**BLIND LUCK TO SELL AT KEENOV**

Eclipse Award winner **Blind Luck** (Pollard's Vision) will be offered as hip 210A to the upcoming Keeneland November Breeding Stock Sale. She will be consigned to the sale as a racing/broodmare prospect by Taylor Made Sales Agency and will be the final horse to go under the hammer on day one of the sale Monday, Nov. 6. "This filly has proven herself beyond a doubt to be one of the top horses over the past two decades," said Hall of Fame trainer Jerry Hollendorfer. "She has won on different surfaces, on both coasts and against the best fillies in America, including Horse of the Year candidate Havre de Grace. Blind Luck is easily

the best filly I ever trained. She's special." Added Keeneland Vice President of Sales Walt Robertson, "We are very fortunate to include Blind Luck, one of the best fillies of our generation, in our November sale. She's an outstanding champion filly." Purchased privately by a partnership including Hollendorfer off a 13 1/4-length debut victory, the popular chestnut filly won the GI Oak Leaf S. and GI Hollywood Starlet S. at two, sandwiched around an unlucky third in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies. Her championship season at three was highlighted by a dramatic win in the GI Kentucky Oaks ([video](#)), one of a remarkable six trips she made outside of California. Blind Luck also defeated Havre de Grace in the GI Alabama S ([video](#)) and GII Delaware Oaks, and was runner-up as the favorite in the GI Breeders' Cup Ladies' Classic en route to her Eclipse statue. Blind Luck won half of her first six starts this season, including the GI Vanity H. and a defeat of Havre de Grace in the GII Delaware H. Blind Luck is a daughter of Lucky One (Best of Luck), a half-sister to GSW Ethan Man (Glitterman) who sold for \$1.85 million carrying a full sibling to champion at last year's November Sale. Bred in Kentucky by Dr. Bill and Terry Baker's Fairlawn Farm, Blind Luck has a current record of 22-12-7-2 and earnings of \$3,279,520.

**CAPE BLANCO TO ASHFORD**

Multiple Group 1 winner **Cape Blanco (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}--Laurel Delight {GB}, by Presidium {GB}) will embark on his breeding career at Ashford Stud in 2012. His stud fee has not yet been announced. After winning the GI Man o'War S. and GI Arlington Million, the chestnut captured the GI Joe Hirsch Turf Classic at Belmont Oct. 1, but sustained a knee fracture and was retired. "Galileo is without doubt the hottest sire in the world right now--he sired two European champion 2-year-old colts from his first three crops, and has no less than 10 different Group or Grade 1 winners, including five European Classic winners this year alone," said Dermot Ryan, Ashford's manager. "We've wanted to stand one of his top sons for some time, but we thought we should wait for the right one and, in Cape Blanco, we're confident we've got him." A €330,000 Goffs yearling, the half-brother to MGSW Mr O'Brien (Ire) (Mukaddamah) captured the G2 Futurity S. at two. He added victories in the G1 Irish Derby and G1 Irish Champion S. at three, and also finished second in the G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth S. that summer. Cape Blanco heads to the breeding shed with earnings of \$3,853,216.

**'VOICE' FOR FRANKIE**

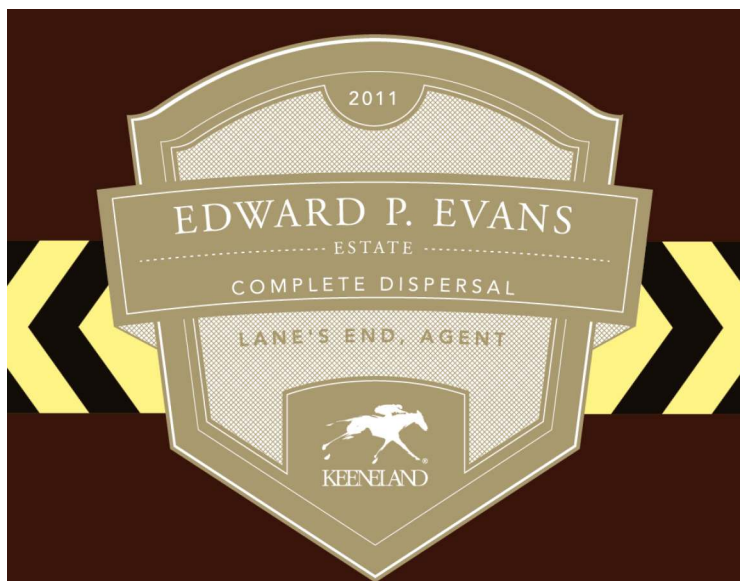
Frankie Dettori is set to partner last year's winner **Poet's Voice (GB)** (Dubawi {Ire}) in Saturday's G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. at Ascot. Successful by a nose over Rip Van Winkle (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) 12 months ago, the 4-year-old has been winless since, but was third in

Newmarket's G2 Joel S. last time Sept. 23. Trainer Saeed bin Suroor also has the 6-year-old **Rio de la Plata** (Rahy) among the entries, but Dettori is sticking with the younger of the pair. "Poet's Voice was good enough to win the race last year," Dettori commented. "He's a lovely old horse and I think he can run a good race." The Italian was in pessimistic mood, however,

as he faces the current 1-3 favorite **Frankel (GB)** (Galileo {Ire}) in the prestigious mile contest. "He's a good horse, but we're all running for second, really, as Frankel will be hard to beat," Dettori added. "He's an absolute superstar. I've ridden against him three times now and I've never even seen his face. He's a joy to watch; you can see that he just loves running. He just breaks away and destroys his rivals. He's a very exciting horse. I think the only way we can beat Frankel is if we set off five minutes before him." One who will not be lining up alongside the Cecil goliath is **Cityscape (GB)** (Selkirk). Khalid Abdullah's Sept. 24 G1 Premio Vittorio di Capua runner-up will only run if the operation's main contender is a non-runner, trainer Roger Charlton tweeted yesterday. In other maneuvers, Richard Hughes is set to partner John Manley's **Dick Turpin (Ire)** (Anabaa), who beat Cityscape in the Vittorio di Capua last time, which leaves connections of **Dubawi Gold (GB)** (Dubawi {Ire}) looking elsewhere. Owner Andrew Tinkler's Racing Manager Tim Jones told *PA Sport*, "At the moment, Richard is veering towards Dick Turpin, which is understandable on official ratings. But if Hughesie does ride Dick Turpin, there are naturally other top jockeys available. Johnny Murtagh knows the horse well, though, and has a good relationship with Andrew. There's also Ryan Moore waiting in the wings, so we're in a good position."

**NO BC FOR DANEDREAM** Danedream (Ger) (Lomitas {GB}) will sidestep the Breeders' Cup, her connections confirmed. Gestut Burg Eberstein and

Teruya Yoshida's brilliant G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe heroine had been touted as a possible for the GI Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf or GI Breeders' Cup Turf following her Longchamp success, but trainer Peter Schiergen has only the Nov. 27 G1 Japan Cup in mind now. "We have

talked it all over and come to the conclusion that, if she runs again this year, it will only be in the Japan Cup," Schiergen told *Racing Post*. "We had three possible options, the Breeders Cup and two races in Japan, but have now made our decision."

He continued, "The race is more than six weeks away, so obviously we cannot yet say anything for sure, and will make a definite decision nearer the time. She seems in great form and has come back from Paris in excellent shape. We are taking it easy with her at the moment, but I am totally happy with her, and if she is in the same form in a month's time, then she will probably run." A significant bonus would also be on the line if Danedream runs in the Japan Cup; the Arc winner would receive the equivalent of US\$1.25 million if she wins in Tokyo, or US\$500,000 if she were the runner-up.

**'DAWN' WAITS** ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ **Await the Dawn** (Giant's Causeway) will miss Saturday's G1 Champion S. at Ascot, connections announced yesterday. Michael Tabor, Susan Magnier and Derrick Smith's 4-year-old has been out of action since his defeat at 8-13 in York's G1 Juddmonte International Aug. 17, but was found to be running a temperature after that contest. Left in the 10-furlong feature at Monday's declaration stage, the June 18 G2 Hardwicke S. winner needs more time, according to Anne-Marie O'Brien. "Await the Dawn is unlikely to run in the Qipco Champion S. this weekend, as we feel the race is coming a little too soon for him," O'Brien tweeted.

**TONER HOPING FOR WINTER CORONATION**

Trainer Jimmy Toner is looking for **Winter Memories** (El Prado {Ire}) to continue her ascent in Saturday's GI Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup S. at Keeneland. The gray filly, who has made a career of late-running nail-biting finishes, is coming off a neck win in the Sept. 17 GI Garden City S. Toner is hoping that more pace will lead to less drama Saturday. "I looked at the race, and at least there is more speed," Toner told a national teleconference yesterday. "And when you have more speed in the race, the field has more of a chance to open up a little bit and spread out. The last couple of times that she's run, there hasn't been any definitive pace, so everyone sits and waits. What happens then is that she winds up in a box because there is no speed developing in there. So, hopefully, this weekend at least there will be enough pace where they can clear out a little bit and she won't be as boxed in as much." While the Queen Elizabeth has been Winter Memories' primary target all year, Toner would not completely close the door on a possible Breeders' Cup berth. "If you're looking at the GI Filly and Mare Turf, you've got Stacelita (Fr) (Monsun {Ger}), who is the top grass filly in the country, so do you run against her? Or do you cut back and run the mile against Goldikova (Ire) (Anabaa)? Those are the kinds of things we'd have to look at first. Either race that she would run in is going to be very tough. It will remain to be seen until after Saturday. We're running Saturday and hope all goes well, and then we'll see what happens after that." Winter Memories has won six of eight races, five of them in graded company. According to Toner, the filly knows she is special. "She has a great personality around the stable," the trainer said. "She knows who she is and she enjoys the attention. She's the queen and she knows it, and that's the way she handles herself."

### 'Summer' Ready to Take on 'Winter'...

Trainer Graham Motion knows Team Valor's **Summer Soiree** (War Front) faces a formidable opponent in **Winter Memories** (El Prado {Ire}) in Saturday's GI Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup S., but he thinks his charge is up to the challenge. "I'm not crazy about taking on Winter Memories, to be honest," Motion admitted. "I wish she wasn't in there, but it's a Grade I. And my filly is certainly one of the fastest fillies that I have ever had, and she is doing great. So if ever there was a time to do it, this is the time. At the end of the day, I hope that my filly performs the way I know she can and makes a race of it." Summer Soiree, who was purchased by Team Valor after a

10 3/4-length romp in the GIII Bourbonette Oaks in March, is unbeaten in two turf appearances since running 10th in the GI Kentucky Oaks. The bay filly won the June 25 GIII Boiling Springs S. at Monmouth Park before a half-length tally in the Aug. 20 GI Del Mar Oaks. Despite her "high cruising speed," Motion doesn't think Summer Soiree has to be on the lead in Saturday's nine-furlong turf event. "Quite frankly, in her last two races she's settled quite nicely off of the lead," Motion said. "I don't know that to assume she's going to be on the lead is necessarily how it is going to go. It is something that we've tried to get her to do, to relax."

Motion added that last Sunday's GI Juddmonte Spinster S. winner **Aruna** (Mr. Greeley) would most likely be entered in both the GI Breeders' Cup Ladies' Classic, for which the Spinster was a "Win and You're In" race, and the GI F/M Turf. "I just had a long conversation with Alan Cooper, who is Flaxman Holdings racing manager, and we're certainly going to consider running Aruna in the dirt race," he said. "It's something that I have to discuss more with Maria [Niarchos], but I think there is every chance that she'll be nominated to both races."

### ACCLAMATION DONE FOR YEAR

**Acclamation** (Unusual Heat), a winner of five straight races, including the GI TVG Pacific Classic S. Aug. 28 and GII Clement L. Hirsch Turf Championship S. at Santa Anita Oct. 2, has been sidelined with a foot ailment and will miss the remainder of his 5-year-old season, *Daily Racing Form* reports. "He isn't in any real discomfort, but you know when you've got heat, you've got something to worry about," majority owner and breeder Buddy Johnston told *DRF*. "There's no fractures. But even a bruised foot, like this appears to be, can cost you time. The last thing you'd want to have is a short horse for a mile-and-a-half race as tough as the Breeders' Cup Turf." The California-bred has also won this term's GII Jim Murray H.

May 14, GI Charles Whittingham Memorial H. June 11 and GI Eddie Read S. July 23. "He's telling us we'd be smart to give him a little time, so that's what we're going to do," Johnston continued. "He's run hard all year. He's won five big stakes in a row, something nobody else has done. And he's beaten the best out here. I'd like to have him as good or better next year. He'll go up to our farm near Fresno in a few days and be turned out in a grass paddock, just like we did last year. Then, we'll set out a program to see if we can get him to the Breeders' Cup next year at Santa Anita." Acclamation has won nine of 28 career starts and has posted \$1,628,048 in earnings.

## DRAWING POWER

Probably five principal factors combined to make last week's Tattersalls October 1 Yearling Sale in Newmarket the strongest of the year. It was the same trend we saw in Keeneland Book 2. At Keeneland, 28% fewer horses were catalogued in Book 2, which went from four days back to three. And, while 23% fewer sold, the gross was up by 2%, and the average by 33%. October 1 remained at three days, but the numbers in each session were reduced, and the number catalogued dropped by 26%. The number sold dropped by 23%, as in Keeneland Book 2, and again the gross increased. At Tattersalls the increase was a little under 3.4-million guineas, which was a 7% increase in gross, and, similarly to Book 2, the average rose by 32% (and the median by 43%, from 70,000gns to 100,000gns). Second, there are clearly a certain number of buyers of yearlings who are unaffected by the headlines. We hear news that the sky is falling, but nobody told the buyers at October 1, or they took no notice. An example was the Maktoums' determined support of their stallions; we reckoned (see *TDN* Sat 10-08), just of the sires that had six or more sell, that Maktoum entities (John Ferguson, Shadwell, Rabbah, Dick O'Gorman, some Mark Johnston) signed for nine of 17 yearlings by leading first-crop sire New Approach; nine of the 19 sold that were by Cape Cross, as well as nine of the 19 by Teofilo (who of course had the G1 Dewhurst S, winner the day after the sale ended). Maktoum entities also bought four of the six sold by Dubawi; four of 10 by Raven's Pass; seven of 11 by Shamardal; seven of 18 by Invincible Spirit; and six of seven by Authorized.

In all, that's 55 of 107 yearlings sold by those eight Maktoum (or part-Maktoum) stallions--over half. By contrast, Coolmore bought six of the 10 Montjeus sold, but only one of the 19 Galileos. Besides the spending by operations clearly unaffected by the latest global economic crisis, an increasing presence in the auction marketplace are representatives of economies that are not in recession, but which are in fact growing. New Arabian peninsula investors from Abu Dhabi, Dubai, Saudi Arabia, and especially Qatar are having an impact, as are buyers from the Asian economies and Australia.

Some of this is actual new money coming from new people in the business; some of it is stepped-up investment from groups like the Australians, who have gone from buying crooked half-sisters to good horses that couldn't run, to actually buying the good horses themselves. Fourth, there is definite drawing power to buying in Europe.

America can be difficult enough to get into, and unfriendly, especially at the point of entry, which is a turnoff for very rich people used to being catered to. Deauville, and especially Newmarket, have become the destinations for non-Europeans wanting to buy the best bloodlines, and it's certainly connected to this point that probably most of the world's best sires now stand in Europe.

Let's put it this way: 20 years ago, the relationship between American and European stallions was 75-25 that the top stallions were in America. Now it's more like 50-50, maybe even Advantage Europe. The money showed up, and the pedigrees were there. The fifth, and most important ingredient, was the horses. There was universal agreement that there were plenty of nice yearlings, so much so that the median for the 364 sold jumped from 70,000gns (449 sold in 2010) to 100,000gns--a rise of 43%! No doubt it would have still been a good sale even if there hadn't have been dozens and dozens of nice individuals, but the fact that people's short lists weren't so short told the story.

Evidently breeders really had saved their best individuals, as well as the best pedigrees, for Newmarket October 1. That, combined with the other factors cited above, contributed to October 1 deserving 'The Yearling Sale of the Year' accolade. When 364 yearlings average the equivalent of almost \$227,000, with a gross of over \$82 million, and a median price around \$160,000--blockbuster sale, up 30%.

### JUVENILE FORM

Last weekend marked many of the final preps for the Breeders' Cup races--with the exception of anything that will run back in three weeks after this weekend's inaugural British Champions Day at Ascot. Just about all of the major 2-year-old preps have been run, and last weekend's results make interesting reading on that front. The two New York Grade I winners are now the likely favorites for their races: GI Champagne S. winner Union Rags (Dixie Union) in the GI Breeder's Cup Juvenile, and GI Frizette winner My Miss Aurelia (Smart Strike) in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies. They're not going to frighten off much of the opposition, though. My Miss Aurelia actually ran almost two ticks faster than the colts, earning a Beyer 96, while Union Rags ran just 92, which definitely won't be scaring many of them off.

There are liable to be, as usual, the best last-race winners from California, Kentucky, and Canada, plus a few others thrown in. One interesting development was three Grade I third-place finishes for North American freshman sires last weekend: the gelding Right to Vote, from the first crop by Political Force, was third in the Champagne; the filly Miss Netta, by Street Sense, was third in the Frizette; and Optimizer, from the first crop by English Channel, ran third behind the previous maiden Dullahan (Beyer 85, by Even the Score) in Keeneland's GI Breeders' Futurity.

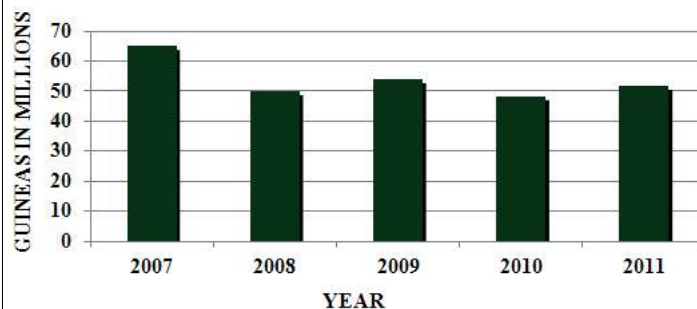
## Weekly Sales Ticker

"The results at Keeneland September and Tattersalls October 1 sales confirm that we are finally seeing things start to trend upward in the thoroughbred auction market. Of course, a big part of the improvement is due to a reduction in numbers; when the number of horses sold is down a quarter, yet the grosses are up, you know the results are looking better. Compared to 2007, almost exactly 25% fewer horses have now been offered at the 2011 yearling sales. Compared to 2009, the number sold is down 10%, the average up 11%."

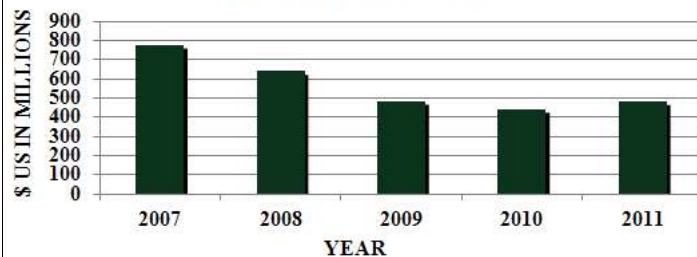

At Newmarket, the G1 Dewhurst (seven furlongs), the G1 Middle Park (six furlongs), and the G2 Rockfel (fillies, seven furlongs) completed a set of eight Group 1 and Group 2 juvenile races run in England and France between Sept. 23 and Oct. 8.

Interestingly, in last weekend's three contests, the Irish mopped the floor with their British counterparts, winning all three races, running one-two in the Dewhurst, and filling five of the nine placings among the three races. In the Dewhurst--sometimes Europe's most important 2-year-old race--Parish Hall held on to win from the arguably unlucky G1 National S. winner Power (Oasis Dream), trained by Aidan O'Brien. Bred and trained by Jim Bolger, Parish Hall is inbred 3x3 to Sadler's Wells, being by Teofilo (the first of Bolger's four winners in the last six years) out of a Montjeu mare. Most Improved, from the first crop by Lawman (it is the first crop by the winner's sire, Teofilo, as well, of course), ran a good third.

Aidan O'Brien won the other two races, capturing the Middle Park with Crusade (Mr. Greeley), who may now try to emulate Johannesburg by going against Union Rags in the dirt Juvenile; and the Rockfel, with arguably the most impressive 2-year-old winner of the weekend, the Montjeu filly Wading. A filly from the first crop by Excellent Art, Gray Pearl, was third in the Rockfel. Lilbourne Lad (Acclamation), who was second in the Middle Park, is a possibility for the G1 Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf, in what will be his last race before following on from Dark Angel and Zebedee, and being retired to stud in Ireland as a 3-year-old.

Interestingly, the new distribution of these eight European Group 1 and Group 2 2-year-old races over the last three weeks, partially as a result of the Britain's Racing For Change initiative, has actually resulted in a reduction of field sizes. Last year, the eight 2-year-old races referenced (G1 Fillies' Mile, G1 Cheveley Park, G2 Royal Lodge in England; G1 Jean-Luc Lagardere and G1 Marcel Boussac in France, in addition to the three last weekend) averaged 9.6 starters. This year they averaged 8.6, and it would have been below eight had the Middle Park not had 16 runners. Getting only 9,000 people to Newmarket on what was promoted as Future Champions' Day doesn't really qualify as a big win, either.

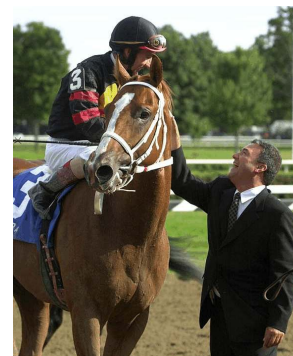

**RED BULLET PENSIONED** Red Bullet (Unbridled--Cargo, by Caro {Ire}), winner of the 2000 GI Preakness S., has been pensioned from stud duties at Adena Springs due to declining fertility. Adena Springs General Manager Eric Hamelback reported the 14-year-old stallion is "very happy and healthy, and he will continue to live with us at Adena Springs in Kentucky. He will be available to all of his fans and continue to enjoy the same treatment as all of our active stallions." Owned and bred by Adena Springs and trained by Joe Orseno, Red Bullet won the 2000 Gill Gotham S. and was second in that year's Gil Wood Memorial S. He was also third in the 2001 GI Cigar Mile H. On the board in 10 of 14 starts, Red Bullet won six times and earned \$1,161,920. Retired to stud at Adena Springs South in Florida in 2003, Red Bullet has sired 11 stakes winners, including Canadian champion Fatal Bullet. "Red Bullet's accomplishments exemplify the breeding program that Adena Springs has established," said Adena owner Frank Stronach. "He was a tough and talented racehorse and, although his crop sizes were limited, you could see that his offspring possessed those same qualities."

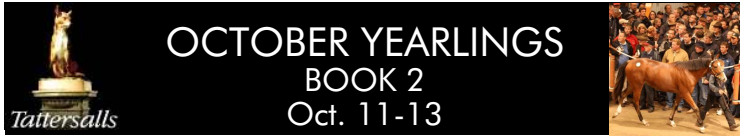

**ACCLAIM TO FAME** Acclamation (GB) (Royal Applause {GB}), who has had a sensational season with his juveniles this year, was the sire in demand at Tattersalls yesterday as Book 2 of the October Yearling Sale got underway in Newmarket. The Rathbarry Stud sire was responsible for three of the four highest prices on a day that saw 19 lots hit the six-figure mark, compared to 28 in the whole sale last year. Sheikh Hamdan Al Maktoum's racing manager Angus Gold paid the day's highest price of 180,000gns (*approximately US\$294,448*) for lot 743, an Acclamation (GB) colt out of Intrepid Queen (Theatrical {Ire}). The grandson of 1986 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies' winner Brave Raj (Rajab) was offered by The Castlebridge Consignment.

"We are trying to get some sharper 2-year-old types to supplement our more backward homebreds," said Gold. "And Acclamation has become a great sire of 2-year-olds. He has had to establish himself the hard way before he started getting better mares. This colt will be heading back to Shadwell, and we will allocate trainers to our yearlings once the sales are over."

Gold struck again just before the sale's end when outbidding Ed Sackville of Sackville Donald at 160,000gns for lot 774, an Iffraaj (GB) half-brother to smart juvenile Cavaleiro (Ire) (Sir Percy {Ire}) offered from Peter Kavanagh's Kildaragh Stud.

Another popular Acclamation (GB) yearling was a colt consigned from the Cashman family's Rathbarry Stud, which stands the sire. Bought for 48,000gns last year, he made 165,000gns yesterday afternoon when bought by agent Ross Doyle to join Richard Hannon on behalf of a new owner. Michael Donohoe of BBA Ireland was underbidder.

"We know the stallion very well," said Doyle, who recently completed the deal for G2 Railway S. winner Lilbourne Lad (Ire) (Acclamation {GB}) to stand at Rathbarry next year. "Rathbarry has also been a very lucky farm for us to buy from over the years, and this colt was very typical of Acclamation with a bit of scope to him."

Agent Charlie Gordon-Watson, who paid 1.7-million guineas for last week's Book 1 sale topper, was operating at a lower level yesterday when snapping up another son of Acclamation (GB). Acting for an owner with Luca Cumani, Gordon-Watson fought off first Ed Sackville of Sackville Donald and finally trainer Roger Varian at 160,000gns for lot 689, a colt out of Gold Hush (Seeking the Gold).

"They are still hard to buy today, and this was a really nice colt by a very good stallion," said Gordon-Watson.

Earlier in the day, Sackville was the underbidder to Tom Goff of Blandford Bloodstock for lot 540, a Kyllachy (GB) colt that sold for 145,000gns. The son of of Group 2-placed Clinet (Ire) (Docksider) was bred by Andrew Cohen's Wood Hall Stud and sold from Trickle-down Stud.

"I know the mare well and I think I actually did the mating for this colt, who was a lovely mover," said Goff, who had been standing with John Gosden during the bidding.

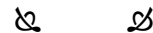
