this year, Frank Alesia died of natural causes at his home in Carlsbad. His death left the group downhearted and wondering if the partnership would go on. But his widow, Sharon, told the group she'd like to continue on in Frank's memory, and so Zip and Eurton returned to OBS April less than two months later.

Zap, doing preview work for the buying team in advance of Eurton's arrival, took notice of Weemissfrankie after she worked a quarter in [:21 flat](#) for consignor Eddie Woods.

"She breezed really well, but the story was how she galloped out," said Zap. "I think she went out [four furlongs] in :46 3/5 on my watch. When I had my binoculars on her on the other side of the track, the kid couldn't pull her up. These horses usually slow down tremendously, because usually they're spent after 3/8ths of a mile, and here's a filly that went out a quarter, 3/8ths, and a half, and the kid still couldn't pull her up. I put a big star in my catalogue and thought to myself that this was the first horse I had to pull out. Then when Pete came and saw her, he felt the same way."

Zap, who in the previous few years had been outbid on several juveniles that went on to graded success on the track, had been making the case to the group that they were going to have to step up their spending if they wanted to land top prospects. Ciaglia, for one, apparently was listening, and as bidding on Weemissfrankie escalated in the ring, Eurton, on the phone with Ciaglia, kept getting the okay to proceed.

"Frank was a little more conservative, and the funny thing is that we probably wouldn't own her if he was still around," said Ciaglia. "But we really believed in Larry and Pete, and they thought she was a unique filly."

With Sharon Alesia watching from her late husband's box at Del Mar, Weemissfrankie took her five-furlong debut on opening day of the prestigious meet, rallying from the back of the pack to win going away July 20 (video). The effort was impressive enough that she was sent off favored adding two furlongs in the GI Del Mar Debutante Sept. 3, and she ran a similar race, flying home to win by 1 1/4 lengths (video). It was the group's first graded winner and Eurton's first graded winner--an emotional win for everybody. Those emotions were heightened still when Weemissfrankie doubled her Grade I tally in the 1 1/16-mile Oak Leaf S. Sunday (video), and now the strange bedfellows who own her can boast having one of the favorites for the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies at Churchill Downs Nov. 4.

"This may not have happened if Frank was around, but we feel there's a lot of good fortune that's come out of it, and kind of feel like he's up there looking down on us," said Ciaglia. "We wish he was here enjoying it with us. It's nice that his wife is getting a lot of enjoyment out of it. I think it's been good for her to enjoy herself and feel like she's got all that love around her, and feel like Frank's there with her in spirit."

"When she watched the races in the box at Del Mar, I was down below watching. After we won the first time, I met her down in the winner's circle and said that it was like having a date there, and gave her a hug. The next time out, we laughed and did the same thing. Our next date, hopefully, is in Kentucky." -Lucas Marquardt
